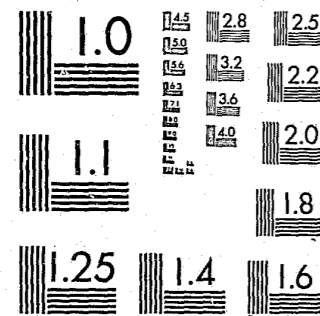

INTRODUCTION

The Virginia Division of Justice and Crime Prevention has been designated by the Secretary of Public Safety to serve as a state resource center for crime prevention information.

To facilitate coordination and information dissemination, the Division has prepared this directory which provides practitioners and interested Virginians with a means to identify and share resources.

The directory provides an opportunity for crime prevention programs to match their project needs with resources which are available on the National, State and local levels. It also provides a means for resource sharing which hopefully, in some instances, will eliminate the need for a program to purchase costly films, slides, and equipment when there is a possibility they may be borrowed from a neighboring agency or organization.

In addition to information concerning resources and programs, the directory contains a film guide which concisely describes the most commonly used crime prevention films. This should be helpful in determining visual aid needs for specific programs. The films are listed by program areas: residential burglary, assaults on women, etc.

In order to facilitate the use of the directory, a glossary (including program definitions) is included.

The glossary was taken from the Directory of Community Crime Prevention Programs published in December, 1978, by L.E.A.A. Their permission to reproduce the material is appreciated.

While every effort was made to identify those agencies and organizations actively engaged in conducting crime prevention programs, it is probably inevitable that some programs were overlooked. The final page of the directory is a data sheet for organizations to complete and submit for inclusion in future editions of the directory which will be periodically updated. BOY WHO LIKED DEER - (18 minutes 1975)

Jason is anticipating a summer spent helping a park warden tend the deer. But as a result of his inattention in class, his teacher tells him he will have to attend summer school instead. Angered, Jason joins his friends in a spree of vandalism during which they break into a storage shed in the Deer Park and destroy everything in the teacher's classroom. Although not caught, Jason witnesses the results of his vandalism, his teacher's anguish at the destruction and the death of some of his beloved deer.

CHILD ABUSE - CRADLE OF VIOLENCE - (20 minutes 1976)

Presents the problem of child abuse and solutions to the frustrations of parenthood that bring about violence against children. Candid interviews with once abusive parents reveal how they lost emotional perspective and physical control in trying situations with their children. Shows how groups organized by parental stress offer an environment for troubled individuals to discuss their problems and find ways of coping with the realities of raising a family.

CRIME IN THE HOME - (22 minutes 1973)

Uses vignettes to demonstrate effective ways of self-protection in the home, and to tell how to protect personal property. Includes crime prevention tips involving doors, windows, locks, guns, property I.D., confrontation, and empty homes.

HOW TO SAY NO TO A RAPIST AND SURVIVE - (52 minutes 1974)

Filmed during a lecture appearance, Frederic Storaska discusses a program of rape and assault prevention. Discarding dubious defense measures, he offers practical and constructive options available to any woman. Basic to the program is the recognition of the human element - understanding the emotional make-up of both victim and assailant. His aim is the reduction of violence from the attacker. Characterizing the would-be rapist as rejected by women and hating them, he explains why a hostile response by the victim can jeopardize her life.

INTRUDER - (20 minutes 1971)

This film is designed to alert citizens to the danger represented by the residential burglar. Shows the common-sense precautions to be taken to discourage intruders, what to do when confronted and gives basic information about safety devices.

FILM GUIDE

LADY BEWARE - (16 minutes 1972)

A film that teaches the four basics of personal safety. It demonstrates effective common sense techniques that women can employ to protect themselves from the growing menace of personal assault.

MUGGING - YOU CAN PROTECT YOURSELF - (31 minutes 1977)

Police Officer Liddon Griffith explains precautions to observe to avoid muggers. He then demonstrates practical methods by which a mugging victim can deal with an assailant.

NATION OF SPOILERS - (11 minutes 1965)

This film is a dramatic appeal to keep America beautiful. Acts of vandalism, resulting in such things as broken recreational facilities, vandalized schools, littered parks and scenic views marred with names painted on rocks, are contrasted with scenes of some of the most beautiful areas in the United States.

NO EXCEPTIONS - A FILM ABOUT RAPE - (24 minutes 1977)

Deals with three aspects of rape - how to prevent it from happening, what to do if it happens, and what to do afterward. Provides rules to follow in walking alone at night, dealing with car breakdowns, and securing the home. Discusses the benefits and dangers of firearms and self-defense techniques. Offers advice on physical and psychological tactics to try when confronted by a rapist. Gives steps of action to be followed after a rape--notifying the police, examination at a hospital, and the help available at rape crisis units.

NOBODY'S VICTIM - (20 minutes 1972)

Avoiding danger and dealing with danger--the two basics of personal safety--are discussed in this film on self-defense for women. The first section on avoidance covers working alone, driving alone, parking and leaving a car, car trouble, home security and harrassment. The second section emphasizes escape and describes what to do if confronted, by using several easily learned physical self-defense techniques.

ON GUARD - BUNCO - (27 minutes 1970)

It is estimated that at least four billion dollars go into the pockets of gypsters annually. In the film it is pointed out that the most subtle of criminals are those who prey upon the unwary by fraudulent schemes. This film is designed to give such information by dramatizing schemes used by criminals in defrauding the public.

RAPE - VICTIM OR VICTOR - (17 minutes 1978)

Uses a series of vignettes to show situations in which rapes occur and demonstrates precautions which can be taken to reduce the risk of attack. Offers specific guidelines about how to avoid advertising vulnerability, how to prevent an intruder from entering a home or automobile, and if trouble arises, how to attract attention and escape.

SELF-DEFENSE FOR GIRLS - 20 minutes 1969)

A training film that teaches girls to defend themselves against attack and injury in any situation. Demonstrates methods that enable girls to get out of dangerous situations, without harm to the attacker, but with safety to themselves.

SENIOR POWER - AND HOW TO USE IT - (19 minutes 1975)

Dramatic sequences depicting purse-snatching, armed robbery, burglary, and the obscene telephone call accompanied with panel discussions motivate not only the elderly but everyone to adopt simple non-physical procedures for personal protection.

SHOPLIFTING--SHARON'S STORY - (26 minutes 1976)

Tells the story of a teenage girl who steals from a department store and is subsequently arrested. Shows her reactions, as well as those of her parents, to the humiliation of search, interrogation, detention, family confrontation, and court procedure.

Arrangement to borrow these films from the State Library can be made through individual local libraries. In many instances, local libraries will have films on hand which can be loaned out.

THE DOOR WAS LOCKED - (25 minutes 1972)

Depicts how intruders can be frustrated by simple devices and shows the anguishing consequences when private citizens become careless about their own safety at home.

FIREBUGS - (40 minutes 1978)

Eight arsonists discuss the reasons for starting fires and how they start them. Characteristics of each are discussed and methods to detect arson during investigation are covered.

HOW TO SAY NO TO A RAPIST AND SURVIVE - (52 minutes 1978)

This is an on-the-spot record of the principles of Frederick Storaska's program of rape and assault prevention. Storaska's ability to establish communication with his audience and his sensitivity in dealing with his subjects are integral to the success of his program.

INVITATIONS TO BURGLARY - (20 minutes 1973)

Raymond Burr tells homeowners and tenants what they need to know about burglary prevention. Demonstrates security devices and gives valuable advice on how to make homes more secure. Shows why burglaries happen and how to prevent them.

IT CAN HAPPEN TO YOU - (28 minutes 1970)

Policewoman Jeanne Bray demonstrates self-defense for women. Stresses physical techniques and tips on ways to avoid trouble.

PAPERHANGERS - (30 minutes 1973)

Shows methods used by bad check artists in passing hot checks. Points out things to look for to detect a bad check and methods used to protect against them.

THE PLASTIC CRIMINAL - (22 minutes 1973)

Portrays the credit card fraud problem and what can be done to stop it by the card holder.

THE SHOPLIFTERS - (20 minutes 1973)

Details the techniques used by amateur and professional shoplifters to steal over two billion dollars worth of merchandise annually; emphasizes how much of this can be prevented.

VICTIM OR WITNESS - (28 minutes 1971)

Instruction for bank employees in reference to bank robberies.

WALK WITHOUT FEAR - (20 minutes 1974)

Offers a number of precautionary measures women can take to increase their peace of mind while decreasing the likelihood of being attacked. Tips and advice are given along with what to do if you are.

FILM GUIDE

Residential Crimes

An Ounce of Prevention (18 minutes-color) - Burglary film narrated by Glenn Ford. He shows homeowners and tenants exactly how to check and evaluate their homes or apartments for security. He also demonstrates how to make simple and inexpensive modifications to protect property.

Basic Security Surveys (25 minutes-color) - Film dealing with various security checks . . . for adult and business groups.

Before It's Too Late (28 minutes-color) - Conceptual overview of the rapidly emerging crime prevention/opportunity reduction strategy. Points out who has the responsibility for reducing criminal opportunity. Covers hardware concepts, target hardening, security surveys, and citizen group meetings to reduce crimes against property and persons.

Crime in the Home - List ways homeowners can protect themselves and their property.

Introduction to Crime Prevention (23 minutes-color) - Basic introduction to need for crime prevention approach, definition, theory, and practice. Shows statistically where the crime prevention approach can help. Detail information on locks, lights, doors, and windows; includes comprehensive guide. This film is not intended for viewing by the general public due to the depiction of criminal methods. It is well suited for business and governmental groups where the audience is prescreened.

Invitation to Burglary (20 minutes-color) - Star, Raymond Burr tells homeowners and tenants what they need to know about burglary prevention. Shows how burglaries happen and how to prevent them.

Neighborhood Watch (20 minutes-color) - Film shows community groups and individuals how they can work with law enforcement to drastically reduce the rate of burglary and larceny.

Not A Weapon Or A Star - Discusses the role of the citizen in crime prevention.

Senior Power (19 minutes-color) - Covers most of the personal safety and home security tips elderly persons need to know to improve their safety, as well as provide the motivation to take these critical steps.

Target for Terror (18 minutes-color) - Depicts the results of a violent residential burglary followed by a security survey and comprehensive suggestions for better safety for the homeowner.

The Door Was Locked (25 minutes-color) - Makes suggestions for improving residential security by physical and procedural means. The tragic results of indifference toward security on the part of the citizen are forcefully portrayed.

The Theft (25 minutes-color) - Documentary story about a jobless youngster who agrees to go away on a burglary with an older boy and what happens.

What Have You Got To Lose (30 minutes-color) - Burglary film involving two (2) teenagers and how they burglarize homes. The film also shows how to prevent burglaries.

Whose Neighborhood Is This (20 minutes-color) - Crime Prevention awareness film. Documentary film exploring various aspects of neighborhood crime. It looks at the problem and solutions from three (3) points of view: the victim, the criminal and the police. Very good for showing why neighborhoods and people should get involved in crime prevention awareness.

You Can't Jude a Crook by His Cover (15 minutes-color) - Shows a clean-cut individual and his method of breaking into homes. Explains actions to be taken by suspicious neighbors. Covers the advantages of marking possessions with the engraver.

Crimes Against Women

Attack (15 minutes-B&W) - Shows women how to protect themselves from attacks and how to defend themselves should they be attacked.

Common-Sense Self Defense (33 minutes-color) - A unique self-defense training program for women. Uses simple realistic techniques that any woman of any age and size can learn to apply. It minimizes physical techniques and fighting and requires no specific facilities or equipment.

How To Say No To A Rapist and Survive (55 minutes-color) - Film is an on-the-spot record of the principals of Frederick Storaska's program of rape and assault prevention using well-timed humor intersperse no-nonsense directness. He imparts a wealth of information that instills confidence in women and their ability to handle a rape situation.

Lady Beware (25 minutes-color) - A unique self-defense training program for women.

Nobody's Victim - Presents steps women can use to prevent themselves from becoming victims of violent crime, such as rape and robbery.

Protection for Women (13 minutes-color) - Safety tips for women, common sense security precautions that can be used. Little on home security awareness.

Rape - A Preventive Inquiry (18 minutes-color) - Film replaces myth with fact to give practical advice every woman can use to decrease her chances of being raped and survival alternatives in case an attack occurs.

Self-Defense for Girls (16 minutes-color) - Film introduces practical techniques and goals of self-defense for girls and women.

The Hitchhiker (20 minutes-color) - Film explores the dangers of hitchhiking from two points of view. A girl is rescued by a sheriff's helicopter unit as she wanders alone, bruised and dazed in the desert. First, she gives her

account of what happened after she accepted a ride from a stranger. Second, the man who picked her up tells his version of the same incident.

Walk Without Fear (20 minutes-color) - Film touches on the various problems women might encounter. Explains what to do about purse snatching, being surprised by an intruder in your home, trouble while out at night, and being attacked.

Street Crimes

Crime In The Street (18 minutes-color) - Film dealing with various street crimes. Excellent crime prevention film for adult groups.

Street Crimes - What To Do (20 minutes-color) - Film emphasizes the importance of common sense when riding on buses and walking to and from your car. Provides some good tips on self defense in situations threatening personal safety. The importance of individual protection, particularly in the inner-city.

Bicycle Security

How to Protect Your Bike (12 minutes-color) - Film shows grammar school students how to protect their bikes. Explains five (5) points of bicycle safety.

Citizen Band Radio

Citizen Band Radio: A New Hue and Cry (28 minutes-color) - The organization of a number of citizen monitor groups. The positive participation of citizens in community crime prevention by using their CB's to augment the manpower of law enforcement agencies and provide a sense of cooperation and community involvement.

Fraud

On Guard - Bunco (26 minutes-color) - Nobody ever got anything for nothing, however, human nature being what it is, some are subject to the susceptible in all of us to succumb to greed. Bunco artists prey on the frailty of character in their victims, as portrayed in four (4) vignettes presented in this film.

The Bunco Boys - Dramatizes the three most frequent con artist schemes: the Pigeon Drop, the Bank Examiner and the Charity Rocket.

Vandalism

The Clubhouse: A Vandalism Story (10 minutes-color) - Story about four (4) young boys who have made a small clubhouse with their own hands and now face

a boring day. When a rock thrown from outside strikes their clubhouse, they pass it off as mischief by other children. After deciding to go to a local school, the youngest boy yields to peer pressure and throws a rock through a classroom window. Soon, all the boys are breaking windows, but, when the police arrive, only the boy who threw the first rock is caught. The others run back to their clubhouse, only to discover that it too has been vandalized.

Crimes Against Children

Child Abuse: A Cradle of Violence (21 minutes-color) - Film gives an overall awareness and understanding of the problem of child abuse.

Child Molester: Fact or Fiction (30 minutes) - Points out the many facts and fictions about child molesters. Intended for adult audience.

Girls Aware (10 minutes-color) - Discusses the problems of young girls falling prey to the molester told forcefully in good taste with four (4) actual case histories. For Junior High.

Meeting Strangers (20 minutes-color) - Film for elementary school children presents important safety rules for children about being cautious around strangers and what to do.

Incest: The Victim Nobody Believes - Gives a frank and intimate discussion of the typical problems and effects of sexual abuse and incest suffered by women.

Pedophile (20 minutes-color) - Child molestation for high school and adults. Story follows a ten (10) year old victim giving insights into the child molester, parent responsibility, and the police role. Narrated by Robert Fuller.

Stranger In The Car (15 minutes) - Film designed for elementary school children relating the dangers of child molesting.

The Trouble With Strangers (10 minutes-color) - Child molestation film for elementary school students, presents important safety rules to children about being cautious with strangers. The format is easily understood by children and is not frightening, very adaptable with speaking program.

The Child Molester (17 minutes-color) - Film shows safety tips for children. Shows a child who did not act in a safe manner. Results in child being molested and killed. Good for young children. Should have parental consent.

Commercial Burglary

Burglary Is Your Business (15 minutes) - Deals with burglary of business and preventative measures.

Caught (25 minutes-color) - Shoplifting film showing how it is done and ways business people can cope with it with security devices.

Commercial Burglary (Continued)

Crime, It's A Matter of Time (15 minutes) - Humorous day in the life of a retail shop owner who cannot seem to do anything right to protect himself from crime. Illustrates how many criminal opportunities the businessman really provides burglars everyday . . . and how it would be to his benefit to work with his local crime prevention unit to tighten security and reduce loss.

Crisis Management (21 minutes-color) - Good for businessmen. Defines risk avoidance, risk abatement, risk spreading, risk transfer, and risk assumption, and dramatizes the process of evaluating business risk exposure, realigning preventive priorities and capabilities. Also, good crime prevention training.

Harden the Target (15 minutes-color) - Deals with business burglary. Showing preventative means to harden the target.

Rip-Off (20 minutes-color) - A practical film on commercial burglary and business security starring Henry Fonda. Using actual location shots of a variety of commercial establishments and demonstrating numerous security devices and techniques.

Shoplifting Is Stealing - (16 minutes-color) - A three-pronged attack on shoplifting that complements and reinforces many of the points brought out in the National Retail Merchants Association Booklet "Teenagers Beware: Shoplifting is Stealing." Film emphasizes that shoplifting is a serious crime punishable by law and shows what happens when a shoplifter is apprehended and booked, resulting in a police record that affects a person's whole life.

The Paperhangers (28 minutes) - Film deals with bad check writers. An excellent film for the business community.

The Shoplifter (20 minutes-color) - Film dealing with shoplifting prevention for business and adult groups.

Shoplifting: The Great American Rip-Off - (27 minutes-color) - Uses three (3) types of retail establishments to illustrate the prime targets of the shoplifter and differentiates between the amateur and professional shoplifter. Offers store owners, management and, then, employees proven methods of prevention, detection and recovery. Discusses the legal steps in a "citizen's arrest" thoroughly and completely. Excellent for employee training.

You and the Bank Robber (20 minutes-color) - Film for bank employees. Describes actions to be taken during and after a bank robbery (made about 1962).

You're Just Asking For It (13 minutes-color) - Discusses basic armed robbery and preventative measures to be taken by small business owners.

GLOSSARY*

*Directory of Community Crime Prevention Programs
(Washington, D.D.: Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, 1978.)

The following list of terms are included to assist the reader and to facilitate common terminology usage. It should be noted that the definitions of the terms listed reflect their utilization in the area of community crime prevention.

Behavior Modification - a change in behavior patterns brought about by education or training in crime prevention principles and/or techniques.

Burglary - the unlawful entry or trespass within a structure with the intent to commit a crime therein. (Related terms: breaking and entering, house-breaking, unlawful entry)

Citizen Awareness - a state in which the members of the community are cognizant of a situation (in this case, a crime risk), and possible solutions or methods of dealing with it. (Related term: citizen education)

Citizen Crime Reporting - includes encouraging citizens, either witnesses or victims, to report crimes and to assist police in apprehension of the offenders. Should provide procedures for making such report accurate and useful. (Related term: community involvement)

Citizen Community Patrols - a concept in which residents of a community (residential, business, etc.) organize into a group and provide security patrols of the environs of that community.

Community Action Programs - programs undertaken by the residents of a community with a specific goal in mind. (Related term: community involvement)

Community Anticrime Efforts - actions taken by the members of a community to prevent crime or to increase the amount of cooperation with the police in reporting crimes.

Community Crime Prevention - direct involvement of a single sector or a combination of sectors in a community in the planning, funding, implementation, and operation of a crime prevention program; usually stressing cooperation with the local criminal justice system. (Related term: community involvement)

Crime Control Program - various programs dealing with the control or prevention of specific types of crime, based on patterns of occurrences and known offenders and victims.

Crime Displacement - theory which states that criminals denied the opportunity to commit crimes in a certain area will move to other areas or to other crimes. (Related term: mercury effect)

Crime Prediction - a system of predicting future crime patterns and trends using past patterns and trends as indicators.

Crime Prevention - the anticipation, recognition, and analysis of a crime risk, and the initiation of some action to remove or reduce it.

Crime Prevention Training - the training of crime prevention practitioners in the theory and principles of crime prevention.

Crime Resistance - term used by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (F.B.I.) and other law enforcement and criminal justice agencies which is synonymous with crime prevention.

Crime Specific Countermeasures - specific strategies which are intended to prevent certain crimes (e.g., and antiburglary campaign).

Defensible Space - a term for the range of mechanism -- real and symbolic barriers, strongly defined areas of influence, improved opportunities for surveillance--that combine to bring an environment under the control of its residents. (Related term: environmental design)

Deterrence - a concept which holds that the threat of punishment or the denial of opportunity will forestall the criminal or delinquent act. (Related term: punitive crime prevention)

Dynamic Risk - a risk situation which carries the potential for both benefit and cost or loss. Normally considered to be the type of risk that is inherent in doing business. (Related terms: risk management, risk assessment, pure risk)

Environmental Design - selectively controlling variables in the planning, design, and effective use of physical space to create physical and social conditions which will promote citizen surveillance, reduce criminal opportunity, and increase the risk of apprehension and arrest.

Information Transfer - a means by which professionals and practitioners exchange ideas, concepts, and programmatic information to facilitate the development and the practice of crime prevention.

Mechanical Crime Prevention - concept developed by Lejins based upon opportunity reduction (emphasis on target hardening).

Media Campaigns - the use of mass media (radio, television, newspapers, etc.) as part of a public awareness program.

Neighborhood Watch - a community action program administered by the National Sheriff's Association which encourages neighborhood residents to organize with a purpose of neighborhood security, and cooperation with the criminal justice system. (Related terms: block watch, radio watch, community action programs)

Operation Identification - a program in which citizens mark property for identification purposes. Intent of program is to facilitate the recovery and return of stolen property, and to provide a deterrent to potential offenders. (Related term: property identification)

Opportunity Reduction - the removal of opportunity, a necessary ingredient for the commission of crime, by making a potential target of attack inaccessible or unattractive and by making the attack itself dangerous or unprofitable to the criminal.

Organizations in the Community - ethnic, religious, fraternal, and service organizations.

Physical Crime Prevention - prevention of anticipated crimes or delinquencies by placing obstacles in the way of potential offenders so that it becomes difficult or impossible for them to perpetrate the offense. (Related term: opportunity reduction)

Private Security - self-employed individuals and privately funded business entities and organizations who provide security-related services to a restricted clientele for a fee, for the individual or entity that retains or employs them, or for themselves in order to protect their persons, private property, or interests from varied hazards. (Related terms: security systems, deterrence)

Property Identification - see Operation Identification.

Pure Risk - a risk situation in which there is no possibility for benefit, only cost or loss (e.g., fire, flood, etc.). (Related terms: risk management, risk assessment, dynamic risk)

Radio Watch - a community action program in which citizens organize to facilitate the reporting of criminal activity through the use of radio transmissions. This usually involves the use of citizen band radios. (Related terms: neighborhood watch, block watch, community action programs)

Residential Security - security concept utilizing mechanical, electronic, procedural, and other methods to protect the home from crime and other hazards. (Related terms: physical crime prevention, operation identification, security systems)

Risk Management - the anticipation, recognition, and appraisal of a risk and the initiation of some action to remove the risk or reduce the potential loss from it to an acceptable level. (NCPI) (Related terms: dynamic risk, pure risk, risk assessment)

Robbery - unlawful and forcible taking of property in the possession of another, from his person or immediate presence, and against his will by use of violence or threat of violence, and with the intent to steal.

Security Codes and Ordinances - laws which require that buildings, recreational facilities, streets, and other public areas meet certain security requirements. (Related terms: environmental design, defensible space, alarm and dead bolt laws)

Security Surveys - surveys of residences, businesses, public buildings and other facilities for the purpose of evaluating the degree of security present in order to make recommendations for physical and procedural improvement. (Related term: vulnerability analysis/assessment)

Security Systems - methods and materials employed to ensure the protection of persons and premises against encroachment. (Related terms: Alarm systems, security hardware, lighting, target hardening)

Street Lighting - a concern to the crime prevention practitioner. Street lighting is an important component of environmental security. (Related terms: defensible space, deterrents, environmental design)

Target Hardening - concept of opportunity reduction which seeks to deter the criminal act by making a potential target of attack inaccessible or unattractive and by making the attack itself dangerous or unprofitable to the criminal. (Related terms: opportunity reduction, security hardware, security systems)

Target Specific Measures - specific strategies intended to protect a certain premise from crime risk or safety hazards.

Vigilante - those who extralegally assume authority for summary action purportedly to keep order and to punish crime because of the alleged inadequacy or failure of the usual law enforcement agencies.

Whistle Stop - a program designed to provide women with a means of signaling for help in the event of an attack. A secondary purpose is to increase public awareness and public participation in crime prevention programs.

Youth Services Programs - (as applied to crime prevention) - programs which focus on youths and attempt to divert them from criminal activities. Some of these deal with children in schools, others deal with students who have dropped out, and others are based in the community. (Related term: juvenile delinquency prevention)
