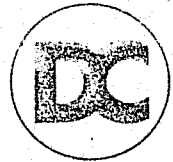

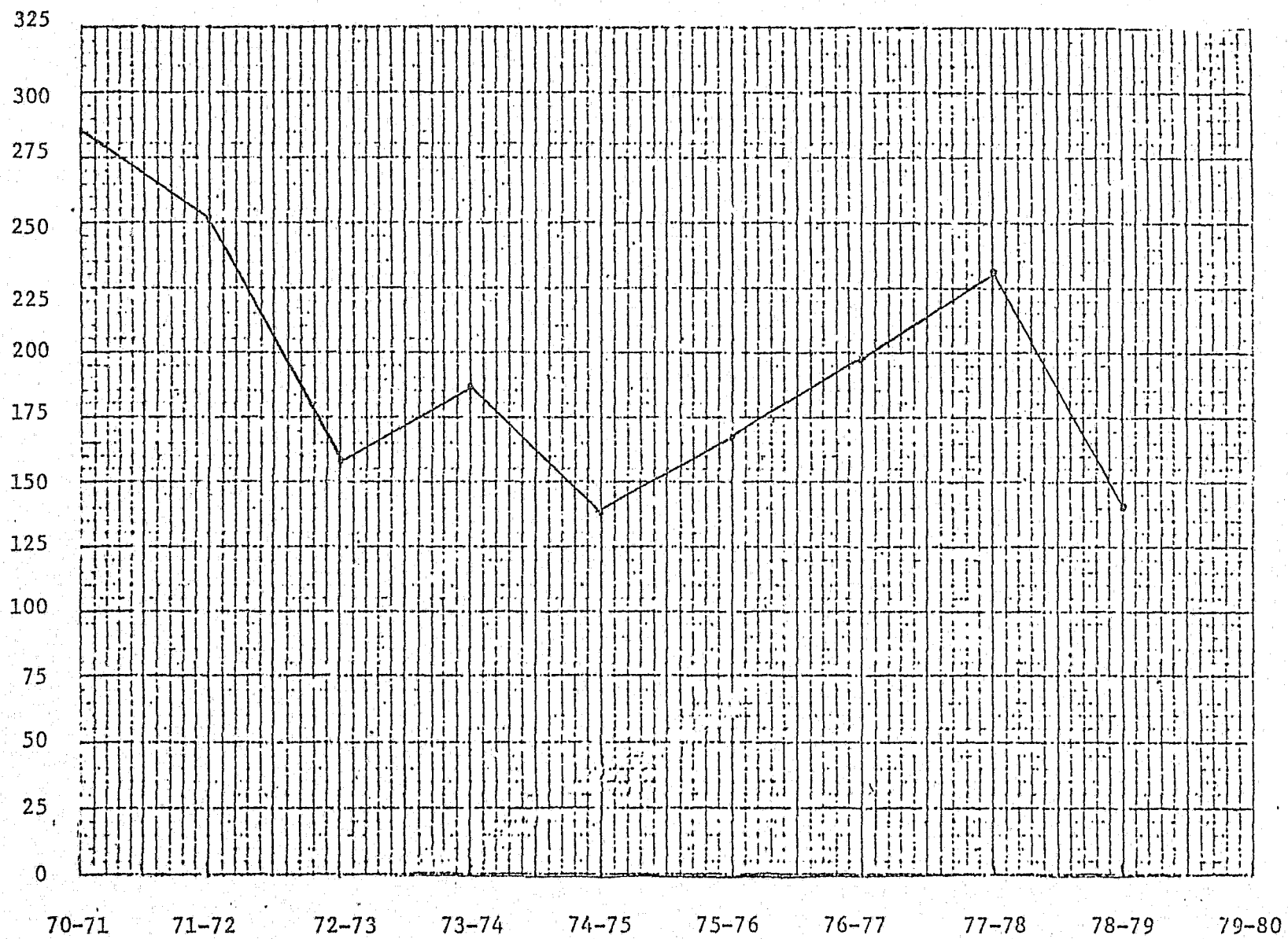

2. Unemployment rate will stabilize at 5.0 percent in Colorado by FY 1980-81.
3. The average length of stay will stabilize at 26.2 months during the next two years before rising to 28.0 months.
4. No new legislation will be passed which would significantly affect sentencing or length of stay.
