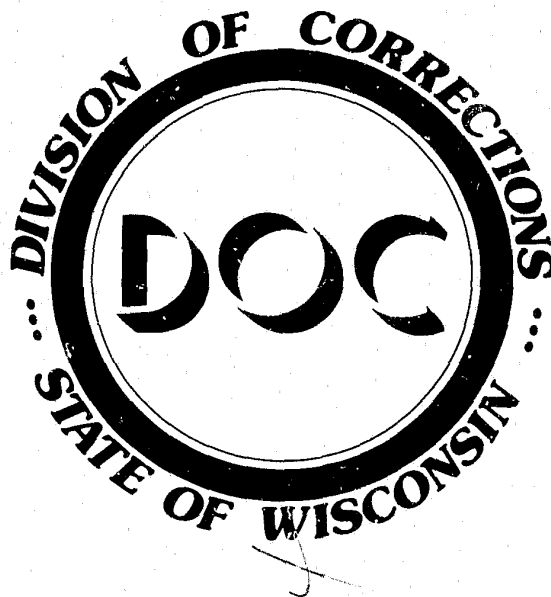

ACQUISITIONS

Offenders Released from Adult Correctional Institutions
Through the Mutual Agreement Program
For Calendar Year 1978

This report describes offenders released from Wisconsin adult correctional facilities upon completion of the Mutual Agreement Program (MAP) for calendar year 1978. Information for the report was routinely collected from adult institution record offices, social services, and MAP negotiating staff.

MAP releases for 1978 totaled 574 cases. About 93 percent (535 cases) were first released and 7 percent (39 cases) were re-released. The first released proportions are lower than reported for 1977 but remain higher than reported in 1975 and 1976 (Table A). The total number of releases via MAP is about 11 percent lower than 1977.

Table B shows the proportion of MAP releases to all releases for 1978. About 39 percent of all releases were through MAP. This is about 3 percent lower than reported in 1977. MAP first releases represent about 43 percent of all first releases for 1978 and re-releases represent about 18 percent of all re-releases.

The total proportions of MAP releases is less than reported in 1977 but more than 1975 and 1976. MAP re-releases has its lowest proportion since 1975.

Selected characteristics for 1978 are compared to data reported on MAP releases for 1975 through 1977. Another increase in length of stay is shown for 1978, with over one-half month longer stays than for 1977, about one month longer than 1976, and over 4 months longer than for 1975. While the length of stay increased, the proportion of sentence served was smaller than for previous calendar years.

The average length of contract continued to get longer, but the increase between 1977 and 1978 is not as large as for previous years. The proportion of sentence served under a contract was about 16 percent, about 8 percentage points lower than for 1977.

The decrease in percent of sentence served under a contract coupled with the decreases in percent of total sentence served are good indicators as to the increased severity of offenses and longer sentences of persons now getting released from the institutions via MAP. Policy decisions relating to MAP eligibility in 1978 made it feasible for persons with longer sentences and more severe offenses to write contracts.

Type of contract components shows the resources utilized in the institutions. About three-fourths of all MAP releases in 1978 had contract components including work assignments, education, and treatment components.

Table D combines the various contract components and illustrates the magnitude of program participation by residents completing MAP contracts. Two types of contracts are realized, both having transfer opportunities as a part of the contract. Program contracts will have education, treatment, or both as parts of the contract. Performance contracts have neither education or treatment but may have a routine work assignment.

Program contracts represented about 92 percent of the MAP releases, about 4 percent higher than for 1977 releases. Moreover, program contracts having education and treatment components were held by 60 percent of the releases. While some performance contracts existed, most had a transfer plan included in the contract.

Highlights for Calendar Year 1978

1. Over 92 percent of MAP releases were first-released. About 93 percent of all MAP releases had adult parole assigned as a release status. (Table 1)
2. Males account for nearly 93 percent of the MAP releases. About 52 percent of the males were White and 40 percent Black. About 49 percent of the females were White and 44 percent Black. (Table 2)
3. The mean (average) age reported at admission for MAP releases was 24.3 years. The median age was 22.1. (Table 3)
4. By proportions, unarmed burglary (27.7 percent), armed robbery (15.7 percent), drug law violations (9.7 percent), theft, except auto (7.1 percent), and unarmed robbery (6.7 percent) are most often reported as type of offenses for males. Forgery (33.3 percent), armed robbery (10.2 percent) and assault (10.2 percent) were most often reported for females. (Table 4)
5. The median sentence reported at admission for those residents released via MAP was 47.7 months or about 4 years. Nearly 25 percent of the releases had a sentence of 3 years but less than 4. About one-quarter of the releases had sentences of less than 3 years. (Table 5)
6. One-quarter of the 1978 MAP releases had length of stays 1 year less than 1-1/2 years (12 to 17 months), and one-fifth of the releases had stays of 18 months but less than 24 months. The median length of stay was 20 months and the mean was 23.6 months.
7. Although the average length of stay was 23.6 months, by offense groupings, seven offenses had averages higher than the grand mean. These were murder (2nd degree), unarmed and armed robbery, injury by conduct regardless of life, armed burglary, 1st degree sexual assault and other person offenses. Property offenses had averages lower than the grand average. (Table 7)
8. The average length of sentence was 58.1 months and, like average length of stay, had the same seven person-oriented offenses with averages higher than the grand mean. Property offenses had average sentences lower than the group average. (Table 8)
9. Average length of contracts were correspondingly higher for person-offense groups such as robbery (armed and unarmed), sex offenses, and armed burglary. (Table 10)

10. Nearly three-fourths of all contracts had work assignment reported as institution needs. This assignment is generally given to allow institutions flexibility in making assignments as residents complete the education components or during the semester breaks. (Table 13)
11. About 10 percent of the MAP releases participated in some form of academic education, 48 percent in vocational education, and 20 percent in other education. Welding, custodial services, carpentry and machinist programs were often selected. Another 18 percent of the releases selected other education (HED, basic education, etc.) as additional program choices. (Tables 14 and 15)
12. A treatment program was contracted for by 73 percent of the releases with most (nearly 42 percent) carried out by Clinical Services. Nearly 20 percent of all residents eventually participated in the Alcohol Education and Treatment Program. (Tables 16 and 17)
