This Annual Uniform Crime Report portrays the nature, volume and extent of crime in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania during 1978. All statistics presented in this publication have been accumulated through direct report submission by each law enforcement agency participating in the Pennsylvania Uniform Crime Reporting Program. In turn, our State Program has furnished data to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for tabulation of the national crime figures and inclusion in their annual publication, Crime in the United States.

Since we now have five years of historical data collected through our State program, a table and chart have been presented with each section of Crime Index Offenses depicting the changes that have occurred over the five year period.

This report will assist law enforcement officers in adjusting their efforts in the fight against crime. It also provides valuable information for other interested agencies, both public and private, which have similar goals. We sincerely hope that it will also create an awareness within the general public that crime exists as a serious problem within our communities and requires attention from every segment of society. Criminal activity cannot be eliminated by law enforcement agencies acting alone, it requires the efforts of every law abiding citizen as well.

While criminal offenses and related clearances by individual jurisdictions are reported in the appendages of this report, these listings are not intended to show who investigates the most crimes or clears the most offenses. The purpose of these listings is to aid in the determination of those factors which are indicative of the particular crime problems of a given area.

This report has been made possible through the concerted efforts of the many law enforcement agencies of the Commonwealth who consistently submitted the essential data. Recognition is given to the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association which has constantly advocated and supported the concept of a unified reporting program for our Commonwealth. Such effort and support is sincerely and deeply appreciated and it is on behalf of these dedicated public servants that this Annual Uniform Crime Report is presented.

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INTRODUCTION

THE PROGRAM

The Pennsylvania Uniform Crime Reporting Program was established as a result of the Uniform Criminal Statistics Act of 1970 (71 P.S. 307.8 and 307.9). Powers and duties concerning criminal statistics were given to the Attorney General. In October 1973, the Uniform Crime Reporting duties set forth in this Act were transferred to the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police by Reorganization Plan No. 7 of 1973 (71 P.S. 755-7).

The counterpart of the Pennsylvania UCR Program is the National UCR Program under the direction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This national program is the result of a need for nationwide and uniform compilation of law enforcement data. Uniform Crime Reports, developed by a committee of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, were first collected in 1930. The IACP continues to serve in an advisory capacity to the FBI in its operation of the Program. In our state program, the UCR Committee of the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association was instrumental in the development of the program and continues to serve as an advisor to its operation.

The primary objectives of the Pennsylvania UCR Program are to inform the Governor, Legislature, other governmental officials and the public as to the nature of the crime problem in Pennsylvania and to provide law enforcement administrators with criminal statistics for administrative and operational purposes.

The National UCR Program is a continually expanding program, with more law enforcement agencies participating each year. Each year additional states mandate submission of UCR data by their police agencies, the ultimate goal being that every police agency in the nation submit their crime data. Although we are all aware of its shortcomings, Uniform Crime Report data is still the best crime information available. The returns completed by law enforcement agencies deal only with offenses that come to their attention, and no data is routinely collected to measure the total amount of crime that actually occurs. Some studies indicate that many of the offenses committed are not reported to the police. As an example, offenses are less likely to be reported to police agencies when they are considered less serious or trivial by the general public.

There are many factors which will affect the type and volume of crime that occurs from place to place. Some of these are listed in "Crime in the United States, Uniform Crime Reports, 1977" page v, and are reprinted on the following page.

CRIME FACTORS

Density and size of community population, and of its surrounding area.
Variations in composition of the population, particularly age structure.
Stability of population with respect to transient factors.
Economic conditions, including job availability.
Cultural conditions, such as educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
Climate.
Effective strength of law enforcement agencies.
Administrative and investigative emphases of law enforcement.
Policies of other components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational).
Attitudes of citizenry toward crime.
Crime reporting practices of citizenry.

CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

Uniformity in reporting under the Pennsylvania system is based upon the proper classifications of offenses by police. The adoption of the Federal system of reporting included the utilization of the offense classifications of that system. Law enforcement personnel in this state have made accurate application of those classifications in the reports submitted to the program.

In view of the need for compatibility with the Federal system, the categories of offense classification employed in this program remain the same as those employed on the national level. Care must be taken by police officers in classifying because of the conflicts between this system and the Pennsylvania Crimes Code.

Part I Offenses

Offense data consists of information that has been extracted from reports of crimes that have come to the attention of Pennsylvania law enforcement agencies. In general, Part I crimes are those serious crimes that are usually reported to law enforcement agencies. It consists of the following offenses:

(1) Criminal Homicide

- 1a. Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter - The unlawful, nonnegligent killing of a human being, by another.
General rule - Any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault or commission of a crime.
- 1b. Manslaughter by Negligence - The accidental killing of a human being, by another.
General rule - The killing may result from the

commission of an unlawful act or from a lawful act performed with gross negligence. Deaths resulting from traffic accidents are not included in this classification.

(2) Forcible Rape

- 2a. Rape by Force - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly against her will.
General rule - Forcible rape of a female but excluding Statutory Rape or other sex offenses.
- 2b. Assault to Rape - Attempts - All assaults and attempts to rape.

(3) Robbery - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

- 3a. Firearm - Any firearm used as a weapon or employed as a means of force to threaten the victim or put him in fear.
- 3b. Knife or Cutting Instrument - Any knife, broken bottle, razor, or other cutting instrument employed as a weapon or as a means of force to threaten the victim or put him in fear.
- 3c. Other Dangerous Weapon - Any club, acid, explosive, brass knuckles, or other dangerous weapon employed as a means of force to threaten the victim or put him in fear.
- 3d. Strong Arm - Mugging, yokings, and similar offenses where no weapon is used, but strongarm tactics are employed to deprive a victim of his property. This is limited to personal weapons such as hands, fists, feet, teeth, etc.

(4) Assault - An assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another.

General rule - All assaults will be classified in the following categories, excluding assaults with intent to rob or rape.

- 4a. Gun - All assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of any type of firearm. (Revolvers, automatic pistols, shotguns, zip guns, rifles, pellet guns, etc.)
- 4b. Knife or Cutting Instrument - All assaults and attempted assaults, involving the use of cutting or stabbing objects. (Knife, razor, hatchet, axe, cleaver, scissors, glass, broken bottle, dagger, ice pick, etc.)
- 4c. Other Dangerous Weapon - All assaults and attempted assaults, when any other object or thing is used as a weapon. (Clubs, bricks, pick handles, bottles, explosives, acid, lye, poison, scalding water and cases of attempted drowning, burning, etc.)
- 4d. Hands, Fists, Feet, etc. - Felonious - Assaults which are of a felonious nature when hands, fists, feet, etc., are used. To be classified as felonious assault, the attack must result in serious personal injury.

4e. Other Assaults - Not Aggravated - All offenses of simple assault and battery. Crimes of this classification are not considered Index Offenses and appear as classification 8 (Part II Offense) in this report.

(5) Burglary - Unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or theft.
General rule - Any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any dwelling house, attached structure, public building, shop, office, factory, storehouse, apartment, house trailer, warehouse, mill, barn, other building, houseboat or railroad car.
Note: For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, breaking and entering and larceny are classified only as burglary; the larceny is excluded. Breaking and entering of a motor vehicle is classified as larceny.

5a. Forcible Entry - All offenses where force of any kind is used to enter unlawfully a locked structure, with intent to steal or commit a felony. This includes entry by use of a master key, celluloid or other device that leaves no outward mark but is used to open a lock. Concealment inside a building, followed by the breaking out of the structure is also included.

5b. Unlawful Entry - No Force - Any unlawful entry without any evidence of forcible entry.

5c. Attempted Forcible Entry - When determined that forcible entry has been attempted.

(6) Larceny-Theft (except Motor Vehicle Theft) - The unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership.
General rule - All larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket-picking, purse snatching, shop lifting, larceny from auto, larceny of auto parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, larceny from buildings and from coin operated machines. Any theft that is not a robbery or the result of breaking and entering is included. Embezzlement, frauds or bad check cases are excluded.

(7) Motor Vehicle Theft - Theft and attempted theft of a motor vehicle.
General rule - This includes all vehicles which can be registered as motor vehicles in this state. Excludes cases where there is a lawful access to the vehicle, such as a family situation or unauthorized use by others with lawful access to the vehicle. (Chauffeur, employees, etc.)

7a. Auto Theft - The theft of all sedans, stationwagons, coupes, convertibles and other similar motor vehicles which serve the sole purpose of transporting people from one place to another.

7b. Trucks and Buses - Theft of those vehicles specifically designed to transport people on a commercial basis, and to transport cargo.

7c. Other Vehicles - Theft of all other motor vehicles limited by the UCR definition such as snowmobiles, motorcycles, motor scooters, trailbikes, etc. Theft of farm equipment, construction equipment or airplanes are considered Larceny-Theft.

Part II Offenses

Part II offenses are made up of all other crimes not classified as Part I crimes. Part II crimes for UCR purposes are as follows:

(8) Other Assaults - This class is comprised of all assaults and attempted assaults which are simple or minor in nature. For reporting purposes, these "Other Assaults" are scored on Return A under item 4e as offenses known to Police. However, arrests for this offense are scored in this class.

(9) Arson - Includes all violations of state laws and municipal ordinances relating to arson and attempted arson. Includes: any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, church, college, jail, meeting house, public building or any building, ship or other vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft; contents of buildings, personal property of another, goods or chattels, crops, trees, fences, gates, grain, vegetable products, lumber, woods, cranberry bogs, marshes, meadows, etc. In the event of a death from arson, the offense would be classified as murder and if personal injury results, the offense would be classified as assault (4c).

(10) Forgery and Counterfeiting - In this class are placed all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering or possessing, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.
Includes:
Altering or forging public or other records.
Making, altering, forging, or counterfeiting bills, notes, drafts, tickets, checks, credit cards, etc.
Forging wills, deeds, notes, bonds, seals, trademarks, etc.
Counterfeiting coins, plates, bank notes, checks, etc.
Possessing or uttering forged or counterfeiting instruments.
Erasures.
Signing the name of another or fictitious person with intent to defraud.
Using forged labels.
Possession, manufacture, etc., of counterfeiting apparatus.
Selling goods with altered, forged or counterfeited trademarks.
All attempts to commit any of the above.

- (11) Fraud - Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretense. Includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.
- (12) Embezzlement - Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.
- (13) Stolen Property; Buying, Receiving, Possessing - Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving and possession of stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.
- (14) Vandalism - Included in this class are all willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth or any other such means as may be specified by law or ordinance. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property.
- (15) Weapons; Carrying, Possessing, etc. - This class deals with violations of weapons laws such as:
 Manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons.
 Carrying deadly weapons.
 Using, manufacturing, etc., silencers.
 Furnishing deadly weapons to minors.
 Aliens possessing deadly weapons.
 All attempts to commit the above.
- (16) Prostitution and Commercialized Vice - Included in this class are the sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as:
 Prostitution.
 Keeping bawdy house, disorderly house or house of ill repute.
 Pandering, procuring, transporting or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.
 All attempts to commit any of the above.
- (17) Sex Offenses - Except forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Includes offenses against chastity, common decency, morals and the like.
 Adultery and fornication.
 Buggery.
 Incest.
 Indecent liberties.
 Indecent exposure.
 Intercourse with an insane, epileptic or venereally diseased person.

Sodomy.
 Seduction.
 Statutory rape - (no force).
 All attempts to commit any of the above.

- (18) Drug Abuse Violations - Drug abuse violations are reported on the basis of the narcotic involved. Include all violations of state and local ordinances, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs. The following subdivisions of narcotic drug law violations are classified:

Sale or Manufacture

- 18a. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives.
 Morphine, heroin, codeine.
 18b. Marijuana.
 18c. Synthetic narcotics, manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction.
 Demerol, methadones.
 18d. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs.
 Barbiturates, benzedrine, inhalants.

Possession

- 18e. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives.
 Morphine, heroin, codeine.
 18f. Marijuana.
 18g. Synthetic narcotics, manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction.
 Demerol, methadones.
 18h. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs.
 Barbiturates, benzedrine, inhalants.

- (19) Gambling - All offenses which are related to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling. To provide a more refined collection of gambling offenses, the following classifications are used:

- 19a. Bookmaking (Horse and sport books).
 19b. Numbers and lottery.
 19c. All other.

- (20) Offenses Against the Family and Children - Included here are all charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family and children.

Desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport.
 Neglect or abuse of child. (If injury is serious, offense is reported as aggravated assault.)
 Non-payment of alimony.
 All attempts to commit any of the above.

- (21) Driving Under the Influence - This class is limited to the operating of any vehicle while under the influence of alcoholic beverages or narcotic drugs.

- (22) Liquor Laws - With the exception of "Drunkness" (Class 23) and "Driving Under the Influence" (Class 21), liquor law violations, state or local, are placed in this class.

Includes:

Manufacturing, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing, etc.
Maintaining unlawful drinking places.
Bootlegging.
Operating still.
Furnishing alcoholic beverages to a minor.
Using vehicle for illegal transportation of alcoholic beverages.
Consumption of alcoholic beverages by a minor.

- (23) Drunkness - Included in this class are all offenses of drunkness or intoxication, with the exception of "Driving Under the Influence" (Class 21).

Drunk and disorderly.
Public intoxication.

- (24) Disorderly Conduct - In this class are placed all violations of committing a breach of the peace.

Includes:

Affray.
Unlawful assembly.
Disturbing the peace.
Disturbing meetings.
Disorderly conduct in State institutions, at court, at fairs, on trains or public conveyances, etc.
Blasphemy, profanity and obscene language.
Desecrating the flag.
Refusing to assist an officer.
All attempts to commit any of the above.

- (25) Vagrancy - In this class are placed persons who are "suspicious characters" and fail to give good account of themselves.

Includes:

Vagrancy.
Begging.
Loitering (persons 18 and over).
Vagabondage.

- (26) All Other Offenses - Include in this class, every other State offense not included in classes 1 through 25. Violations of local ordinances are not included in this class. Illustrated below is a partial list of offenses.

Abduction and compelling to marry.
Abortion (Death resulting from abortion is homicide, offense class 1a).

Bigamy and polygamy.
Blackmail and extortion.
Bribery.
Contempt of court.
Discrimination, unfair competition.
Kidnapping.
Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency except as provided for in classes 1 through 28, such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices, admitting minors to improper places, etc.
Perjury and subornation of perjury.
Possession, repair, manufacture, etc., of burglar's tools.
Possession or sale of obscene literature.
Unlawful use, possession, etc., of explosives, etc.

- (28) Curfew and Loitering Laws (Juveniles) - All violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances are included.

- (29) Runaways (Juveniles) - Reported in this category are apprehensions for protective custody. Runaways taken into protective custody for other jurisdictions are not included.

CALCULATION OF RATES

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program provides data for police administrators to measure local problems, but to facilitate this function it is sometimes necessary to convert the data into rates or percentages. Simple formulas are presented to assist in these computations.

Crime Rates

One of the most useful crime statistics is the crime rate which is the number of offenses per 100,000 persons. This rate can be calculated regardless of the number of inhabitants in your jurisdiction. To compute rates, divide your jurisdiction's population into 100,000 and multiply the number of offenses by that answer.

Example:

$$\frac{100,000}{50,000 \text{ population}} = 2 \times 182 \text{ robberies} = 364$$

Your robbery rate would be 364 per 100,000 population.

Clearance Rates

The percentage of crimes cleared by arrest is obtained by dividing the number of offenses cleared by the number of actual offenses known. This answer is then multiplied by 100.

Example:

$$\frac{147 \text{ Robberies cleared}}{364 \text{ Robberies known}} = 0.404 \times 100 = 40.4\%$$

Your percentage of clearance for robbery is 40.4 percent.

Law Enforcement Employee Rates

These rates are conventionally expressed as the number of employees per 1,000 population. The rate is computed by dividing the population into 1,000 and in turn multiplying the number of employees by this quotient.

Example:

$$\frac{1,000}{50,000 \text{ population}} = 0.2 \times 102 \text{ employees} = 2.04$$

Your rate is 2.0 employees per 1,000 population.

SUMMARY OF CRIME IN PENNSYLVANIA, 1978

There were 820,624 actual crimes of all types reported into the UCR Program by Pennsylvania law enforcement agencies. This total represents a rate of 6,847.0 crimes per 100,000 estimated population, an increase of 6.2 percent over last year's total of 772,596 actual crimes and rate of 6,455.1.

Crime Index Offenses are considered to be both most serious and most likely to be reported and are used nationally as the standard base for comparisons. They include: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft. Manslaughter by negligence is a Part I Crime but is not considered as part of the Crime Index.

This year, 370,600 Crime Index Offenses were reported and confirmed by Pennsylvania police after investigation. Actually, 381,875 Index Offenses were reported, but 3.0 percent or 11,275 were unfounded following investigation, ranging from 1.7 percent unfounded for larceny to 14.9 percent unfounded for rape. Crime Index Offenses increased by 1.1 percent over last year's total of 366,662 Crime Index Offenses and rate of 3,063.5. The Crime Index Rate this year was 3,092.1.

In addition, 449,985 Part II Offenses were reported with a rate of 3,754.5 per 100,000 population. This is a sharp gain of 11.0 percent over the 405,475 Part II Offenses reported the previous year and a corresponding rate of 3,387.5. Part II Offenses include: other assaults, arson, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons, prostitution, other sex offenses, drug abuse violations, gambling, offenses against the family, driving under the influence, liquor law violations, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, and all other offenses.

This year, 44.2 percent of all offenses were cleared; 23.5 percent of the Crime Index Offenses and 61.1 percent of all Part II Offenses.

The following table summarizes the combined Part I and Part II Offense total.

NOTE: In some tables of this report, individual percentages, rates, etc., may not equal totals because of rounding.

Pennsylvania is an urban state, with 81.9 percent of its population living within Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.* 86.2 percent of the Crime Index Offenses and 85.2 percent of Part II Offenses occurred within Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA), as summarized in the following table:

It should be noted that the crime rate of core city jurisdictions in SMSA's continued to be much higher than the suburban jurisdictions. The volume of offenses was higher in suburban jurisdictions than in the core city jurisdictions and was also the highest among all population groups.

* A Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area is composed of an entire county or group of counties with at least one core city, with the whole area meeting criteria of certain metropolitan characteristics established by the United States Bureau of the Census.

ARRESTS

Arrests are primarily a measure of success in police investigation in relation to the criminal offenses taking place within a community. Arrest practices, policies, and enforcement emphasis will vary from place to place and from time to time within a community. Arrests do, however, provide a useful indicator as to the age, sex and race of persons involved in criminal acts, especially for those crimes which have high solution rates.

A total of 393,981 arrests were made in Pennsylvania, a 0.7 percent increase over last year. As indicated in the table below, Part II Offenses totaled 304,257 or 77.2 percent of all arrests, a 0.5 percent gain over last year. Part I Offense arrests numbered 89,724 or 22.8 percent of all arrests, increasing by 1.6 percent.

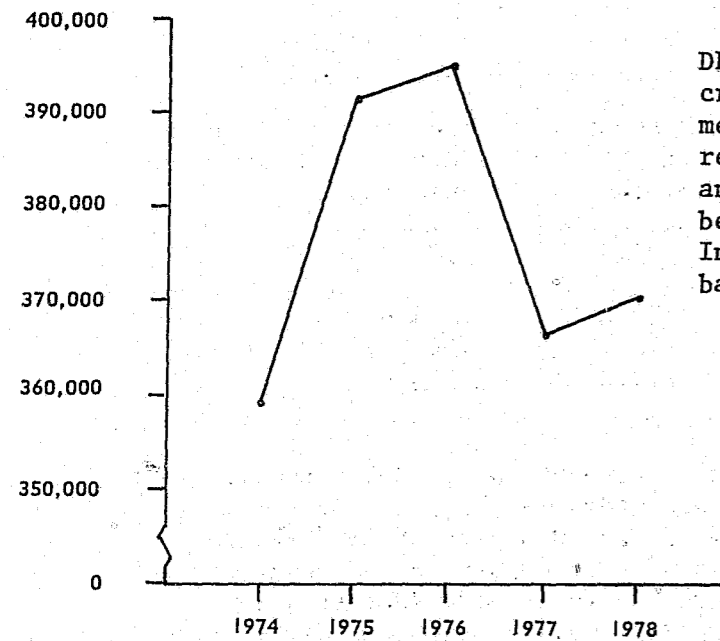

As outlined in Tables 13, 14 and 15, 85.4 percent or 336,300 arrestees were male, and 14.6 percent or 57,681 arrestees were female. 70.9 percent or 279,137 were White, 28.3 percent or 111,382 were Negro, and 0.9 percent or 3,382 were Other races. 36.8 percent or 144,931 of the arrestees were under 18 year old, and 70.2 percent or 276,434 of the arrestees were under 25 years old, demonstrating the youthful character of arrestees in Pennsylvania. Female arrestees decreased 3.8 percent, Negro arrestees decreased 5.4 percent, and arrests of juveniles decreased by 5.1 percent.

Juvenile arrestees were disposed of as follows: 43.6 percent or 63,213 were handled within the police department and released; 31.1 percent or 45,141 were sent to Juvenile Court or the Juvenile Court Probation Officer; 1.2 percent or 1,710 were referred to welfare agencies; 0.9 percent or 1,245 were referred to other police agencies; and 23.2 percent or 33,622 were referred to criminal or adult court, usually the district magistrate for specified petty crimes as underage drinking, shoplifting, etc.

DEFINITION: Crime Index Offenses are crimes that are considered by law enforcement to be the most serious crimes that readily come to the attention of police and occur with a frequency great enough to be reported as a separate category. Crime Index Offenses are used nationally as a basis for comparison of criminal activity.

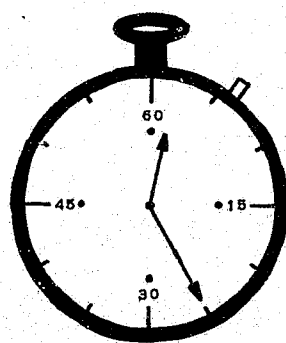

Violent Crime accounted for 35,151 offenses or 9.5 percent of the total Crime Index: 0.2 percent or 717 for murder; 0.6 percent or 2,187 for forcible rape; 4.3 percent or 16,000 for robbery; and 4.4 percent or 116,247 for aggravated assault.

Property Crime consisted of 335,449 offenses or 90.5 percent of the Crime Index: burglary, 28.3 percent or 104,785; larceny-theft, 51.5 percent or 190,934; and motor vehicle theft, 10.7 percent or 39,730.

IN PENNSYLVANIA 1978**

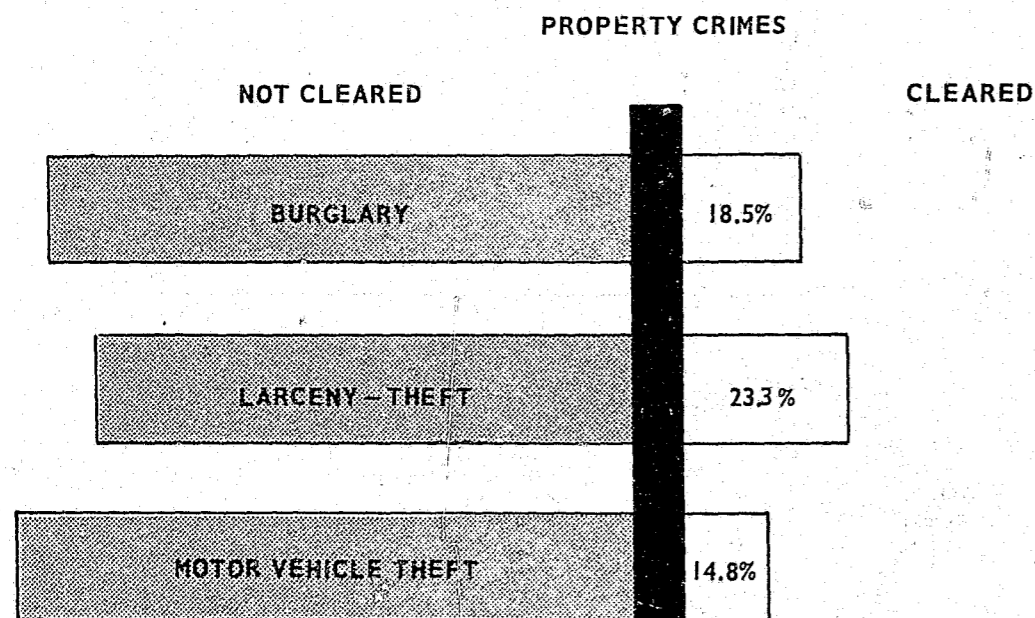
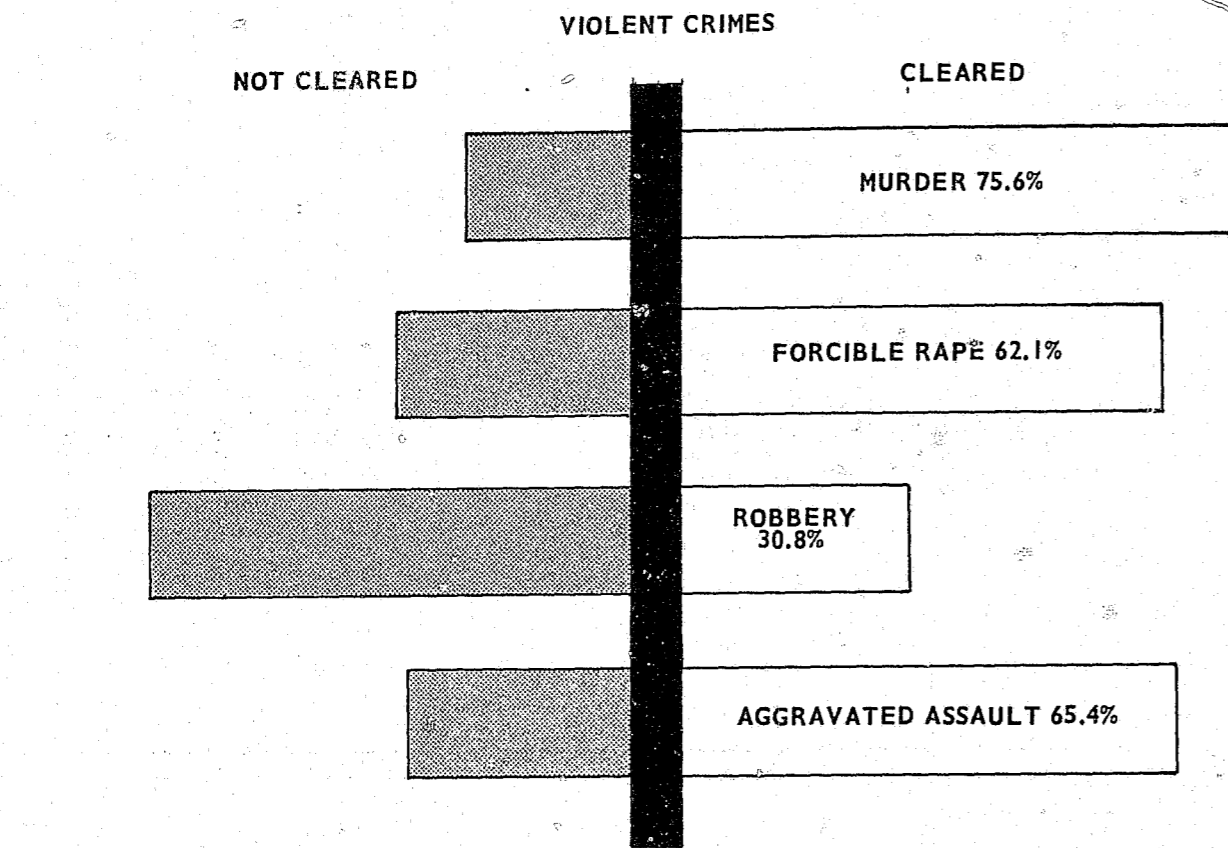

TREND

The Crime Index gained by 1.1 percent to 370,600 offenses from 366,662 offenses last year.

Property Crime increased by 0.6 percent from 333,365 offenses last year to 335,449, while Violent Crime increased 5.6 percent from 33,297 offenses last year to 35,151.

The only offense showing a decrease this year was rape with a 1.8 percent drop to 2,187 from 2,228 last year. Murder increased by 8.6 percent, and aggravated assault showed a 7.9 percent increase over last year.

CLEARANCES

As outlined in Table 3, 87,175 offenses or 23.5 percent of the total Crime Index of 370,600 were cleared this year compared with a 24.1 percent clearance rate last year. 49.7 percent or 17,456 Violent Crimes were cleared this year in contrast to only 21.2 percent or 71,119 Property Crimes. Clearances of Violent Crimes dropped from 52.6 percent last year while clearances of Property Crimes showed a slight decrease from 21.3 percent last year. Clearances of Property Crimes are low because these are crimes of stealth and generally lack witnesses. Conversely, Violent Crimes are generally committed more openly, have more witnesses, and generate a greater degree of intensity in the way of police investigation.

CRIME INDEX DISTRIBUTION BY COUNTY

The following table summarizes the counties in terms of Index Offense volume and the Crime Index Rate per 100,000 population:

PERCENT DISTRIBUTION

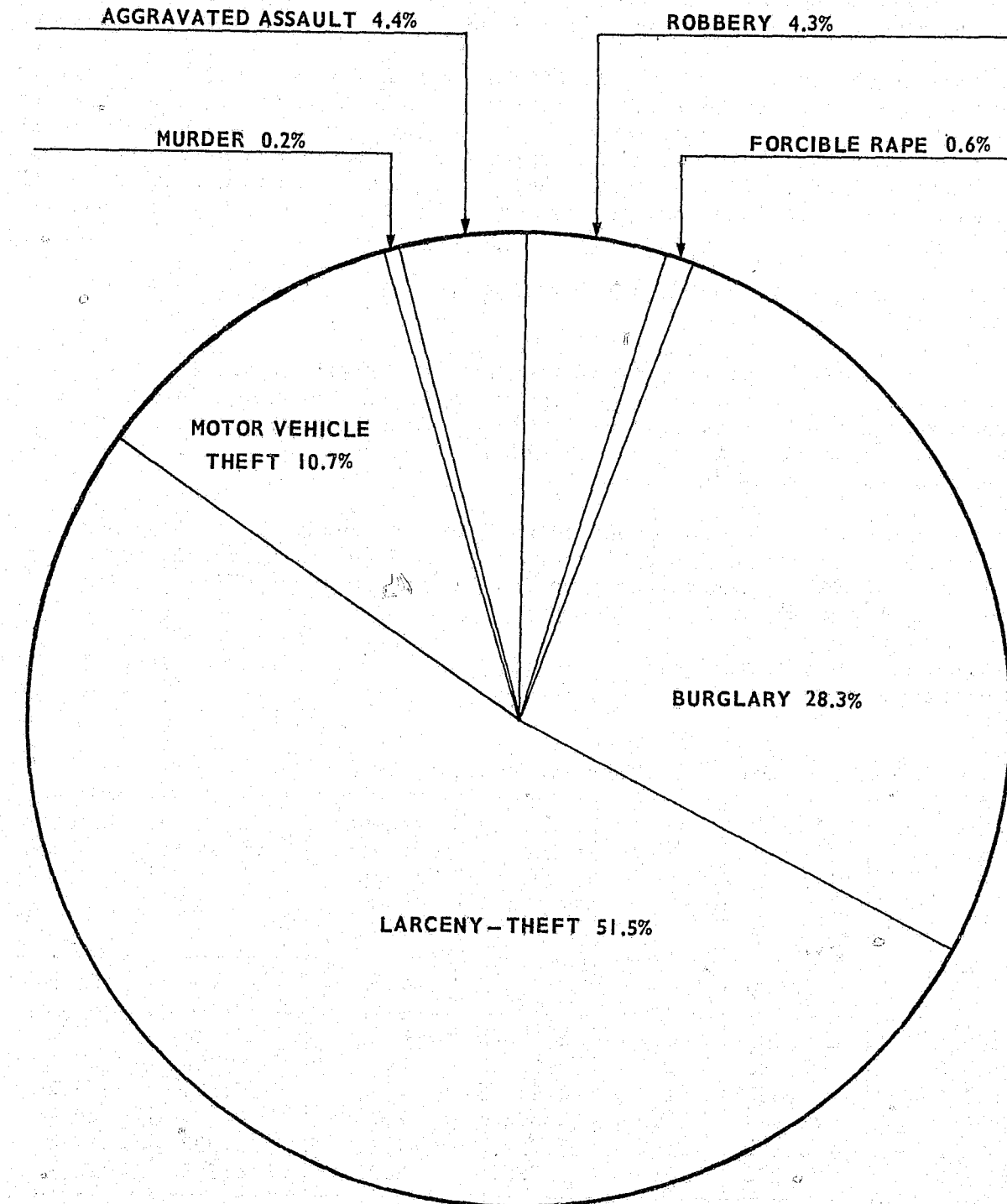

Among the SMSA counties, Blair County reported the greatest increase in the number of Index Offenses, 15.1 percent, while Beaver County reported the largest decrease, 22.4 percent. Cameron County, among the non-SMSA counties, reported an increase of 62.2 percent in Index Offenses, while Montour County reported a decrease of 26.2 percent.

Forest County again reported the highest Crime Index Rate (7,495.4), while Armstrong County reported the lowest Crime Index Rate (1,286.0). Cameron County showed the greatest change in Crime Index Rate, increasing 63.2 percent. The Crime Index Rate for Montour County decreased 25.9 percent for the largest percentage drop.

The first fifteen counties in the listing accounted for 76.3 percent of all Crime Index Offenses reported to the police. A review of Table 2 indicates a range in the Crime Index Rate from 5,542.0 in Monroe County to 1,564.4 in Carbon County among SMSA counties. Similar variations occurred in non-SMSA counties with a range from 7,495.4 in Forest County to 1,286.0 in Armstrong County. It should be noted that all of the first fifteen counties with the greatest numbers of offenses are SMSA counties.

CRIME INDEX DISTRIBUTION BY COMMON HUMAN SERVICE REGIONS

In 1967, the Governor's Office proclaimed six "Common Human Service Regions" (CHSR) in Pennsylvania, consisting of generally comparative counties in terms of interrelated needs and populations. See Figure D. Accordingly, the tables in this report are so organized, with the individual counties being identified alphabetically within the CHSR's.

These regions are considered "standardized" for Commonwealth planning and reporting purposes. They should not be confused with Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA), although the counties in the Southeast CHSR coincide with the Pennsylvania area of the Philadelphia SMSA.

The following table summarizes the distribution of Crime Index Offenses among these six regions.

PENNSYLVANIA COMMON HUMAN SERVICE REGIONS

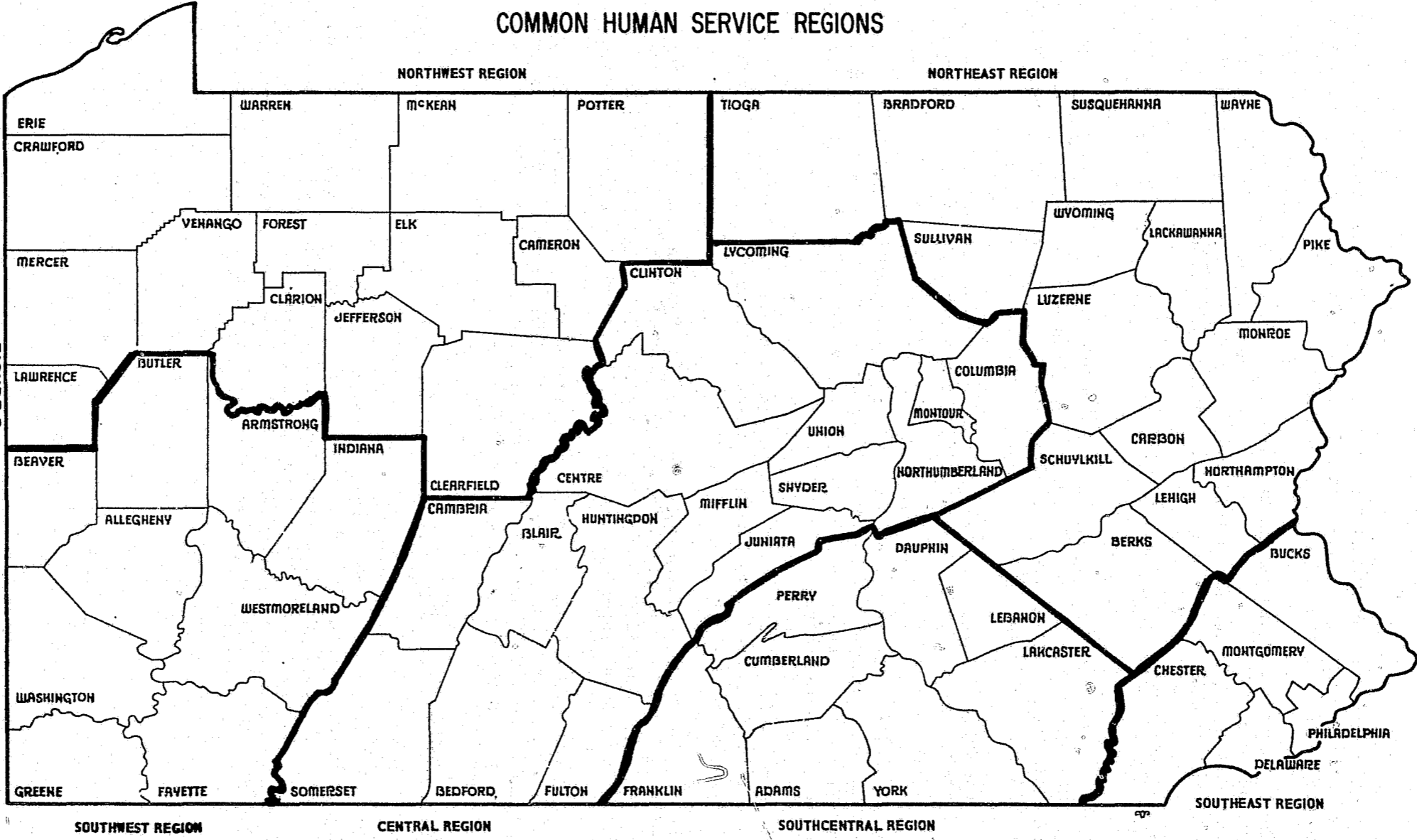

The Crime Index Rates ranged from 3,780.6 in the Southeast CHSR (Philadelphia and surrounding counties) to 2,302.1 in the Central CHSR, which is largely composed of the Appalachian counties of Pennsylvania.

The Northeast CHSR showed the greatest increase in Index Offenses, increasing 3.4 percent from 46,325 last year to 47,880. The Southwest CHSR and the Northwest CHSR provided the only decreases this year. Clearance rates ranged from 27.0 percent in the Southeast CHSR to 17.4 percent in the Southwest CHSR.

CRIME INDEX DISTRIBUTION BY STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS (SMSA)

Table 4 summarizes the 12 SMSA's in Pennsylvania and includes Susquehanna County, which is a part of the Binghamton, New York SMSA. A total of 28 counties are involved. Counties in New Jersey which are part of the Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton SMSA and the Philadelphia SMSA are not included in this report.

Highest Crime Index Rates were produced by the Harrisburg SMSA (3,892.0) and the Erie SMSA (3,818.2). The lowest Crime Index Rate occurred in the Johnstown SMSA (1,645.5).

Of significance in this table are the high Crime Index Rates shown by core cities of the SMSA's in contrast to the rates in their suburbs. Some examples are: Harrisburg, 11,046.3 against a suburban rate of 2,855.5; York, 8,801.5 against 2,577.3; and Reading, 5,945.3 against 1,825.8.

The core cities' Crime Rates were generally double that of their suburbs. In fact, the Crime Index Rate in Harrisburg was 4 times the rate of its suburbs; and Reading, York and Lancaster, 3 times.

The highest rate of increase was reported for Reading SMSA, 11.9 percent, from 7,951 offenses last year to 8,898 offenses. The Northeast Pennsylvania SMSA increased by 7.5 percent. Meanwhile, declines were reported for Williamsport SMSA, down by 3.3 percent followed by Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton SMSA with 2.9 percent.

Pennsylvania SMSA Crime Index Offenses increased by 1.2 percent. The SMSA core city jurisdictions increased by 1.4 percent; the SMSA suburban jurisdictions, 1.1 percent; and the Non-SMSA jurisdictions, 2.0 percent. Rural jurisdictions showed the only Crime Index Offense decrease, 2.4 percent.

VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED

The total value of property stolen this year in Pennsylvania was \$205,420,870, of which only 37.7 percent or \$77,372,092 was recovered. The total value increased by 13.8 percent from \$180,556,497 last year, and total recovered property increased by 22.7 percent. Motor vehicles accounted for 55.3 percent of stolen property value and 59.0 percent of property recovered. While Crime Index Offenses have increased slightly, stolen property values have continued to climb at a far greater rate.

PERCENT RECOVERED OF PROPERTY STOLEN

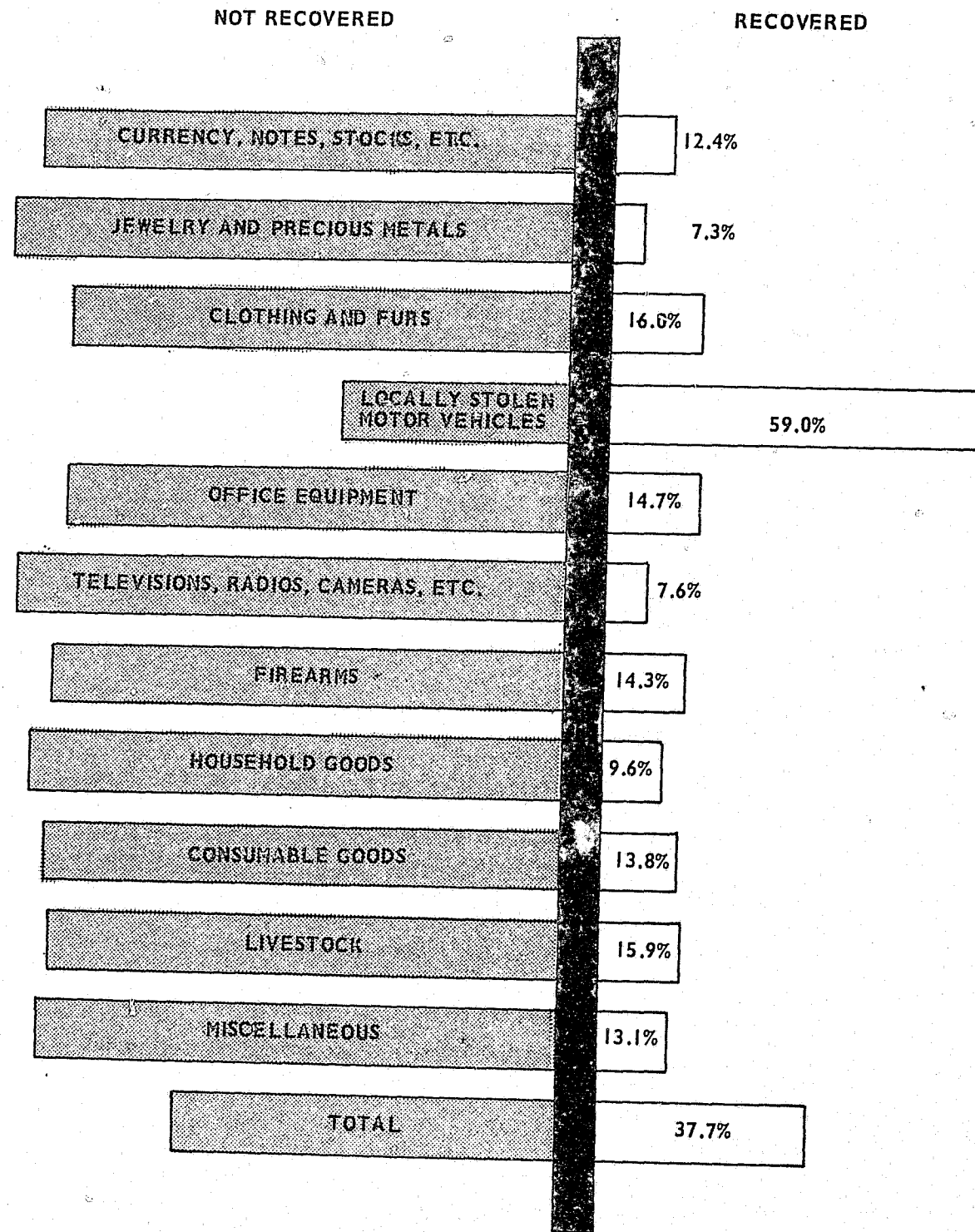

"Household goods" and "Locally stolen motor vehicles" showed respective increases of 22.9 percent and 20.5 percent. "Office equipment" and "Televisions, radios, cameras, etc." showed respective declines of 5.4 percent and 4.3 percent. Value of property recovered for "Currency, notes, etc." and "Jewelry and precious metals" showed respective increases of 37.1 percent and 36.5 percent, while recovered "Consumable goods" showed a 68.7 percent decrease.

As outlined in the following table, motor vehicle theft, while comprising only 11.2 percent of offenses involving property loss, accounted for a loss of 54.9 percent of all property stolen or \$112,874,434. Burglary accounted for 29.6 percent of all property loss with \$50,411,890. While larceny-theft had the highest number of offenses, 53.9 percent, its property loss value amounted to \$35,812,669 or 17.4 percent.

The average stolen value by offense category ranged from \$2,841 for motor vehicle theft to \$188 for larceny-theft down to insignificant values of \$8 taken in forcible rape and \$7 in the commission of murder.

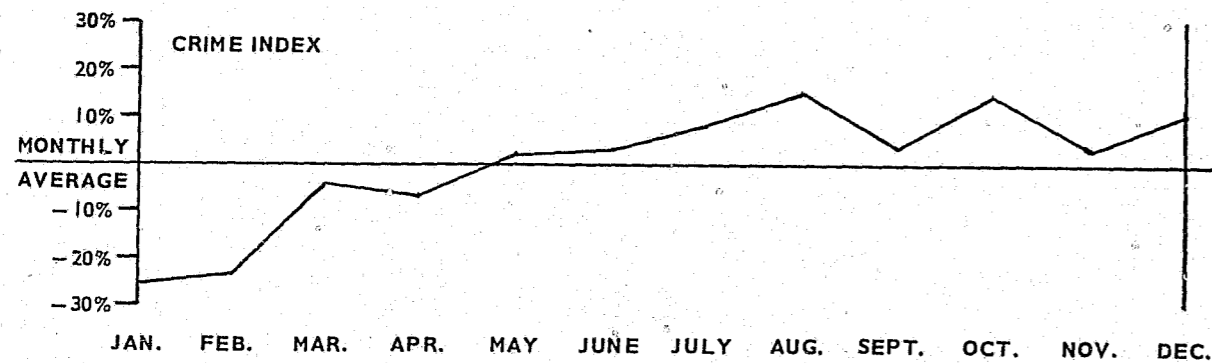

As outlined in the preceding table, significant increases in stolen property were reported for the crimes of robbery, increasing 24.8 percent to \$6,298,660 this year from \$5,048,603 last year, and for motor vehicle theft, increasing 20.7 percent from \$93,509,522 last year to \$112,874,434 this year. For the average value of a crime, robbery increased by 19.8 percent from \$329 to \$394. The overall increase in value of property stolen was 12.8 percent from \$180,556,497 to \$205,420,870, far exceeding the overall increase of 1.1 percent in Crime Index Offenses and indicating clearly the inflationary nature of crime in Pennsylvania.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

In the following chart, Crime Index Offenses are plotted by months from the average monthly base. The monthly Crime Index Offense totals varied from extreme lows of -25 percent and -24 percent for the cold months of January and February to a high of 15 percent in August.



CRIME INDEX ARRESTS

Crime Index Arrests increased 1.6 percent to 89,542 from 88,124 arrests last year. Arrests for Violent Crimes were 18,957, a 6.0 percent jump from 17,878 arrests last year. Arrests of those involved in Property Crime totaled 70,585, a 0.5 percent increase over 70,246 last year. The Arrest Rate for Crime Index Offenses was 747.1.

Violent Crime Arrests accounted for 18,957 or 21.2 percent of the Crime Index Arrests: murder, 592 or 0.7 percent; forcible rape, 1,444 or 1.6 percent; robbery, 7,066 or 7.9 percent; and aggravated assault, 9,855 or 11.0 percent.

Property Crime Arrests registered 70,585 or 78.8 percent of the Crime Index Arrests: burglary, 20,767 or 23.2 percent; larceny-theft, 44,352 or 49.5 percent; and motor vehicle theft, 5,466 or 6.1 percent.

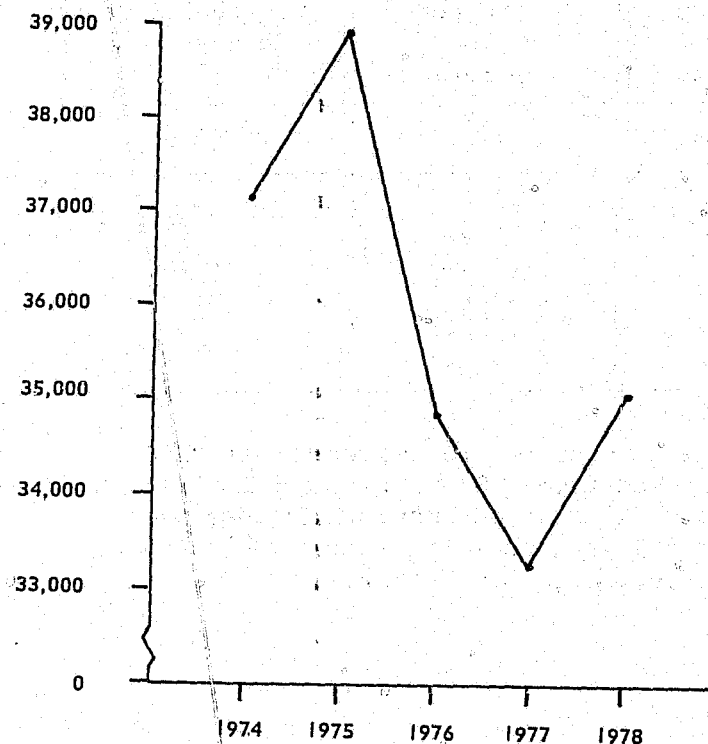
As outlined in Tables 13, 14 and 15, the following analysis of Crime Index Offenders was revealed: 82.2 percent were male and 17.8 percent female; 44.8 percent were under 18 years old, and 31.2 percent were between ages 18 and 25; 63.1 percent were White and 35.5 percent Negro.

Nearly one half of all Crime Index Arrests occurred in the Southeast CHSR. The Arrest Rates for Crime Index Offenses ranged from 1,084.3 in the Southeast Region to 502.2 in the Southwest CHSR. Two CHSR's showed arrest increases over last year, led by the Southeast CHSR with a 5.9 percent gain. Four CHSR's showed declines, led by the Southwest CHSR with a 5.9 percent decrease.

VOLUME, RATE AND NATURE

There were 35,151 Violent Crimes reported to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 96 each day. The Violent Crime Index Rate was 293.3. Violent Crimes represented 9.5 percent of all Crime Index Offenses, up from 9.1 percent of all Crime Index Offenses last year.

The components of the 35,151 Violent Crimes were 717 murders (2.0 percent), 2,178 forcible rapes (6.2 percent), 16,000 robberies (45.5 percent) and 16,247 aggravated assaults (46.2 percent).

The Violent Crime Index Rate of 293.3 was composed of 6.0 for murder, 18.2 for forcible rape, 133.5 for robbery, and 135.6 for aggravated assault.

TREND

The 35,151 Violent Crimes represented a 5.6 percent increase from 33,297 for last year. The 293.3 rate represented a 5.4 percent increase from the 278.2 Violent Crime Rate for last year. Forcible rape, down 1.8 percent, was the only Violent Crime showing a decrease this year. Aggravated assault increased 7.9 percent; murder, 8.6 percent and robbery, 4.2 percent. Violent Crimes have been decreasing, in spite of the gain this year. In fact, Violent Crime has dropped by 5.5 percent in the last five years.

CLEARANCES

This year, 49.7 percent or 17,456 Violent Crimes were cleared. Clearance rates for the components of Violent Crime were 75.6 percent for murder, 62.1 percent for forcible rape, 30.8 percent for robbery and 65.4 percent for aggravated assault. Clearance rates were down from last year for all Violent Crimes.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, 18,229 or 51.9 percent of all Violent Crime occurred in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 8,653 or 24.6 percent in the Southwest CHSR, with these two regions accounting for 76.5 percent of all Violent Crimes in Pennsylvania. The Central CHSR had the lowest volume of Violent Crime, 1,382 or 3.9 percent.

The Violent Crime Index Rates ranged from 459.7 in the Southeast CHSR to 132.7 in the Central CHSR. However, the Central CHSR had the highest clearance rate, 61.3 percent, the Southwest CHSR the lowest, 36.5 percent.

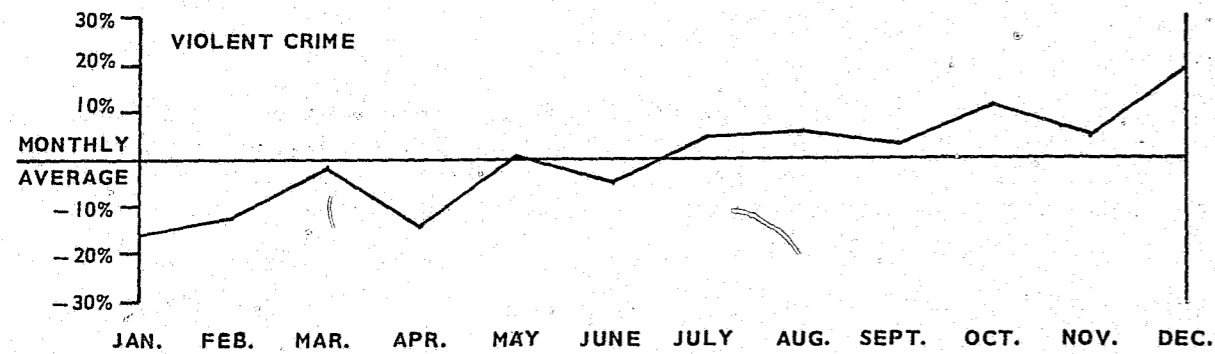
All CHSR's showed gains over last year's totals for Violent Crimes, led by the Central CHSR and the Northwest CHSR, increasing by 14.2 percent and 12.9 percent respectively.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF VIOLENT CRIME

In the following chart, Violent Crimes are plotted from the average monthly base. Such crimes were below average for the first six months with a -16 percent low in January. The last six months were above average with a high of 19 percent in December.



VIOLENT CRIME ARRESTS

There were 18,957 persons arrested this year for committing Violent Crimes, a 6.0 percent increase from the 17,878 persons arrested last year. Violent Crime arrestees were distributed as follows: 592 or 3.1 percent for murder; 1,444 or 7.6 percent for forcible rape; 7,066 or 37.3 percent for robbery; and 9,855 or 52.0 percent for aggravated assault. The Arrest Rate for Violent Crime was 158.2. Aggravated assault gained 8.5 percent and forcible rape declined by 4.9 percent from last year.

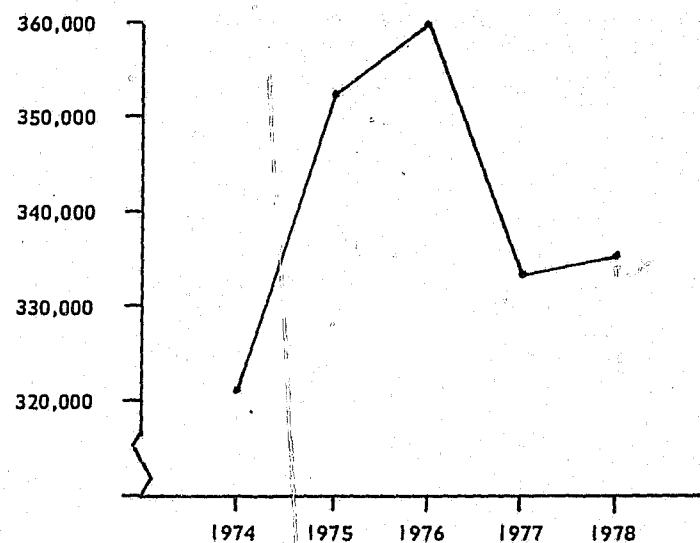

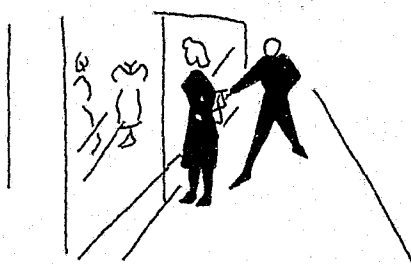

61.8 percent of all Violent Crime Arrests occurred in the Southeast CHSR. In fact, the Southeast and Southwest CHSR's accounted for 78.7 percent of all Violent Crime Arrests made during this year in Pennsylvania. The Arrest Rates for Violent Crime ranged from 295.3 in the Southeast Region to 58.0 in the Central CHSR. Three CHSR's showed gains in Violent Crime Arrests this year, led by the Southeast CHSR with an increase of 9.4 percent. Three CHSR's declined in Violent Crime Arrests, led by the Central CHSR with a drop of 7.4 percent.

VOLUME, RATE AND NATURE

There were 335,449 Property Crimes reported to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 919 each day. The Property Crime Index Rate was 2,798.9.

The components of the 335,449 Property Crimes were 104,785 burglaries (31.2 percent), 190,934 larceny-thefts (56.9 percent), and 39,730 motor vehicle thefts (11.8 percent).

The Property Crime Index Rate of 2,798.9 was composed of 874.3 for burglary, 1,593.1 for larceny-theft, and 331.5 for motor vehicle theft.

TREND

The 335,449 Property Crimes represent a 0.6 percent increase over the 333,365 Property Crimes last year. The Property Crime Index Rate of 2,798.9 was 0.5 percent higher than the 2,785.3 rate last year. Burglary increased by 1.2 percent, larceny-theft, 0.1 percent, and motor vehicle theft, 1.4 percent. Although Property Crime has dropped 6.8 percent from the peak of two years ago, it still shows a 4.2 percent increase over the five year period.

CLEARANCES

This year, 69,719 or 20.8 percent of all Property Crimes were cleared. Clearance rates for the components of Property Crime were 18.5 percent for burglary, 23.3 percent for larceny-theft, and 14.8 percent for motor vehicle theft. All Property Crime clearance rates were below those of 1977.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, 131,671 Property Crimes or 39.3 percent occurred in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 71,464 Property Crimes or 21.3 percent in the Southwest CHSR. Thus, these two regions accounted for 60.6 percent of all Property Crimes. The Central CHSR had the lowest volume of Property Crime, 22,587 or 6.7 percent.

Property Crime Index Rates ranged from 3,320.8 in the Southeast CHSR to 2,169.4 in the Central CHSR.

The Central CHSR had the highest clearance rate, 24.1 percent, while the Southwest CHSR had the lowest clearance rate, 15.1 percent.

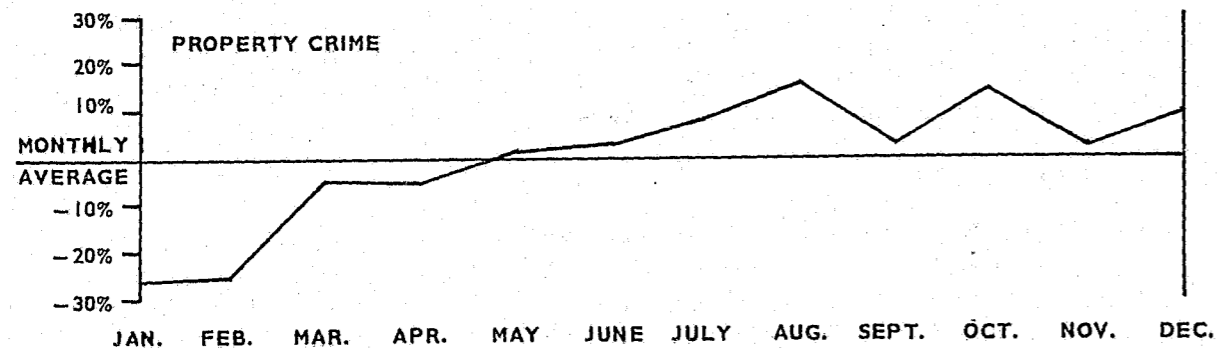
Four CHSR's increased in Property Crimes this year, with the Northeast CHSR showing the largest gain, 3.2 percent. The Northwest CHSR declined by 2.8 percent, and the Southwest CHSR, 1.9 percent.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF PROPERTY CRIME

In the following chart, Property Crimes are plotted by months from the average monthly base. From a low of -27 percent in January, and -25 percent in February, Property Crime climbed over the average reaching highs of 16 percent in August and 15 percent in October.



PROPERTY CRIME ARRESTS

70,585 persons were arrested this year for committing Property Crimes, an increase of 0.5 percent from 70,246 such arrestees last year. Arrestees for Property Crime violations were as follows: burglary, 20,767 or 29.4 percent; larceny-theft, 44,352 or 62.8 percent; and motor vehicle theft, 5,466 or 7.7 percent. The Arrest Rate for Property Crime was 588.9. Burglary gained 1.9 percent in arrests over last year, larceny-theft by 0.2 percent and motor vehicle theft arrests declined by 2.2 percent.

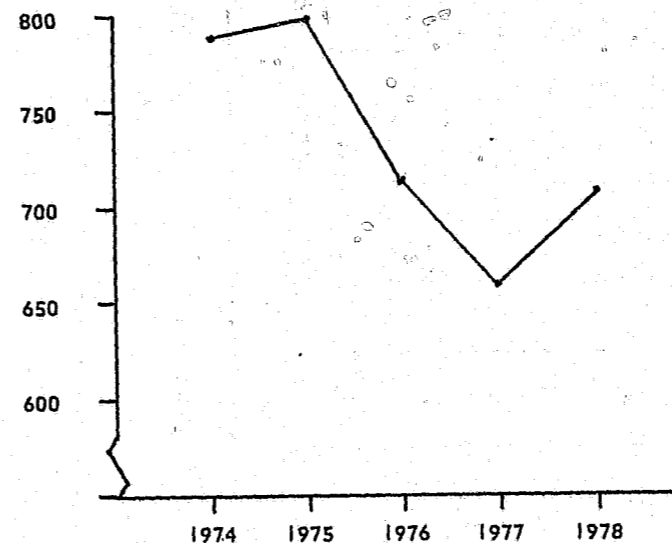

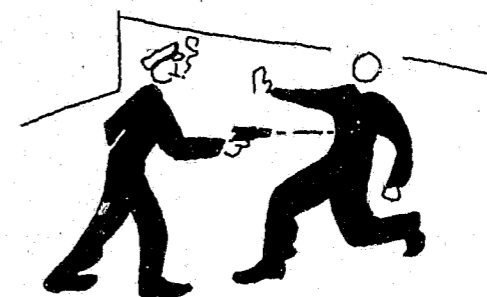

44.3 percent of Property Crime Arrests occurred in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 15.9 percent in the Southwest CHSR, a combined total of 60.2 percent. The Arrest Rates ranged from 789.0 in the Southeast CHSR to 390.3 in the Southwest CHSR. Three CHSR's reported increases in arrests, led by the Southeast with a gain of 4.3 percent. The remaining three regions decreased, led by the Southwest CHSR with a drop of 7.4 percent.

VOLUME AND RATE

There were 717 murders reported this year to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 2.0 each day. Murder comprised 0.2 percent of all Index Crimes and 2.0 percent of all Violent Crimes. The victimization rate was 6.0 per 100,000 population (Table 1).

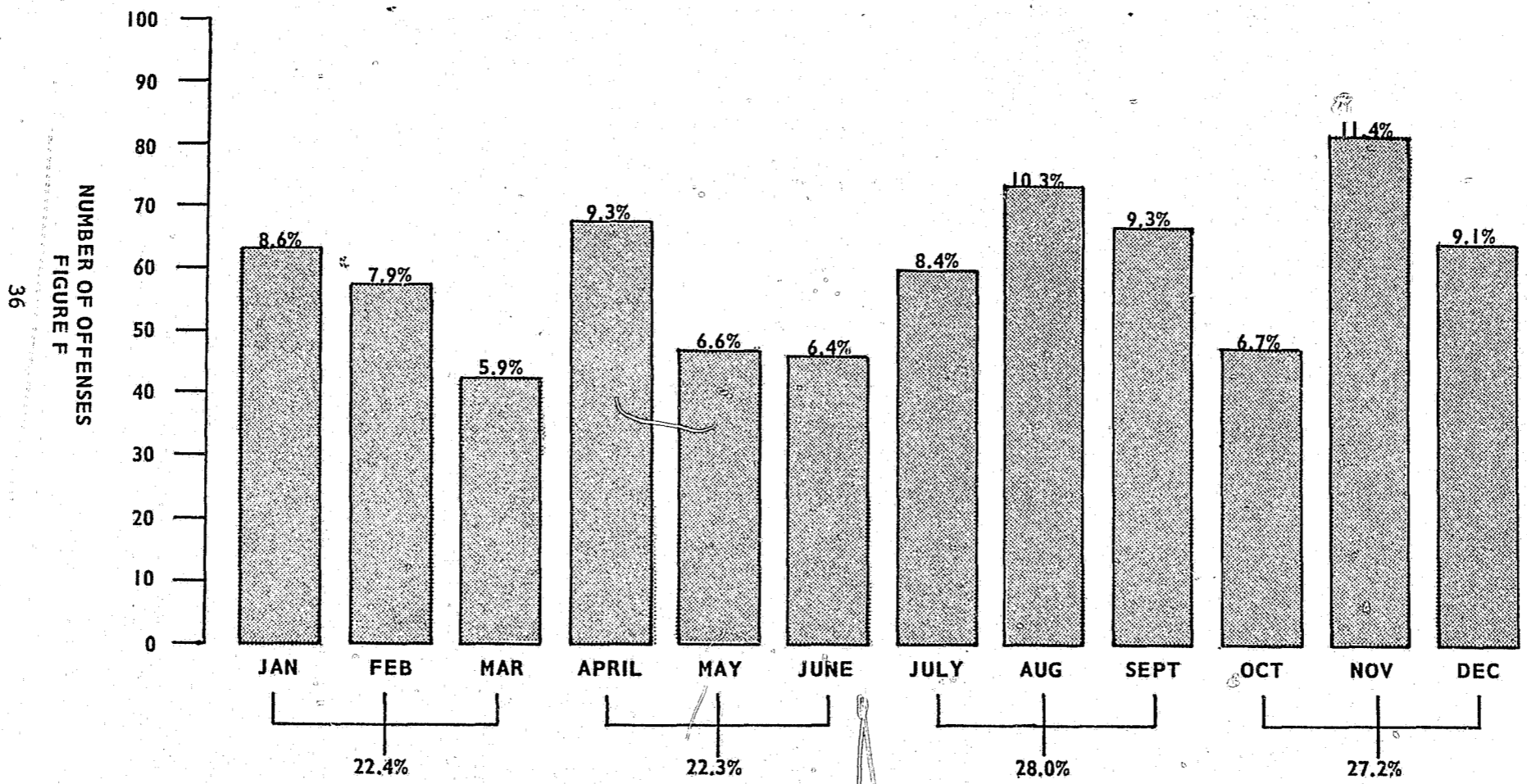
TREND

The 717 murders represent an 8.6 percent increase from the 660 reported last year. The Index Rate of 6.0 is an increase of 9.1 percent from last year's rate of 5.5.

CLEARANCES

Of the 717 murders, 542 or 75.6 percent were cleared. This represents the highest clearance rate of any of the Index Offenses.

Philadelphia accounted for almost half (351 or 49.0 percent) of all reports of this offense. The clearance rate was 67.2 percent, and the offense rate per 100,000 population was 18.3.

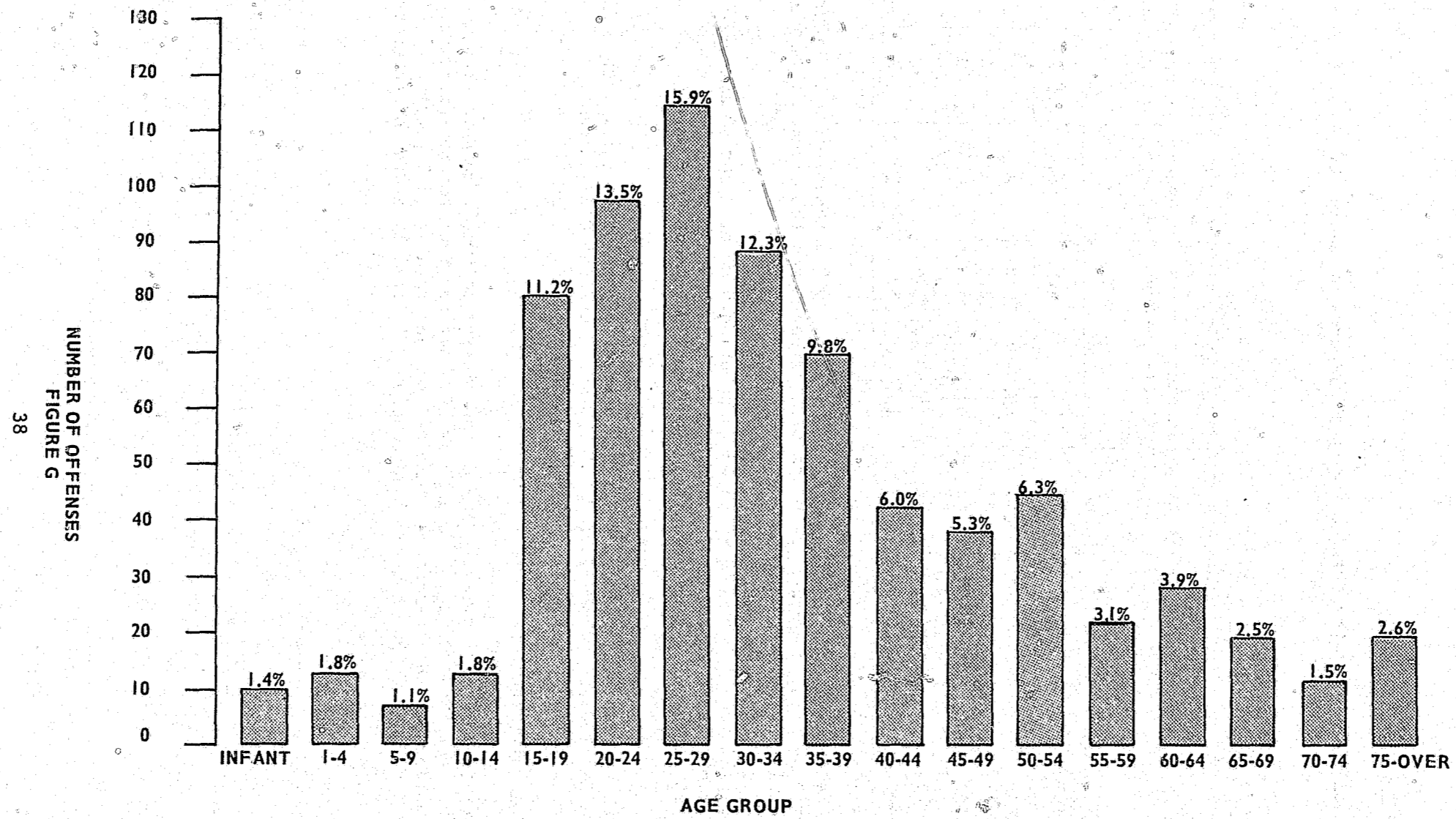
Municipalities with 50,000 - 250,000 population accounted for 42 murders or 5.9 percent of the State total with a 3.8 Index Rate. The clearance rate was 95.2 percent. This population group reported the lowest number of murders this year.

Pittsburgh reported 66 murders or 9.2 percent of the State total with a 13.5 Index Rate per 100,000 population. The clearance rate was 81.8 percent.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, the highest volume of murders occurred in the Southeast CHSR, with 425 murders or 59.3 percent, and the Southwest CHSR with 135 murders or 18.8 percent. These two regions totaled 78.1 percent of all murders. The Central CHSR had the lowest volume, 22 or 3.1 percent of the total.

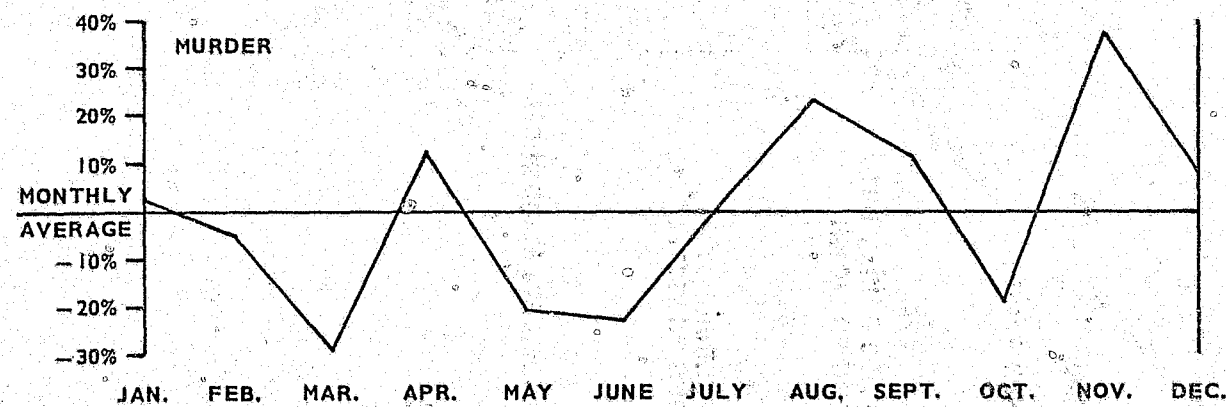
The Murder Crime Index Rate ranged from 10.7 in the Southeast CHSR to 2.1 in the Central CHSR.

The Northeast CHSR reported the highest clearance rate, 96.8 percent. The lowest clearance rate, 68.0 percent, occurred in the Southeast CHSR.

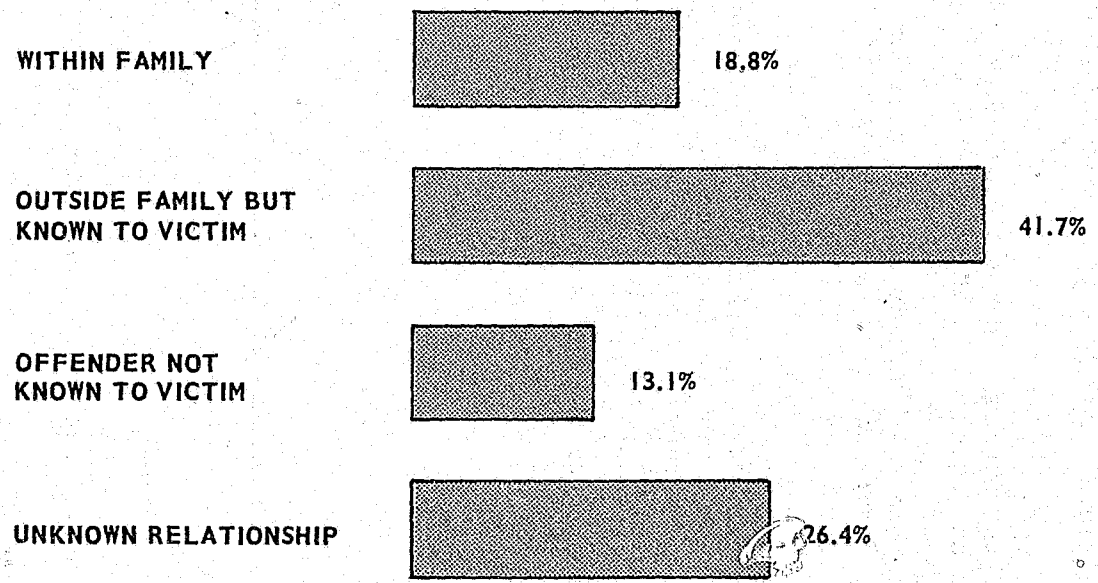
The Northeast CHSR showed the largest percent change in murder from last year, a 47.6 percent increase. The Central CHSR reported a decrease of 35.3 percent.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF MURDER

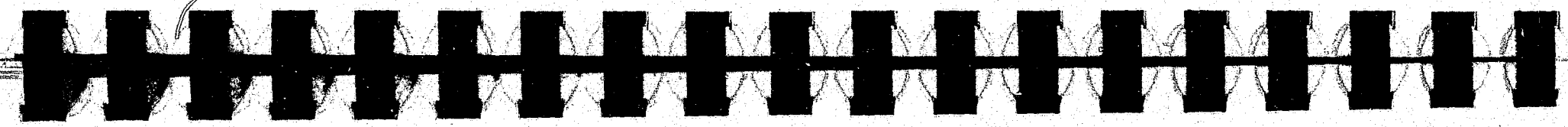

The highest incidence of murder occurred during the month of November, with 82 offenses (11.4 percent), or 37 percent above the average monthly base, and the lowest during the month of March, with 42 offenses (5.9 percent), or 30 percent below the average monthly base. The third quarter of the year (July, August, September) had the greatest incidence of murder compared to the other quarters of the year.

MURDER BY TYPE OF WEAPON

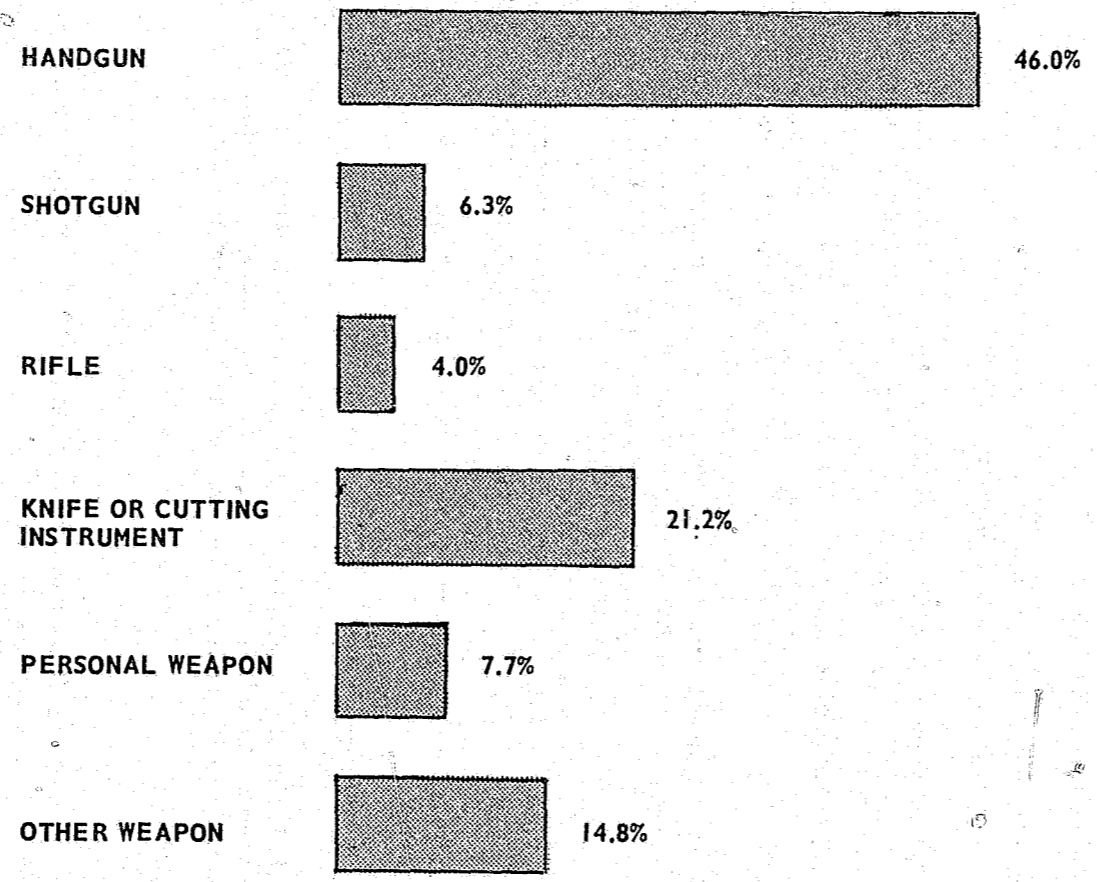

AGE, RACE AND SEX OF VICTIM

Murder victims were predominately males, who accounted for 73.5 percent of the total. See Table 5. Victim analysis by race discloses that 48.8 percent were white and 51.2 percent were non-white. The largest number of victims were between the ages of 20 to 29 (29.4 percent of the total).

MURDER WEAPONS

Firearms, chiefly handguns, predominated as the weapon used in the commission of the crime.

Statewide, 56.3 percent of the reported murders were attributed to the use of firearms (Table 6, Figure I). The use of cutting or stabbing weapons represented 21.2 percent of the total. Use of personal weapons such as hands, fists, feet, etc., accounted for 7.7 percent. The remaining 14.8 percent was attributed to the use of all other weapons, such as blunt objects, arson, instruments of strangulation, asphyxiation, etc.

CIRCUMSTANCES CAUSING MURDER

Circumstances causing murder are classified by four general categories. These categories are defined as the following:

Felony type - a killing which occurs in conjunction with the commission of another crime such as robbery, burglary, etc.

Suspected felony type - victim found murdered. Circumstances indicate possible felony type murder, but sufficient facts to identify type of felony are not available.

Other than felony type - involves brawls due to the influence of alcohol or narcotics, arguments (domestic, lover's triangle, over money or property) gangland and institutional killings.

Unable to determine circumstances - all instances where facts provided do not permit determination of circumstances.

A summary of these circumstances appears in Figure J and in Table 7 on page A-5 of Appendix A.

JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDES

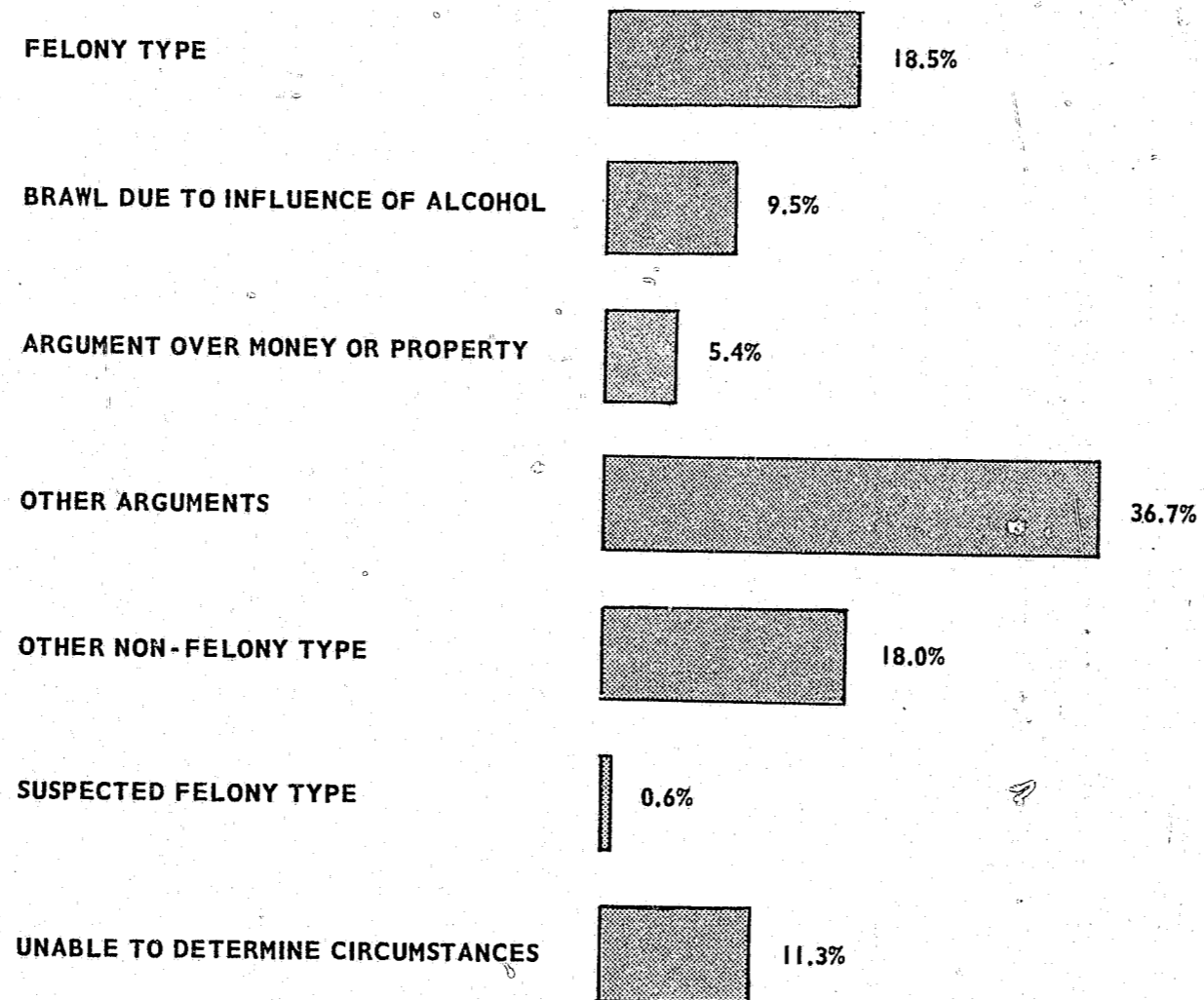
A justifiable homicide is the killing of a felon by a police officer or a private citizen. In addition to the 717 homicides, 45 justifiable homicides were reported by police agencies. These justifiable homicides are omitted from this analysis.

MURDER ARRESTS

592 persons were arrested for murder, a 0.5 percent increase over last year's total of 589. The Arrest Rate was 4.9.

An analysis of persons arrested for murder is as follows: 87.7 percent male and 12.3 percent female; 58.8 percent 25 years of age and over; 40.0 percent White; and 56.8 percent Negro.

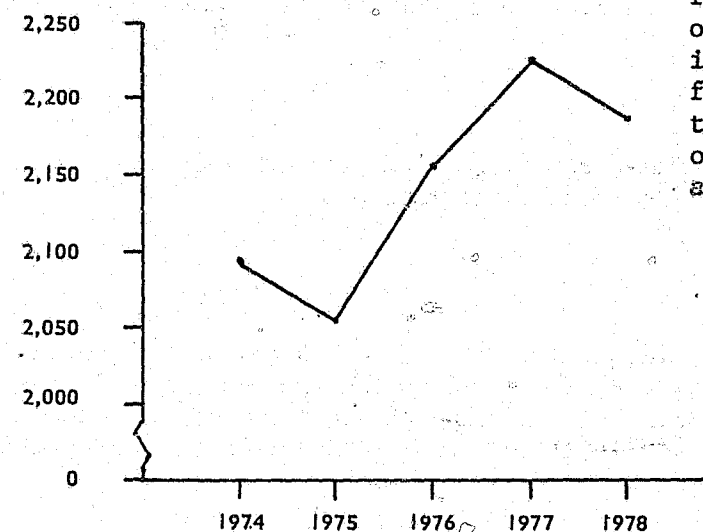

57.8 percent of the murder arrests occurred in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 19.8 percent in the Southwest CHSR, a total of 77.6 percent for the two regions. Murder Arrest Rates ranged from 8.6 in the Southeast CHSR to 1.8 in the Central CHSR.

VOLUME, RATE AND NATURE

There were 2,187 forcible rapes reported to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 6 each day. This offense represents 6.2 percent of all Violent Crimes and only 0.6 percent of all Crime Index Offenses.

While the Forcible Rape Crime Index Rate was 18.2, the rate per 100,000 Pennsylvania females was 35.1, which places the rate in its proper perspective as a victim risk rate, since it equates the number of crimes per unit of population.

Of the 2,187 cases of rape reported, 1,741 or 79.6 percent were actual rapes, the remaining 446 cases or 20.4 percent were assaults to commit rape or attempts to commit rape. Of all the Index Crimes, law enforcement administrators recognize rape as one of the most underreported crimes, primarily because of fear and/or embarrassment on the part of the victim. In addition, 382 reported rape cases were unfounded by police investigation. In these cases, the police determined that no forcible rape offense or attempt occurred.

TREND

The 2,187 forcible rapes represent a 1.8 percent drop from last year's 2,228. Similarly, the Index Rate of 18.2 is a 2.2 percent decline from last year's 18.6 rate. Actual rapes declined only 0.8 percent while attempted rapes decreased 5.7 percent. Contributing somewhat to the increases over the last several years was the development of rape crisis centers and the training of personnel specialized in handling rape victims in some police jurisdictions. Even though reported rape has decreased this year, it still shows a 4.3 percent increase over the last five years.

CLEARANCES

This year, the clearance rate for actual rape was 63.7 percent and attempted rape, 56.1 percent, for a total clearance rate of 62.1 percent.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, 48.4 percent or 1,058 cases of all forcible rapes reported occurred in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 23.4 percent or 512 cases in the Southwest CHSR. Almost three-fourths of all rape cases occurred in these two regions. The lowest occurrence of rape was in the Central CHSR where 5.3 percent or 116 cases were reported.

The Forcible Rape Crime Rates ranged from 26.7 in the Southeast CHSR to 9.4 in the Northeast CHSR.

The Northwest CHSR had the highest rate of clearance (77.5 percent). The lowest clearance rate was in the Southcentral CHSR, 52.7 percent.

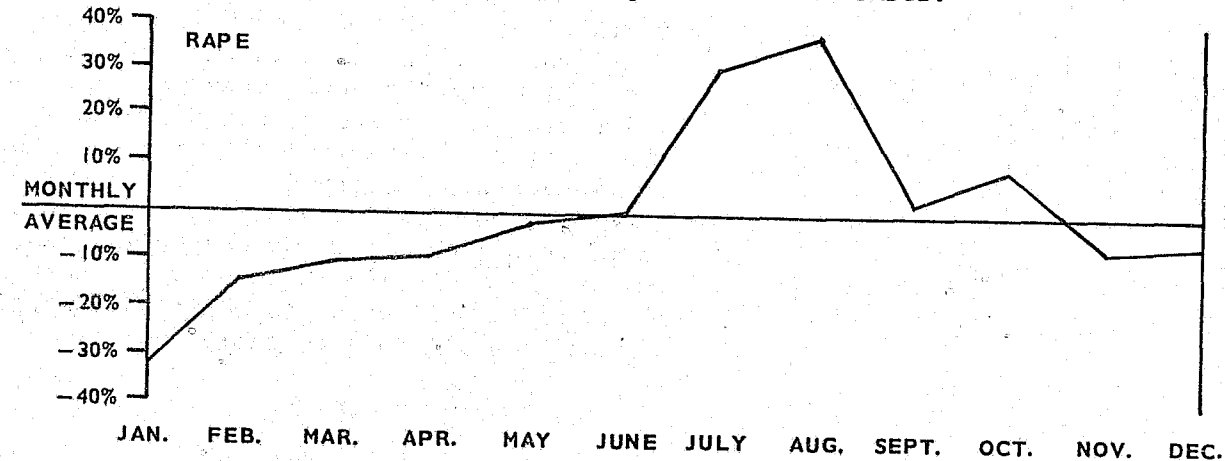
The Central CHSR increased 30.3 percent in rape cases this year, followed by the Northeast CHSR with 17.9 percent. All other CHSR's declined, led by the Northwest CHSR with an 11.8 percent drop.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF RAPE

In the following chart, rape offenses are plotted by months from the average monthly base. Rape offenses fluctuated below the average base for the first five months, with a -32 percent low in January. They climbed above average during the warm months of summer and early fall, reaching an apex of 37.7 percent in August and declined in the fall, to a low of -7 percent in November.



FORCIBLE RAPE ARRESTS

1,444 persons were arrested for forcible rape, a 4.9 percent decrease from the 1,519 arrested last year. The Arrest Rate per 100,000 for forcible rape was 12.0.

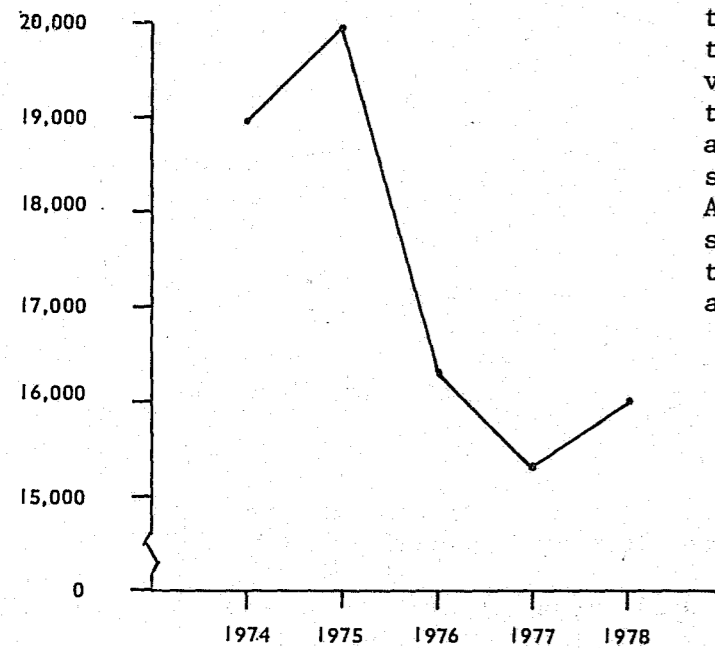
An analysis of persons arrested for forcible rape reveals the following: 98.8 percent male and 1.2 percent female (apparently accomplices or otherwise involved in the crime); 16.9 percent under age 18 and 55.4 percent under age 25 years; 40.5 White and 58.0 percent Negro. Arrests of persons under 25 years decreased 13.9 percent and arrests of juveniles, 16.4 percent. Arrests of those 25 years and older increased by 9.2 percent.

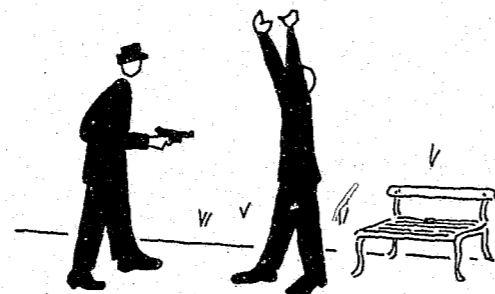

60.9 percent of the forcible rape arrests occurred in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 17.0 percent in the Southwest CHSR, a total of 77.9 percent for the two regions. Forcible Rape Arrest Rates ranged from 22.2 in the Southeast CHSR to 4.3 in the Central CHSR. The Southeast CHSR was the only CHSR to show an increase in arrests, 7.6 percent. All other CHSR's declined, led by the Northwest CHSR with a 28.4 percent drop.

Armed robberies where any weapon is used, and strong-arm robberies where no weapon other than a personal weapon is employed ("mugging") are included in this category.

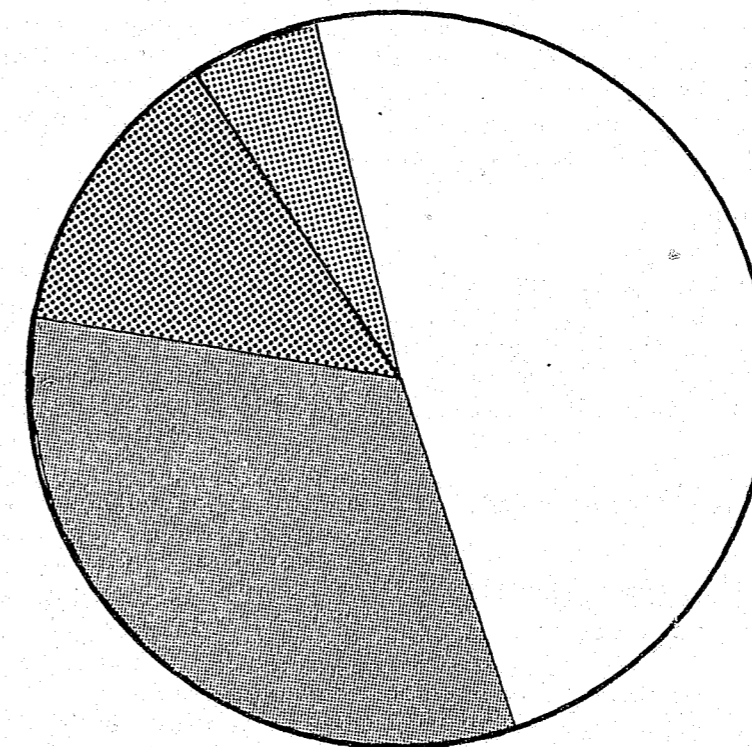
VOLUME, RATE AND NATURE

There were 16,000 robberies reported to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 44 each day. Robberies represented 4.3 percent of all Crime Index Offenses, and 45.5 percent of all Violent Crimes.

Robberies with firearms represented 33.7 percent or 5,399 of all robberies; with knives or cutting instruments, 12.1 percent or 1,942; with other dangerous weapons, 5.1 percent or 812; and strong-arm robberies (no weapons), 49.0 percent or 7,847.

The Crime Index Rate for robbery was 133.5, subdivided into 45.0 for robberies with firearms, 16.2 for robberies with knives or cutting instruments, 6.8 for robberies with other dangerous weapons, and 65.5 for strong-arm robberies.

ROBBERY BY TYPE OF WEAPON







TREND

Robberies gained 4.2 percent from 15,354 last year to 16,000. The Robbery Crime Index Rate increased 4.1 percent from 128.3 to 133.5 this year. Robbery with firearms decreased 1.5 percent; however, robbery with knives or cutting instruments increased 3.4 percent; other dangerous weapons, 0.7 percent; and strong-arm, 9.2 percent.

Although robbery has increased this year, it still shows a decrease of 15.1 percent over the last five years.

CLEARANCES

30.8 percent or 4,927 robberies were cleared. Robberies with firearms were cleared in 26.4 percent or 1,423 cases; with knives or cutting instruments, 30.7 percent or 596 cases; with other dangerous weapons, 36.3 percent or 295 cases; and strong-arm robberies, 33.3 percent or 2,613 cases. In general, robbery clearances were down by 9.8 percent from last year.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, the highest volume of robberies occurred in the two CHSR's with the most metropolitan characteristics: the Southeast CHSR with 8,747 robberies or 54.7 percent, and the Southwest CHSR, 4,318 robberies or 27.0 percent. Together, 81.7 percent of all robberies occurred in these two regions. The least number of robberies were recorded in the Central CHSR, 327 or 2.0 percent.

The Robbery Index Rates ranged from 220.6 in the Southeast CHSR to 31.4 in the Central CHSR.

The highest clearance rate occurred in the Southeast CHSR, 36.4 percent. The lowest clearance rate occurred in the Southwest CHSR, 20.9 percent.

Only the Southeast CHSR showed a decline among the CHSR's, 0.7 percent. The Central CHSR gained 30.3 percent to lead the remaining CHSR's.

As outlined in the above table, \$6,298,660 in property was stolen in the 16,000 robberies reported, with an average value per robbery of \$394. The highest average value was \$5,853 stolen in bank robberies, even though these cases represented only 1.2 percent or 184 of all robberies.

"Highway robbery" represented 60.1 percent of all robberies, and 32.4 percent of all value stolen in robbery or \$2,039,030, with an average value of \$212. The second highest type of robbery in value and number was "Commercial houses" where 13.6 percent or 2,180 robberies accounted for 15.9 percent of all value stolen or \$1,001,422, an average value of \$459.

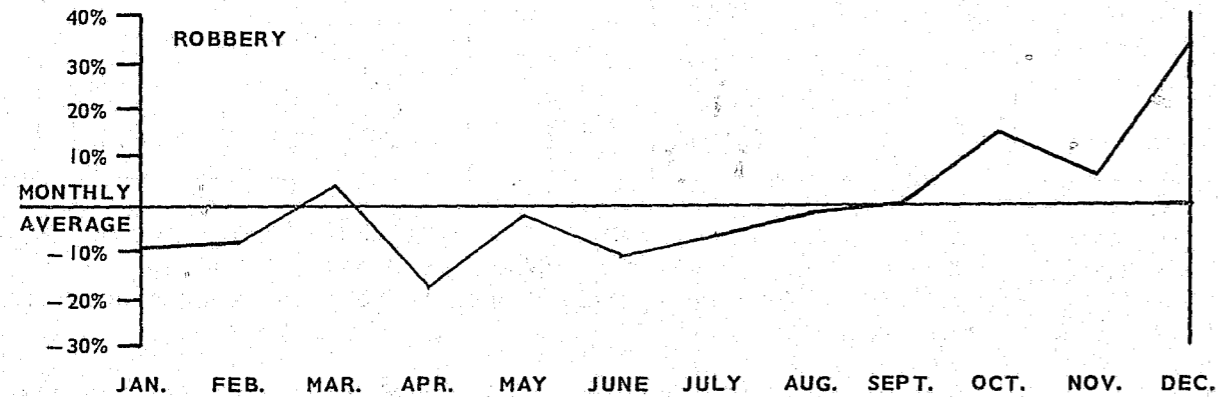

The total value for robbery increased 24.8 percent from last year, climbing to \$6,298,660 from \$5,048,603. The average value for robbery increased to \$394 from \$329 last year, a gain of 19.8 percent. The robbery category showing the largest gain in value was "Bank", a 47.2 percent increase to \$1,076,962 this year from \$731,637 last year. Its average value also increased 49.6 percent from \$3,912 last year to \$5,853 this year. "Convenience store" robbery declined 4.6 percent to \$605,670 from \$635,004 last year. However, its average value increased 4.8 percent from \$819 to \$858.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF ROBBERY

In the following chart, robbery offenses are plotted by months from the average monthly base. The first eight months, except for March, were under the average with a low of -18 percent in April. The last four months were above the average with a December high of 34 percent.



ROBBERY ARRESTS

Robbery arrests totaled 7,066, a 5.7 percent increase over last year's total of 6,687. The Arrest Rate for robbery was 59.0.

An analysis of persons arrested for robbery is as follows: 94.4 percent male and 5.6 percent female; 30.1 percent under age 18, and 79.5 percent under age 25; 39.1 percent White, and 68.7 percent Negro. Arrests of juveniles increased 10.4 percent and persons under 25 increased 8.4 percent.

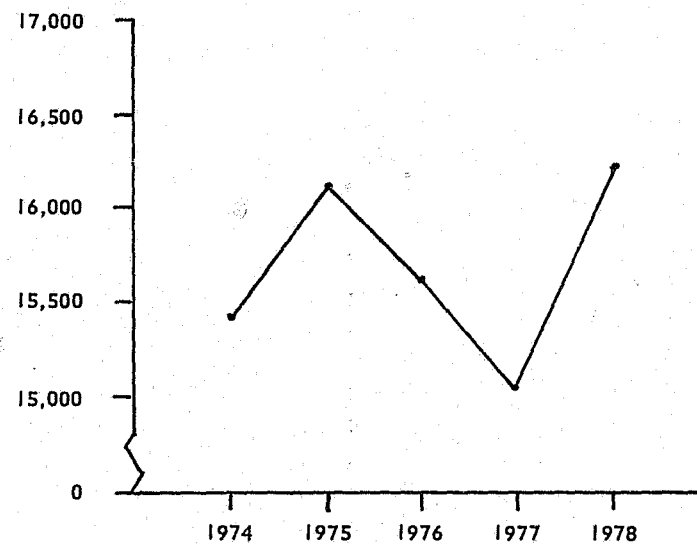
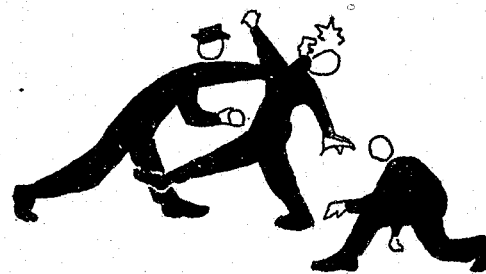

67.2 percent of all arrests occurred in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 17.0 percent in the Southwest CHSR, accounting for 84.2 percent of all robbery arrests. The Arrest Rates ranged from 119.7 in the Southeast CHSR to 12.5 in the Central CHSR. Four CHSR's showed gains in robbery arrests over last year, while two CHSR's decreased from last year. The largest increase was 16.8 percent in the Northwest CHSR, and the largest decline was 13.0 percent in the Southcentral CHSR.

DEFINITION: Aggravated assault is the unlawful attack by one person upon another with the intent to inflict great bodily injury, usually accomplished by the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or serious bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury were the crime successfully completed. Attempted murders are included in this category.

VOLUME, RATE AND NATURE

There were 16,247 aggravated assaults reported to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 45 each day. Aggravated assault totaled 4.4 percent of all Crime Index Offenses and 46.2 percent of all Violent Crimes.

Aggravated assault consisted of 2,574 cases with firearms (15.8 percent), 3,474 cases with knives or cutting instruments (21.4 percent), 3,160 cases with other dangerous weapons (19.5 percent), and 7,039 cases by hands, fists, feet, etc. (43.3 percent).

ASSAULT BY TYPE OF WEAPON

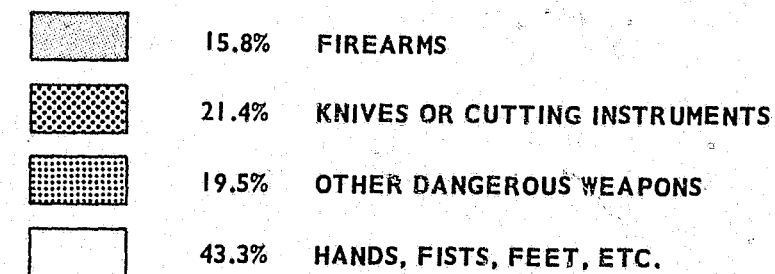
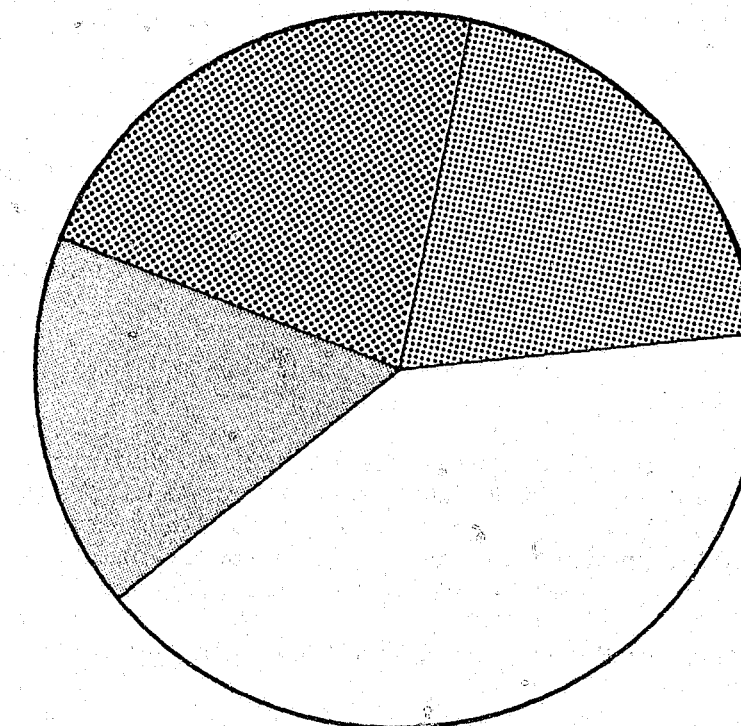

The Crime Index Rate for aggravated assault was 135.6. The rates for the components of aggravated assault were 21.5 for assaults with firearms, 29.0 for assaults with knives or cutting instruments, 26.4 for assaults with other dangerous weapons, and 58.7 for assaults by hands, fists, feet, etc.

TREND

Aggravated assault increased by 7.9 percent from 15,055 last year to 16,247. The Index Rate for aggravated assault gained by 7.8 percent from 125.8 to 135.6. Assaults with firearms increased 8.7 percent, assaults with knives or cutting instruments, 9.5 percent, assaults with dangerous weapons, 6.1 percent, and assaults with hands, fists, feet, etc., 7.7 percent. Aggravated assault showed the most substantial gain in Violent Crime Offenses this year.

CLEARANCES

65.4 percent or 10,628 aggravated assaults were cleared. Clearance rates for the components of aggravated assault were 67.4 percent for assaults with firearms, 66.1 percent for assaults with knives or cutting instruments, 60.0 percent for assaults with other dangerous weapons, and 66.8 percent for assaults with hands, fists, feet, etc.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, the highest volume of aggravated assaults occurred in the Southeast CHSR, with 7,999 assaults or 49.2 percent, and in the Southwest CHSR, with 3,688 assaults or 22.7 percent. These two regions accounted for 71.9 percent of all aggravated assaults. The lowest number of aggravated assaults occurred in the Northwest CHSR, 840 or 5.2 percent.

The Aggravated Assault Rates ranged from 201.7 in the Southeast CHSR to 74.7 in the Northeast CHSR.

The Northwest CHSR had the highest clearance rate for assaults, 71.4 percent. The Southwest CHSR had the lowest clearance rate, 50.7 percent.

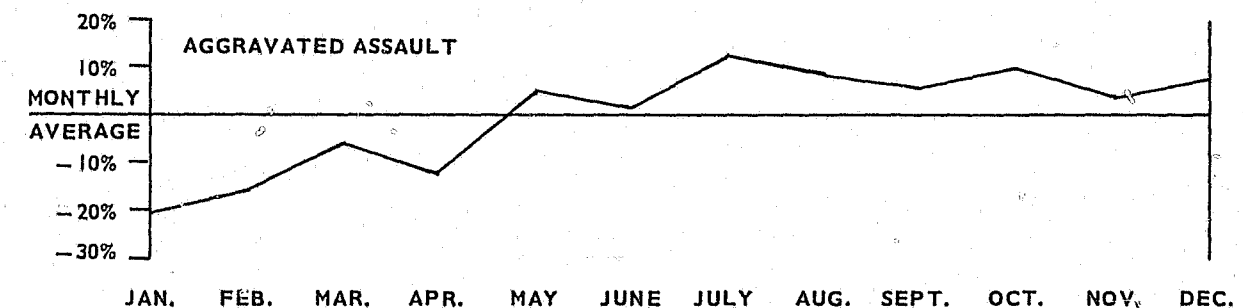

In the following chart, aggravated assaults are plotted by months from the average monthly base. From a low of 21 percent below average in January, the aggravated assaults remained under the average monthly base for the first four months. It climbed over the average monthly base, for the remainder of the year, with an apex of 12 percent in July.



AGGRAVATED ASSAULT ARRESTS

There were 9,855 arrests made for aggravated assault this year, representing a 8.5 percent increase over the 9,083 arrests last year. The Aggravated Assault Arrest Rate per 100,000 was 82.2. The aggravated assault arrest increase was the largest gain in Violent Crime arrests this year.

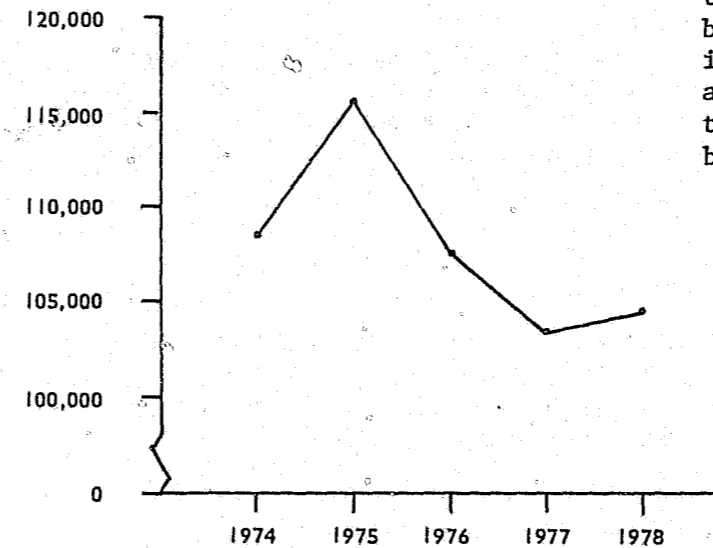

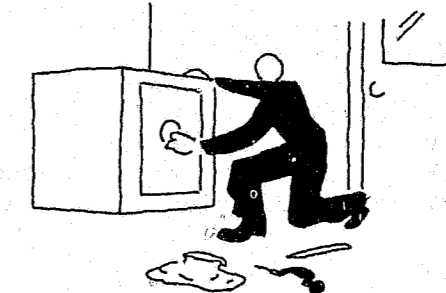

58.2 percent of all aggravated assault arrests were recorded in the Southeast CHSR, and 16.7 percent in the Southwest CHSR, accounting for 74.9 percent of all aggravated assault arrests. The Aggravated Assault Arrest Rates per 100,000 ranged from 144.7 in the Southeast CHSR to 39.4 in the Central CHSR. The Southeast CHSR recorded a 12.5 percent increase, while the Central CHSR showed a 6.4 percent drop.

It is not necessary for force to be used to gain or attempt to gain entrance in order for the event to be classified as a burglary. Moreover, a loss does not have to occur for a case of an illegal entry to be counted.

VOLUME, RATE AND NATURE

There were 104,785 burglaries reported to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 287 each day. Burglary comprised 28.3 percent of all Index Crimes and 31.2 percent of all Property Crimes.

Forcible entry occurred in 77,917 cases or 74.4 percent of all burglaries. Unlawful entry without force accounted for 18,626 cases or 17.8 percent, and attempted forcible entry totaled 8,242 cases or 7.9 percent.

The Crime Index Rate for burglary was 874.3. This rate is an accumulation of 650.1 for forcible entry, 155.4 for unlawful entry without force, and 68.8 for attempted forcible entry.

TREND

Burglary increased by 1.2 percent to 104,785 from 103,516 last year. The Crime Index Rate gained 1.1 percent to 874.3 from 864.9. The components of burglary gained as follows: forcible entry, 0.2 percent; unlawful entry without force, 2.1 percent; and attempted forcible entry, 9.9 percent. Although burglary increased for the first time in three years, the offense still shows a 3.8 percent decrease over the past five years.

CLEARANCES

Burglary is a crime of stealth, a characteristic tending to make detection of the perpetrator more difficult. As a result only 18.5 percent of all burglaries were cleared. The clearance rate for forcible entry was 19.8 percent. For unlawful entry without force the clearance rate was 16.1 percent, and for attempted forcible entry the clearance rate was 11.0 percent.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, 39,750 or 37.9 percent of all burglaries occurred in the Southeast CHSR, and 22,660 or 21.6 percent occurred in the Southwest CHSR. These two regions accounted for 59.5 percent of all burglaries. The least number of burglaries was found in the Central CHSR, with 6,966 or 6.6 percent.

The Burglary Rates ranged from 1,002.5 in the Southeast CHSR to 669.1 in the Central CHSR.

The Southeast CHSR had the highest clearance rate with 21.6 percent, and the Northeast CHSR, the lowest with 14.4 percent.

The Southcentral CHSR had the highest increase in burglary offenses this year, 8.1 percent, and the Southwest CHSR had the largest decline, 1.5 percent.

Property valued at \$50,411,890 was stolen in burglary this year with an average value of \$481 per offense. Burglary is divided into two classes for analysis: burglary of residence, by time of day, and burglary of nonresidence, by time of day.

Burglary of residences accounted for 63,124 offenses, with \$31,075,429 in stolen property value. This was an average value of \$492. Nighttime burglary of residences represented 28,366 burglaries or 27.1 percent, with a total property value stolen of \$14,035,272 or an average value of \$495.

Burglary of nonresidence establishments amounted to 41,661 cases or 39.8 percent of all burglaries with a total property value of \$19,336,461. The average value of nonresidence burglary was \$464. Again nighttime burglary comprised the majority of nonresidence cases, 30,428 or 29.0 percent, with \$14,748,963 in stolen property value or an average value of \$485.

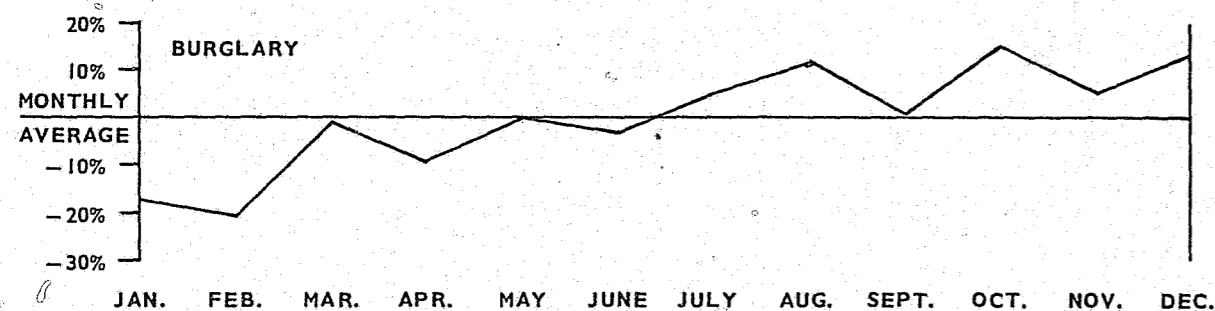

The total value of property stolen in burglary increased by 4.1 percent from \$48,421,736 last year to \$50,411,890. The average value of all burglaries is \$481 this year, 2.8 percent over the \$468 of last year.

Property taken in residence burglaries increased by 2.7 percent from \$30,263,314 last year to \$31,075,429 this year, while burglaries of nonresidences increased from \$18,158,422 to \$19,336,461 or a 6.5 percent gain.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF BURGLARY

In the following chart, burglary offenses are plotted by months from the average monthly base. The burglary offenses were under the average base for the first six months with a -20 percent low in February and over the average base for the remainder of the year with a peak of 16 percent reached in October.



BURGLARY ARRESTS

There were 20,767 persons arrested for burglary, which is a 1.9 percent gain over the 20,380 persons arrested last year. The Burglary Arrest Rate per 100,000 was 173.3.

An analysis of persons arrested for burglary was as follows: male, 95.3 percent, female, 4.7 percent; under age 18, 55.0 percent and under age 25, 86.5 percent; White, 69.7 percent and Negro, 28.3 percent. Arrests of juveniles increased by 4.5 percent, and Negro arrestees, 6.3 percent. Female arrestees declined by 6.1 percent.

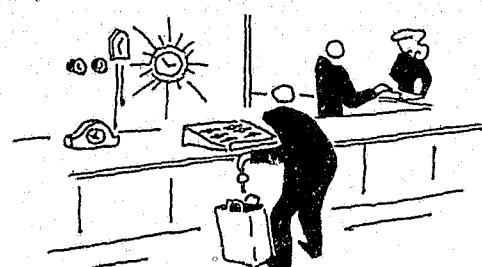
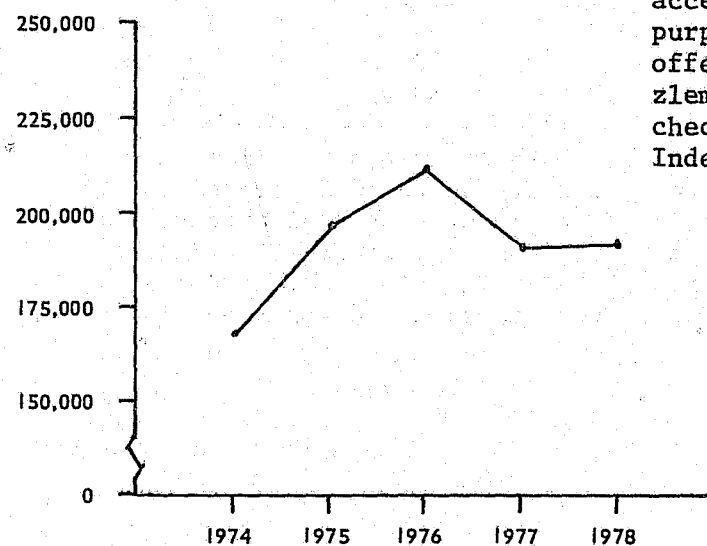

44.0 percent of the arrests occurred in the Southeast Region, followed by 18.3 percent in the Southwest CHSR. These two regions represented 62.3 percent of all arrests made for burglary. The Central CHSR had the least number of arrests, 1,386 or 6.7 percent. The Burglary Arrest Rates per 100,000 ranged from 230.4 in the Southeast CHSR to 132.4 in the Southwest CHSR. The Northeast CHSR recorded a 5.7 percent increase in arrests, and the Northwest CHSR reported a 6.8 percent decrease.

DEFINITION: Larceny-theft is the unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles of value without the use of force, violence, or fraud. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse-snatching, thefts from autos, theft of auto parts and accessories, bicycle theft, etc. For the purposes of Uniform Crime Reporting, this offense category does not include embezzlement, "con" games, forgery or worthless checks. Motor vehicle theft is a separate Index Crime and, therefore, is also excluded.

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

Larceny-theft was the most voluminous Crime Index Offense in Pennsylvania. There were 190,934 larceny-thefts reported to Pennsylvania police departments, an average of 523 each day. Larceny-theft represented 51.5 percent of all Crime Index Offenses, and 56.9 percent of all Property Crimes.

The Larceny-Theft Crime Index was 190,934, a 0.1 percent gain over 190,662 last year. The rate per 100,000 for larceny-theft was 1,593.1, less than 0.1 percent increase from 1,593.0 last year. Larceny-Theft Crime Index showed the smallest increase of all Property Crime Offenses this year.

Of all the Crime Index Offenses, larceny-theft has shown the greatest increase over a five-year period, 13.2 percent.

CLEARANCES

The nature of larceny-theft makes it an extremely difficult offense for law enforcement officers to solve. Two elements, a lack of witnesses, and the tremendous volume, work in the offender's favor. 23.3 percent or 44,474 larceny-thefts were cleared this year.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, 73,313 cases or 38.4 percent of all larceny-thefts occurred in the Southeast CHSR and 36,868 cases or 19.3 percent were reported in the Southwest CHSR. These two regions accounted for 57.7 percent of all larceny-thefts. The lowest volume was revealed in the Central Region, with 14,339 or 7.5 percent.

The Southeast CHSR had the highest rate of clearance, 26.4 percent, followed by the Central CHSR, 25.3 percent. The Southwest CHSR had the lowest rate of clearance, 16.8 percent.

The Larceny-Theft Rates ranged from 1,864.4 in the Southcentral CHSR to 1,286.0 in the Southwest CHSR.

The Southeast CHSR had the greatest increase this year, 3.1 percent, the Northwest CHSR, the largest decline, 4.8 percent.

\$35,812,669 in property was stolen in the 190,934 larceny-thefts reported this year, an average value of \$188.

Thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories represented the largest classification, 19.7 percent or 37,530 larceny-thefts. Such thefts amounted to \$5,390,838 or 15.1 percent of all value stolen, with an average value of \$144. The 33,042 (17.3 percent) thefts from buildings accounted for the highest value of property stolen, \$9,213,195 (25.7 percent), an average value of \$279.

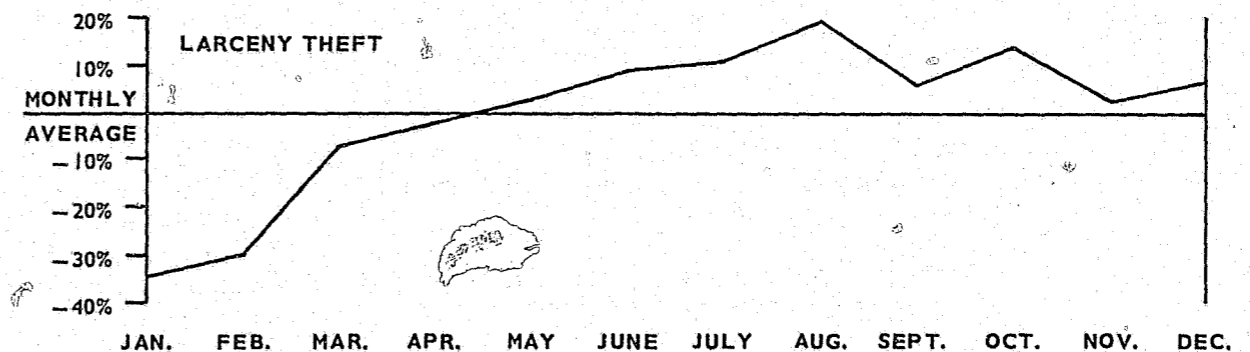

The total value of larceny-theft increased by 6.8 percent to \$35,812,669 from the \$33,541,613 of last year. The average value of larceny-theft gained 6.8 percent from \$176 last year to \$188. These value increases probably represent an influence of inflation on crime, as larceny-theft increased by only 0.1 percent in offense volume.

The largest increase in the classifications of larceny-theft was 28.9 percent for pocket-picking and 25.7 percent for thefts from coin-operated machines. Theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories declined by 3.4 percent. The greatest change in average value of property stolen was the 22.1 percent increase from \$68 to \$83 for thefts from coin-operated machines.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF LARCENY-THEFT

In the following chart, larceny-theft offenses are plotted by months from the average monthly base. From a low of -34 percent in January, larceny-thefts were over the average monthly base from May until December. In August, larceny-thefts peaked 20 percent above the average base.



LARCENY-THEFT ARRESTS

Arrests for larceny-theft gained by 0.2 percent from 44,279 to 44,352 this year. The Larceny-Theft Arrest Rate was 370.1.

An analysis of persons arrested for larceny-theft is as follows: male, 71.0 percent, and female, 29.0 percent (the largest percent of all the Crime Index Offenses for females); under age 18, 46.7 percent, and under age 25, 74.9 percent; White, 67.4 percent and Negro, 31.5 percent.

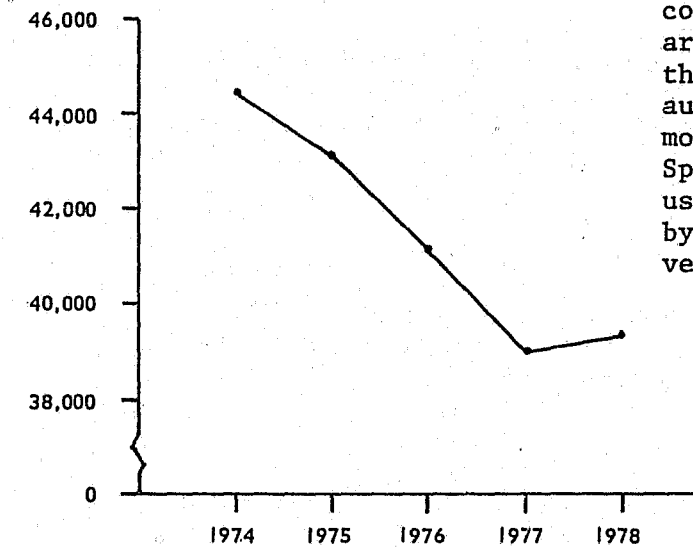

The Southeast and Southwest Regions accounted for 58.8 percent of all arrests. The Larceny-Theft Arrest Rates ranged from 491.4 in the Southeast CHSR to 230.1 in the Southwest CHSR. The Southeast CHSR increased by 4.4 percent over last year, and the Southwest CHSR declined by 9.9 percent from last year.

DEFINITION: Motor vehicle theft is the illegal taking of a motor vehicle, or driving the vehicle without the owner's consent. Attempted motor vehicle thefts are included. This category includes theft of motor-driven vehicles, such as automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, motor scooters, and snowmobiles. Specifically excluded is the temporary use when the vehicle is actually returned by the user, and lawful access to the vehicle has been granted or can be assumed.

VOLUME, RATE AND NATURE

There were 39,730 motor vehicle thefts reported to Pennsylvania police departments this year, an average of 109 each day. Motor vehicle theft represented 10.7 percent of all Crime Index Offenses and 11.8 percent of all Property Crimes.

Automobiles represented 32,384 or 81.5 percent of motor vehicle thefts, 11.2 percent or 4,468 were trucks and buses, and 7.2 percent or 2,878 were all other types of motor vehicles.

The Motor Vehicle Theft Crime Rate was 331.5, composed of 270.2 for automobiles, 37.3 for trucks and buses, and 24.0 for all other vehicles.

TREND

Motor vehicle theft increased by 1.4 percent from 39,187 last year to 39,730 this year. The rate per 100,000 increased 1.3 percent to 331.5 from 327.4 last year. Theft of automobiles declined by 2.1 percent, while larceny of trucks and buses increased by 29.2 percent and theft of other vehicles, by 9.1 percent. The 1.4 percent increase is the first recorded in five years. Motor vehicle theft has decreased 10.3 percent during the five year period.

CLEARANCES

The clearance rate for motor vehicle theft was 14.8 percent, or 5,882 clearances. The clearance rates for the components of motor vehicle theft were 15.5 percent or 5,012 for automobiles, 10.3 percent or 461 for trucks and buses, and 14.2 percent or 409 for all other vehicles. In general, motor vehicle theft had the lowest clearance rate of all the Crime Index Offenses.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

As outlined in the following table, 18,608 or 46.8 percent of all motor vehicle thefts were reported in the Southeast CHSR, followed by 11,936 or 30.0 percent in the Southwest CHSR. These two regions accounted for 76.8 percent of all motor vehicle thefts. The lowest number of motor vehicle thefts was totaled in the Central CHSR, 1,282 or 3.2 percent.

The Motor Vehicle Theft Rates ranged from 469.3 in the Southeast CHSR to 123.1 in the Central CHSR.

However, the Central CHSR led in clearances with 30.1 percent cleared, while the Southwest CHSR had by far the lowest clearance rate, 8.3 percent.

A decline of 7.2 percent in motor vehicle theft was found in the Southcentral Region. The Northeast and the Central CHSR's showed increases of 14.6 percent and 6.7 percent respectively.

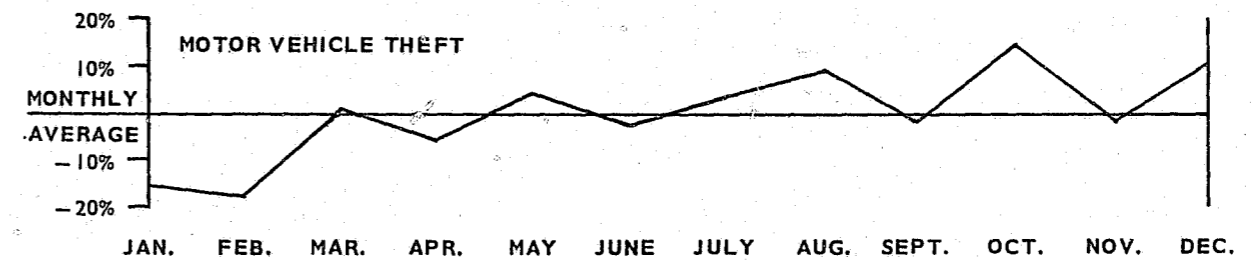

RECOVERY RATE

27,307 stolen motor vehicles or 68.7 percent of all stolen motor vehicles this year were recovered for the jurisdictions from which they were stolen. This represents a gain of 13.0 percent from 24,162 motor vehicles recovered last year. Police recovered 20,237 motor vehicles or 74.1 percent locally, and 7,070 or 25.9 percent were recovered by other police jurisdictions.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF MOTOR VEHICLE THEFTS

In the following chart, motor vehicle thefts are plotted by months from the average monthly base. Motor vehicle thefts fluctuated around the average base throughout the year. Figures varied from a low of 17.5 percent below the average base for February to a high 14.7 percent in October.



MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT ARRESTS

Motor vehicle theft arrests declined 2.2 percent this year to 5,466 from 5,587 last year. The Motor Vehicle Arrest Rate per 100,000 was 45.6.

Analysis of motor vehicle theft arrestees is as follows: male, 93.8 percent, and female, 6.2 percent; 17 years old and under, 51.8 percent, and under 25 years old, 85.1 percent; White, 67.4 percent, and Negro, 31.1 percent. A significant trend was a 6.0 percent increase in female arrestees for motor vehicle thefts. Also, arrestees in the under 18 group declined by 12.3 percent, while the 25 age and over group increased by 8.7 percent.

48.8 percent of all arrests for motor vehicle theft occurred in the Southeast Region, followed by 14.6 percent in the Southwest Region. These two CHSR's accounted for 63.4 percent of all motor vehicle theft arrests. The Central CHSR had the lowest amount of motor vehicle theft arrests, 362 or 6.6 percent. The Motor Vehicle Theft Arrest Rates ranged from 67.3 in the Southeast CHSR to 27.8 in the Southwest CHSR. The Northeast CHSR gained 8.3 percent in motor vehicle theft arrests over last year, and the Southwest CHSR declined by 17.8 percent from last year.

PART II OFFENSES

PART II OFFENSE DISTRIBUTION

Pennsylvania is one of the few states which has a UCR Program that collects Part II Offenses. This year, 449,985 Part II Offenses were reported by Pennsylvania police agencies, an increase of 11.0 percent over last year's total of 405,475 (Table 1).

While there are nineteen distinct Part II Offense categories, over 90 percent of the offenses reported were in only eight categories. These eight offenses, summarized in the following table, can be considered to be the "leaders" among Part II Offenses in volume and rate per 100,000 population.

TREND

As a group, Part II Offenses increased by 11.0 percent from 405,475 to 449,985. The individual offenses registering the largest percentage increases were other assaults and vagrancy. Other assaults rose from 17,035 offenses to 33,337, a gain of 95.7 percent, while vagrancy increased 73.5 percent from 626 offenses to 1,086.

The offense showing the biggest decline from last year was embezzlement. Reported offenses declined from 124 to 98, a decrease of 21.0 percent.

CLEARANCES

As depicted in Table 1, 275,153 or 61.1 percent of Part II Offenses were cleared. This compares with a 63.1 percent clearance rate for last year.

Extremely high clearance rates (over 95 percent) were achieved for five Part II Offenses: Prostitution and commercialized vice, gambling, driving under the influence, liquor law violations and drunkenness.

On the other hand, a very low clearance rate of 12.2 percent was attained for vandalism, the largest Part II Offense in volume.

In general, the Part II Offenses with the highest clearance rates were those which are usually observed at the time of commission.

PART II OFFENSES BY COUNTY

A review of Table 8, from which the preceding table was derived, indicates variances in the Part II Rates per 100,000 population among the urban (SMSA) counties from 5,370.1 in Dauphin County and 5,259.7 in Delaware County to 1,181.2 in Susquehanna County. Similar variations occurred among rural counties, with a range from 5,768.8 in Forest County to 1,056.2 in Wayne County.

PART II OFFENSES BY COMMON HUMAN SERVICE REGIONS (CHSR)

The following table summarizes the distribution of reported Part II Offenses among the six Common Human Service Regions in Pennsylvania.

Over two-fifths of all Part II Offenses - 190,497 or 42.3 percent - were reported from the Southeast CHSR. The smallest number, 31,509 or 7.0 percent occurred in the Northwest CHSR.

The biggest change from last year occurred in the Central CHSR, an increase of 14.6 percent. The Northwest CHSR had the smallest increase, 5.9 percent. No CHSR's reported decreases.

Clearance rates for Part II Offenses ranged from 69.6 percent in the Southeast CHSR to 50.9 percent in the Northeast CHSR. The overall State clearance rate was 61.1 percent.

Part II Offense Rates varied from 4,804.5 in the Southeast CHSR, made up of Philadelphia and its suburban counties, to 2,825.6 in the Northeast CHSR. The statewide Part II Offense Rate was 3,754.5.

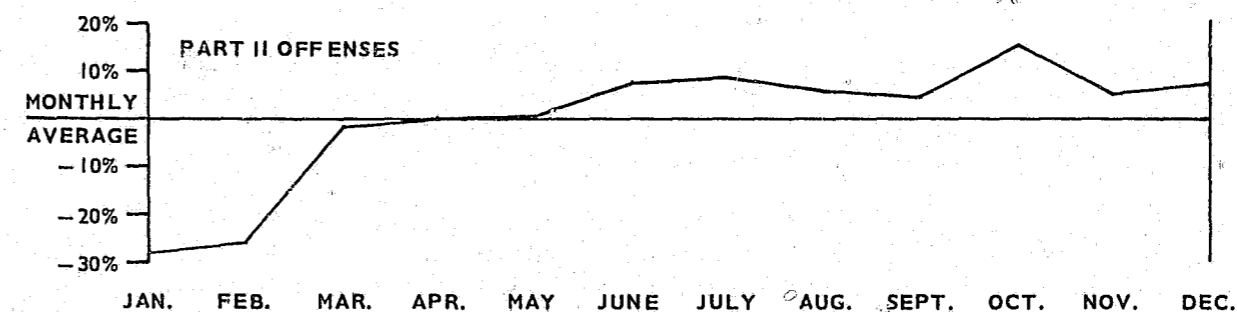
PART II OFFENSES BY STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS (SMSA)

An inspection of Table 4 indicates a range in Part II Offense Rates for 100,000 population from 4,804.5 in the Philadelphia SMSA, to a low of 2,581.6 in the Johnstown SMSA.

The Part II Offense Rates for core cities within SMSA's were, except for the Erie SMSA, higher than the rates for their suburban areas. Some extreme examples are Easton at 8,902.4 or 3.9 times its suburban rate of 2,276.2; Harrisburg, 10,029.0 against 3,160.9 or 3.2 times; and Lancaster, 6,569.8 versus 2,554.7 or 2.6 times.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF PART II OFFENSES

On the following chart, total Part II Offenses are plotted from an average monthly base. These crimes were below the monthly average for the first three months of the year, with a yearly low of -28.5 percent in January. March's figure was almost equal to the year's average. The remainder of the year was above average every month, with a peak of 15.6 percent above average in October.



SUMMARY OF ARRESTS FOR PART II OFFENSES

This year there were 275,503* arrests made for Part II Offenses in Pennsylvania (Table 12). This figure represented a 3.0 percent increase over last year's total of 267,594 Part II arrests and was the equivalent of an arrest rate of 2,298.7 per 100,000 population.

Arrests rose for sixteen Part II Offense categories, with increases ranging from 52.0 percent for vagrancy to 0.1 percent for stolen property. Arrests for three Part II Offenses declined - all other offenses, 9.3 percent, sex offenses, 5.7 percent, and drug abuse violations, 3.5 percent.

ARRESTS BY OFFENSE CATEGORY

Over two-thirds of all Part II Offense arrests were made in just four offense categories. These offenses were disorderly conduct, 51,229 arrests, or 18.6 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 427.4; drunkenness, 49,543 arrests, 18.0 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 413.4; liquor law violations, 47,516 arrests, or 17.2 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 396.5; and all other offenses, 43,068 arrests, or 15.6 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 359.3.

PART II OFFENSE ARRESTS BY AGE

The distribution of Part II Offense arrests (Table 13) by broad age categories was as follows: juveniles (persons under 18 years of age) 76,020, or 27.6 percent; young adults under 25 years of age, 103,477, or 37.6 percent; and remaining adults (persons 25 or older) 96,006, or 34.8 percent.

*This discussion excludes the 22,937 arrests for curfew and loitering, and the 5,817 arrests for runaways. These arrestees were all juveniles.

Juvenile arrests decreased 2.7 percent from last year's 78,133, while young adult arrests increased 8.0 percent over last year's total of 95,780, and arrests of remaining adults were 2.5 percent above the 93,681 last year.

Juveniles accounted for the majority of arrests for two Part II Offenses: vandalism, 63.9 percent; and arson, 54.0 percent. Other Part II Offenses which had substantial proportions of juvenile arrestees were the following: drug abuse (possession of marijuana), 49.2 percent; all other offenses, 46.4 percent; and liquor law violations, 40.3 percent.

Young adults accounted for substantial proportions of arrests for the following categories: liquor law violations, 57.3 percent; prostitution and commercialized vice, 57.6 percent; vagrancy, 56.1 percent; disorderly conduct, 46.5 percent; fraud, 40.6 percent; and total drug abuse violations, 40.3 percent.

Adults, 25 or older accounted for half or more of the arrestees in the following categories: gambling, 90.6 percent; drunkenness, 74.0 percent; driving under the influence, 68.3 percent; embezzlement, 64.9 percent; drug abuse (opium-cocaine) sale or manufacture, 53.9 percent; fraud, 53.0 percent; and forgery, 50.7 percent.

More than four-fifths of all juvenile arrests were made for the following four offenses: all other offenses, 26.3 percent; liquor law violations, 25.2 percent; disorderly conduct, 16.5 percent; and vandalism, 14.1 percent.

Almost half of all arrests of young adults were made for liquor law violations, 26.5 percent, and disorderly conduct, 23.0 percent.

Two-thirds of arrests of adults 25 or older were accounted for by drunkenness, 38.2 percent, disorderly conduct, 15.5 percent, and driving under the influence, 13.0 percent.

PART II OFFENSE ARRESTS BY SEX

This year, 239,736 persons arrested or 87.0 percent of the total, were males (Table 14). This was an increase of 4.1 percent over the 230,388 males arrested last year. There were 35,767 females arrested this year, or 3.9 percent less than the 37,206 in the previous year.

Persons arrested were predominantly male in all but one Part II Offense category. The exception was prostitution and commercialized vice, where 66.0 percent of the arrestees were females.

Over two-thirds of the males arrested fell into four offense categories: drunkenness, 19.4 percent; disorderly conduct, 18.8 percent; liquor law violations, 17.0 percent; and all other offenses, 14.5 percent. More than two-thirds of female arrestees were accounted for by all other offenses, 23.6 percent; liquor law violations, 18.8 percent; disorderly conduct, 17.1 percent; and drunkenness, 8.6 percent.

PART II OFFENSE ARRESTS BY RACE

The breakdown by race of persons arrested for Part II Offenses (Table 15), was as follows: White, 207,326 or 75.3 percent; Negro, 65,964 or 23.9 percent; other races, 2,213 or 0.8 percent.

Arrests of Whites increased 5.7 percent from last year's total of 196,191, while arrests of Negroes fell 3.9 percent below last year's 68,654. Other races showed the greatest percentage change in arrestees by race, a decline of 19.5 percent from the 2,749 recorded last year.

Whites comprised the majority of persons arrested for most Part II Offenses, ranging from 97.4 percent of liquor law violations to 57.8 percent for drunkenness. Offenses for which arrestees were predominantly Negro were numbers-gambling, 77.1 percent; other gambling, 61.3 percent; possession opium-cocaine, 58.0 percent; prostitution and commercialized vice, 57.9 percent; sale or manufacture opium-cocaine, 53.0 percent; and possession of weapons, 52.5 percent.

Over two-thirds of Whites were arrested for four offenses: liquor law violations, 22.3 percent; disorderly conduct, 20.0 percent; all other offenses, 14.3 percent; and drunkenness, 13.8 percent.

Almost two-thirds of Negroes were arrested for three offenses: drunkenness, 30.7 percent; all other offenses, 20.0 percent; and disorderly conduct, 14.2 percent.

Almost half of the arrests made of persons of other races were for drunkenness, 31.3 percent; and disorderly conduct, 18.6 percent.

VANDALISM

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

The most frequently reported Part II Offense this year was vandalism. With an increase of 17.6 percent over last year's total of 118,866, the 139,808 acts of vandalism reported represented nearly a third of all Part II Offenses.

Vandalism is an offense which covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property. Based on a two-month survey conducted during August and September of 1977, an average cost of \$140 per incident was established. Using that established average cost per incident, we can conservatively estimate that vandalism reported this year has cost Pennsylvanians more than 19 million dollars.

Vandalism cannot, by any stretch of the imagination, be considered a petty crime. When the inconvenience to the victims and the investigative burden placed upon the police are added to the actual dollar loss, vandalism emerges as a very serious problem.

The ten counties ranking highest in reported vandalism offenses are shown in the following table.

The statewide Vandalism Offense Rate per 100,000 population was 1,166.5. County rates varied from 2,417.2 in Forest County to 435.8 in Susquehanna.

Vandalism made up 60.3 percent of Pike County's Part II Offense total, but only 10.5 percent of Philadelphia's. In the entire State, vandalism comprised 31.1 percent of the Part II Offense total.

CLEARANCES

Clearance rates by county ranged from 43.1 percent in Adams to 7.0 percent in Allegheny.

While vandalism is the most frequent Part II Offense reported in Pennsylvania, its clearance rate among Part II Offenses is by far the lowest. Only 12.2 percent of the reported offenses of vandalism were cleared.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

The following table summarizes reported offenses of vandalism by Common Human Service Regions.

Nearly a third of the acts of vandalism - 43,937 or 31.4 percent - were reported from the Southeast CHSR. Only 10,158 offenses of vandalism, or 7.3 percent of the State total occurred in the Northwest CHSR.

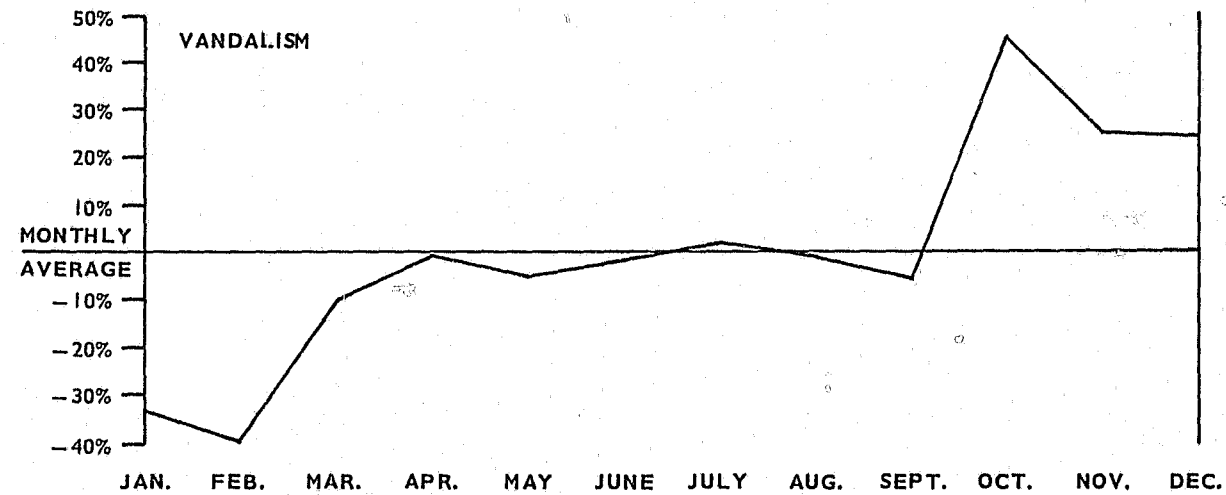
All Common Human Service Regions reported rises in vandalism over last year. The increases ranged from 26.9 percent in the Southeast CHSR to 7.2 percent in the Northwest CHSR.

Offense rates per 100,000 population in the individual CHSR's varied from 1,302.3 in the Northeast CHSR to 1,049.1 in the Northwest CHSR.

Clearance rates for all Common Human Service Regions were low. The range was from 16.9 percent in the Southcentral CHSR to 9.2 percent in the Southwest CHSR.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF VANDALISM

In the following chart, offenses of vandalism are plotted by months from an average monthly base. For the first six months of the year, vandalism offenses were below the average, with a low of -39.4 percent in February. July was slightly above average, but the trend reversed, putting August and September below the average. A sharp reversal of trend gave October a peak of 45.7 percent. November and December were also strongly above the base with respective values of 25.8 and 25.1 percent.



VANDALISM ARRESTS

This year, police agencies reported 16,826 arrests for vandalism. This was the equivalent of an Arrest Rate of 140.4 per 100,000 population.

Arrestees were predominantly young, white and male. Nine-tenths (89.6 percent) or 15,077, were under 25 years of age, with 10,755 (63.9 percent) under 18. Whites totaled 15,226 arrestees (90.5 percent), and Negroes 1,550 (9.2 percent). By sex, 15,704 persons arrested (93.3 percent) were male.

More than a quarter of the vandalism arrests, 4,719 or 28.0 percent took place in the Southeast CHSR, while only 1,702 or 10.1 percent of the total were made in the Central CHSR. Arrest rates varied from 197.7 in the Southcentral CHSR to 117.0 in the Southwest CHSR. Statewide vandalism arrests were 9.8 percent above the previous year. Arrests increased in all regions except the Northeast (2.9 percent decrease).

DRUNKENNESS

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

There were 47,456 offenses of drunkenness reported this year, 10.5 percent of the State total for Part II Offenses, and a decrease of 9.4 percent from last year's total of 52,390. Drunkenness ranked fourth in Part II Offenses reported this year.

The ten counties ranking highest in reported offenses of drunkenness are shown in the following table.

A total of 36,209 offenses of drunkenness, 76.3 percent of the State total was reported from the counties of Philadelphia and Allegheny. Philadelphia County alone accounted for 26,440 of these offenses, over half of the total. After Philadelphia and Allegheny, drunkenness offenses in the remaining eight highest ranking counties declined sharply. None of the eight individual county totals was more than 1.6 percent of the State total and their total of 4,734 was only 10.0 percent of all offenses of drunkenness reported this year.

The statewide Drunkenness Offense Rate per 100,000 population was 396.0. Rates in the sixty-four counties which reported this offense varied from 1,374.7 in Philadelphia to 4.8 in Wyoming.

Drunkenness comprised 26.7 percent of Philadelphia County's Part II Offense total, but only 0.2 percent of Wyoming County's total. Statewide, drunkenness comprised 10.5 percent of the Part II Offense total.

CLEARANCES

Statewide, 99.1 percent of offenses of drunkenness were cleared. Individual county clearance rates ranged from 101.8 percent (Crawford County) to 63.6 percent (Carbon County).

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

About three-fifths of the offenses of drunkenness - 28,763 or 60.6 percent - were reported from the Southeast CHSR. Only 1,028 offenses, 2.2 percent of the total, were reported from the Central Region.

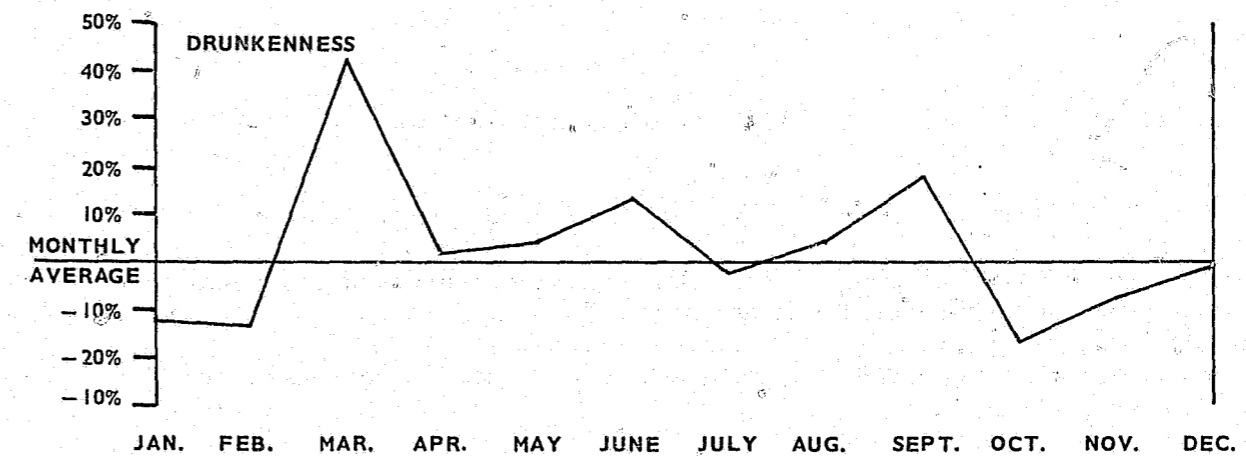
Decreases from last year in offenses of drunkenness occurred in four of the six CHSR's. The largest decrease, 18.4 percent, was in the Central CHSR, the smallest, 5.3 percent, in the Northwest CHSR. Increases were reported from the Southwest CHSR and the Southcentral CHSR.

Drunkenness Offense Rates per 100,000 population varied from 725.4 in the Southeast CHSR to 96.4 in the Northeast CHSR.

Clearance rates in the six Common Human Service Regions were uniformly high, ranging from 99.6 percent in the Southeast CHSR to 95.9 percent in the Southcentral CHSR.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF DRUNKENNESS

In the following chart, drunkenness offenses are plotted by months from an average monthly base. January and February were both below average, with February at -23.2 percent, the low point for the year. A sharp reversal of trend occurred in March, with a peak of 42.5 percent above the average line. April through September, except for July, displayed varying percentages above the average. The last three months of the year were below average with a low point of -17.6 in October.



DRUNKENNESS ARRESTS

This year, 49,543 arrests were made for the offense of drunkenness, a slight increase of 0.2 percent over last year's figure of 49,425. The Arrest Rate per 100,000 population was 413.4.

The majority of arrestees for this offense were adult males. Only 1.3 percent were juveniles and 26.0 percent were under 25. However, 36,661 or 74.0 percent were 25 and over, with 19,327 or 39.0 percent, 40 years of age or older. More than half, 28,612 or 57.8 percent were White, and 20,238 or 40.8 percent were Negro.

Males comprised 46,476 arrestees, or 93.8 percent of the total.

Nearly two-thirds of drunkenness arrests were made in the Southeast CHSR, 31,026 or 62.6 percent. Only 996 or 2.0 percent took place in the Central CHSR. Arrest Rates ranged from 782.5 in the Southeast CHSR to 95.7 in the Central CHSR.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

There were 55,146 offenses of disorderly conduct reported this year, an increase of 10.8 percent over last year's 49,771.

The ten counties reporting the most disorderly conduct offenses are shown in the following table.

These ten counties reported 35,620 offenses of disorderly conduct, 64.6 percent of the State total. Four counties, Delaware, Allegheny, Philadelphia, and Montgomery, together accounted for 25,281 offenses, 45.8 percent of the State total.

The statewide Disorderly Conduct Offense Rate per 100,000 was 460.1. County rates varied from 1,684.5 in Delaware to 31.5 in Pike.

Disorderly conduct made up 12.3 percent of all Part II Offenses reported. It comprised 32.0 percent of Delaware County's Part II Offense total, but only 1.5 percent of Clinton County's total.

CLEARANCES

Statewide, 80.0 percent of disorderly conduct offenses were cleared. Individual county clearance rates ranged from Forest's 157.1 to Fulton's 38.5 percent.

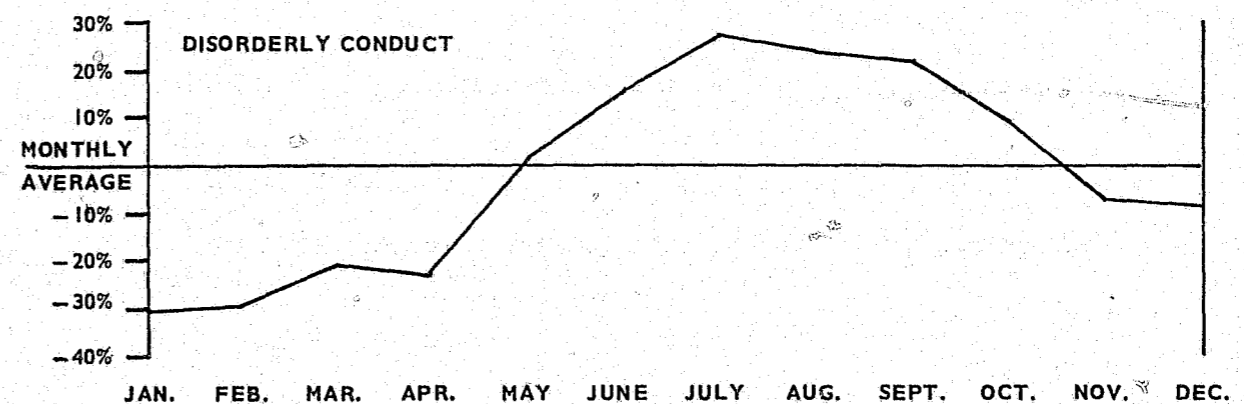
More than two-fifths of disorderly conduct offenses - 22,845 or 41.4 percent - were reported from the Southeast CHSR, and only 3,824 or 6.9 percent from the Northwest CHSR. Increases in the offense over last year occurred in five CHSR's, the largest, 16.5 percent in the Central, the smallest, 4.5 percent in the Northeast. Only the Southcentral CHSR reported a decrease, 0.3 percent.

Disorderly Conduct Offense Rates ranged from 576.2 in the Southeast CHSR to 294.4 in the Northeast CHSR.

Clearance rates for this offense ran from 87.3 percent in the Northeast CHSR to 73.2 percent in the Central CHSR.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF DISORDERLY CONDUCT

On the following chart, disorderly conduct offenses are plotted by months from an average monthly base. The first four months were below average, with a yearly low of -30.9 percent in January. The period May through October displayed varying percentages above the average, with a peak of 27.5 percent in July. November and December showed a reversal of trend, with values for each month about 8 percent below the average.



DISORDERLY CONDUCT ARRESTS

This year, 51,229 arrests were made for disorderly conduct, an increase of 10.5 percent over last year's total of 46,361. The Arrest Rate per 100,000 population was 427.4.

Persons arrested for disorderly conduct were likely to be young (70.9 percent under 25), White (80.9 percent), and male (88.1 percent).

The largest portion - 22,749 or 44.4 percent - of disorderly conduct arrests were made in the Southeast CHSR. Only 3,392 or 6.6 percent occurred in the Northwest CHSR. Arrest rates varied from 573.7 in the Southeast CHSR to 284.3 in the Northeast CHSR.

Arrests this year for disorderly conduct rose 10.5 percent over last year. Arrests increased in four of the regions, and decreased in two.

LIQUOR LAW VIOLATIONS

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

There were 36,540 liquor law violations reported this year, an increase of 10.1 percent over last year's total of 33,186.

These ten counties accounted for 21,789 liquor law violations, 59.6 percent of the State total. The first four counties, Allegheny, Montgomery, Delaware, and Bucks reported a total of 13,465 offenses or 36.9 percent of the State total.

The Liquor Law Violation Offense Rate was 304.9 and ranged from 837.2 in Somerset County to 51.6 in Juniata County.

This year, liquor law violations comprised 8.1 percent of all Part II Offenses reported. This offense made up 30.2 percent of Somerset County's Part II total, but only 1.6 percent of Philadelphia County's total.

CLEARANCES

Statewide, 98.8 percent of liquor law violations were cleared. Clearance rates by county varied from 109.1 percent in Pike County to 86.7 percent in Centre County.

Almost a third of the liquor law violations - 11,476 or 31.4 percent - were reported from the Southeast CHSR, and only 3,299 (9.0 percent) from the Northwest CHSR. All regions showed increases from last year in reported offenses, with the Central CHSR highest (14.4 percent) and the Northeast CHSR lowest (7.0 percent).

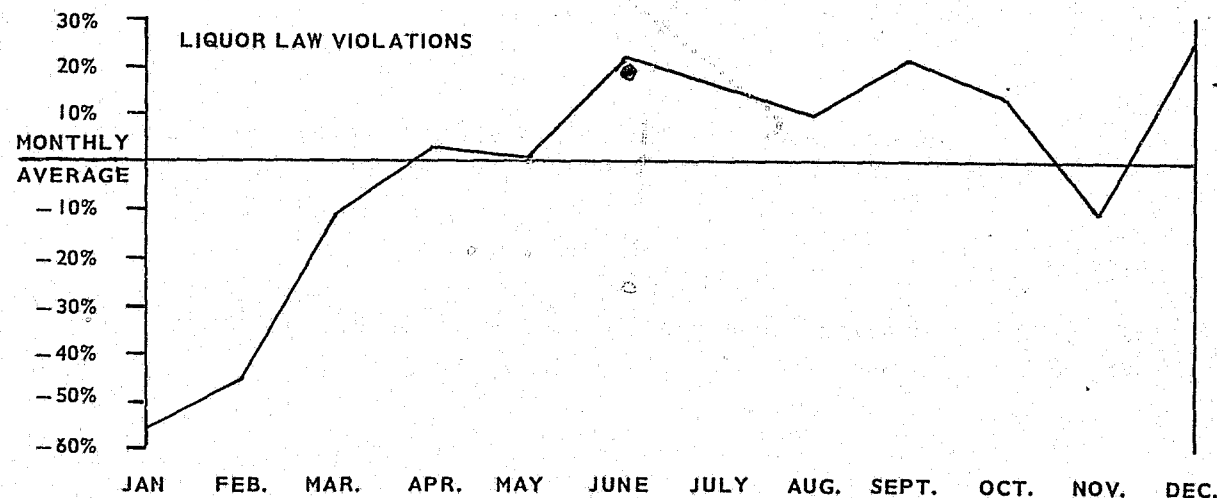
Liquor Law Violation Offense Rate was highest (401.3) in the Southcentral CHSR and lowest in the Northeast CHSR (254.4).

Clearance rates for this offense, all very high, ranged from 100.7 percent in the Southeast CHSR to 97.1 percent in the Southwest CHSR.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF LIQUOR LAW VIOLATIONS

In the chart below, liquor law violations are plotted by months from an average monthly base. January was the low point for the year, at 55.5 percent below the average.

February and March were still below average, by decreasing percentages. The months in the period April through October were all above the average, with a high point for the period occurring in June, 22.6 percent above average. November, in a reversal, was below average, but December was the peak for the year, at 25.4 percent above the average line.



LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION ARRESTS

This year, 47,516 arrests were made for liquor law violations, 7.8 percent above last year's total of 44,093. The arrest total was the equivalent of a rate per 100,000 population of 396.5.

Liquor law violations are essentially youth-oriented offenses, i.e., most liquor law violations in reality are instances of drinking by youths under the age of twenty-one. This year, 46,057 of the arrestees, or 96.9 percent were under twenty-one years of age.

A total of 46,262 arrestees or 97.4 percent were White.

By sex, 40,777 or 85.8 percent of the total were males.

Almost a third - 14,866 or 31.3 percent - of the liquor law violation arrests were made in the Southeast CHSR. Only 8.5 percent or 4,033 occurred in the Northwest CHSR. Arrest rates ranged from 467.9 in the Southcentral CHSR to 346.0 in the Northeast CHSR.

Total arrests for liquor law violations were 7.8 percent greater this year. The number of arrests rose in all regions.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

Driving under the influence ranked seventh in Part II Offenses this year, with 17,292 reported offenses, a decrease of 3.4 percent from last year's 17,906.

The ten counties ranking highest in reported driving under the influence offenses are shown in the following table.

These ten counties accounted for 10,892 offenses, 63.0 percent of the State total. Philadelphia County alone reported 4,222 offenses, 24.4 percent of the State figure.

The statewide driving under the influence rate per 100,000 population was 144.3. Clinton County had the highest rate, 373.3, Susquehanna County the lowest, 2.9.

This offense made up 3.8 percent of the Part II Offense total. The individual county percentages varied from Tioga's 11.8 percent to Susquehanna's 0.2 percent.

CLEARANCES

The clearance rate for this offense was 99.2 percent. Driving under the influence and certain other Part II Offenses have high clearance rates because an arrest is usually made as the result of observation by a police officer when the offense is committed. Individual county rates varied from Delaware County's 104.1 percent to Carbon County's 90.6 percent.

GEOGRAPHICAL DISTRIBUTION

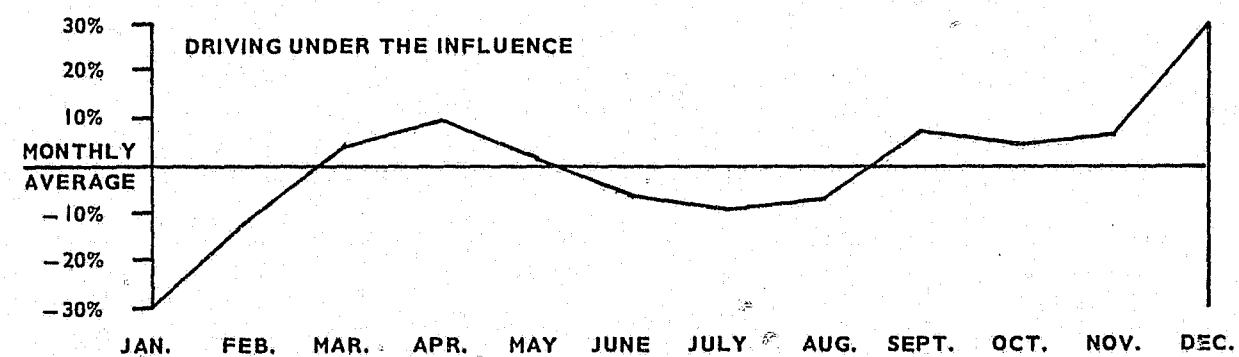
The largest portion - 6,746 or 39.0 percent - of the reported offenses were in the Southeast CHSR. The Northwest CHSR had the smallest regional total, 1,199 offenses or 6.9 percent of the State figure. Five Common Human Service Regions reported increases in this offense from last year, ranging from 1.4 percent in the Northwest Region to 18.9 percent in the Central CHSR. A decrease of 19.1 percent was reported from the Southeast CHSR.

The offense rate per 100,000 population was highest in the Southeast CHSR (170.1), and lowest in the Northeast CHSR (109.5).

Clearance rates for driving under the influence were very high in all regions - from 100.0 percent in the Southeast to 98.3 percent in the Southcentral CHSR.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

In the following chart, offenses of driving under the influence are plotted by months from an average monthly base. January was the low point for the year at 30.0 percent below the average. March, April and May were above the average, while the following three months were below it. The months in the last quarter of the year were all higher than the average, with a peak for the year of 29.6 percent in December.



DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE ARRESTS

This year, 18,320 arrests were made for the offense of driving under the influence. This was 4.7 percent over last year's total of 17,498.

A total of 12,504 or 68.3 percent of the arrestees were 25 years of age or older.

Arrestees by race were 14,642 Whites (79.9 percent), 3,480 Negroes (19.0 percent) and 198 other races (1.1 percent). Only 1,172 females were arrested for this offense, 6.4 percent of the total.

Over two-fifths - 7,756 or 42.3 percent - of the arrests for this offense were made in the Southeast CHSR, while only 1,209 or 6.6 percent occurred in the Northwest CHSR.

Arrest rates varied from 195.6 in the Southeast CHSR to 108.7 in the Northeast CHSR.

Arrests for driving under the influence rose 4.7 percent above last year. Increases occurred in all regions except the Southeast.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

This year, drug abuse violations totaled 14,292, a decrease of 5.9 percent from last year's figure of 15,188. About two-thirds of these offenses - 9,647 or 67.5 percent - involved the possession of narcotic or dangerous non-narcotic drugs; the remaining 4,645 offenses or 32.5 percent related to the sale or manufacture of these drugs.

Four-fifths of the 9,647 offenses of possession - 7,746 or 80.3 percent - involved marijuana. The balance was distributed among opium/cocaine, 715 offenses or 7.4 percent, other drugs, 631 or 6.5 percent; and synthetic drugs, 555 or 5.8 percent. Slightly more than half of the 4,645 sale/manufacture offenses, 2,570 or 55.3 percent involved marijuana, with the remainder opium/cocaine, 1,005 or 21.6 percent; other drugs 559 or 12.0 percent; and synthetic drugs 511 or 11.0 percent.

These ten counties accounted for 9,956 offenses or 69.7 percent of the drug abuse violations reported. Philadelphia County reported almost a third of these offenses - 4,637, or 32.4 percent. Of note is that all of the 10 counties were urban counties found within Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

The statewide rate for this offense was 119.2. Individual county rates ranged from Philadelphia County's 241.1 to Juniata County's 28.6.

This offense represented 3.2 percent of all Part II Offenses. The percentage it made up of individual county Part II Offenses ranged from 8.2 percent in Pike County to 0.7 percent in Venango County.

BY DRUG INVOLVED

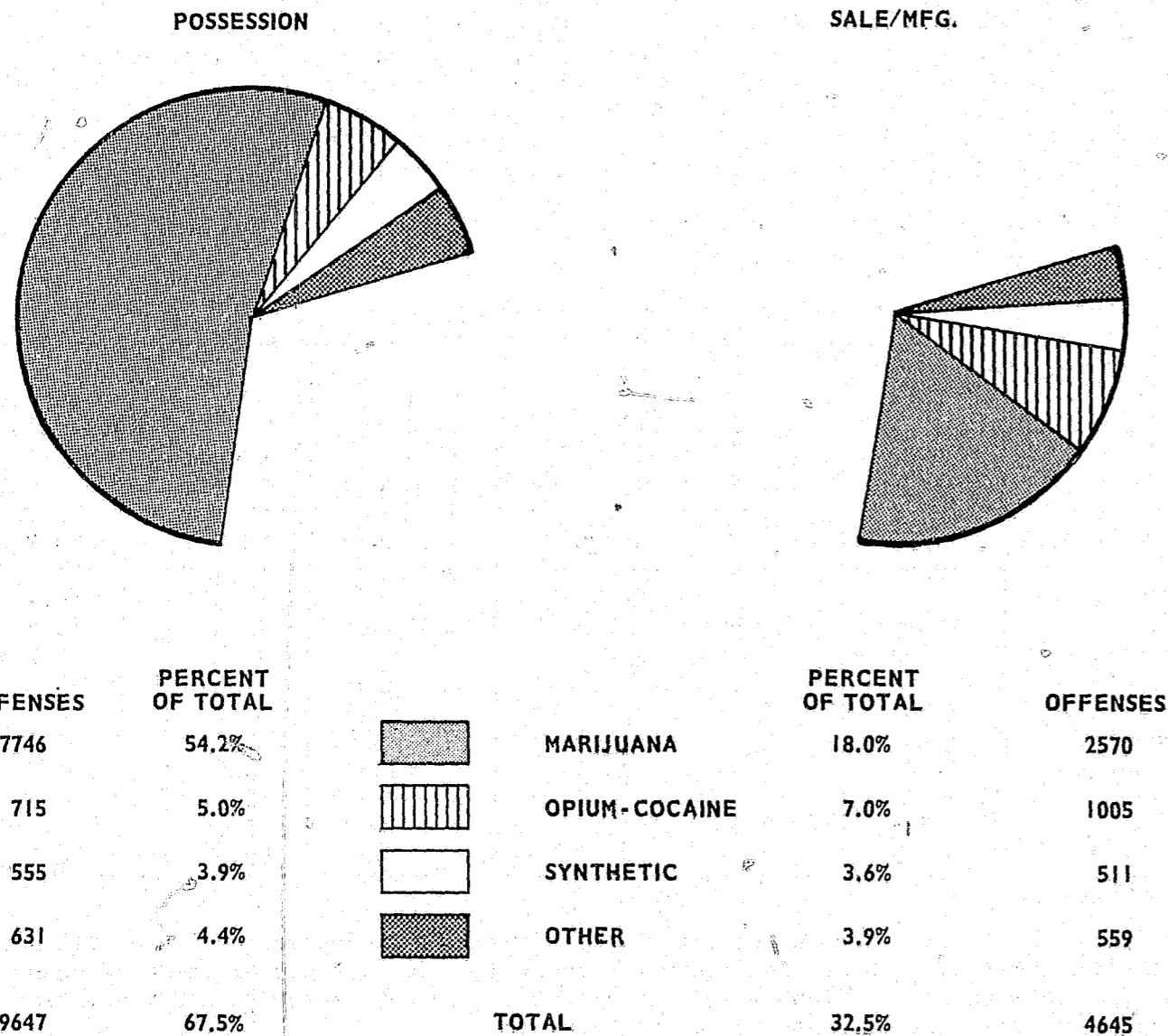

CLEARANCES

In the entire State, this offense had a clearance rate of 92.8 percent. Clearance rates for the individual counties ran from 112.1 percent in Delaware County to 20.0 percent in Juniata County.

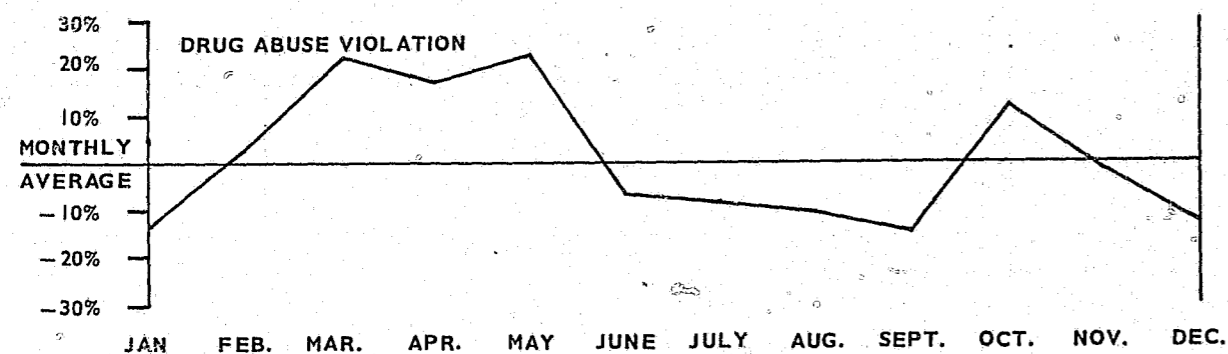
Nearly half - 6,930 or 48.5 percent - of all reported drug abuse violations were reported from the Southeast CHSR, while only 804 offenses or 5.6 percent occurred in the Northwest CHSR. Three regions reported increases in this offense over last year's total, ranging from 0.4 percent in the Southwest CHSR to 53.9 percent in the Central CHSR. The remaining three regions reported decreases, the largest 13.8 percent in the Southeast CHSR, and the smallest 5.9 percent in the Northeast Region.

The Southeast CHSR had the largest offense rate, 174.8, the Northwest CHSR the lowest, 83.0.

Clearance rates varied from 84.7 percent in the Southcentral CHSR to 95.8 percent in the Southeast CHSR.

MONTHLY VARIATION OF DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

In the following chart, drug abuse violations are plotted by months from an average monthly base. From a low of 23.4 percent below average in January, this offense climbed to a peak of 23.2 percent above the average in May. The remaining seven months of the year were all below the average with the exception of October.



DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION ARRESTS

There were 15,664 arrests for drug abuse violations this year, a drop of 3.5 percent from last year's 16,229. About two-thirds of the arrests - 10,582 or 67.6 percent - were made for drug possession, with the remaining 5,082 arrests (32.4 percent) made for drug sale or manufacture.

Drug possession arrests by type were as follows: marijuana, 8,782 or 83.0 percent; opium-cocaine, 743 or 7.0 percent; other drugs, 559 or 5.3 percent; synthetic drugs, 498 or 4.7 percent. The distribution of arrests for sale/manufacture was marijuana, 3,000 or 59.0 percent; opium-cocaine, 1,269 or 25.0 percent; other drugs, 403 or 7.9 percent; synthetic drugs, 410 or 8.1 percent.

Persons arrested for drug abuse violations were predominantly young adults and juveniles: 76.4 percent of all arrestees were under 25 years of age, and 36.2 percent were under 18. The ages of persons arrested for each kind of drug abuse violation roughly paralleled the above percentages, with the exceptions of sale/manufacture opium-cocaine, where 684 individuals or 53.9 percent were 25 or older and only 75 or 5.9 percent were under 18, and possession opium-cocaine, with 357 persons arrested or 48.0 percent, 25 or older and only 63 or 8.5 percent under 18.

Overall arrests by race for the offense were as follows: Whites 11,315 or 72.2 percent, and Negroes 4,122 or 26.3 percent. Whites predominated in arrests for all types of drug abuse violations, with the exception of sale/manufacture opium-cocaine and possession opium-cocaine, where Negroes comprised 53.0 and 58.0 percent of the arrestees, respectively.

The great majority of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were males - 13,531 or 86.4 percent. Individual male percentages of arrestees for each type of drug abuse violation were all above 80 percent except for possession of synthetic drugs (79.9 percent).

A little more than half - 8,187 or 52.3 percent - of all drug abuse violation arrests were made in the Southeast CHSR. Only 752 or 4.8 percent were made in the Central CHSR. Arrest rates ranged from 206.5 in the Southeast CHSR to 72.2 in the Central CHSR.

Statewide, arrests for drug abuse violations declined 3.5 percent from last year. Arrests increased in four CHSR's and decreased in two.

ARSON

VOLUME, RATE AND TREND

There were 3,530 offenses of arson reported this year, 15.2 percent more than last year's total of 3,065. This crime represented less than 1 percent of all Part II Offenses reported, but based on a special survey conducted in the summer of 1977 the monetary loss per incident of arson was far greater than for any of the crime index offenses.

The results of an arson survey conducted during August and September of 1977, placed the average property loss for each arson at \$7,400. This figure excluded the extremely costly fires resulting from arson. A conservative estimate of the total property loss as the result of arson this year is \$26,000,000.

It is therefore readily apparent that the crime of arson represents a serious economic loss to the community and a threat to society in general.

There were 2,072 arson offenses reported from these ten counties, 58.7 percent of the State total.

The statewide Arson Offense Rate was 29.5. Individual rates for the 62 counties reporting this offense varied from 128.6 in Potter to 2.5 in Huntingdon.

Arson made up only 0.8 percent of Part II Offenses statewide this year. As a percentage of Part II Offenses among the 62 counties reporting this offense, it varied from 5.9 percent in Potter County to 0.1 percent in Huntingdon County.

CLEARANCES

The statewide clearance rate for this offense was 25.4 percent. County clearance rates varied from 300.0 percent in Indiana County to 0.0 percent in Forest, Huntingdon, Montour, Perry, Tioga and Warren Counties.

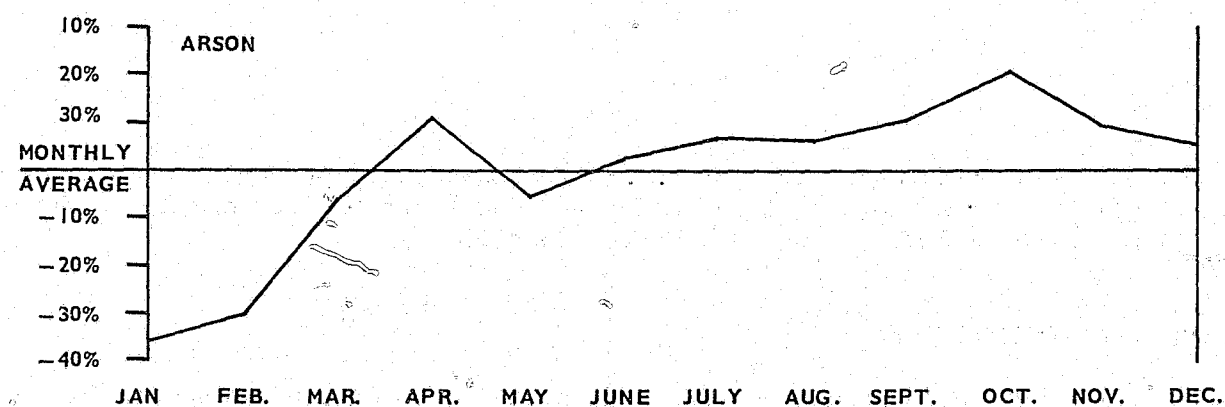
More than a fourth of all arson offenses - 1,036 or 29.3 percent - were reported from the Southeast CHSR, and only 222 or 6.3 percent from the Central CHSR. Five regions showed increases in this offense over last year, from 2.3 percent in the Southeast to 82.9 percent in the Northwest. Offenses declined 9.0 percent in the Central CHSR.

The offense rate per 100,000 population was highest in the Southcentral CHSR (41.3), and lowest in the Central CHSR (21.3).

Individual region clearance rates for arson ranged from 17.4 percent in the Northwest CHSR to 34.1 percent in the Southeast CHSR.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF ARSON

In the following chart, arson offenses are plotted by months from an average monthly base. The first three months of the year were below the average, with a low of -36.1 percent in January. The last seven months of the year were all above the average, with a high of 21.7 percent in October.



ARSON ARRESTS

This year, 1,088 arrests were made for arson. This was a 10.1 percent rise over last year's 988, and was the equivalent of an Arrest Rate of 9.1.

Arson arrestees were primarily young adults and juveniles: 588 persons, or 54.0 percent were under 18 years of age, and 848, or 77.9 percent were under 25 years of age.

Racial breakdown of arrestees was 823 White or 75.6 percent, 244 Negro or 22.4 percent, and 21 other races or 1.9 percent.

Almost ninety percent, or 954 of the arrestees were males.

The following table summarizes arson arrests and arrest rates for each of the Common Human Service Regions.

Nearly half - 534 or 49.1 percent - of the arson arrests were made in the Southeast CHSR. Only 65 or 6.0 percent, occurred in the Central CHSR.

The Arrest Rate was highest in the Southeast CHSR (13.5), lowest in the Southwest CHSR (4.9).

There were 10.1 percent more arrests for arson than in the previous year. The number of arrests increased in five of the six regions.

PERSONS CHARGED AND DISPOSITIONS

The collection of data of persons arrested and formally charged, plus the subsequent dispositions, is an important tool in the records-keeping process for the modern police administrator. This collection offers an insight into the effectiveness of a department with regard to the quality of police investigation, case preparation, and court presentation toward the successful prosecution of the criminal element.

PERSONS CHARGED

There were 327,553 persons arrested and charged with criminal offenses this year. Physical arrests resulted in charges against 215,587 persons or 65.8 percent. Criminal citations were issued to 111,966 persons or 34.2 percent.

Of the 80,927 persons charged with Crime Index Offenses, 64,521 or 79.7 percent were arrested and arraigned, while 16,406 or 20.3 percent received citations. A total of 18,373 Violent Crime offenders were charged this year. Physical arrests of Violent Crime offenders totaled 17,652 or 96.1 percent, and citations were issued to 721 Violent Crime offenders or 3.9 percent. Property Crime offenders were charged in 62,554 incidents. Physical arrests of Property Crime offenders occurred in 46,869 cases or 74.9 percent, and citations were issued to 15,685 Property Crime offenders or 25.1 percent. This latter group was composed primarily of larceny-theft offenders.

Part II offenders charged amounted to 246,447 persons. Physical arrests and arraignments took place in 150,898 cases or 61.2 percent, and citations were issued to 95,549 individuals or 38.8 percent. A review indicates that citations were issued to 76.2 percent of persons charged with liquor law violations and to the majority of persons charged with fraud, vandalism, disorderly conduct or vagrancy.

DISPOSITIONS

The 241,763 dispositions represent 73.8 percent of the 327,553 persons charged this year. This difference is partly due to dispositions of charges from prior years and pending dispositions from persons charged this year.

Overall, 115,963 persons or 48.0 percent were found guilty of the offense charged; 6,323 or 2.6 percent, guilty of a lesser offense; 74,436 or 30.8 percent, acquitted or dismissed; and 45,141 or 18.7 percent, referred to Juvenile Court.

Dispositions of Crime Index offenders were distributed as follows: 24,153 or 36.0 percent were guilty as charged; 3,249 or 4.8 percent, guilty of a lesser offense; 13,931 or 20.7 percent, acquitted or dismissed; 25,806 or 38.5 percent, referred to Juvenile Court. However, 58.5 percent of adults prosecuted for Crime Index Offenses were found guilty of the offense charged, and 7.9 percent were found guilty of a lesser offense. Murder (50.7 percent) and larceny-theft (49.9 percent) had the highest rates of conviction among the Crime Index Offenses. Aggravated assault (47.4 percent) and rape (39.0 percent) had the highest rates of acquittals or dismissals among Crime Index Offenses. High rates among Crime Index Offenses for juveniles referred to Juvenile Court were reported for motor vehicle theft (72.1 percent) and burglary (56.9 percent). Of note, the acquittal-dismissal rate for Violent Crime was 39.1 percent as opposed to a 13.8 percent acquittal-dismissal rate for Property Crime.

The dispositions of the 174,530 persons charged with Part II Offenses were distributed as follows: 91,641 or 52.5 percent were guilty as charged; 3,059 or 1.8 percent, guilty of a lesser offense; 60,505 or 34.7 percent, acquitted or dismissed; 19,325 or 11.1 percent, referred to Juvenile Court.

The highest conviction rates for persons charged with Part II Offenses were reported for liquor law violations (86.5 percent) and disorderly conduct (78.7 percent). High dismissal rates were reported for drunkenness (82.9 percent), gambling (83.4 percent), and prostitution and commercialized vice (78.0 percent). Drunkenness acquittal rates are influenced by the practice in some areas of apprehending individuals for drunkenness for their own safety and releasing them when they have regained sobriety.

JUVENILES

In addition to the 45,141 or 13.8 percent juveniles charged and subsequently referred to Juvenile Court, 33,622 or 10.3 percent were charged as adults, even though they were under 18 years old. This latter group represents youths apprehended generally for summary offenses, such as shoplifting, teen-age drinking, vandalism, or disorderly conduct. Included in the category of persons charged and involved in criminal judicial proceedings this year were 78,763 juveniles, 24.0 percent of the total.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE DATA

Annual reports from 989 police departments, including the Pennsylvania State Police, indicated a total of 27,248 full-time law enforcement employees in Pennsylvania as of October 31, 1978 (See table below and Figure N). Full-time police officers made up 86.9 percent and civilian employees of police departments 13.1 percent of this total. Statewide there were 2.3 full-time employees - 2.0 officers and 0.3 civilians-per 1,000 population.

The 986 local police jurisdictions (State total less Pennsylvania State Police, Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board and Pennsylvania Office of Drug Law Enforcement) accounted for 22,334 full-time law enforcement employees, or 82 percent of the State total. Eighty-eight percent or 19,690 of these 22,334 local police agency employees were full-time officers and 2,644 or 12 percent were civilians.

More than half of the police departments reporting to the Pennsylvania UCR Program (538 out of 989) employed less than six full-time officers (See following table). Ninety-two percent (913) of the departments reported 25 or less full-time officers; while at the other end of the scale, only 5 departments - less than 1 percent of the total - employed more than 200.

PERSONNEL IN PENNSYLVANIA IN 1978 BY POLICE AGENCY CATEGORY**

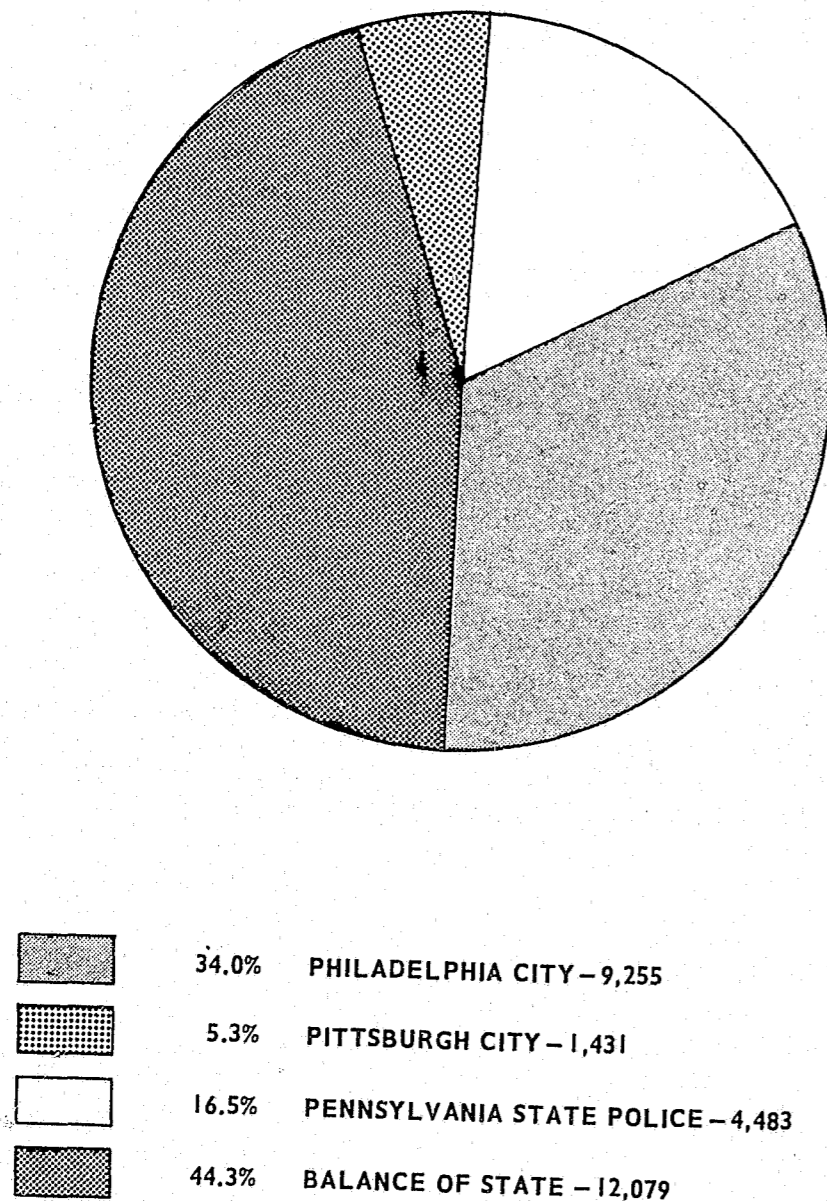

The greatest number of full-time law enforcement employees occurred in the city of Philadelphia. This city alone employed 9,255 full-time law enforcement personnel, 34 percent of the State total.

Ninety-two percent of the reported 27,248 full-time law enforcement personnel were males, while 8 percent were females (See following table). Females represented only two percent of the full-time police officers, but 51 percent of the civilian employees were women.

On a geographic basis, 84 percent of the 22,334 full-time local department police employees and 85 percent of its 19,690 full-time local department police officers were located in 15 counties (See following table). DEATHS OF AND ASSAULTS ON
PENNSYLVANIA LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

This year, three Pennsylvania law enforcement officers, one each from Philadelphia, Harrisburg and the Delaware County Park Police, were feloniously killed while performing their official duties. Over the ten-year period 1969-1978 inclusive, 39 Pennsylvania police officers have been murdered in the line of duty. In addition, there were two police officers killed in the line of duty this year as the result of traffic accidents.

Pennsylvania's law enforcement agencies reported 3,426 assaults on police officers this year (Table 17), a slight 0.6 percent decrease from last year's total. This was the equivalent of 14.5 assaults per 100 full-time officers. Among population groups, the highest assault rates, 22.1 and 21.4 were experienced by the State's two largest cities, Pittsburgh and Philadelphia. Philadelphia alone accounted for 51 percent of the reported assaults. At the other end of the scale, the rate for Sheriffs and Other County Police was only 1.2 assaults per 100 full-time officers.

Injuries were sustained by 36 percent of the law enforcement officers assaulted this year. While only about one Philadelphia City policeman in four (26 percent) assaulted was injured, the injury percentages for all other population groups ranged from 41 to 51.

In the entire state, there were 1,241 assaults with injury reported, for a rate of 5.2 per 100 full-time officers. In a comparison of population groups, Pittsburgh had the highest rate, 9.1 while the Pennsylvania State Police had the lowest, 1.4 assaults with injury per 100 full-time officers.

Statewide, 97 percent of the assaults on police officers were cleared by arrests. Clearance rates, by population group, ranged from 83 percent for Sheriffs and Other County Police to almost 99 percent for the City of Philadelphia, six of the nine population groups had clearance rates of 95 percent or higher.

Personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.) were employed in 89 percent of the assaults on Pennsylvania police officers this year (Table 18, Figure 0). Six percent of the assaults were committed with dangerous weapons other than firearms or cutting instruments, while firearms and knives or other cutting instruments were the weapons of commission in three percent and two percent of the attacks, respectively.

Assaults with deadly weapons other than firearms or cutting instruments produced the highest rate of personal injury. Forty-four percent of the officers attacked with these weapons were injured (Table 19). Assaults with knives or other cutting instruments or with personal weapons resulted in injury 36 percent of the time. When firearms were used, the injury rate was 17 percent.

More than 41 percent of the assaults happened while officers were responding to disturbance calls (Table 20). An additional 21 percent were committed on officers attempting other arrests.* Officers engaged in the handling, transporting, or custody of prisoners were the victims in 12 percent of the assaults.

*At the time of assault, the officer was making or attempting to make an arrest for an offense other than disturbance call, burglary, robbery, civil disorder or traffic.

OFFICERS BY TYPE OF WEAPON USED

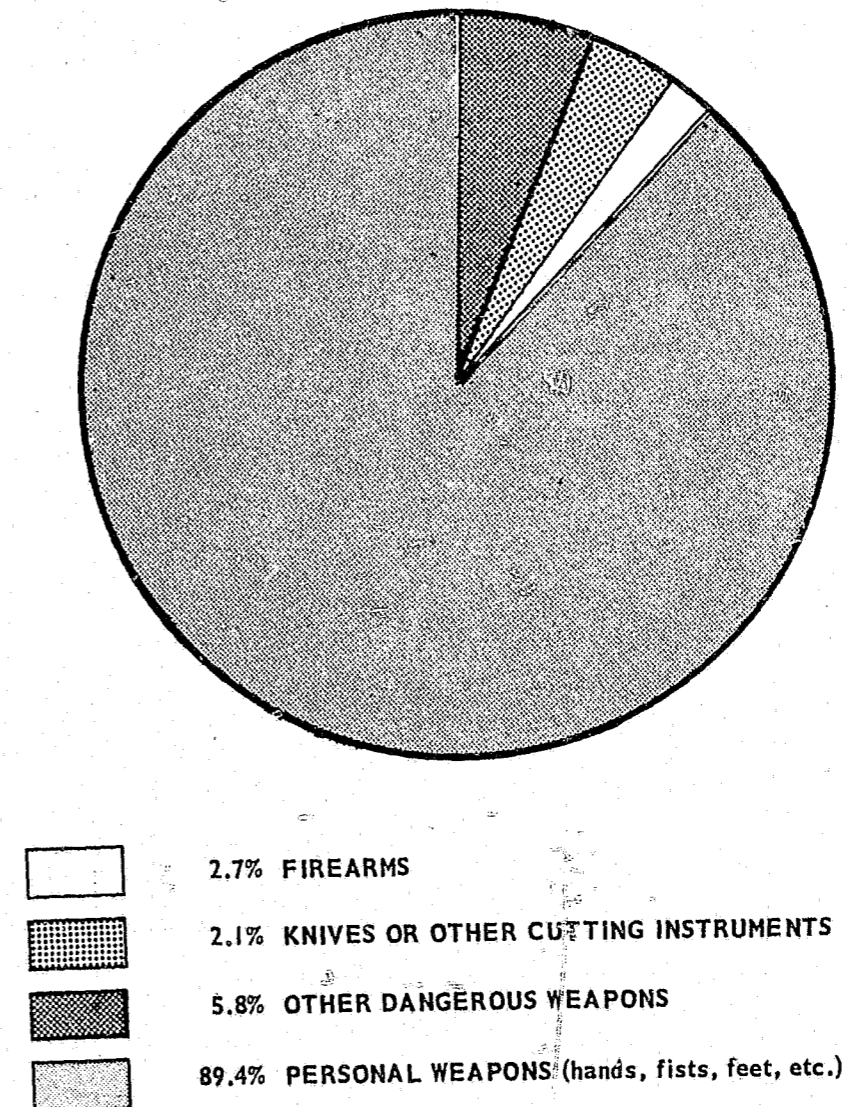
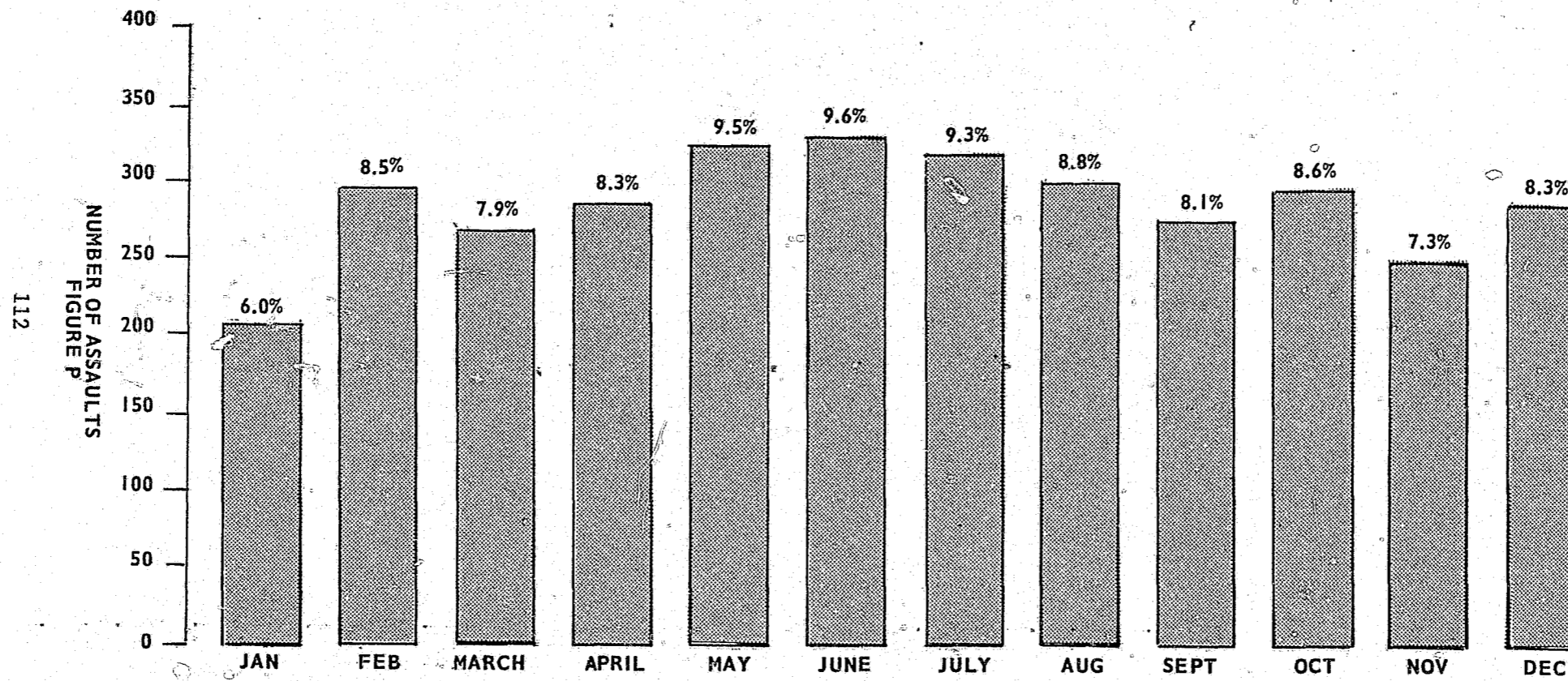

Forty-two percent of the 3,063 assaults with personal weapons took place while officers were responding to disturbance calls, 22 percent during attempts at other arrests, and 13 percent while handling or transporting prisoners. Twenty-nine percent of the assaults with other dangerous weapons were committed while officers were engaged in traffic pursuits or stops. Forty-eight percent of assaults with firearms occurred while officers were responding to disturbance calls. Almost 53 percent of assaults with knives or other cutting instruments happened during responses to disturbance calls.

As mentioned earlier, 97 percent of the reported 3,426 assaults on Pennsylvania police officers were cleared by arrest. Clearance rates of 95 percent or more were reported for assaults occurring in the course of the following seven categories of police activity: responding to disturbance calls, robberies in progress, attempting other arrests, handling or transporting prisoners, mentally deranged, traffic pursuits and stops, and all other (Table 21).

Personal weapons, predominantly, were employed in the assaults which took place during most types of police activity (Table 22). Personal weapons were used to commit 97 percent of the assaults on officers while they were handling or transporting prisoners, and 95 percent of assaults occurring while the officers were attempting other arrests. The exception to the prevailing use of personal weapons occurred during ambushes of policemen, when personal weapons were used in only 33 percent of the assaults.

Eighty percent of the police officers were assigned to vehicle patrols at the time of assault (Table 23), either in one-man (43 percent) or two-man vehicles (37 percent). Four percent of the officers were on a detective or special assignment, and 16 percent were on other types of assignment.

Forty-five percent of the assaults on officers assigned to two-man vehicles were made while the officers were responding to disturbance calls, 18 percent while attempting other arrests and 15 percent in the handling, transporting or custody of prisoners (Table 24). Two-thirds of the attacks on officers patrolling in one-man vehicles happened while they were either responding to disturbance calls (46 percent) or attempting other arrests (21 percent). Twenty-seven percent of the assaults on officers on other assignments occurred when they were responding to disturbance calls, and 22 percent were committed while they were attempting other arrests. 36 percent of assaults on officers on detective or special assignment took place while they were attempting other arrests.

More assaults, 328 occurred in June than in any other month (Figure P). Assaults were least frequent in the month of January, when 205 were reported.

Almost half (45 percent) of the reported assaults on police officers were committed between the hours of 8:01 P.M. and 2:00 A.M. (Table 25). About one in six occurred during the two-hour period of 8:01 P.M. to 10:00 P.M.

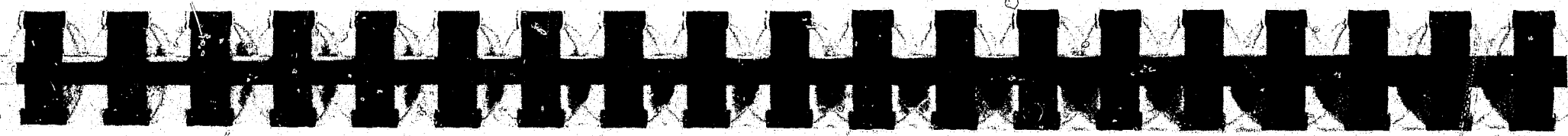
