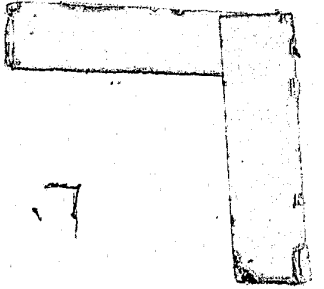

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DEDICATION

This report is dedicated to Alabama's law enforcement officers who protect and defend the citizens of this state.

In particular, we would like to honor the memory of Alabama's peace officers who lost their lives in the line of duty in 1981.

January: Patrolman George Claypoole, a Hurtsboro police officer, was killed while attempting to arrest a suspect.

June: Gerald Leon Horn, an auxiliary officer with the Maplesville Police Department, was struck by an automobile driven by a fleeing suspect.

October: Patrolman Tommy Lee Thedford, a Bessemer police officer, was killed attempting to arrest a suspect.

November: Patrolman George Steven Watkins, a Troy police officer, was killed during a domestic disturbance call.

November: Deputy Charles Ivan Baker, of the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, was killed in a traffic accident while responding to a burglary alarm.

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PREFACE

The 1981 Crime in Alabama report is intended to inform law enforcement officials and private citizens of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama; these data are then used for analyzing crime problems inherent in the criminal justice system and as a foundation for planning and budgeting.

Geographic areas covered in this report include the State of Alabama, Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's), county and city strata. A 1981 Crime by County report is contained in Appendix A.

We would like to extend our appreciation to law enforcement agencies -- sheriff's departments, municipal police departments, and campus police -- for their cooperation in the UCR program.

INTRODUCTION

In October of 1975, Act 872 passed both houses of the Alabama Legislature creating and establishing the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) which is commissioned to collect, store, retrieve, analyze, and disseminate criminal justice data. Inherent in ACJIC is a "uniform crime reporting system for the periodic collection and analysis of crimes reported to any and all criminal justice agencies within the state." (Act 872, § 9, 1975)

As a result of Act 872, 1976 was the first year that mandatory reporting was required of law enforcement agencies in Alabama; prior to 1976, law enforcement agencies participated in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting System (UCR) on a voluntary basis. Mandatory submission has resulted in a 185% increase in reporting over 1975.

Alabama's UCR program functions in accordance with FBI standards of operation, i.e., a uniform data collection device and quality control procedures which provide viable crime statistics and an accurate indication of crime and crime trends.

ACJIC has implemented an incident-based reporting system as an alternative to UCR. The Incident-Based Reporting System (IBR) provides a self-contained internal recordkeeping system for the agency as well as data for ACJIC to generate UCR.

IBR is a voluntary system with 65% of Alabama's agencies participating. Law enforcement agencies have the option of utilizing IBR instead of UCR summary since comparable data elements can be obtained from IBR forms. All the information obtained by the investigating officer is recorded on the IBR forms and a copy is sent to ACJIC. This information is more detailed in nature than requisites for UCR. This wealth of information provides great potential for better services, analyses, and resource studies by both individual agency's crime analysis units and ACJIC.

Alabama's law enforcement agencies are supplied with monthly reporting forms, either UCR summaries or IBR forms. ACJIC's Technical Assistance field staff is made available to the reporting agencies to help answer any questions which may arise regarding forms, crime classifications, and clearance data. The Technical Assistants are also responsible for training law enforcement personnel and maintaining the quality of information for output to the criminal justice system.

When the UCR summaries or incident reports are returned to ACJIC, they are reviewed for accuracy by the quality control section of UCR. Then, the Alabama UCR program furnishes the contributing agencies and the FBI with monthly data for their verification and review process.

CRIME AND ARREST DATA

Studying criminal activity is one of the best ways to combat crime. Valid crime data can provide a solid foundation for statistical analyses, management-oriented analyses and crime breakdowns. These projects can then aid local police departments in laying out patrol districts, assigning patrol units, and designating community education programs.

Data used in this report are provided by the Uniform Crime Reporting section of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. Both UCR Summaries and Incident Report forms are submitted to ACJIC's UCR section which is the depository for reported offenses and has the responsibility of collecting and disseminating crime data.

In 1981, approximately 320 agencies reported known offenses to Alabama's UCR; 65% of Alabama's law enforcement agencies submitted Incident Reports and 35% returned UCR Summaries.

Through a mandate of Congress, Arson is counted as a Part I Offense. So as not to distort crime trends in Total and Property Crime indices, Arson totals will not be included in these sections but will be included in a separate section which follows property crimes.

Crime data are obtained from the Part I Index of Offenses submitted by law enforcement agencies to Alabama's UCR program. These Part I Offenses are divided into Violent Crimes and Property Crimes.

Violent Crimes include Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are considered violent inasmuch as they are offenses perpetrated against a person(s) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim(s).

Property Crimes are comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson*. Property or Non-Violent Crimes lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

Clearance and arrest data are also reported to Alabama's UCR. A crime is considered cleared, either by arrest or by exceptional means, when enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody. It is conceivable that one arrest could clear several offenses or that several arrests could clear one offense. The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.

This report is a composite picture of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama for 1981. It provides a breakdown for the State, the State's eight Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) and localities participating in the UCR program. The report concentrates on the Index Crime

of the FBI's Part I Offenses and offers tabular and narrative formats for comparisons, trends, rates, and percentage changes.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Adult - the UCR system defines adults as 18 years of age and over.

Arrest - a measure of law enforcement activity by which an individual is detained in legal custody.

Arson - willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts. (Through a Congressional mandate, 1979 was the first year arson was counted as a Part I Offense.) Arson is divided into the following categories:

Structural

Single occupancy residential - houses, townhouses, duplexes, etc.

Other residential - apartments, tenements, hotels, motels, dormitories, boarding houses, etc.

Storage - barns, garages, warehouses, etc.

Industrial/manufacturing.

Other commercial - stores, restaurants, offices, etc.

Community/public - churches, jails, schools, colleges, hospitals, etc.

All other structures - outbuildings, monuments, buildings under construction, etc.

Arson - (continued)

Mobile

Motor vehicles - automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc.

Other mobile property - trailers, recreational vehicles, airplanes, boats, etc.

Other - crops, timber, fences, signs, etc.

Assault - the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, including attempts. Attempted homicide is listed as an assault.

Burglary - unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft.

Central city - a city with at least 50,000 residents.

City strata - a breakdown of cities according to population.

Clearance - a measure of law enforcement activity which shows that a crime has been solved for crime reporting purposes either by the arrest of a suspect or by exceptional means. Exceptional means provides a solution to a crime when there is enough evidence to place a formal charge against an offender, but some element beyond law enforcement control precludes an actual arrest. It is possible for one arrest to clear more than one offense.

Clearance rate - the clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.

Crime rate - a measure of criminal activity which shows the number of crimes reported per 100,000 residents.

Criminal activity - measured by reported crimes, trends, rates.

Forcible entry - offenses in which force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a structure for the purpose of committing a theft or felony.

Hierarchy of offenses - whenever more than one offense is committed simultaneously, the most severe offense is reported to UCR.

Homicide - the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.

Incident-Based Reporting System - a voluntary crime reporting system developed by ACJIC as an alternative to the UCR Summary.

Juveniles - the UCR system defines juveniles as males and females 17 years of age and younger.

Larceny - unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud, i.e., pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, theft from coin operated machines, etc.

Law enforcement activity - police activity as measured by clearances and arrests.

Minimal injury - personal injury involving abrasions, minor lacerations requiring no more than usual first-aid treatment.

Motor vehicles - automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc.

Motor vehicle theft - unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts.

Non-residence - any structure used for purposes other than a residence.

Part I Index Crimes - a category of UCR offenses deemed more serious and/or most frequent. The Part I Index Crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

Part II Offenses - a category of UCR offenses which include:

- . Other assaults - non-aggravated assaults.
- . Forgery and counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.
- . Fraud - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.
- . Embezzlement - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.
- . Stolen property - buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.
- . Vandalism - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.
- . Weapons - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.

Part II Offenses (cont.)

- . Prostitution and commercialized vice - sex offenses of a commercialized nature.
- . Sex offenses (other than rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice) - statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.
- . Narcotic drug laws - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.
- . Gambling - promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.
- . Offenses against the family and children - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.
- . Driving under the influence - driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
- . Liquor laws - violations of state or local liquor laws.
- . Drunkenness - drunkenness or intoxication.
- . Disorderly conduct - breach of the peace.
- . Vagrancy - begging, loitering, etc.
- . All other offenses - all violations of state or local laws, excepting categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses, and traffic violations.

Property crimes - (non-violent crimes) index crimes which lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s). Included in this category are burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

Recovery - finding stolen property. It should be noted that a recovered article does not clear a crime, although the owner is reunited with his property a crime was committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to clear the offense.

Reported crimes - crimes reported to law enforcement officials.

NOTE: In this report, only those offenses which prove to be actual offenses are used. Those cases which have been deemed unfounded are excluded from the crime totals. (It should be mentioned that a change in reporting on the part of victims can effect an increase or a decrease for certain crimes.)

Residence - any dwelling structure used for human habitation.

Robbery - stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, including attempts. Robbery is broken down into seven categories:

- . Highway - robberies occurring on the streets, in alleys, outside of structures.
- . Commercial house - hotels, motels, lodging houses, loan companies.
- . Gas or service stations - sell gasoline and related products.
- . Convenience stores - neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items.
- . Banking establishments - banks, savings & loan institutions, credit unions, etc.
- . Miscellaneous - churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit systems, etc.

Serious injury - personal injury is considered serious if there are broken bones, internal injuries, or if stitches are required.

Standard metropolitan statistical area (SMSA) - a county or contiguous counties which contain at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000.

Uniform Crime Reports - standardized reporting forms used by law enforcement officials to report criminal activity within their jurisdiction.

Uniform Crime Reporting System - is the depository of the Uniform Crime Reports and Incident reporting forms and provides for the collection and dissemination of crime data.

Unlawful entry - involves no force and is achieved by use of an unlocked door or window. The element of trespass is essential.

Urbanized areas - incorporated or unincorporated places of 2500 or more inhabitants.

Violent crimes - index crimes which are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim. Crimes included in this category are homicide, rape, robbery, and assault.

TOTAL INDEX CRIME

Total Index Crime is comprised of the Part I Offenses: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson*. Both crime and arrest data are collected for Part I Crime.

Offense Data

In 1981 the Total Index Crime reported was 186,475. This is a 1% decrease over 1980 figures. The crime rate for Alabama was 4793.6 crimes per 100,000 people in 1981 which is a 2% decrease over 1980's crime rate of 4867.4.

Of the Total Index Crimes reported to law enforcement agencies in 1981, 10% of those reported were considered Violent Crimes with 90% being Property Crimes. Violent Crime experienced a 4% increase while Property Crime showed a 1% decrease.

All Violent Crimes reported experienced a decrease except assault which increased 12% over 1980. Rape experienced a 13% decrease, homicide decreased by 12% and robbery by 5%.

*In order to keep crime statistics meaningful, Arson data will not be included in Part I totals or Property Crime totals. A separate section on Arson is included in this report.

Larceny effected the greatest increase of the Property crimes, 2%. Burglary showed a 6% decrease and motor vehicle theft had a 9% decrease.

Clearance Data

Of the 186,475 reported offenses, 32,396 were cleared producing a 17% clearance rate. Violent Crimes experienced a 48% clearance rate and 14% of the Property Crimes were cleared.

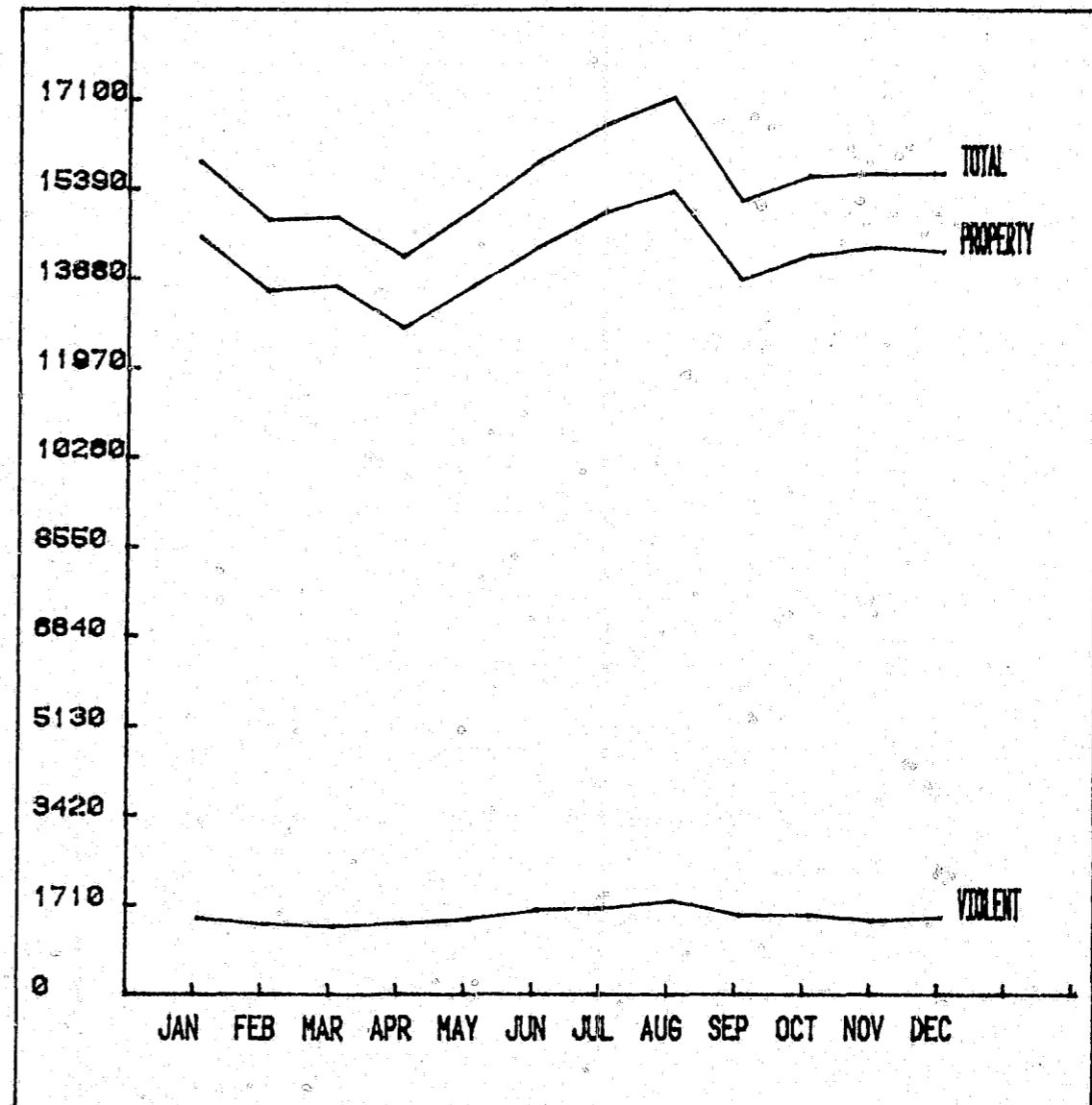

The following pages contain offense data and rates for each agency submitting UCR returns. The rates used here are based on 1980 census data.

A rate is a measurement tool used to equalize population distribution by giving each jurisdiction a population base of 100,000 people. By using crime rates, we are able to compare crime in cities of disproportionate size, for example, we can compare criminal activity in Birmingham with that of a city of less than 500 residents by using crime rates.

Actual offenses reported to UCR do not constitute crime rates. They are merely reported offenses. Crime rates are computed as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Reported Offenses}}{\text{Actual population}} \times 100,000 = \text{Crime Rate}$$

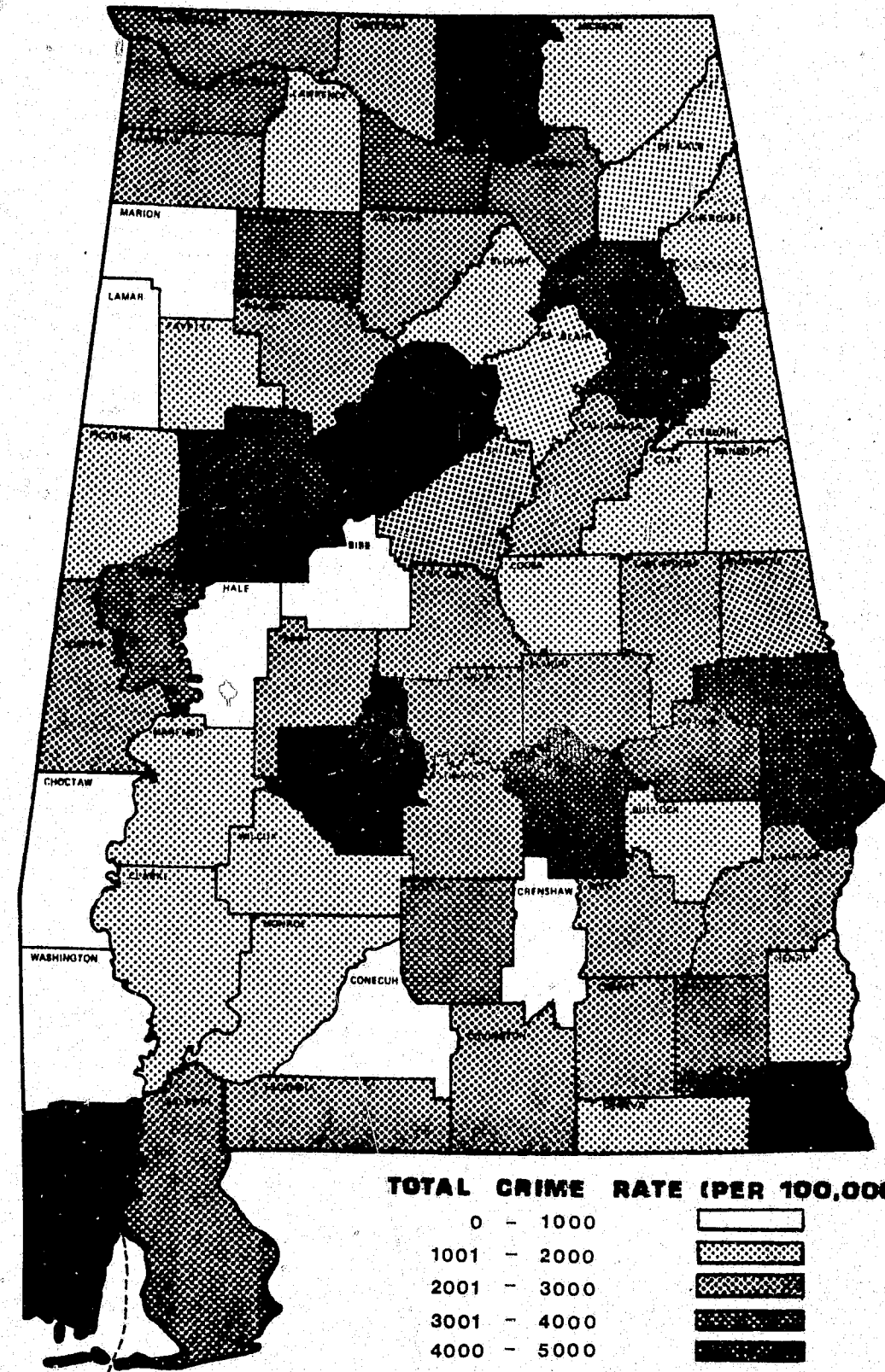

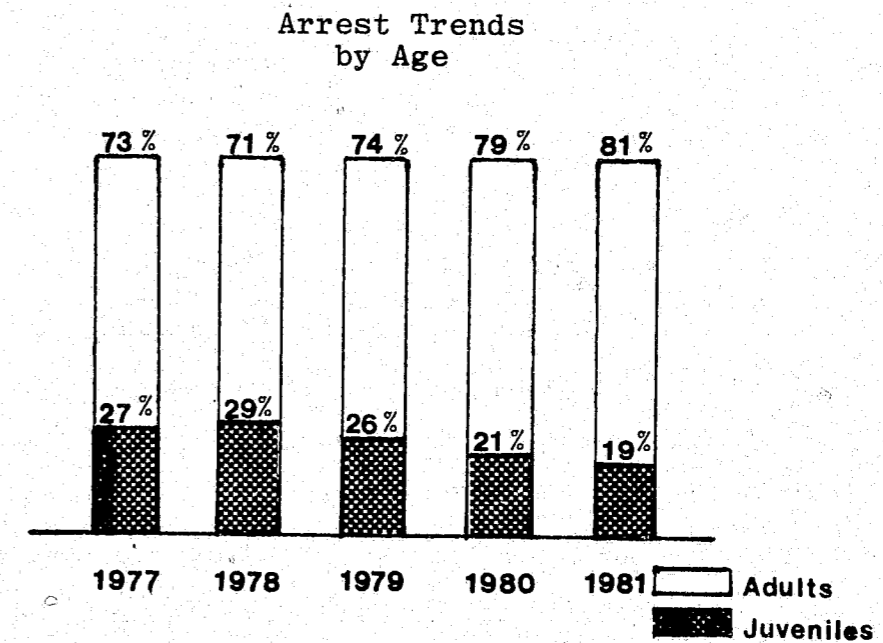

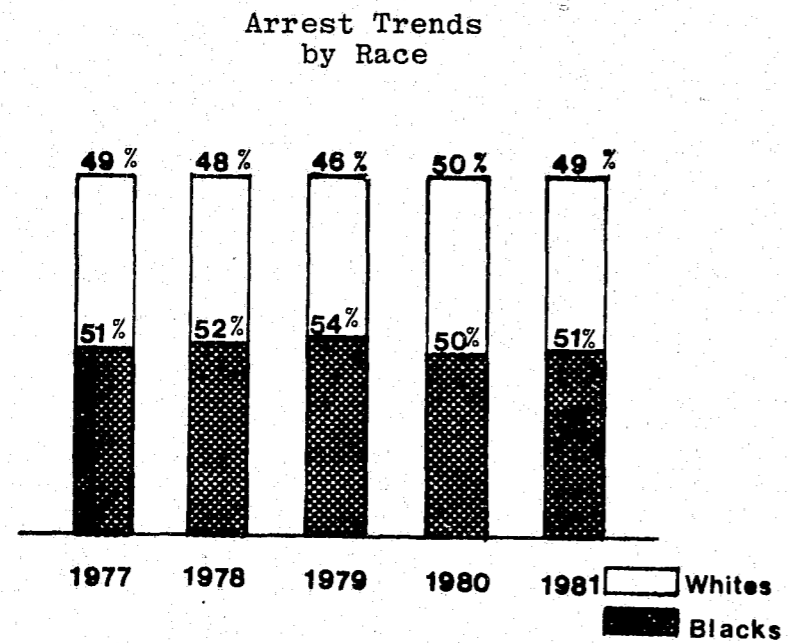
There were 35,422 persons arrested in Alabama in 1981 for Index Offenses. Eighty-one percent of the persons arrested were adults. The 25-29 age group accounted for 5,509 arrests or 19% of the adults arrested.

A total of 6,738 juveniles were arrested for Part I Index Crimes in 1981. Seventeen year olds accounted for the greatest number of juvenile arrests, 1,893 or 28%. Sixteen year olds accounted for 23% with 1,550 juveniles in that age group arrested. There were 255 juveniles 10 and Under arrested for Part I offenses for 4% of the total juvenile arrests. The following chart shows the proportion of arrests by adults and juveniles for a five year period.

Fifty percent of the adults arrested for index offenses were white and 50% were black; white juveniles accounted for 46% and black juveniles 54%. The following graph gives arrest trends by race for a five year period.

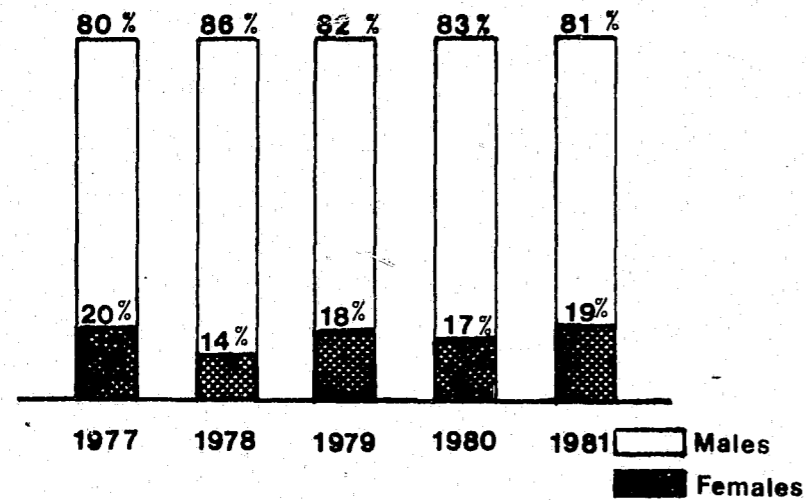

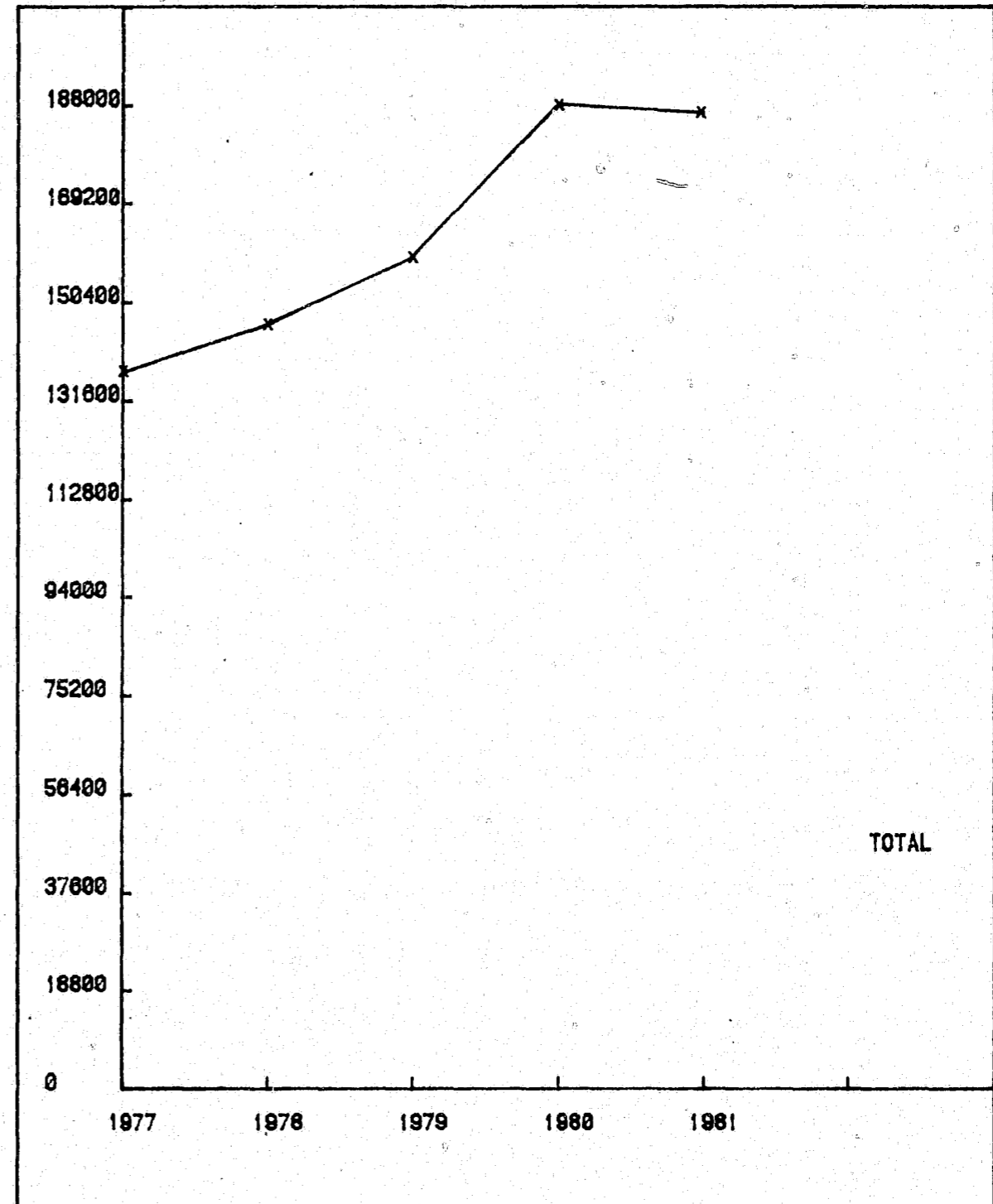
Arson totals for 1981 have been excluded from the Total Part I Index Offenses to keep trend data more accurate. There were 1,217 incidents of arson reported in 1981; 825 incidents involved structural units; 290 involved mobile property; and 102 included all other types of property. There were 229 arson clearances for a 19% clearance rate. The estimated value of property destroyed by arson in 1981 was \$12,895,775 for an average of \$10,596 per incident.

Trends

Index offenses show a 36% increase from 1977 to 1981. The crime rate increased by 22% in the same time period.

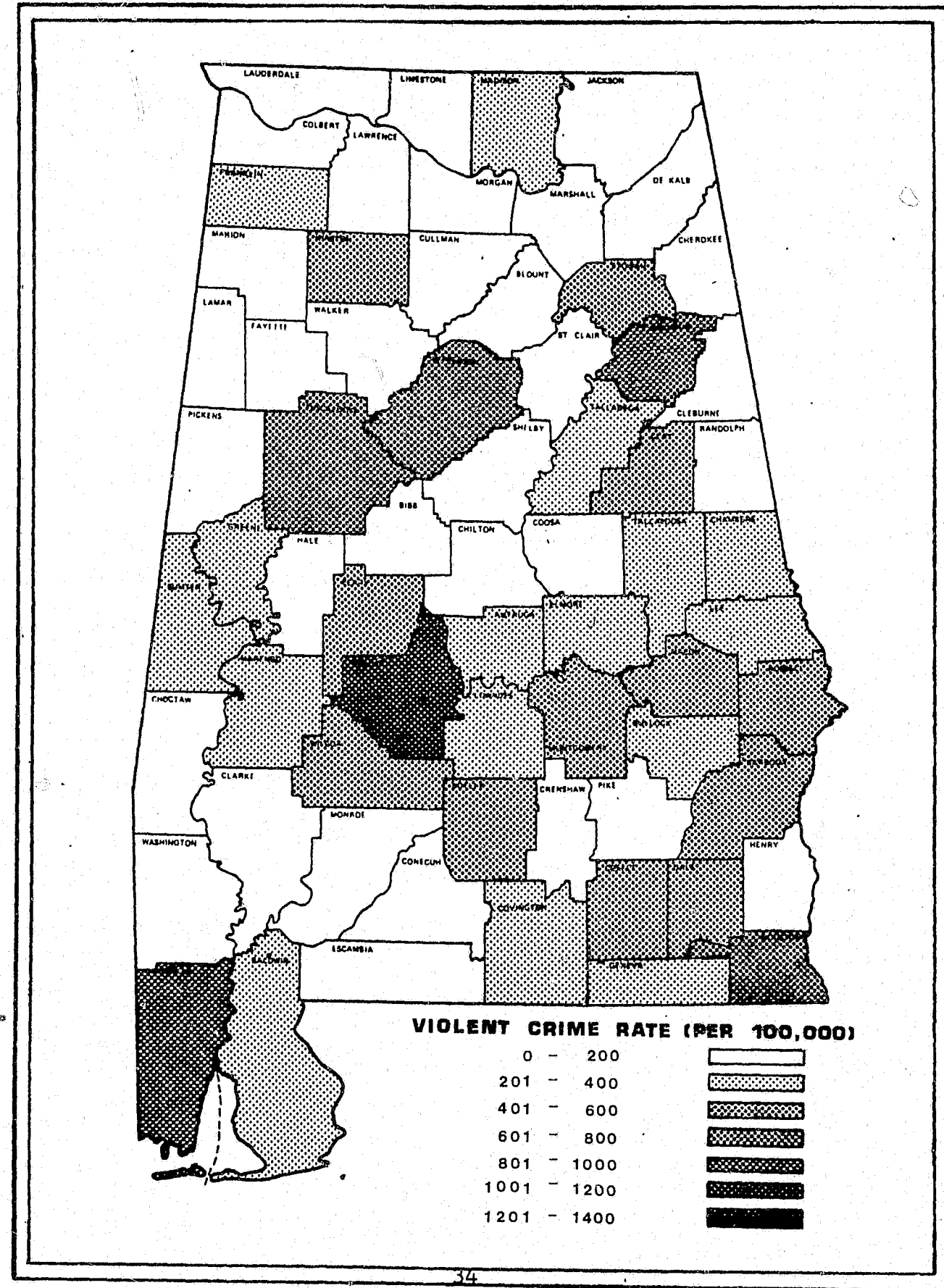
Offense and Clearance Data

Violent Crime in Alabama increased by 4% over 1980. A total of 17,875 offenses were reported in 1981. The Violent Crime rate increased by 4% from 443.0 violent crimes per 100,000 people in 1980 to 459.5 in 1981.

In 1981, reported assaults experienced an increase of 12%. Homicide, rape, and robbery showed decreases, 12%, 13%, and 5%, respectively.

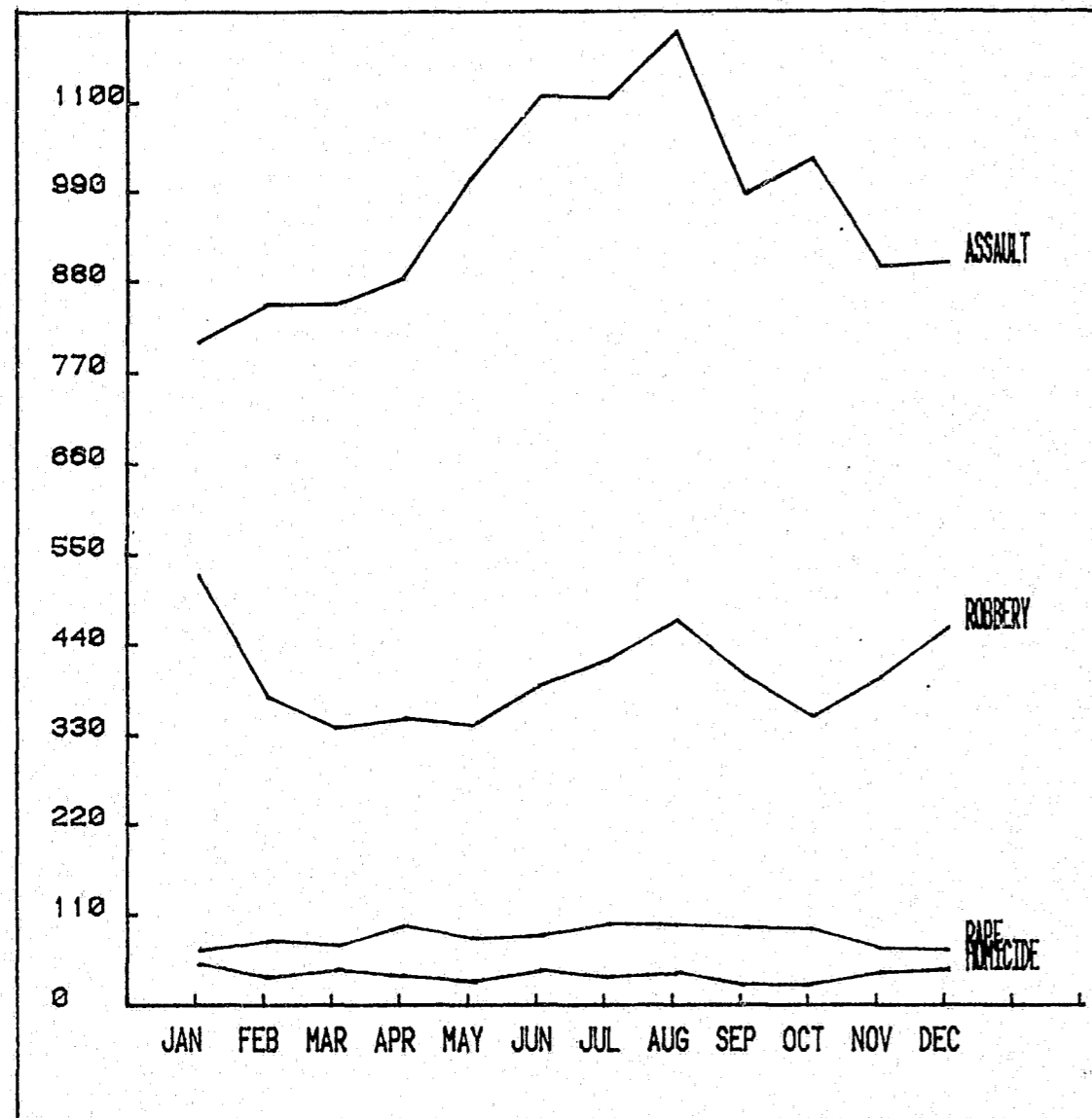

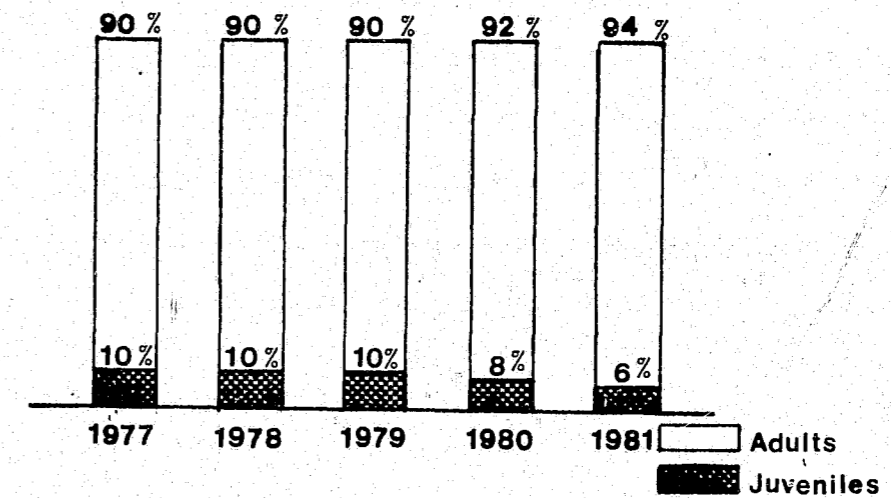

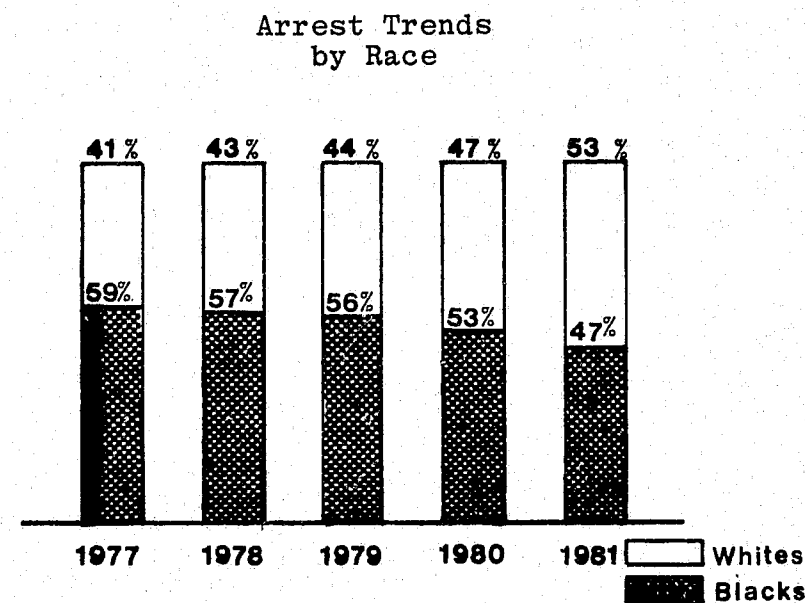

by Age

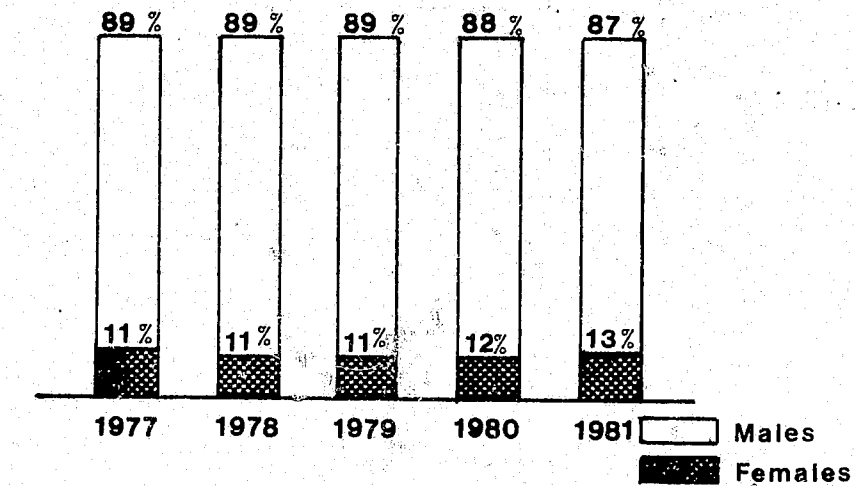

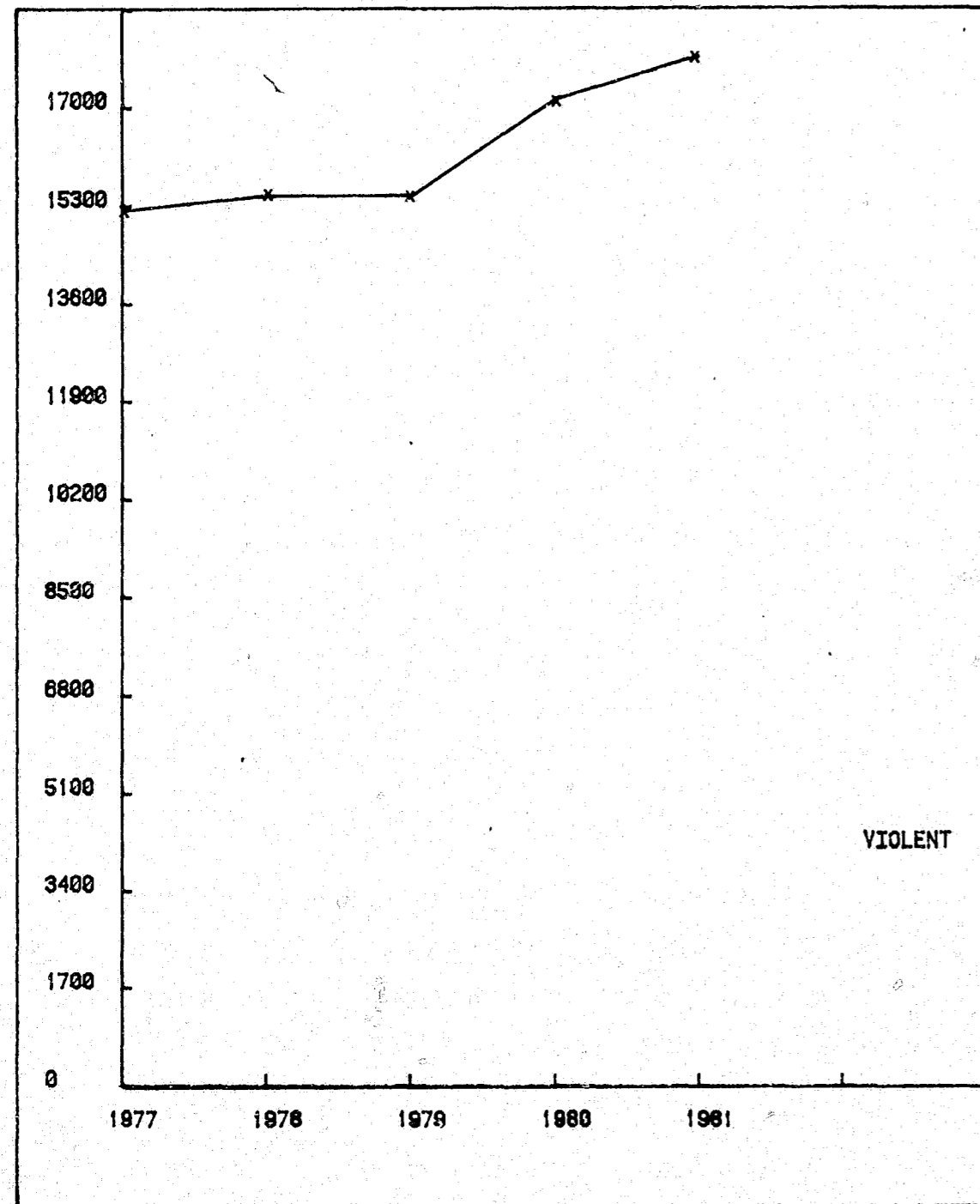

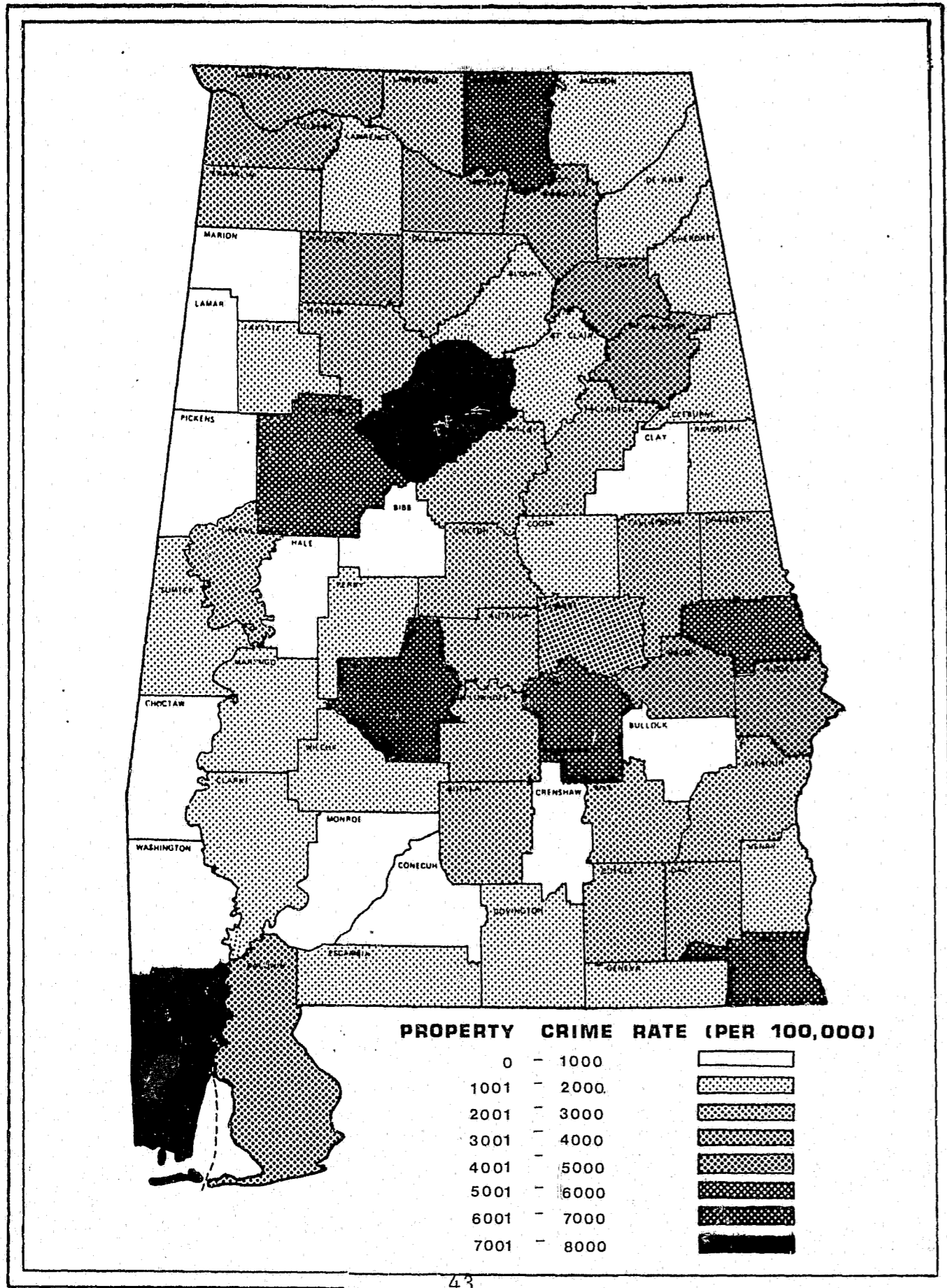

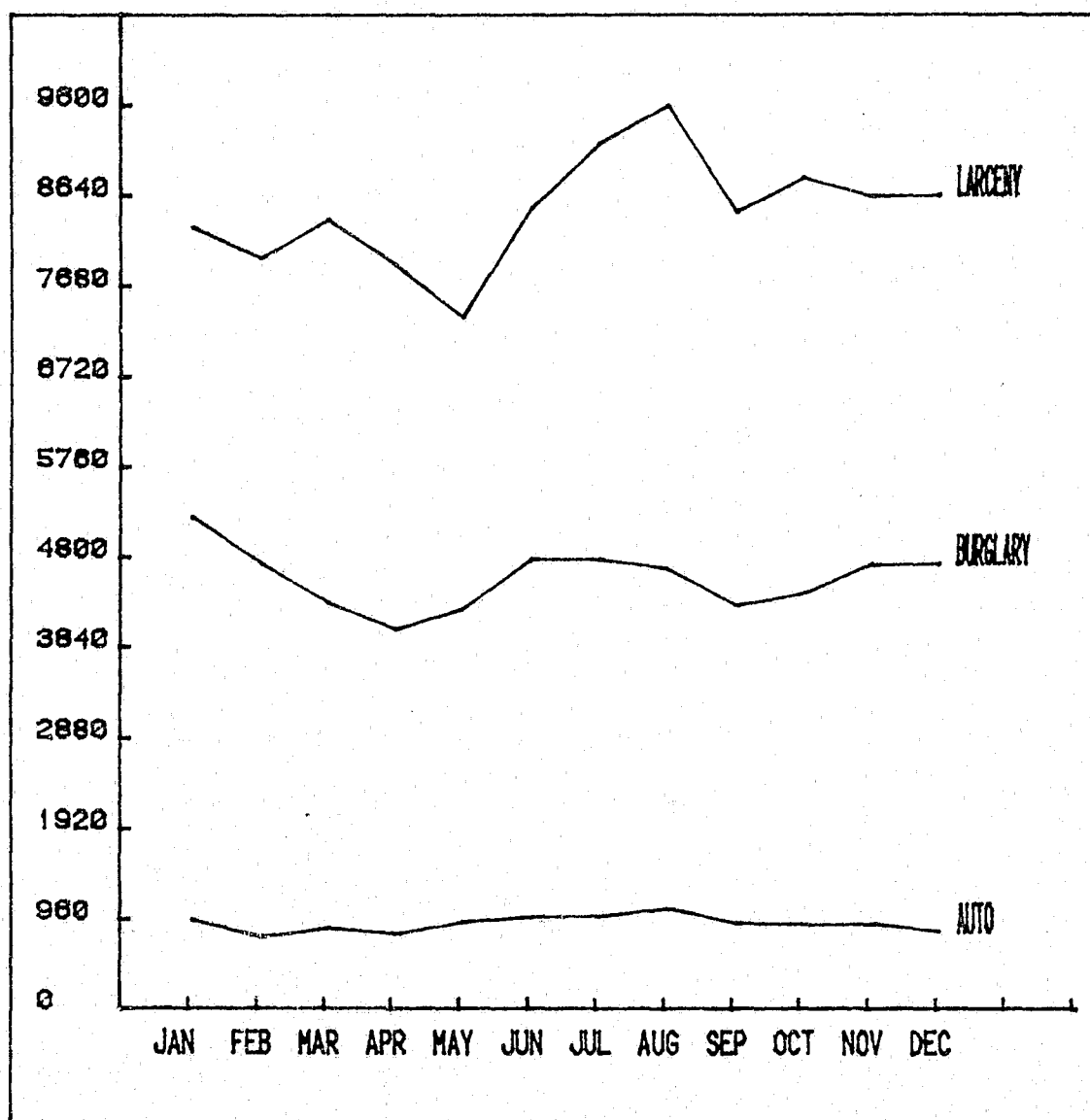

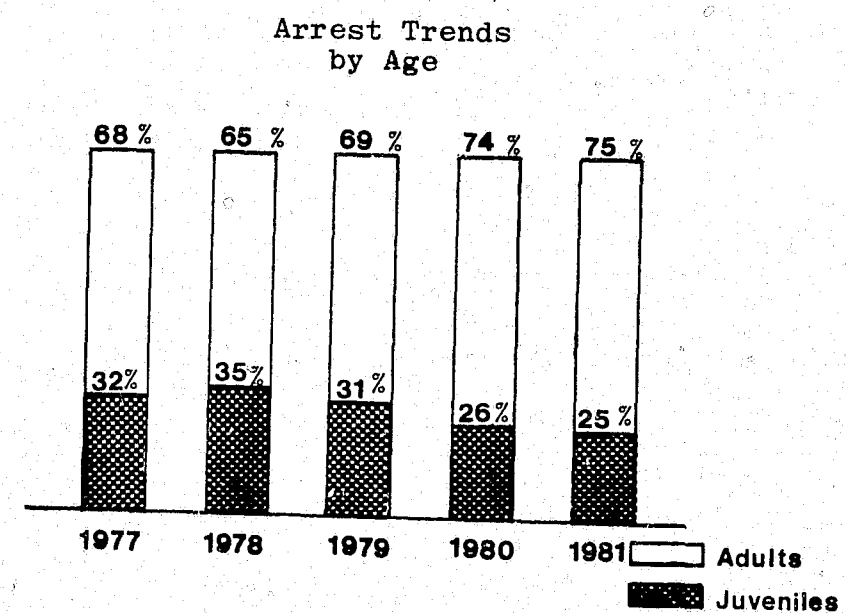

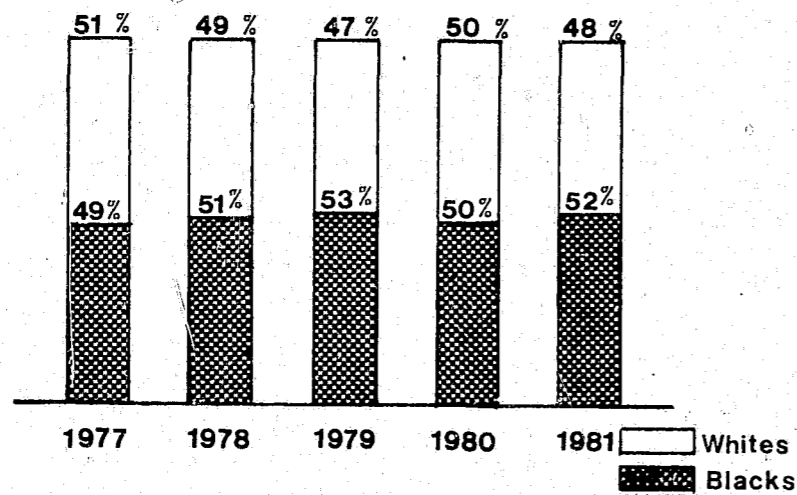

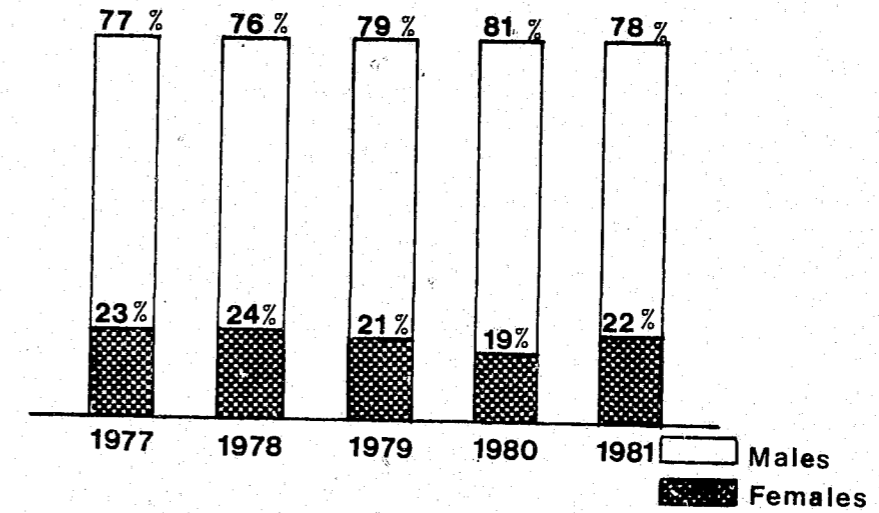

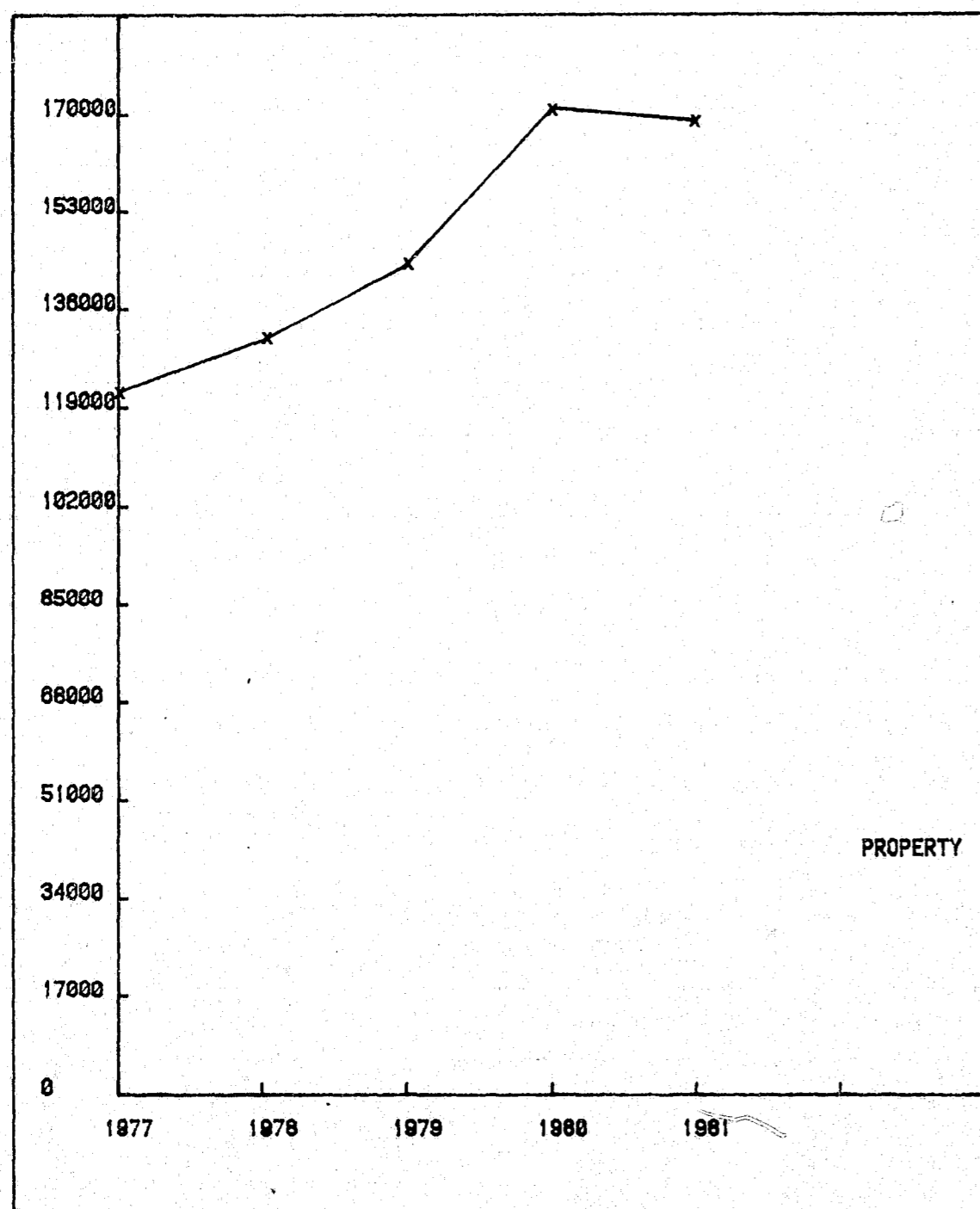

The discussion of Property Crimes should answer questions regarding the value of property stolen and the amount recovered. From 1978 to 1981 the value stolen and the value recovered both increased by 20% with the recovery rate remaining fairly constant. For each year that data are available, the recovery rate of locally stolen motor vehicles is over 50% with the average being 51.5%. This remains the highest category of recovered property. HOMICIDE

Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter is the willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident; justifiable homicides which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens; and, attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are scored as aggravated assaults.

Offense and Clearance Data

In 1981, 443 homicides were reported to Alabama law enforcement agencies. This is a 12% decrease over 1980 when 504 homicides were reported. These homicide incidents comprise 2% of the Violent Crime and .2% of the Total Index Crime. The homicide rate was 11.4 murders per 100,000 people. A total of 371 homicides were cleared in 1981 for an 84% clearance rate. Juveniles were responsible for 2% of the homicide clearances.

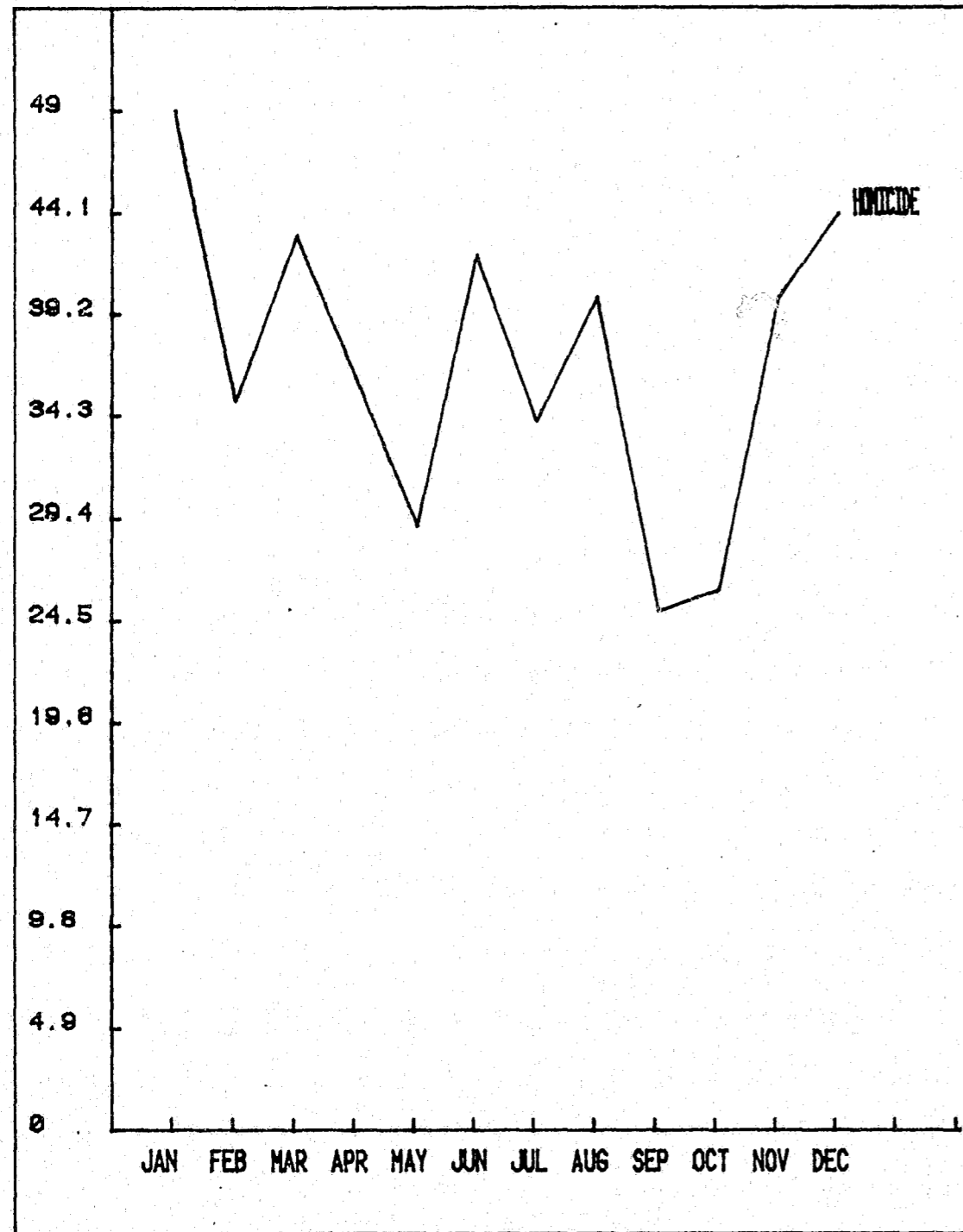

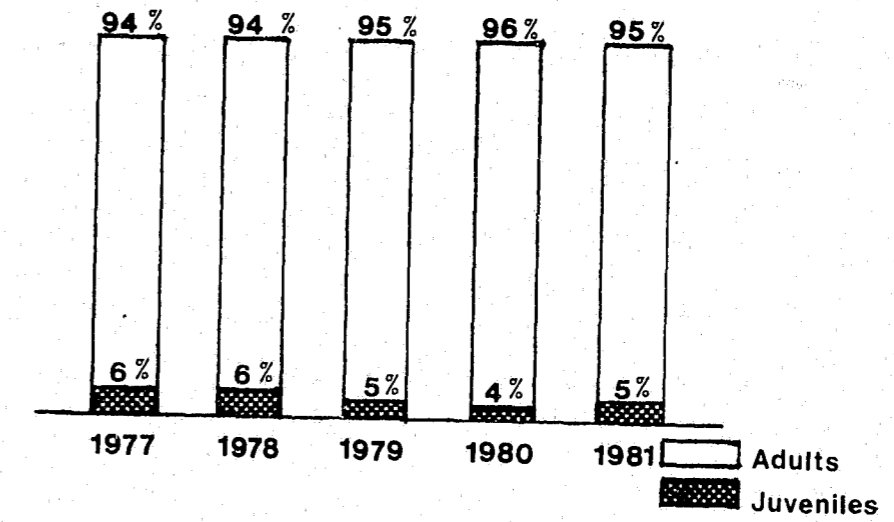

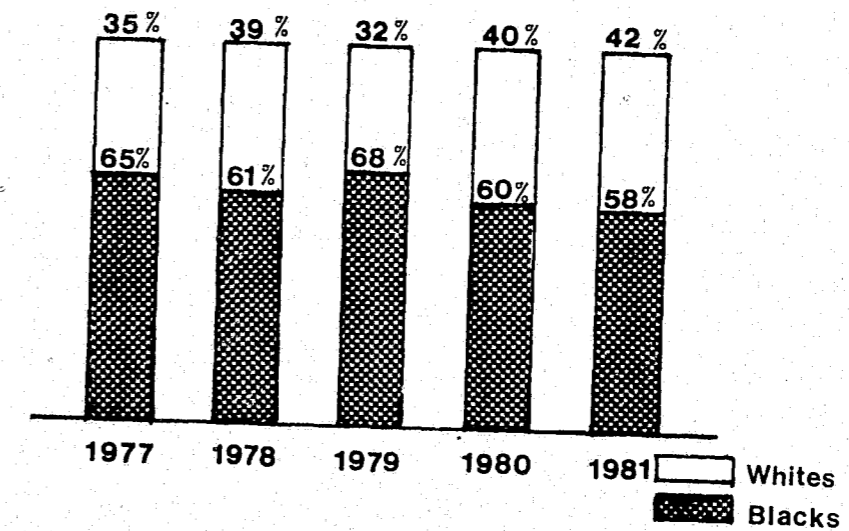


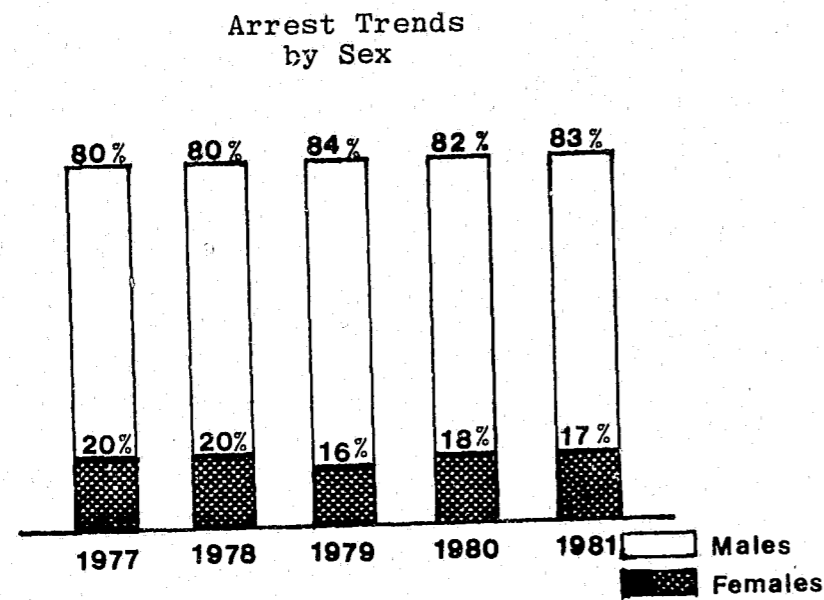
Arrest Trends by Age

Age of Victim

Sex/Race of Victims to Offenders

Fifty-seven percent of the reported homicides involved black victims and black offenders. White victims with white offenders effected 27% of the homicides. In 3% of the incidents, there was a white victim with a black offender and in 2% of the cases, a black victim and a white offender. Eleven percent of the offenders were unknown.

Weapon Type

Seventy-one percent of the homicides occurring in Alabama in 1981 resulted from firearms; handguns resulted in 51% of the homicides. Cutting instruments were listed as the cause of death in 88 incidents or 20% of the homicides. Blunt instruments effected 17 homicides for 4% of the total. Personal weapons such as hands, fists, feet, etc., resulted in 16 deaths for 3% of the total homicides reported.

Circumstances

Argument

Of the 443 homicides reported in 1981, 289, or 65%, resulted during the course of an argument. Over 50% of the argument-related homicides involved relatives.

Felonies

In 1981, 41 people lost their lives during the commission of felonies. This is 9% of the total homicides in the State. Victims range in age from 21 to 92. The known offenders range in age from 18 to 76. Rape and attempted rape claimed six lives. Victims of robberies claimed 35 lives.

Six incidents involved robbers being killed by their intended victims. These homicides are listed as justifiable and are not included in the homicide total for Alabama.

Child Abuse

Five children lost their lives in 1981 as a direct result of physical abuse. Two were infants and three were a year old. The victims included 1 white male, 1 white female, 1 black female and two black males. The age of the offenders ranged from 20 to 30 years. There were 2 white males, 2 black males and 2 black females arrested in these five deaths. Four of the victims were killed by parents or stepparents and one was killed by an acquaintance. Three of the children were beaten, one was struck by a blunt object and one was thrown against a wall.

Justifiable Homicide (Not included in homicide totals)

Justifiable homicides involve police officers acting in the line of duty. In 1981, there were six people killed by police officers which were listed as justifiable. The victims included 4 black males and 2 white males. They ranged in age from 19 to 79. All six were killed by a handgun. The police officers ranged in age from 24 to 41 and all of them were white males. The circumstances surrounding these shootings included: a burglary; a robbery; an assault on a police officer; and, an aggravated assault. Two incidents did not list the circumstances.

Police Officers Killed

Five officers died in 1981 while acting in the line of duty. One officer died in a traffic mishap while responding to a call; both victim and offender were white males.

The remaining four officers died by felonious acts. Two were killed while attempting to make an arrest, one was run down at a road block and one officer was killed on a domestic disturbance call. The victim officers' age ranged from 25 to 42. Four of the officers were white males and one was a black male. The offenders' ages ranged from 24 to 79. Three of the offenders were black males and two were white males.

Trends

Homicide showed a 16% decrease over 1977 with ranges of

525 in 1977 to 443 in 1981. The homicide rate has decreased by 25% over 1977.

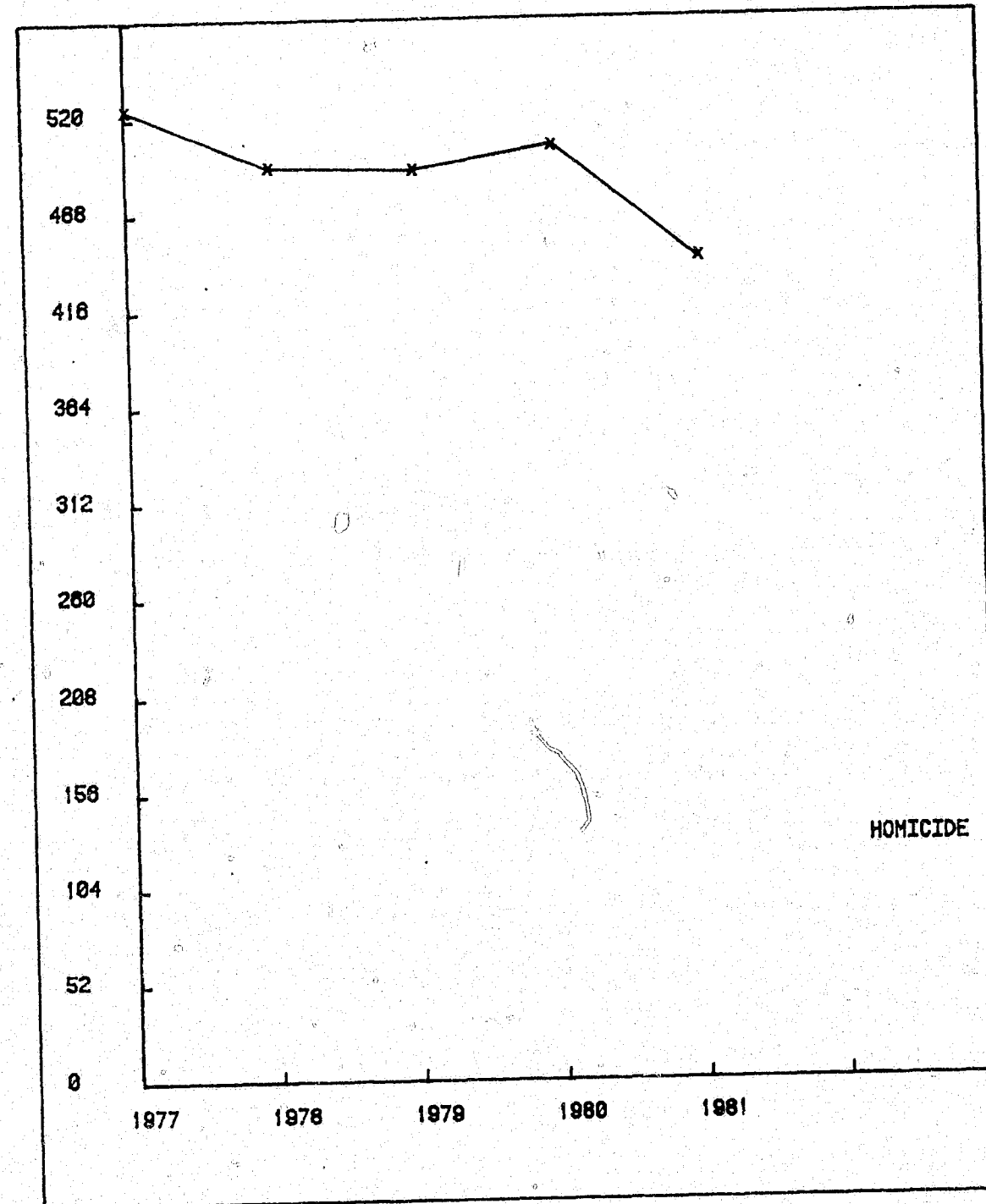

Offense and Clearance Data

There were 944 rapes reported to law enforcement agencies in 1981. This is a 13% decrease over 1980 when 1144 cases were reported. The rape rate* fell 14% in 1981 over 1980 from 56.9 to 49.1 rapes per 100,000 females. Reported rape made up 5% of the Violent Crime totals and 1% of the Part I Offense totals.

Rape showed a 54% clearance rate in 1981 with 541 rapes cleared. Rape clearances made up 6% of the Violent Crime clearances and 2% of the total Part I clearances. Four percent of the rape clearances involved juveniles.

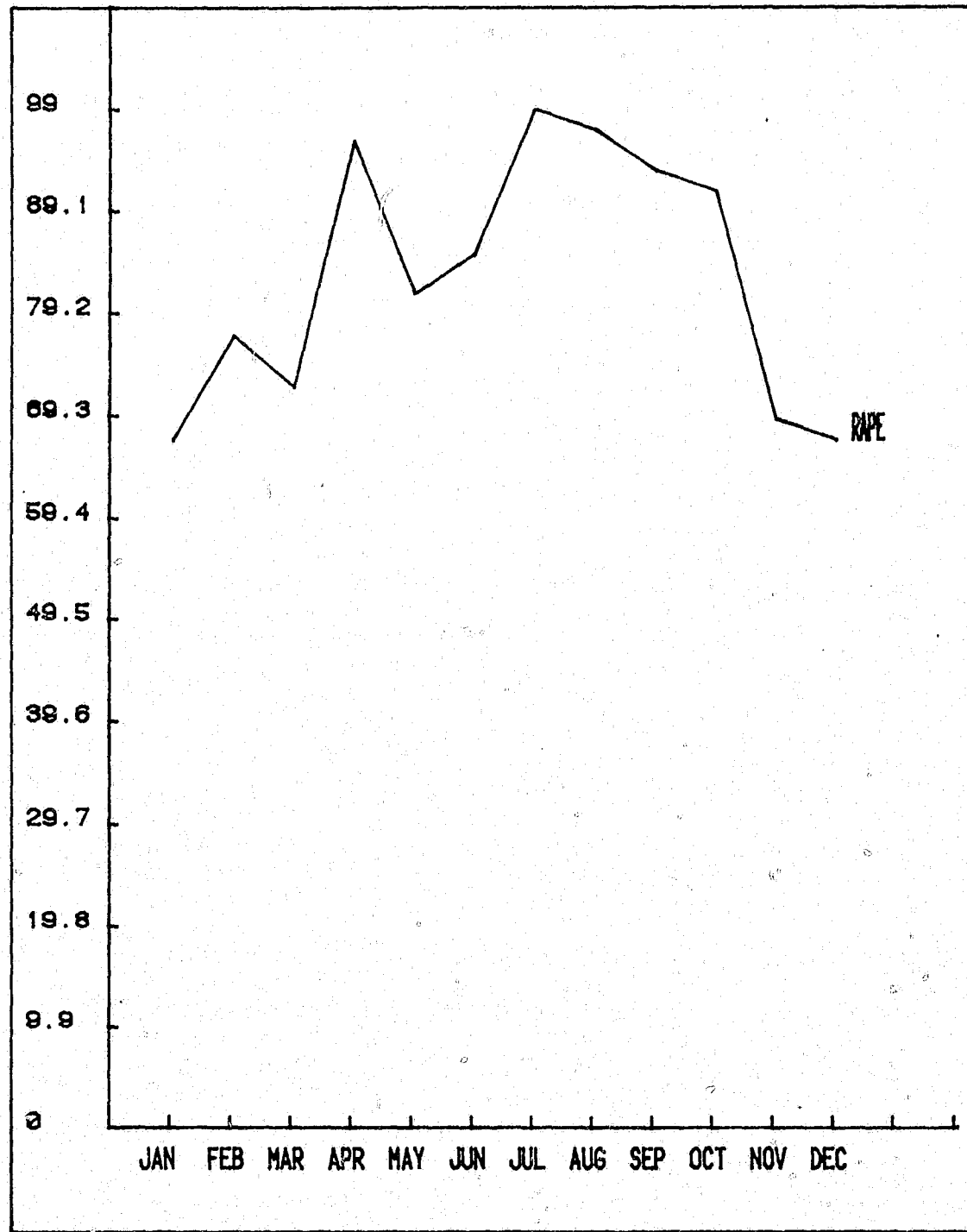

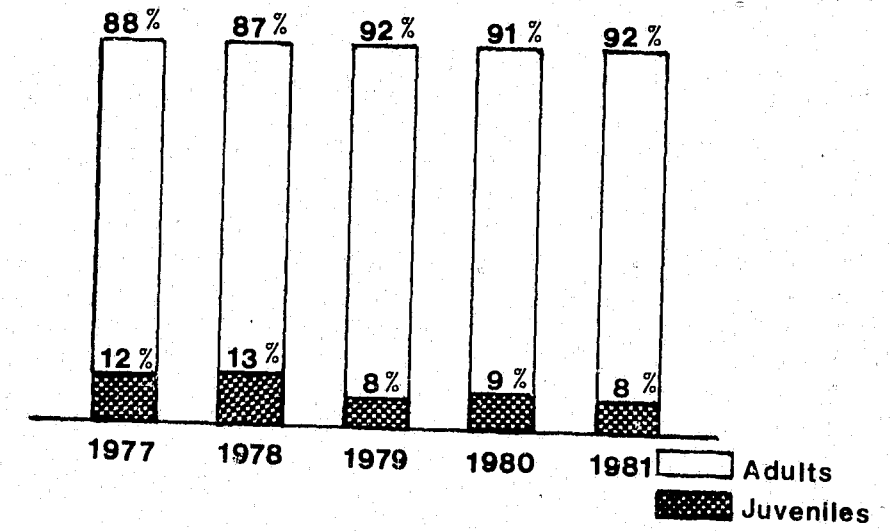

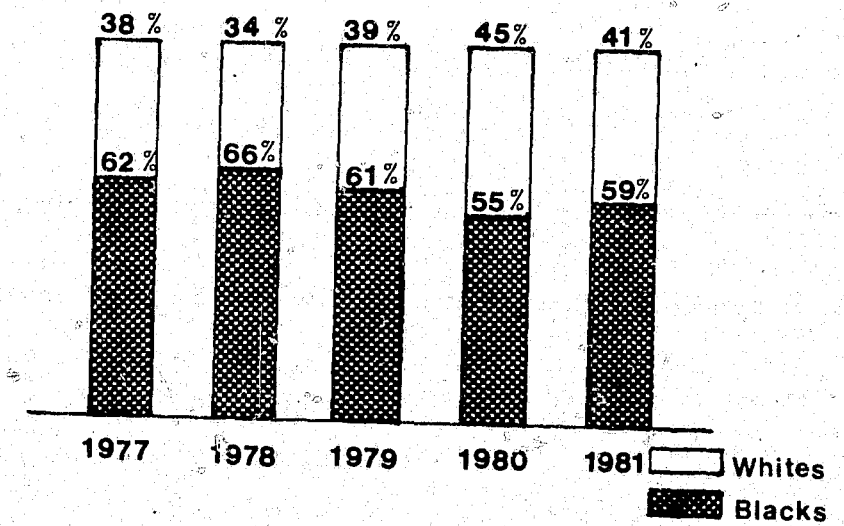

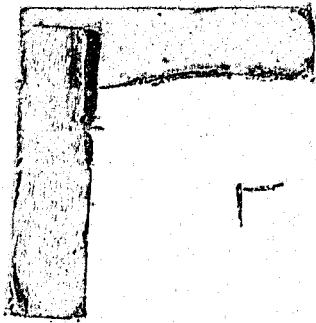
Arrest Trends by Age

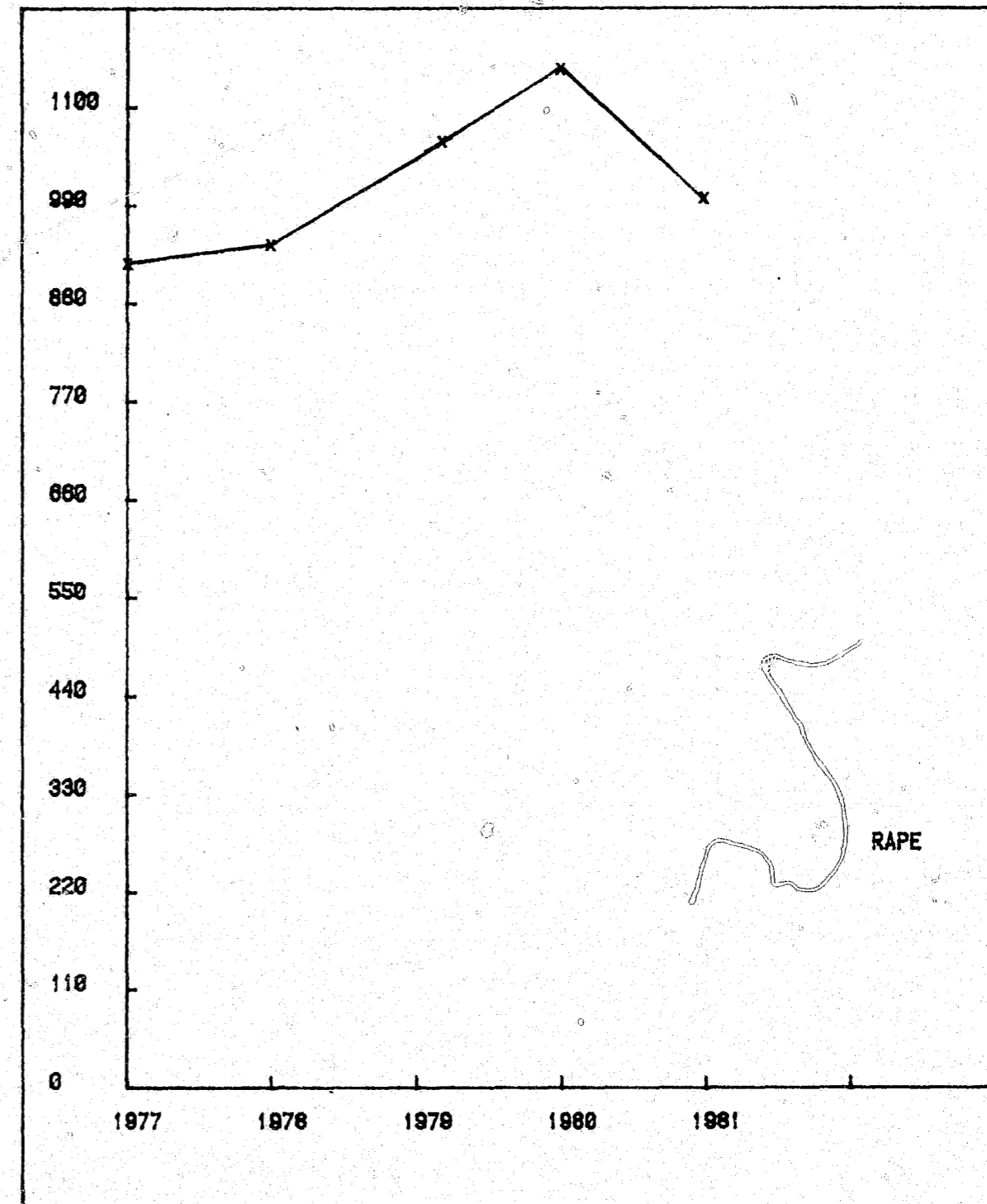

Offense and Clearance Data

Robbery decreased by 5% in 1981 over 1980 going from 5,066 incidents to 4,820. The robbery rate decreased from 131.1 in 1980 to 123.9 in 1981.

There were 1,611 robberies cleared in 1981 producing a 33% clearance rate. Juveniles accounted for 4% of the clearances. Robbery clearances accounted for 19% of the Violent Crime clearances and 5% of the Part I clearances.

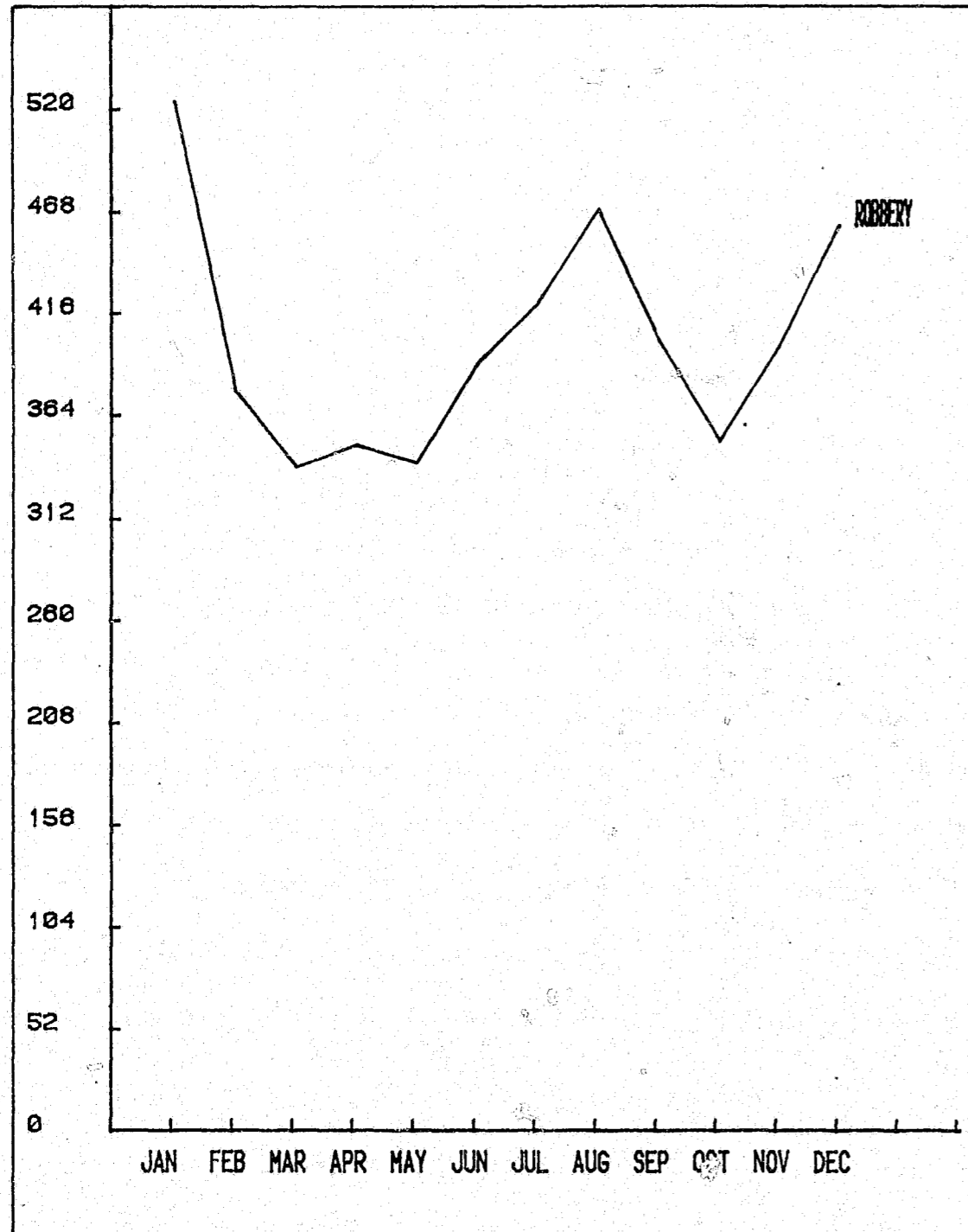

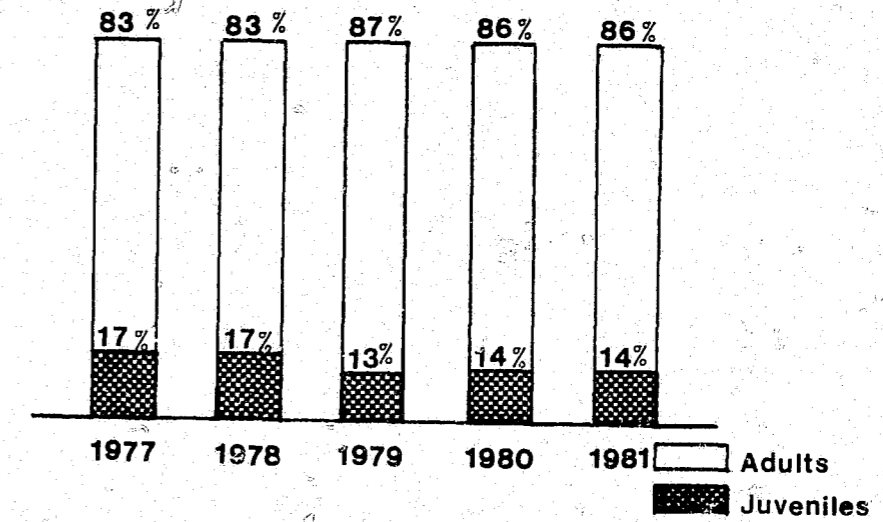

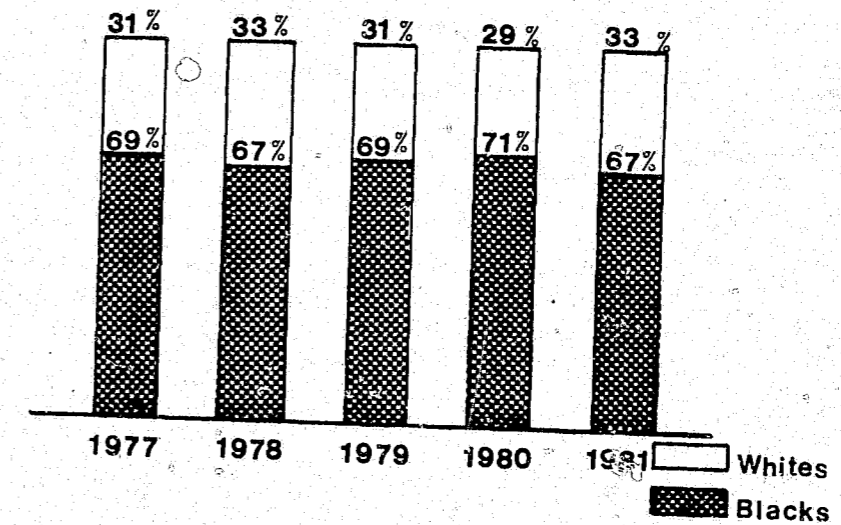


Arrest Trends by Age

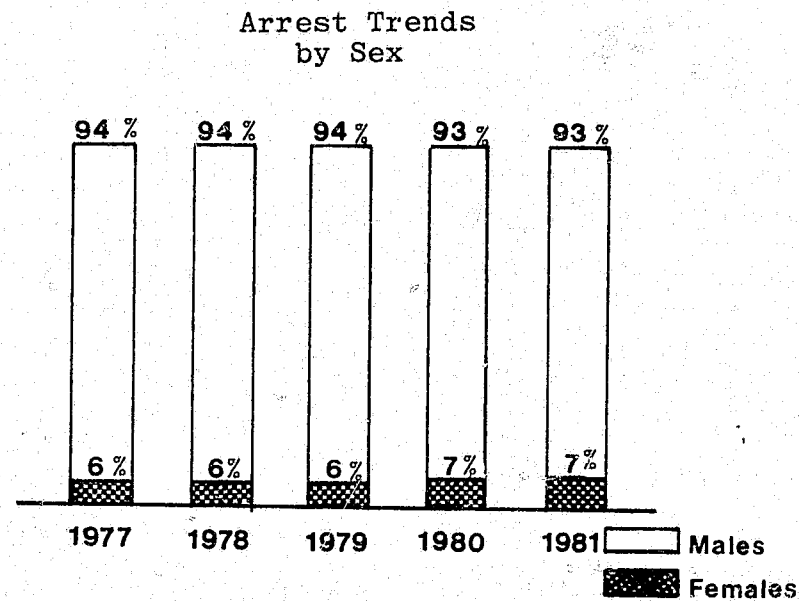

Arrest Trends by Race



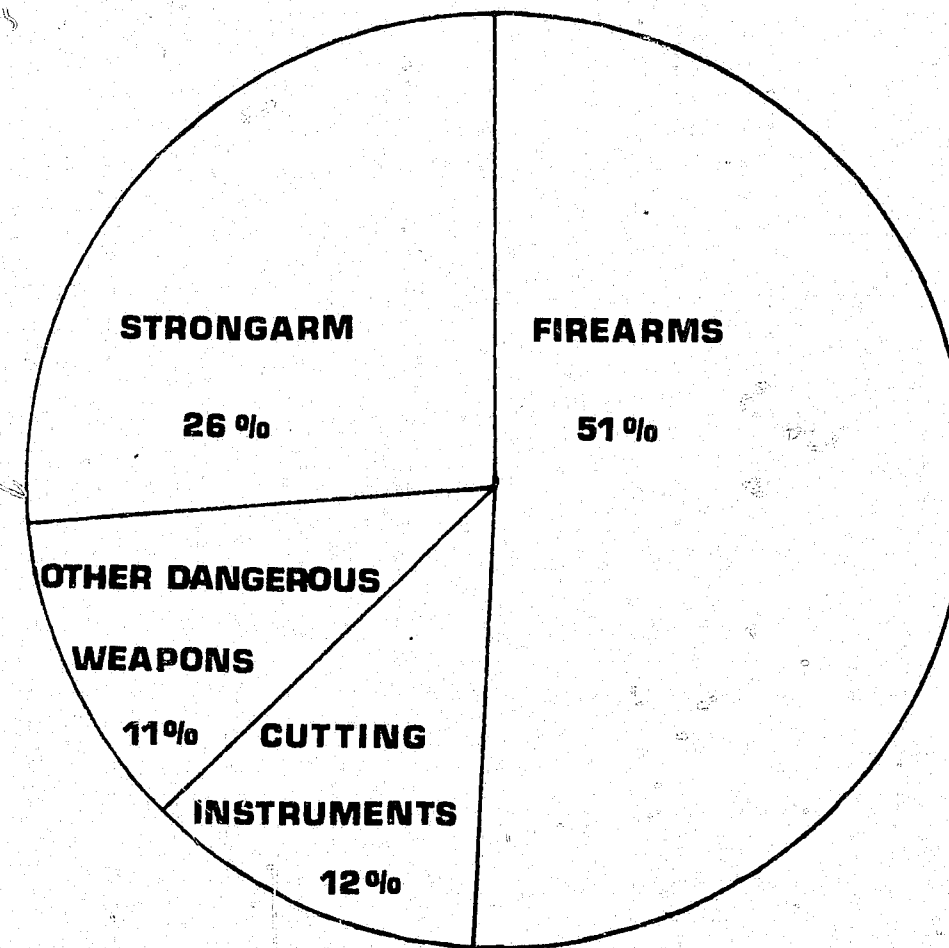

Robbery by Weapon Type

Robbery is classified as a Violent Crime due to the possibility of injury or death to the victim(s). In 51% of the reported robberies, a firearm was used. Of the robberies involving firearms 32% were cleared with 2% being cleared by juveniles. A knife or cutting instrument was used in 12% of the reported robberies; of these robberies, 30% were cleared with 4% being juvenile clearances. Other dangerous weapons effected 11% of the reported robberies; 45% of these were cleared with 8% being cleared by juveniles. Strong-arm

Robbery by Classification

Highway offenses occur on the streets, alleys, and in general view of police patrol. These are robberies occurring outside of structures. In 1981, 34% of robberies were scored in this category with the actual number of highway robberies being 1,667. The total dollar value involved for highway robberies was \$540,232 which gave an average dollar value of \$324 per incident.

Commercial houses are listed as establishments, such as hotels, motels, lodging houses, loan companies, etc. Commercial house robberies were 21% of the total number of robberies in 1981 with 1,038 reported incidents. The total dollar amount stolen in this category was \$911,631 for an average of \$878.

Gas or service stations are establishments whose main purpose is selling gasoline and related products. In 1981, there were 326 reported incidents involving gas or service stations for a total dollar amount of \$107,449 and an average of \$330.

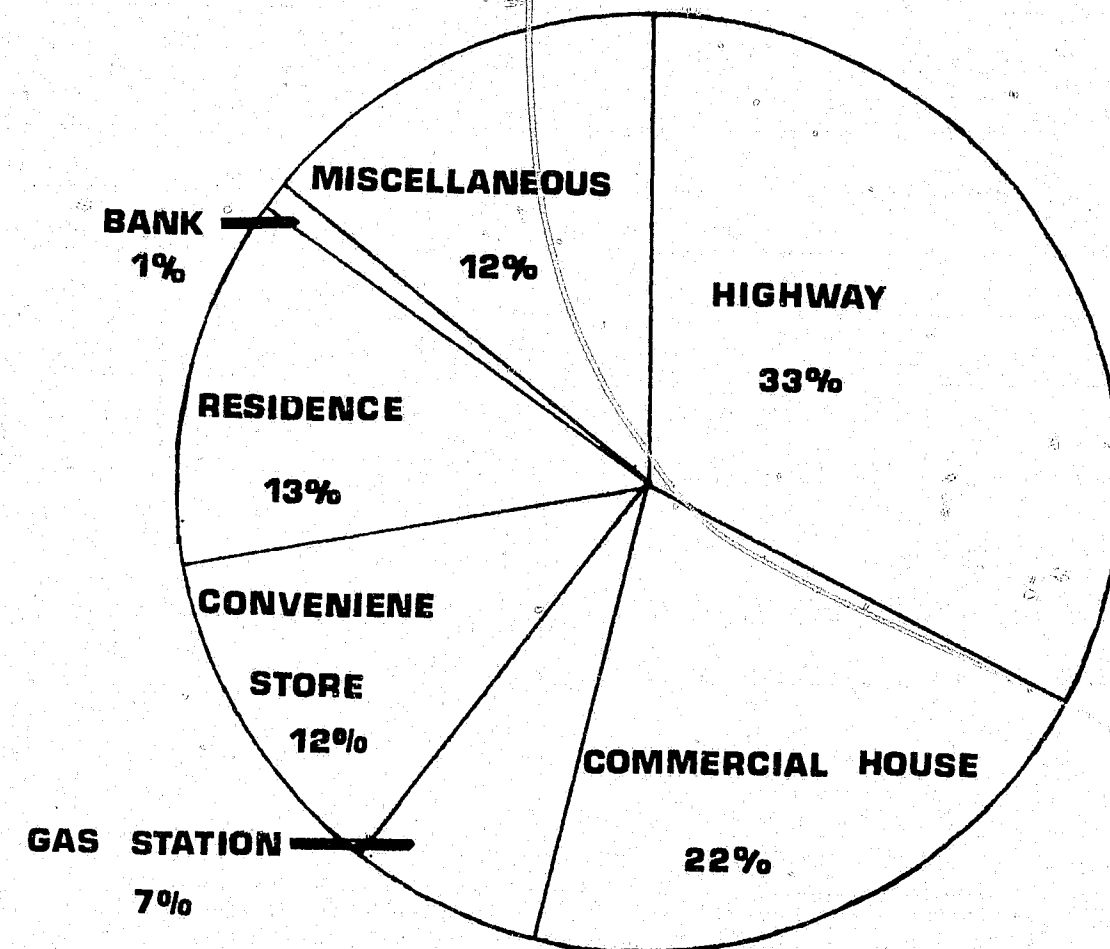
Convenience stores are defined as neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items. These stores are easily accessible and usually have extended hours of operation. Twelve percent of the total reported robberies occurred in convenience stores. The 556 convenience store robberies resulted in \$140,305 stolen with an average dollar value of \$252.

Residential robberies are all robberies occurring in a dwelling or on the premises. There were 628 reported residential robberies in 1981 making up 13% of the reported robberies. The total dollar value involved in residential robberies was \$420,406 with an average dollar value of \$669 per incident.

The bank category includes savings and loan institutions, credit unions, building and loan associations, etc. There were 30 robberies pertaining to banking institutions that were reported to law enforcement officials in 1981. This is 1% of the total reported robberies in Alabama. The total dollar amount stolen from banking institutions was \$180,393 with \$6,013 being the average amount stolen.

The miscellaneous category includes, churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit

systems, offices, etc. Twelve percent of the reported robberies were listed in this category. There were 575 actual cases reported for a total dollar value of \$237,474. This produces an average of \$413 per incident.

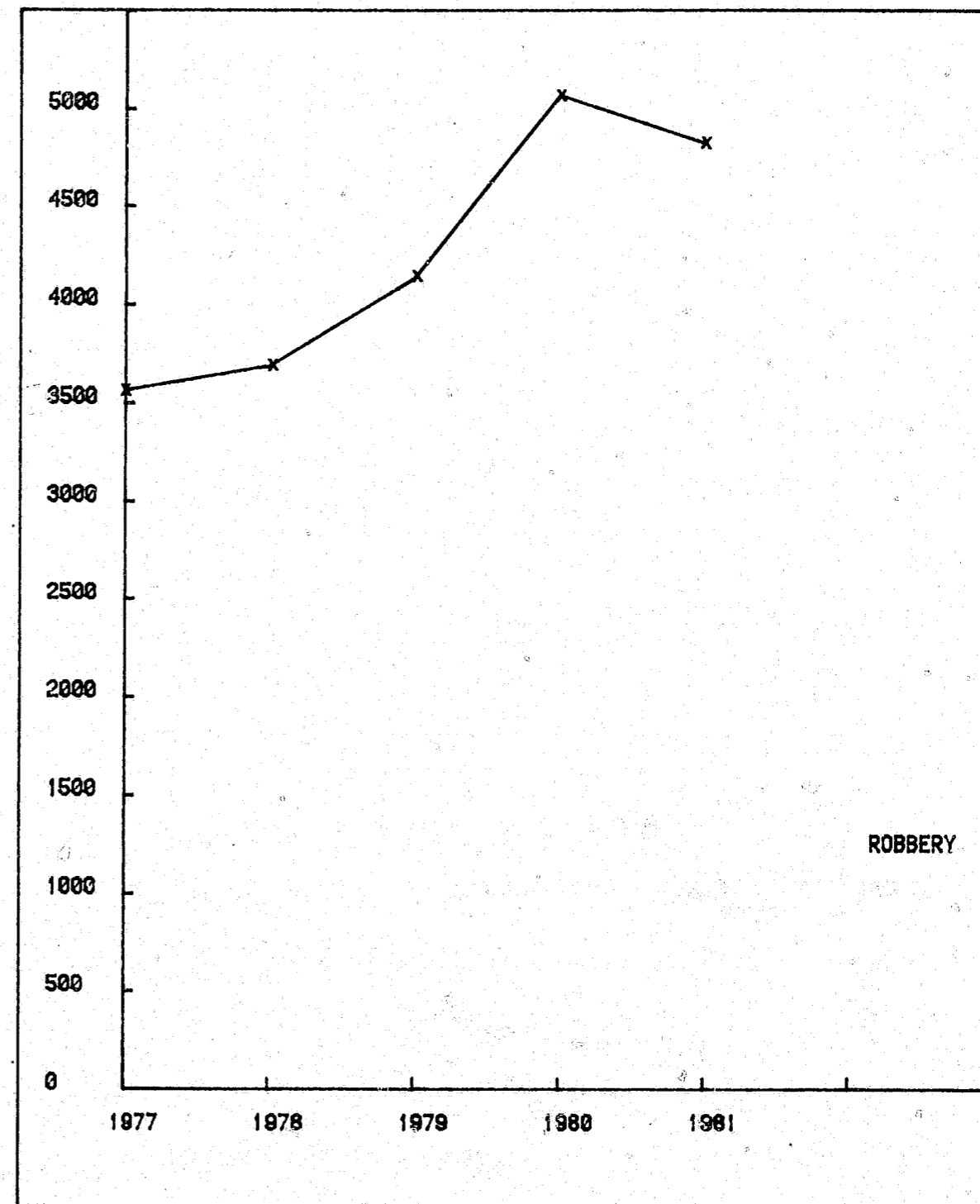

There were 11,618 reported assaults in 1981, a 12% increase over 1980. The assault rate was 298.7 per 100,000 people. Assaults comprised 65% of the Violent Crimes and 6% of the Total Index offenses.

A total of 5,995 assaults were cleared in 1981 producing a 52% clearance rate. Assault clearances made up 70% of the Violent Crime clearances and 19% of the total clearances for Part I offenses.

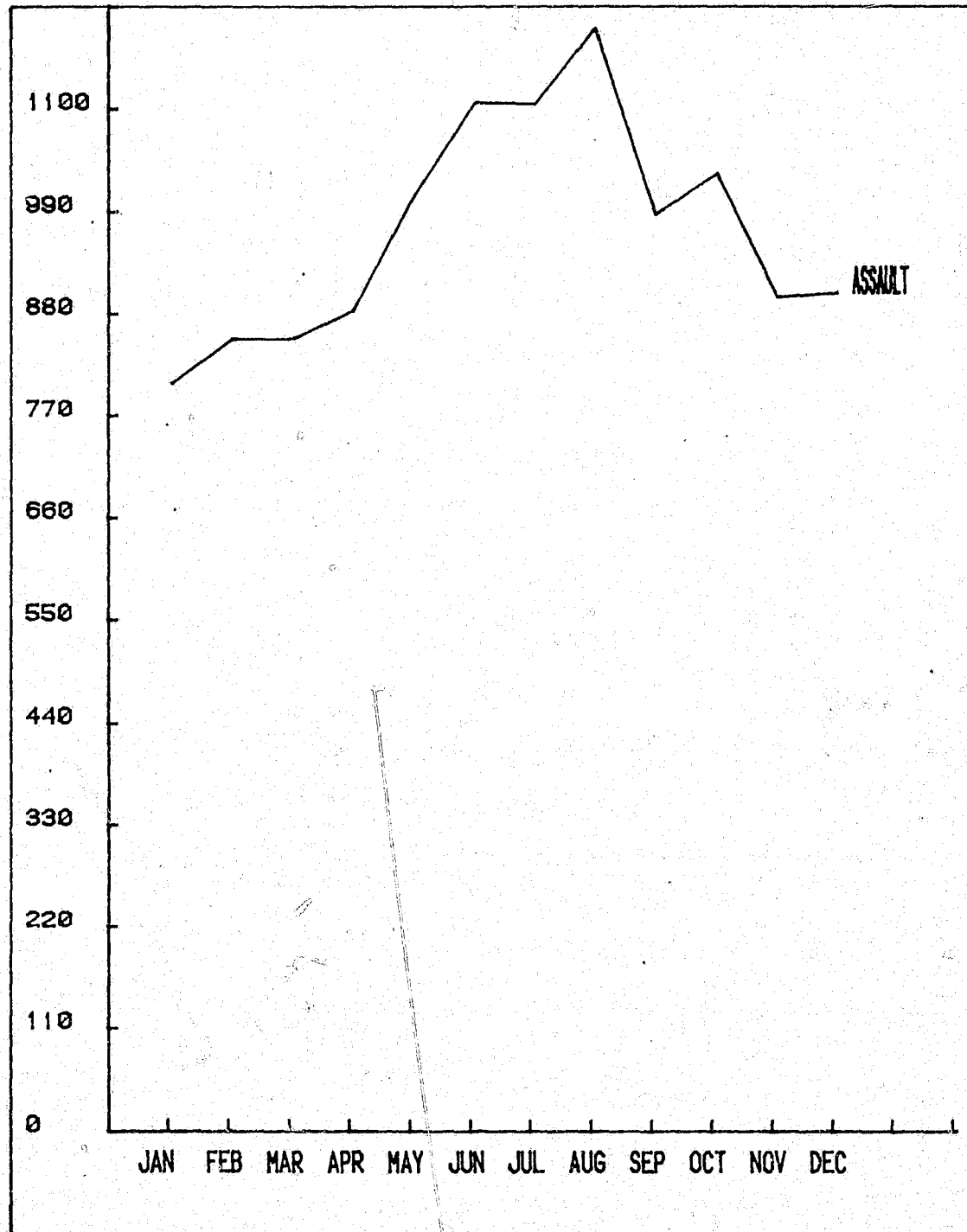

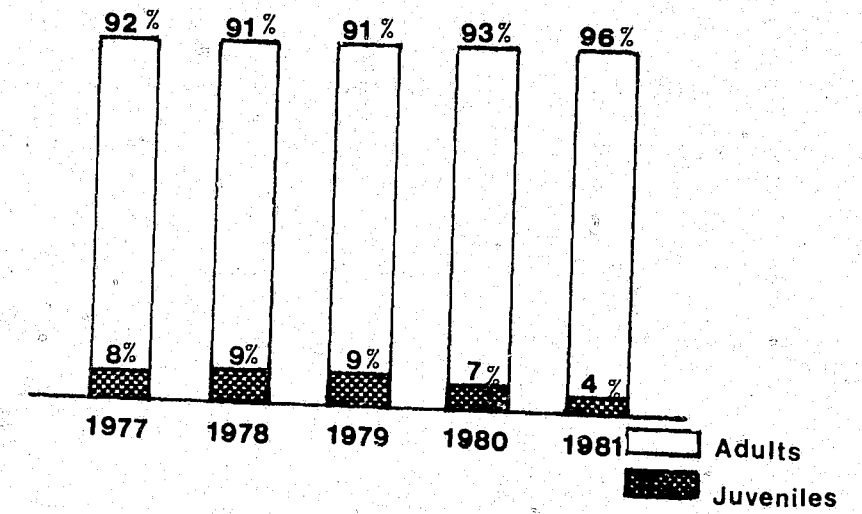

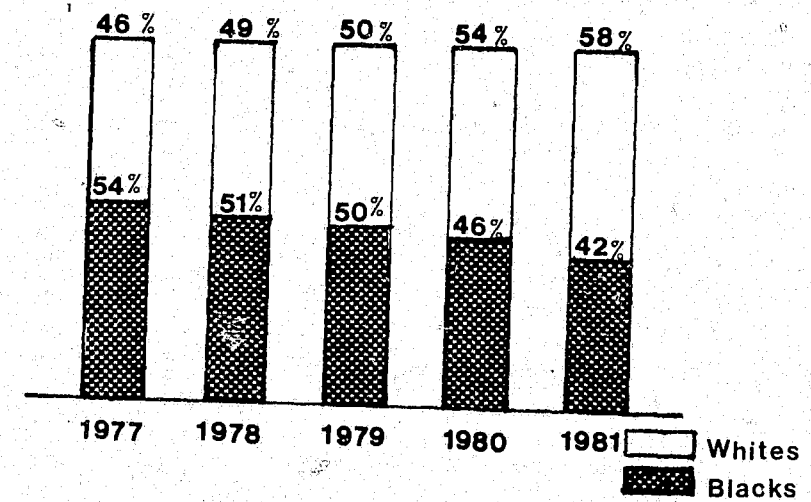


Arrest Trends by Age

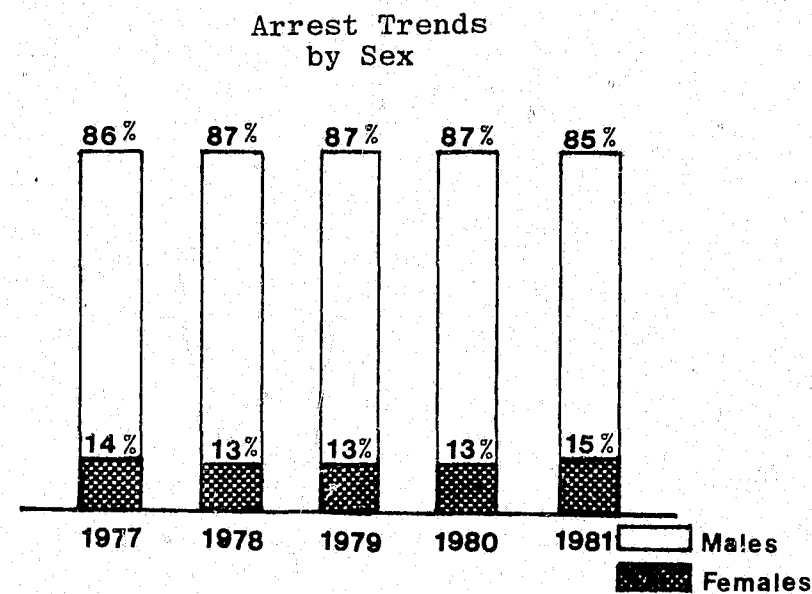

Arrest Trends by Race



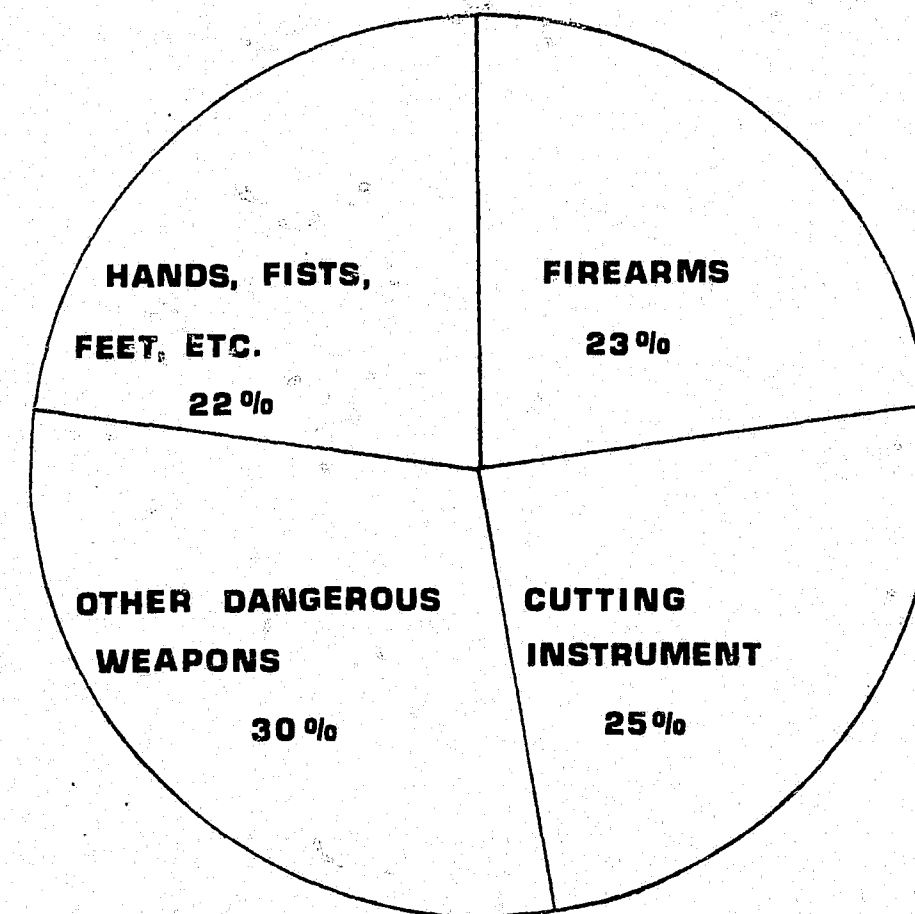

Weapon Type

Aggravated assault is sometimes accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. In 24% of the reported aggravated assault incidents, a firearm was used. Of these assaults, 46% were cleared with 2% being cleared by juveniles. A knife or cutting instrument resulted in 25% of the reported assaults effecting a 47% clearance rate. Four percent of the

clearances were juveniles. Thirty percent of the reported assaults were a result of other dangerous weapons; this category has a clearance rate of 41% with a 3% juvenile clearance rate. Aggravated assaults in which the assailant used hands, fists, feet, etc., resulted in 22% of the reported assaults; 49% of these assaults were cleared; the juvenile clearance rate was 5%.

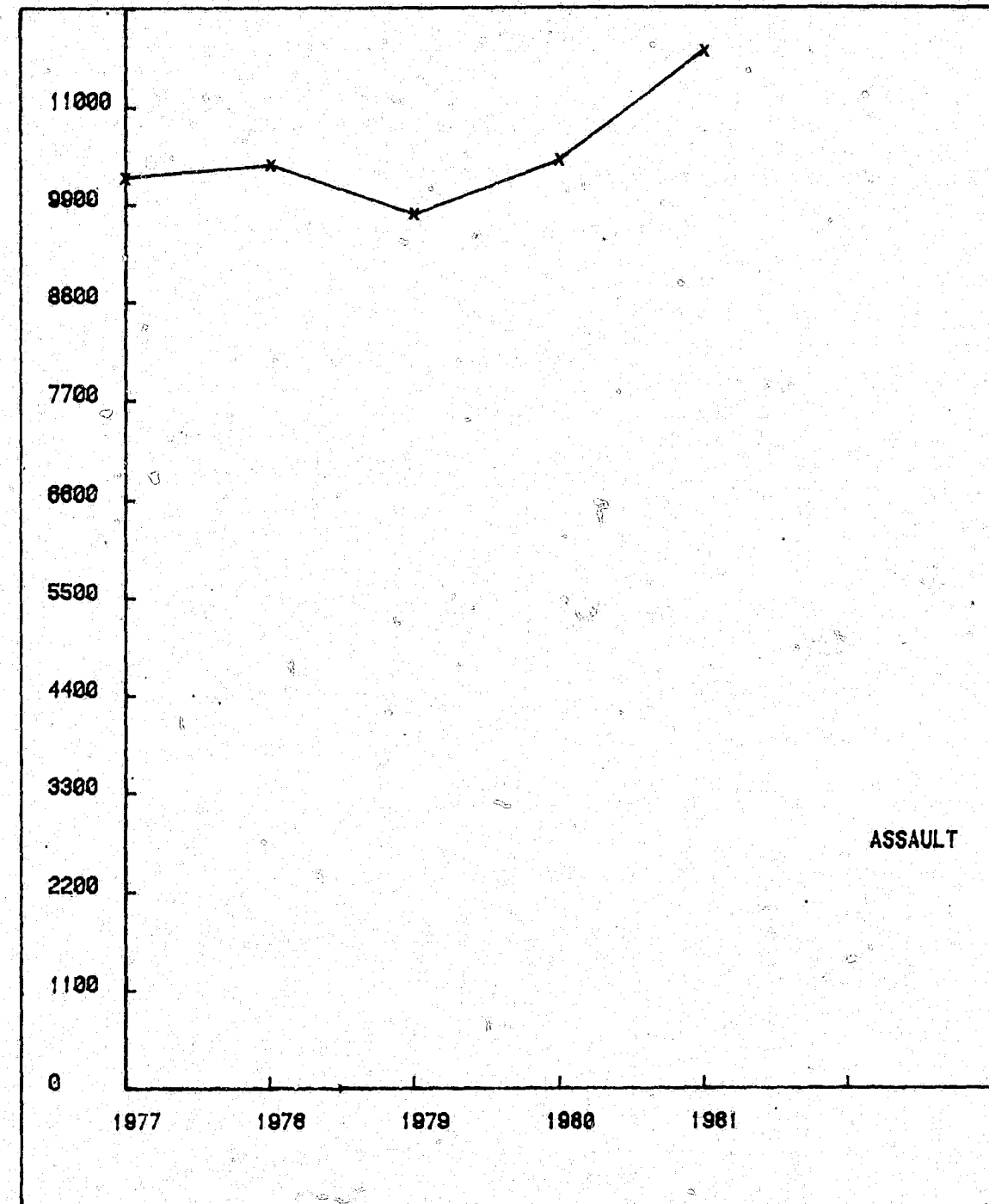

Offense and Clearance Data

Reported burglaries decreased by 6% in 1981 over 1980. There were 54,918 burglaries reported in 1981 compared to 58,232 for 1980. The burglary rate, likewise, experienced a decrease, going from 1507.2 in 1980 to 1411.8 per 100,000 residents in 1981, this is a 6% decrease.

A total of 6,715 burglaries were cleared in 1981 for a 12% clearance rate. Burglary clearances comprised 28% of the Property Crime clearances and 21% of the total clearances.

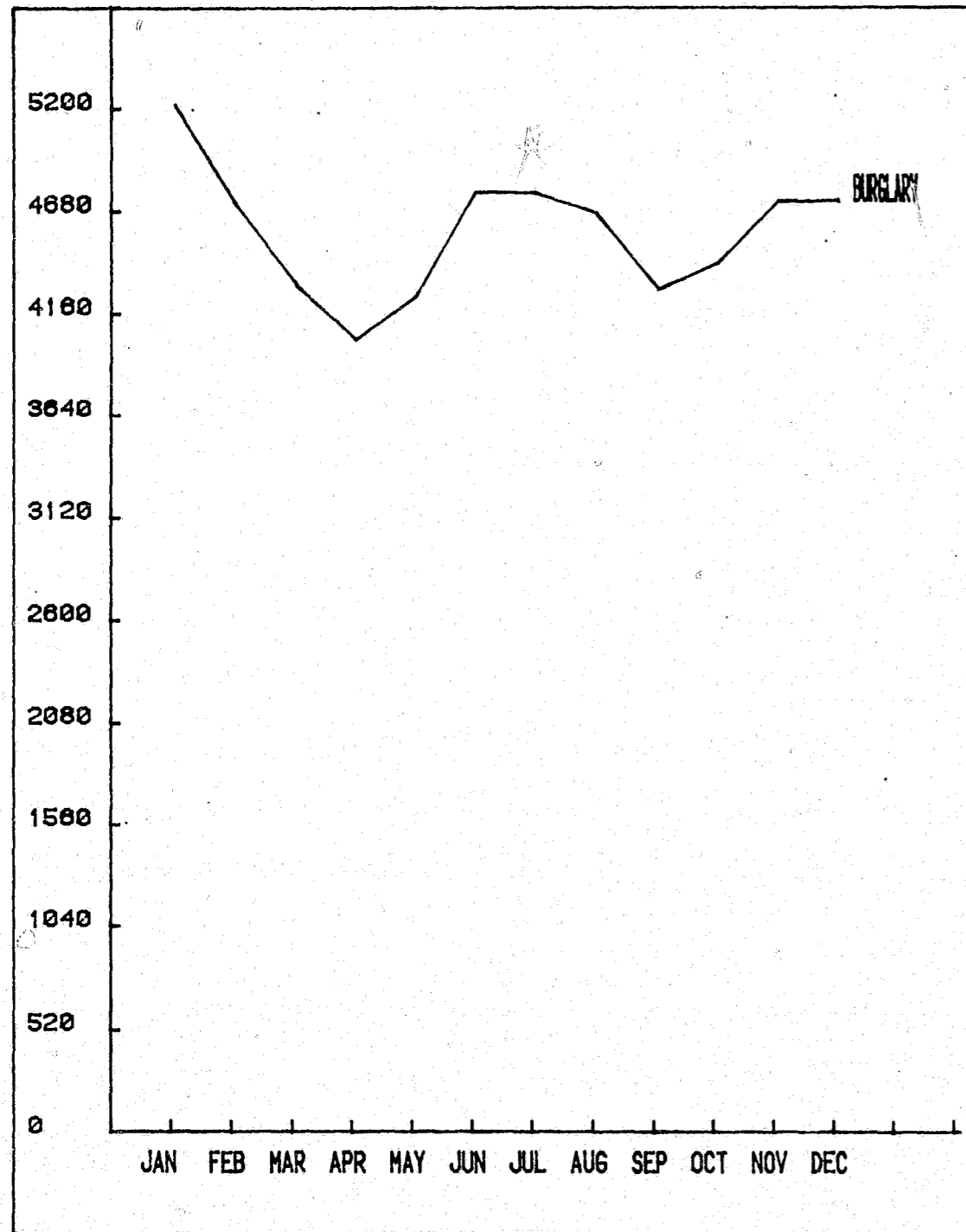

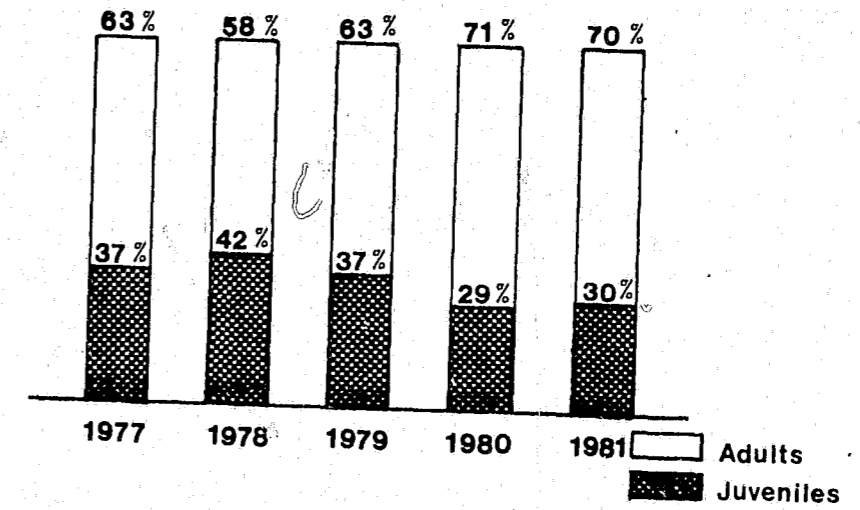

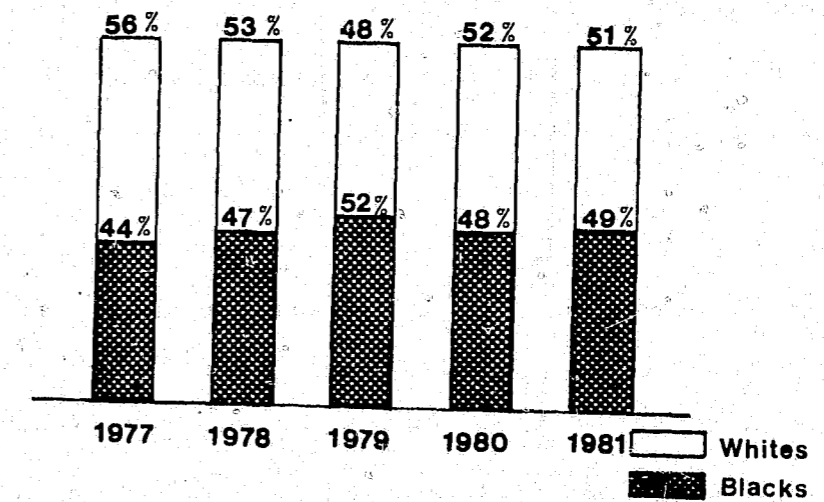


Arrest Trends by Age

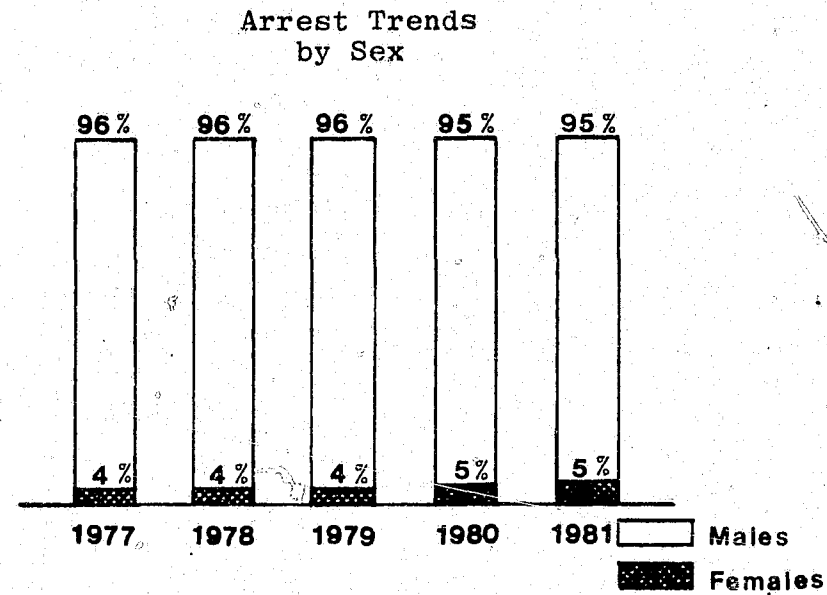

Ninety-five percent of those arrested for burglary were males. This ratio has remained fairly constant over the five year period 1977 - 1981.



Burglary Classifications

In 1981, there were 45,281 reported burglaries classified as forcible entry; this is 82% of the reported burglaries. Twelve percent were cleared with 3% being cleared by juvenile arrests. There were 6,897 unlawful entries reported in 1981. An unlawful entry involves an unlocked door or window, no force is applied but the element of trespass is essential. Thirteen percent of the reported burglaries were unlawful entries and 12% of those were cleared with 3% being juvenile clearances. There were 2,740 cases of attempted forcible entry reported to police in 1981 for 5% of the reported burglaries. Twelve percent of these cases were cleared with 3% being juvenile clearances.

Residential and Non-Residential Burglaries

Burglaries are divided into residential and non-residential burglaries by time of day. Residential burglaries comprised 64% of all reported burglaries. In 1981, 11,798 daytime* burglaries of a residence were reported for 34% of the reported residential burglaries. A total dollar value of \$9,840,342 was stolen producing an average figure of \$834 per incident. Nighttime burglaries of residences comprised 20% of the residential burglaries with an estimated value of \$4,089,243 stolen for an average amount of \$600. Forty-six percent of the residential burglaries occurred at an unknown time. These burglaries resulted in a total dollar value of \$11,428,923 worth of property stolen effecting an average dollar amount per incident of \$692.

Non-residential burglaries comprised 36% of the total reported burglaries in 1981. Of the non-residential burglaries, 31% occurred at night with 8% occurring during daylight hours; 61% of the non-residential burglaries occurred at unknown times.

There were 6,217 nighttime non-residential burglaries reported in 1981 for a total dollar value of \$3,229,747 stolen for an average dollar value of \$520 per incident. A total of 1,483 daytime non-residential burglaries were reported for a total value of \$611,789 producing a \$413 average per incident. The 12,097 non-residential burglaries, committed at unknown times, effected a value of \$6,442,430 worth of property stolen for an average dollar value of \$533.

*Day is designated as the hours between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Night is considered 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

In 1981, the total number of reported residential burglaries was 35,121. The estimated dollar amounts stolen in residential burglaries last year was \$25,358,508 for an average of \$722 per incident. The 19,797 non-residential burglaries made up 36% of all reported burglaries. The estimated dollar values stolen in non-residential burglaries was \$10,283,966 for an average of \$519. All totalled, there were 54,918 burglaries reported to law enforcement officials in 1981. An estimated value of \$35,642,474 was stolen for an average of \$649 per incident.

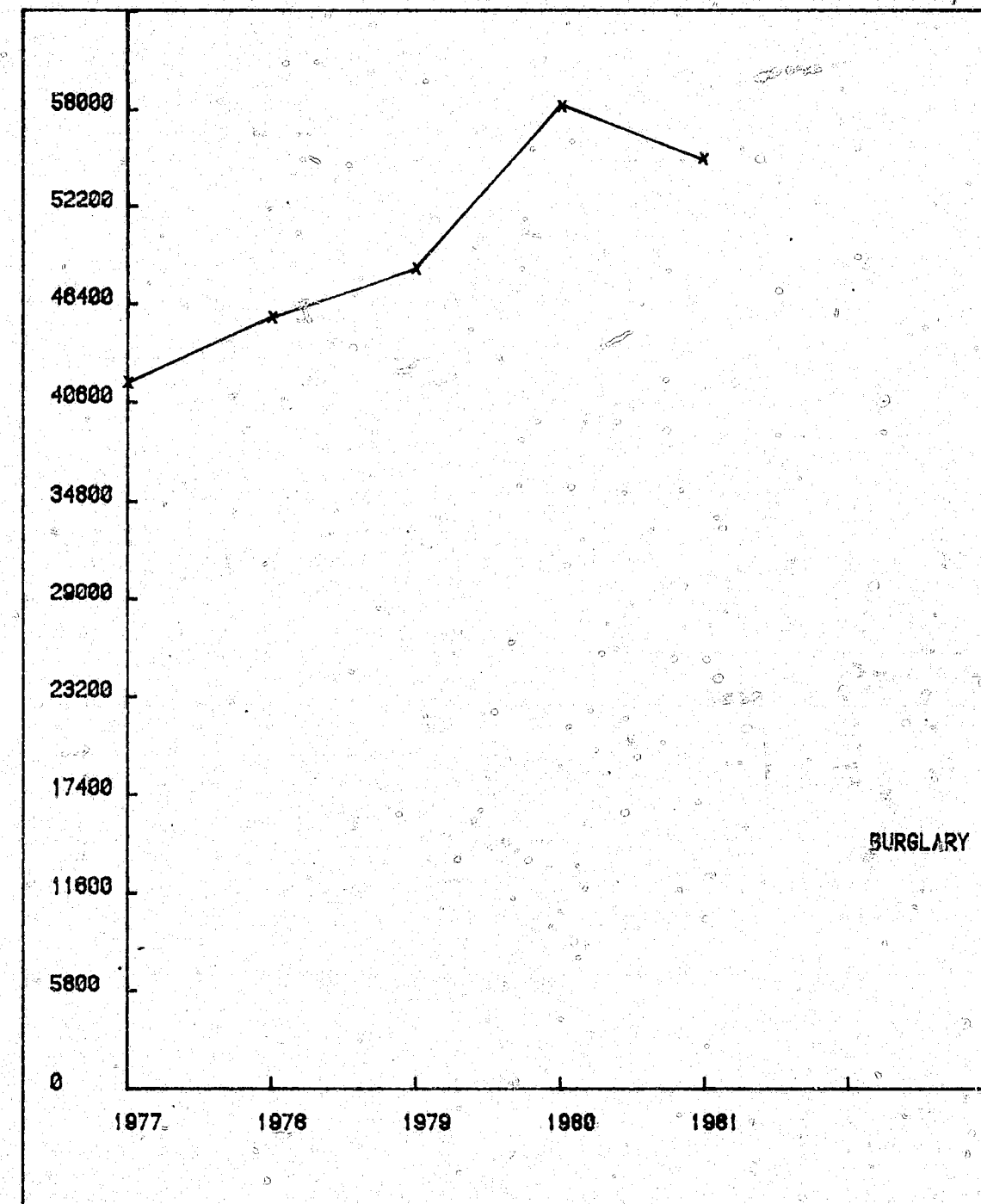

Offense and Clearance Data

In 1981, reported larceny experienced a 2% increase over 1980 totals. Reported incidences of larceny rose from 100,744 in 1980 to 102,789 in 1981. The larceny rate showed an increase of 1% in 1981, from 2207.4 incidents per 100,000 people in 1980 to 2642.3 cases in 1981.

There were 15,179 clearances for larceny in 1981 producing a 15% clearance rate. These larceny clearances comprise 64% of the Property Crime clearances and 47% of the Part I Crime clearances.

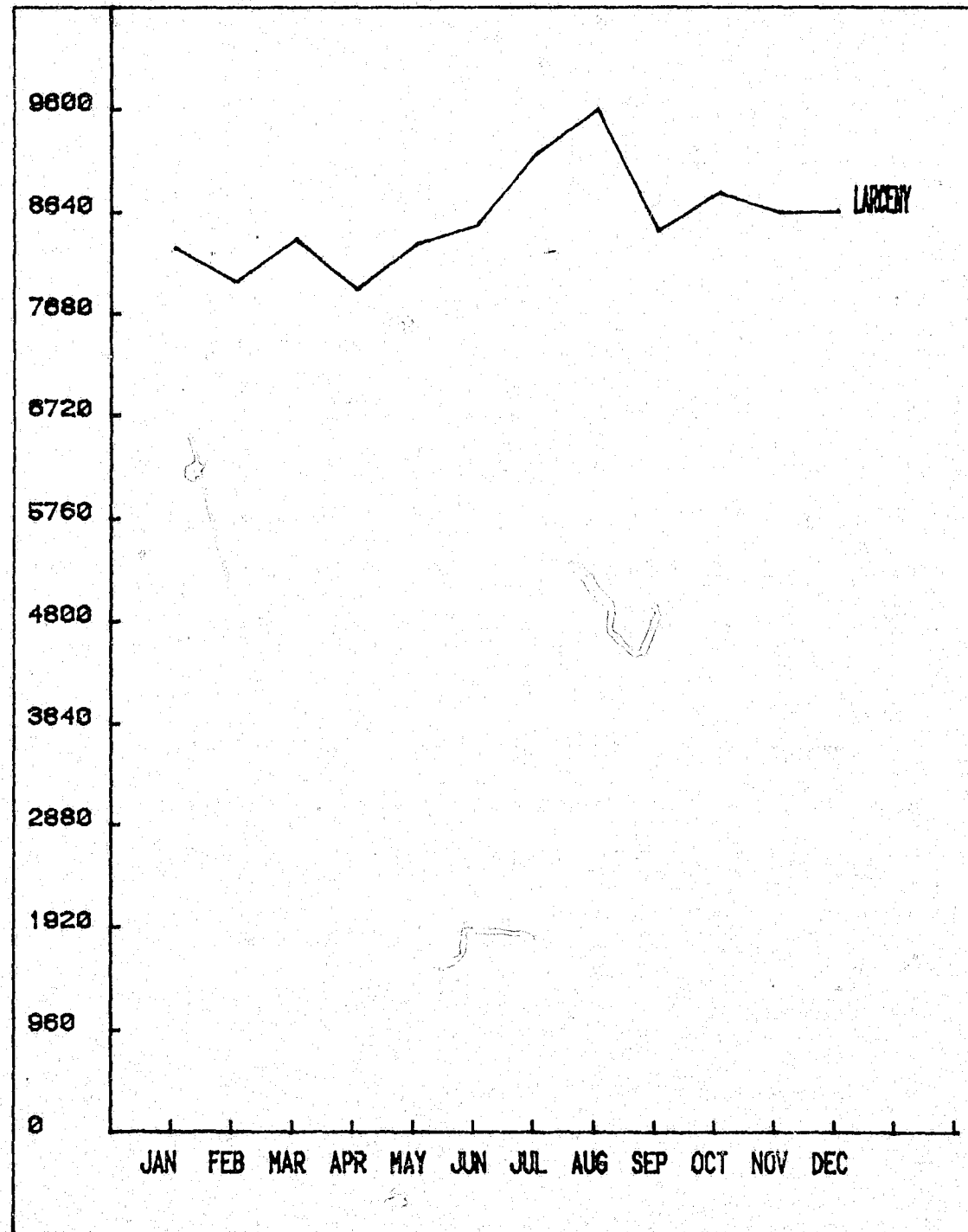

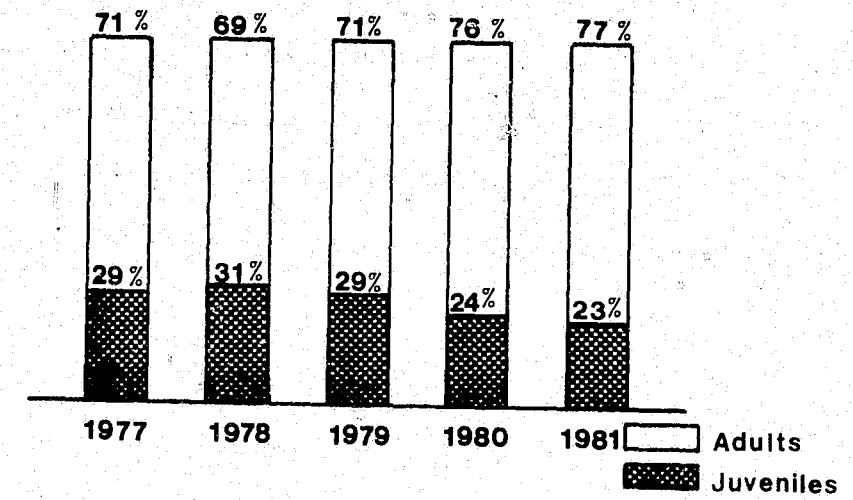

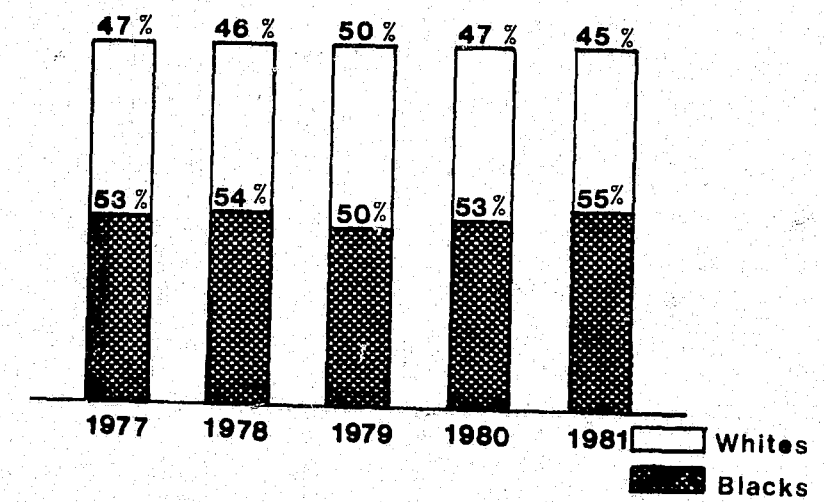


Arrest Trends by Age

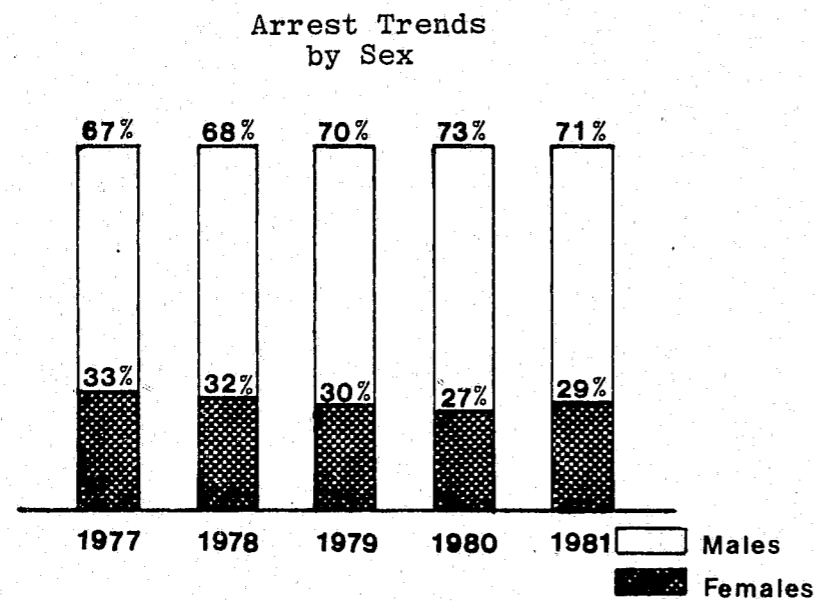

Thefts from motor vehicles accounted for 17,653 incidences or 17% of reported larcenies in Alabama. The average dollar value of thefts involving motor vehicle parts and accessories was

\$228 per incident; the average dollar value of thefts from motor vehicles was \$281.

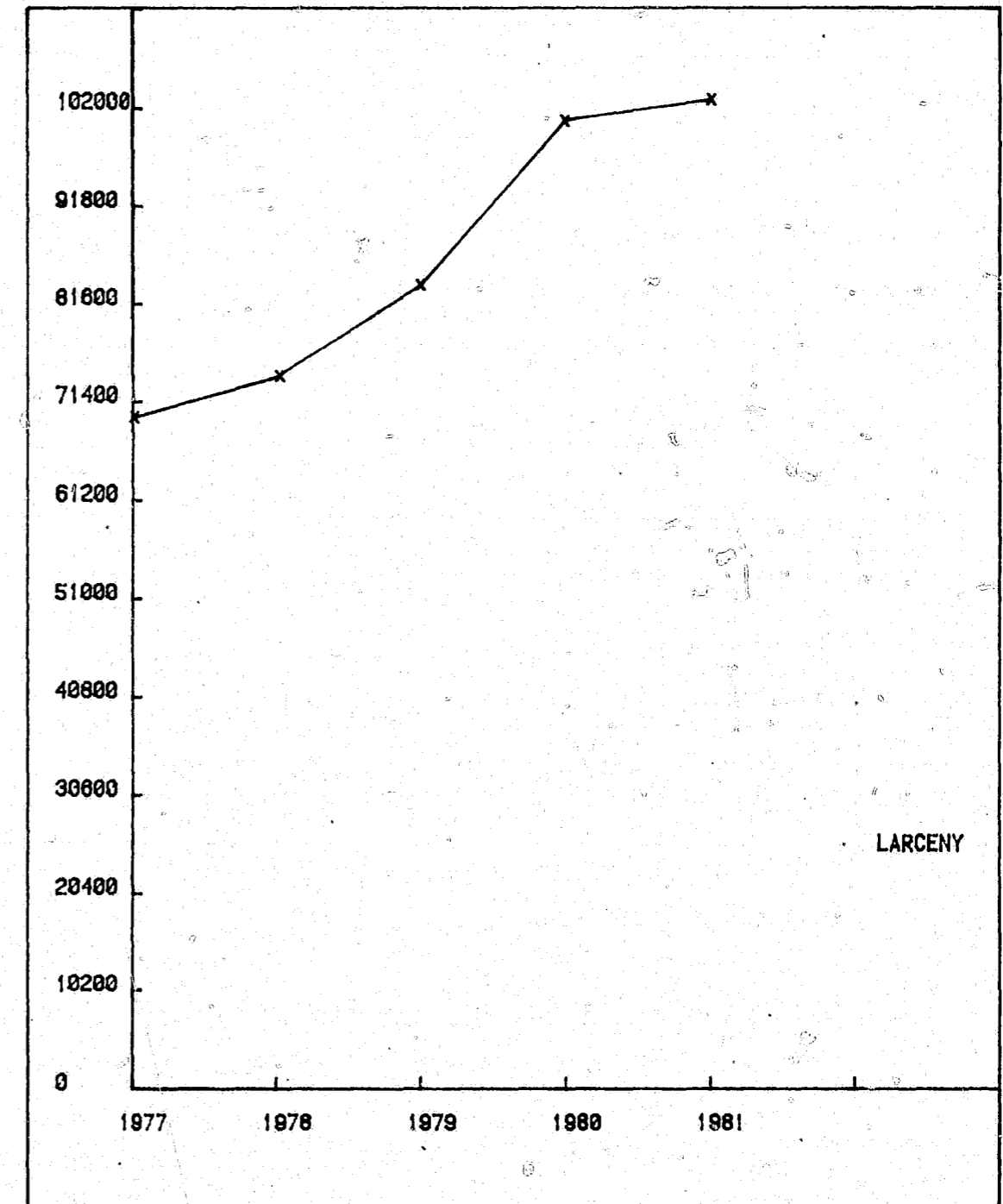

Offense and Clearance Data

Motor Vehicle Theft (MVT) decreased from 11,969 incidents in 1980 to 10,893 reported cases in 1981 for a 9% decrease. The MVT rate* for Alabama in 1981 was 220.4 thefts for every 100,000 vehicles.

A total of 1,982 MVT's were cleared in 1981 for an 18% clearance rate. Clearances for MVT make up 8% of the Property Crime clearances and 6% of the Total clearances.

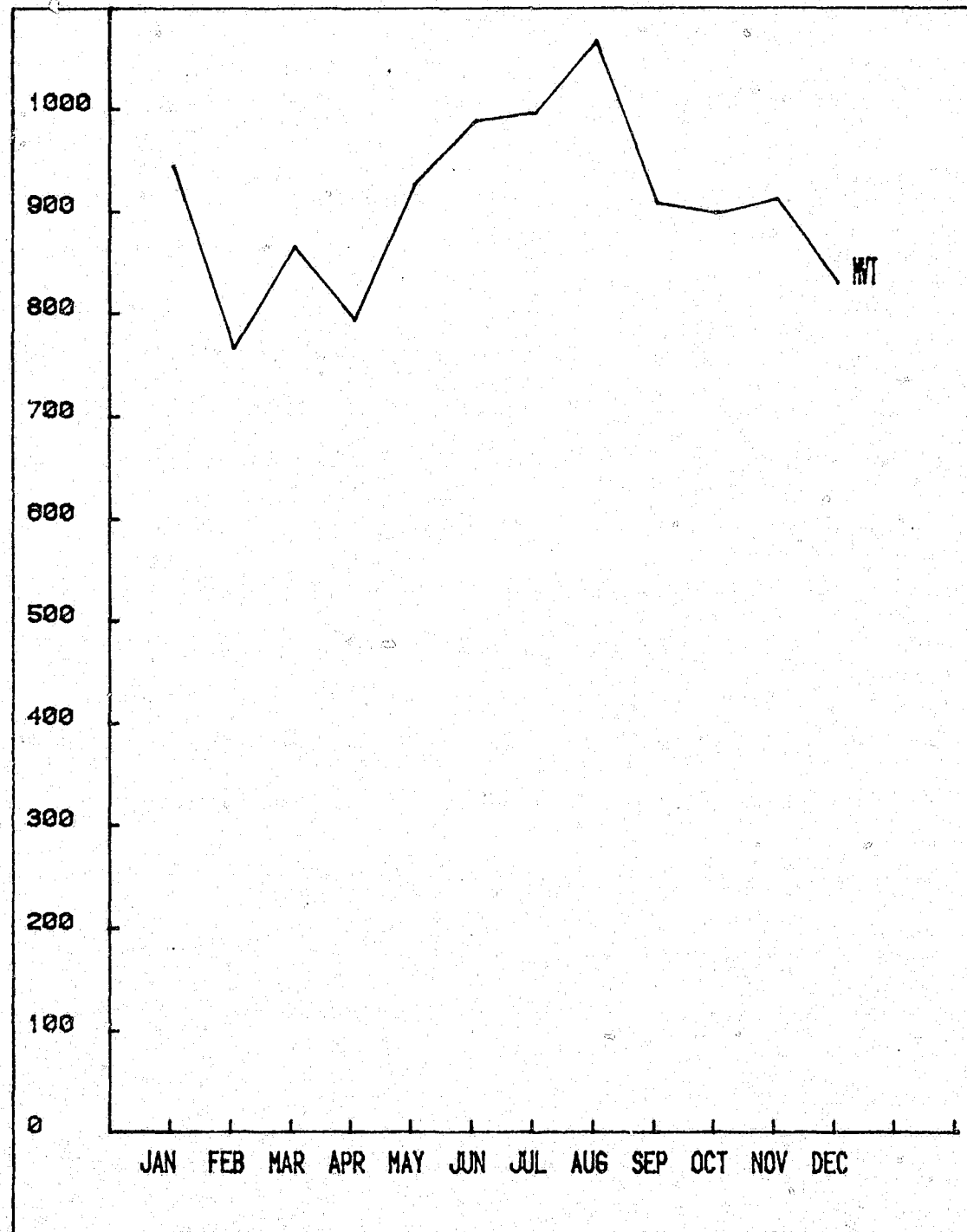

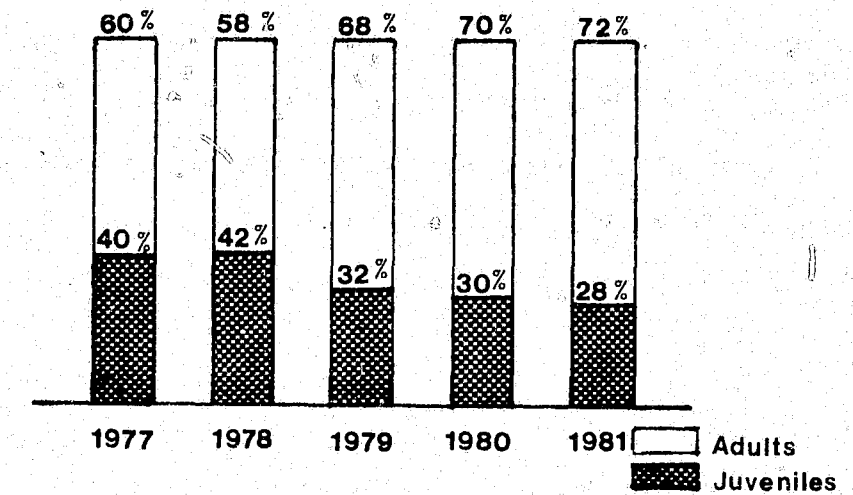

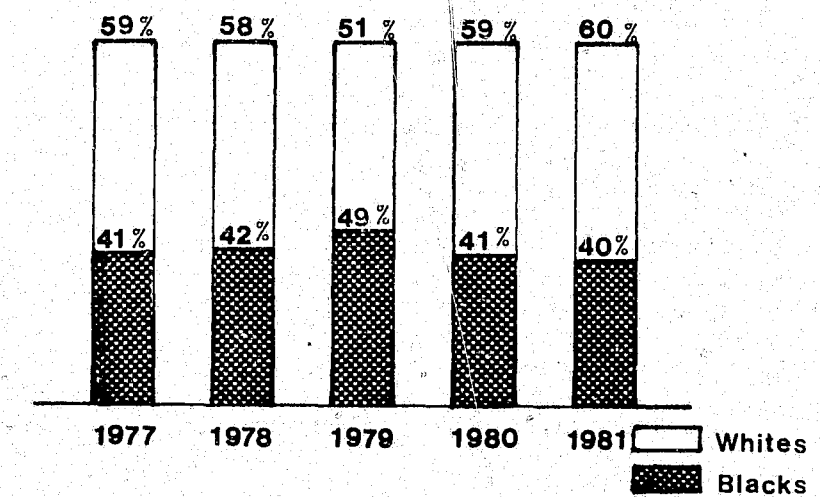

by Age

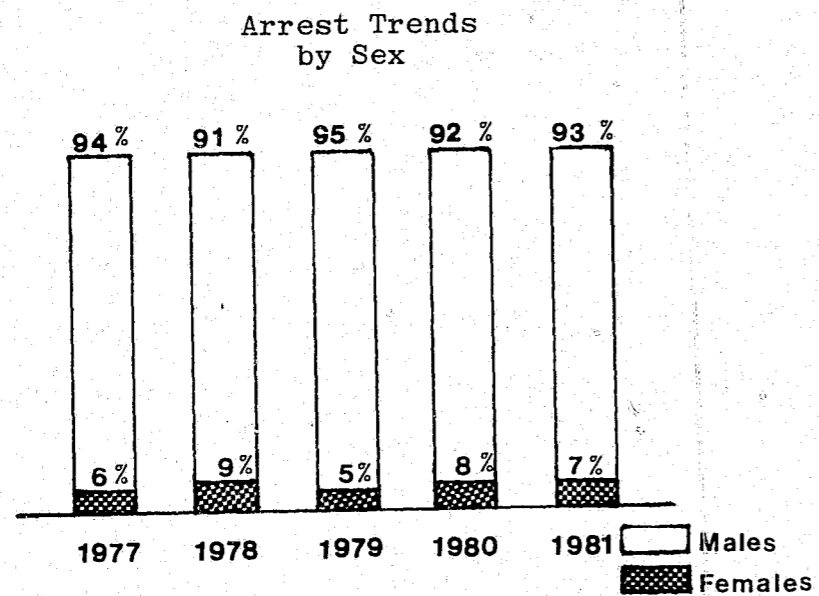

There were 7,771 automobiles stolen last year with 1,476 cases cleared for a 19% clearance rate. Trucks and buses accounted for 1,920 thefts with 299 clearances for a 16% clearance rate. There were 1,202 thefts reported in the "other" category with 207 clearances for a 17% clearance rate.

Motor Vehicles Recovered

It should be noted that a recovery involves locating stolen property; but, a recovery does not clear a crime. Even though the owner is reunited with his property a crime was committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to clear the offense.

The number of motor vehicles stolen locally and recovered locally was 4,482. The vehicles stolen locally but recovered in other jurisdictions was 1,848. The number of vehicles stolen in other jurisdictions but recovered locally was 1,484.

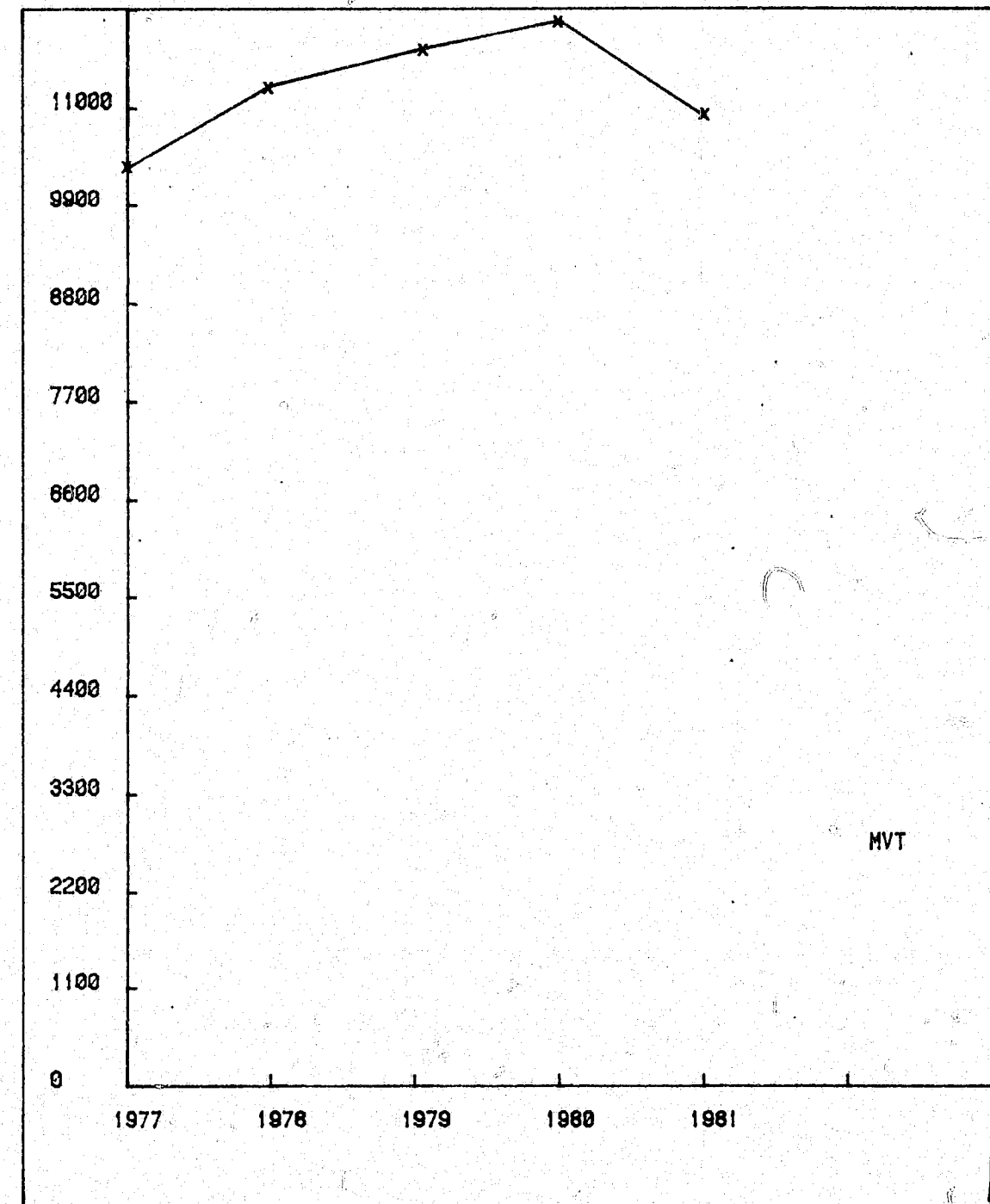

Arson - willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts. It should be noted that the hierarchy rule does not apply to arson, meaning that any offense(s) committed in conjunction with arson results in the most serious offense, as well as the arson incident, being reported to UCR.

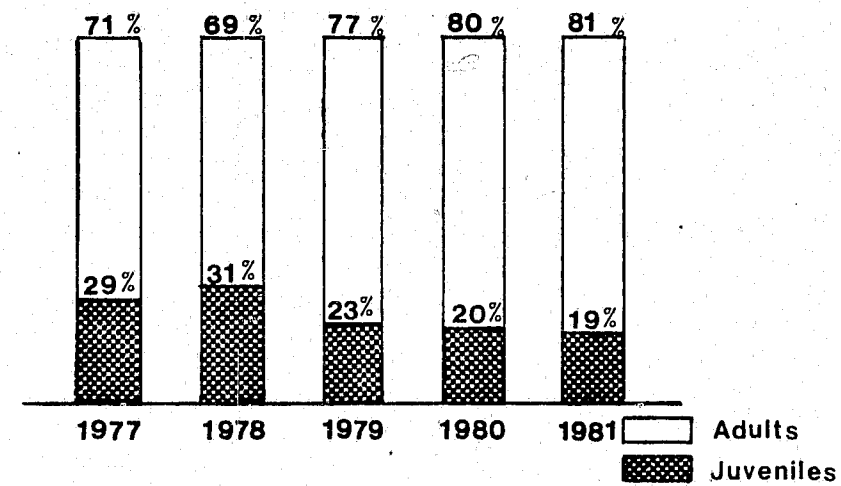
Offense and Clearance Data

In 1981, a total of 1,217 incidents of arson were reported to Alabama's law enforcement agencies. This is a 10% increase over 1980. In 1981, a total of 1,217 arsons were reported as compared to 1,106 incidents reported in 1980. There were 229 arsons cleared in 1981 effecting a 19% clearance rate. Juveniles accounted for 5% of the clearances.

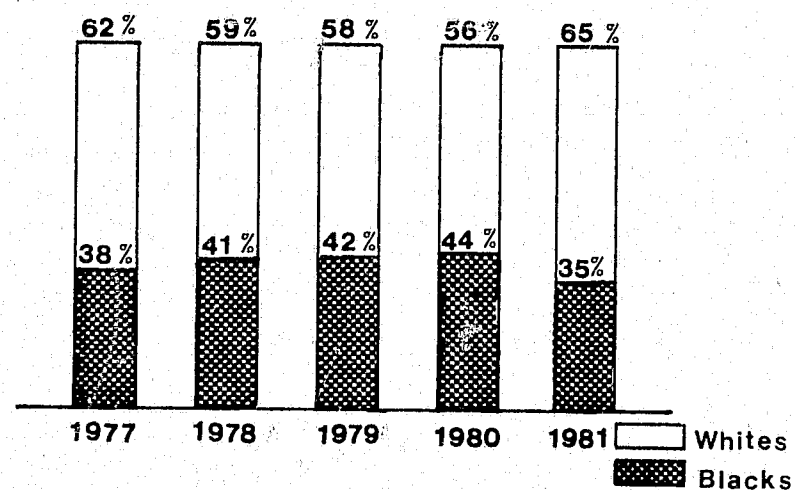

by Age



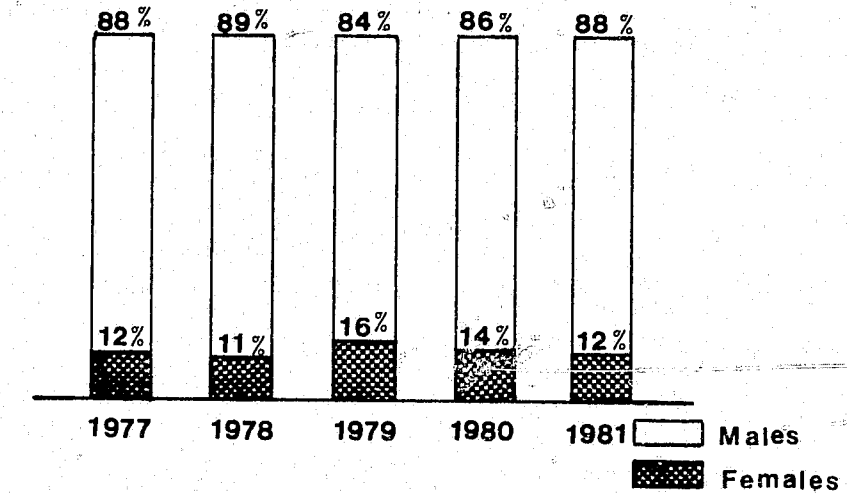

Arson By Type

Structural units, mobile property and "other" are the classifications used in reporting arson. Sixty-eight percent of the reported arson in Alabama involved structural units; 24% involved mobile property, and the remaining 8% fell into the "other" category. Clearance data indicate that 21% of the arsons involving structural units were cleared, with a 14% clearance rate for mobile property and 15% clearance rate for the "other" category.

In 23% of the reported arsons, the structures involved were uninhabited, abandoned, or not normally in use. The total estimated value of property damage in Alabama resulting from arson in 1981 was \$12,895,775. This produces an average of \$10,596 per incident.

Single occupancy residences made up 60% of the structural arsons and 41% of the total reported arson in Alabama in 1981. Of the 497 single occupancy arsons, 100 were cleared for a 20% clearance rate; juvenile arrests cleared 7%. The arson rate* for single occupancy residences was 33.9 per 100,000 housing units. The arson rate is considerably higher for unoccupied or uninhabited single occupancy structures, 139.7 per 100,000 unoccupied housing units. The estimated value of property damage for single occupancy residences was \$4,363,705 for an average of \$8,780 per incident.

Other residences, which include apartments, dormitories, boarding houses, etc., made up 10% of the structural arson incidences. Of these 83 residential arsons, 33 were cleared for a 40% clearance rate. Juveniles accounted for 8% of the clearances. The arson rate* for residential units other than single occupancy dwellings was 5.7 per 100,000 housing units. The arson rate for these uninhabited residential structures was 9.4 per 100,000 unoccupied structures. The estimated value of property damage due to arson for other residential units

*This arson rate is based on the number of housing units in Alabama as reported by the U.S. Census of Housing (1980).

was \$1,959,615 averaging \$23,609.8 per incident.

Forty-six of the reported arsons in Alabama in 1981 affected storage buildings such as barns, warehouses, garages, etc. This is 6% of the structural arsons and 4% of the total number of arsons reported to Alabama's law enforcement agencies. Seven percent of these arsons were cleared with 2% being juvenile clearances. Fifteen, or 33%, of these arsons occurred in buildings which were unoccupied or abandoned. The property damage estimate for storage buildings was \$156,250 producing an average of \$3,397 per incident.

Industrial/manufacturing buildings experienced 2% of the structural arsons in 1981, reporting seventeen incidents. Two offenses were cleared for a 12% clearance rate. There were two instances of arson of an uninhabited structure. The estimated property damage totalled \$434,300 with an average of \$25,547 per incident.

One hundred twelve incidents of arson were reported involving commercial establishments, i.e., restaurants, stores, offices, etc.; this is 14% of the reported arson against structural units. Seventeen of these arsons were cleared for a 15% clearance rate. Juveniles accounted for 5% of the clearances. In 7% of the incidents, the structure was uninhabited or not normally in use. Estimated property damage was \$3,784,570 producing an average per incident of \$33,791.

Community or public buildings such as schools, jails,

churches, hospitals, etc., experienced 44 incidents for 5% of the reported structural arsons. Fifteen of the 44 reported offenses were solved for a clearance rate of 34%. Juvenile arrests accounted for 16% of the clearances. The estimated property damage for public buildings was \$827,125 for an average per incident value of \$18,798.

There were 26 reported arsons which involved buildings other than those previously mentioned. These buildings include monuments, outbuildings, buildings under construction, etc. Twelve percent of these arsons were cleared and they were cleared by juvenile arrests. Property damage is estimated at \$124,000 for an average of \$4,769 per incident.

All totalled, there were 825 reported incidents of arson involving structural units. Of the 825 arsons, 173 were cleared for a clearance rate of 21%; 7% of the clearances involved juveniles. In 187 incidents, the buildings were uninhabited, abandoned, or not normally in use. The total estimated property damage for structural units was \$11,649,565 with an average of \$14,121 per incident.

Twenty-four percent of the total reported arson in 1981 involved mobile property. For the purpose of reporting arson data, mobile property consists of motor vehicles and "other" mobile property.

By UCR definition, motor vehicles include automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc. In 1981, there were 290

arsons which involved motor vehicles. This was 80% of the arson against mobile property and 19% of all reported arson. Thirty-one of these offenses were cleared for a 13% clearance rate; juveniles accounted for 4% of the clearances. The arson rate* was 5.9 arsons per 100,000 motor vehicles. Estimated property damage for motor vehicle arson was \$634,535 averaging \$2,735 per incident.

There were 58 reported incidents of arson of "other" mobile property. "Other" mobile property includes trailers, recreational vehicles, airplanes, boats, etc. Ten offenses were cleared producing a 17% clearance rate. The estimated property damage was \$576,235 averaging \$9,935 per incident.

A total of 290 mobile property arsons were reported to law enforcement agencies in 1981. This is 24% of all reported arson. Forty-one of these incidents were cleared for a 14% clearance rate. Juvenile arrests cleared 4%. Mobile property damage due to arson was estimated at \$1,210,770 for an average of \$4,175 per incident.

The miscellaneous or "all other" category includes crops, timber, fences, signs, etc. In 1981, a total of 102 incidents were reported in this category. This is 8% of the total number of arson incidents known to law enforcement agencies

in 1981. Fifteen of these offenses were cleared for a 15% clearance rate; juvenile arrests accounted for 10% of the clearances. The estimated value of property destroyed in the "other property" category was \$35,440 for an average cost per incident of \$347.

In summary, there were 1,217 arsons reported to Alabama's law enforcement agencies in 1981. Arson experienced a 19% clearance rate with juveniles accounting for 6% of the clearances. All totalled, property damage from arson was estimated at \$12,895,775 for Alabama in 1981. An average cost per incident was estimated at \$10,596.

Trends

Prior to 1979, Arson was classified as a Part II Offense with only arrest data being collected for UCR purposes. As a result of Congressional authorization* in 1979, Arson was designated a Part I Offense thereby requiring law enforcement agencies to submit reported offenses, unfounded complaints, actual offenses, clearances, juvenile clearances, arson of uninhabited or abandoned structures and estimated value of property damage.

*Title 28, Section 534, United States Code.

Arson increased by 60% over 1979. This increase is probably a result of better reporting procedures considering 1979 was the first year arson offenses were collected; there is only a 10% increase in arson from 1980 to 1981.

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A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and, therefore, it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.

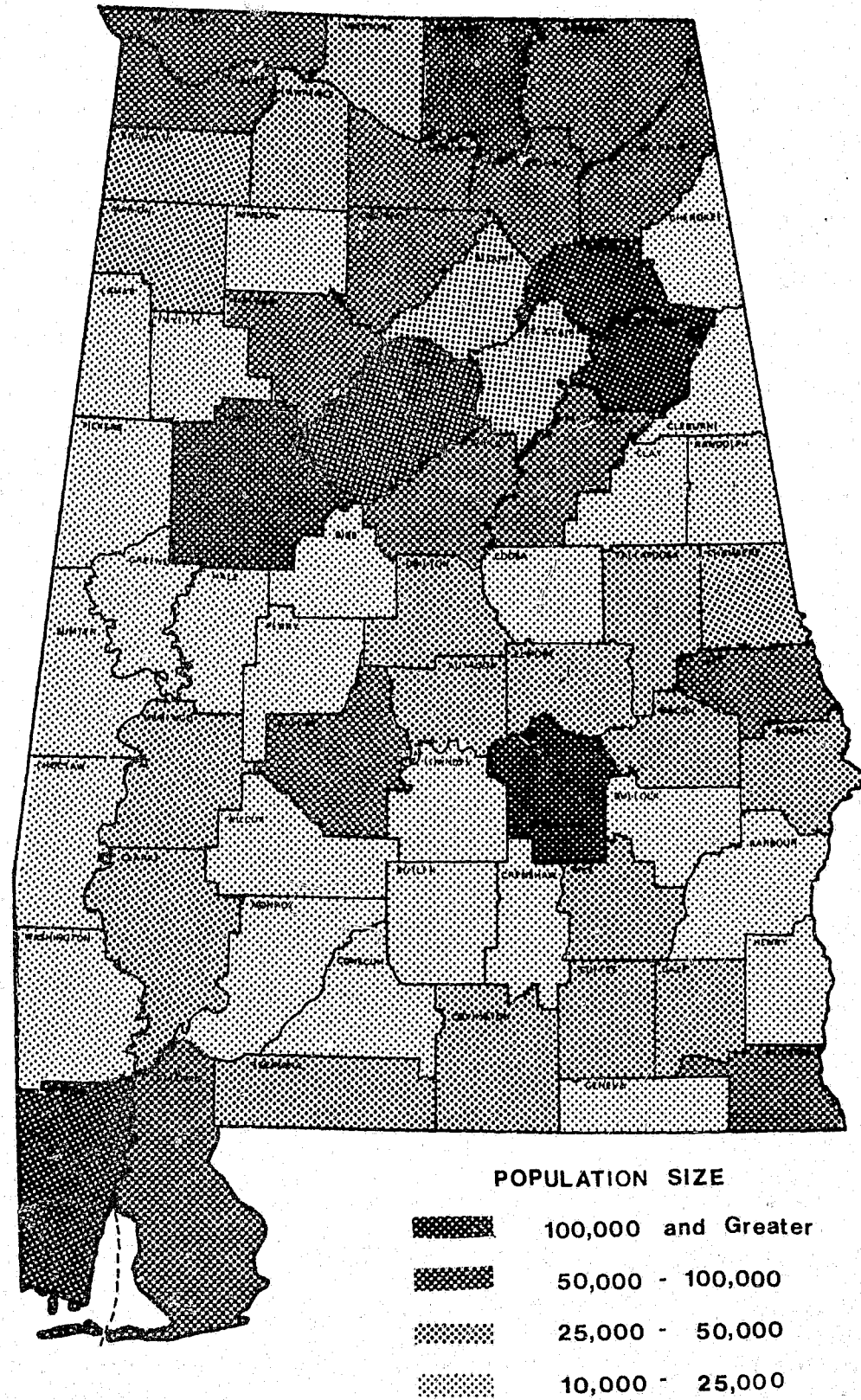

A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and, therefore, it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.

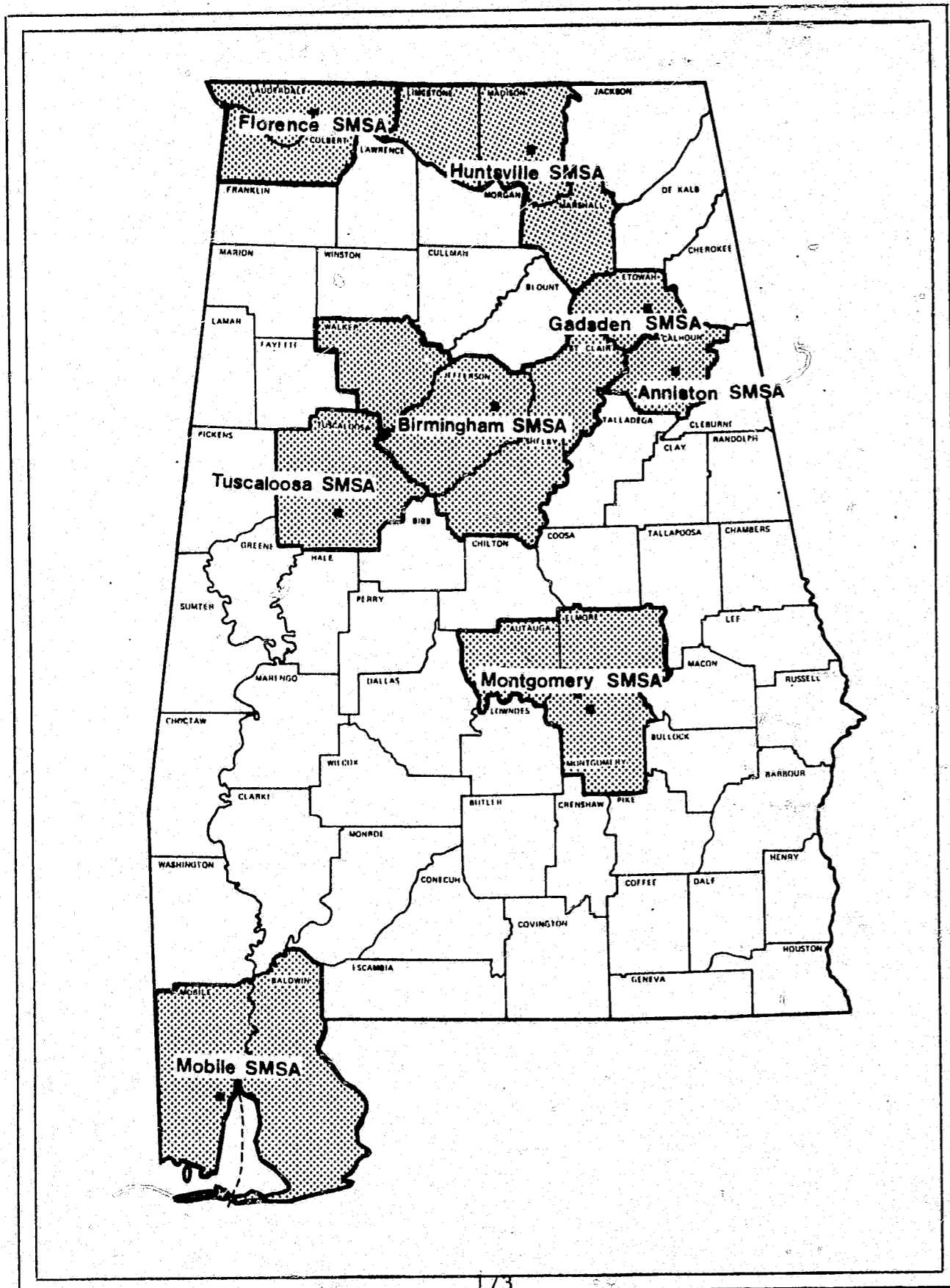

PART II ARREST DATA

Part II Offenses include crimes other than those defined as Part I Offenses. The nature of many Part II Offenses is such that they go undetected until an arrest is made; therefore, for UCR purposes, only arrest data is collected. Part II Offenses include:

- . Other Assaults - nonaggravated assaults.
- . Forgery and Counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.
- . Fraud - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.
- . Embezzlement - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.
- . Stolen Property - buying, receiving and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.
- . Vandalism - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.
- . Weapons - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.

- . Prostitution and Commercialized Vice - sex offenses of a commercialized nature.
- . Sex Offenses (other than forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice) - statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.
- . Narcotic Drug Laws - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing, and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.
- . Gambling - promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.
- . Offenses Against the Family and Children - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.
- . Driving Under the Influence - driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
- . Liquor Laws - violations of state or local liquor laws.
- . Drunkenness - drunkenness or intoxication.
- . Disorderly conduct - breach of the peace.
- . Vagrancy - begging, loitering, etc.
- . All Other Offenses - all violations of state or local laws, excepting categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses and traffic violations.

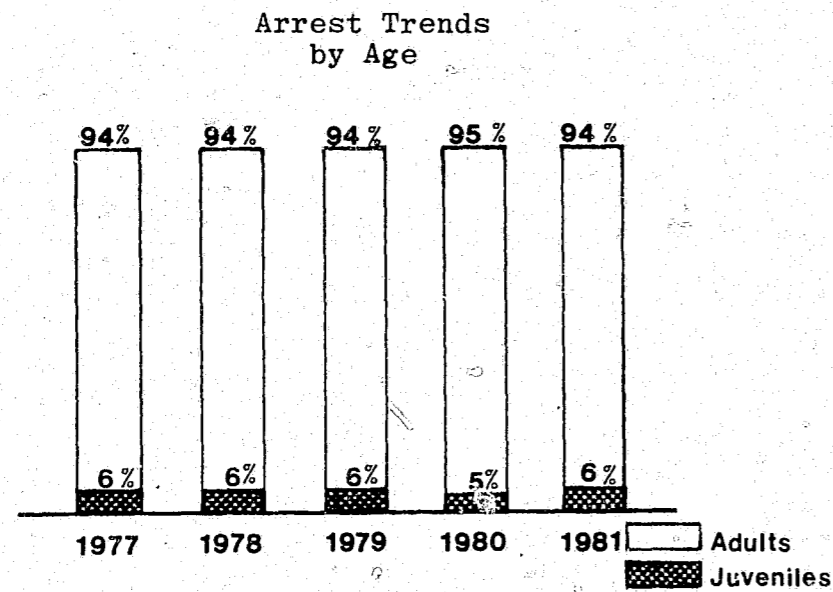

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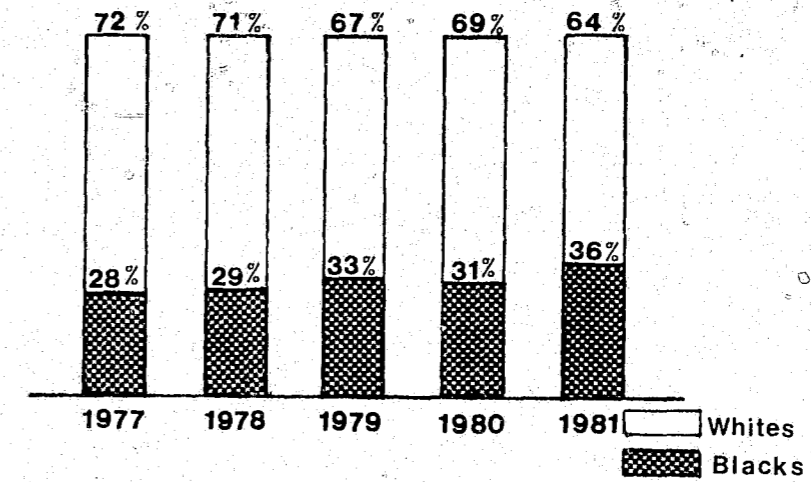
A total of 160,156 persons were arrested in Alabama in 1981 for Part II Offenses. The arrest figure is down 10% over 1980 when 177,544 persons were arrested on Part II charges. Ninety-five percent of those arrested in 1981 were adults and 5% were juveniles. The following table shows proportions of arrest by age for 1977 through 1981.



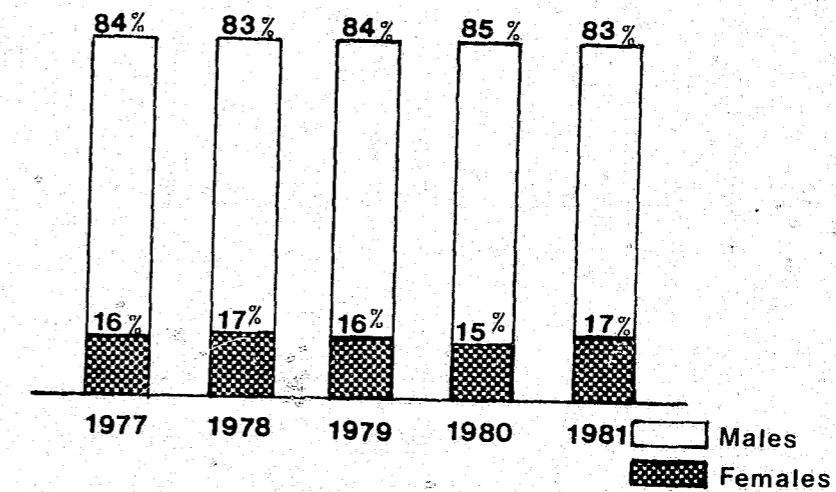
Of the total number of arrests, 55% were white males and 29% were black males. White females comprised 10% of the total and black females made up 6%.

Liquor Laws Violations

Driving under the influence (DUI) resulted in 33,057

arrests with 98% of those arrested over 18. The 25-29 age group effected the majority of the adult arrests, 4,855 or 17%. Of the adults arrested for DUI, 67% were white males, 25% black males, 6% and 1% for white females and black females, respectively. Seventy percent of the juveniles arrested for DUI were 17 year olds. Two percent of those arrested were 14 or under. There were 6 DUI arrests in the 10 and Under age group, 1 in the 11-12 year group, and 6 in the 13-14 age category. Eighty-seven percent of the juveniles arrested for DUI were white males, black males accounted for 7% and white females 6% of the total juveniles arrested for DUI.

There were 8,967 arrests made for liquor law violations with 89% of the arrests being adults. The adult arrests show 76% were white males, 14% black males, 7% white females, and 3% black females. Juvenile arrests show 77% were white males, 7% black males, 15% white females, and black females, 1%.

In 1981, 32,654 persons were arrested for public drunkenness. Ninety-eight percent of those arrested were adults. Of the adult arrests, 68% were white males, 25% black males, 5% and 2% for white females and black females, respectively. Juvenile arrests show 78% were white males, 11% black males, 10% white females and 1% black females.

Drug Violations

There were 9,314 drug related arrests in 1981 comprising 6% of the Total Part II Arrests. Ninety-one percent of those

arrested on drug charges were adults with 80% of the adults arrested on possession charges. Marijuana sale and possession effected the greatest number of total drug arrests, 7,629 or 82%. The 25-29 age group accounted for 22% of the adult drug arrests. White males accounted for 60% of the adult drug arrests with black males comprising 28%. White females accounted for 11% and black females 1%.

There were 878 juveniles arrested on drug related charges with 44% of the juveniles arrested being 17 year olds. Ninety-one percent of the juvenile drug arrests in 1981 were sale or possession of marijuana. There was one juvenile under 10 arrested for possession of marijuana. Sixty-six percent of the juvenile drug arrests were white males, 18% were black males. White females accounted for 13% of the drug arrests and black females, 3%.

OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

In 1981, five law enforcement officers lost their lives in the line of duty. All of these deaths were cleared by arrest.

Accident or Negligence

One police officer died in a traffic accident while responding to a burglary call.

Felonious Act

Two officers were killed, in separate incidents, attempting to arrest a suspect. Another officer was killed while on a call to a domestic disturbance. And, at a road block, an officer was struck and killed by an automobile being driven by a fleeing suspect.

Assaulted

In 1981, a total of 428 law enforcement officers were assaulted in the line of duty. Eighty-four, or 20% of these officers received serious injury. The remainder received no injury or minimal injuries.

Type of Activity by Weapons

Attempting other arrests resulted in 26% of the assaults on law enforcement officers. Responding to disturbance calls resulted in 22%. In both of these activities, personal weapons such as hands, fists, feet, etc., were the most common weapon type. Ninety percent of the assaults on officers attempting other arrests and eighty-one percent of the assaults on officers responding to disturbance calls were perpetrated by personal weapons.

Other high risk activities include handling and transporting prisoners which resulted in 19% of the assaults. In 10% of the assaults the officers were involved in traffic pursuits or stops. Again, personal weapons were used in the majority of these assaults, 98% and 79%, respectively.

Eighty-three percent of the assaults on police officers involved hands, fists, feet, etc., with 81% receiving minimal

injuries. Cutting instruments were used in 2% of the assaults and other weapons in 5%. Records indicate that 86% of the assaults resulting from cutting instruments and 70% from other weapons involved minimal or no injury to the officer.

Clearances for Assaults on Law Enforcement Officers

Eighty-nine percent of the assaults on law enforcement officers in 1981 were cleared.

Officers assaulted during burglaries in progress had a 100% clearance rate. Officers assaulted while attempting other arrests and handling and transporting prisoners effected a 94% clearance rate. Ninety-one percent of the assaults resulting from disturbance calls were cleared. The following table depicts the number of clearances and clearance rate by activity type.

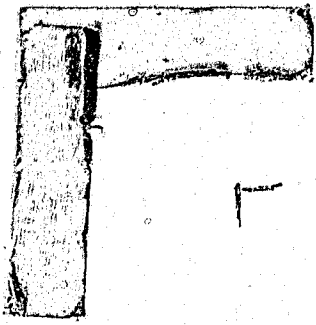

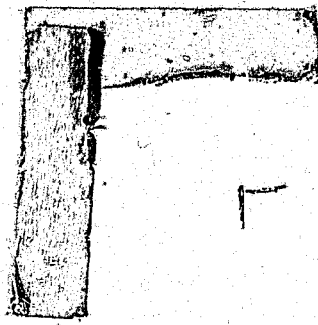
