

## PREFACE

### Abbreviations:

BTC = Boys Training Center  
S/S = Stevens School  
P.D. = Police Department  
MHC = Mental Health Centers

C/C = Courts or Corrections  
HFC = Holding for Court  
Eval. = Diagnosis/Evaluation

Notes: (1) All data is on a fiscal year basis, i.e., from July 1st to June 30th  
(2) All per capita figures are based on under age 18 populations

### Definition of Terms:

Note A: Juvenile Arrest and Disposition: The important fact to keep in mind is that the Uniform Crime Reporting System is a measure of police activity. Therefore, for Uniform Crime Reporting, a juvenile is counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult, an arrest would result; in fact, there may not have been a formal charge. Also, police involvement in non-criminal juvenile cases would also be counted as an "arrest". (See the definition of "Referred to Welfare Agency")

- (1) "Handled Within the Department": Released with no prosecuting action taken
- (2) "Referred to Juvenile Court": This disposition also includes referral to a Probation and Parole officer or aftercare worker even though such a referral might be informal
- (3) "Referred to Welfare Agency": Cases involving abuse and neglect, etc.
- (4) "Referred to Other Police Department": Self-explanatory
- (5) "Referred to Adult Court": Referred by police directly to Adult Court

Part I Offenses are listed on Page J.J.1

Part II Offenses: Some of the 21 classifications in Part II are: vandalism, narcotic and drug laws, driving under the influence, liquor laws, curfew and loitering laws, and runaway

County data is based on reports from police departments in those counties and not on the residence of the person "arrested".

Note B: Juvenile Court Appearances:

- (1) County data is based on District Court of origin
- (2) Appearances are based on offenses committed within the jurisdiction of that particular court
- (3) Petitions for custody of a child from the Department of Human Services are considered civil and not a juvenile court appearance
- (4) Although a juvenile might appear two or three times before a case is disposed of, "Juvenile Court Appearances" reflect only one case.
- (5) Traffic cases involving juveniles are not heard in Juvenile Court, with the exception of "operating under the influence", etc.

Note C: Juvenile Detention and Holding for Court

- (1) Juveniles may be detained by law enforcement personnel until the next juvenile court day, and after that only upon the request of the court
- (2) Holdings for Court = Detained while awaiting court hearing and/or disposition
- (3) Holdings for Court are based on county of residence

Note D: Psychological Services

- (1) Evaluation: Psychological, sound, educational, and physical diagnosis performed at the request of the court
- (2) Data re: evaluations at Boys Training Center and Stevens School, and referrals to Mental Health Centers from Police and Courts/Corrections are based on county of residence

Note E: Commitments

- (1) All commitments are based on county of residence

Note F: Probation

- (1) Juvenile probation data is based on the county of the District Court from which the person was placed on probation






