





## TABLE OF CONTENTS

### PREFACE

*This report covers commitments to county and city jails and city jail farms; it should be noted that this confinement in jail does not reflect whether a person has been judged innocent or guilty. A separate commitment is reported each time a person is confined in jail on a charge of having violated a law or ordinance, for being inebriated or insane, as a material witness in a criminal case, for investigation, for protection, or for any other reason. The confinement may be before or after adjudication of the case in which the prisoner is involved. A person who is recommitted after being released on bond or otherwise released is reported each time he is placed in jail.*

*The statistics in this report were obtained from the Forms DC - J6, Record of Prisoners Confined. These forms are submitted monthly by the individual jails and jail farms to the Virginia Department of Corrections, Division of Finance, Jails Reimbursement Unit. The primary purpose of these documents is to serve as a basis for determining costs of operation and the amount of state reimbursement to local jails and city jail farms. To serve the secondary function, that of providing statistical data, the forms are then transferred to the Electronic Data Processing Unit for editing and computer processing. The final statistical report is prepared by the Research and Reporting Unit. All questions, remarks or requests relating to the report should be directed to this agency:*


COMMITMENTS TO COUNTY AND CITY JAILS AND CITY JAIL FARMS  
FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1979

*During fiscal year 1979 there were 174,350 commitments to county and city jails and city jail farms. This represents a 14.9 percent increase over commitments during 1978 (151,721).*


RACE AND SEX

Among the jail commitments, 63.8 percent were white and 36.2 percent were non-white. The number of males received was 156,873 or 90.0 percent. The number of females was 17,477 or 10.0 percent. This has not significantly changed from last fiscal year when females comprised 8.9 percent of the commitments.

MALES




FEMALES



#### AGE

Last fiscal year there were 3,749 youths committed who were under age eighteen. During fiscal year 1979, 2.3 percent of the commitments (3,956) were in this category, which represents a 5.5 percent increase since last year.





#### OFFENSE

An analysis of the offenses for fiscal 1979 shows that Offenses Against Decency, Peace and Good Order were the most frequent (54,543 or 31.3 percent); traffic offenses ranked second with 36,862 or 21.1 percent.



Specifically, the most common offenses were Drunkenness/Drunk and Disorderly, which represented nearly one quarter of all commitments (24.5 percent). The second most frequent offense was Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (13.1 percent).

Incarceration for violations of the narcotic laws accounted for only 7,263 commitments or 4.2 percent. This represents a slight increase from last fiscal year, 1978, when 4.0 percent of the commitments were in this category.



#### TYPE OF OFFENSE

Of the total commitments, more than half were charged with misdemeanors (94,269 or 54.1 percent), which is a slight increase from last year when 51.9 percent were committed for misdemeanors. The persons committed on local ordinances ("other offenses") numbered 44,227 (25.4 percent) while 35,854 (20.6 percent) were charged with felony offenses.



#### PLACE COMMITTED FROM

Virginia counties accounted for 49.3 percent of the jail commitments and the cities accounted for 50.7 percent of the commitments. Of the 86,038 commitments from the counties, Fairfax had by far the greatest share with 11,495; Henrico committed 4,580 and Arlington committed 4,320 prisoners. Of the 88,312 city commitments, Richmond had 17,614, Norfolk had 15,121 and Roanoke had 8,307.

#### **CAPACITY AND POPULATION ANALYSIS**

The average of the rated capacities for all the jails in Virginia is 52 beds. The total rated capacity for all the jail facilities was 5,033 beds on June 30, 1979. In comparison, the average daily population for a Virginia jail facility was slightly less than this average rated capacity. During fiscal year 1979 the average population was 49.7 persons, which is a slight increase from fiscal 1978 when the average population was 46.5 persons.



The average number of commitments during fiscal year 1979 for the 97 jail facilities was 1,797, which is an increase over the 1978 average of 1,564 commitments. The average prisoner days in 1979 was 18,137 days as compared to 16,982 days for fiscal year 1978. Although the average number of commitments is rising, the average length of confinement per prisoner dropped slightly during fiscal year 1979. The average length of stay per commitment during fiscal 1979 was 10.1 days. Last fiscal year the average length of stay was 10.9 days.

Only 31 jails recorded more total prisoner days than capacity days available. There were 114 days during fiscal year 1979 when the total prisoner days for all Virginia jails exceeded the total state capacity.
