TERMINATIONS FROM ADULT PAROLE SUPERVISION  
WISCONSIN DIVISION OF CORRECTIONS  
CALENDAR YEARS 1973 - 1977

This report summarizes trends in selected characteristics of males and females terminated from Wisconsin adult parole supervision in calendar years 1973 through 1977. Data for these tables were reported by field agents of the Bureau of Community Corrections and compiled by the Office of Systems and Evaluation.

ACQUISITIONS

A total of 5,361 persons--5,069 men and 292 women--were removed from parole in the five-year period 1973 through 1977. The number of removals ranged from 1,000 in 1975 to 1,184 in 1977. Of the total, 1,282 (23.9 percent) were revoked and re-incarcerated, and 85 died while under supervision. The remaining 3,994 persons (74.5 percent) were terminated successfully from supervision. Among them were 589 persons who received early discharges from parole.

The number of men whose parole was revoked declined from 276 in 1973 to 206 in 1976, but rose to 253 in 1977. There was a steady decline in the number of women revoked, from 14 in 1973 to two in 1977. All of the parolees who died during the five-year period were men. They were included in Table 1 but not in subsequent tables.

Type of Termination (Table 1)

Three-fourths of the men and nearly 90 percent of the women terminated from parole during the period 1973 through 1977 successfully completed field supervision. More than 11 percent of the men and 9.6 percent of the women received early discharges from supervision. The percentage of men successfully completing supervision (viz., discharge, early discharge, and off records) rose by 3.1 percentage points, and the percentage of women rose by 17.4 percentage points, from 1973 to 1977.

County of Residence (Table 2)

Sixty percent of the adults who completed parole supervision were residents of the state's 10 largest counties. The number of terminating parolees from

Milwaukee County declined from 472 in 1973 to 366 in 1977. Slightly less than seven out of 10 male parolees from that county completed supervision successfully, compared with almost eight out of 10 in other counties. Yet, from 1974 through 1977, 92.9 percent of the female parolees residing in Milwaukee County successfully completed supervision, slightly higher than the statewide average of 92.4 percent.

#### Time Under Supervision (Table 3)

Only two-thirds of the adults under supervision less than one year successfully terminated parole. The success rate for the five-year period averaged 76.7 percent for those under supervision for a period of 18 months to two years and exceeded 80 percent for persons under supervision for longer periods. The percentage of women who completed supervision successfully climbed from 79.4 percent in 1973 to 96.8 percent in 1977. Virtually all women (95 out of 99) who had been under supervision for two years or more successfully completed parole.

Women were generally under supervision for shorter periods of time than men, but this gap narrowed during the five-year span. In 1973, nearly 53 percent of the women terminated had been under supervision less than one year and 91 percent, less than three years, while only 7.5 percent of the men had been under supervision less than one year and 83.8 percent less than three years. In 1977 there was little difference in period of supervision between men and women. A little over one-third of each sex had been under supervision less than 2 years, and a little over three-fourths over three years.

#### Age at Termination (Table 4)

Nearly 60 percent of the adults terminated from supervision were 20 through 29 years of age, and another 22 percent were 30 through 39. Age appeared to have little bearing on successful completion of supervision; during the five-year period, roughly three-fourths of the persons in all age groupings from 20 through 54 completed parole successfully. It is interesting to note that parolees 55 years of age or older and those under 20 years of age had the highest rates of successful completion--83.6 percent and 78.2 percent,

respectively. From 1974 through 1977, all of the women 35 years of age and older successfully completed supervision.

#### Race (Table 5)

Seventy-one percent of the adults who completed parole supervision from 1973 through 1977 were White. Fewer than one-fourth of the males but 37.3 percent of the females were Black. White non-Hispanic males had a successful completion rate of 77.2 percent, compared with 68.3 percent for Black males, but Black females had a success rate slightly higher than the rate for White non-Hispanic females. Among Native Americans, 78.2 percent of the men and 92.9 percent of the women successfully completed supervision.

#### Marital Status (Table 6)

One-half of the men and 42.8 percent of the women who completed parole supervision were single, while 22.5 percent of the men and 34.9 percent of the women were divorced or separated. Among men, the 22.7 percent of parolees who were married had a successful completion rate of 85.5 percent, or 10.5 percentage points higher than the overall rate for males, while those who were single, divorced, or separated, had a lower-than-average rate of 71.5 percent. Among females, married women had a success rate of 91.3 percent, compared with 89.2 percent for divorced or separated women and 88.0 percent for single women. All widows and 88.9 percent of the widowers successfully completed supervision.

#### Residence During Supervision (Table 7)

One-third of the males and females were living with relatives and one-fourth were living alone when they completed parole supervision. One-fifth of the men and 13.4 percent of the women were living with a spouse. Those living with a spouse had the highest rate of successful completions, over 85 percent. Those living alone or with relatives had almost identical rates of successful completion, just under 75 percent. About 55 percent of those who lived in group homes or halfway houses completed supervision successfully.

### Employment (Table 8)

About 45 percent of the men and 29 percent of the women were employed full-time when parole supervision was terminated. One-third of the men and nearly half of the women were unemployed. Roughly 16 percent of both men and women held regular or sporadic part-time jobs.

Approximately 85 percent of those who held full-time jobs completed supervision successfully as compared with less than two-thirds of those who were unemployed. Those with regular part-time jobs had a slightly higher than average success rate, and those with only sporadic employment a slightly lower than average success rate. Interestingly, the women who had regular part-time jobs had a higher success rate than those who worked full-time, and unemployed women had a higher success rate than those employed sporadically.

### Reason for Revocation (Table 9)

Nearly one-fourth of the males but only one-tenth of the females were terminated from parole by revocation during the years 1973 through 1977. (See Table 1.) Beginning in 1975, there was a slight decline in the number of men revoked and a significant decline in number of women. More than one-third of the men were revoked because of conviction of a new offense, 28.6 percent for absconding, and 20 percent after being charged with a new offense, though not yet convicted. About 10 percent were revoked for violating rules of parole. Two-thirds of the small number of women revoked were absconders.

### Most Serious Violation (Table 10)

More than one-third of the new violations committed by persons whose parole was revoked involved property offenses, and one-fifth involved offenses against persons. Absconding was the major violation in another 20 percent of the cases. The proportion of offenses against persons by parole violators rose from 15.6 percent in 1974 to 28.3 percent in 1977. The proportion of property offenses, primarily burglary and theft, also rose, from 31.2 percent in 1974 to 44.2 percent in 1977.
