## CLEARANCE EFFORT BY PERCENT & CRIME TREND PER 100,000 POPULATION

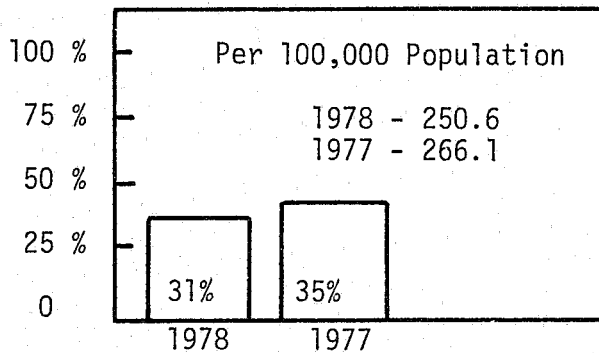
