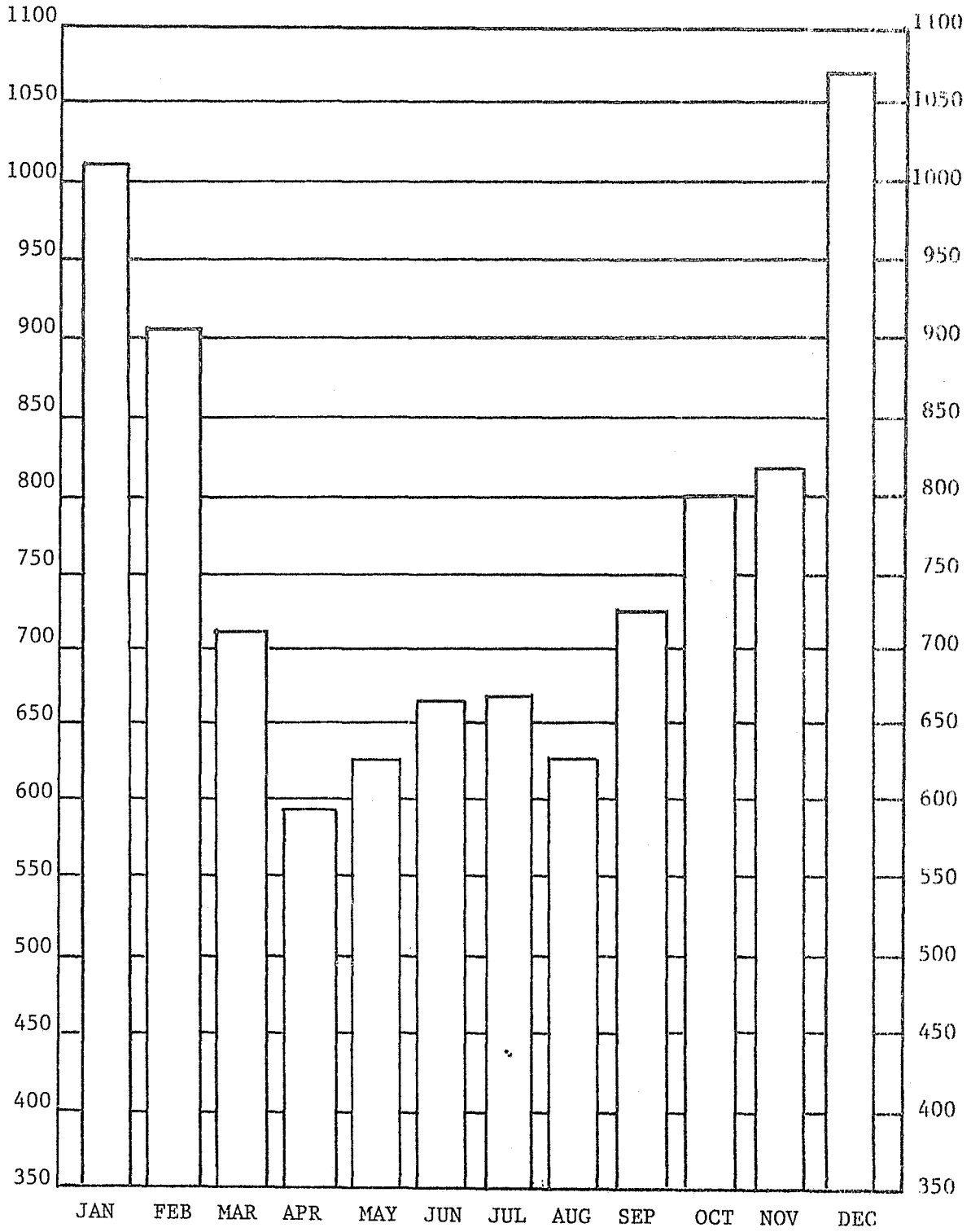

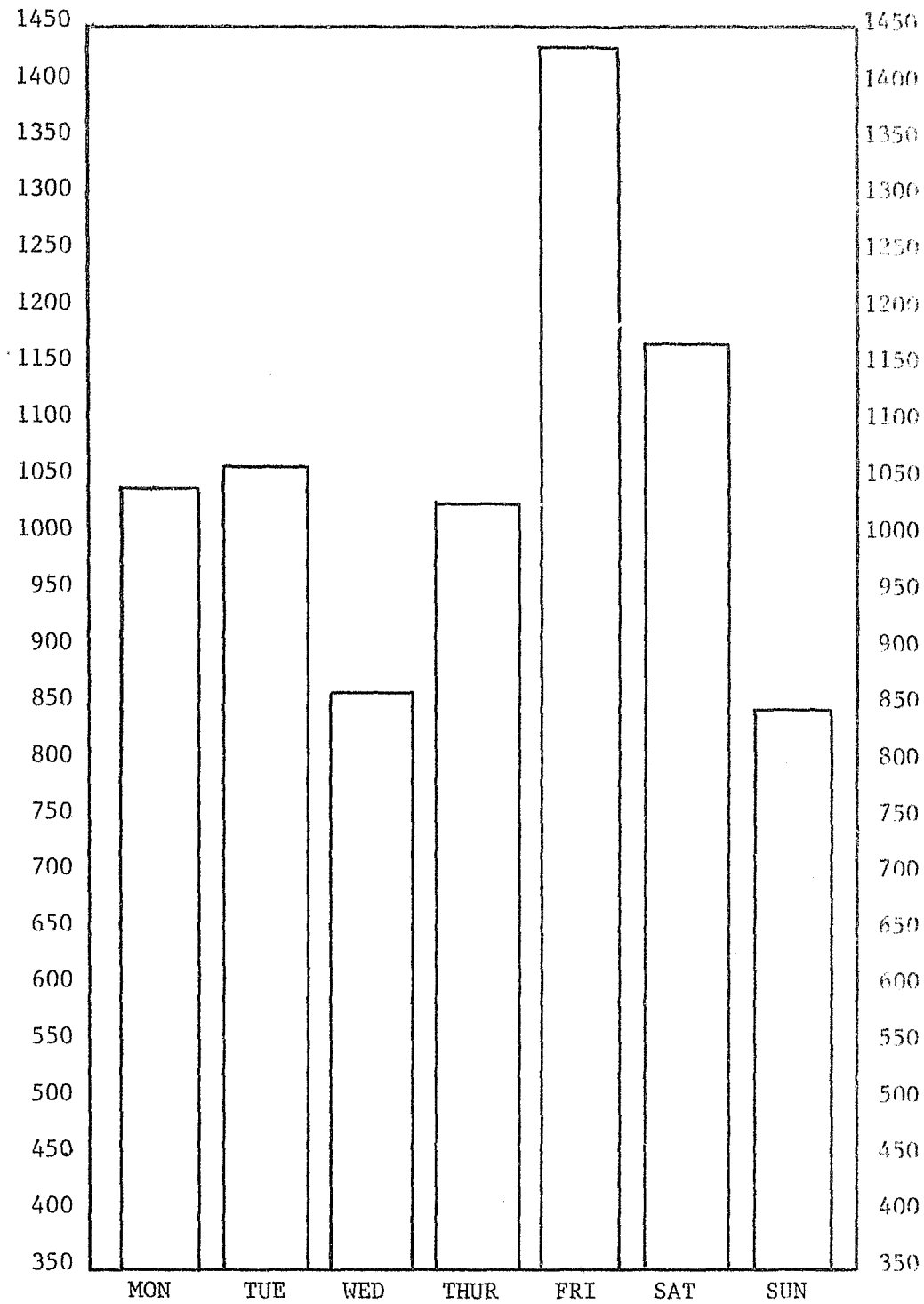

ACCIDENTS BY DAY OF WEEK



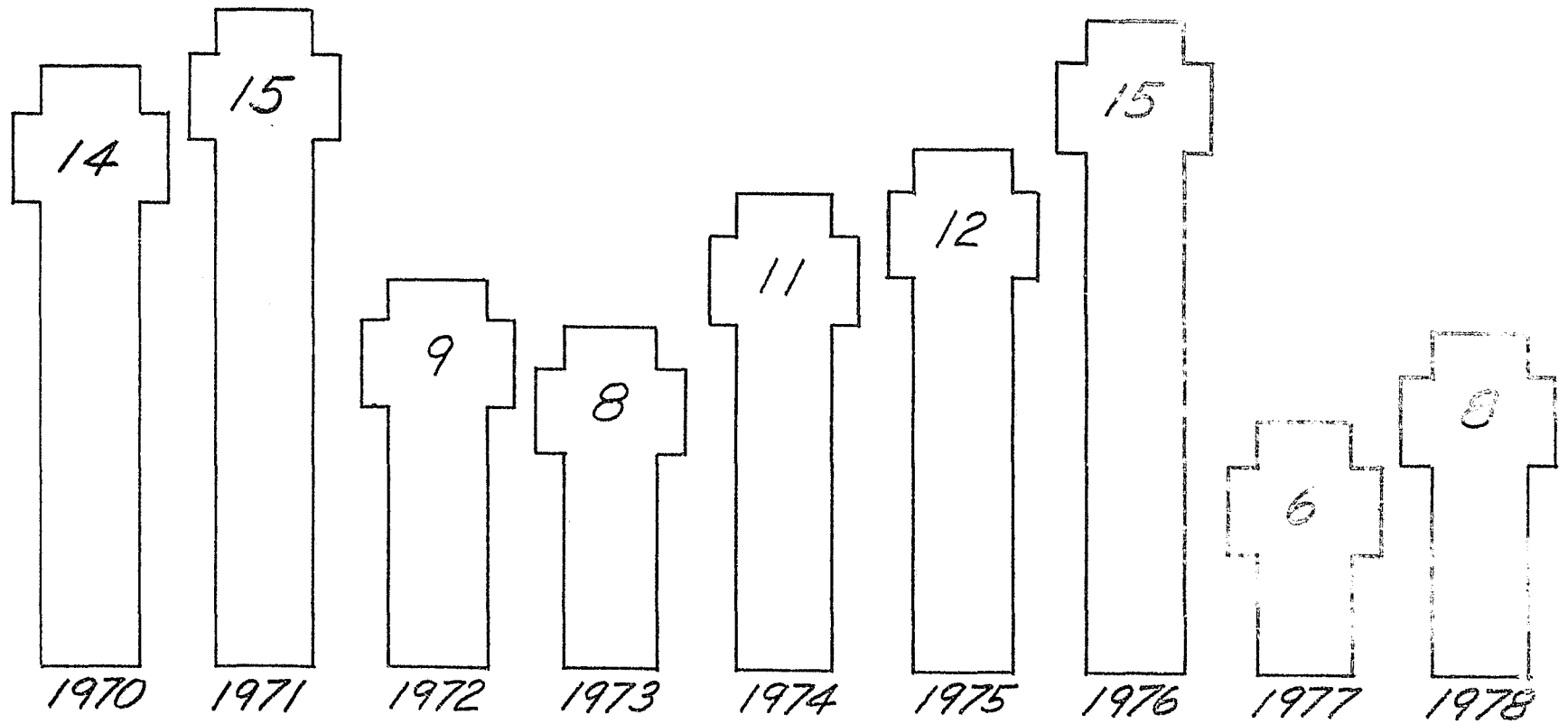

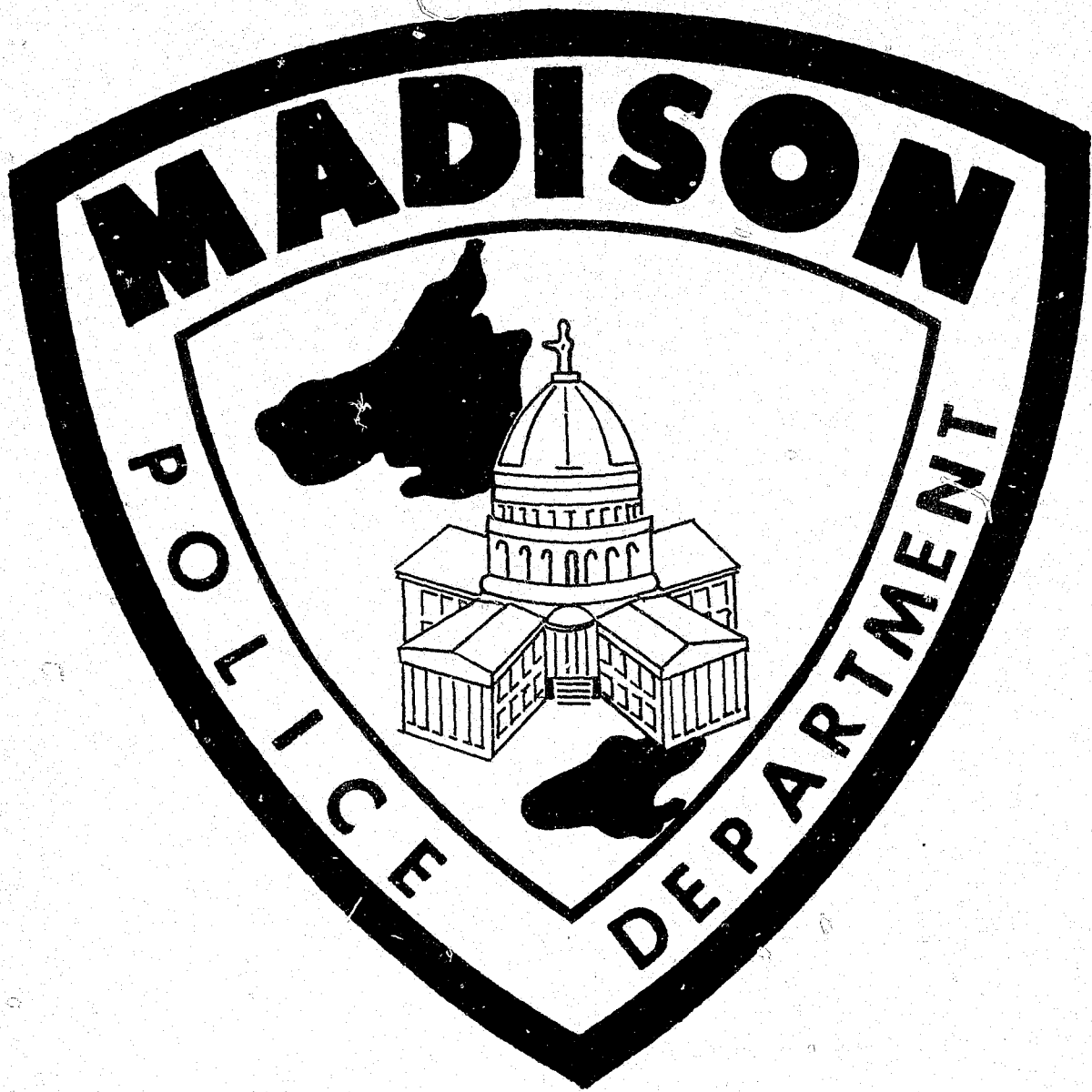
