1980 CALENDAR YEAR SUMMARY
OF POPULATION MOVEMENT

This bulletin summarizes the volume and movement of offender populations supervised by the Wisconsin Division of Corrections during calendar year 1980. Five-year trends are presented for the most major population groups--residents in Wisconsin correctional institutions, offenders supervised in the community under probation and parole, residents in the Bureau of Community Corrections Residential Centers, and absconders from probation and parole supervision. Appendix tables present information on counts at the beginning and end of the year, intake and separations during the year, and average daily populations. For probation and parole cases, average daily populations are based on end-of-month averages.

NOTE: This bulletin is the companion publication of the C-60A, which reports the same information on a fiscal year basis.

The total population supervised by the Division of Corrections increased by 487 cases, or 1.8 percent, from 26,604 cases at the beginning of the year to 27,091 cases on December 31, 1980. Institution populations rose 5.8 percent, from 4,047 to 4,283; active field supervision cases increased 1.1 percent, from 19,648 to 19,863, and the number of absconders rose 1.2 percent, from 2,909 to 2,945. (These totals do not include institutionalized adult or juvenile offenders reported in the footnotes to the appendix tables as being absent.)

Table A shows the average daily population for all cases supervised by the Division of Corrections in both correctional institutions and the community for calendar years 1976 through 1980. The average total population grew each year, but at a slower rate in each succeeding year through 1979 and then at a slightly higher rate in 1980--2.1 percent in 1979 versus 3.1 percent in 1980.

Following three years of successively smaller increases, the average daily institutional population declined 2.6 percent in 1979, and then increased 3.8 percent in 1980, as shown in Table B.

Despite the overall 3.8 percent increase in average daily institutional populations, the adult population average actually increased 6.2 percent in 1980, from 3,428 to 3,639 (Table C). However, the juvenile population average dropped 9.9 percent, from 585 to 527. This can be attributed primarily to the revised Children's Code, which went into effect in November 1978. Under the revised Code, juveniles can be placed in Division custody only if adjudged delinquent for an act which would be punishable by a sentence of six months or more if committed by an adult, and only if found to be a danger to the public and in need of restrictive custodial treatment. Further, disposition orders are limited to a maximum of one year unless extended by the court.

From 1976 through 1980, the average daily population of adults rose 13.6 percent, while the average daily population of juveniles dropped 26.9 percent.

Table D shows the annual average daily population of offenders under probation and parole supervision by the Division's Bureau of Community Corrections, including absconders. Offenders resident in Community Corrections Residential Centers administered by the Bureau are included in institution population counts. The probation and parole average populations increased each year but at a steadily diminishing rate. The 1980 increase of 2.9 percent was the lowest during the five-year period. Total increase for the period was 18.8 percent.

Table E shows the average daily population of all cases under community supervision differentiated into probation and parole, including absconders. The number of probation cases rose 20.2 percent and the number of parole cases 11.6 percent during the five-year period. More than 85 percent of the cases were supervised under probation.

Table F shows the average daily populations under probation supervision by type and sex of population, including absconders. Over 94 percent of all probationers were adults. The number of adult male cases rose 16.0 percent and the number of adult female cases rose 34.3 percent during the five-year period. There was a sharp decline in the number of youthful offender probationers because the Youthful Offender Law was repealed effective July 1, 1978. A policy decision of the Department of Health and Social Services not to accept supervision of juveniles placed on probation under the revised Children's Code accounted for a marked reduction in the number of juvenile probation cases. The number of persons from other states supervised in Wisconsin (Interstate Compact cases) varied little from year to year, ranging from 355 in 1977 to 376 in 1978, until 1980. The number of persons supervised in Wisconsin increased 33.2 percent in 1980, from 361 in 1979 to 481 in 1980.

The average number of absconders from probation supervision in calendar years 1976 through 1980 is shown in Table G. The number of absconders rose 32.0 percent, from 2,010 to 2,654 during the five-year period. Over 79 percent of the absconders were adult males.

Table H shows the average daily populations under the parole and juvenile aftercare supervision by type and sex, including absconders. There was a 15.1 percent increase in adult male cases and a 25.4 percent increase in adult female cases during the five-year period. Meanwhile, the number of juvenile male aftercare cases dropped 19.2 percent, while the number of female juvenile aftercare cases dropped 36.6 percent. There was a 41.1 percent increase in the number of Interstate Compact cases supervised in Wisconsin in the five-year period.

The average number of absconders from parole and juvenile aftercare supervision in calendar years 1976 through 1980 is shown in Table I. The total number of absconders was relatively constant, ranging from 272 in 1977 to 294 in 1979. About 89 percent of absconders were adult males.
