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The Cover: The Northampton County Courthouse, in Jackson, North Carolina, was built in 1859 and rehovated in 1939. It is a distinguished example of the classic, "Greek Revival" architectual style often used for public buildings in the mid-1800's; it is included in the National Register of Historic Places.

Submitted herewith is the Thirteenth Annual Report of the Administrative Office of the Courts. This Report, prepared pursuant to G.S. 7A-343, relates to calendar year 1978.

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During 1978 a total of 1,564,877 cases of all types were reported filed in the State's district and superior courts. By category, the numbers filed ranged from 11,541 civil cases, in the superior courts to 815,857 criminal cases (traffic offenses) in the State's district courts. Each of the State's 100 counties contributed a portion of case filings, ranging from a total of 850 in Tyrrell County to 109,674 in Mecklenburg County*.

During 1978 a total of 1,527,180 civil and criminal cases were disposed of in the State's district and superior courts. In terms of category, the numbers ranged from 10,916 civil cases disposed of by the superior courts, to 801,787 criminal cases (traffic offenses) disposed of by the State's district courts. Each of the State's 100 counties contributed a portion of these case dispositions, ranging from a total of 801 in Tyrrell County, to 106,429 in Mecklenburg County.

The combined total of case filings and case dispositions during 1978, for the entire State, was 3,092,057. This was the total number of individual case numbers (with other accompanying data) reported to the Administrative Office of the Courts by the 100 clerks of superior court.

For record-keeping and statistical reporting in 1978, by individual case numbers, there are five major case categories at the superior court level and five at the district court level. These are listed below, with the numbers of filings and dispositions during 1978 compared with the numbers of filings and dispositions during 1977.

The total number of case filings in the superior courts during 1978 was 3.2% above the number of case filings during 1977, while the total number of case dispositions in the superior courts during 1978 was 3.7% above the number of case dispositions in 1977. For the district courts, the total number of case filings during 1978 was 8.5% above the number of case filings during 1977, and the total number of case dispositions in the district courts during 1978 was 10.2% above the number of case dispositions during 1977. As filings continued to run ahead of dispositions during 1978, the number of cases pending at the end of 1978 increased accordingly.

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THE APPELLATE DIVISION

THE SUPREME COURT

One hundred and thirty-three opinions were filed by the Supreme Court in 1978. Of the total, 44 were civil and 89 were criminal cases. Sixty-eight percent (22 opinions) of the civil appeals were affirmed and eighty-four percent (75 opinions) of the criminal appeals were affirmed. In the remaining cases, the Supreme Court modified or reversed the decision from which the appeals were taken. Of the total number of appeals, 56 were decisions in which the Supreme Court granted a discretionary review; the remaining 77 were appeals as of right. As reported in the North Carolina Reports, the Court disposed of 422 petitions for discretionary review and two motions to reconsider.

THE COURT OF APPEALS

In 1978 the Court of Appeals disposed of 1,133 appeals. The Court filed 1,035 written opinions during the year (covering 1,038 appeals). Of the 1,035 written opinions, 489 were in criminal cases and 546 were in civil cases, including appeals from the Insurance Commissioner, the Industrial Commission, and the Utilities Commission. In addition, the Court disposed of 1,086 motions and petitions in 1978.



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
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THE SUPERIOR COURT DIVISION

The flow of cases through the State's superior courts increased in volume in 1978, as compared to previous years, as illustrated in the graph below. Including both civil and criminal superior court cases, there was a five per cent increase in filings, from 61,665 in 1977, to 64,819 in 1978. This would appear to signify a return to the earlier pattern of annual state-wide increases in filings, a pattern broken by the decreases in 1976 (as compared to 1975) and in 1977 (as compared to 1976).


There was also an increase in dispositions, from 59,434 in 1977 to 61,713 in 1978. However, neither the amount of the increase (2,279 cases) nor the rate (slightly less than four per cent) matched the increase in filings; the result was a nine per cent increase in the number of cases pending at year end: from 33,108 cases pending on December 31, 1977, to 36,214 cases pending on December 31, 1978. The total number of civil and criminal superior court cases pending at the end of each of the last five years is shown in the bar graph on the following page.

The table below this bar graph shows the utilization of scheduled superior court for each of the last five years. In 1978, the 58 regular and 8 special superior court judges held a total of 10,124 days of court, an increase of 10.7% over the 9,142 days of court held in 1977 by 47 regular and 8 special superior court judges. The percentage of scheduled days which were utilized rose from 78.3% in 1977 to 80.3% in 1978.

Filings

The total number of superior court civil cases filed during 1978 was 11,541, an increase of 1,140 cases (11%) over 1977 filings of 10,401 cases.

The trend in case filing over the last five years is illustrated in the first of the bar graphs on the following page, where the dark-colored bars represent filings. Since 1974, the yearly total of superior court civil cases filed has risen by $14\frac{1}{2}\%$, which averages out to about $3\frac{1}{2}\%$ per year. Although the increase in 1978 is the largest single increase in the five years shown on the graph, it would appear to be consistent with the over-all trend of the period: when it is combined with the 1977 decrease, the average for the two years is also about $3\frac{1}{2}\%$.

For this same five-year period, the population of North Carolina is estimated to have increased by an average of about $1\frac{1}{4}\%$ per year. Superior court civil case filings, then, are increasing at a greater rate than the State's population. This, perhaps, should come as no surprise. As society increases in urbanization, technological orientation, and interdependence, it seems likely that more conflicts between individual citizens, governmental agencies and private organizations will occur. In such circumstances, it would perhaps be a greater surprise to find that the amount of litigation in the civil courts was increasing at only the same rate as the population.

Dispositions

Dispositions of superior court civil cases totalled 10,916 in 1978, an increase of 15% over total dispositions 9,447 in 1977.

This rather sharp increase in civil case dispositions should be viewed in the perspective of a very moderate (1.6%) increase in criminal case dispositions. As noted earlier, dispositions of both civil and criminal superior court cases increased in 1978 by slightly less than 4%. The greater percentage increase in civil case dispositions than in criminal case dispositions is probably due to the fact that there was a larger increase in the number of days of civil court held than in the number of days of criminal court held. There were 3,696 days of superior civil court held in 1978, 17% more than the 1977 figure of $3,161\frac{1}{2}$ days, and there is a significant correlation between the number of days of civil court held in a year and the number of civil cases disposed of during the year. (There is also a significant correlation between the number of days of criminal court held in a year and the number of criminal cases disposed of.)

As indicated on the table, "Superior Court Civil Cases Pending, Filed and Disposed of," a substantial portion of the 10,916 cases disposed of in 1978 were not disposed of by trial. A total of 611 cases (5.6%) were disposed of by jury trial and an additional 3,954 cases (36.2%) were disposed of by trial with the judge sitting as the finder of facts in lieu of a jury. Of the remainder, 1,012 cases (9.3%)were disposed of "by clerk"—i.e., by the entry of a default judgment or a confession of judgment; and 5,339 cases (48.9%) were disposed of by "other" means, such as an out of court settlement or a voluntary dismissal. These figures are comparable to the figures for 1977, when 5.6% of the 9,447 cases disposed of were by jury trial, 35.4% were by trial by judge, and 59.0% were by other means.

Cases Pending

Since the number of filings during 1978 was greater than the number of dispositions, there was an increase in the number of cases pending on December 31, 1978 (15,285) compared with the number of superior court civil cases (14,660) pending on December 31, 1977. This increase totalled 625 cases, or about $4\frac{1}{4}$ % more cases pending at the end of 1978 than at the end of 1977.

As is indicated in the table, "Ratios of Superior Court Civil Dispositions to Total Caseload, and Ratios of Cases Pending on December 31, 1978 to Cases Disposed of During 1978," the several counties differ to a substantial degree on these measures of how much of each county's caseload was disposed of during 1978 and how much remained pending on December 31. (Total caseload is defined as the number of cases pending at the beginning of the year plus the number of cases filed during the year.) Almost two-thirds (65.7%) of the total 1978 caseload in the county ranked first on these ratios (Cherokee) was disposed of during the year, while only 6.8% of the caseload of the 100th-ranked county (Warren) was disposed of. For the State as a whole, 41.7% of the total superior court civil caseload was disposed of; this is a moderate improvement over 1977, when 37.7% of the total caseload was disposed of.

Time from Filing to Disposition

For the 10,916 superior court civil cases disposed of in 1978, the *average* time from filing to disposition was 516.2 days, or about one year and five months.

The fact that a substantial number of superior court civil cases are disposed of by "clerk" or by "other" means, alluded to earlier, must be kept in mind in any examination of this table. It is likely that all of the 627 cases disposed of in less than 30 days, and the additional 1,513 cases disposed of between 80 and 90 days, were disposed of by default judgment, by confession of judgment, or by one of the "other" (non-trial) modes of disposition such as voluntary dismissal or out-of-court settlement between the litigants. Since the figures for the average time from filing to disposition presented in the table include these quickly-disposed of cases, which likely did not go to trial, it can be assumed that the average time from filing to disposition by trial on the merits would be greater than the 516-day figure for all dispositions. It must also be recognized, however, that a mathematical average such as this one may be substantially raised if a relatively small number of very old cases have been included among the dispositions. (The disposition of a single 20-year old case, included with ten one-year old cases disposed of, for example, would produce an "average" time from filing to disposition of two years and eight months.)

In addition, although a low time-from-filing-todisposition figure is to be desired, all other things being equal, it is incumbent upon a court system with a substantial number of long-pending cases to dispose of them, and the disposing of such cases will of necessity raise the system's average time from filing to disposition for that year. The average for 1978 reflects the fact that 616 of the superior court civil cases disposed of were older than four years at the time of their disposition, compared with 483 such cases disposed of in 1977; a lower average would have indicated less progress in disposition of some of the long-pending cases.


Ages of Pending Cases

The table on the ages of cases pending on December 31, 1978, does reflect some progress. Fewer cases (730) had been pending for more than four years as of the end of 1978 than as of the end of 1977 (862), a decrease of 15%. As of the end of 1978, 2,577 cases had been pending between two years and four years, down 13% from the 1977 figure of 2,963 cases. Combining these categories, 3,307 cases were older than two years and still pending on December 31, 1978—518 cases less than the comparable figure (3,825 cases) for December 31, 1977. There was also a decrease in the number of cases pending between one year and two years: 4,192 on December 31, 1977, compared with 3,751 on December 31, 1978. Counting all cases older than one year, 8,017 such cases were pending on December 31, 1977 and 7,058 were pending on December 31, 1978—a decrease of almost 12%.


North Carolina has no official or generally recognized "standard" or time-limit for disposing of civil cases. Ideally, perhaps, most if not all superior court civil cases should be disposed of within six months of filing. Or, perhaps, it would be more realistic and in keeping with the developments in most civil cases in the superior courts to suggest that all but a very few unusually complicated such cases should be disposed of within one year of filing.

If a one-year standard be assumed, the data here presented would force the conclusion that there is a considerable "backlog" of superior court civil cases in the courts of North Carolina. Although, as noted, there were fewer cases aged over one year pending on December 31, 1978 than were pending one year earlier, such cases still made up 46% of all pending superior court civil cases. If the courts continue in 1979 to dispose of civil cases at the rate of 10,916 cases per year (about 910 cases per month). it would take almost eight months to dispose of the 7,058 cases older than one year and still pending on December 31, 1978 if all the courts' efforts were devoted exclusively to these older cases. Needless to say, this would be impossible: the courthouse doors cannot be closed and no new cases accepted. Nor would it be appropriate to concentrate exclusively on the cases already older than one year and allow the 8,227 cases aged one year or less and still pending at the end of 1978 to create a new "backlog." In sum, unless the disposition rate increases dramatically, a "backlog" of superior court civil cases aged over one year will continue.

ESTATES AND SPECIAL PROCEEDINGS

This section of the annual report contains information on cases which are initially within the jurisdiction of the clerk of superior court. These include estate and probate matters and such "special proceedings" as petitions on forclosures, involuntary commitments to mental hospitals, adoptions, condemnations of real property for public purposes, and incompetency of persons to manage their personal financial affairs. (Rulings of the clerk may be appealed to the superior court judge.)

There was a small (less than 3%) increase in the total number of estate cases filed in the State —from 31,742 cases in 1977 to 32,602 cases in 1978. Dispositions rose from 29,222 in 1977 to 30,841 in 1978, an increase of $5\frac{1}{2}$ %. There were 45,706 estates cases pending on December 31, 1977 and 47,467 pending on December 31, 1978, which is an increase of slightly less than 4%. For the State as a whole, 39.4% of the total 1978 estates caseload was disposed of in 1978, a small improvement over the 1977 figure of 38.8%. Within the 100 counties, the variation on this measure was substantial: 69% of the caseload in Camden County (ranked first on the ratio) was disposed of; less than 17% of the Dare County caseload was disposed of.

Filings of special proceedings before the clerks dropped from 27,156 in 1977 to 27,078 in 1978, a decrease of less than one-half of one per cent. Dispositions, however, increased from 26,888 in 1977 to 27,266 in 1978 (an increase of 1.4%), which resulted in a decrease in the number of cases pending at year end: 20,003 cases were pending on December 31, 1977 and 19,315 cases were pending on December 31, 1978, a drop of 188 cases, or slightly less than one per cent.

For the State as a whole, 57.9% of the toal 1978 special proceedings caseload was disposed of in 1978, an increase from the 1977 figure of 56.6%. Individual counties ranged from a high of an 82.9% disposition of the caseload (Burke County) to 11.5% of the caseload disposed of during the year (Warren County).

Filings

A total of 53,278 criminal cases were filed in the superior courts in 1978. This is an increase of approximately four per cent over the 1977 filings total of 51,264 cases.

Of the cases filed, 30,576 were felony cases (within the original jurisdiction of the superior courts) and 22,702 were cases appealed from the districts courts for trial *de novo*. In relation to 1977 case filings, appeals from district courts increased slightly more (4.7%) than felony case filings increased (3.4%); as a result, appeals from district courts constituted a slightly higher proportion of the total superior court criminal case filings figure (42.6%) in 1978 than they did in 1977 (42.3%).

The moderate increases in both categories of superior court criminal case filings would appear to be consistent with recent trends. Following substantial yearly increases during the early part of the decade, felony _ase filings have remained at the level of approximately 30,000 cases per year since 1975. Appeals from district courts have been filed at the rate of about 22,000 cases per year (about six percent of the cases tried in district court) since the extension of the district court system into all 100 counties was completed in 1970.

Dispositions

A total of 50,797 superior court criminal cases were disposed of in 1978, an increase of 1.6% over 1977 case dispositions of 49,987.

Case dispositions over the last five years are illustrated in the first of the following graphs. As in the case of superior court civil case dispositions, the yearly total of criminal cases disposed of is strongly correlated with the total number of days of court devoted to criminal matters held during the respective year. There was a moderate increase in the number of days of superior criminal court held: 6,428 days in 1978, compared with 5,981½ days in 1977.

Of the 50,797 superior court criminal cases disposed of in 1978, a total of 3,491 (6.9%) were disposed of by jury trial, 25,799 (50.8%) by accepting defendant's pleas of guilty, 15,785 (31.1%) by dismissal by the district attorney, and 5,722 (11.3%) by other means. There was one difference between the two case categories (felony cases and appeals from district courts): only 5.4% of the felony case dispositions were by "other" means, but 19.1% of the appeals from district courts were disposed of by "other." Of the remaining cases, the pattern among the several modes of disposition is very much the same for both case categories: 7.4% of the felony cases and 8.3% of the appeals were disposed of by jury trial; 57.0% of the felony cases and 57.6% of the appeals were disposed of by accepting guilty pleas; and 35.6% of the felony cases and 34.1% of the appeals were disposed of by dismissal. Compared to 1977 case dispositions, there was a decrease in the number of jury-trial dispositions (from 4,332 in 1977 to 3,491 in 1978), an increase in the number of guiltyplea dispositions (from 25,031 to 24,799), an increase in the number of dismissals and "other" dispositions (from 20,624 to 21,507).

Pending Cases

Since the moderate increase in cases disposed of fell short of the increase in cases filed in 1978, there was a substantial increase $(13\frac{1}{2}\%)$ in the number of criminal cases pending in superior courts on December 31, 1978 (20,929 cases) as compared with the number pending on December 31, 1977 (18,448).

As the table, "Ratios of Superior Court Criminal Dispositions to Total Caseload, and Ratios of Cases Pending on December 31, 1978 to Cases Disposed of During 1978" indicates, there were substantial differences between the several counties on these measures of how much of each county's caseload was disposed of during 1978 and how much remained pending at year's end. ("Total caseload" consists of the number of cases pending at the beginning of the year plus the number of cases filed during the year.) In the county ranked first on the ratios (Chowan), 91.8% of its total caseload was disposed of during the year; in the 100th-ranked county (Warren), 37.9% of the caseload was disposed of. For all 100 counties, 70.8% of the caseload was disposed of, a decrease from the 1977 figure of 71.7%.

Time from Filing to Disposition

Of the 29,113 felony cases disposed of in 1978, the average time from filing in the superior courts to disposition was 128.3 days; of the 21,684 appeals from district courts disposed of, the average time from filing in the superior courts to disposition was 120.9 days.

It should be remembered that the disposition of a relatively few long-pending cases will substantially raise these averages. (For example, combining the disposition of only one two-year old case with 10 cases disposed of 90 days after filing produces an "average" time from filing to disposition of about five months.) The majority of superior court criminal cases were disposed of in less than 120 days: of the 29,113 felony cases disposed of in 1978, 20,292 cases (69.7%) were disposed of within 120 days of filing in the superior courts. Of the 21,684 appeals from district courts, 15,298 cases (70.5%) were disposed of within 120 days. The high averages result from the disposition of a relatively few long-pending cases: 546 of the felony cases (1.9%) and 302 of the appeals from district court (1.4%) were older than two years at the time of their disposition in 1978.

Ages of Pending Cases

The average age of the 12,157 felony cases pending on December 31, 1978 was 208.8 days; for the 8,772 appeals from district courts still pending on December 31, the average age was 182.4 days.

As the averages indicate, there is a larger "backlog" of long-pending felony cases than of appeals from district court. For both categories, the situation is slightly worse than it was at the end of 1977. The number of felony cases older than two years and still pending on December 31, 1978 (565 cases) is slightly lower than the number older than two years and still pending at the end of 1977 (577 cases); however, the number of felony cases between one and two years old and still pending at the end of 1978 (1,509 cases) is 24% larger than the number of such cases pending at the end of 1977 (1,217 cases). There was also an increase in the number of cases aged between 181 days and one year: 2,235 cases pending December 31, 1978, compared with 2,145 felony cases pending December 31, 1977. Combining all these categories, 4,309 felony cases were six months old or older and still pending on December 31, 1978, compared with 3,939 such cases pending one year before, an increase of 370 cases.

The "backlog" of older appeals from district courts has not grown as much. There were 302 appeals over two years old still pending at the end of 1978, one case fewer than the number of such cases pending at the end of 1977 (303 cases). The number between one and two years old increased 856 cases pending on December 31, 1977 to 951 cases pending on December 31, 1978; this is an increase of 11%. However, there was a decrease in the number aged between 181 days and one year: from 1,582 cases pending at the end of 1977 to 1,463 cases pending at the end of 1978, which amounts to $7\frac{1}{2}$ % decrease.

The date on ages of pending cases and on time from filing to disposition are relevant to the matter of "speedy trials" and the time standards of G.S.15A-701, et seq., which mandate disposition within 120 days of filing for criminal cases filed on or after October 1, 1978. (For cases filed on or after October 1, 1980, the statutes specify disposition within 90 days of filing.) Certain periods of delay are excluded, such as time required for physical or mental examination of a defendant; for other trials involving the defendant; for interlocutory appeals; for hearings on motions; for delay caused by the defendant; for delay agreed to by defendant and prosecutor; and for delay granted by the trial judge for good cause. If a defendant is not brought to trial within the time limits specified by statute or as otherwise prescribed by the trial judge, the criminal charge must be dismissed on motion of the defendent.


Of the 50,797 superior court criminal cases disposed of in 1978, 35,580 (70%) were disposed of in 120 days or less; 15,217 cases (30%) were 121 days old or older at the time of their disposition. Of these, 8,831 were felony cases and 6,386 were appeals from district courts.


Of the cases pending on December 31, 1978, 11,705 were 120 days old or less; 9,224 (44% of the total) were older than 120 days, 5,487 of them felony cases and 3,737 appeals from district court.

It is obvious that a substantial number of superior court criminal cases on which action was completed during 1978 required more than 120 days for disposition, and a substantial number of cases still pending at the end of 1978 had been pending for more than 120 days.

These older cases, filed before October 1, 1978, are not subject to the provisions of the "speedy trial" statutes, of course, but the question might be asked, what conclusions can one draw from these 1978 statistics regarding the likely response of the superior courts to the 120-day standard? No clear-cut answer can be given to this question. The speedy trial statute does not mandate the 120-day standard for all criminal cases irrespective of individual case circumstances. Clearly, many criminal cases will be delayed for good cause, as recognized by the speedy trial statute. This means that the 120-day period will be exceeded in many cases but there will still be full compliance with the statutory provisions. Thus the 1978 data do not tell us whether the implementation of the speedy trial statute will impose any serious strain on available court resources for the handling of criminal cases. Data will be collected during 1979 which will provide information on the extent of dismissals required under the "speedy trial" statutes.


THE DISTRICT COURT DIVISION

The flow of cases through the State's district courts increased considerably in 1978. As the graph below illustrates, filings of both civil and criminal cases increased from 1,327,195 in 1977 to 1,440,378 in 1978. This increase of 113,183 cases (about $8\frac{1}{2}\%$) is nearly twice as large as the increase from 1976 to 1977 (57,195 cases or about $4\frac{1}{2}\%$).

Although case dispositions also increased (from 1,276,225 in 1977 to 1,407,360 in 1978), they did not offset the increase in filings. The result, shown in the graph on the following page, was an increase in the number of cases pending at the end of the year: 209,502 district court cases were pending on December 31, 1977, compared with 242,520 pending on December 31, 1978. This is an increase of 33,018 cases—almost 16%.


It should be noted that the increase in case dispositions (abo.t 10%) was larger than the increase in the number of days of district court held. As the table on the following page shows, 19,217½ days of district court were held in 1977 and 20,194½ in 1978, for an increase of about 5%. It would thus appear that more cases were disposed of each day in court in 1978 than in 1977. The percentage increases in case dispositions and in days of court held were larger, in turn, than the increase in the number of district court judges: authorization for two additional district court judges, effective July 1, 1978, brought the total number of judges for the State to 126, an increase of less than two per cent.

The data on the days of district court held are followed by sections covering district court civil cases, juvenile proceedings, and district court criminal cases.

Filings

A total of 264,120 civil cases were filed in the district courts in 1978, an increase of eight per cent over 1977 filings of 244,655 cases. This increase appears to be consistent with the trend over the past five years, depicted in the bar graph on the following page.

Of the three district court civil case categories, the smallest increase was in domestic relations cases (suits for divorce, custody of a child, payment of support for a child, etc.). Filings of these cases rose 4.9% from 46,996 cases filed in 1977 to 49,311 cases in 1978.

Small claims case filings increased by slightly over 8%, from 158,797 cases filed in 1977 to 171,612 cases filed in 1978. (A small claims case is one in which the amount in dispute is not more than \$500 and the plaintiff requests that the case be assigned to a magistrate for trial. The judgment of the magistrate may be appealed to the district court for trial *de novo*.)

The largest increase came in the category of "general" civil cases (those civil cases within the jurisdiction of the district court which are not domestic relations or small claims cases assigned to magistrates). Filings of such cases increased from 38,862 cases in 1977 to 43,197 cases in 1978, an increase of over 11%.

Dispositions

District court civil case dispositions totalled 254,984 cases in 1978, an increase of $9\frac{1}{2}\%$ over 1977 dispositions of 232,765.

Domestic relations case dispositions increased by 6.4%, from 43,138 cases disposed of in 1977 to 45,913 cases disposed of in 1978. General civil case dispositions went up 7.6% (36,996 cases in 1977 to 39,796 cases in 1978). Small claims case dispositions increased by 11% from 152,631 cases disposed of in 1977 to 169,275 cases disposed of in 1978.

As shown on the table, "District Court Civil Case Dispositions, by Manner of Disposition," each of the three categories has a distinctive pattern of dispositions. Of the general civil cases disposed of in 1978, 331 cases (less than 1%) were disposed of by jury, 12,725 cases (32%) were disposed of by trial before the judge alone, 13,992 cases (35%) were disposed of by "clerk" (i.e., by the entry of a default judgment or a confession of judgment), and the remaining 12,748 cases (32% were disposed of by "other" means such as an out of court settlement between the litigants, a voluntary withdrawal by the plaintiff, or a dismissal by the judge. Of the domestic relations cases, again less than 1% were disposed of by jury trial (a total of 59 cases); however, 86% of the domestic relations cases disposed of in 1978 were disposed of by trial before the judge (39,292 cases), while only 544 cases (about 1%) were disposed of by "clerk" and 6,018 cases (13%) were disposed of by other means. Of the small claims cases, the overwhelming majority (161,153 cases—over 95% of the total) were disposed of by the magistrates to which they were assigned; less than 1%(1,442 cases) were disposed of by "clerk" and less than 4% (6,680 cases) were disposed of by "other" means such as an out of court settlement or a dismissal.

The pattern of disposition of general civil cases in the district courts resembles that of superior court civil cases; in both of these categories, less than a majority of the cases were disposed of by trial before a judge or a judge and jury. (The two differ in that a larger percentage of district court general civil cases are disposed of by "clerk"—i.e., by default or confession of judgment; in superior courts, the most common form of non-trial disposit on is "other": dismissals and out of court settlements.)

The higher rate of dispositions by judge in domestic relations cases may be accounted for by the fact that only a judge can grant a divorce judgment.

Cases Pending

Although district court civil case dispositions increased at a higher rate $(9\frac{1}{270})$ more cases disposed of in 1978 than in 1977) than did filings (8% more cases filed in 1978 than in 1977), filings still outnumbered dispositions and thus the number of cases pending at the end of the year increased. There were 81,494 district court civil cases pending on December 31, 1978, an increase of 9,136 cases (about 12%).

The table "Ratios of District Court Civil Dispositions to Total Caseload, and Ratios of Cases Pending on December 31, 1978 to Cases Disposed of During 1978," shows considerable variation among the counties on these measures of how much of each county's caseload was disposed of during the year and how much remained pending at year's end. (Total caseload is defined as the number of cases pending at the beginning of the year plus the number of cases filed during the year.) In Camden County (ranked first on the ratios), 91.5% of the total 1978 caseload was disposed of during the year; in the 100th-ranked county (Brunswick) 50.3% of the caseload was disposed of. For the State as a whole, 75.8% of the 1978 caseload was disposed of in 1978, a slight improvement over the figure of 75.3% in 1977.

Time from Filing to Disposition

For the 254,984 district court civil cases disposed of in 1978, the *average* time from filing to disposition was 102 days, or slightly less than 3½ months.


It should be noted that the disposition of even a small number of long-pending cases will cause an average such as this one to increase. (Combining the disposition of a single two-year-old case with 10 cases disposed of 30 days after filing produces an "average" time from filing to disposition of 94 days.) Of the district court civil cases disposed of in 1978, 1,496 (less than 1% of the total) were older than four years at the time of disposition, compared with 2.742 such cases disposed of in 1977 (1.2% of 1977 total case dispositions). An additional 8,761 cases (3.4%) were between two and four years old at the time of their disposition in 1978, compared with 6,346 such cases disposed of in 1977. Counting all cases older than one year at the time of disposition, there were 18,565 such dispositions in 1978 (7.3%), an increase over the figure of 16,252 cases older than one year at the time of their disposition in 1977 (7.0% of all 1977 dispositions). The disposition of these long-pending cases raised the average time from filing to disposition to a figure (102 days) higher than might have been expected in light of the fact that over half of the district court civil cases disposed of in 1978 were disposed of in less than 30 days (144,066 cases, 56.5% of the total).

Ages of Pending Cases

The average age of the 81,494 district court civil cases pedding on December 31, 1978 was 392.2 days, or about 13 months.

Little progress towards the disposition of the "backlog" of older district court civil cases was made in 1978. Although there was a 4% decrease in the number between two and four years old (from 10,019 such cases pending on December 31, 1977, to 9,599 pending on December 31, 1978), there was an increase in the number of cases older than four years and still pending (from 2,991 cases on December 31, 1977 to 3,025 cases pending at the end of 1978). And there was a substantial increase in the number of cases between one and two years old and pending at year end (from 14,138 such cases pending at the end of 1977 to 16,455 cases pending at the end of 1978, an increase of over 16%). Counting all cases older than one year, 29,079 district court civil cases were pending on December 31, 1978, comparer with 27,148 cases pending at the end of 1977; this is an increase of 1,931 cases (slightly more than 7%). The cases older than one year and still pending at the end of 1978 made up 36% of all pending cases.


As with the superior courts, there is no official or generally recognized time standard for the disposition of civil cases in district courts. If a one-year standard were to be assumed for purposes of assessment, the figures on the ages of district court civil cases pending on December 31, 1978 would force the conclusion that there is a substantial "backlog" of such cases and that (when the figures for December 31, 1977 are compared) it is getting worse.

JUVENILE PROCEEDINGS

For purposes of the juvenile jurisdiction of the district courts, a "child" is defined, except where a criminal offense is charged, as a person who has not reached his or her *eighteenth* birthday and "is not married, emancipated, or a member of the armed services of the United States." A person who has reached his or her *sixteenth* birthday and who is alleged to have committed a criminal offense is not within the juvenile jurisdiction of the district courts. In addition, a person who has reached his *fourteenth* birthday and is charged with a felony *may* be tried in superior court as an adult; and if the felony charged is a capital offense, the case *must* be transferred to superior court for trial as in the case of adults.

Juvenile proceedings are actions initiated by petitions alleging: (1) that a child is *delinquent* (has committed a criminal offense); (2) that a child is undisciplined (has committed one of the so-called "status offenses"—*i.e.*, is in violation of a statutory requirement imposed only upon children); (3) that a child is dependent (is in need of service because he is without a parent or guardia able to provide for his supervision or care); or (4) that a child is neglected (is not receiving proper supervision or care from his parent or guardian). The first of the following tables shows the number of offenses alleged in delinquency and undisciplined petitions and the numbers of allegations of a dependent or neglected condition, for each county and judicial district. The second table reports on the numbers of hearings held to adjudicate these allegations.

Prior to July 1, 1978, a juvenile could be found delinquent if he were found to have violated the conditions of probation imposed in a previous juvenile court proceeding. The first of the tables thus provides the number of probation violations alleged in delinquency petitions as well as the numbers of capital, other felony, and misdemeanor allegations. Allegations of probation violations dropped from 2,565 in 1977 to 1,883 in 1978. At the same time, allegations of capital offenses increased from 25 to 28; allegations of other felony offenses increased by 4%, from 3,789 to 3,937; and allegations of misdemeanors increased from 6,726 to 6,794 (about 1%). For all four categories, allegations in delinquency petitions dropped from 13,105 in 1977 to 12,642 in 1978, a decrease of $3\frac{1}{2}$ %. There was a corresponding drop in the number of hearings held to adjudicate delinquency petitions—from 12,796 in 1977 to 12,245 in 1978, a decrease of $4\frac{1}{4}$ %.

Allegations in undisciplined petitions also decreased. Allegations of truancy decreased from 1,372 in 1977 to 994 in 1978 (27½%), and allegations of other so-called "status" offenses dropped by 12½%, from 3,195 to 2,792. Combining the two categories, allegations in undisciplined petitions dropped from 4,567 in 1977 to 3,789 in 1978, a decrease of 17%. The number of adjudicatory hearings held on these petitions decreased by 20½%, from 4,943 hearings held in 1977 to 3,934 held in 1978.

There were increases in the remaining two categories. Allegations of dependency rose from 2,375 in 1977.to 2,488 in 1978 (4.8%); adjudicatory hearings on these petitions rose $23\frac{1}{2}$ %, from 2,389 in 1977 to 2,954 in 1978. Allegations of neglect rose $5\frac{1}{4}$ % (2,575 in 1977, 2,710 in 1978); hearings on these petitions increased from 3,180 in 1977 to 3,448 in 1978, an increase of $8\frac{1}{2}$ %.

For all categories, a total of 21,629 offenses or conditions were alleged in juvenile petitions in 1978, a decrease of $4\frac{1}{2}$ % from the 1977 total of 22,622. The number of adjudicatory hearings decreased by 3%, from 23,308 hearings held in 1977 to 22,581 hearings held in 1978. The number of children appearing in juvenile court for the first time also decreased, from 11,838 in 1977 to 11,088 in 1978, a decrease of 6.3%.

Data on these cases were not reported to AOC by case number and filing and disposition dates in 1978. Thus, data on the time from filing to disposition and on the ages of cases pending on December 31, 1978, are not available.

Filings

A total of 1,176,258 criminal cases were filed in the district courts in 1978, an increase of 8.7% over 1977 filings of 1,082,540 cases.

The increase results from a substantial rise in the number of motor vehicle cases filed: from 721,048 cases in 1977 to 815,857 cases in 1978, up 94,809 cases (an increase of over 13%). Non-motor vehicle case filings decreased slightly, from 361,492 cases filed in 1977 to 360,401 cases filed in 1978, which is a drop of less than 1%.

Filings of district court criminal cases in each of the last five years are illustrated by the dark-colored bars in the first of the graphs which follow. The fluctuations in annual filings totals are for the most part attributable to the increases and decreases in motor vehicle case filings; the number of non-motor vehicle cases filed has decreased slightly each year since 1975. Motor vehicle case filings would appear to rise in periods of additional emphasis upon enforcement of speed limits: thus filings increased most sharply in 1975 (when the North Carolina Highway Patrol mounted a special enforcement effort).

Dispositions

A total of 1,152,376 criminal cases were disposed of in the district courts in 1978, an increase of about $10\frac{1}{2}\%$ over 1977 case dispositions of 1,043,460 cases.

Dispositions of motor vehicle cases were responsible for most of this increase, as they rose 15% (from 696,421 cases disposed of in 1977 to 801,787 cases disposed of in 1978) while non-motor vehicle case dispositions increased only 1% (347,039 cases disposed of in 1977, 350,589 cases disposed of in 1978).

The tables on the cases pending, filed and disposed of in 1978 (one for each category, motor vehicle cases and nonmotor vehicle cases) include for the first time in this year's Annul.' Report columns showing the percentage of cases disposed of by waiver of appearance. (Columns showing the numbers of cases dismissed by the District Attorney have also been added this year; previously these cases were included with "other" dispositions.) Waivers of court appearance, with the defendant's plea of guilty and payment of set fine and court costs accepted by a magistrate or the clerk's office, make up the majority of motor vehicle case dispositions (60.5% in 1978) and a substantial portion of non-motor vehicle case dispositions (12.9% in 1978). Combining these two case categories, 46% of all district court criminal cases disposed of in 1978 were disposed of by defendant's waiver of appearance-530,068 cases; this is a substantial increase over the 450,745 waivers in 1977 (43.2% of all 1977 case dispositions).

The differing waiver rates of the two case categories is to be expected: waiver of appearance is permitted for a large number of the motor vehicle offenses but for only one non-motor vehicle offense (worthless check).

A majority of the felony cases filed in North Carolina are filed first in district court for a preliminary hearing; if the judge finds probable cause to believe that the defendant has committed a felony, the case will be transferred to superior court for trial. A total of 22,043 district court criminal cases were disposed of by preliminary hearing in 1978, slightly less than 2% of the total case dispositions. (The 1977 total was 21,199 cases disposed of by preliminary hearing, slightly above 2% of all 1977 district court criminal case dispositions.) Since few of the criminal offenses defined in the motor vehicles chapter of the General Statutes are felonies, the number of motor vehicle offenses disposed of by preliminary hearing is relatively small (1,703 cases disposed of in 1978, about one-fifth of one percent of all 1978 motor vehicle case dispositions). In contrast, 20,340 non-motor vehicle criminal cases were disposed of by preliminary hearing in 1978, 5.8% of the total non-motor vehicle case dispositions.

Of the district court criminal cases not disposed of by waiver or preliminary hearing, 74,001 cases (6.4% of all 1978 dispositions) were disposed of by trial following a plea of not guilty. A total of 296,347 cases (26%) were disposed of following a plea of guilty or *nolo contendere* before the judge or (for certain non-motor vehicle offenses) a magistrate; 155,667 cases ($13\frac{1}{2}\%$) were disposed of by dismissal by the district attorney; and 74,250 cases ($6\frac{1}{2}\%$) were disposed of by other means.

Cases Pending

Because the total number of district court criminal cases filed in 1978 again exceeded the total number disposed of in 1978, there was an increase in the number of cases pending at the end of the year: from 137,144 cases pending on December 31, 1977 to 161,026 cases pending on December 31, 1978, an increase of 23,882 cases, or about 17%. The five-year trend in the numbers of district court criminal cases pending at year end is shown in the second of the following bar graphs. Following a slight decrease in 1975, the number of cases pending on December 31 has risen significantly in each of the last three years.

As is shown on the table, "Ratios of District Court Criminal Dispositions to Total Caseload, and Ratios of Cases Pending on December 31, 1978 to Cases Disposed of During 1978," 87.7% of the total district court criminal caseload was disposed of during the year. (Total caseload includes the number of cases pending at the beginning of the year as well as the number filed during the year.) This is a slight improvement: 87.3% of the 1977 total caseload was disposed of in 1977. The variation among the individual counties on these measures is the lowest of any of the major case categories, but it is not insubstantial: in the county ranked first (Camden), 96.9% of the caseload was disposed of by the end of the year, while in the 100thranked county (Durham), 64.2% of the caseload was disposed of.

Time from Filing to Disposition

The 801,787 motor vehicle criminal cases disposed of in 1978 were, on the average, disposed of 39.1 days after filing; the average time from filing to disposition for the 350,589 non-motor vehicle cases disposed of in 1978 was 43.9 days.

These averages are substantially lower than those for any criter major case category (district court civil cases, superior court civil and superior court criminal cases). Almost two-thirds of the district court criminal cases (752,508 cases, 65.3%) disposed of in 1978 were disposed of in less than 30 days. An overwhelming majority (1,080,876 cases, 93.8%) of 1978 dispositions were within 120 days of filing.

These figures, of course, include those cases disposed of by waiver of appearance. Such cases, which do not require the resources of the trial courts, are generally disposed of within 30 days of filing, and as indicated earlier, they constitute a substantial portion of the district court criminal cases disposed of. A separate computation of the average time from filing to disposition of just those cases *not* disposed of by waiver in 1978 was not performed; there can be no doubt, however, that the average time from filing to disposition of non-waived cases was considerably higher than the lower figures reported above.


Ages of Pending Cases

The average age of the 102,713 motor vehicle cases pending on December 31, 1978 was 136.8 days, about $4\frac{1}{2}$ months. Of the 58,313 non-motor vehicle cases still pending at the end of 1978, the average age was 221.3 days—over 7 months. Of the total district court criminal caseload pending on December 31 (161,026 cases), 56,577 cases (35.1%) had been pending for more than 120 days.


As of December 31, 1977, 7,313 district court criminal cases older than two years were still pending in the district courts; by December 31, 1978, there were 4,951 over two years old pending, a decrease of 2,362 cases. However there was an increase of 9,253 cases in the number between one and two years old: 8,321 such cases were pending at the end of 1977 and 17,574 (more than double) were pending at the end of 1978. Combining these two categories, 15,634 cases over one year old had been left pending on December 31, 1977 and 22,525 cases over one year were still pending on December 31, 1978, an increase of 44%. In sum, the situation on ages of pending cases at the end of 1978.

As noted in the section, "Superior Court Criminal Cases," the "speedy trial" provisions of G. S 15A-701, et seq., mandating dispositions of all criminal cases filed on or after October 1, 1978 within 120 days of filing, permit delays for certain good causes. Whether an individual case may be dismissed because of failure to meet the statutory standard, then, will necesarily be decided on a case-by-case basis. Thus the fact that 35% of the district court criminal cases pending on December 31, 1978 were older than 120 days does not provide a basis for speculation as to the possible number of cases which might be dismissed under the "speedy trial" statutes. (As noted earlier, data which will provide information on the extent of dismissals required by these statutes will be collected during 1979.)

Organizational, Administrative, Fiscal And Directory Information

"The General Assembly shall provide for an administrative office of the courts to carry out the provisions of this Article."

N. C. Constitution, Art. III, Sec. 15

THE NORTH CAROLINA COURT SYSTEM

North Carolina's court system is a structure of three tiers known collectively as the General Court of Justice. The three levels correspond to a division of judicial labor within the unified court system to accommodate these essential functions: review of cases (Appellate Division); trial of major cases (Superior Court Division); and trial of the large volume of minor cases (District Court Division).

Appellate Division

Supreme Court. At the apex of the judicial structure is the seven-member Supreme Court, which sits in Raleigh to review procedural questions and interpretations of the law arising from the lower courts. The court's caseload consists of lower court actions involving the death penalty or life imprisonment, substantial constitutional questions, dissent at the Court of Appeals level, utilities ratemaking decisions, or the exercise of the Supreme Court's own discretionary review. Supreme Court justices are elected by popular vote for eight-year terms.

Court of Appeals. The 12-judge intermediate Court of Appeals sits in panels of three in Raleigh and hears the great volume of appeals originating in the State court system. Court of Appeals judges are elected for terms of eight years.

Superior Court Division

As required by the North Carolina Constitution, at least two sessions of superior court are held annually in each county of the state; the 100 counties comprise 32 judicial districts. As of December 31, 1978, there are 58 regular and eight special superior court judges. North Carolina carries the rotation of its trial judges to a greater degree than any other state. A regular superior court judge is required to rotate through the judicial districts within his geographic quarter of the State, holding court for six months in each district, and then moving on to the next assignment. Regular judges are elected for eight-year terms. Special judges are appointed by the governor for four-year terms and may be assigned to hold court in any county in the state.

The superior court is a trial court of general jurisdiction and is the "proper" court for civil cases involving more than \$5,000 in controversy. The criminal jurisdiction of the superior court extends to all felonies and some misdemeanors, including misdemeanor charges that are closely connected with felony charges as well as misdemeanor convictions at the district court level which are appealed for a new trial in superior court.

District Court Division

This level of the trial court in North Carolina has limited jurisdiction, extending to misdemeanors, and is the proper court for civil cases involving \$5,000 or less. The major portion of all cases filed in the State's courts is disposed of in the district court division.

District Court Judges. There are 126 district court judges as of December 31, 1978, elected to four-year terms. District court judges hold court in rotation among the counties in their district. The 32 districts at this level of court correspond to the superior court judicial districts.

For civil cases involving \$5,000 or less, the district court is the proper division for trial, which can include a jury. In criminal matters, the district court's jurisdiction extends to all misdemeanors and to preliminary hearings on felony charges; trial of misdemeanors is without a jury. This court division also has jurisdiction of proceedings involving juveniles.

Magistrates. There are more than 500 magistrates as of December 31, 1978. Magistrates are nominated in each county by the clerk of superior court, appointed by the senior resident superior court judge, and work under the supervision of the chief district court judge. Magistrates are officers of the district court, paid by the state, and in many cases work part-time. Their civil jurisdiction includes small claims involving \$500 or less. In criminal matters, the magistrate tries worthless check cases involving \$50 or less, accepts guilty pleas in cases involving no more than a \$50 fine or a 30 day jail sentence, issues warrants, and conducts first appearance hearings.

Other Key Officials

District Attorneys. The state is divided into prosecutorial districts that correspond with the judicial districts, and a district attorney is elected to a four-year term for each of the 32 districts. The responsibility of the district attorney and his assistants is to represent the state in criminal and certain juvenile matters. The district attorney is responsible for the calendaring of criminal cases.

Public Defenders. As of December 31, 1978, there are five public defenders in North Carolina (serving Judicial Districts 12, 18, 26, 27A and 28) who provide legal representation for persons determined to be indigent. In unusual circumstances, such as the existence of a conflict of interests, an indigent in one of these districts may be represented by private counsel, appointed by the court and paid a fee for his legal services by the State; in the other 26 districts this assigned private counsel system is the only one employed. The public defender for the 28th district is appointed by the senior resident superior court judge from recommendations by the district bar; for the other districts, the appointment is by the governor from recommendations of the district bar. Their terms are four years. Each public defender is by statute provided one full-time assistant; additional full-time or part-time assistants may be authorized by the Administrative Office of the Courts.

A person is determined to be indigent if he is found "financially unable to secure legal representation." He is entitled to State-paid legal representation in: confinement, a fine of \$500 or more, or extradition to another state; a proceeding alleging mental illness of incapacity which may result in hospitalization, sterilization, or the loss of certain property rights; and juvenile proceedings which may result in confinement, transfer to superior court for a felony trial, or a transfer of custody upon a finding of neglect.

Clerks of Superior Court. The clerk of superior court maintains a system of records for both the district and superior courts. Thus, there is one trial court clerk in each of the 100 counties, elected for a four-year term. The clerk is also judge of probate and special proceedings. He is authorized to issue warrants and accept trial waivers in traffic cases.

Juvenile Court Counselors. There are from four to twenty-four juvenile court counselors in each judicial district of the state. As part of their "intake" responsibilities, the counselors screen complaints regarding children to determine whether petitions should be filed in juvenile court or some other means should be used to solve the problem. The counselors also exercise probation responsibilities for juveniles assigned to counseling within the community, and they provide aftercare supervision for children conditionally released from training schools.

THE NORTH CAROLINA JUDICIAL PLANNING COMMITTEE IN 1978

A Judicial Planning Committee for North Carolina was appointed by the Supreme Court of North Carolina in September 1977, pursuant to Section 203(c) of the Federal Crime Control Act of 1976 and Section 143B-339 of the North Carolina General Statutes (as amended in 1977). Under the Federal legislation, State judicial planning committees are given a special role in planning for judicial departments under the LEAA program, and specifically in the allocation of LEAA funds to judicial department projects. In addition, the Federal legislation encourages State judicial planning committees to examine, assess, and recommend measures for the improvement of State court systems regardless of the sources of funding. The State statute is similarly broad in the scope of responsibility assigned to the North Carolina Judicial Planning Committee.

Staff assistance for the Judicial Planning Committee is provided by the Research and Planning Division of the Administrative Office of the Courts.

The Committee met in Raleigh on April 14, 1978 and heard staff reports concerning the Committee's role and functions in planning improvements for the Judicial Department as well as approving a Judicial Plan for the allocation of LEAA funds. The Committee then considered specific project allocations for the 1978-79 State plan for LEAA funding, and concluded that the following projects should be covered by LEAA funds made available to the Judicial Department:

- (1) \$855,000, for development and implementation of electronic data processing for North Carolina courts;
- (2) \$82,500, to complete the "career criminal prosecution" project which had been started with previous LEAA funding in the 12th District, and to fund projects in one or more districts to achieve more

efficient coordination of the attendance of witnesses in criminal trials;

- (3) \$50,000, for research and reporting on sentencing;
- (4) \$201,333, for Judicial Department education and training activity (not including the juvenile justice area);
- (5) \$220,000, for Judicial Department education and training activity in the juvenile justice area;
- (6) \$45,000, for development and implementation of electronic data processing for Judicial Department juvenile justice activity; and
- (7) \$150,000, for a pilot-project program of consultation with troubled juveniles and their families before the juvenile becomes involved in court proceedings.

With the exception of some reduction in the amounts for juvenile justice education and training activity and for the pilot-project program of consultation with troubled juveniles prior to their involvement in court proceedings, the proposals of the Judicial Planning Committee were approved by the Governor's Crime Commission and included in the overall State LEAA plan for 1978-79.

The Judicial Planning Committee met in Raleigh on October 27, 1978. At that meeting the Committee heard a report on the special study of North Carolina courthouse facilities which was published in September, 1978. The Committee also received a report on coordination of attendance of witnesses at criminal trials, as handled in the several judicial districts throughout the State, and a report on the utilization of a trial court administrator position in the 10th, 22nd and 28th Judicial Districts. Special reports were presented on the issue of an additional district court judge for the First Judicial District and the 29th Judicial District.

THE NORTH CAROLINA JUDICIAL COUNCIL IN 1978

The Judicial Council has been in continuous existence since it was established by the 1949 General Assembly. The membership,² terms of office, and the duties of the Council are described in Article 31 of Chapter 7A of the North Carolina General Statutes.

During 1978 the Council worked upon several proposals to be covered in the 16th Report of the Council, scheduled to be submitted to the Governor and General Assembly early in 1979. These included the following:

- (1) revision of Article 6, Chapter 16 of the General Statutes relating to homicide, with particular reference to affirmative defenses;
- (2) revision of the statutes to extend the time of coverage of bail bonds;
- (3) amendment to make clear that a jury proceeding is

not required to determine the sentence in a capital case where there is no evidence of an aggravating circumstance (and under the law the sentence must in any event be life imprisonment);

- (5) amendment to prohibit conviction as accessory before the fact on an indictment charging the principal felony;
- (6) amendment to change the punishment for burglary from life imprisonment to not less than ten (10) years or life;
- (7) amendment to change the punishment of accessory before the fact for certain felonies to a term of years or for life; and
- (8) amendment relating to the procedure for selection of alternate jurors.

THE JUDICIAL STANDARDS COMMISSION IN 1978

The Judicial Standards Commission was established by the General Assembly pursuant to a constitutional amendment approved by the voters at the general election in November, 1972. The membership consists of a Court of Appeals judge, a superior court judge, and a district court judge, each appointed by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court; two members of the State Bar, elected by the State Bar Council; and two citizens who are not judges nor members of the State Bar, appointed by the Governor. The Court of Appeals judge serves as chairman of the Commission.

Upon recommendation of the Commission, the Supreme Court may censure or remove any justice or judge for willful misconduct in office, willful and persistent failure to perform his dutues, habitual intemperance, conviction of a crime involving moral turpitude, or conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice that brings the judicial office into disrepute. Upon recommendation of the Commission, the Supreme Court may remove any justice or judge for mental or physical incapacity interfering with the performance of his duties, which is, or is likely to become, permanent.

A complaint or other information against a judge, whether filed with the Commission or by action of the Commission on its own motion, is designated as an "Inquiry Concerning a Judge." There were seventy-two "Inquiries Concerning a Judge" during 1978, including three inquiries carried over from 1977.

Nine of these seventy-two inquiries were received near

the end of 1978 and were awaiting initial action by the Commission.

Thirty-nine of these inquiries were determined by the Judicial Standards Commission to involve subject matter not within the Commission's jurisdiction.

Thirteen inquiries were determined by the Commission to involve subject matter within its jurisdiction but which did not warrant any further proceeding by the Commission.

Eleven inquiries were determined by the Commission to require preliminary investigation.

In one of the eleven inquiries in which preliminary investigations were ordered, the investigation had not been completed at the end of the year.

In two of the eleven inquiries in which preliminary investigations were ordered, the investigations were completed and the inquiries awaited further action by the Commission.

There were six inquiries in which the preliminary investigation was completed, and the Commission determined that no further action was justified.

There were two inquiries in which the preliminary investigations were completed, formal hearings were conducted, and recommendations of removal were filed with the Supreme Court of North Carolina.

The Supreme Court of North Carolina, in *In re Martin*, 295 N.C. 291 (1978), declined to follow the recommendation of the Judicial Standards Commission for removal and instead imposed a censure of the respondent judge. The Supreme Court of North Carolina concurred in the recommendation of the Judicial Standards Commission for removal of a judge which disqualified him from holding further judicial office and made him ineligible to receive retirement benefits. *In re Peoples*, 296 N.C. 109 (1978).

JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY IN 1978

- a conference on adolescent behavior, January 12-14 in Southern Pines, attended by 11 judges who regularly hear juvenile cases;
- a conference on alternative ways of disposing of juvenile cases, May 5-6 in Greensboro, attended by 42 judges;
- the Summer Seminar of the Association of District Court Judges, June 11-14 in Winston-Salem, attended by 77 judges;
- a conference on juveniles with learning disabilities, September 15-16 in Burlington, attended by 32 judges; and
- -- the Fall Seminar, October 19-21 in Asheville, attended by 87 judges.

District Attorneys

- two Spring Conferences, April 25-28 and May 9-12 at the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill, attended by 15 district attorneys and 95 assistant district attorneys;
- the District Attorneys Association Summer Conference, June 11-14 in Asheville, attended by 21 district attorneys and 83 assistant district attorneys;
- a conference for administrative assistants, June 11-14 at the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill, attended by 20 administrative assistants, 1 investigator and 1 secretary;
- the District Attorneys Association Fall Training Conference, October 26-28 in Chapel Hill, attended by 11 district attorneys and 71 assistant district attorneys; and
- an orientation session for new prosecutors, October 17-20 at the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill,

attended by 24 new assistant district attorneys, 1 administrative assistant and 1 investigator.

Public Defenders

- a Spring Training Session, May 18-19 at the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill, attended by 3 public defenders and 22 assistant public defenders; and
- a Fall Training Session, October 11-13 in Chapel Hill, attended by 5 public defenders and 21 assistant public defenders.

Clerks of Superior Court

- the Annual Conference of the Association of Clerks of Superior Court, July 26-28 in Nags Head, attended by 68 clerks; and
- the Annual Conference of the Association of Assistant and Deputy Clerks of Superior Court, July 19-21 in Charlotte, attended by 210 assistant and deputy clerks.

Magistrates

- two sessions of basic training for new magistrates, February 1-10 and July 17-21/July 31-August 4 at the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill, attended by a total of 56 magistrates;

- a mandatory refresher course for chief court counselors and administrative personnel, November 8-10 in Whispering Pines, attended by 50 persons;

- a conference on administrative responsibility for chief court counselors and administrative personnel, April 4-6 in Burlington, attended by 33 persons;
- a course for secretaries who deal regularly with troubled adolescents, May 3-4 in Winston-Salem and May 9-10 in Goldsboro, attended by 41 secretaries; and
- 12 different special-interest courses in counseling techniques and theories, presented in a total of 28 different sessions across the State, with a total attendance of 465.

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

JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT APPROPRIATION FROM THE GENERAL FUND

Fiscal Year, July 1, 1977 - June 30, 1978

Appropriations from the State's General Fund for *operating expenses* for all departments and agencies of state government, including the Judicial Department, totalled \$2,193,540,024 for the 1977-78 fiscal year. (Appropriations from the Highway Fund and appropriations from the General Fund for capital improvements are not included in this total.)

The appropriation from the General Fund for operating expenses of the Judicial Department for fiscal year 1977-78 was \$56,319,115, or 2.6% of the total General Fund appropriations for operating expenses of all state departments and agencies.




JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT EXPENDITURES

JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT RECEIPTS

Fiscal Year, July 1, 1977 – June 30, 1978

During the 1977-78 fiscal year the Judicial Department had receipts totalling \$46,204,962.18, an increase of 12% over total receipts of \$41,250,936.40 for the 1976-77 fiscal year.

As required by the State Constitution, fines, penalties, and forfeitures collected by the courts in criminal cases are distributed to the respective counties in which the cases are tried. These funds must be used by the counties for the support of the public schools.

A uniform schedule of court costs for civil and criminal cases, comprised of a variety of fees, is set by statute for cases filed in the superior and district courts. Statutes prescribe the distribution of these fees and provide that certain fees shall be devoted to specific uses. For example, a facilities fee is included in court costs when costs are assessed, and this fee is paid over to the respective county or municipality which provided the facility used in the case. These fees must be utilized by the counties and municipalities to provide and maintain courtrooms and related judicial facilities.

Officer Fees (for arrest or service of process) are included, where applicable, in the costs of each case filed in the tria courts. If a municipal officer performed these services in a case, the fee is paid over to the respective municipality. Otherwise, all officer fees are paid to the respective counties in which the cases are filed. A jail fee is included in the costs of each case where applicable; and these fees are distributed to the respective county or municipality whose facilities were used. Most jail facilities in the State are provided by the counties.

A fee for the Law Enforcement Officers Benefit and Retirement Fund is included as a part of court costs when costs are assessed in a criminal case. As required by statute, the Judicial Department remits these fees to the State Treasurer, for deposit in the Law Enforcement Officers Benefit and Retirement Fund.

Except as indicated, all superior and district court costs collected by the Judicial Department are paid into the State's General Fund.

When private counsel or a public defender is assigned to represent an indigent defendant in a criminal case the trial judge sets the money value for the services rendered. If the defendant is convicted, a judgment lien is entered against him for such amount. Collections on these judgments are paid into the State's General Fund, as are appellate court fees and proceeds from the sales of appellate division reports.

COST AND CASE DATA IN REPRESENTATION OF INDIGENTS

Fiscal Year, July 1, 1977 — June 30, 1978

The State provides legal counsel for indigent persons in a variety of actions and proceedings, as specified in the North Carolina General Statutes, Section 7A-450 *et seq.* These include criminal proceedings, judicial hospitalization proceedings, juvenile proceedings that may result in commitment to an institution or transfer to superior court for trial as an adult. Legal representation for indigents may be by assignment of private counsel, by assignment of special public counsel (involving mental hospital commitments), or by assignment of a public defender.

Five of North Carolina's judicial districts have an office of public defender: the 12th, 18th, 26th, 27th, and 28th districts. The other 27 judicial districts utilize only assignment of private counsel. Private counsel is also assigned in the five districts which have a public defender in the event of a conflict of interests involving the public defender's office and the indigent and in the event of unusual circumstances when, in the opinion of the court, the proper administration of justice requires the assignment of private counsel rather than the public defender in those cases.

In addition, the State provides a full-time Special Counsel at each of the State's four mental hospitals, to represent patients in commitment or recommitment hearings before a district court judge. Under State law, each patient committed to a mental hospital is entitled to a judicial hearing (before a district court judge) within 90 days after the initial commitment, a further hearing within 180 days after the initial commitment, and thereafter a hearing once each year during the continuance of an involuntary commitment.

The cost of the entire program of indigent representation, rounded to the nearest dollar, was \$5,162,652 in the 1977-78 fiscal year, compared to \$4,869,632 in the 1976-77 fiscal year, an increase of six percent. The total amount expended for representation of indigents was 9.5% of total Judicial Department expenditures in the 1977-78 fiscal year.

Payments for assigned counsel in adult cases accounted for 95.5% of total expenditures for assigned counsel, and juvenile case payments accounted for 4.5%.

Following is a summary of case and cost data for representation of indigents, for the fiscal year, July 1, 1977 through June 30, 1978.

The total cost of providing special counsel at each of the State's four mental hospitals, o represent patients in commitment or recommitment hearings, was \$149,796 for the 1977-78 fiscal year. There were a total of 10,588 hearings *during the fiscal year*, for an average cost per hearing of \$14.15.
