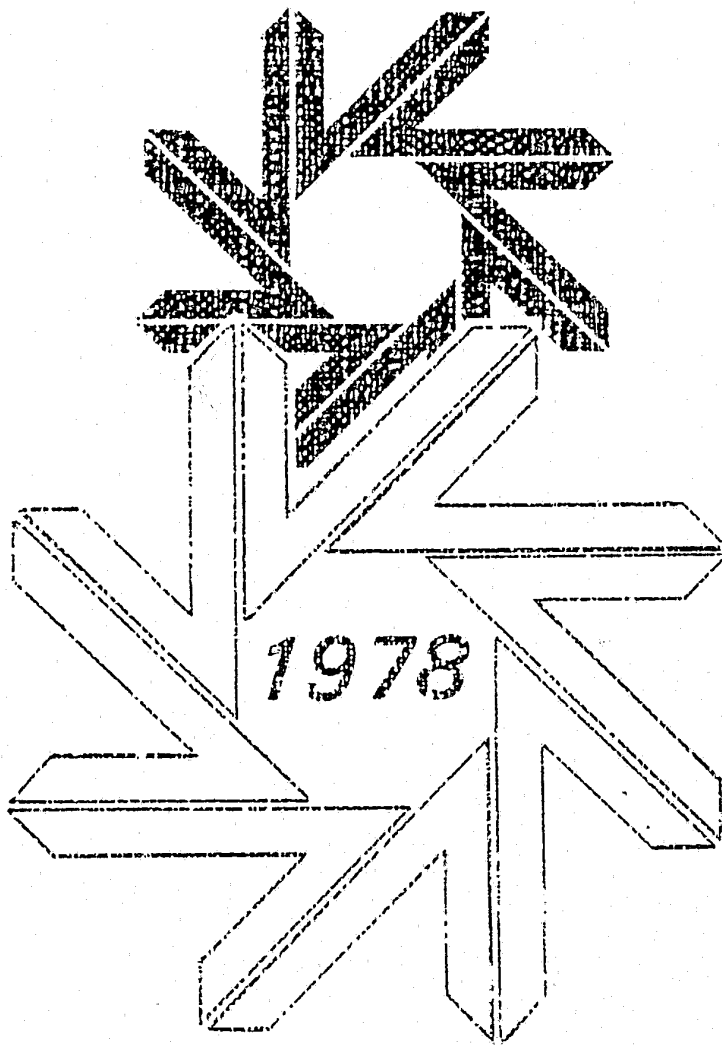

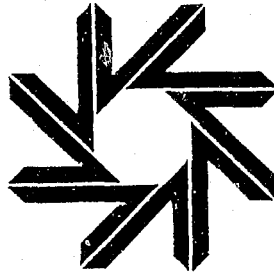

PREFACE

This report covers commitments to county and city jails and city jail farms; it should be noted that this confinement in jail does not reflect whether a person has been judged innocent or guilty. A separate commitment is reported each time a person is confined in jail on a charge of having violated a law or ordinance, for being inebriated or insane, as a material witness in a criminal case, for investigation, for protection or for any other reason. The confinement may be before or after adjudication of the case in which the prisoner is involved. A person who is recommitted after being released on bond or otherwise released, is reported each time he is placed in jail.

The statistics in this report were obtained from the Forms DC—J6, Record of Prisoners Confined. These forms are submitted monthly by the individual jails and jail farms to the Department of Corrections, Division of Finance, Jails Reimbursement Unit. The primary purpose of these documents is to serve as a basis for determining costs of operation and the amount of state reimbursement to local jails and city jail farms. To serve the secondary function, that of providing statistical data, the forms are then transferred to the Electronic Data Processing Unit for editing and computer processing. The final statistical report is prepared by the Research & Reporting Unit. All questions, remarks or requests relating to the report should be directed to this agency:

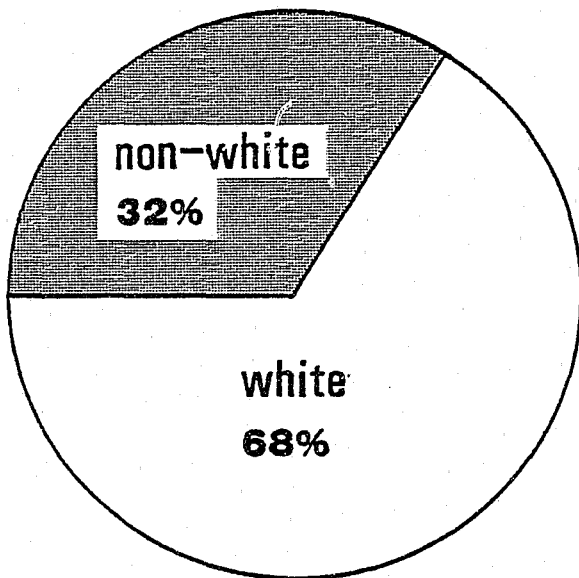

YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1978

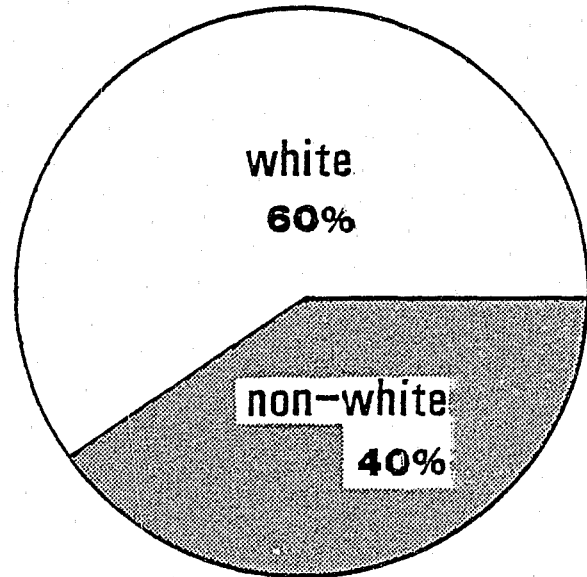
During fiscal year 1978, there were 151,721 commitments to county and city jails and city jail farms. This represents a 5.0 percent increase over commitments during 1977 (144,459).

RACE AND SEX

Among the jail commitments, 67.2 percent were white and 32.8 percent were non-white. The number of men received was 138,196 or 91.1 percent. The number of women was 13,525 or 8.9 percent. This is not significantly changed from last fiscal year when women comprised 8.7 percent of the commitments.



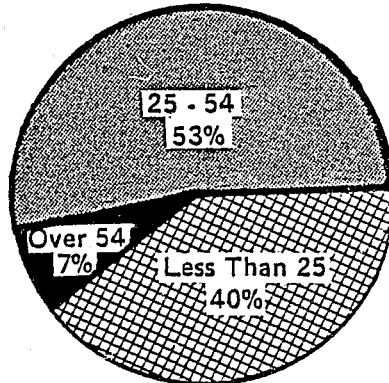
MALE

AGE

Last fiscal year there were 4,557 youths committed who were under age eighteen. During this fiscal year, 2.5 percent of the commitments (3,749) were in this category, which represents a 17.7 percent decline since last year.

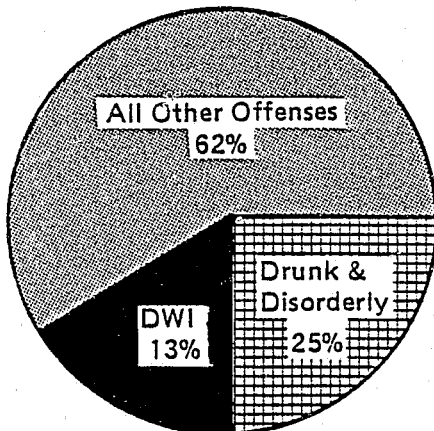


OFFENSE

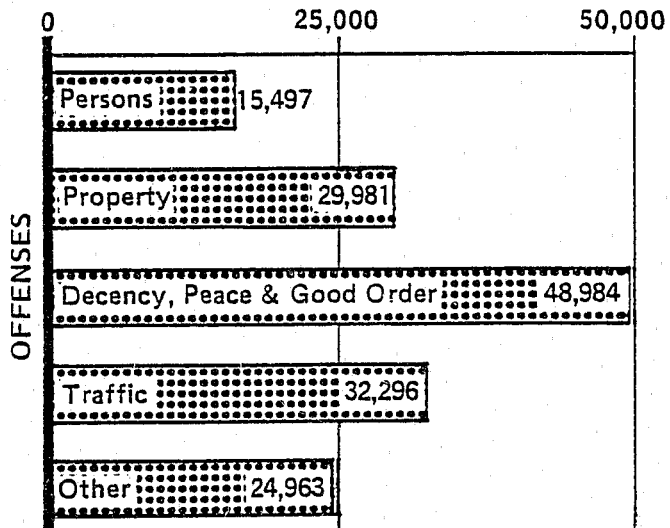
An analysis of the offenses for fiscal 1978 shows that offenses against decency, peace and good order were the most frequent (48,984 or 32.3 percent); traffic offenses ranked second with 32,296 or 21.3 percent.

Specifically, the most common offenses were drunkenness/drunk and disorderly which represented one quarter of all commitments (25.3 percent). The second most frequent offense was driving under the influence of intoxicants (12.8 percent).

Incarceration for violations of the narcotic laws accounted for only 6,000 commitments or 4.0 percent. This represents a slight decline from last fiscal year when 4.5 percent of the commitments were in this category.

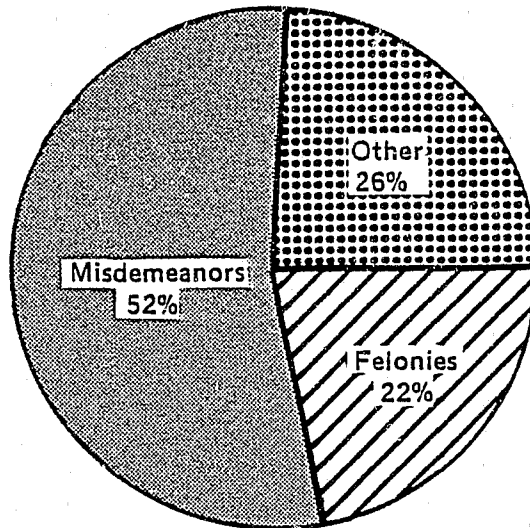

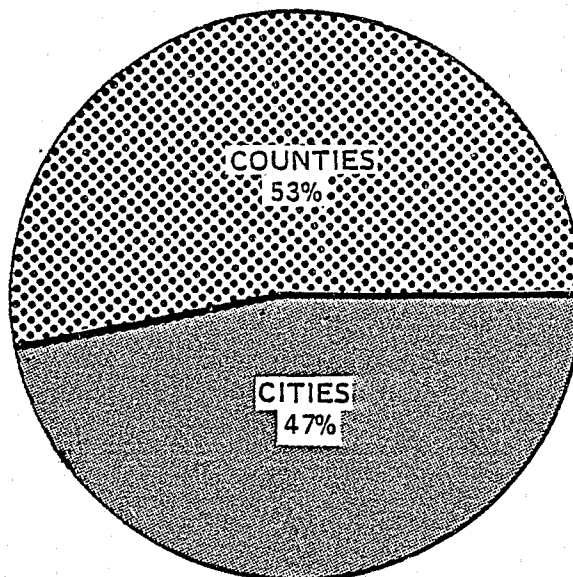
TYPE OF OFFENSE

Of the total commitments, more than half were charged with misdemeanors (78,781 or 51.9 percent), which is a slight decrease from last year when 53.6 percent were committed for misdemeanors. The persons committed on local ordinances ("other offenses") numbered 39,940 (26.3 percent) while 32,997 (21.8 percent) were charged with felony offenses.



PLACE COMMITTED FROM

Virginia counties accounted for 53.1 percent of the jail commitments and the cities accounted for 46.9 percent of the commitments. From the 80,583 commitments from the counties, Fairfax had by far the greatest share with 10,397; Henrico committed 3,678 and Arlington committed 3,811 prisoners. Of the 71,138 city commitments, Norfolk had 13,507, Roanoke had 9,675 and Richmond had 5,931.



CAPACITY AND POPULATION ANALYSIS

The average of the rated capacities for all the jails in Virginia is 51 beds. The total rated capacity for all the jail facilities was 4,954 beds on June 30, 1978. In comparison, the average daily population for a Virginia jail facility was slightly less than this average rated capacity. During this fiscal year the average population was 46.5 persons, which is a slight decline from 1977 when the average population was 48 persons.

The average number of commitments during 1978 for the 97 jail facilities was 1,564, which is an increase over the 1977 average of 1,474 commitments. The average prisoner days in 1978 was 16,982 days as compared to 17,648 days for fiscal year 1977. Although the average number of commitments is rising, the average length of confinement per prisoner dropped during this fiscal year. The average length of stay per commitment during fiscal year 1978 was 10.9 days. Last fiscal year the average length of stay was 12.0 days.

Only 26 jails recorded more total prisoner days than capacity days available. There were only nine days during the fiscal year when the total prisoner days for all Virginia jails exceeded the total state capacity.

 TEN YEAR COMPARISON

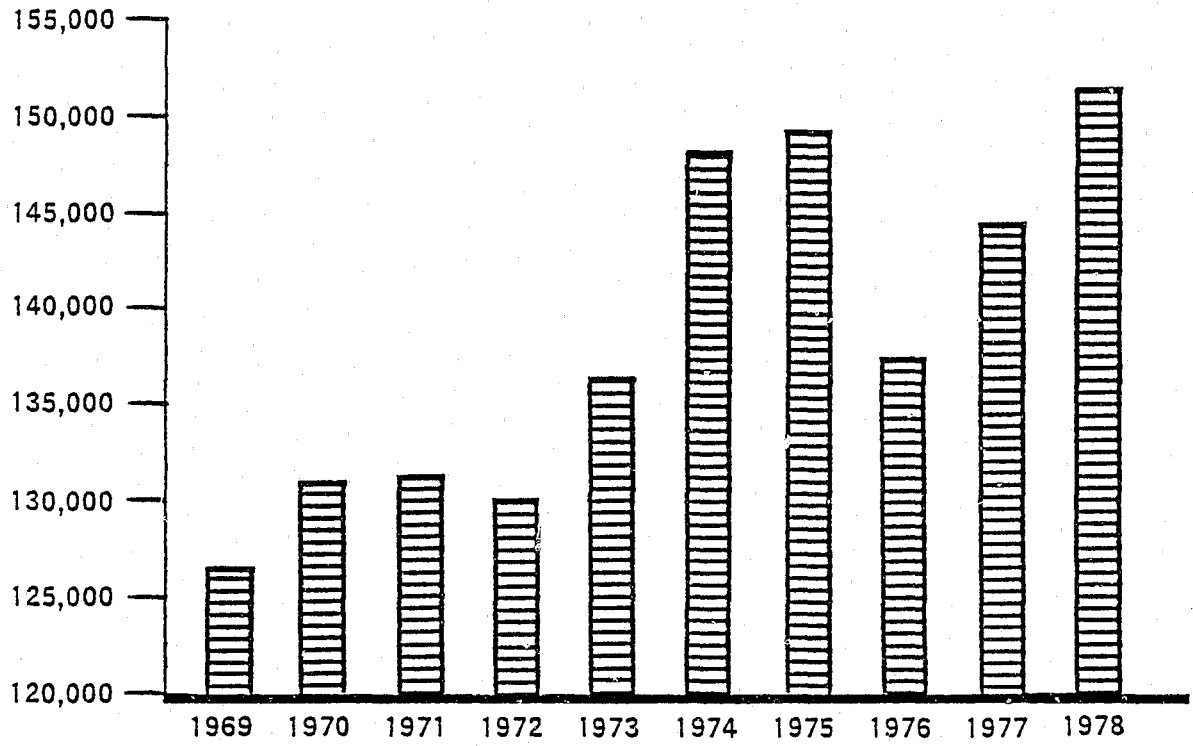

 TEN YEAR COMPARISON

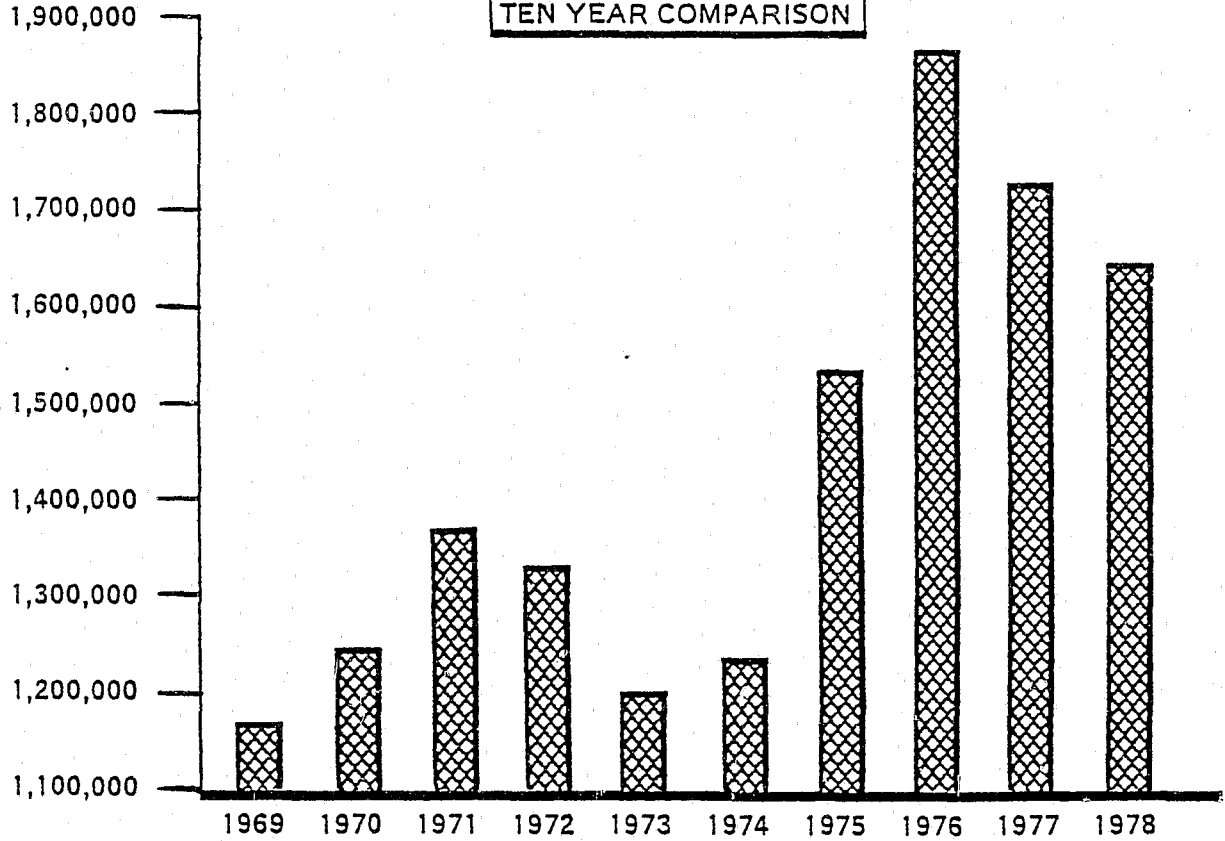
