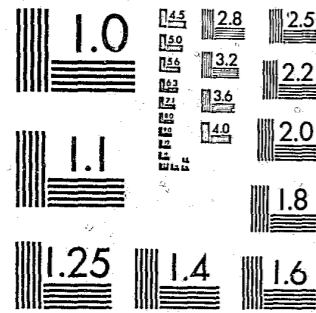


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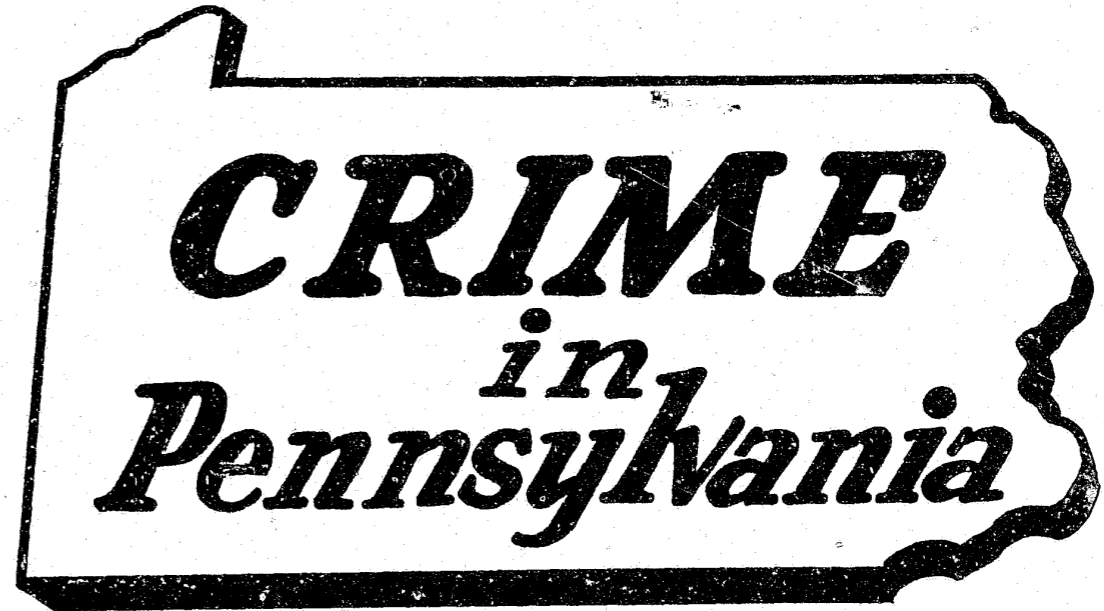

In keeping with the legislated change of making Arson an Index Offense, all of the tables in this report reflect this change. Previous years figures shown in this report were also changed accordingly.



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INTRODUCTION

THE PROGRAM

The Pennsylvania Uniform Crime Reporting Program was established as a result of the Uniform Criminal Statistics Act of 1970 (71 P.S. 307.8 and 307.9). Powers and duties concerning criminal statistics were given to the Attorney General. In October 1973, the Uniform Crime Reporting duties set forth in this Act were transferred to the Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police by Reorganization Plan No. 7 of 1973 (71 P.S. 755-7).

The counterpart of the Pennsylvania UCR Program is the National UCR Program under the direction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. This national program is the result of a need for nationwide and uniform compilation of law enforcement data. Uniform Crime Reports, developed by a committee of the International Association of Chiefs of Police, were first collected in 1930. The IACP continues to serve in an advisory capacity to the FBI in its operation of the Program. In our state program, the UCR Committee of the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police Association was instrumental in the development of the program and continues to serve as an advisor to its operation.

The primary objectives of the Pennsylvania UCR Program are to inform the Governor, Legislature, other governmental officials and the public as to the nature of the crime problem in Pennsylvania and to provide law enforcement administrators with criminal statistics for administrative and operational purposes.

The National UCR Program is a continually expanding program, with more law enforcement agencies participating each year. Each year additional states mandate submission of UCR data by their police agencies, the ultimate goal being that every police agency in the nation submit their crime data. Although we are all aware of its shortcomings, Uniform Crime Report data is still the best crime information available. The returns completed by law enforcement agencies deal only with offenses that come to their attention, and no data is routinely collected to measure the total amount of crime that actually occurs. Some studies indicate that many of the offenses committed are not reported to the police. As an example, offenses are less likely to be reported to police agencies when they are considered less serious or trivial by the general public.

There are many factors which will affect the type and volume of crime that occurs from place to place. Some of these are listed in "Crime in the United States, Uniform Crime Reports, 1979" page v, and are reprinted on the following page.

CRIME FACTORS .

Density and size of community population, and of its surrounding area.
Variations in composition of the population, particularly age structure.
Stability of population with respect to transient factors.
Economic conditions, including job availability.
Cultural conditions, such as educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
Climate.
Effective strength of law enforcement agencies.
Administrative and investigative emphases of law enforcement.
Policies of other components of the criminal justice system (i.e., prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational).
Attitudes of citizenry toward crime.
Crime reporting practices of citizenry.

CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

Uniformity in reporting under the Pennsylvania system is based upon the proper classifications of offenses by police. The adoption of the Federal system of reporting included the utilization of the offense classifications of that system. Law enforcement personnel in this state have made accurate application of those classifications in the reports submitted to the program.

In view of the need for compatibility with the Federal system, the categories of offense classification employed in this program remain the same as those employed on the national level. Care must be taken by police officers in classifying because of the conflicts between this system and the Pennsylvania Crimes Code.

Part I Offenses

Offense data consists of information that has been extracted from reports of crimes that have come to the attention of Pennsylvania law enforcement agencies. In general, Part I crimes are those serious crimes that are usually reported to law enforcement agencies. It consists of the following offenses:

(1) Criminal Homicide

- 1a. Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter - The unlawful, nonnegligent killing of a human being, by another.
General rule - Any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault or commission of a crime.
- 1b. Manslaughter by Negligence - The accidental killing of a human being, by another.
General rule - The killing may result from the commission of an unlawful act or from a lawful act performed with gross negligence. Deaths resulting from traffic accidents are not included in this classification.

(2) Forcible Rape

- 2a. Rape by Force - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly against her will.
General rule - Forcible rape of a female but excluding Statutory Rape or other sex offenses.
- 2b. Assault to Rape - Attempts - All assaults and attempts to rape.

(3) Robbery - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

- 3a. Firearm - Any firearm used as a weapon or employed as a means of force to threaten the victim or put him in fear.
- 3b. Knife or Cutting Instrument - Any knife, broken bottle, razor, or other cutting instrument employed as a weapon or as a means of force to threaten the victim or put him in fear.
- 3c. Other Dangerous Weapon - Any club, acid, explosive, brass knuckles, or other dangerous weapon employed as a means of force to threaten the victim or put him in fear.
- 3d. Strong Arm - Mugging, yokings, and similar offenses where no weapon is used, but strongarm tactics are employed to deprive a victim of his property. This is limited to personal weapons such as hands, fists, feet, teeth, etc.

(4) Assault - An assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another.

General rule - All assaults will be classified in the following categories, excluding assaults with intent to rob or rape.

- 4a. Gun - All assaults and attempted assaults involving the use of any type of firearm. (Revolvers, automatic pistols, shotguns, zip guns, rifles, pellet guns, etc.)
- 4b. Knife or Cutting Instrument - All assaults and attempted assaults, involving the use of cutting or stabbing objects. (Knife, razor, hatchet, axe, cleaver, scissors, glass, broken bottle, dagger, ice pick, etc.)
- 4c. Other Dangerous Weapon - All assaults and attempted assaults, when any other object or thing is used as a weapon. (Clubs, bricks, pick handles, bottles, explosives, acid, lye, poison, scalding water and cases of attempted drowning, burning, etc.)
- 4d. Hands, Fists, Feet, etc. - Felonious - Assaults which are of a felonious nature when hands, fists, feet, etc., are used. To be classified as felonious assault, the attack must result in serious personal injury.
- 4e. Other Assaults - Not Aggravated - All offenses of simple assault and assault and battery. Crimes of this classification are not considered Index Offenses and appear as classification 8 (Part II Offense) in this report.

- (5) Burglary - Unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or theft.
General rule - Any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any dwelling house, attached structure, public building, shop, office, factory, storehouse, apartment, house trailer, warehouse, mill, barn, other building, houseboat or railroad car. Note: For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, breaking and entering and larceny are classified only as burglary; the larceny is excluded. Breaking and entering of a motor vehicle is classified as larceny.

5a. Forcible Entry - All offenses where force of any kind is used to enter unlawfully a locked structure, with intent to steal or commit a felony. This includes entry by use of a master key, celluloid or other device that leaves no outward mark but is used to open a lock. Concealment inside a building, followed by the breaking out of the structure is also included.

5b. Unlawful Entry - No Force - Any unlawful entry without any evidence of forcible entry.

5c. Attempted Forcible Entry - When determined that forcible entry has been attempted.

- (6) Larceny-theft (except Motor Vehicle Theft) - The unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to deprive him of ownership.
General rule - All larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket-picking, purse snatching, shop lifting, larceny from auto, larceny of auto parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, larceny from buildings and from coin operated machines. Any theft that is not a robbery or the result of breaking and entering is included. Embezzlement, frauds or bad check cases are excluded.

- (7) Motor Vehicle Theft - Theft and attempted theft of a motor vehicle.
General rule - This includes all vehicles which can be registered as motor vehicles in this state. Excludes cases where there is a lawful access to the vehicle, such as a family situation or unauthorized use by others with lawful access to the vehicle.
(Chauffeur, employees, etc.)

7a. Auto Theft - The theft of all sedans, stationwagons, coupes, convertibles and other similar motor vehicles which serve the sole purpose of transporting people from one place to another.

7b. Trucks and Buses - Theft of those vehicles specifically designed to transport people on a commercial basis, and to transport cargo.

7c. Other Vehicles - Theft of all other motor vehicles limited by the UCR definition such as snowmobiles, motorcycles, motor scooters, trailbikes, etc. Theft of farm equipment, construction equipment or airplanes are considered Larceny-theft.

- (9) Arson - Includes all violations of state laws and municipal ordinances relating to arson and attempted arson. Includes: any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, church, college, jail, meeting house, public building or any building, ship or other vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft; contents of buildings, personal property of another, goods or chattels, crops, trees, fences, gates, grain, vegetable products, lumber, woods, cranberry bogs, marshes, meadows, etc. In the event of a death from arson, the offense would be classified as murder and if personal injury results, the offense would be classified as assault (4c).

Part II Offenses

Part II offenses are made up of all other crimes not classified as Part I crimes. Part II crimes for UCR purposes are as follows:

- (8) Other Assaults - This class is comprised of all assaults and attempted assaults which are simple or minor in nature. For reporting purposes, these "Other Assaults" are scored on Return A under item 4e as offenses known to Police. However, arrests for this offense are scored in this class.

- (10) Forgery and Counterfeiting - In this class are placed all offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering or possessing, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

Includes:

Altering or forging public or other records.

Making, altering, forging, or counterfeiting bills, notes, drafts, tickets, checks, credit cards, etc.

Forging wills, deeds, notes, bonds, seals, trademarks, etc.

Counterfeiting coins, plates, bank notes, checks, etc.

Possessing or uttering forged or counterfeiting instruments.

Erasures.

Signing the name of another or fictitious person with intent to defraud.

Using forged labels.

Possession, manufacture, etc., of counterfeiting apparatus.

Selling goods with altered, forged or counterfeited trademarks.

All attempts to commit any of the above.

- (11) Fraud - Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretense. Includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- (12) Embezzlement - Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- (13) Stolen Property; Buying, Receiving, Possessing - Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving and possession of stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- (14) Vandalism - Included in this class are all willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth or any other such means as may be specified by law or ordinance. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property.
- (15) Weapons; Carrying, Possessing, etc. - This class deals with violations of weapons laws such as:
Manufacture, sale or possession of deadly weapons.
Carrying deadly weapons.
Using, manufacturing, etc., silencers.
Furnishing deadly weapons to minors.
Aliens possessing deadly weapons.
All attempts to commit the above.
- (16) Prostitution and Commercialized Vice - Included in this class are the sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as:
Prostitution.
Keeping bawdy house, disorderly house or house of ill repute.
Pandering, procuring, transporting or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.
All attempts to commit any of the above.
- (17) Sex Offenses - Except forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Includes offenses against chastity, common decency, morals and the like.
Adultery and fornication.
Buggery.
Incest.
Indecent liberties.
Indecent exposure.
Intercourse with an insane, epileptic or venereally diseased person.
Sodomy.
Seduction.
Statutory rape - (no force).
All attempts to commit any of the above.
- (18) Drug Abuse Violations - Drug abuse violations are reported on the basis of the narcotic involved. Include all violations of state and local ordinances, specifically those relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing and making of narcotic drugs. The following subdivisions of narcotic drug law violations are classified:
- Sale or Manufacture
18a. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives.
Morphine, heroin, codeine.
18b. Marijuana.

- 18c. Synthetic narcotics, manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction.
Demerol, methadones.
18d. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs.
Barbiturates, benzedrine, inhalants.

Possession

- 18e. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives.
Morphine, heroin, codeine.
18f. Marijuana.
18g. Synthetic narcotics, manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction.
Demerol, methadones.
18h. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs.
Barbiturates, benzedrine, inhalants.

- (19) Gambling - All offenses which are related to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling. To provide a more refined collection of gambling offenses, the following classifications are used:
- 19a. Bookmaking (Horse and sport books).
19b. Numbers and lottery.
19c. All other.
- (20) Offenses Against the Family and Children - Included here are all charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family and children.
Desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport.
Neglect or abuse of child. (If injury is serious, offense is reported as aggravated assault.)
Non-payment of alimony.
All attempts to commit any of the above.
- (21) Driving Under the Influence - This class is limited to the operating of any vehicle while under the influence of alcoholic beverages or narcotic drugs.
- (22) Liquor Laws - With the exception of "Drunkenness" (Class 23) and "Driving Under the Influence" (Class 21), liquor law violations, state or local, are placed in this class.
Includes:
Manufacturing, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing, etc.
Maintaining unlawful drinking places.
Bootlegging.
Operating still.
Furnishing alcoholic beverages to a minor.
Using vehicle for illegal transportation of alcoholic beverages.
Consumption of alcoholic beverages by a minor.

- (14) Vandalism - Included in this class are all willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control, by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth or any other such means as may be specified by law or ordinance. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property.
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Prostitution.
Keeping bawdy house, disorderly house or house of ill repute.
Pandering, procuring, transporting or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.
All attempts to commit any of the above.
- (17) Sex Offenses - Except forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Includes offenses against chastity, common decency, morals and the like.
Adultery and fornication.
Buggery.
Incest.
Indecent liberties.
Indecent exposure.
Intercourse with an insane, epileptic or venereally diseased person.
Sodomy.
Seduction.
Statutory rape - (no force).
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- 18c. Synthetic narcotics, manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction.
Demerol, methadones.
18d. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs.
Barbiturates, benzedrine, inhalants.

Possession

- 18e. Opium or cocaine and their derivatives.
Morphine, heroin, codeine.
18f. Marijuana.
18g. Synthetic narcotics, manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction.
Demerol, methadones.
18h. Dangerous non-narcotic drugs.
Barbiturates, benzedrine, inhalants.

- (19) Gambling - All offenses which are related to promoting, permitting or engaging in gambling. To provide a more refined collection of gambling offenses, the following classifications are used:

- 19a. Bookmaking (Horse and sport books).
19b. Numbers and lottery.
19c. All other.

- (20) Offenses Against the Family and Children - Included here are all charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family and children.

- Desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport.
Neglect or abuse of child. (If injury is serious, offense is reported as aggravated assault.)
Non-payment of alimony.
All attempts to commit any of the above.

- (21) Driving Under the Influence - This class is limited to the operating of any vehicle while under the influence of alcoholic beverages or narcotic drugs.

- (22) Liquor Laws - With the exception of "Drunkenness" (Class 23) and "Driving Under the Influence" (Class 21), liquor law violations, state or local, are placed in this class.
Includes:

- Manufacturing, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing, etc.
Maintaining unlawful drinking places.
Bootlegging.
Operating still.
Furnishing alcoholic beverages to a minor.
Using vehicle for illegal transportation of alcoholic beverages.
Consumption of alcoholic beverages by a minor.

- (23) Drunkness - Included in this class are all offenses of drunkness or intoxication, with the exception of "Driving Under the Influence" (Class 21).
Drunk and disorderly.
Public intoxication.
- (24) Disorderly Conduct - In this class are placed all violations of committing a breach of the peace.
Includes:
Affray.
Unlawful assembly.
Disturbing the peace.
Disturbing meetings.
Disorderly conduct in State institutions, at court, at fairs, on trains or public conveyances, etc.
Blasphemy, profanity and obscene language.
Desecrating the flag.
Refusing to assist an officer.
All attempts to commit any of the above.
- (25) Vagrancy - In this class are placed persons who are "suspicious characters" and fail to give good account of themselves.
Includes:
Vagrancy.
Begging.
Loitering (persons 18 and over).
Vagabondage.
- (26) All Other Offenses - Include in this class, every other State offense not included in classes 1 through 25. Violations of local ordinances are not included in this class. Illustrated below is a partial list of offenses.
Abduction and compelling to marry.
Abortion (Death resulting from abortion is homicide, offense class 1a).
Bigamy and polygamy.
Blackmail and extortion.
Bribery.
Contempt of court.
Discrimination, unfair competition.
Kidnapping.
Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency except as provided for in classes 1 through 28, such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices, admitting minors to improper places, etc.
Perjury and subornation of perjury.
Possession, repair, manufacture, etc., of burglar's tools.
Possession or sale of obscene literature.
Unlawful use, possession, etc., of explosives, etc.

- (28) Curfew and Loitering Laws (Juveniles) - All violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances are included.
- (29) Runaways (Juveniles) - Reported in this category are apprehensions for protective custody. Runaways taken into protective custody for other jurisdictions are not included.

CALCULATION OF RATES

The Uniform Crime Reporting Program provides data for police administrators to measure local problems, but to facilitate this function it is sometimes necessary to convert the data into rates or percentages. Simple formulas are presented to assist in these computations.

Crime Rates

One of the most useful crime statistics is the crime rate which is the number of offenses per 100,000 persons. This rate can be calculated regardless of the number of inhabitants in your jurisdiction. To compute rates, divide your jurisdiction's population into 100,000 and multiply the number of offenses by that answer.

Example:

$$\frac{100,000}{50,000 \text{ population}} = 2 \times 182 \text{ robberies} = 364$$

Your robbery rate would be 364 per 100,000 population.

Clearance Rates

The percentage of crimes cleared by arrest is obtained by dividing the number of offenses cleared by the number of actual offenses known. This answer is then multiplied by 100.

Example:

$$\frac{147 \text{ Robberies cleared}}{364 \text{ Robberies known}} = 0.404 \times 100 = 40.4\%$$

Your percentage of clearance for robbery is 40.4 percent.

Law Enforcement Employee Rates

These rates are conventionally expressed as the number of employees per 1,000 population. The rate is computed by dividing the population into 1,000 and in turn multiplying the number of employees by this quotient.

Example:

$$\frac{1,000}{50,000 \text{ population}} = 0.02 \times 102 \text{ employees} = 2.04$$

Your rate is 2.0 employees per 1,000 population.

SUMMARY OF CRIME IN PENNSYLVANIA, 1980

There were 927,074 actual crimes of all types reported into the UCR Program by Pennsylvania law enforcement agencies. This total represents a rate of 7,837.9 crimes per 100,000 estimated population, an increase of 3.7 percent over last year's total of 893,899 actual crimes. This year's figures were the highest reported to the Pennsylvania UCR Program to date.

Crime Index Offenses are considered to be both most serious and most likely to be reported and are used nationally as the standard base for comparisons. They include: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft and arson. Manslaughter by negligence is a Part I Crime but is not considered as part of the Crime Index.

This year, 443,043 Crime Index Offenses were reported and confirmed by Pennsylvania police after investigation. Actually, 454,886 Index Offenses were reported, but 2.7 percent or 11,843 were unfounded following investigation, ranging from 1.6 percent unfounded for larceny to 18.6 percent unfounded for rape. Crime Index Offenses increased by 7.9 percent over last year's total of 410,636 Crime Index Offenses. The Crime Index Rate this year was 3,745.7.

In addition, 483,989 Part II Offenses were reported with a rate of 4,091.9 per 100,000 population. This is a gain of 0.2 percent over the 483,209 Part II Offenses reported the previous year. Part II Offenses include: other assaults, forgery and counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons, prostitution, other sex offenses, drug abuse violations, gambling, offenses against the family, driving under the influence, liquor law violations, drunkenness, disorderly conduct, vagrancy and all other offenses.

This year, 42.5 percent of all offenses were cleared; 22.0 percent of the Crime Index Offenses and 61.2 percent of all Part II Offenses.

The following table summarizes the combined Part I and Part II Offense totals.

Pennsylvania is an urban state, with 79.9 percent of its population living within Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas.* 86.5 percent of the Crime Index Offenses and 83.8 percent of Part II Offenses occurred within Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA), as summarized in the following table:

It should be noted that the crime rate of core city jurisdictions in SMSA's continued to be much higher than the suburban jurisdictions. The volume of offenses was higher in suburban jurisdictions than in the core city jurisdictions and was also the highest among all population groups.

* A Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area is composed of an entire county or group of counties with at least one core city, with the whole area meeting criteria of certain metropolitan characteristics established by the United States Bureau of the Census.

ARRESTS

Arrests are primarily a measure of success in police investigation in relation to the criminal offenses taking place within a community. Arrest practices, policies and enforcement emphasis will vary from place to place and from time to time within a community. Arrests do, however, provide a useful indicator as to the age, sex and race of persons involved in criminal acts, especially for those crimes which have high solution rates.

A total of 396,166 arrests were made in Pennsylvania, a 2.2 percent drop from last year. As indicated in the table below, Part II Offenses totaled 300,547 or 75.9 percent of all arrests, a 3.6 percent drop from last year. Part I Offense arrests numbered 95,619 or 24.1 percent of all arrests, increasing by 2.3 percent.

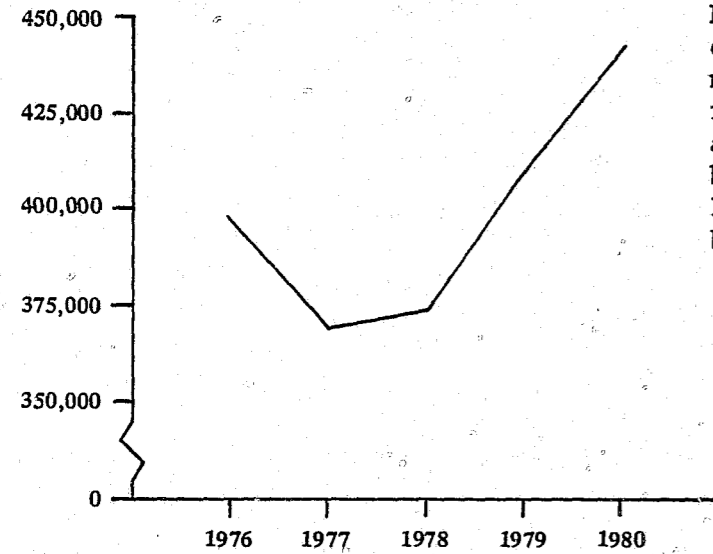

As outlined in Tables 13, 14 and 15, 85.5 percent or 338,748 arrestees were male, and 14.5 percent or 57,418 arrestees were female. 75.4 percent or 298,596 were White, 24.5 percent or 96,880 were Black, and 0.2 percent or 690 were Other Races.* 30.7 percent or 121,656 of the arrestees were under 18 years old, and 69.4 percent or 274,812 of the arrestees were under 25 years old, demonstrating the youthful character of arrestees in Pennsylvania. Male arrestees decreased 2.9 percent, Black arrestees decreased 5.5 percent, and arrests of juveniles decreased by 12.2 percent.

Juvenile arrestees were disposed of as follows: 33.2 percent or 40,340 were handled within the police department and released; 32.6 percent or 39,642 were sent to Juvenile Court or the Juvenile Court Probation Officer; 1.1 percent or 1,344 were referred to welfare agencies; 0.7 percent or 812 were referred to other police agencies; and 32.5 percent or 39,518 were referred to criminal or adult court, usually the district magistrate for specified petty crimes as underage drinking, shoplifting, etc. It should be noted that the number of juvenile arrestees has declined in each of the last five years indicating that the population of Pennsylvania is growing older.

* A decrease in "Other Races" figure may be due to the new classifications of race used this year.

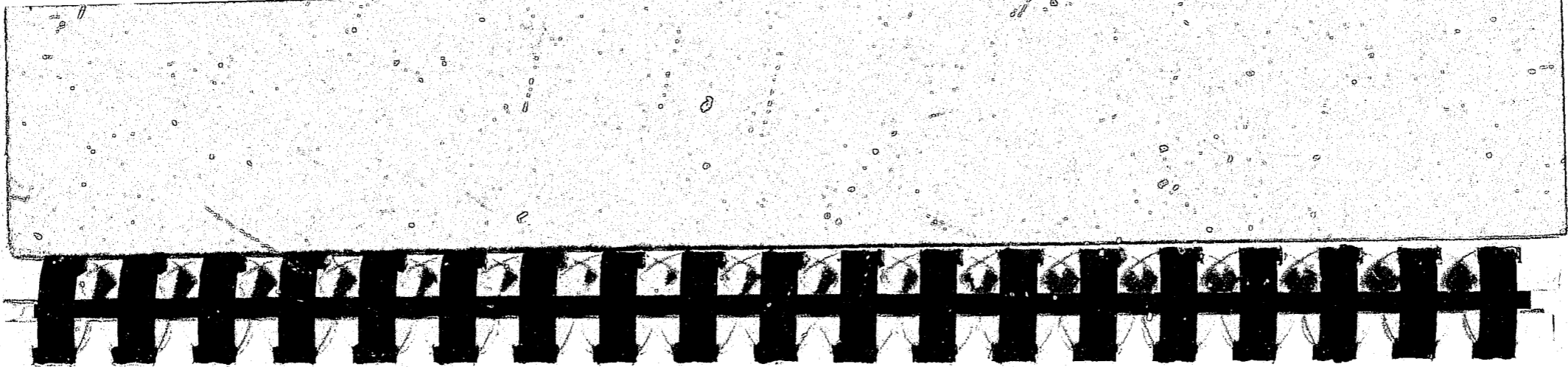

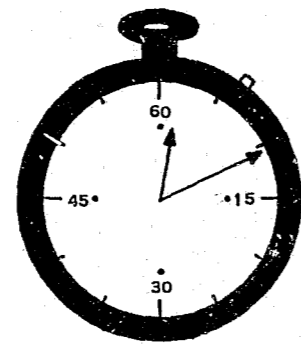
SUMMARY

There were 443,043 Crime Index Offenses reported to Pennsylvania Police Departments, an average of 1,211 each day or one every one minute and 11 seconds. This is an increase of 7.9 percent over the 410,636 reported last year. The Crime Index Rate was 3,745.7.

97,514 or 22.0 percent of the Crime Index Offenses were cleared this year, a slight decline from the 22.7 percent clearance rate achieved last year.

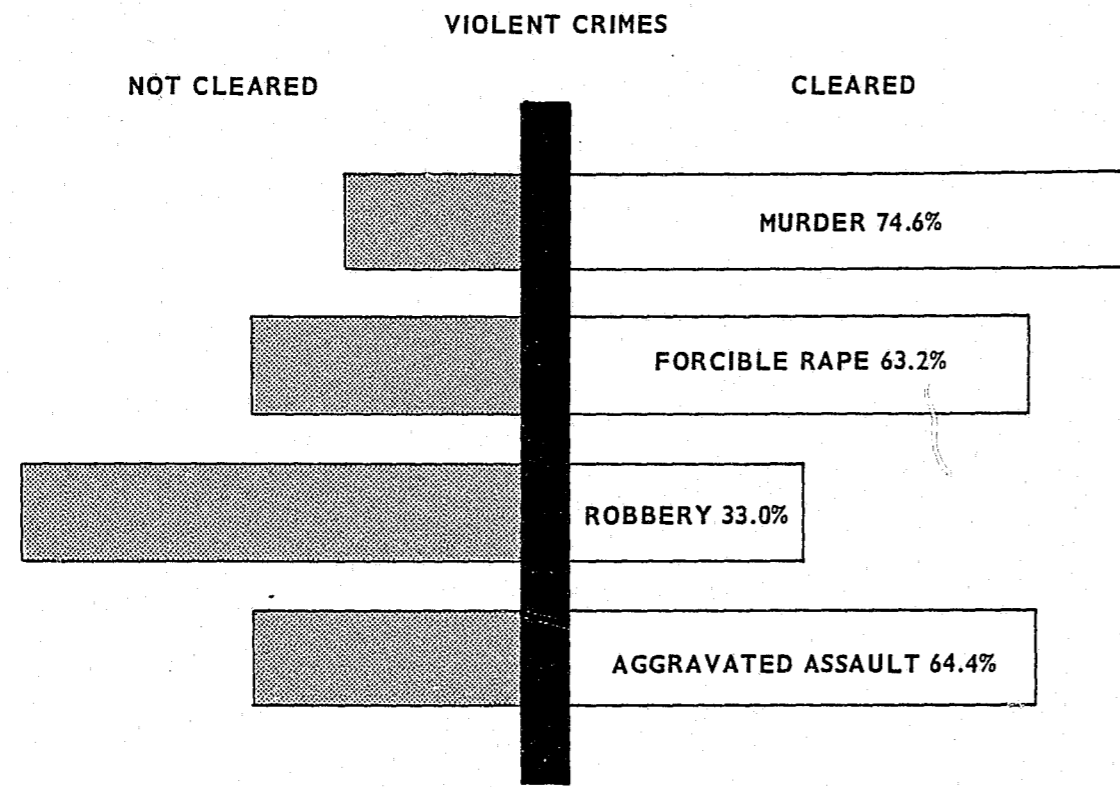

PROPERTY CRIMES

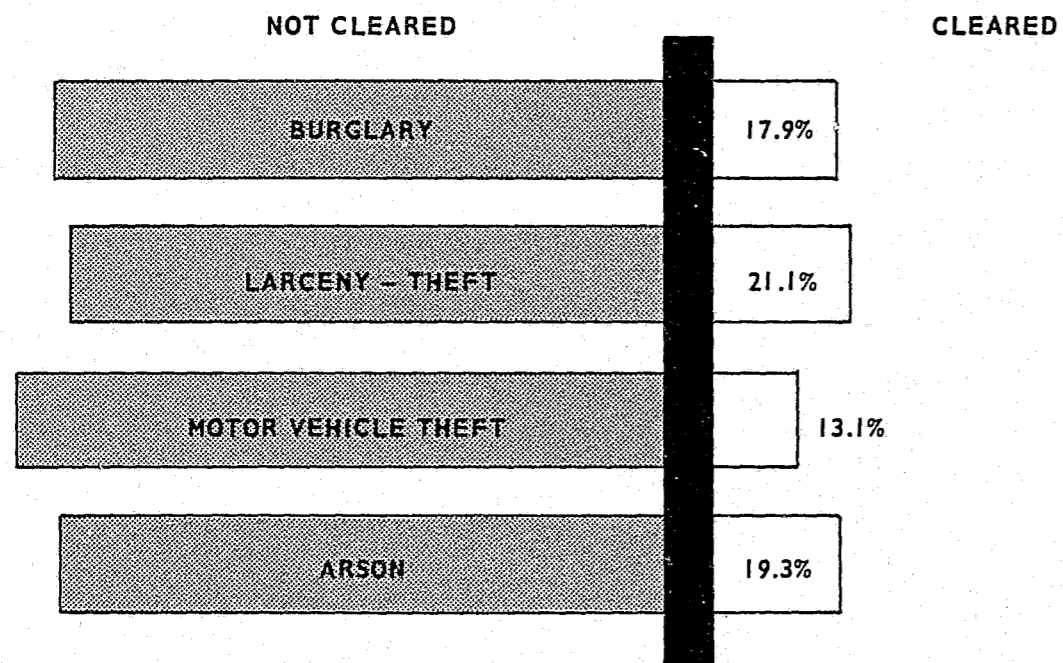

PERCENT DISTRIBUTION

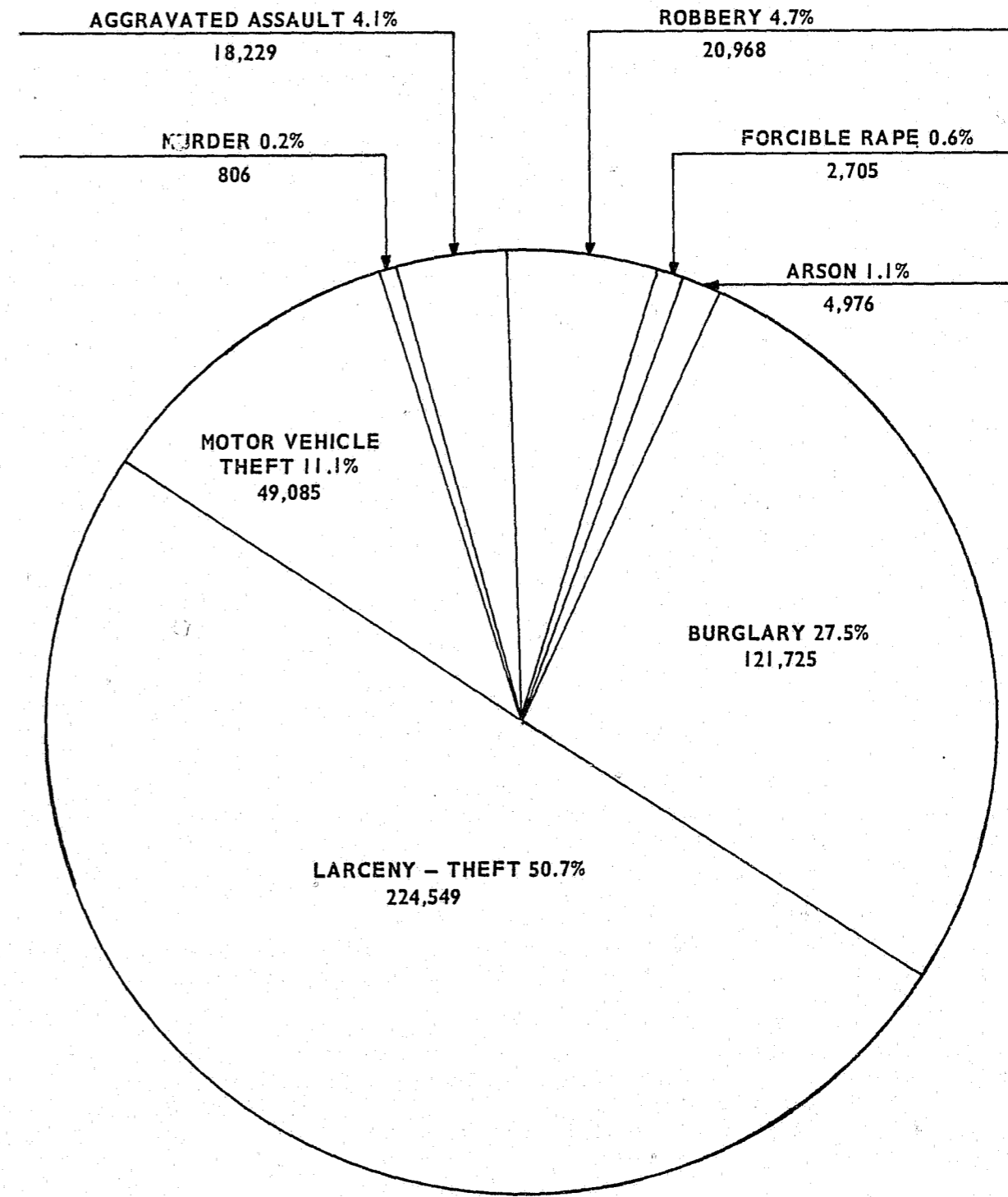

In 1967, the Governor's Office proclaimed six "Common Human Service Regions" (CHSR) in Pennsylvania, consisting of generally comparative counties in terms of interrelated needs and populations. See Figure D. Accordingly, the tables in this report are so organized, with the individual counties being identified alphabetically within the CHSR's.

These regions are considered "standardized" for Commonwealth planning and reporting purposes. They should not be confused with Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA), although the counties in the Southeast CHSR coincide with the Pennsylvania area of the Philadelphia SMSA.

The following table summarizes the distribution of Crime Index Offenses among these six regions.

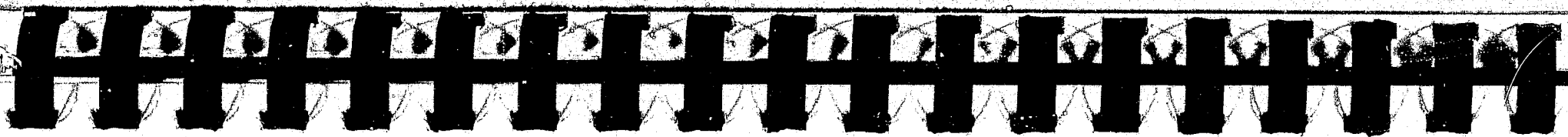
CRIME INDEX DISTRIBUTION BY STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS (SMSA)

Table 4 summarizes the 12 SMSA's in Pennsylvania and additionally includes Susquehanna County, which is a part of the Binghamton, New York SMSA. A total of 28 counties are involved. Counties in New Jersey which are part of the Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton SMSA and the Philadelphia SMSA are not included in this report.

Highest Crime Index Rates were produced by the Philadelphia SMSA (5,147.4) and the Harrisburg SMSA (4,619.7). The lowest Crime Index Rate occurred in the Johnstown SMSA (1,931.2).

Of significance in this table are the high Crime Index Rates shown by core cities of the SMSA's in contrast to the rates in their suburbs. Some examples are: Harrisburg, 13,064.6 against a suburban rate of 3,478.9; York, 9,895.6 against 2,951.4; Pittsburgh, 7,288.7 against 2,617.9; Williamsport, 7,036.9 against 2,760.4; and Reading, 6,745.8 against 2,033.7.

The core cities' Crime Rates were generally double that of their suburbs. In fact, the Crime Index Rate in Harrisburg was almost 4 times the rate of its suburbs; and Reading, York and Pittsburgh, about 3 times.



PENNSYLVANIA COMMON HUMAN SERVICE REGIONS

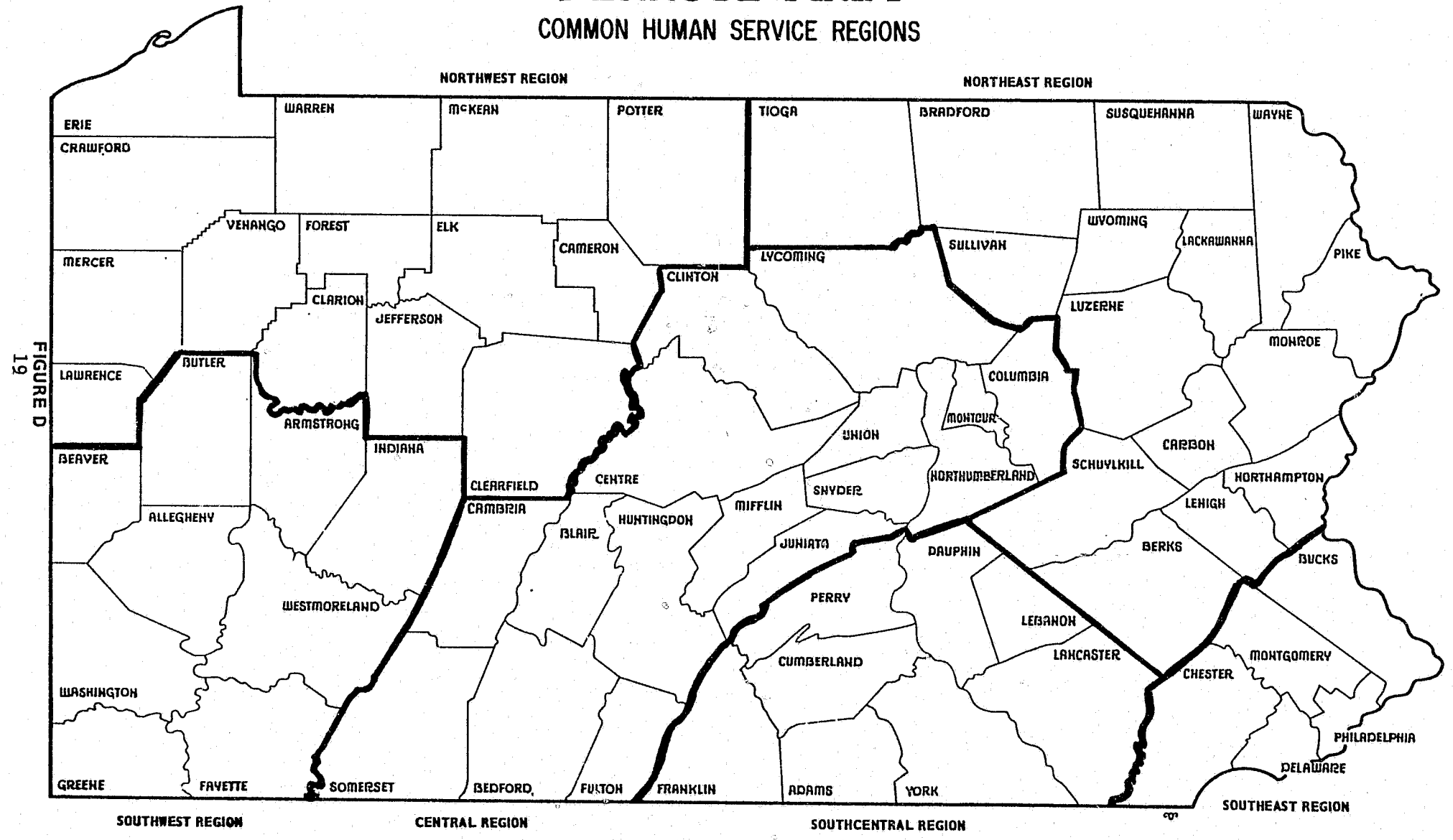

The highest rate of increase was reported for Philadelphia SMSA, 14.1 percent, from 165,532 offenses last year to 188,876 offenses. Erie SMSA showed a 17.7 percent decrease.

Pennsylvania SMSA Crime Index Offenses increased by 8.5 percent. The SMSA core city jurisdictions increased by 14.4 percent; the SMSA suburban jurisdictions, 4.3 percent; and rural jurisdictions, 5.9 percent. Non-SMSA jurisdictions, however, declined by 0.2 percent.

VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED

The total value of property stolen this year in Pennsylvania was \$329,613,745 of which only 36.4 percent or \$120,014,446 was recovered. The total value increased by 24.6 percent from \$264,473,823 last year, and total recovered property increased by 18.4 percent. Motor vehicles accounted for 51.6 percent of stolen property value and 85.8 percent of property recovered. While Crime Index Offenses have increased sharply, stolen property values have continued to climb at a far greater rate, indicating our inflationary times.

As outlined in the following table, motor vehicle thefts, while comprising only 11.7 percent of offenses involving property loss, accounted for a total loss of 51.3 percent of all property stolen or \$169,141,681, an average of \$3,446 per theft. Larceny-theft had the highest number of offenses, 53.5 percent. Its property loss amounted to \$58,765,473 or 17.8 percent of total value of property stolen.

PERCENT RECOVERED OF PROPERTY STOLEN

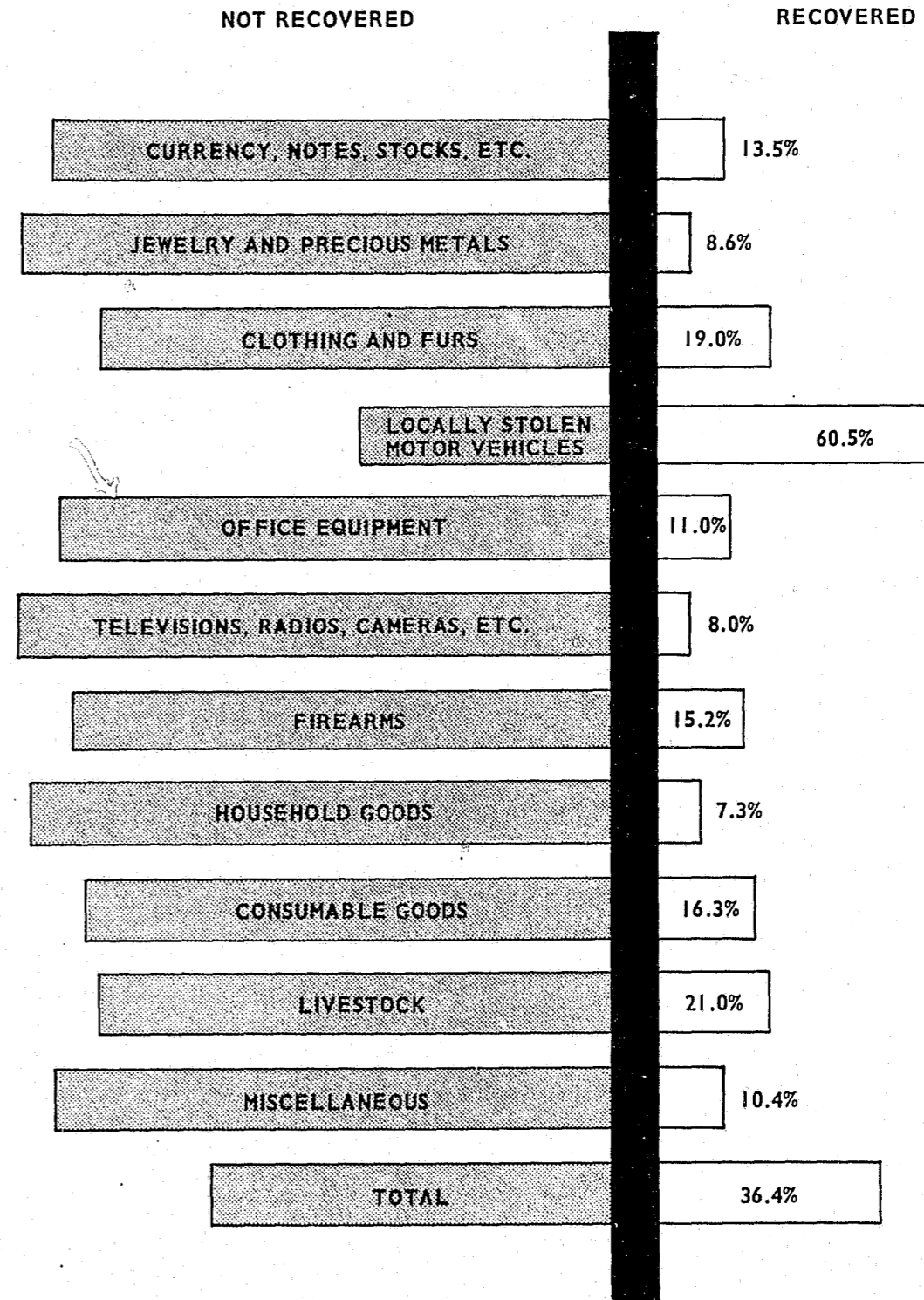

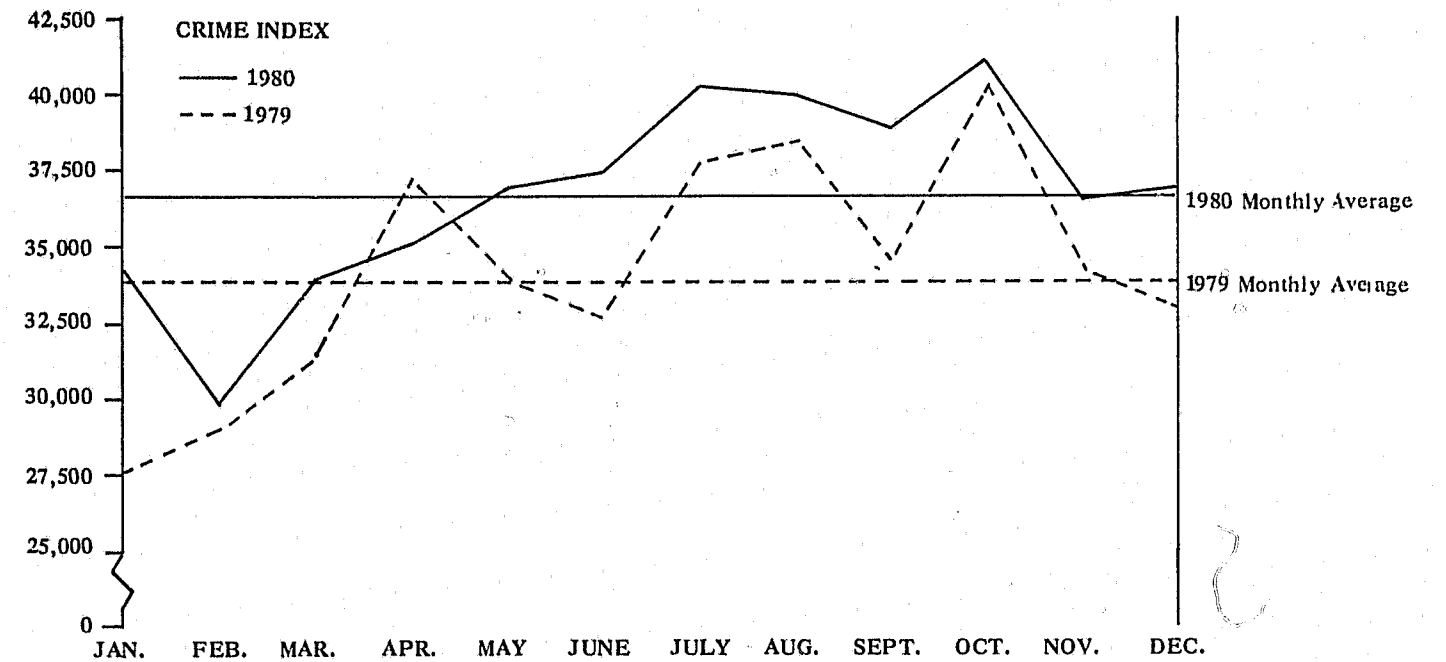

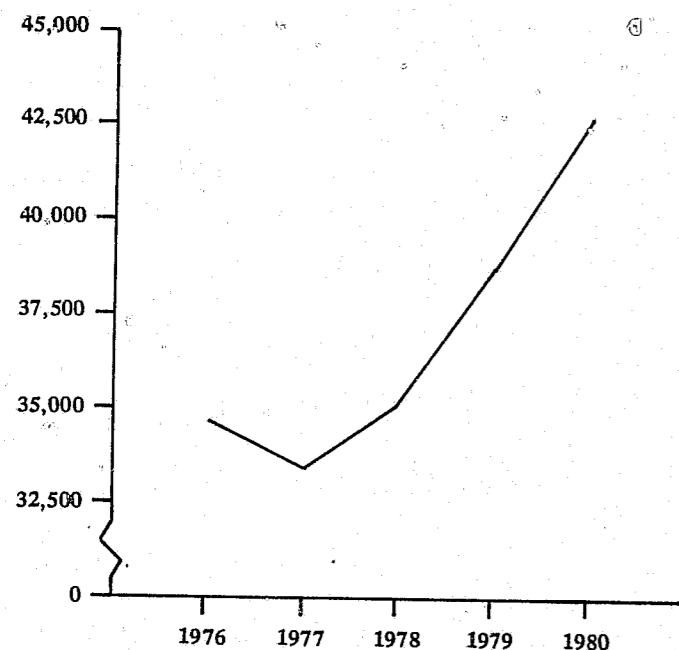

SUMMARY

There were 42,708 Violent Crimes reported to Pennsylvania Police Departments this year, an average of 117 each day or one every 12 minutes and 19 seconds. This is an increase of 9.9 percent over 38,858 Violent Crimes last year and represents the highest number of Violent Crimes reported in the eight year history of the Pennsylvania UCR Program. Violent Crime represented 9.6 percent of the Crime Index. The Violent Crime Index Rate was 361.1.

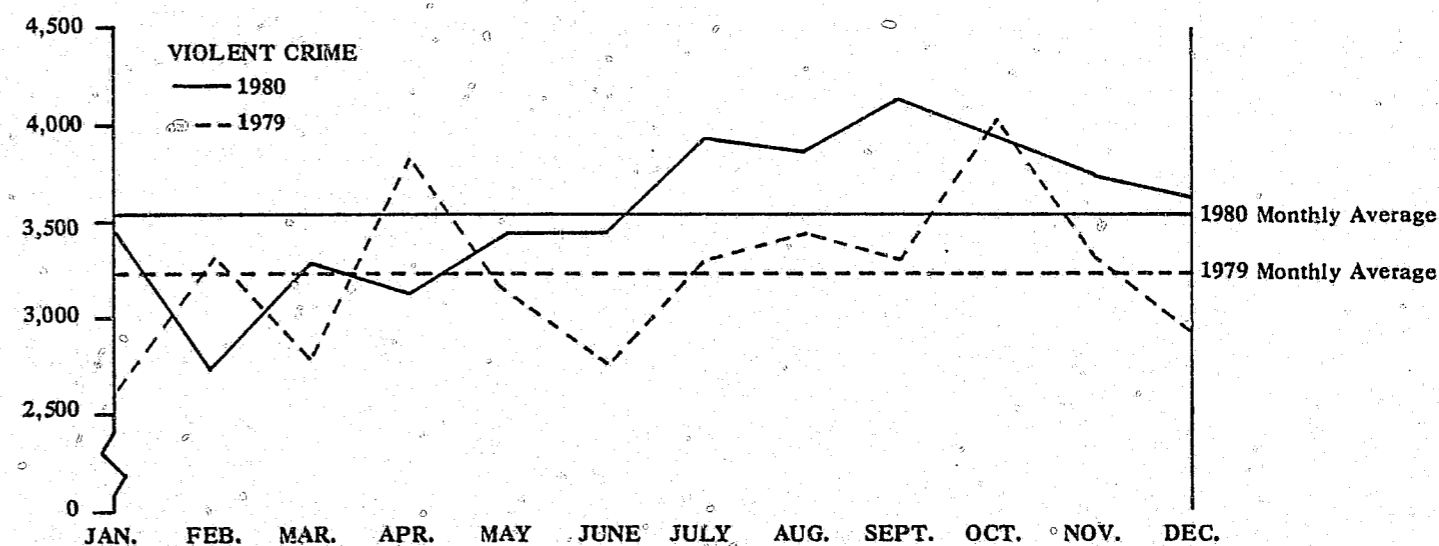
This year 49.1 percent or 20,978 Violent Crimes were cleared, gaining from a 48.9 percent clearance rate last year. In general, clearances of Violent Crime are much higher than Property Crime, because they are committed more openly, have more witnesses and generate a higher degree of intensity in the way of police investigation.

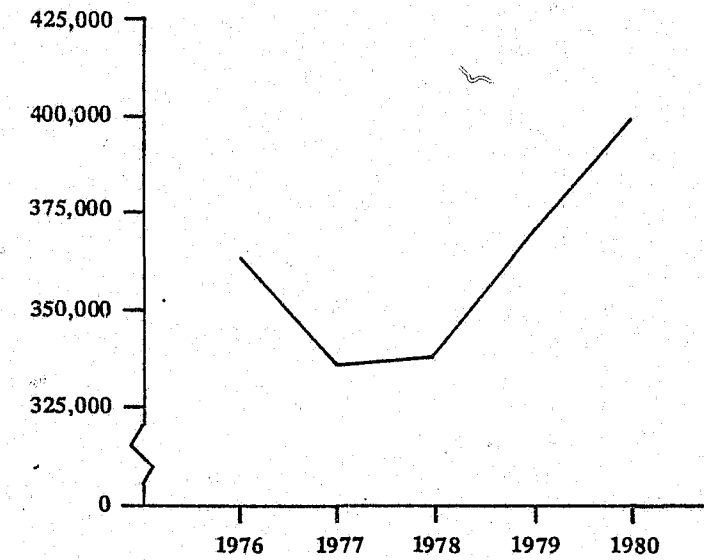

SUMMARY

There were 400,335 Property Crimes reported to Pennsylvania Police Departments, an average of 1,094 each day or one every 1 minute and 19 seconds. This is an increase of 7.7 percent over the 371,778 Property Crimes reported last year and the highest number of Property Crimes in the history of the State Program. Property Crime represented 90.4 percent of the Crime Index Offenses. The Property Crime Index Rate was 3,384.8.

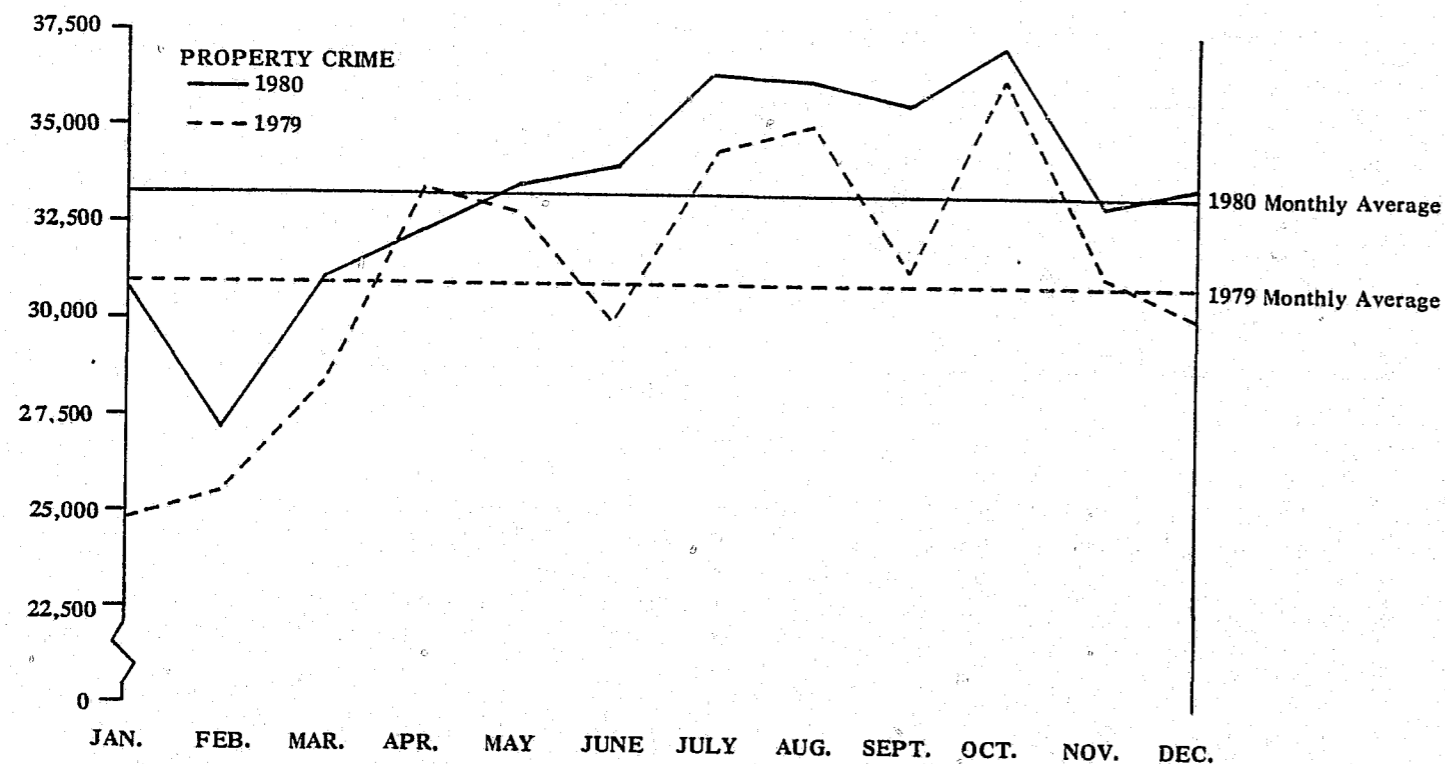

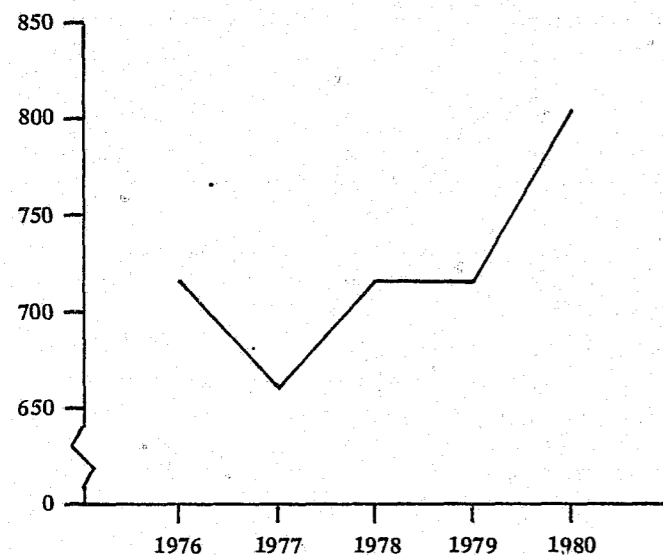

SUMMARY

There were 806 murders reported to Pennsylvania Police Departments this year, an average of 2.2 each day or one every 10 hours and 54 minutes. Murder comprised 0.2 percent of all Index Crimes and 1.9 percent of all Violent Crimes. The Murder Index Rate was 6.8 per 100,000 population.

There was an increase of 89 murders or 12.4 percent from 717 last year to 806 this year. This is the greatest number of murders reported to the Pennsylvania UCR Program to date.

Of the 806 murders, 601 or 74.6 percent were cleared. This represents the highest clearance rate of any of the Index Offenses.

In addition to the 806 homicides reported, 31 "justifiable homicides" were reported by police agencies. Such homicides are killings of felons by police officers (16) or by private citizens (15). Justifiable homicides are omitted from analyses of homicides presented in this report.

HOMICIDE SITUATIONS

The 806 homicide victims were killed in a total of 776 homicide situations involving multiple or single victims and multiple or single known or unknown offenders, as indicated in the following table. 70.4 percent or 546 homicide situations involved a single victim and a single offender; 169 incidents or 21.8 percent involved 177 or 21.9 percent of the victims where the offenders were unknown; 52 of the victims were in 48 multiple offender situations.

AGE, RACE AND SEX OF VICTIMS

Murder victims were predominately males, who accounted for 77.0 percent of the total. Victim analysis by race discloses that 45.9 percent were white and 54.1 percent were non-white. The largest number of victims were between the ages of 20 to 29, 34.0 percent of the total. See Table 5.

AGE, RACE AND SEX OF KNOWN OFFENDERS

Reports on known offenders indicate that the major portion was male, 88.0 percent. Known offender analysis by race discloses that 37.7 percent were white and 62.3 percent were non-white. The largest number of known offenders were between the ages of 20 and 29, 43.8 percent of the total. See Table 6.

MURDER WEAPONS

As outlined in the following table and Figure H, firearms were predominately the weapons used in murder, 59.1 percent. Handguns alone accounted for 379 or 47.0 percent of murders. 183 or 22.7 percent resulted from stabbings.

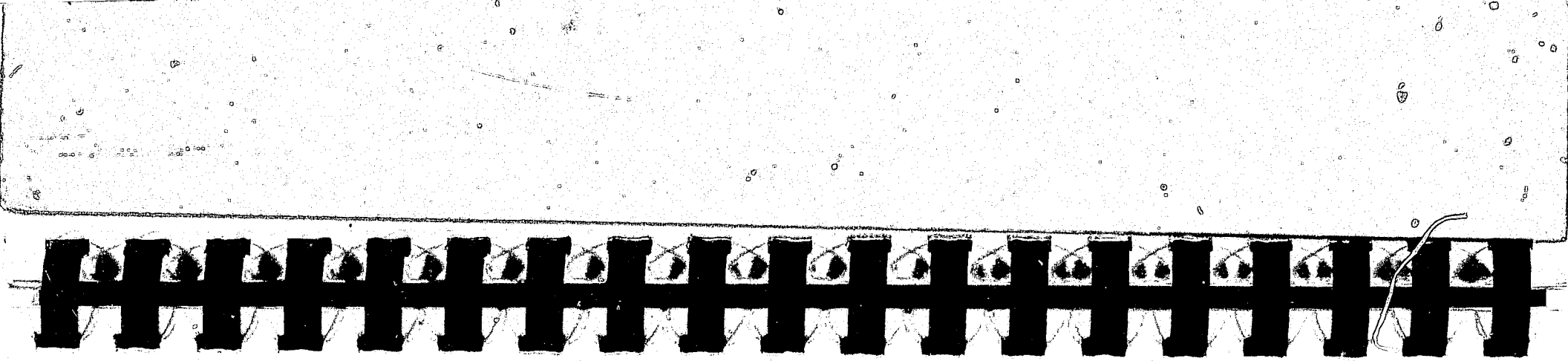

RELATIONSHIP OF VICTIMS TO OFFENDERS

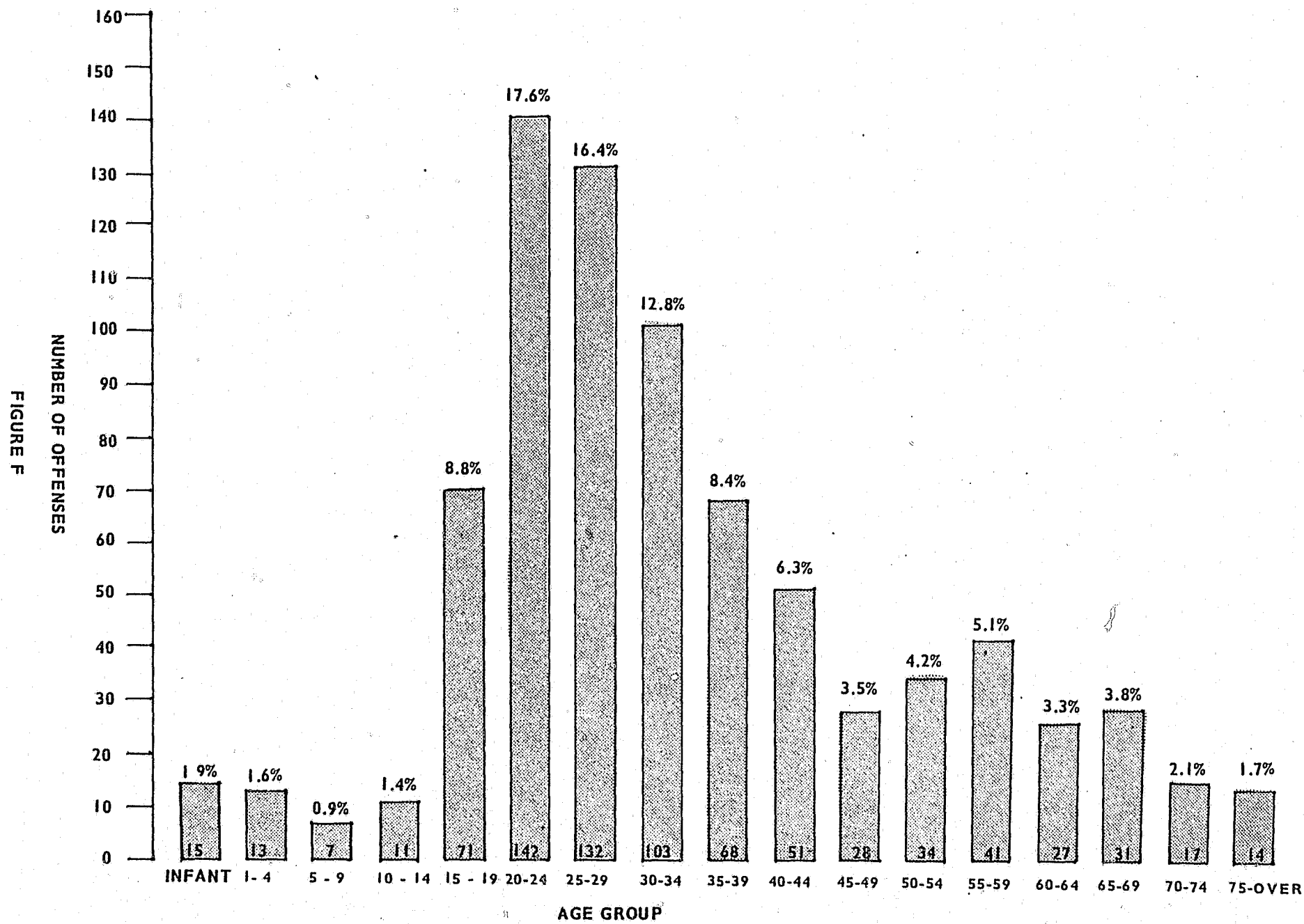

DISTRIBUTION OF MURDER VICTIMS BY AGE GROUP

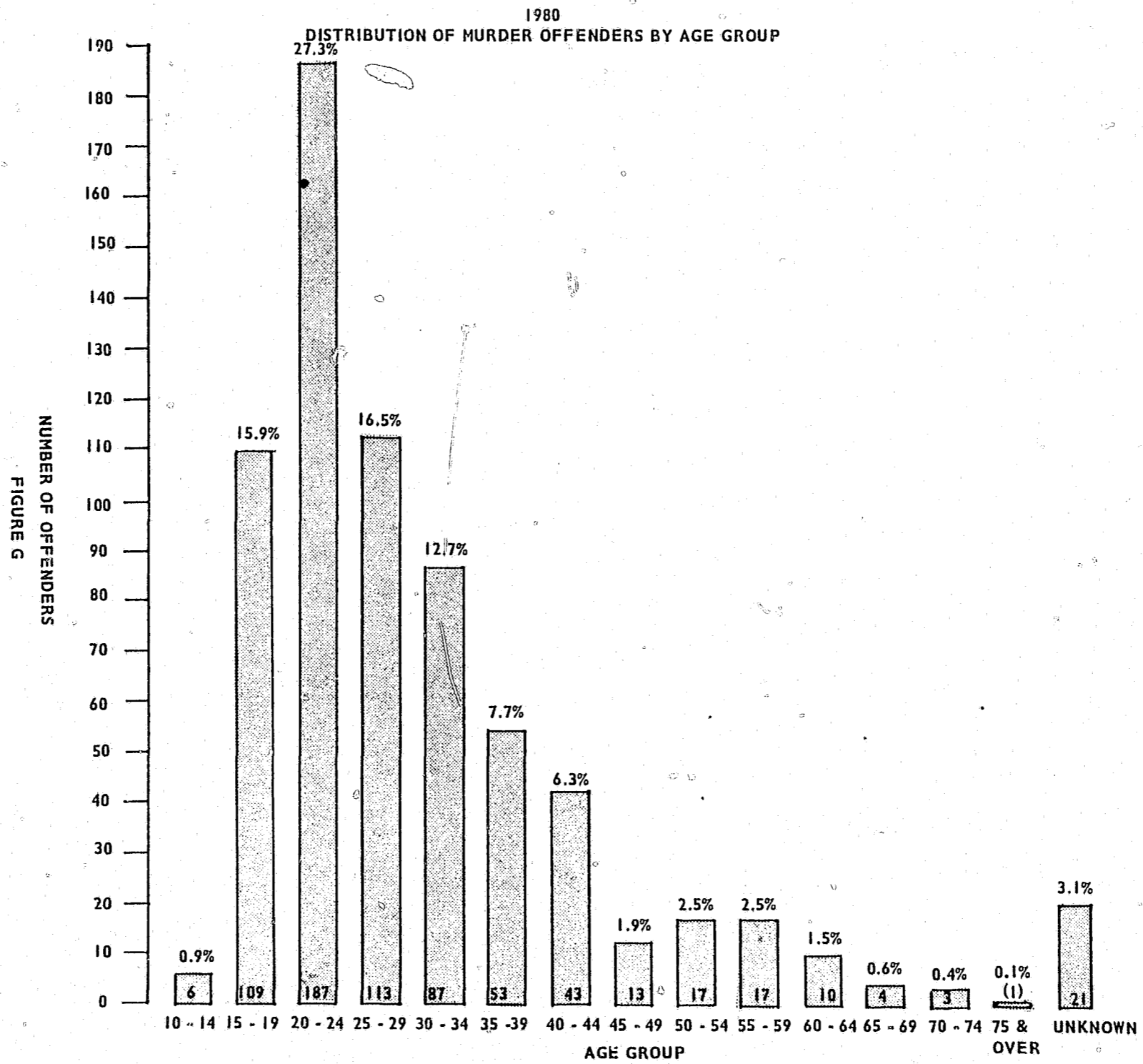


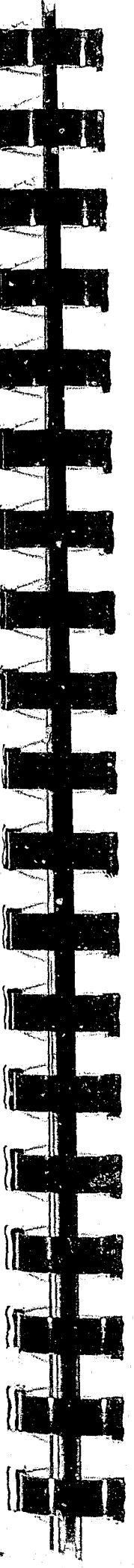
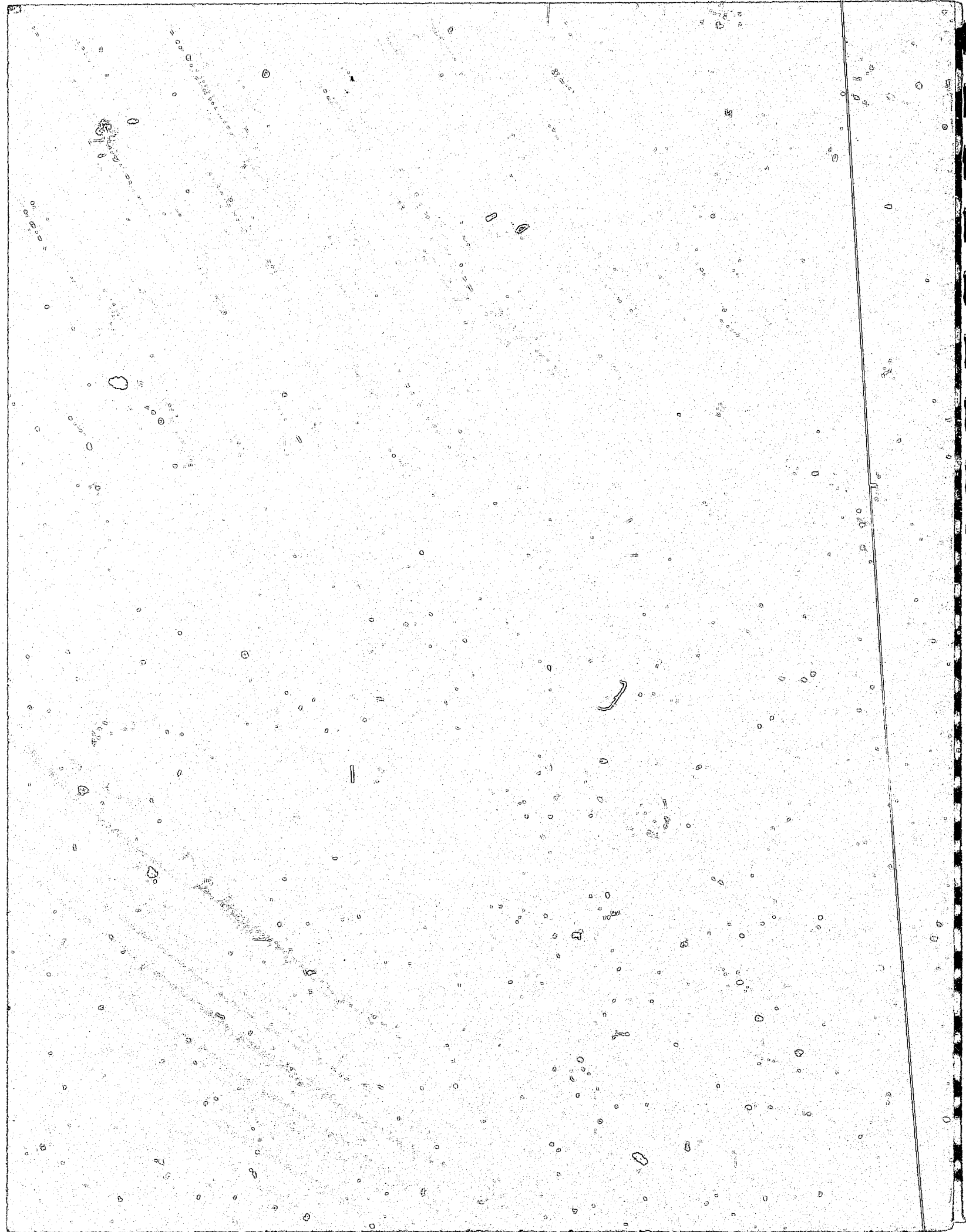

MURDER BY TYPE OF WEAPON

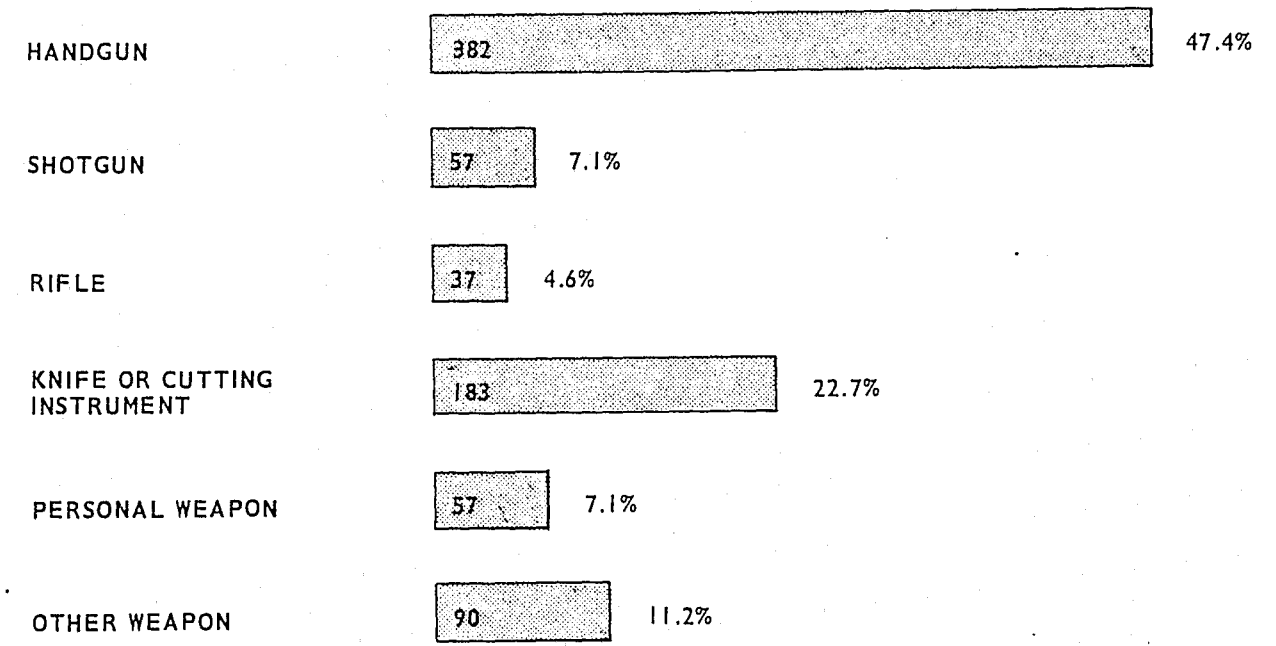

RELATIONSHIP OF VICTIM TO OFFENDER

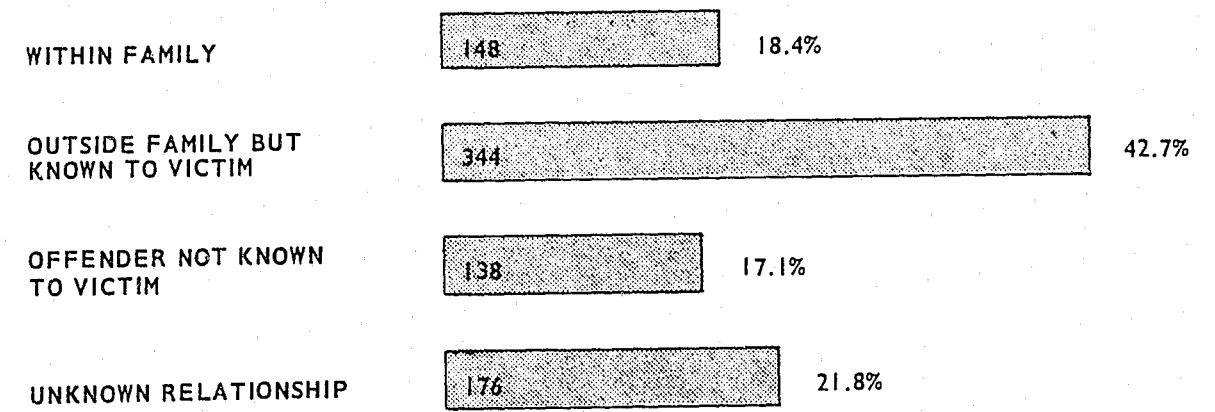

SUMMARY

There were 2,705 Forcible Rape Offenses reported to Pennsylvania Police Departments, an average of 7 each day or one reported every 3 1/4 hours. This is an increase of 8.0 percent over the 2,504 reported last year, the highest volume of Forcible Rape in the State UCR Program. Forcible Rape represented 0.6 percent of the Crime Index and 6.3 percent of the Violent Crime Index. While the Forcible Rape Index Rate this year was 22.9, the rate per 100,000 estimated females in Pennsylvania was 44.4, which places the index in its proper perspective as a victim rate, since it equates the number of crimes per unit of related population. There were 2,160 or 79.9 percent actual rapes and 545 or 20.1 percent attempted rapes.

Of all the Index Offenses, law enforcement officials recognize rape as one of the most under reported crimes, primarily because of fear and/or embarrassment on the part of the victim. 504 additional cases reported this year were unfounded by police

investigation. Forcible Rape is up 25.5 percent over the past five years. Contributing to this trend are the developments of rape crisis centers and the training of personnel specialized in handling rape victims in some police jurisdictions.

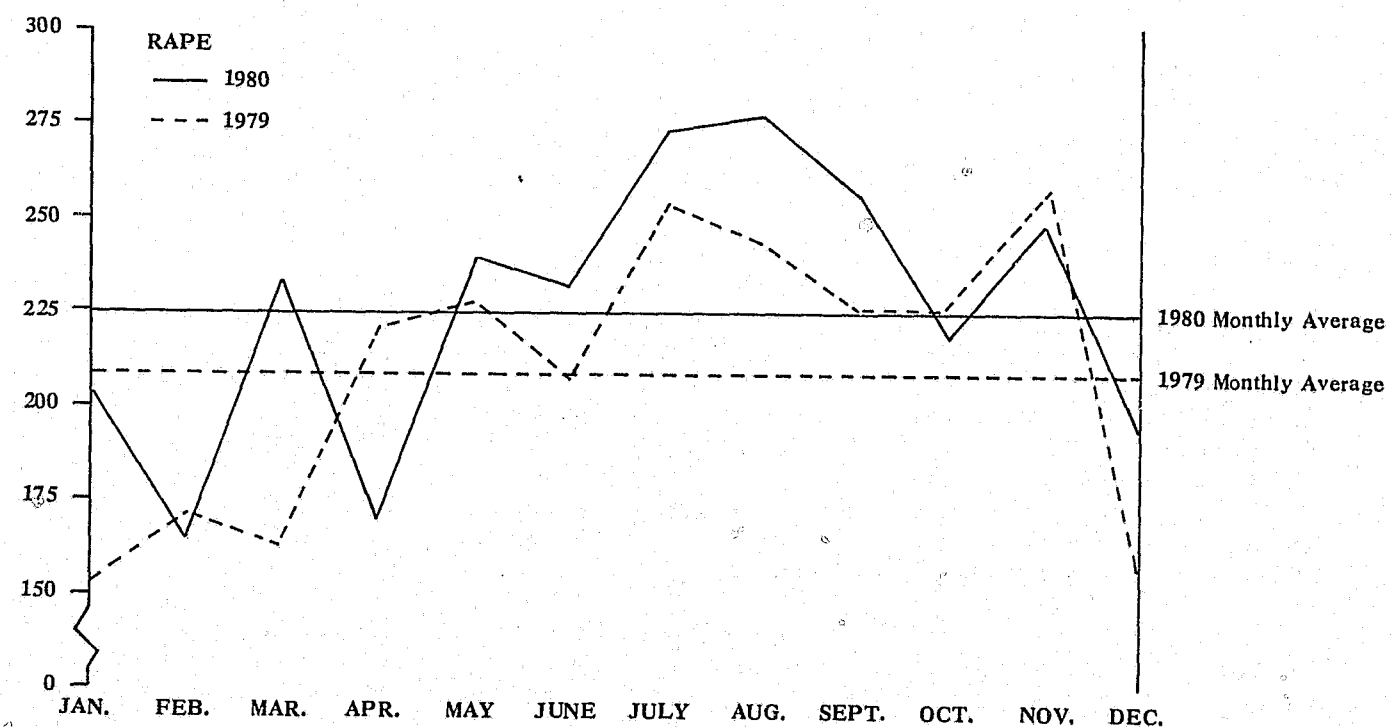

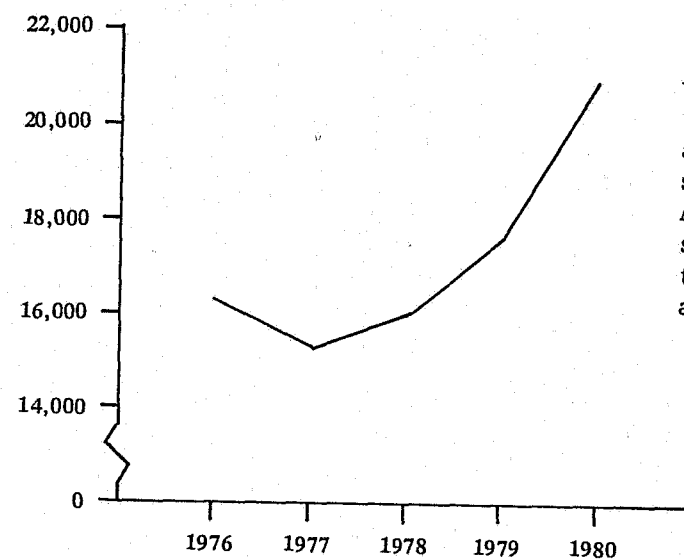

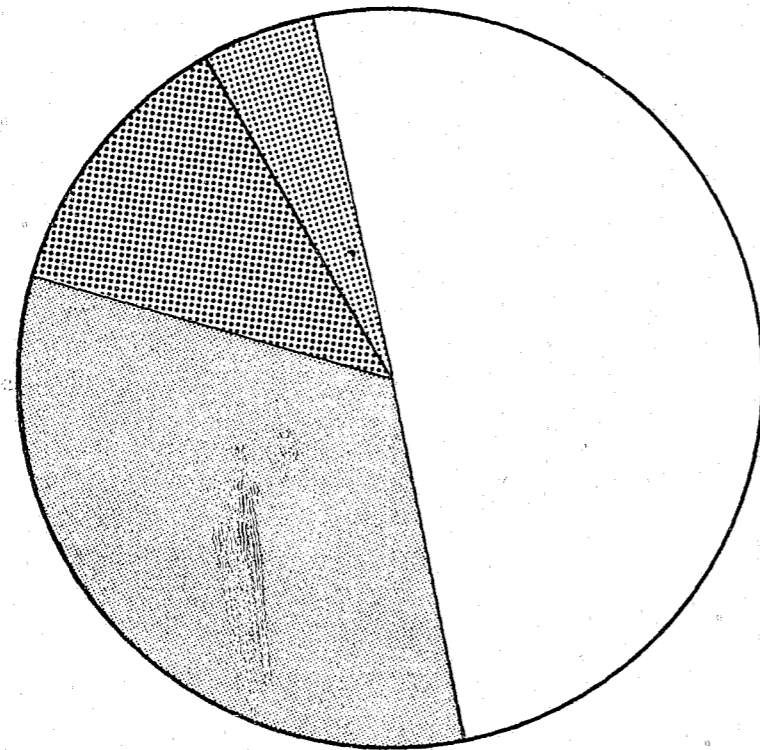

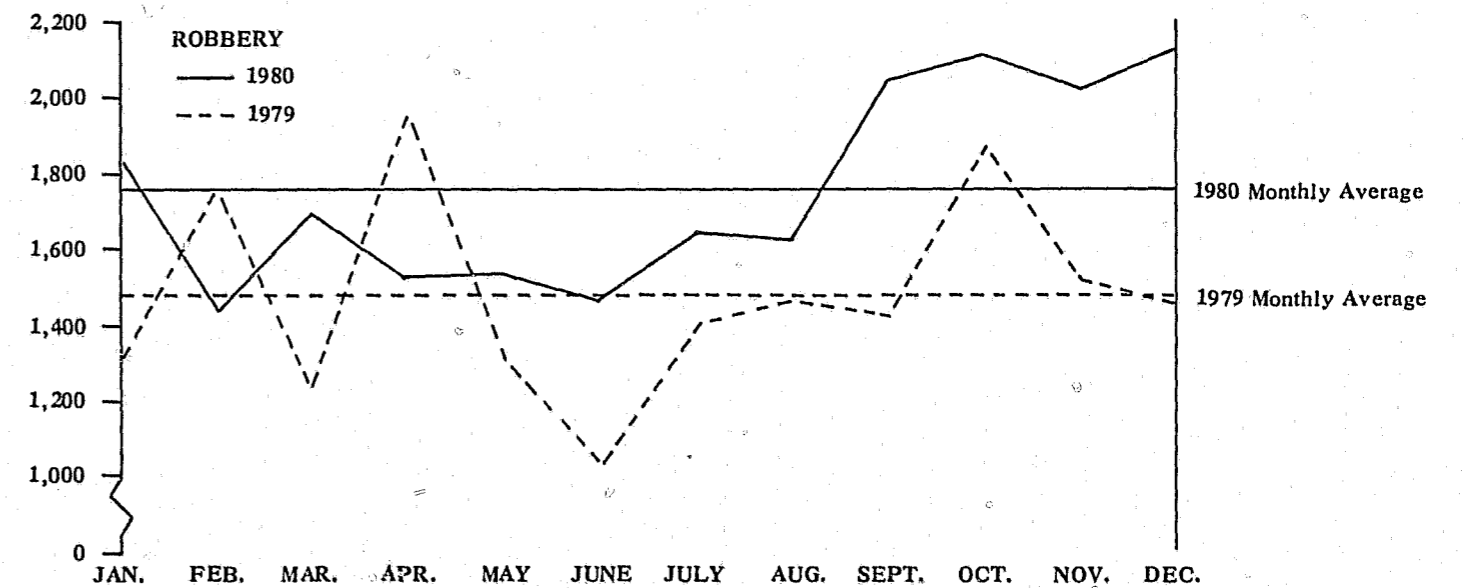

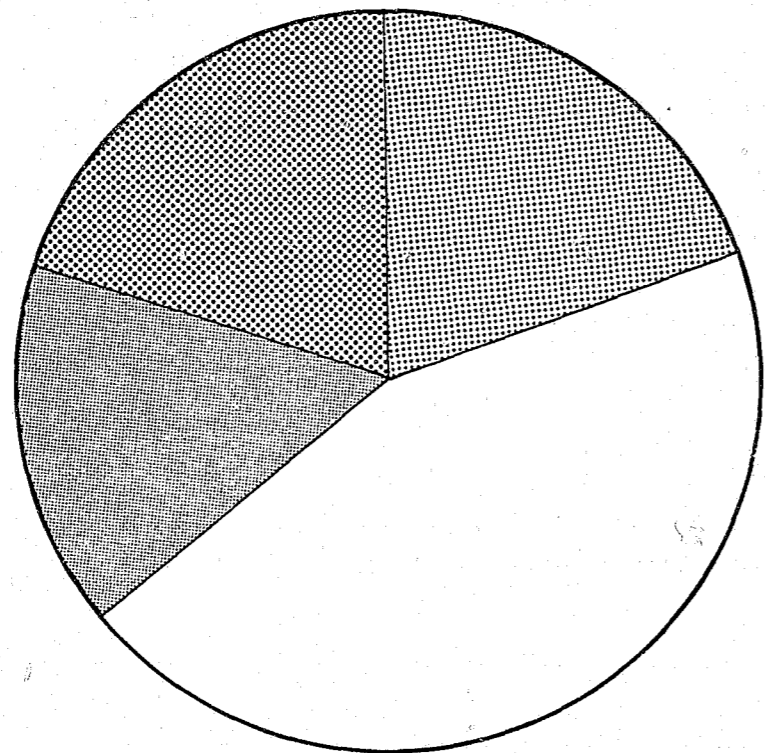

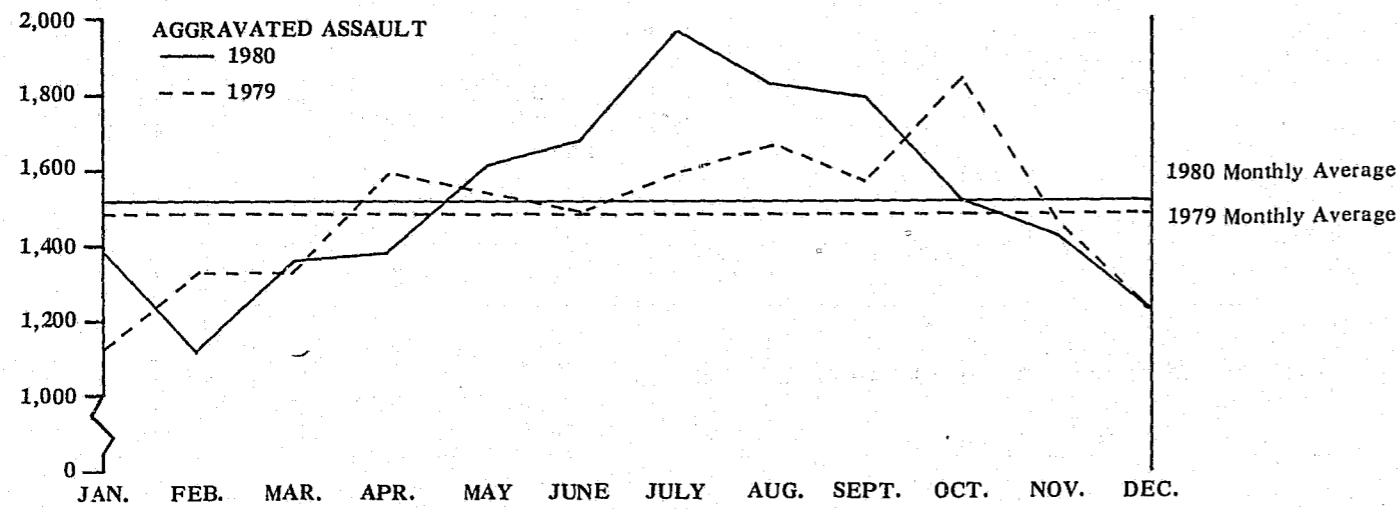

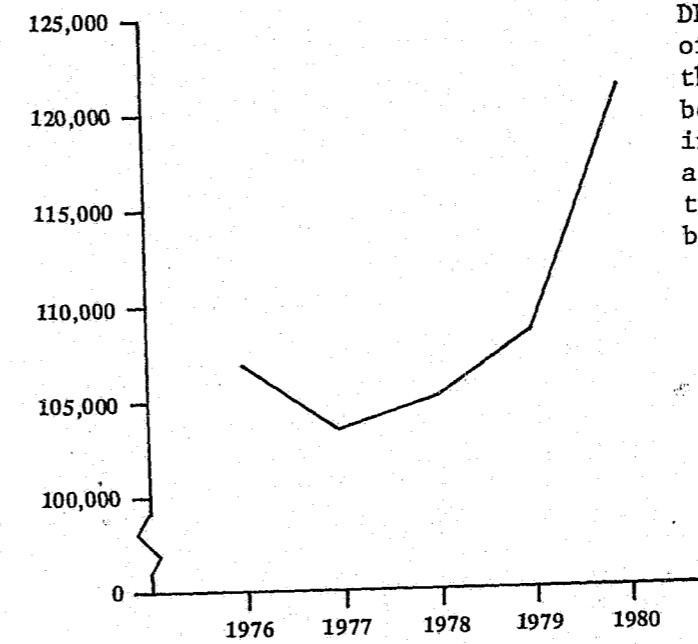

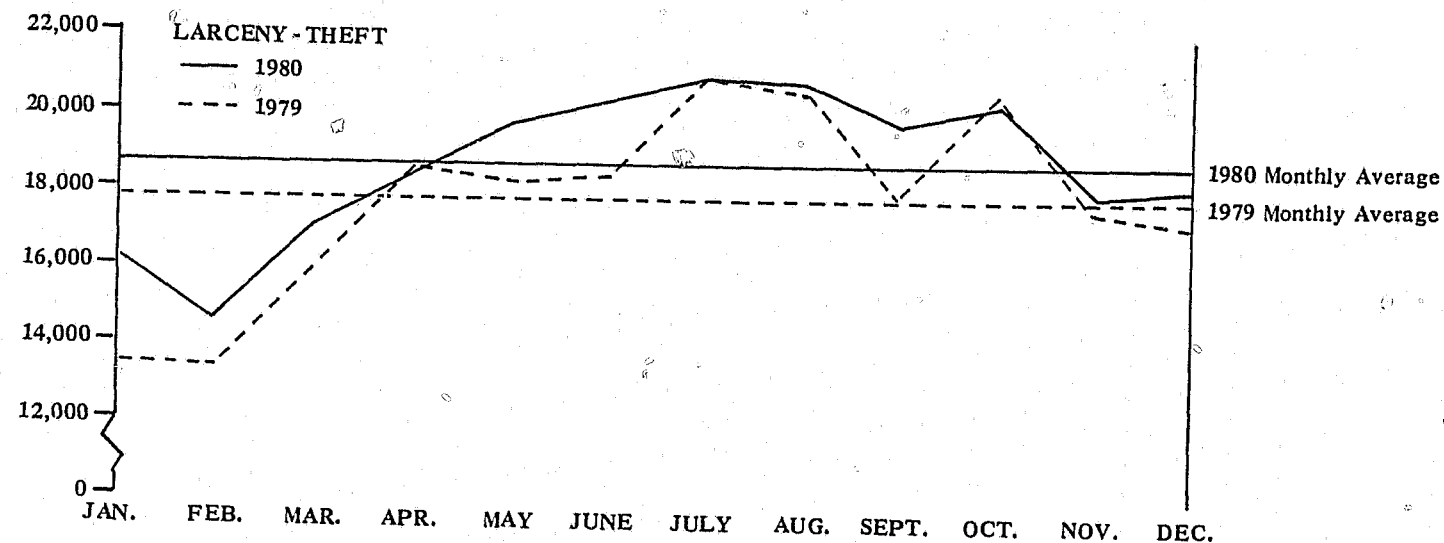

The total value stolen in larceny-theft increased by 26.3 percent to \$58,765,473 from the \$46,542,627 of last year. The average value stolen in larceny-theft gained 20.2 percent from \$218 last year to \$262. Shoplifting showed the highest percent of increases in total dollars stolen (55.4 percent) and average value stolen (51.8 percent).

MONTHLY VARIATION OF LARCENY-THEFT

Monthly totals of Larceny-theft varied from a low of 14,667 in February to a high of 20,912 in July. All months showed increases over last year's figures except April and October.



LARCENY-THEFT ARRESTS

There were 46,333 persons arrested this year for committing Larceny-theft. This is a 0.1 percent drop from the 46,368 persons arrested last year. The Larceny-theft Arrest Rate was 391.7.

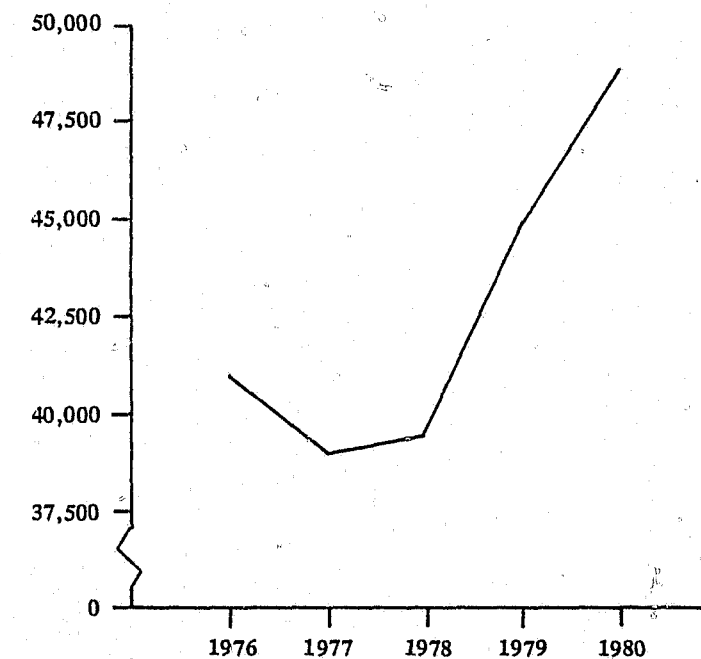

Specifically excluded is the temporary use when the vehicle is actually returned by the user, and lawful access to the vehicle has been granted or can be assumed.

SUMMARY

There were 49,085 Motor Vehicle Thefts reported to Pennsylvania Police Departments, an average of 134 each day or one every 10 minutes and 44 seconds. This is an increase of 8.4 percent over the 45,290 reported last year and a new peak in Pennsylvania UCR Reporting. Motor Vehicle Theft represented 11.1 percent of the Crime Index and 12.3 percent of the Property Crime Index. The Motor Vehicle Theft Rate was 415.0.

This year 13.1 percent or 6,413 Motor Vehicle Thefts were cleared, both figures decreasing from 15.3 percent or 6,939 last year.

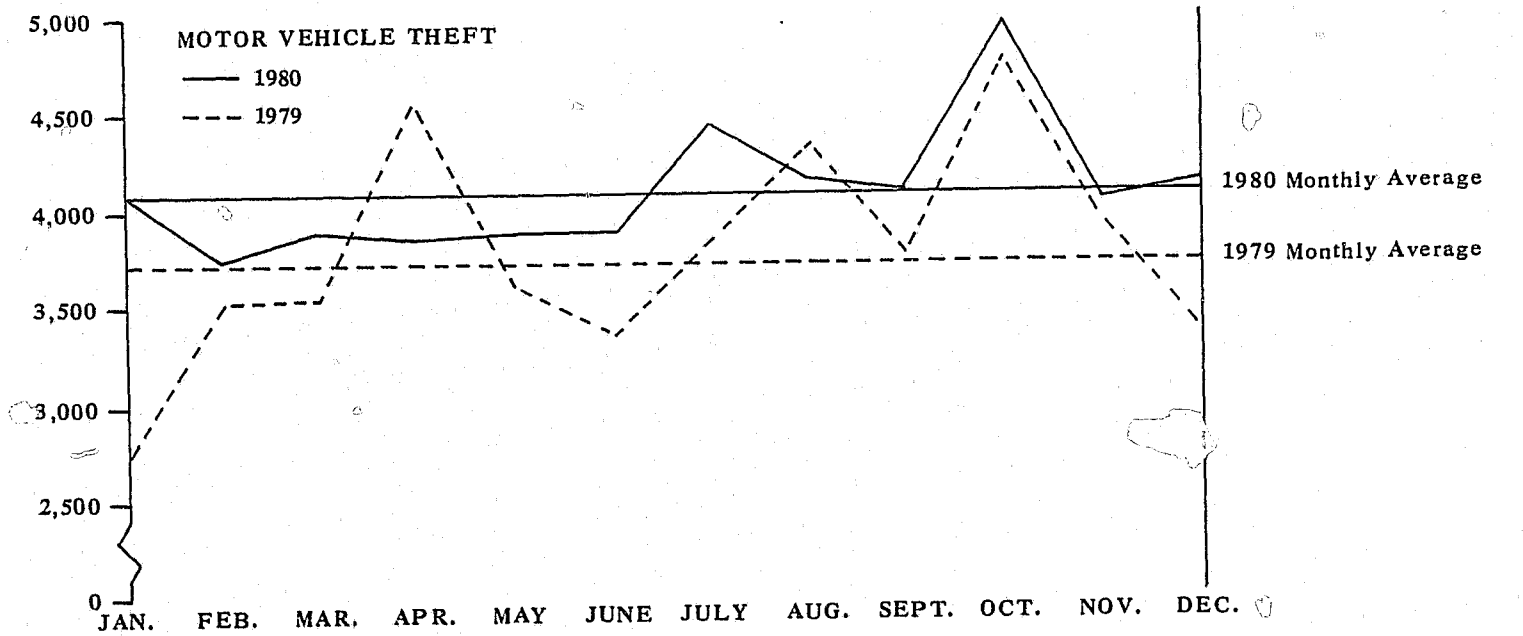

RECOVERY RATE

32,145 stolen motor vehicles or 65.5 percent of all stolen motor vehicles were recovered for the jurisdiction from which they were stolen. This represents a gain of 9.7 percent from 29,299 motor vehicles recovered last year. Police recovered 23,082 or 71.8 percent locally and 9,063 or 28.2 percent were recovered by other police jurisdictions for the local jurisdiction.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Monthly totals of Motor Vehicle Theft varied from a low of 3,721 in February to a high of 4,941 in October. All but two months showed increases over last year's figures.



MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT ARRESTS

There were 6,376 persons arrested this year for committing Motor Vehicle Theft. This is a 6.6 percent increase over the 5,982 persons arrested last year. The Motor Vehicle Theft Arrest Rate was 53.9.

An analysis of Motor Vehicle Theft arrestees is as follows: Male, 94.8 percent and Female, 5.1 percent; under age 18, 48.3 percent and under age 25, 84.2 percent; White, 52.6 percent and Black, 47.2 percent.

CRIME INDEX OFFENSES
ARSON
PENNSYLVANIA

DEFINITION: Arson includes any willful or malicious burning, or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling, house, church, public building, motor vehicle, vessel, aircraft, personal property of another, crops, trees, woods, meadows, etc.

Arson is now classified in the National Uniform Crime Reporting Program as a Crime Index Offense, and data has been collected and published as such throughout the nation. However, Arson has been collected as a Part II crime since the inception of our State program. For the sake of preserving historical data, arson will continue to be collected on Return A as well as on Return G.

The data collected through Return G will be used in the analysis of Crime Index Arson. The number of arson offenses reported on this form will be greater than the offenses reported on Return A because all arsons, ignoring the hierarchy rule, are reported on Return G.

For those persons unfamiliar with the hierarchy rule, the rule states that if two or more offenses are committed by a person or a group of persons at the same time only the most serious offense is reported on Return A. For example, if an arson is committed that results in a person being burned to death in the fire, the offense would be reported as murder on Return A. However, the arson would be reported on Return G.

This year there were 5,087 arsons reported on Return G. This figure is 111 or 2.2 percent greater than the 4,976 arsons reported on Return A outlined in Table 1. As a matter of fact, arson resulted in the murder of 10 persons this year. These arsons are recorded as murder on Return A.

The 5,087 arsons reported represents an average of 14 each day or one each 1 hour and 46 minutes. The Arson Index Rate was 43.0. 5,087 Arsons represent a decrease of 0.3 percent from 5,100 reported last year, even though hierarchical arson increased by 4.4 percent to 4,976 from 4,765.

The total property damage for Arson this year was \$78,432,107, a 39.2 percent increase from \$56,330,039 last year. This is a tremendous amount for one state alone. It is surpassed only by property value loss for motor vehicle thefts and burglary. The average value of an arson this year was \$15,418, 39.6 percent over the \$11,045 last year. Practically all property classifications showed increases in value of property damage.

As outlined in the table, Characteristics of Arson by Property Classifications, 3,331 or 65.5 percent of arsons involved structures, 30.1 percent or 1,529, mobile property and 4.5 percent or 227 other arsons such as crops, timber, etc. Of the 3,331 structure arsons, 618 or 18.6 percent involved uninhabited or abandoned structures not in normal use. The Arson Clearance Rate was 17.6 percent or 896 clearances.

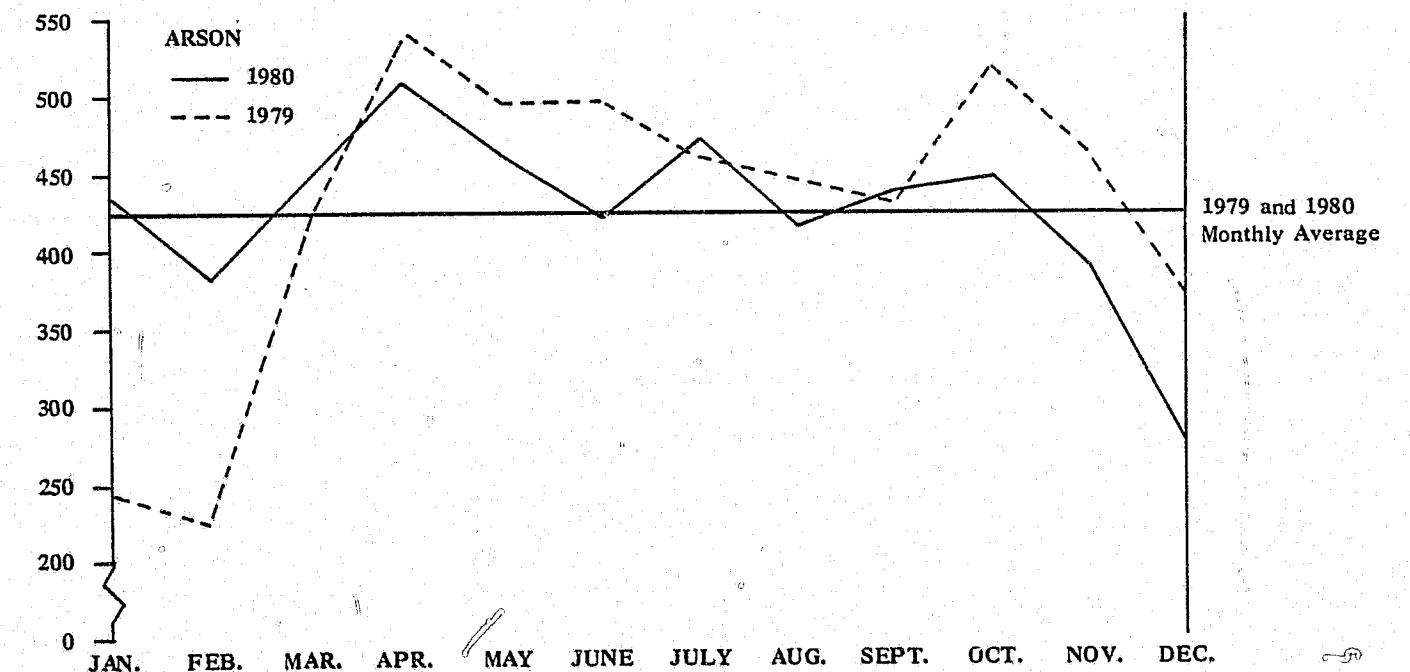

ARSON ARRESTS

Arson arrests, collected under the hierarchy rule, totaled 1,004 this year, a decline of 6.2 percent from 1,070 arrested for Arson last year. The Arson Arrest Rate was 8.5.

Arson arrestees were primarily young adults and juveniles. 49.8 percent were under 18 years old and 74.7 percent were under 25 years old.

A high proportion of Arson arrestees were Males, 87.4 percent. 74.7 percent were White and 25.1 percent were Black.

PART II OFFENSES

PART II OFFENSE DISTRIBUTION

Pennsylvania is one of the few states which has a UCR Program that collects Part II Offenses. This year, 483,989 Part II Offenses were reported by Pennsylvania police agencies, an increase of 0.2 percent over last year's total of 483,209 (Table 1). Throughout this discussion, arson offenses have been omitted from last year's total Part II Offenses for comparison purposes.

While there are eighteen distinct Part II Offense categories, over 90 percent of the offenses reported were in only eight categories. These eight offenses, summarized in the following table, can be considered to be the "leaders" among Part II Offenses in volume and rate per 100,000 population.

TREND

As a group, Part II Offenses increased by 0.2 percent from 483,209 to 483,989. The offenses registering the largest percentage increases were embezzlement and all other offenses. Embezzlement rose from 46 offenses to 115, a gain of 150.0 percent, while all other offenses increased 13.0 percent from 78,090 offenses to 88,256.

The offense showing the biggest decline from last year was vagrancy. Reported offenses declined from 1,287 to 1,008, a decrease of 21.7 percent.

CLEARANCES

This year 296,281 or 61.2 percent of Part II Offenses were cleared. This compares with a 60.8 percent clearance rate for last year.

Extremely high clearance rates (over 95 percent) were achieved for four Part II Offenses: gambling, driving under the influence, liquor law violations and drunkenness.

On the other hand, a very low clearance rate of 12.6 percent was attained for vandalism, the largest Part II Offense in volume.

In general, the Part II Offenses with the highest clearance rates were those which are usually observed at the time of commission.

PART II OFFENSES BY COMMON HUMAN SERVICE REGIONS (CHSR)

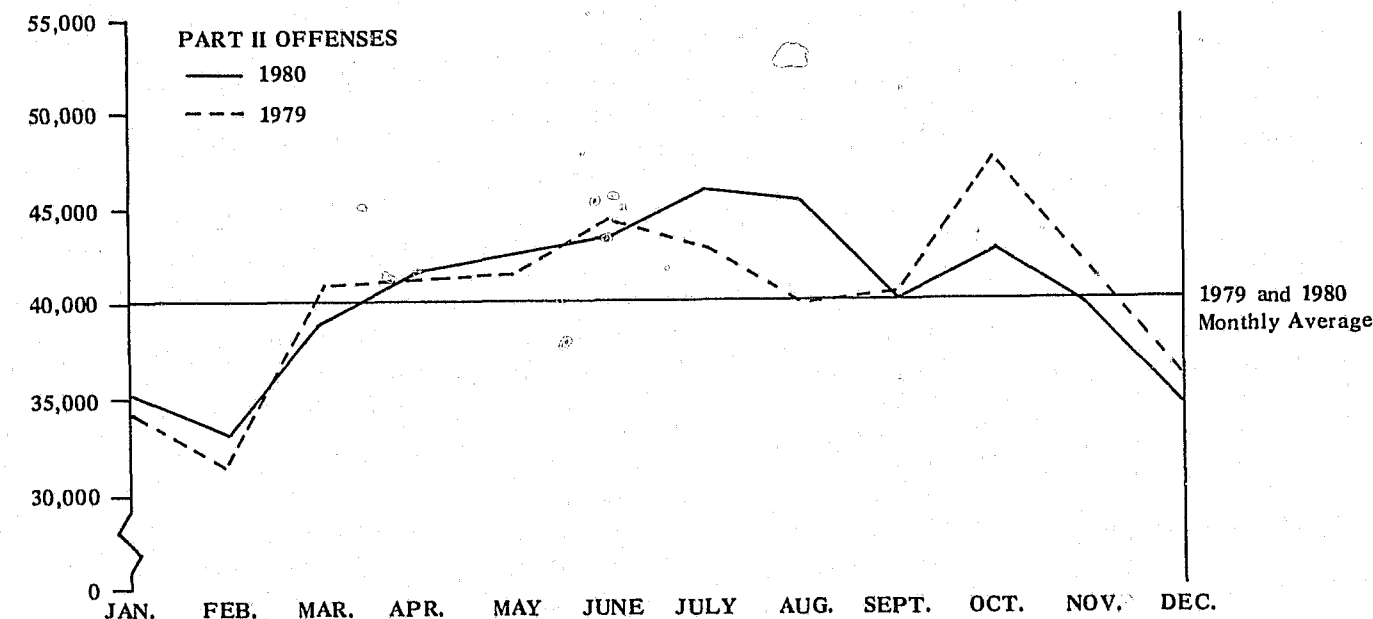
PART II OFFENSES BY STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS (SMSA)

An inspection of Table 4 indicates a range in Part II Offense Rates per 100,000 population from 5,092.7 in the Philadelphia SMSA, to a low of 3,125.2 in the Johnstown SMSA.

The Part II Offense Rates for core cities within SMSA's except for the Philadelphia SMSA were higher than the rates for their suburban areas. Some extreme examples are Easton at 8,841.9 or 3.4 times its suburban rate of 2,625.7; and Harrisburg, 10,398.6 against 3,685.7 or 2.8 times.

MONTHLY VARIATIONS OF PART II OFFENSES

In the following chart, Part II Offense totals are plotted by month of occurrence. Additionally, the average monthly figures are shown on the chart as reference points.



In January, February and December of this year, monthly totals were substantially below the year's average, with February the low point for the year. The months of April through October, except for September, were all above the average, with July the maximum for the year. The monthly average for Part II offenses was essentially the same as last year.

SUMMARY OF ARRESTS FOR PART II OFFENSES

This year there were 284,561* arrests made for Part II Offenses in Pennsylvania (Table 11). This figure represented a 0.9 percent decrease from last year's total of 287,218 Part II arrests and was the equivalent of an arrest rate of 2,405.8 per 100,000 population.

Arrests rose for twelve Part II Offense categories, with increases ranging from 64.3 percent for embezzlement to 0.3 percent for weapons offenses. Arrests for six Part II Offenses declined. The decreases ranged from 0.3 percent for prostitution and commercialized vice to 38.7 percent for family offenses.

ARRESTS BY OFFENSE CATEGORY

Over two-thirds of all Part II Offense arrests were made in just four offense categories. These offenses were liquor law violations, 54,390 arrests, or 19.1 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 459.8; disorderly conduct, 59,004 arrests, 20.7 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 498.8; drunkenness, 43,880 arrests, 15.4 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 371.0; and all other offenses, 40,339, or 14.2 percent of the total, with an arrest rate of 341.0.

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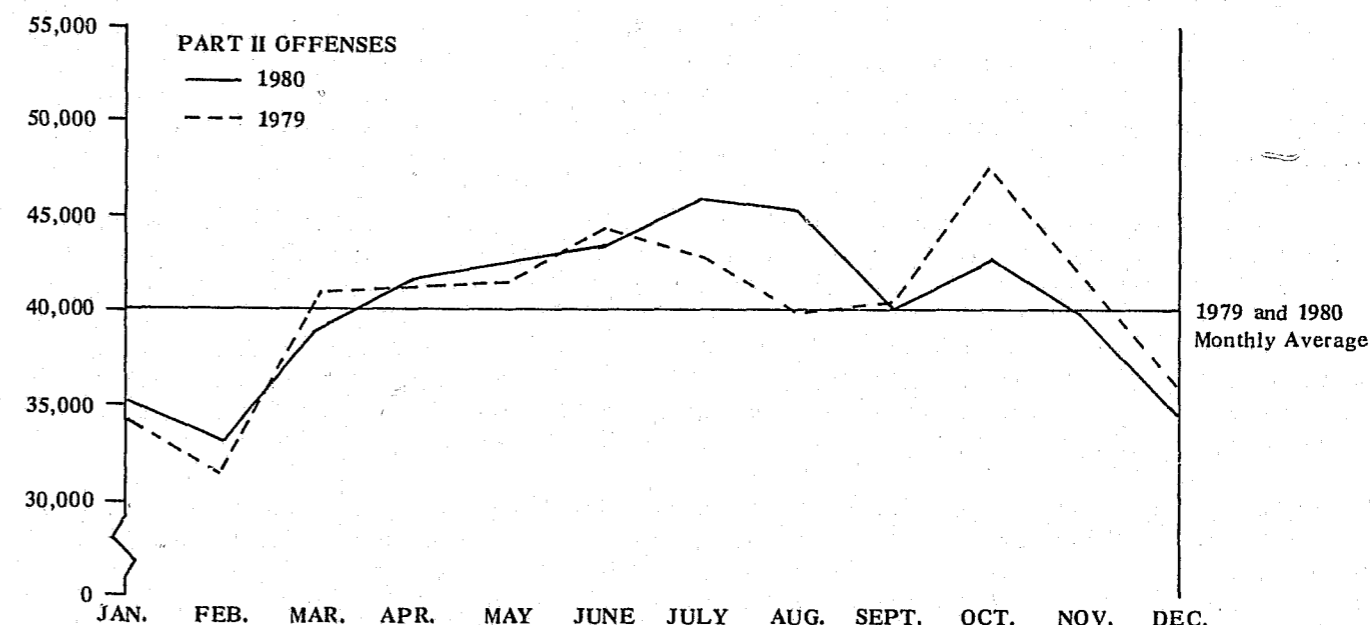

PART II OFFENSE ARRESTS BY AGE

The distribution of Part II Offense arrests (Table 12) by broad age categories was as follows: juveniles (persons under 18 years of age) 68,022, or 23.9 percent; young adults under 25 years of age, 188,978, or 66.4 percent; and remaining adults (persons 25 or older) 95,583, or 33.6 percent.

Juvenile arrests decreased 7.4 percent from last year's 73,444, while young adult arrests decreased 1.1 percent from last year's total of 191,101, and arrests of remaining adults were 0.8 percent below the 96,344 last year.

Juveniles accounted for the majority of arrests for only one Part II Offense: vandalism, 53.3 percent. Other Part II Offenses which had substantial proportions of juvenile arrestees were drug abuse (possession of marijuana), 41.8 percent; and liquor law violations, 39.0 percent.

Young adults accounted for substantial proportions of arrests for the following categories: liquor law violations, 59.8 percent; prostitution and commercialized vice, 61.2 percent; vagrancy, 52.6 percent; disorderly conduct, 50.4 percent; total drug abuse violations, 40.8 percent; and stolen property, 40.5 percent.

Adults, 25 or older accounted for half or more of the arrestees in the following categories: gambling, 87.8 percent; drunkenness, 68.6 percent; driving under the influence, 65.3 percent; embezzlement, 65.2 percent; fraud, 57.3 percent; and drug abuse (opium-cocaine) sale or manufacture, 56.7 percent.

More than four-fifths of all juvenile arrests were made for the following four offenses: liquor law violations, 31.2 percent; all other offenses, 19.2 percent; disorderly conduct, 17.5 percent; and vandalism, 14.8 percent.

More than half of all arrests of young adults were made for liquor law violations, 28.4 percent, and disorderly conduct, 22.0 percent.

Nearly two-thirds of arrests of adults 25 or older were accounted for by drunkenness, 31.5 percent, disorderly conduct, 18.2 percent, and driving under the influence, 13.2 percent.

PART II OFFENSE ARRESTS BY SEX

This year, 247,117 persons arrested or 86.8 percent of the total, were males (Table 13). This was a decrease of 2.0 percent from the 252,205 males arrested last year. There were 37,444 females arrested this year, or 6.9 percent more than the 35,013 in the previous year.

Persons arrested were predominantly male in all but one Part II Offense category. The exception was prostitution and commercialized vice, where 72.9 percent of the arrestees were females.

Over two-thirds of the males arrested fell into four offense categories: liquor law violations, 18.8 percent; disorderly conduct, 21.0 percent; drunkenness, 16.5 percent; and all other offenses, 13.5 percent.

PART II OFFENSE ARRESTS BY RACE

The breakdown by race of persons arrested for Part II Offenses (Table 14), was as follows: White, 229,275 or 80.6 percent; Black, 54,839 or 19.3 percent; Other Races, 447 or 0.2 percent.

Arrests of Whites increased 1.1 percent from last year's total of 226,814, while arrests of Blacks fell 5.8 percent below last year's 58,200. Other Races decreased 79.7 percent below last year's 2,204.*

Whites comprised the majority of persons arrested for most Part II Offenses, ranging from 97.6 percent of liquor law violations to 52.2 percent for sale of opium-cocaine. Offenses for which arrestees were predominantly Black were numbers-gambling, 69.9 percent; prostitution and commercialized vice, 68.5 percent; other gambling, 56.6 percent; possession of weapons, 55.5 percent; and possession of opium-cocaine, 52.9 percent.

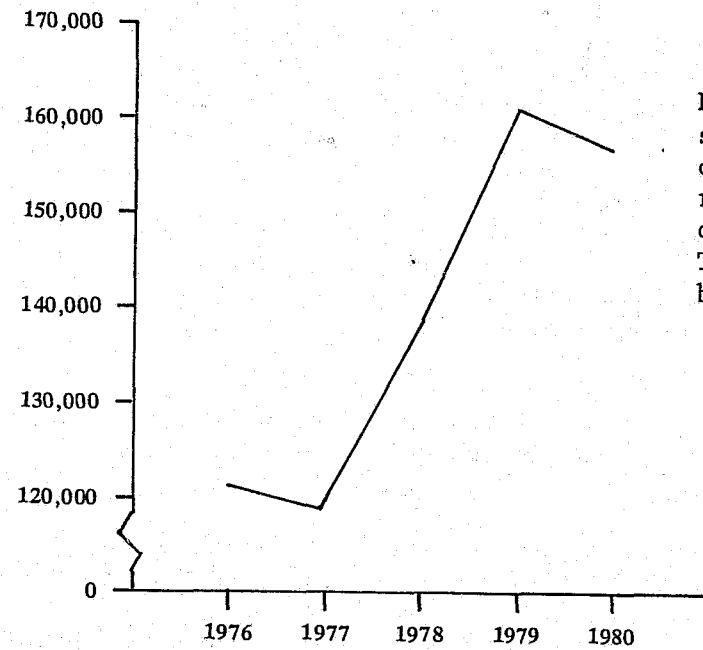
Over two-thirds of Whites were arrested for four offenses: liquor law violations, 23.2 percent; disorderly conduct, 21.9 percent; drunkenness, 12.7 percent; and all other offenses, 13.5 percent.

Almost three-fifths of Blacks were arrested for three offenses: drunkenness, 26.7 percent; all other offenses, 17.1 percent; and disorderly conduct, 16.0 percent.

Over two-thirds of the arrests made of persons of other races were for drunkenness, 19.2 percent; disorderly conduct, 24.8 percent; all other offenses, 14.1 percent; and driving under the influence, 11.4 percent.

* A decrease in "Other Races" figure may be due to the new classifications of race used this year.

VANDALISM



DEFINITION: Vandalism is the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control. This offense covers a wide range of malicious behavior directed at property.

There were 155,665 offenses of vandalism reported to Pennsylvania Police Departments this year. This is a decrease of 3.5 percent over last year's total of 161,232. 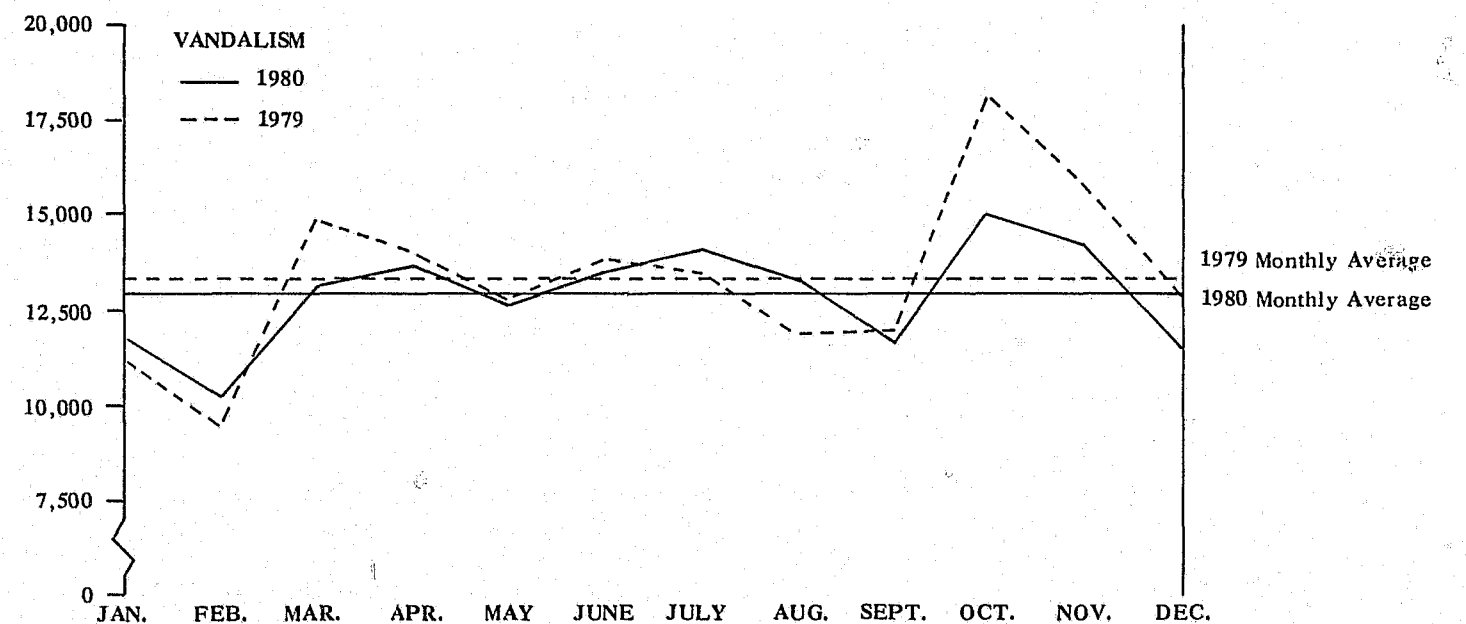

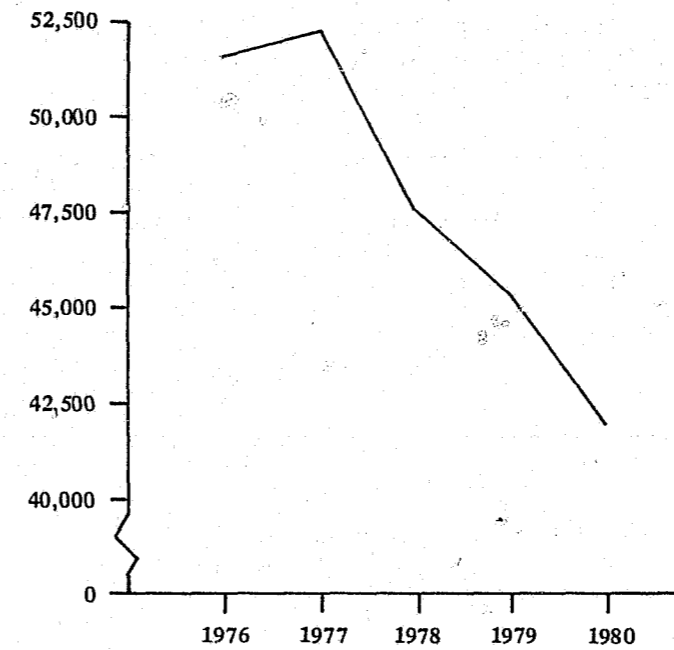

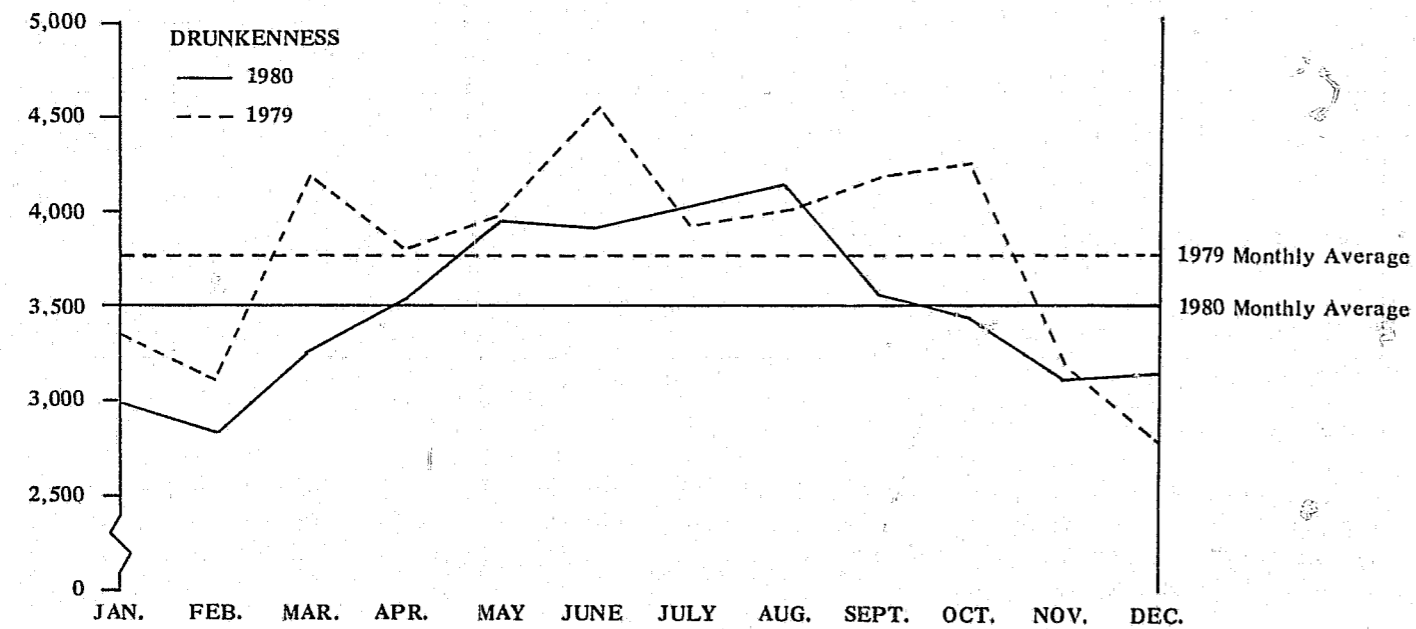

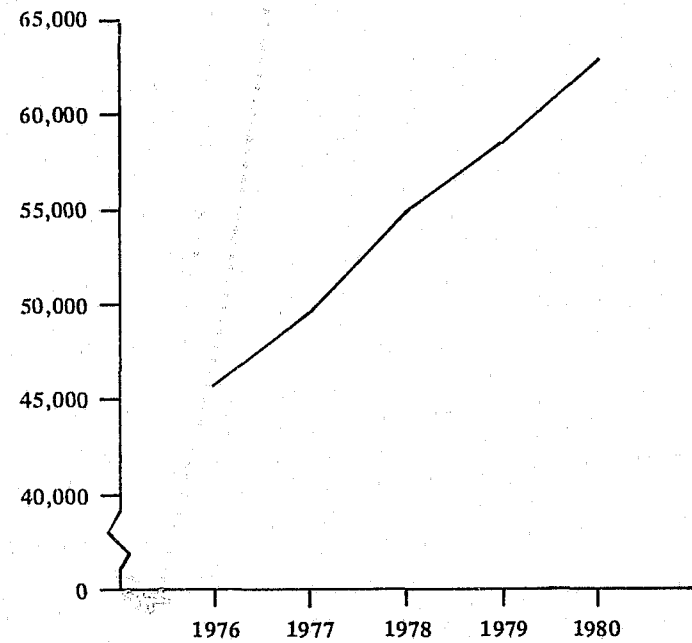

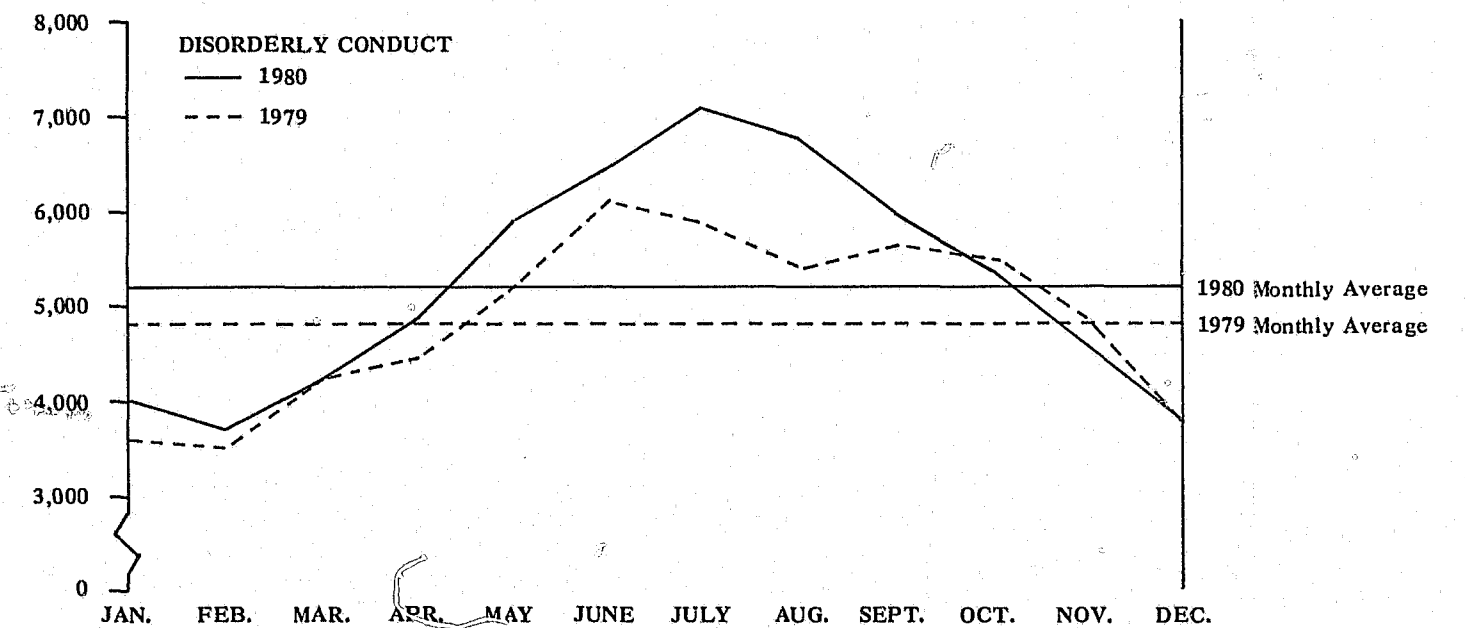

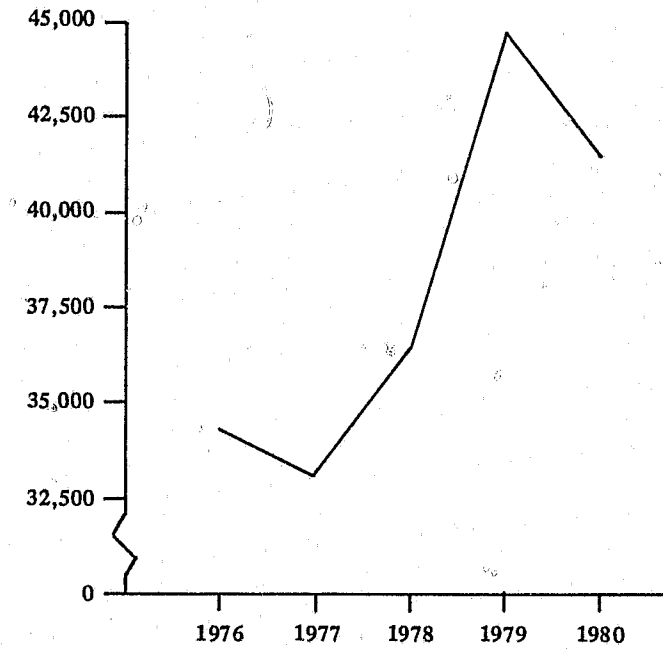

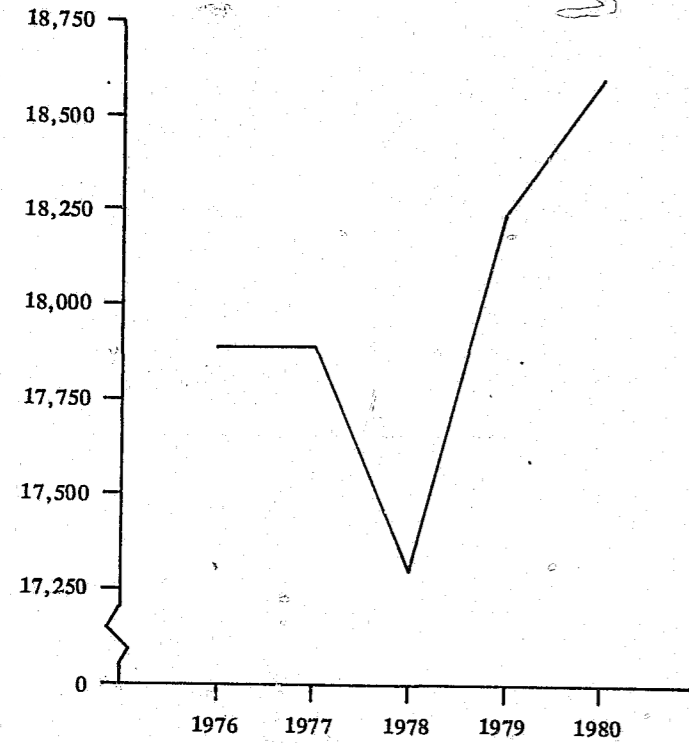

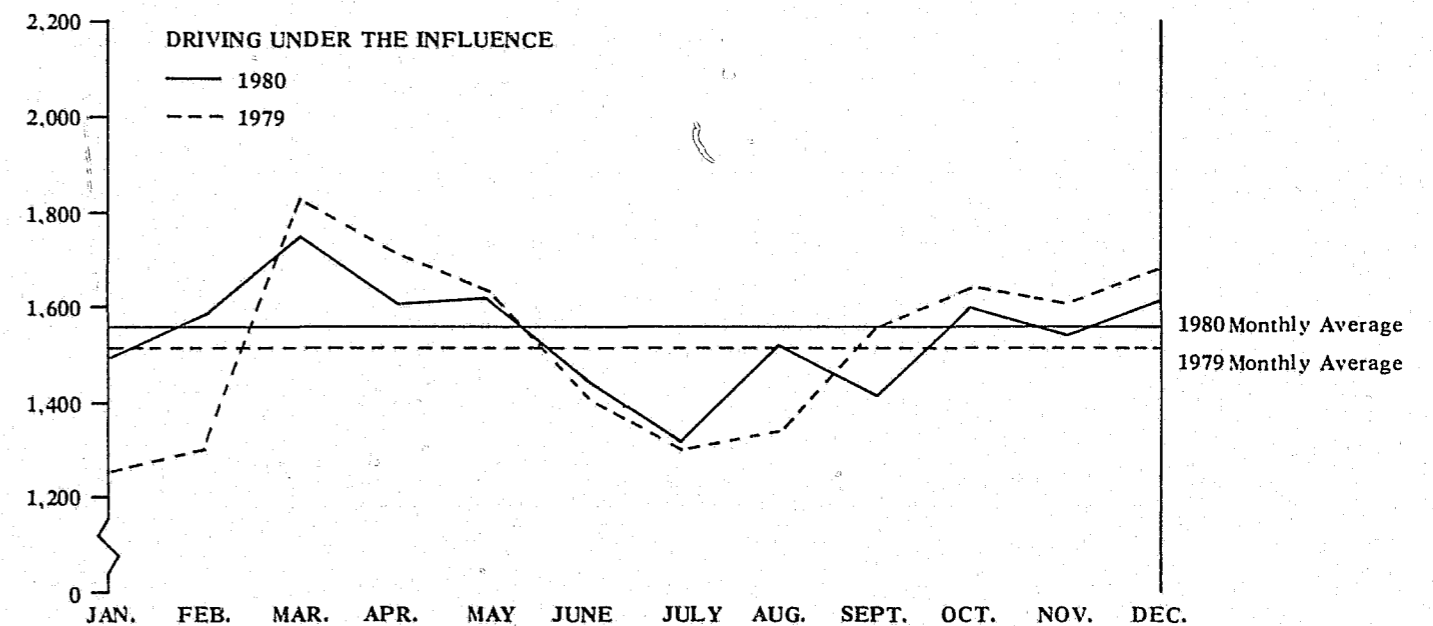

PERSONS CHARGED AND DISPOSITIONS

The collection of data of persons arrested and formally charged, plus the subsequent dispositions, is an important tool in the records-keeping process for the modern police administrator. This collection offers an insight into the effectiveness of a department with regard to the quality of police investigation, case preparation, and court presentation toward the successful prosecution of the criminal element.

PERSONS CHARGED

There were 353,670 persons arrested and charged with criminal offenses this year. Physical arrests resulted in charges against 205,254 persons or 58.0 percent. Criminal citations were issued to 148,416 persons or 42.0 percent.

Of the 87,714 persons charged with Crime Index Offenses, 69,563 or 79.3 percent were arrested and arraigned, while 18,151 or 20.7 percent received citations. A total of 20,109 Violent Crime offenders were charged this year. Physical arrests of Violent Crime offenders totaled 19,466 or 96.8 percent, and citations were issued to 643 Violent Crime offenders or 3.2 percent. Property Crime offenders were charged in 67,605 incidents. Physical arrests of Property Crime offenders occurred in 50,097 cases or 74.1 percent, and citations were issued to 17,508 Property Crime offenders or 25.9 percent. This latter group was composed primarily of larceny-theft offenders, arrested for "summary offenses", such as shoplifting.

Part II offenders charged amounted to 265,782 persons. Physical arrests and arraignments took place in 135,532 cases or 51.0 percent, and citations were issued to 130,250 individuals or 49.0 percent. A review indicates that citations were issued to 80.5 percent of persons charged with liquor law violations and to the majority of persons charged with fraud, vandalism, disorderly conduct, vagrancy or all other offenses.

DISPOSITIONS

The 260,597 dispositions represent 73.7 percent of the 353,670 persons charged this year. This difference is partly due to dispositions of charges from prior years and pending dispositions from persons charged this year.

Overall, 144,151 persons or 55.3 percent were found guilty of the offense charged; 9,280 or 3.6 percent, guilty of a lesser offense; 67,524 or 25.9 percent, acquitted or dismissed; and 39,642 or 15.2 percent, referred to Juvenile Court.

Dispositions of Crime Index offenders were distributed as follows: 27,244 or 37.9 percent were guilty as charged; 4,564 or 6.4 percent, guilty of a lesser offense; 15,718 or 21.9 percent, acquitted or dismissed; 24,325 or 33.9 percent, referred to Juvenile Court. However, 57.3 percent of adults prosecuted for Crime Index Offenses were found guilty of the offense charged, and 9.6 percent were found guilty of a lesser offense. Murder (52.6 percent) and larceny-theft (51.6 percent) had the highest rates of conviction among the Crime Index Offenses. Rape (45.6 percent) and aggravated assault (43.5 percent) had the highest rates of acquittals or dismissals among Crime Index Offenses. High rates among Crime Index Offenses for juveniles referred to Juvenile Court were reported for motor vehicle theft (68.0 percent) and burglary (48.1 percent). Of note, the acquittal-dismissal rate for Violent Crime was 36.9 percent as opposed to a 16.1 percent acquittal-dismissal rate for Property Crime.

The dispositions of persons charged with Part II Offenses were distributed as follows: 116,809 or 61.9 percent were guilty as charged; 4,701 or 2.5 percent, guilty of a lesser offense; 51,771 or 27.5 percent, acquitted or dismissed; 15,297 or 8.1 percent, referred to Juvenile Court.

The highest conviction rates for persons charged with Part II Offenses were reported for liquor law violations (89.7 percent) and disorderly conduct (84.0 percent). High dismissal rates were reported for prostitution and commercialized vice (79.2 percent), gambling (78.9 percent) and drunkenness (72.2 percent). Drunkenness acquittal rates are influenced by the practice in some areas of apprehending individuals for drunkenness for their own safety and releasing them when they have regained sobriety.

JUVENILES

In addition to the 39,642 or 11.2 percent juveniles charged and subsequently referred to Juvenile Court, 39,518 or 11.2 percent were charged as adults, even though they were under 18 years old. This latter group represents youths apprehended generally for summary offenses, such as shoplifting, teen-age drinking, vandalism, or disorderly conduct. Included in the category of persons charged and involved in criminal judicial proceedings this year were 79,160 juveniles, 22.4 percent of the total.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE DATA

Annual reports from 998 police departments, including the Pennsylvania State Police, indicated a total of 26,749 full-time law enforcement employees in Pennsylvania as of October 31, 1980 (See table below and Figure M). Full-time police officers made up 86.4 percent of police departments and civilian employees 13.6 percent of this total. Statewide there were 2.3 full-time employees - 2.0 officers and 0.3 civilians - per 1,000 population.

The 995 local police jurisdictions (State total less Pennsylvania State Police, Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board and Pennsylvania Office of Drug Law Enforcement) accounted for 21,713 full-time law enforcement employees, or 81 percent of the State total. Eighty-eight percent or 19,113 of these 21,713 local police agency employees were full-time officers and 2,600 or 12 percent were civilians.

More than half of the police departments reporting to the Pennsylvania UCR Program (546 out of 998) employed less than six full-time officers (See following table). Ninety-two percent (921) of the departments reported 25 or fewer full-time officers; while at the other end of the scale, only 6 departments - less than 1 percent of the total - employed more than 200.

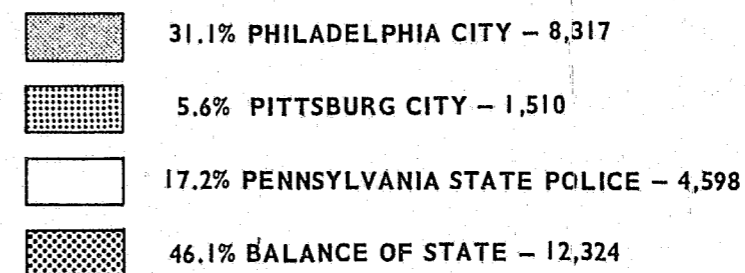
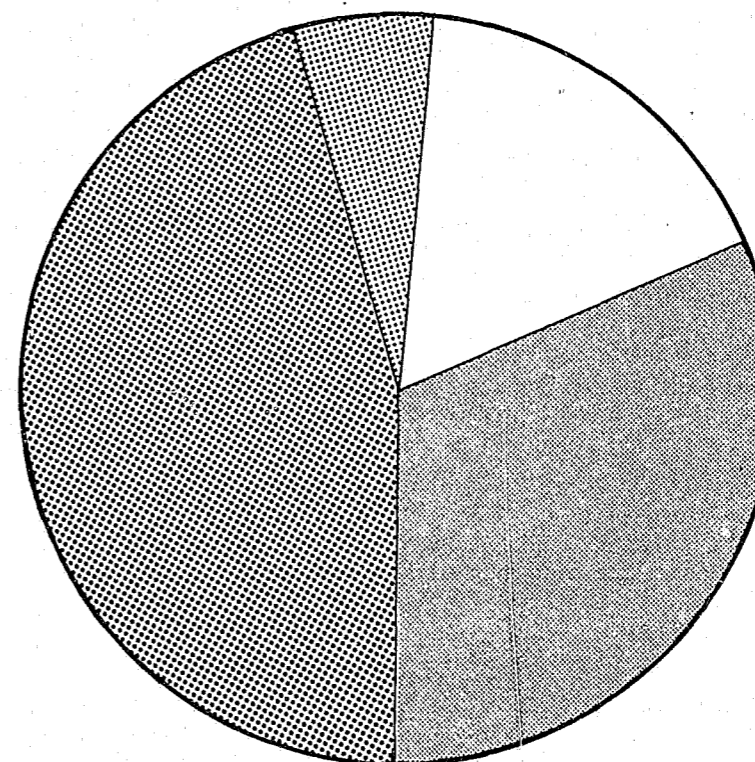

The City of Philadelphia had the greatest number of full-time law enforcement employees. This city alone employed 8,317 full-time law enforcement personnel, 31 percent of the State total.

Ninety percent of the reported 26,749 full-time law enforcement personnel were males, while 10 percent were females (See following table). Females represented only three percent of the full-time police officers, but 55 percent of the civilian employees were women.

On a geographic basis, 84 percent of the 21,713 full-time local department police employees and 84 percent of the 19,113 full-time local department police officers were located in 15 counties (See following table). Ten of these 15 counties contained at least one local police department which ranked among the top 15 in police employment as shown in the preceding table.

DEATHS OF AND ASSAULTS ON PENNSYLVANIA LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

This year, seven Pennsylvania law enforcement officers were feloniously killed while performing their official duties. Over the ten-year period, 1971-1980 inclusive, 40 Pennsylvania police officers have been murdered in the line of duty. In addition, there was a police officer killed in the line of duty this year in a traffic accident.

Pennsylvania's law enforcement agencies reported 3,519 assaults on police officers this year (Table 16), a 8.9 percent decrease from last year's total. This was the equivalent of 15.4 assaults per 100 full-time officers. Among population groups, the highest assault rates, 28.6 and 22.1 were experienced by the State's two largest cities, Pittsburgh and Philadelphia. Philadelphia alone accounted for 47 percent of the reported assaults. At the other end of the scale, the rate for the Pennsylvania State Police, sheriffs, and other county police, was only 2.0 assaults per 100 full-time officers.

Injuries were sustained by 34 percent of the law enforcement officers assaulted this year. While slightly over one Philadelphia and Pittsburgh City policeman in five (22 percent) assaulted was injured, the injury percentages for all other population groups ranged from 41 to 73.

In the entire state, there were 1,213 assaults with injury reported, for a rate of 5.3 per 100 full-time officers. In a comparison of population groups, municipalities of 25,000 - 50,000 population had the highest rate, 9.2, while the Pennsylvania State Police had the lowest, 0.8 assaults with injury per 100 full-time officers.

Statewide, 97 percent of the assaults on police officers were cleared by arrests. Clearance rates, by population group, ranged from 77 percent for sheriffs and other county police to 98 percent for the City of Philadelphia. Five of the nine population groups had clearance rates of 95 percent or higher.

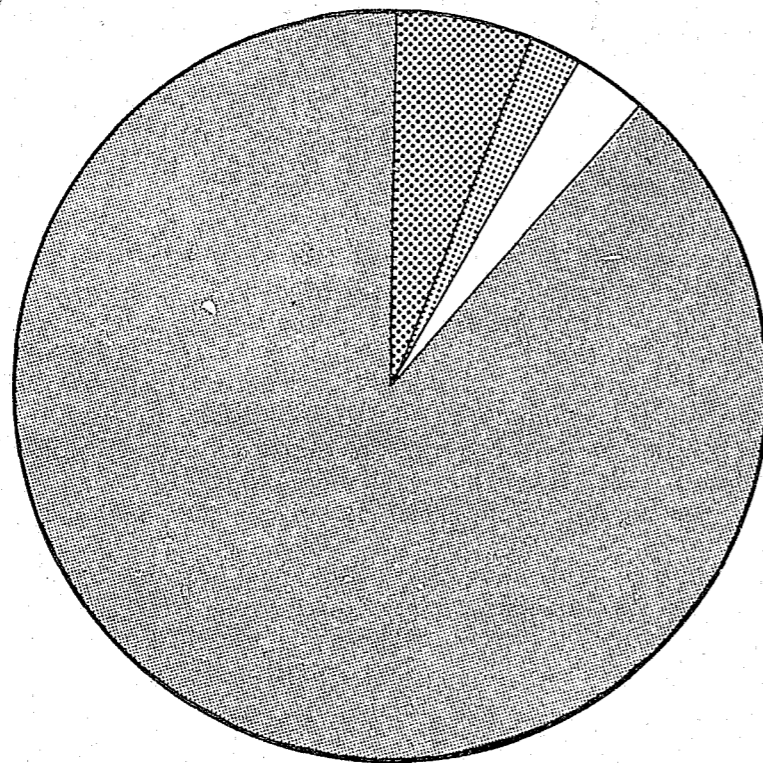
Personal weapons (hands, fists, feet, etc.) were employed in 88 percent of the assaults on Pennsylvania police officers this year (Table 17, Figure N). Six percent of the assaults were committed with dangerous weapons other than firearms or cutting instruments, while firearms and knives or other cutting instruments were the weapons of commission in three percent and two percent of the attacks, respectively.

Assaults with deadly weapons other than firearms or cutting instruments produced the highest rate of personal injury. Fifty-three percent of the officers attacked with these weapons were injured (Table 18). Assaults with personal weapons resulted in injury 34 percent of the time, while the injury rates for knives or other cutting instruments or firearms were 30 and 23 percent, respectively.

Thirty-eight percent of the assaults happened while officers were responding to disturbance calls (Table 19). An additional 22 percent were committed on officers attempting other arrests.* Officers engaged in the handling, transporting, or custody of prisoners were the victims in 15 percent of the assaults.

*At the time of assault, the officer was making or attempting to make an arrest for an offense other than disturbance call, burglary, robbery, civil disorder or traffic.

OFFICERS BY TYPE OF WEAPON USED







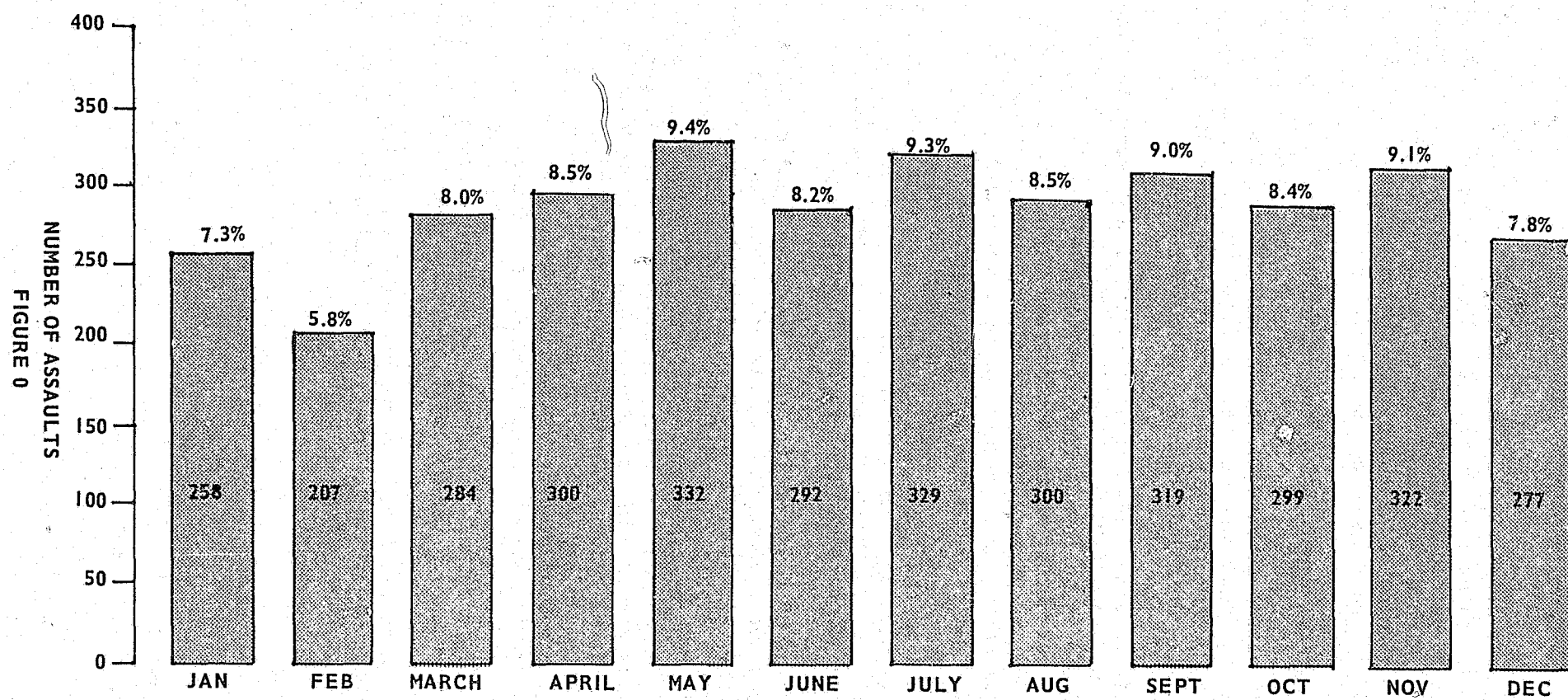

Thirty-eight percent of the 3,112 assaults with personal weapons took place while officers were responding to disturbance calls, 23 percent during attempts at other arrests, and 16 percent while handling or transporting prisoners. Twenty-six percent of the assaults with other dangerous weapons, 44 percent of assaults with firearms, and 51 percent of assaults with knives or other cutting instruments occurred while officers were responding to disturbance calls.

As mentioned earlier, 97 percent of the reported 3,519 assaults on Pennsylvania police officers were cleared by arrest. Clearance rates of 95 percent or more were reported for assaults occurring in the following five categories of police activity: responding to disturbance calls, robberies in progress or pursuing robbery suspects, attempting other arrests, handling or transporting prisoners and dealing with mentally deranged persons (Table 20).

Personal weapons, predominantly, were employed in the assaults which took place during most types of police activity (Table 21). Personal weapons were used to commit 97 percent of the assaults on officers while they were handling or transporting prisoners, and 92 percent of assaults occurring while the officers were attempting other arrests. The exception to the prevailing use of personal weapons occurred during ambushes of policemen, when personal weapons were used in only 13 percent of the assaults.

Eighty-one percent of the police officers were assigned to vehicle patrols at the time of assault (Table 22), either in one-man (45 percent) or two-man vehicles (36 percent). Four percent of the officers were on a detective or special assignment, and 15 percent were on other types of assignment.

Forty-three percent of the assaults on officers assigned to two-man vehicles were made while the officers were responding to disturbance calls, 19 percent occurred during the handling, transporting or custody of prisoners, and 16 percent while attempting other arrests (Table 23). Slightly more than two-thirds of the attacks on officers patrolling in one-man vehicles happened while they were either responding to disturbance calls (43 percent) or attempting other arrests (24 percent). Thirty-one percent of assaults on officers on other assignments occurred when they were handling or transporting prisoners. Twenty-four percent were committed while attempting other arrests, and 18 percent happened when officers were responding to disturbance calls. Forty-five percent of assaults on officers on detective or special assignment took place while they were attempting other arrests.

More assaults, 332, occurred in May than in any other month (Figure 0). Assaults were least frequent in the month of February, when 207 were reported.

Almost half (47 percent) of the reported assaults on police officers were committed between the hours of 8:01 P.M. and 2:00 A.M. (Table 24). Almost one in three occurred during the four-hour period of 8:01 P.M. to 12 Midnight.
