TO THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE JUDICIAL CONFERENCE COMMITTEE  
TO IMPLEMENT THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE ACT.

The following is a report of activities relating to the Criminal Justice Act (CJA) during fiscal year 1978 (FY 78) which ended on September 30, 1978.

Status of Appropriations

The Congress appropriated \$24,000,000 for "Defender Services" for FY 78. This amount included funds, estimated at \$350,000, for the liquidation of obligations which were carried forward from the previous fiscal year. The current estimate of obligations for FY 78 is \$23,015,000 as follows:

The balance of the funds appropriated, estimated at \$635,000, will remain available to cover obligations in 1979.

Representation in Federal Courts

During FY 78 approximately 45,000 persons were represented in the United States courts pursuant to the provisions of the CJA. This compares with 46,052 appointments in FY 77 and 55,649 appointments in FY 76 which

covered the 15 month period from July 1, 1975, through September 30, 1976. If we exclude the three month transition quarter, for comparison purposes, 44,192 persons were represented in FY 76. The number of appointments in FY 78 was thus 2.3% less than the comparable period in FY 77 and 1.8% more than the comparable period in FY 76.

The following tables compare case assignments and CJA funding distribution among CJA panel attorneys, Federal Public Defenders and Community Defenders for fiscal years 76, 77 and 78.

The decrease in CJA appointments in FY 78 may be attributed to a number of factors:

1. In November, 1977, the Department of Justice (DOJ) announced that it was fashioning an anti-crime program with four priorities: organized crime, narcotics, public corruption and white collar crime. Judiciary caseload statistics for 1978 reflect that criminal filings decreased by 13.5% from their 1977 level and have decreased 10.0% from their 1970 level, while civil filings during statistical year 1978 rose by 6.3% and have increased by 58.9% since 1970. Only two major criminal offense categories experienced significant increases in 1978 over 1977 - prosecutions under the weapons and firearms statutes were up 7.6% and immigration law prosecutions rose by 20.8%.

2. Significant vacancies and personnel turnover within U. S. Attorneys' Offices which historically follow a change in Executive Administration generally result in a reduction of case filings.

3. In statistical year 1978, U. S. Attorneys tended to refer more federal/state law violations to the States for prosecution. There was also an emphasis on civil litigation by many U. S. Attorneys. Over the last two statistical years, pending criminal cases in federal courts have been reduced by 19.7% whereas pending civil cases have increased by 18.7%.

The full impact of the Speedy Trial Act on CJA appointments has yet to be determined. Several Speedy Trial Planning Groups have stated that the ultimate effects of the Act would not be known until the time limits are enforced with sanctions beginning July 1, 1979. According to several Speedy Trial Planning Groups, some U. S. Attorneys have adopted a policy of delaying arrest until after indictment, a practice which affords the government an opportunity to prepare a case before the Speedy Trial limits commence to run, and may reduce the number of cases filed. Thus, it appears that the Act has had some influence in reducing the pending criminal case-load and the number of criminal cases filed.

It is anticipated that the combined effect of fully staffed U. S. Attorney offices, the appointment of additional federal judges and the continued operation of the prisoner transfer program will cause criminal filings and thus CJA appointments to rise in FY 79.

Panel Attorney Representation  
Average Payments to Counsel

The following table provides actual average payments to panel attorneys for fiscal years 74 through 78, and those estimated for panel attorneys for fiscal years 77 through 80. These figures include compensation and reimbursement pursuant to subsection (d), but do not include costs of transcripts, expert, and other services (which figures are provided infra).

The estimates for fiscal years 78 through 80 are based on the currently authorized compensation rates. It should be noted, however, that legislation might be reintroduced in the 96th Congress which would increase hourly rates of compensation and the statutory maximums. The 95th Congress considered, but did not enact, legislation (S. 1437 & H.R. 6869) which would have increased both hourly rates and statutory maximums by 50%.

Average payments to counsel have risen over the years and in all probability will continue to increase due to more complex and protracted litigation and a greater number of claims for excess compensation being approved by the chief judges of the courts of appeals. An increase in the reimbursable expenses of attorneys due to inflationary pressures is also a contributing factor.

Average payments to counsel for services rendered in the courts of appeals for FY 78, based on claims processed as of November 30, 1978, ranged from \$549 in the First Circuit to \$951 in the Second. The average for all circuits was \$758.

Payments for district court representations during the same period ranged from a low average of \$68 in the Southern District of California to a high of \$956 in the Middle District of Florida. The modest average for the Southern District of California is largely influenced by the more than 2,200 material witnesses who were represented under the CJA in FY 78. These cases represent more than 70% of the district's total assignments. The average for all districts was \$286.

Exhibits A-1 and A-2 present for fiscal years 77 and 78, the various categories for which counsel were provided, together with costs relating to such representation. Exhibits B-1 and B-2 contain the number and types of appointments made during fiscal years 77 and 78 in each circuit and district. Exhibits C-1 and C-2 provide details regarding the number of persons represented and the payment made to counsel in each circuit and district during fiscal years 77 and 78.

#### Compensation for Extended or Complex Representation

In the preceding section a reference was made to the anticipated increase in the number of claims for excess compensation and the resulting impact on average costs per case assignment. The following table reflects excess compensation payments processed as of the close of each fiscal year since FY 75:

Between fiscal years 75 and 78 excess payments have increased by 68.0% in felony cases; 12.0% in discretionary matters; and 318.0% in expert and other services claims. However, the number of excess compensation claims for felony cases and discretionary appointments appear to have decreased substantially between fiscal years 77 and 78. This reduction is, to some extent, based on delays in the submission of claims for excess compensation. It is projected that FY 78 excess compensation felony claims will approach the FY 77 level as the submission and processing of claims are expedited.

In FY 78, the 203 payments for compensation in excess of \$1,000 in felony cases averaged \$2,532. The largest payment amounted to \$15,000 for representation in a mail fraud case in the District of Columbia. Exhibit D-1 summarizes, by circuit and district, all approved payments for compensation in excess of \$1,000 for extended or complex felony cases for FY 77 while Exhibit D-2 presents similar data for FY 78.

In FY 78, only nine claims for compensation in excess of \$400 for extended or complex representation in misdemeanor cases had been approved by the end of the fiscal year. The largest of these payments was \$1,000 for representation provided in a tax fraud case. The average of all such payments was \$696. Exhibit E-1 lists the payments for FY 77 in this category. Exhibit E-2 provides the same data for FY 78.

With regard to extended or complex discretionary appointments in FY 78, 42 claims in excess of \$250 were approved by the end of the fiscal year. The largest payment was \$2,321 for a habeas corpus petition and the average for all matters was \$624. Exhibits F-1 and F-2 list payments for this category of excess compensation for fiscal years 77 and 78, respectively.

In FY 78, a total of 98 claims for compensation for expert and other services of an unusual character or duration were approved and paid as of September 30, 1978. The largest single payment was \$4,128 for an interpreter in the Western District of New York, and the average was \$780. Exhibit G-1 lists all such payments by circuit and district for FY 77. Exhibit G-2 provides this data for FY 78.

Transcripts, Investigative, Expert  
and Other Services

As of November 30, 1978, a total of \$1,842,486 was paid from the FY 78 CJA appropriation for transcripts, investigative, expert and other services. Current estimates are that, as the remaining claims attributable to FY 78 are approved and paid, the total cost for FY 78 will amount to \$2,482,000. The following tables reflect the cost of providing these services from FY 74 through FY 77 and estimates for FY 78 through FY 80.

The \$360,000 increase in the cost of transcripts in FY 76 compared with FY 75 was largely attributable to increased transcript page rates which became effective on November 1, 1976.

The projected increases for transcripts and other services in 1979 and 1980 are based on past experience, inflation and an anticipated increase in the number of persons to be represented compared to FY 78.

Exhibits H-1 and H-2 provide a detailed breakdown of all costs attributable to transcripts, investigative, expert and other services by circuit and district for fiscal years 77 and 78 as of November 30, 1978.

#### Federal Public Defender Organizations

Five Federal Public Defender programs began operations in FY 78, and two additional branch offices were authorized for FY 79. Florida (Northern) established its main office in Pensacola and a branch office in Tallahassee. Florida (Middle) is headquartered in Tampa, has a branch in Jacksonville, and funding in FY 79 for a second branch office was approved by the Judicial Conference in September, 1978. Tennessee (Middle) established its office in Nashville. Illinois (Eastern and Southern) -- the first Federal Public Defender office which represents persons in two adjacent judicial districts -- based its operations in East St. Louis, Illinois. In addition, a full-time Federal Public Defender office for the District of Minnesota has replaced a part-time Community Defender Organization within that judicial district. A new branch office in the Western District of Washington (Tacoma) commenced operations in October, 1978.

Although a final accounting has not yet been completed, the cost of operating the 31 Federal Public Defender offices during FY 78 is estimated to have been \$7,371,000 or \$878,708 (11.0%) less than was authorized. Approximately 85.0% of the funds provided for the operation of the 31 FPD offices in FY 78 were expended for personnel compensation and benefits. A total of 14,578 cases were opened by Federal Public Defenders in FY 78 and 14,504 were closed. This includes 853 miscellaneous inmate requests by federal prisoners of the U. S. Medical Center in Springfield, Missouri, which were responded to by the Missouri (Western) Federal Public Defender office. As was the case last year, the highest volume during FY 78 was experienced by the Central District of California (1,636 case openings and 1,727 case closings). Exhibit I reflects the openings, closings, hours expended in court, and pending caseload for the 31 reporting offices for FY 78. Based upon original budget submission projections, Federal Public Defenders overall realized 82.5% of their anticipated caseload, a 6.0% increase in shortfall from FY 77 when Federal Public Defenders realized 88.5% of their anticipated caseload.

#### Community Defender Organizations

Grants to Community Defender Organizations totalled \$3,347,023 for FY 78 and those authorized for FY 79 totalled \$3,542,194.

The following table details the Community Defender grant allocations for fiscal years 78 and 79.

The eight Community Defender Organizations were assigned 6,396 cases and closed 6,726 cases during FY 78.

The highest volume of cases was realized by the Federal Defender Services Unit of the Legal Aid Society of New York with 1,942 openings and 1,870 closings. Exhibit J summarizes the case openings, case closings, hours expended in court and pending caseloads for all eight organizations in FY 78. Based upon original budget submission projections made in December, 1976, Community Defenders overall realized 85.1% of their anticipated caseload, a 3.4% increase in shortfall from FY 77 when Community Defenders realized 88.5%, of their anticipated caseload.


The shortfall amounted to 1,118 cases overall in FY 78. Actual cost of operations for FY 78 are expected to amount to approximately \$3,043,407 or about 91.0% of the funding authorized. It is anticipated that Community Defenders will refund a total of \$329,769. Over \$280,000 of this unobligated balance represents refunds by two Community Defender Organizations: the Eastern District of Michigan, (\$142,688) which realized 62.0% of its original FY 78 caseload estimate; and the Southern District of California, (\$137,508) which realized 70.8% of its initial FY 78 caseload forecast.

Comparative Costs of Representation  
By Panel Attorneys, Federal Public  
Defenders and Community Defenders

Average compensation to panel attorneys for FY 78 (district and appeals courts) is expected to reach \$440 per case. This figure does not include the cost of investigative, interpreter, psychiatric and other expert services. Such expenditures are expected to add another \$14 per case thereby raising the average cost of panel attorney representation to \$454. The estimated average cost per case for FY 77 was \$430 plus \$13 for expert and other services or a total of \$443 per case. The estimated increase amounts to \$11 per case or 2.5%.

Based on current estimates, Federal Public Defender costs will average \$524 per case in FY 78. This figure excludes the 853 Missouri (Western) inmate requests, and nonrecurring costs of newly established offices. This compares with an average cost of \$450 in FY 77 or an increase of 16.0%. The highest cost Federal Public Defender Office in FY 78 was the Western District of Pennsylvania, with an average cost of \$1,004 per case; while the lowest was the Southern District of Texas, with an average cost of \$293 per case. 1/

The average cost per case for Community Defenders in FY 78 is expected to be \$464, or an increase of 16.0% over the \$400 average for FY 77. The highest cost community defender office in FY 78 was the Federal Defender, Inc., in the District of Oregon, with an average cost per case of \$690; while the lowest was the Defender Association of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania (E), with an average cost of \$329 per case.




## UNITED STATES COURTS OF APPEALS


## UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURTS


## UNITED STATES DISTRICT AND APPEALS COURTS


