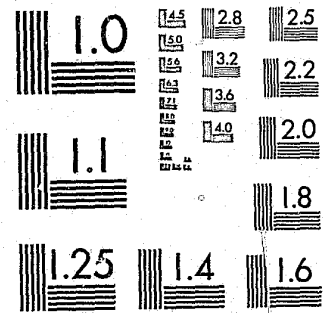

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INTRODUCTION

THE ILLINOIS UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

The Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting (I-UCR) program was developed in 1971 and implemented January 1, 1972. The I-UCR program has evolved into a program intended to meet the needs of all reporting agencies. It is an incident based reporting system designed to accomplish the following major goals:

1. To provide needed administrative statistics for law enforcement agencies.
2. To provide the Legislature with information necessary to formulate effective laws which address the crime problem.
3. To provide Illinois citizens with the most complete information on the nature and extent of crime.
4. To include comprehensive data for researchers and planners.
5. To adhere to the National Program's standards.

Reporting crime statistics is mandated by Chapter 38, Section 206-8 of the Illinois Revised Statutes and is quoted below:

206-8. Crime Statistics. 8. The Department (of Law Enforcement) shall be a central repository and custodian of crime statistics for the State and it shall have all power incident thereto to carry out the purposes of this Act, including the power to demand and receive cooperation in the submission of crime statistics from all units of government.

All reporting agencies receive monthly and quarterly summaries of the reported criminal activity within their jurisdictions. All offenses known to law enforcement agencies are reported monthly to the Crime Studies Section of the Bureau of Identification. Participating jurisdictions include villages, municipalities, counties, colleges, universities, park districts, railroads, hospitals, and transit authorities throughout Illinois. Agencies may also submit service codes and local ordinance data in order to provide law enforcement administrators with information for use in planning and research, manpower determination and utilization, budgeting, and the development and evaluation of crime prevention programs.

In 1978, there were 1,070 law enforcement agencies in Illinois, 730 of which reported crime statistics directly to the Bureau of Identification. The remaining agencies reported their crime statistics through an intermediary agency (Sheriff's Office, Police Department, etc.). Agencies submit their data through the use of source documents, printouts, magnetic tape, punch

cards, or via remote on-line terminals. The following is a breakdown by type of agency reporting directly to the I-UCR program:

CLASSIFICATION OF OFFENSES

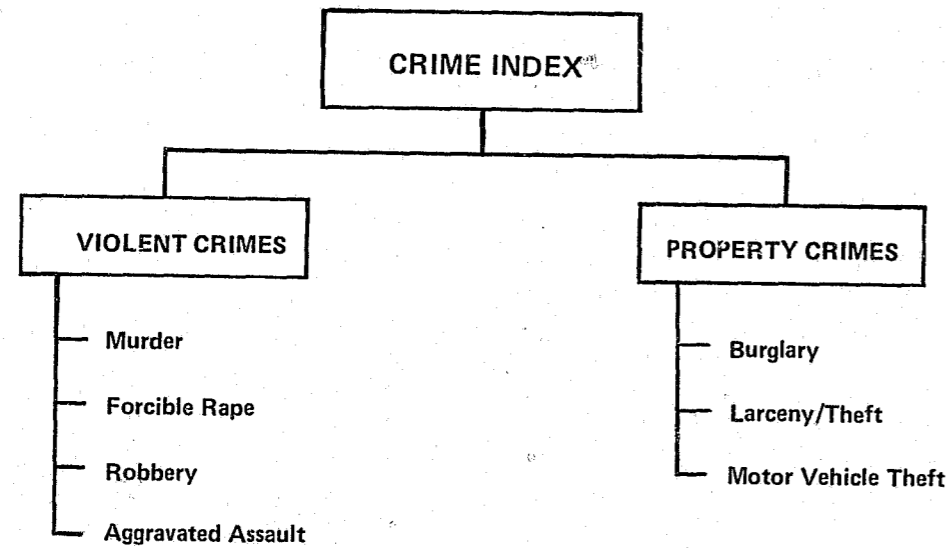
The Index Crimes, as used by the I-UCR program, and as translated into the National Program's crime index offenses, are:

1. *Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter*—The willful killing of a person or the death of a person caused by gross negligence of an individual other than the victim.
2. *Forcible Rape*—The carnal knowledge of a female, forcibly and against her will. This category includes attempted rape.
3. *Aggravated Assault*—The intentional causing of serious bodily harm or the intentional attempt or threat of serious bodily injury or death. In Illinois, Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murder are included in this category.
4. *Robbery*—The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence. Includes Attempted Robbery.
5. *Burglary*—The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. Includes Attempted Burglary.
6. *Theft*—The unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence, or fraud. In Illinois, this category includes Burglary From Motor Vehicle and Attempts.
7. *Motor Vehicle Theft*—The unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle. Includes Attempted Motor Vehicle Theft.

The statistics utilized in this report are based on offenses which occurred between January 1, 1978, and December 31, 1978.

THE CRIME INDEX

The Crime Index is used to indicate the amount and extent of serious crimes as defined by the International Association of Chiefs of Police Committee on Uniform Crime Reports. The Crime Index consists of Violent Crimes and Property Crimes. Murder, Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault are classified as Violent Crimes. Burglary, Theft, and Motor Vehicle Theft comprise the Property Crimes within the Crime Index. The Crime Index is the total number of Index Offenses occurring within a given jurisdiction during a specified period of time. The following illustrates the relationship of the seven Index Offenses that compile the Crime Index:



THE CRIME RATE

The Crime Rate indicates the volume of crime occurring within a given population. It is defined as the total number of Index Crimes per 100,000 inhabitants and it is calculated as follows:

$$\text{CRIME RATE} = \frac{\text{Crime Index} \times 100,000}{\text{Jurisdictional Population}}$$

The jurisdictional population can be that of a city, town, village, state, or the nation.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR INTERPRETATION

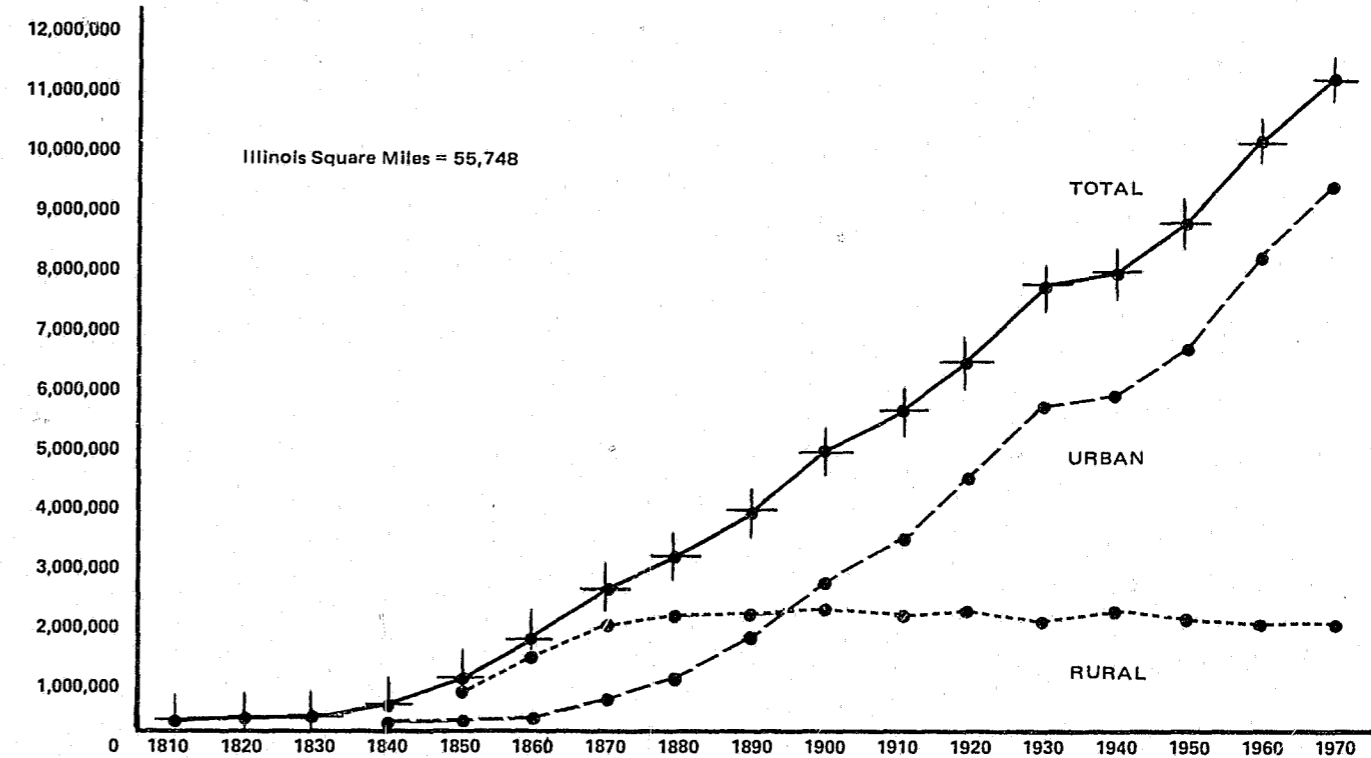
When comparing the crime statistics of one agency with another, many factors should be taken into consideration before conclusions are made. Some of the conditions affecting the type and volume of crime occurring are:

1. Density and size of the community population and the metropolitan area of which it is a part.
2. Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex, and race.
3. Economic status and mores of the population.
4. Stability of population, including commuters, seasonal workers, and other transient types.

5. Climate, including seasonal weather conditions.
6. Educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
7. Effective strength of the police force.
8. Standards of appointments to the local police force.
9. Policies of local officials.
10. Attitudes and policies of the courts and corrections.
11. Attitudes of the public toward law enforcement problems.
12. Administrative and investigative efficiency of law enforcement, including the degree of adherence of crime reporting and standards.
13. Organization and cooperation of adjoining and overlapping police jurisdictions.¹

SECTION I

CRIME TRENDS

STATE SUMMARY

As discussed in the Introduction, the Crime Index consists of seven statistical classifications as defined by the National Program. The relationship between the Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting offense classifications and the National Program's offense classification is illustrated below:

The data presented represents offenses reported by the 1,070 law enforcement agencies in the State; 730 of which report directly to the Bureau of Identification and 340 small departments that report through the Sheriff's offices.

It should be noted that two changes have been made in the manner in which the 1978 Crime Index data is presented:

- (1) All totals shown for each category of offense or offense grouping reflects data reported not only by Sheriff's Offices and Police Departments throughout Illinois but also includes offense data reported by Colleges, Universities, and the Illinois State Police.

The data collected from Colleges, Universities, and the Illinois State Police had been presented separately, through 1977.

- (2) The presentation of each Crime Index category includes Trend comparison information. This information details the trend of the cate-

gory from year to year, beginning with data collected in 1970. In past publications, this trend information was based on a base-year comparison, beginning with data collected in 1965. The figures illustrated in each of the Trend comparison charts for 1978 therefore will be different when compared to the figures in past issues of *Crime in Illinois*.

Figure 1, shown on page 3 illustrates the population trends for Illinois since 1810. The population figures are the basis for computing the Crime Rate and therefore become a Consideration for Interpretation as explained on page 2.

Table 1 details the total Crime Index for 1978 and includes for comparison, figures reported from 1976. The Crime Index increased in volume in 1978, as compared to 1977. A total of 549,663 Crimes Index Offenses were reported in 1978 as compared to the 547,553 Crime Index Offenses reported in 1977, an increase of 0.4 percent. Violent Crimes, or Crimes Against Persons, accounted for 53,800 Index Offenses, or 9.8 percent of the total. This is an increase of 8.2 percent over the volume of Violent Crimes reported in 1977. Crimes Against Property totalled 495,863 offenses or 90.2 percent of the total Crime Index. The number of Crimes Against Property represents a decrease of 0.2 percent when compared to the 1977 total of 496,822.

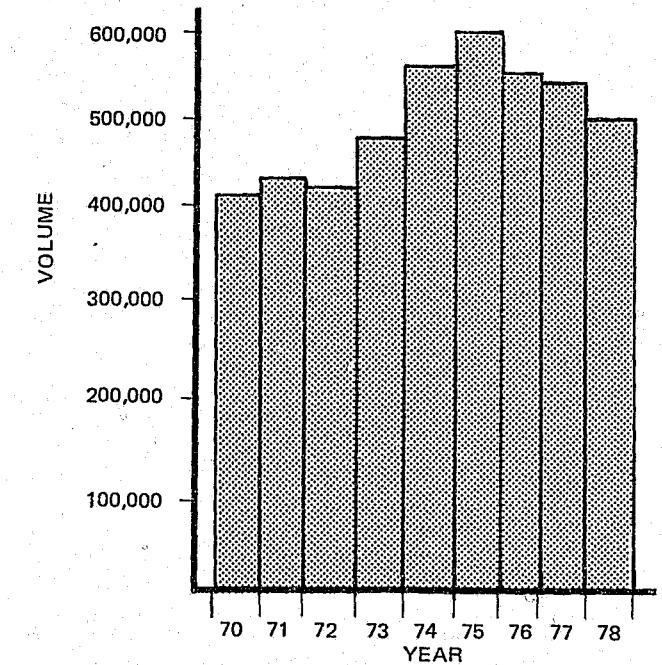
The Crime Rate for each Index Offense is also illustrated in Table 1. The Crime Rate per 100,000 inhabitants for all Crime Index offenses increased by 0.4 percent when compared to 1977. The category of Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murder increased the most in its Crime Rate per 100,000 inhabitants of the Crime Index offenses in 1978; this crime classification's Crime Rate increased by 15.6 percent. The category of Theft showed the greatest decrease in the Crime Rate per 100,000 inhabitants, a figure of minus 0.5 percent. Further details are illustrated in Table 1.

A detailed look at each of the Crime Index offenses follows the collected data on Crime Index Arrests. Each of the Crime Index offenses is defined according to the *Illinois Revised Statutes, 1978*, in the glossary.

CRIME INDEX ARRESTS

There were 120,816 persons arrested for Crime Index Offenses in 1978. This total represents an increase of 6.5 percent as compared to the number of persons arrested in 1977. Adults arrested accounted for 66 percent of the total and juveniles accounted for 34 percent. Males arrested represented 80.9 percent while females represented 19.1 percent of the total. Whites arrested for Index Crimes totaled 55,527 or 46.0 percent, Negroes arrested totaled 58,348 or 48.3 percent, and all other races totaled 6,941 or 5.7 percent. Table 2 details the arrest figures for Crime Index Offenses and compares them to the 1977 arrest figures.

CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

The Violent Crimes, or Crimes Against Persons, consist of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murder. A total of 53,800 Violent Crimes were reported in 1978. Chart 2 depicts the comparison trend and specific data of Crimes Against Persons beginning with the year 1970. In 1978, Violent Crimes increased in volume by 8.2 percent as compared to 1977 when 49,731 Violent Crimes were reported. Crimes Against Persons accounted for 9.8 percent of the total Crime Index. Each of the Violent Crimes will be presented separately in this section, following a review of the data on persons arrested for Violent Crimes.

CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS ARRESTS

Arrests made for offenses in the Crimes Against Persons or Violent Crimes category are illustrated in Table 3. The total number of persons arrested for Violent Crimes in 1978 was 19,044 or 15.8 percent of all Index Crimes Arrests. Males arrested accounted for 92 percent of these arrests while females totaled 1,527 or 8 percent. Whites arrested accounted for 7,403 or 38.9 percent, Negroes arrested accounted for 10,348 or 54.3 percent, and all other races accounted for 1,293 or 6.8 percent of the total. The percent of change of arrests for this offense category comparing 1978 to 1977, is detailed in Table 3.

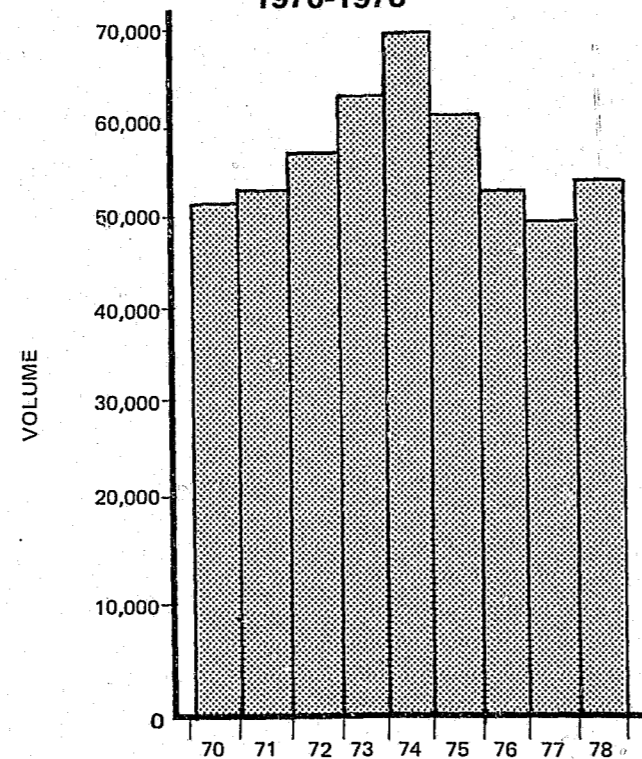

MURDER AND VOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER

The Crime Index Offenses of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter are merged in accordance with the National Program definition and are based solely on police investigation. Law enforcement agencies reported 1,151 of these crimes during 1978.

Some of the charts and figures illustrating data reported about Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter reflect the total 1,149. Ordinarily, homicides are reported to the I-UCR Program by local Police Departments and Sheriffs' Offices. During 1978, the Chicago Northwestern Railroad reported two murders. These two homicides are not included in the state totals shown on the Crime Index Report, page 62, the Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas, page 138, and the Offense Summary, page 141.

The long-term trend of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter is illustrated in Chart 3. The number of homicides increased by 2.9 percent as compared to 1977 when there were 1,119 reported Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters. An analysis of these two offenses indicates that Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter are difficult to prevent by law enforcement alone because the majority of the crimes are committed by persons known to the victim.

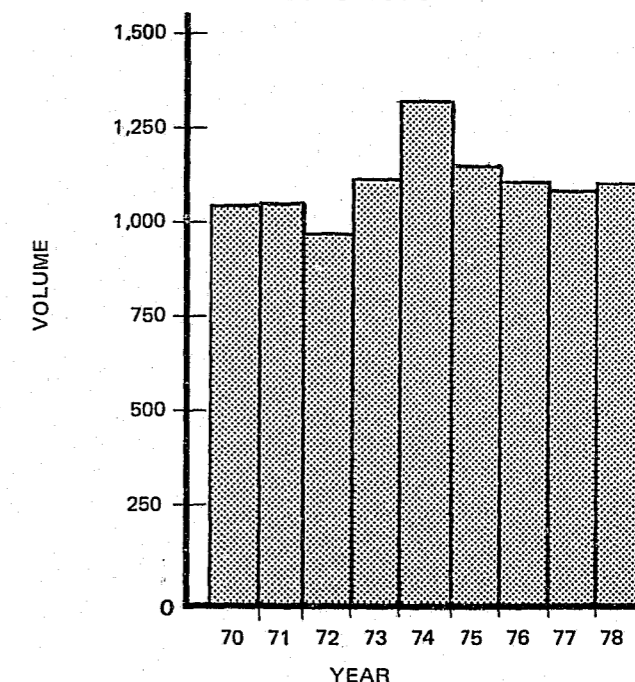
Table 4 displays the number of incidents of the Crime Index classification by month, compares the 1978 figures to 1977, and illustrates the distribution of occurrence of these two offenses over the year's time span.

On the following two pages, Tables 5 and 6 are presented to further illustrate the specific data collected about the types of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter reported during 1978 and compares the data to the 1977 figures. Table 5 is a summary of the relationship between the victim and offender and a summary of the victim's sex and race. In order to clarify the three types of relationships between the victim and offender, the following explanation is in order:

Type I is that relationship whereby the victim and the offender were part of the same family unit. This category includes common-law spouses and in-laws.

Type II is that relationship whereby the offender and victim were known to each other but were not part of the same family unit. Former spouses and homosexual relationships are included in this grouping.

Type III is that relationship whereby the victim and offender were strangers to one another or the relationship was unknown to the reporting law enforcement agency.

Table 5 indicates that the Type III relationship, victim and offender strangers to each other, accounts for 546 victims or 47.4 percent of the total. However, the number of relationships where the victim and offender were at least acquainted totaled 605 or 52.6 percent of the total. In 193 cases, the reported relationships indicated the offender killed a member of his or her family, or 16.8 percent of the total. In 1977, the Type I relationship represented 16.4 percent, the Type II relationship represented 41.1 percent, and the Type III relationship represented 42.5 percent of the total.

In 1978, Males accounted for 79.4 percent of the victims, with females accounting for 20.6 percent. Whites represented 41.9 percent of the victims,

Negroes represented 56.3 percent of the victims, and all other races represented 1.8 percent of the victims. Refer to Table 5 for monthly breakdowns of these figures.

Table 6 details information concerning the type of weapon used to commit Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter in 1978 and compares the data to the 1977 figures. The handgun was used in 627 instances or 54.5 percent of all homicides. The second most frequently used weapon was the knife, which was utilized to commit 235 Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters, or 20.4 percent of the total. Further details are provided in Table 6.

In Table 7, a monthly breakdown of Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters reported in 1978 by situation is presented. The most frequently occurring situation is that of Single Victim/Single Offender. This situation type represents 58.6 percent of the total number of this Crime Index Offense occurring in 1978. The month of March had the highest number of Situation A types reported. Likewise, situations E and F, Multiple Victims/Multiple Offenders and Multiple Victims/Unknown Offender(s) respectively, represented the smallest number of situation types that occurred during 1978, or 0.6 percent in each situation category.

The number of situations illustrated in Table 7 reflects the number of incidents of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter. There were 1,151 murders in 1978; this figure is broken down into the six types of situations to detail the circumstances of these two offenses. In other words, there were 1,068 incidents of Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter in 1978, with a total of 1,151 victims. Situations D, E, and F, those with multiple victims, account for the difference between the number of Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters and the number of situations.

MURDER AND VOLUNTARY MANSLAUGHTER ARRESTS

There were 1,257 persons arrested for Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter in 1978. As Table 8 illustrates, this figure represents an increase of 0.3 percent in arrests made in 1977 for this crime category. Males arrested represented 89.0 percent of this total while females arrested represented 11.0 percent of the total. Whites arrested totaled 219 or 17.4 percent. Negroes arrested totaled 864 or 68.7 percent, and other races arrested totaled 174 or 13.9 percent of those arrested. Table 8 details these arrest figures and compares the 1978 data to that of 1977.

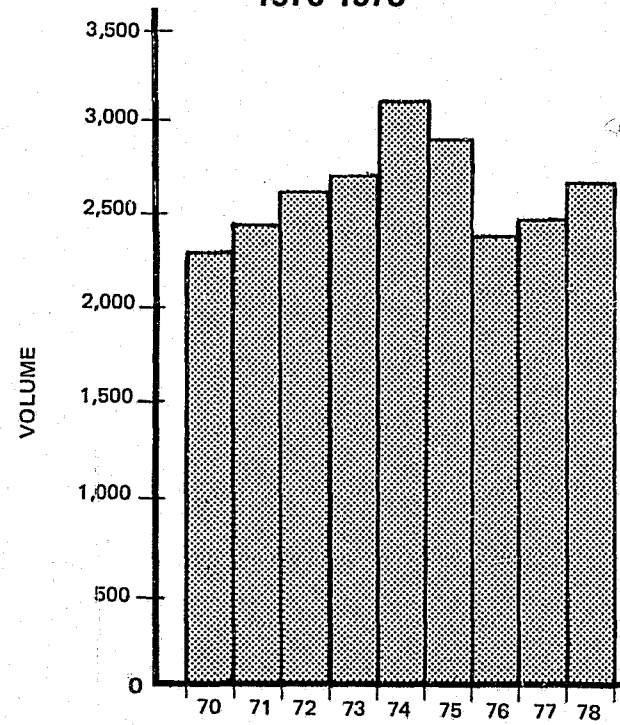

FORCIBLE RAPE

There were 2,659 reported Rapes in 1978. This figure represents 4.9 per cent of the Violent Crimes committed and 0.5 per cent of all Crime Index Offenses. Rape offenses increased by 9.4 per cent from 1977; in 1977, 2,430 Rapes were reported. The Crime Rate for Rape in 1978 was 23.6 per 100,000 inhabitants. This represents an increase of 9.3 per cent in the Crime Rate from 1977, which was 21.6 per 100,000 inhabitants. Chart 4 illustrates the Forcible Rape Comparison Trend since 1970. Further details about this Crime Index Offense are offered in this chart.

FORCIBLE RAPE ARRESTS

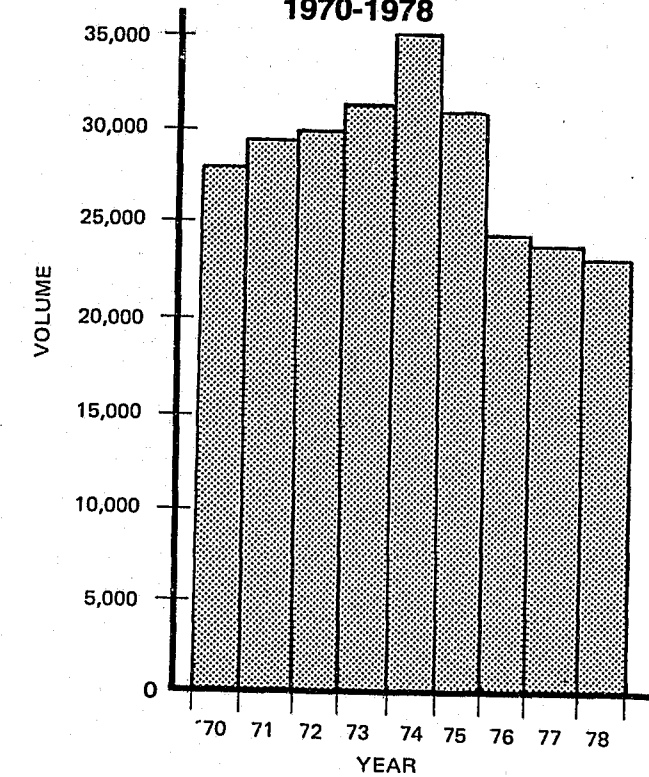
Table 9 illustrates the arrests made for Forcible Rape during 1978 as compared to 1977. The 1,176 males arrested accounted for 99.9 percent of the total. There were 308 whites arrested, accounting for 26.2 percent of the total, 782 negroes arrested or 66.4 percent of the total, and there were 87 persons of other races arrested, or 7.4 percent of the total. Adults arrested represented 88.9 percent of the total and juveniles arrested represented 11.1 percent of the total.

ROBBERY

Robbery, by definition, includes assault and/or battery with the intent to deprive the person of property or to commit a theft. It is considered a Violent Crime against persons although for reporting purposes in the Illinois UCR Program, it is scored as a property loss offense.

There were 22,930 Robberies reported in 1978, a figure which represents 42.6 percent of the Crimes Against Persons and 4.2 percent of all the Crime Index Offenses. The Robbery figures represent a decrease in volume of 3.6 percent as compared to the 1977 Robbery figures. The Crime Rate for Robbery in 1978 was 203.9 per 100,000 inhabitants. In 1977, the Crime Rate was 211.4 per 100,000 inhabitants; the 1978 figure represents a decrease of 3.6 percent in the Crime Rate. Chart 5 depicts the overall Robbery Comparison Trend since 1970.

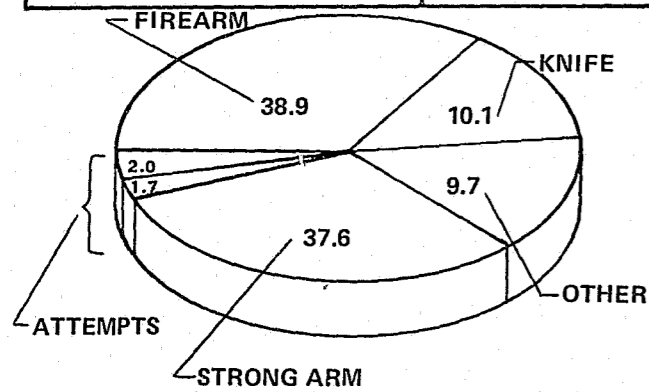


Table 10 details the types of Robbery by type of weapon used as reported to the I-UCR Program. Firearms were the most commonly used weapon, 38.9 percent of the total. The category of Strong-Arm Robbery—No Weapon Used was the second most common type of Robbery reported, representing 37.6 of the total. A Strong-Arm Robbery is one where a certain degree of force but no weapon is used to commit the crime. There were 13,450 Armed Robberies reported in 1978, not including the 397 Attempted Armed Robberies. This total of 13,450 accounts for 58.6 percent of all Robberies. Strong-Arm Robberies, not including attempts accounted for 8,612 or 37.6 percent of the total while Attempted Robberies, Armed or Strong-Arm, totaled 860 or 3.8 percent of the total.

Table 12 presents an analysis of Robbery by Place, detailing the value of property stolen, recovered, and destroyed. Most Robberies reported during 1978 occurred in highways, streets, and alleys; a total of 10,751 offenses in this place type were reported, representing 48.9 percent of the number of Robberies scored with property information. Private residences represented the second highest location, total 3,067 offenses or 13.9 percent of the total. Property involved in committing Robbery amounted to \$5,092,487 in 1978. Of this total, \$2,322,015 worth of property was recovered and \$7,085 was destroyed.

It is important to note the discrepancy between the Crime Index Report which shows a total of 22,930 Robberies reported in 1978, and Table 12 which indicates 22,003 Robberies were reported in 1978. The

difference of 927 is made up of 860 Attempted Robberies which are not included in the Analysis By Place. The remaining 67 offenses represent incidents that were reported as offenses of Robbery by law enforcement agencies but no property analysis was included along with the offense report.

ROBBERY ARRESTS

Table 11 displays the details of persons arrested for Robbery during 1978 and includes a comparison of the 1977 figures. The 8,856 persons arrested represented a decrease of 1.1 percent from arrests made during 1977 for Robbery. Males accounted for 93.4 percent of the total while females represented 6.6 percent. Whites arrested totaled 21.6 percent, Negroes arrested totaled 70.8 percent and all other races totaled 7.6 percent. Adults arrested for Robbery represented 74.2 percent of the total while juveniles arrested accounted for 25.8 percent.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED BATTERY, AND ATTEMPTED MURDER

These three offenses make up the Aggravated Assault category of the National Program. The offenses of simple battery, simple assault, battery or assault without intent to do great bodily harm, and reckless conduct are not included in this crime category. These other offenses are included in the I-UCR Program under a sub-category in order to be consistent with the National Program.

Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murder accounted for 27,060 offenses in

1978. This represents an increase in volume of 15.6 percent from 1977 when 23,412 of these offenses were reported. The offense figures of this crime category for 1978 represent 50.3 percent of the Crimes Against Persons and 4.9 percent of the Crime Index Offenses. The Crime Rate for these three offenses in 1978 was 240.7 per 100,000 inhabitants, an increase of 15.6 percent of the Crime Rate for this crime category for 1977, which was 208.2 per 100,000 inhabitants. Chart 6 further illustrates the crime trend for Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murder. Details of each of the three offenses can be found in the Offense Summary, beginning on Page 141.

1970-1978

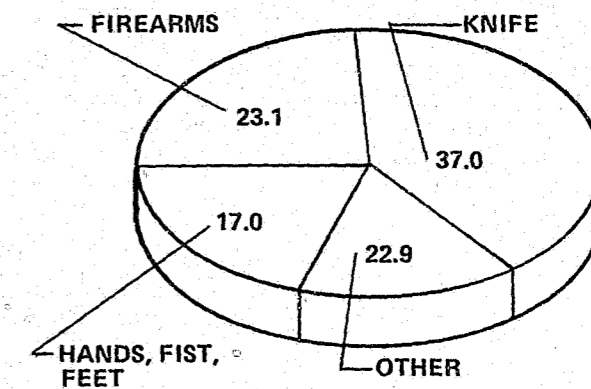
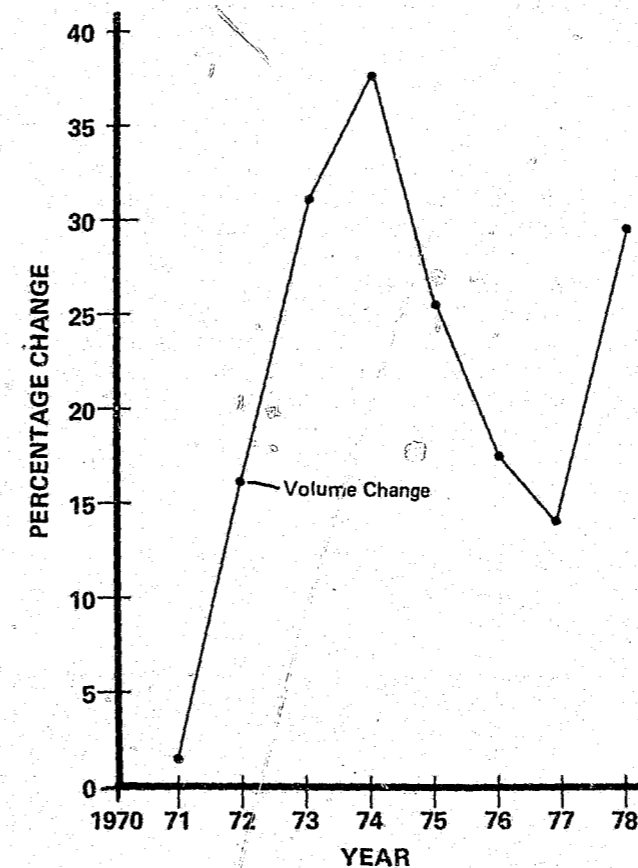


Table 13 depicts the types of weapons used in this offense classification during 1978. The use of knives or other cutting instruments occurred most frequently, 37.0 percent of the time. The table shows a breakdown of the type of weapon used for each of the offenses compiling this Crime Index Classification. The use of firearms occurred in 23.1 percent of the cases reported. Refer to Table 13 for other weapon-related statistics.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED BATTERY, AND ATTEMPTED MURDER ARRESTS

In Table 14, the figures for persons arrested for this crime index offense classification in 1978 are presented. The total of 7,754 accounts for 40.7 percent of the arrests made for Crimes Against Persons and 6.4 percent of arrests made for Crime Index offenses. Males arrested totaled 6,952 or 89.7 percent, while

females totaled 802, or 10.3 percent. Adults represented 86.3 percent of the total, and juveniles represented 13.7 percent of the total. Table 14 indicates Whites accounted for 4,966 persons arrested, or 64.1 percent, Negroes accounted for 2,429 persons arrested, or 31.3 percent, and all other races accounted for 359 persons arrested, or 4.6 percent. The arrest figures of 1978 are compared to those of 1977 in Table 14.

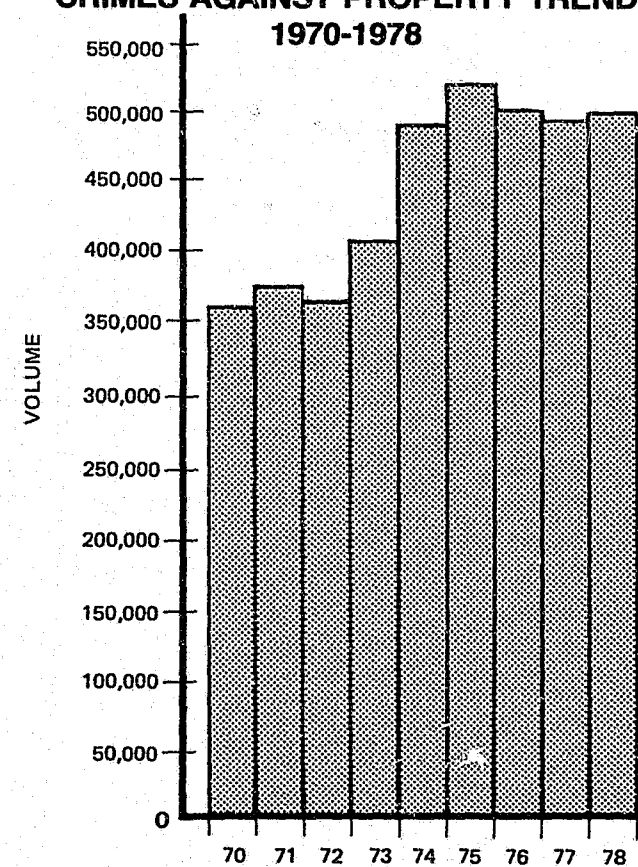

CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY

Burglary, Theft, and Motor Vehicle Theft make up the category of Crimes Against Property. Each will be considered separately in this section along with an analysis of the Non-Crime Index Offenses of Vandalism and Arson.

Property Crimes amounted to 495,863 incidents in 1978 or 90.2 percent of the total Crime Index Offenses. This figure reflects an increase of 1.8 percent as compared to the volume reported in 1977. In 1977, the number of Property Crimes reported totaled 496,822 or 88.9 percent of the Crime Index. Chart 7 depicts the long-range comparison trend of Crimes Against Property since 1970. The Crime Rate of this offense category is also illustrated, indicating a decrease of 0.2 percent from 1977.

CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY ARRESTS

In 1978, there were 101,772 persons arrested for Crimes Against Property, representing 84.2 percent of the Crime Index Offenses Arrests. The 1978 figures shows an increase of 6.7 percent as compared to 1977, when a total of 95,361 persons were arrested for property crimes. Males accounted for 78.9 percent of the 1978 total, and females accounted for 21.1 percent. Whites arrested for property type offenses totaled 48,124 or 47.3 percent, Negroes totaled 48,000 or 47.2 percent, and all other races totaled 5,648 or 5.5 percent. Further details of these arrests are presented in Table 15, including a comparison of the 1977 arrest figures.

At the end of the analysis of each Property Crime, there are several summary tables of data. Table 30 is the Annual Property Analysis by Offense, Table 31 is the Annual Property Summary by Place, and Table 32 is the Annual Property Summary by Property Type. The Property Summaries include the Crime Index Offenses, and the Non-Crime Index Offenses of Arson, Deception, and Vandalism, therefore the total number of offenses shown on each does not correlate to the Crime Index Totals.

BURGLARY

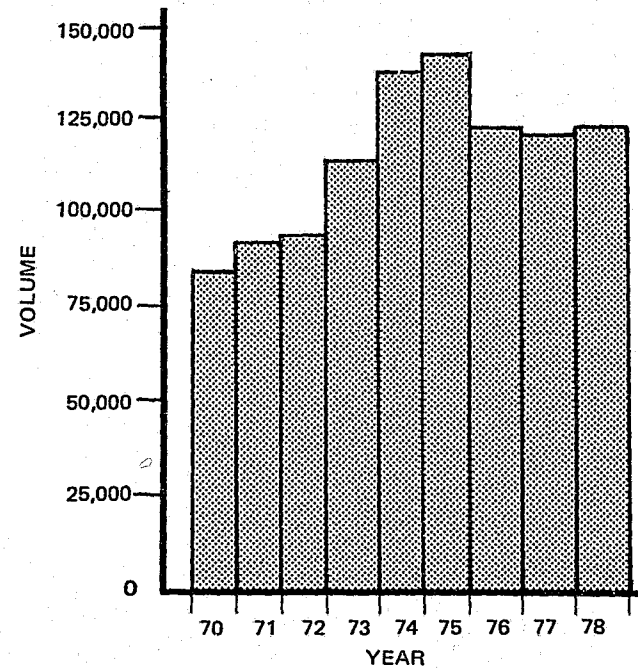
The Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting Program has two categories of Burglary: Burglary from Motor Vehicle and Burglary. The Burglary from Motor Vehicle is treated as Theft on the National level in the Index Crime called Theft/Larceny. In order to be consistent with the National Program, the Illinois Statute for Burglary is divided in order to collect and disseminate statistics by State law. Data related to Theft will include Burglary from Motor Vehicle data.

Burglaries accounted for 124,489 offenses in 1978, or 25.1 percent of the Crimes Against Property. This figure represents an increase in volume of 2.6 percent as compared to 1977. The Crime Rate per 100,000 inhabitants for Burglary also increased from 1977, by 2.7 percent. Chart 8 illustrates the Burglary comparison Trend since 1970 both in terms of volume and the Burglary Crime Rate.

Burglaries accounted for \$64,300,055 worth of stolen property in 1978, an increase of \$287,938 over 1977. Recovered property amounted to \$7,675,530. Burglaries occurring in residences accounted for 56,874 incidents or 45.7 percent of the total. Daytime Burglaries accounted for 43.1 percent of the total, Nighttime Burglaries accounted for 33.3 percent of the Burglaries, and 15.8 percent were unknown as to time occurred; i.e., the victim was away from home and upon discovery of missing property or a forcible entry, the crime could not be pinpointed. The remaining 7.7 percent of the total consists of Burglaries that resulted in no property loss or where no property analysis was included when the offense was scored.

Jewelry ranked highest in property value stolen, \$7,946,149 followed by currency with \$6,118,370 worth reported stolen.

BURGLARY ARRESTS

Burglary Arrests (not including arrests for Burglary from Motor Vehicles) totaled 20,586 in 1978, a 2.6 increase from 1977 when 20,065 persons were arrested for this Crime Index Offense. The 1978 figure accounts for 20.2 percent of the arrests for Crimes Against Property and for 17 percent of arrests for Crime Index Offenses. Males arrested totaled 19,716 or 95.8 percent and females totaled 870 or 4.2 percent. Whites represented 52.7 percent of the total, Negroes represented 40.6 percent of the total, and all other races represented 6.7 percent of the total. Adults accounted for 10,931 arrests, or 53.1 percent and juveniles accounted for 9,655 arrests, or 46.9 percent. Further details on Burglary Arrests are presented in Table 16.

The I-UCR Program is assisting law enforcement agencies through the analysis of this and other crimes in terms of beat analysis, time of day of occurrence, analysis of persons arrested and residency, stolen property, and location analysis. Table 17 is such an analysis; it details Burglaries reported according to place and includes the stolen property values. Table 18 details Burglaries reported according to property type and value. The Tables both show a total of 114,802 Burglaries while the Crime Index shows a total of 124,489 Burglaries. The difference of 9,687 consists of Attempted Burglaries which are not included on the property analysis reports, Burglaries that resulted in no property loss, and incidents reported as offenses with no property analysis included with the offense report.

THEFT

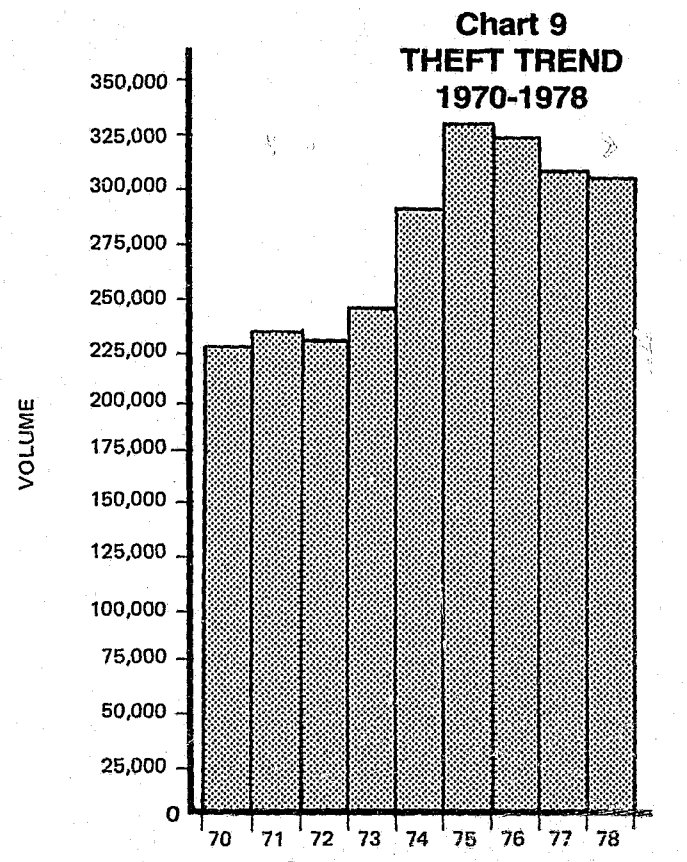
The category of Theft includes figures on Burglary from Motor Vehicle to maintain consistency with the National Program. There were 314,437 Thefts reported in 1978 representing 63.4 percent of the Crimes Against Property and 57.2 percent of all Crime Index Offenses. The number of Thefts decreased by 0.5 percent as compared to the 1977 figures, thereby causing the Theft Crime Rate to decrease to 2,796.7 per 100,000 inhabitants, a decline of 0.5 percent. Chart 9 depicts the Theft Comparison Trend, starting with the year 1970.

THEFT ARRESTS

There were 73,118 arrests made for theft and burglary from Motor Vehicle in 1978, as illustrated in Table 19. This figure represents 71.8 percent of the arrests made for Crimes Against Property and 60.5 percent of the arrests made for Crime Index Offenses. It represents an increase of 6.6 percent as compared to the 1977 total of 68,584. Adults accounted for 48,210 arrests or 65.9 percent and juveniles accounted for 24,908 arrests or 34.1 percent. Males totaled 53,212 or 72.8 percent and females totaled 19,906 or 27.2 percent. Whites arrested represented 46 percent of the total, Negroes arrested represented 49.1 percent of the total, and all other races represented 4.9 percent of the total. Further comparisons can be seen in Table 19.

In Table 20 on the following pages, an analysis of Theft by Place is presented. This offense accounted for \$54,049,475 in stolen property in 1978, a 15.9 percent increase over 1977. Daytime Thefts accounted for 29.5 percent of the total. Night-time Thefts accounted for 16.2 percent, and the number of Thefts occurring at an unknown time accounted for 41.9 percent of the total. The remaining 12.4 percent of the total number of Thefts and Burglaries from Motor Vehicle are those incidents scored in this offense classification but were not accompanied with property analysis information. This discrepancy accounts for the difference in the total number of Thefts shown on the Crime Index, 314,437 and the number shown on the property analysis reports of 275,206.

Commercial Businesses were the most frequent locations of Thefts in 1978, accounting for 26,802 or 8.5 percent of the total. Private Residences were the second most frequent locations accounting for 17,086 or 5.4 percent of the total. An analysis of Theft by Property Type indicates that currency had the highest value of Stolen Property at \$4,576,783 followed by Auto Parts and Accessories at \$4,168,833. These two property classifications also ranked highest in value stolen in 1977.

Tables 20 and 21, on the following pages, present an Analysis of Theft by Place and by Property Type.

BURGLARY FROM MOTOR VEHICLE

In 1978, Illinois law enforcement agencies, excluding Chicago Police Department, reported 34,100 Burglaries from Motor Vehicle. Chicago reports the crime statistics for this sub-category in the Theft/Larceny Offense classification and the figures are not broken down to differentiate the Burglaries from Motor Vehicle. The 1978 figure represents a decrease of 10.9 percent from the 38,259 incidents of this offense reported in 1977.

Tables 22 and 23 follow the Theft analysis by place and property, and present data collected on Burglary from Motor Vehicle. Table 22 is an analysis of this offense sub-category by location and Table 23 is an analysis by Property classification. As in 1977, Highways, Streets, and Alleys accounted for the highest place of occurrence, with 8,238 offenses, or 25.4 percent of the total. Tapes stand out as the most frequently stolen item, accounting for 38,323 tapes stolen or 16.4 percent of all items.

The total number of offenses listed above is 34,100 and the Offense Analysis reports in Tables 22 and 23 reflect a total of 32,417. The difference of 1,683 consists of Attempted Burglaries from Motor Vehicle, not included in these analysis reports, and incidents reported as this offense classification with no property analysis included with the offense report.

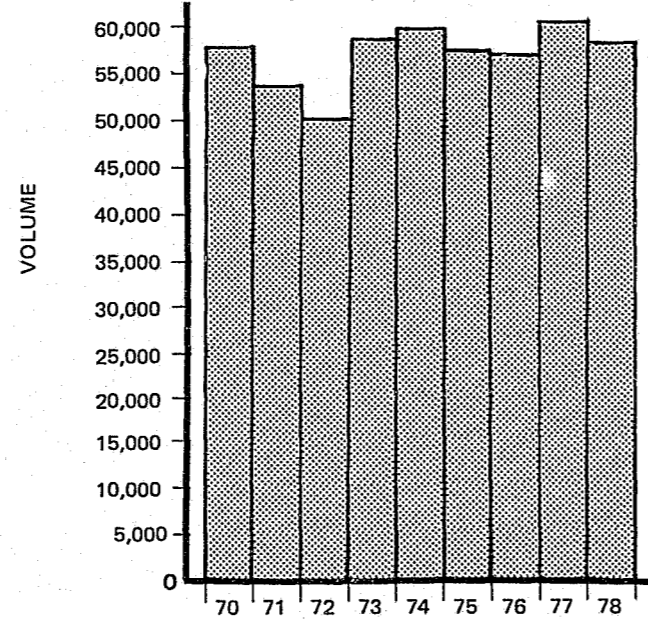
MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

In 1978, Motor Vehicle Thefts totalled 56,937, a decrease in volume of 4.2 percent from 1977. This figure represents 11.5 percent of the Crimes Against Property and 10.4 percent of all Crime Index Offenses. The Crime Rate for this crime classification was 506.4 offenses per 100,000 inhabitants, a decrease of 4.2 as compared to the Crime Rate in 1977. Chart 10 illustrates the comparison trend for Motor Vehicle Thefts, beginning with figures from 1970.

The Motor Vehicle Analysis by Place is presented in Table 25. The value of stolen vehicles amounted to \$137,385,234 in 1978. Value recovered totaled \$73,565,017 or 53.6 percent of the total value stolen. The percent distribution column indicates the largest number of motor vehicles were stolen from highways, streets, and alleys, at 14.1 percent, followed by 8.8 percent having been stolen from business parking lots.

The Crime Index indicates there were 56,937 incidents of Motor Vehicle Theft while Table 25 shows a total of 55,212. The difference of 1,725 consists of Attempted Motor Vehicle Thefts which are not included in the property analysis, and those incident reports for Motor Vehicle Theft that did not include property analysis information.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT ARRESTS

Persons arrested for Motor Vehicle Theft during 1978 totaled 8,068, an increase of 20.2 percent from 1977. Whites arrested accounted for 45.4 percent of this total, Negroes arrested accounted for 46.4 percent, and all other races accounted for 8.2 percent of this total. Males represented 91.0 percent and females represented 9.0 percent of the persons arrested in this crime category. Further details are shown in Table 24.

VANDALISM

The term Vandalism is used in the National Program and includes a broad range of malicious behavior such as cutting auto tires, drawing obscene pictures on public walls, smashing windows, destroying school records, etc. It should be understood that the following statistics are not part of the Crime Index and they are presented because of general interest. The Chicago Police Department does not report these offenses; it reports arrest figures in the general Vandalism category and not by the specific Illinois Statutes for Criminal Damage to Property as defined in the glossary.

The Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting Program includes Criminal Damage to Property, Criminal Damage to Vehicle, Criminal Damage to State Supported Property, and Criminal Damage to Fire Fighting Apparatus in the data presented under the heading of Vandalism. There were 141,577 offenses of this classification reported in 1978. This figure represents an increase of 12,779 or 9.9 percent as compared to the total reported in 1977.

Table 27, on the following pages, depicts the Vandalism Analysis by Place. The most frequent location where Vandalism occurred in 1978 was highways, streets, and alleys, where 27,021 offenses were reported or 19.1 percent. Private residences were the second most frequent location, accounting for 25,612 offenses or 18.1 percent. The total value of property

destroyed amounted to \$15,151,552. Daytime incidents accounted for 55,557 offenses or 39.2 percent, nighttime incidents of Vandalism accounted for 55,290 offenses, or 39.1 percent. There were 21,830 offenses occurring at unknown times or 15.4 percent. The remaining 6.3 percent of the Vandalism total represents incidents reported in this offense classification that did not include property analysis information.

VANDALISM ARRESTS

The figures shown in Table 26 represent arrests made for Criminal Damage to Property, Criminal Damage to Vehicle, Criminal Damage to State Supported Property, and Criminal Damage to Fire Fighting Apparatus. Because Chicago Police Department only reports arrest statistics for the general category of Vandalism, this agency is represented in the arrest figures in Table 26 but not in the Vandalism offense figures.

There were 21,136 persons arrested for this crime category during 1977. Of this total, 60.9 percent were adults and 39.1 percent were juveniles. Males accounted for 85.7 percent of the arrests while females accounted for 14.3 percent of the arrests. Whites represented 67.9 percent of the total, Negroes represented 25.6 percent of the total, and all other races represented 6.5 percent of the total. Further details are displayed in Table 26.

ARSON

There is a growing concern over the amount of property damaged or destroyed as a result of Arson. The data presented in the following summary is not a part of the Crime Index. The Chicago Police Department does not report these offenses, it reports arrest figures and therefore this department is reflected only in the Arson Arrest data reported below. Arson is defined in the Glossary.

There were 2,856 offenses of Arson reported in 1978 with a total value of property destroyed amounting to \$4,785,186. Daytime offenses accounted for 18.4 percent of the total, Nighttime offenses accounted for 35.1 percent of the total, and the time of occurrence was unknown for 9.6 percent of the total. The remaining 1,047 offenses, or 36.7 percent were incidents of

Arson reported that did not include property analysis information. Tabel 29 is an analysis of Arson by Place, which is presented on the following pages.

ARSON ARRESTS

The figures shown in Table 28 represent arrests made for Arson. The data includes arrests reported by Chicago Police Department. In 1978, there were 750 persons arrested for Arson, an increase of 5.5 percent over 1977 arrests which totaled 711. Adults arrested represented 388 or 51.7 percent of the total and juveniles arrested totaled 362 or 48.3 percent. Whites arrested represented 70.9 percent of the total, Negroes arrested represented 23.7 percent of the total and other races represented 5.4 percent of the total. Males accounted for 90.9 percent and females accounted for 9.1 percent of the total persons arrested for arson.

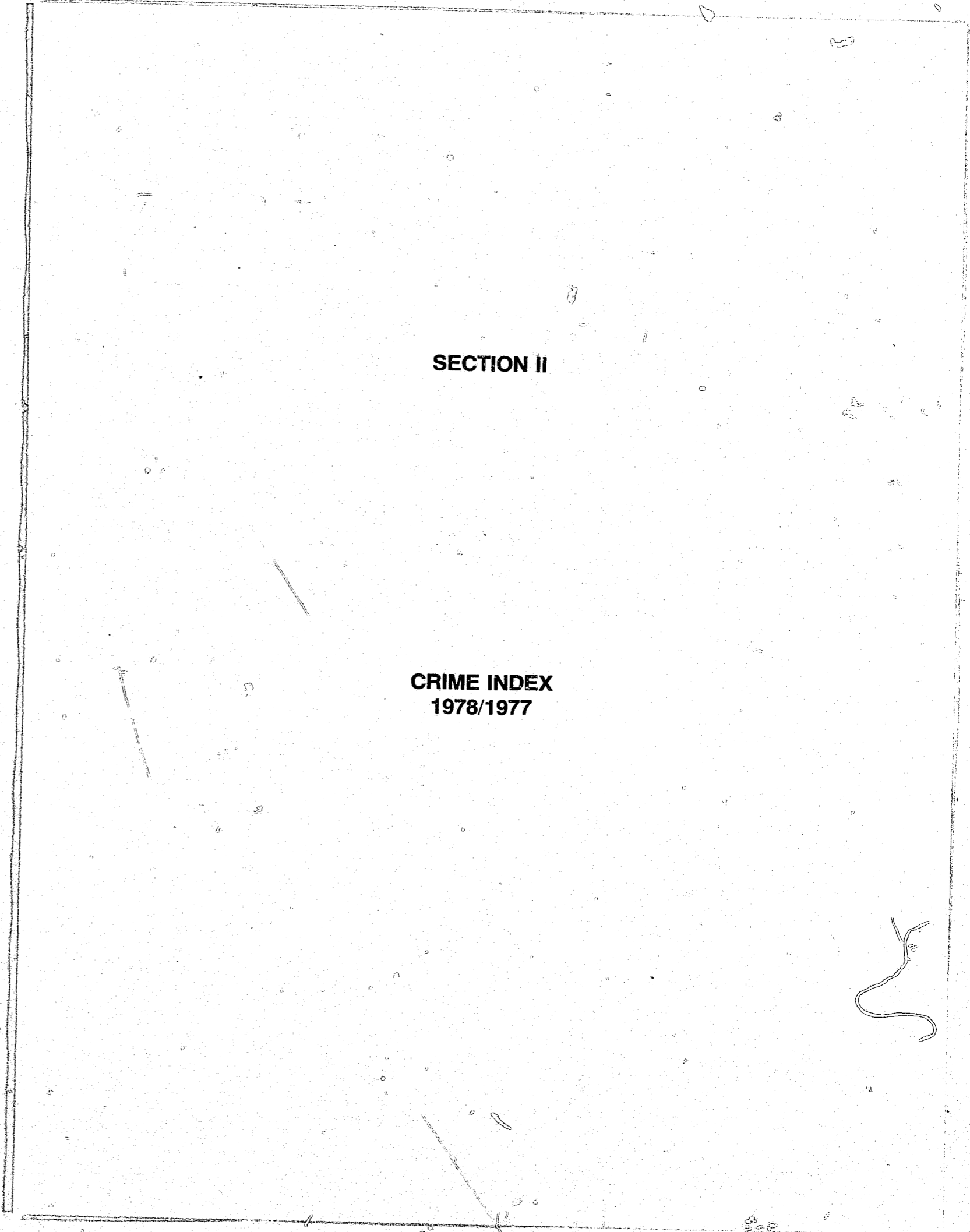
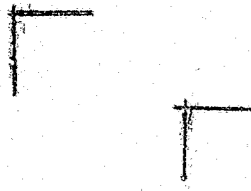

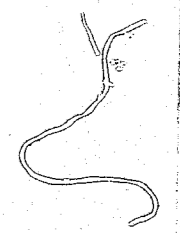

CRIME INDEX 1978/1977

The Crime Index for all law enforcement agencies, comparing statistics of 1978 to those of 1977, is illustrated in the following tables. The first table, Table 33, is in alphabetical order by county and law enforcement jurisdiction within the county. This table includes statistics reported by Colleges and Universities, and by the Illinois State Police. The county totals include the data reported by the Colleges and Universities; however, the Illinois State Police data is only reflected in the state totals. Some of the agencies have a numeric indicator preceding the year. The meanings of the numeric indicators are located at the bottom of each page. A number 1—One or More Months Data Missing, means that agency did not submit one or more of the required monthly reports for one reason or another. A number 2—No Index Crimes, means that agency submitted all reports but experienced no Index offenses throughout the year. A number 3—No Return From Agency, means the agency did not submit any of the required reports for the year indicated. A number 4—Reported Through Other Agency, means the agency submitted incidents of crime primarily through the Sheriff's office.

It was mentioned in the Introduction that there are many social factors that are related to crime. In making community comparisons these contributing factors must be considered in addition to a community's residential population which is used to calculate the Crime Rate. Communities like Bedford Park and McCook in Cook County have very small populations but have very large moving populations because they are manufacturing areas.

Likewise, Rosemont in Cook County is located adjacent to O'Hare Airport and has a relatively large transient population due to the number of motels within the jurisdiction. As a consequence those large moving populations attract criminal behavior that occurs within these small jurisdictions, and therefore must be reported by each of the law enforcement agencies. The Crime Rate calculation does not compensate for a moving population and when one reads Index material it appears that the crimes are committed by the residents of the community which is not necessarily the case. In conclusion, caution should be exercised when reviewing and using these data.

The last page of the Crime Index shown in Table 33 contains five totals; viz., Sheriffs' Offices, Police Departments, Universities, State Police, and State Totals. The State Total indicates a .4 percent increase in Index Crime in 1978 compared to 1977. The Sheriffs' Offices total shows a 1.5 percent increase in crime and Police Departments indicated a negligible difference in Index Crimes. University Totals show an increase of 5.3 percent while the State Police Totals show an increase of 199.2 percent.

The State totals of each of the Crime Index Offenses are presented also. It should be noted that the total for Murder and Voluntary Manslaughter shows 1,149 whereas elsewhere, the total shows 1,151. In 1978, two homicides were reported by a railroad; this agency type is not reflected in the Crime Index Report.

The Tables following the Crime Index display annual 1978/1977 comparison statistics for Railroads, Park Districts, Hospitals, and Other Agencies.

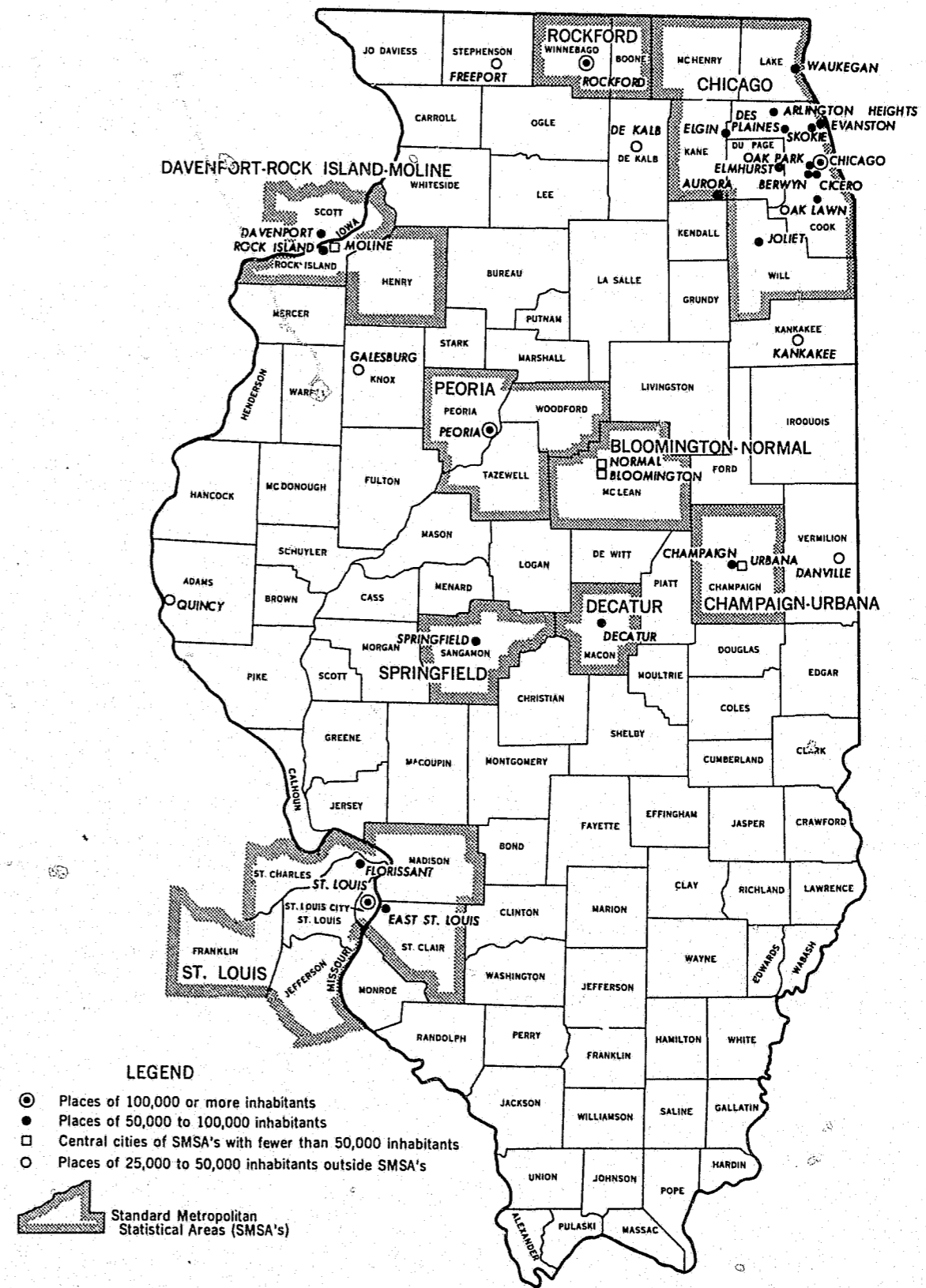

STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS (SMSA)

Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) are defined by the U. S. Bureau of the Census as follows:

A Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area (SMSA) includes a city of more than 50,000 and the county in which the city is located plus other cities which exhibit strong ties with the city. The county sheriff's office is also included for crime reporting purposes.

A core city is within an SMSA and has a population of more than 50,000 or more inhabitants. In certain SMSA's there are "twin central cities" that have a combined population of 50,000 or more inhabitants and together are considered a core city.

A suburban area consists of cities and towns with 50,000 or less population including the counties which are within the SMSA. The county sheriff's office is included in the suburban area.

The rural area is the unincorporated portion of a county outside of the SMSA's. For Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, the rural area is composed of the Sheriff's jurisdiction outside of the SMSA's.

The other cities are urban places outside of the SMSA's. For Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, there are cities and towns outside the SMSA's, surrounded by rural areas that are not under the jurisdiction of the county sheriff's offices.

Figure 2 is a map of Illinois with the SMSA's outlined with heavy lines. Two of the SMSA's overlap with Iowa and Missouri. Areas outside of the State that are included in an SMSA are deleted from the statistics about to be presented.

SMSA SUMMARY

Table 38 represents summary statistics for 1978 versus 1977 for the Core Cities and Suburban areas as defined above. These two areas reflect the SMSA data. The estimated population was 9,185,171 in 1978, accounting for 81.7 percent of the state population. The SMSA accounted for a total of 492,960 Index Offenses, or 89.7 percent of the State's Crime Index for 1978. Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and

Attempted Murder reflected the greatest change in increase, of 15.0 percent.

SMSA CORE CITY SUMMARY

Core Cities accounted for 4,821,275 inhabitants or 42.9 percent of the State's population and 52.5 percent of the population included in the Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas. Core Cities accounted for 60.9 percent of the total SMSA Index Crimes and 54.7 percent of the State Index Crimes. Core Cities accounted for 81.2 percent of the Murders and Voluntary Manslaughters that occurred in 1978. Table 39 provides other statistics with regard to Core Cities.

SMSA SUBURBAN SUMMARY

Suburban areas, like Core Cities, fall within the SMSA's. The suburbs are bounded by the SMSA lines by definition and they are outside the Core Cities. Total Suburban areas accounted for 4,363,896 inhabitants in 1978 which reflects 38.8 percent of the State population. The Crime Index increased 3.9 percent in volume in the suburbs in 1978 with Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murders showing the largest increase, one of 43.3 percent. Table 40 presents further data relating to Suburban Areas for 1978 and compares these statistics to 1977.

RURAL AREA SUMMARY

Rural Areas showed an increase of 2.8 percent in the 1978 Crime Index as compared to 1977. Motor Vehicle Theft increased the most of the Crime Index offenses, by 66.4 percent, followed by Robbery which increased by 50 percent. Rural Areas accounted for 971,102 inhabitants or 8.6 percent of the State population. The Index Crimes per 100,000 inhabitants, or the Crime Rate, for Rural Areas was 1,616.3 in 1978.

OTHER CITIES SUMMARY

The Other Cities consist of 199 Cities outside the Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas and within the Rural Areas. These cities account for 9.7 percent of the State's population and 7.4 percent of the 1978 Crime Index. The Crime Rate increased by 7.5 percent, with Aggravated Assault, Aggravated Battery, and Attempted Murder showing the greatest change when compared to 1977, an increase of 16.1 percent.

SECTION IV

OFFENSE AND CLEARANCE DATA

1978/1977 OFFENSE SUMMARY

Offense data summarized to the State level is represented in the Offense Summaries shown in the following tables. Table 43 is the 1978 Offense Summary and Table 44 is that for 1977, printed for comparison purposes. The following briefly narrates the charts to assist the reader in interpreting them.

The first column contains the four digit offense code related to the Illinois Revised Statutes. The second column, entitled Offense Classification, contains the descriptors of each offense code. (The Offense Code Sheet utilized for I-UCR scoring procedures is reproduced in the Appendix for the reader's reference.) The third column represents the number of Offenses Known to Police. The fourth column, Unfounded, enumerates those offenses that, after investigation, were found to not have occurred. This column also indicates the percent of unfounded offenses, to assist the law enforcement agency in maintaining an awareness of the number of calls received for service for criminal activity which did not actually occur. The fifth column, Referred to Responsible Jurisdiction, indicates the number of calls that were received that were found to be beyond an agency's jurisdiction and hence, referred to the responsible jurisdiction. Column six, Offenses Actually Occurred, is calculated by adding the numbers in the Unfounded and Referred to Responsible Jurisdiction columns and subtracting this sum from the number of Offenses Known to the Police. These are the offenses that the police pursued with investigation and solution, and are used in the Crime Index.

The Offenses Cleared columns contain eight sub-columns. The first four sub-columns represent figures on those offenses exceptionally cleared. A case is exceptionally cleared when:

1. The investigation has definitely established the identity of the offender, and
2. There is sufficient information to support an arrest, charge, and prosecution of the offender, and
3. The agency knows the exact location of the offender so he can be taken into custody, and
4. There is some reason outside of police control that stops the police from arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.

Some examples of exceptional clearances are:

1. Suicide of the offender.
2. Double murder (two persons kill each other).
3. Deathbed confession (the person responsible dies after making a confession).
4. Offender killed by police or citizen.
5. Confession by offender already in custody or serving a sentence.
6. An offender prosecuted in another city for a different offense by State or local authorities, or prosecuted in another city or state by the Federal Government for an offense which may be the same.

7. Extradition is denied.
8. The victim refuses to cooperate with the prosecution.
9. For some reason outside the agency's control, an offender is prosecuted for a less serious charge than that for which you arrested him.
10. The handling of a juvenile offender, either verbally or by written notice to parents, in instances involving minor offenses such as petty larceny. No referral is made to juvenile court as a matter of publicly accepted policy.

It is recognized that departmental policy in various police agencies permits the discontinuance of investigation and administratively closing of cases in which all possible investigation has been completed. This policy does not permit the offense to be cleared exceptionally. The recovery of property is not reason to clear a case for UCR purposes. The clearing of a case for I-UCR purposes should have no effect on the agency's internal policies for closing a case or discontinuing active investigation.

The column, Fail to File Complaint, is separated from all other exceptional clearances in order to give a clearer picture of those circumstances where the victim refuses to cooperate with the prosecution.

The column, Cleared by Arrest, is self-explanatory. Each of the clearance columns is divided into adult and juvenile sub-columns. The last column gives the total number of clearances and a percentage figure. The percentage figure is the Clearance Rate for that offense. The Clearance Rate is calculated as follows:

$$\text{CLEARANCE RATE} = \frac{\text{TOTAL OFFENSES CLEARED}}{\text{ACTUAL OFFENSES OCCURRED}} \times 100$$

At the end of each Offense Summary are five different totals. The Grand Total is the total of all activity. The *Total is the total number of incidents not necessarily included in National crime counts and are therefore subtracted for volume comparisons only with the National Program regarding all criminal activity. The Sub-Total (less*) is the total that should be used for comparison purposes. In addition, the Total Attempts to commit a crime are provided for information regarding incompleting crimes, followed by the Adjusted Total, which represents all activity less * and Attempts. The Sub-Total (less *) is used for the 1978 versus 1977 comparison of crime trends.

The Offense Summary Report is produced for each reporting agency on a monthly basis, and summarized to the State level. The Crime Index Report presented previously is developed from this basic report. For example, Attempted Murder, Aggravated Battery, and Aggravated Assault added together, make up the Aggravated Assault category of the Crime Index of the National Program. The data is kept separate on the State level by State Statute because the laws describe significantly different criminal behavior and are handled differently by the police and the prosecution.

AGE, SEX, AND RACE OF PERSONS ARRESTED AND HELD FOR PROSECUTION OR RELEASED

The total number of persons arrested for all offenses including the Crime Index offenses, in 1978 was 656,929. In 1977, the total was 552,778; therefore, the 1978 figure represents an increase of 18.8 percent. Males arrested in 1978 totaled 538,667 or 82 percent, while females arrested totaled 118,262 or 18 percent. Adults represented 81.7 percent of the total at 536,796 and juveniles represented 18.3 percent of the total at 120,133. Whites arrested accounted for 372,272 persons or 56.7 percent. Negroes arrested accounted for 24,339 persons, or 36.7 percent, and all other races accounted for 43,318 or 6.6 percent. Further details of those persons arrested in 1978 as compared to the figures of 1977 are presented in Table 45.

The Arrest Rate is defined the same as the Crime Rate:

$$\text{Arrest Rate} = \frac{\text{Total Arrests} \times 100,000}{\text{Population}}$$

Using this formula, the Arrest Rate for Illinois in 1978 was

$$\frac{656,929 \times 100,000}{11,243,000} \text{ or } 5,843 \text{ arrests per } 100,000 \text{ inhabitants}$$

In 1977, the Arrest Rate was 4,915.8 arrests per 100,000 inhabitants; therefore the 1978 Arrest Rate represents an increase of 18.9 percent.

Utilizing any of the figures listed below in Table 45, the Arrest Rate can be computed. For example, for white inhabitants, the Arrest Rate for 1978 was as follows:

$$\frac{372,272 \times 100,000}{9,713,952} \text{ or } 3,832.3 \text{ arrests per } 100,000 \text{ inhabitants.}$$

The Arrest Rate for Negro inhabitants in 1978 was as follows:

$$\frac{24,339 \times 100,000}{1,439,104} \text{ or } 16,770.1 \text{ arrests per } 100,000 \text{ inhabitants.}$$

*The 1978 estimated population for white inhabitants is 86.4% of the state population and the estimated 1978 population for Negro inhabitants is 12.8%.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY INFORMATION

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED—1978

The Illinois Uniform Crime Reporting Program gathers information regarding law enforcement officers killed feloniously or accidentally. Since the inception of the State level program in 1972, the year 1978 represents the first year that no law enforcement officers were killed feloniously in Illinois. One officer was killed accidentally while in the line of duty in 1978, as reported to the Bureau of Identification.

In September, an officer with the Chicago Police Department was in transit to the scene of an investigation. A motorist struck and killed the officer. The motorist was taken into custody at the time of the accident.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS ASSAULTED/BATTERED

Table 46 is a summary of law enforcement officers assaulted or battered as reported during 1978. There are three major divisions of this table: (1) Type of Weapons Used; (2) Type of Assignment; (3) Police Assaults/Batteries Cleared.

The type of weapon refers to the offender's use of a weapon to assault or batter a police officer. The type of assignment means the deployment technique for patrol and answering calls. For example, one column is headed "2-Man Vehicle"—2 men were assigned to a vehicle and this deployment technique accounted for 871 incidents of assault or battery against the law enforcement officers. When a "1-Man Vehicle" was deployed with an assist from another "1-Man Vehicle", the assaults and batteries amounted to 290 incidents. The last column of the table displays "cases cleared by arrests" by type of activity. In 1978, Table 46 indicates that 1,630 cases were cleared by arrest out of 1,794 (first column total) cases that occurred.

Line 15, "Time of Assault" is divided into a.m. and p.m. Note that between the hours of 1000-1200 p.m. and 1200-2000 a.m., 559 incidents occurred, or 31.2 percent of the total during the 24 hour time span. The table also shows that the highest frequency of occurrence in Type of Weapons area was when answering disturbance calls followed by attempting other arrests, handling prisoners, and traffic stops.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION

Statistics gathered on law enforcement employment detail several types of agencies. The totals explained in the following section do not include police employment figures for colleges, universities, railroads, park districts, hospitals, or the Department of Law Enforcement. Tables 49, 50, 51, 52, and 53 provide a breakdown of employees for these various types of agencies. Tables 47 and 48, following this narrative, detail the summary figures presented below by individual police department and sheriff's office.

The number of sworn officers, full-time and part-time, employed by police departments and sheriff's offices amounted to 28,889 during 1978. There were 4,707 civilian employees of police departments and sheriff's offices. Of these totals, there were 27,901 sworn male officers and 988 sworn female officers. There were 1,427 males employed in civilian capacities and 3,280 female civilian employees.

During 1978, police departments employed 24,893 sworn males or 97.1 percent of the total sworn force. Females totaled 750 sworn officers or 2.9 percent of the sworn force. Civilians comprised 13 percent of the police work force, representing 3,816 of the 29,459 employees of police departments throughout the State.

The number of sworn employees of police departments per 1,000 inhabitants of Illinois was 2.7 during 1978.

Sheriff's offices employed a total of 3,247 full-time and part-time sworn officers. Of this figure, 3,009 were males, or 92.7 percent of the total sworn force and 238 were females or 7.3 percent of the total sworn force. Civilians comprised 21.5 percent of the employees of sheriff's offices, or a total of 891 persons. In sum, sheriff's offices employed a total work force of 4,138 persons.

The number of sworn officers, both full-time and part-time, of sheriff's offices per 1,000 inhabitants of the State is 1.6.

Calculation of employees per 100,000 inhabitants is accomplished by using this formula:

$$\text{EMPLOYMENT RATE} = \frac{\text{NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES} \times 1,000}{\text{JURISDICTIONAL POPULATION}}$$

Example:

A given department has 60 employees. What is the manpower ratio per 1,000 inhabitants where the population is 51,000 inhabitants?

$$\text{ER} = \frac{60 \times 1,000}{51,000} = 1.2 \text{ per } 1,000 \text{ inhabitants}$$

If the number of full-time sworn officers per 1,000 inhabitants is needed, the above formula is utilized, scoring the number of full-time officers for the number of employees.

Law enforcement employees per 1,000 inhabitants should not be used in relation to the Index Crimes because non-index offenses and the many services performed by the typical law enforcement officer amount to over 80 percent of the officer's workload. The details of this workload usually remain unpublished. Again, each community should consider all the factors related to the causes of crime and determine the role of the law enforcement department relative to crime and to services that are required.

GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY

The Crime Index Offenses are defined below, as listed in the Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 38, in alphabetical order.

Aggravated Assault

12-2 § 12-2.

- (a) A person commits an aggravated assault, when, in committing an assault, he:

(1) Uses a deadly weapon.

Other sub-paragraphs of this statute are accounted for in the I-UCR Program under a sub category in order to be consistent with the National Program. The intent here is to threaten great bodily harm both at the State and National level regarding Index Crimes. Aggravated Battery is the furtherance of the Assault whereby physical contact is made resulting in great bodily harm.

Aggravated Battery

12-4 § 12-4.

- (a) A person who, in committing a battery, intentionally or knowingly causes great bodily harm, or permanent disability or disfigurement commits aggravated battery.

(b) Uses a deadly weapon.

(c) A person who administers to an individual or causes him to take, without his consent or by threat or deception, and for other than medical purposes, any intoxicating, poisonous, stupefying, narcotic or anesthetic substance commits aggravated battery.

Armed Robbery

18-2 § 18-2.

- (a) A person commits armed robbery when he violates Section 18-1 while armed with a dangerous weapon.

Burglary

19-1 § 19-1. A person commits burglary when without authority he knowingly enters or without authority remains within a building, house trailer, watercraft, aircraft, motor vehicle as defined by the Illinois Vehicle Code, railroad car, or any part thereof, with intent to commit therein a felony or theft.

Motor Vehicle Theft

(See the definition of Theft below.)

Murder

9-1 § 9-1.

- (a) A person who kills an individual without lawful justification commits murder if, in performing the acts which cause the death:

(1) He either intends to kill or do great bodily harm to that individual or another, or knows that such acts will cause death to that individual or another; or

(2) He knows that such acts create a strong probability of death or great bodily harm to that individual or another; or

(3) He is attempting or committing a forcible felony other than voluntary manslaughter.

Rape

11-1 § 11-1.

(a) A male person of the age of 14 years and upwards who has sexual intercourse with a female, not his wife, by force and against her will, commits rape. Intercourse by force and against her will includes, but is not limited to, any intercourse which occurs in the following situations:

(1) Where the female is unconscious; or

(2) Where the female is so mentally deranged or deficient that she cannot give effective consent to intercourse.

(b) Sexual intercourse occurs when there is any penetration of the female sex organ by the male sex organ.

Robbery

18-1 § 18-1.

(a) A person commits robbery when he takes property from the person or presence of another by the use of force or by threatening the imminent use of force.

Theft

16-1 § 16-1. A person commits theft when he knowingly:

(a) Obtains or exerts unauthorized control over property of the owner; or

(b) Obtains by deception control over property of the owner; or

(c) Obtains by threat control over property of the owner; or

(d) Obtains control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen by another or under such circumstances as would reasonably induce him to believe that the property was stolen, and

(1) Intends to deprive the owner permanently of the use or benefit of the property; or

(2) Knowingly uses, conceals or abandons the property in such manner as to deprive the owner permanently of such use or benefit; or

(3) Uses, conceals, or abandons the property knowing such use, concealment or abandonment probably will deprive the owner permanently of such use or benefit.

Voluntary Manslaughter

9-2 § 9-2.

(a) A person who kills an individual without lawful justification commits voluntary manslaughter if at the time of the killing he is acting under a sudden and intense passion resulting from serious provocation by:

- (1) The individual killed; or
- (2) Another whom the offender endeavors to kill, but he negligently or accidentally causes the death of the individual killed.

Serious provocation is conduct sufficient to excite an intense passion in a reasonable person.

(b) A person who intentionally or knowingly kills an individual commits voluntary manslaughter if at the time of the killing he believes the circumstances to be such that, if they existed, would justify or exonerate the killing under the principles stated in Chapter 38, Article 7, but his belief is unreasonable.

Other Offenses

Arson

20-1 § 21-1. A person commits arson when, by means of fire or explosive, he knowingly:

- (a) Damages any real property, or any personal property having a value of \$150 or more, of another without his consent; or
- (b) With intent to defraud an insurer, damages any property or any personal property having a value of \$150 or more.

Property "of another" means a building or other property, whether real or personal, in which a person other than the offender has an interest which the offender has no authority to defeat or impair, even though the offender may also have an interest in the building or property.

Criminal Damage to Property

21-1 § 21-1. Any of the following acts, except any act described in paragraph (g), is a Class A misdemeanor and any act enumerated in paragraph (a) or (f) when the damage to property exceeds \$150 is a Class 4 felony:

- (a) Knowingly damages any property of another without his consent; or
- (b) Recklessly by means of fire or explosive damages property of another; or
- (c) Knowingly starts a fire on the land of another without his consent; or
- (d) Knowingly injures a domestic animal of another without his consent; or
- (e) Knowingly deposits on the land or in the building of another, without his consent, any stink bomb or any offensive smelling com-

pound and thereby intends to interfere with the use by another of the land or building.

- (f) Damages any property, other than property described in Subsection 20-1(3), with intent to defraud an insurer.
- (g) Knowingly shooting of a firearm at any portion of a railroad train is a Class 4 felony.

Criminal Damage to State Supported Property

21-4 § 21-4. Any of the following acts is a Class A misdemeanor when the damage to property is \$500 or less, and any such act is a Class 4 felony when the damage exceeds \$500:

- (a) Knowingly damages any property supported in whole or in part with State funds or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies without the consent of the State; or
- (b) Knowingly, by means of fire or explosive damages property supported in whole or in part with State funds or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies; or
- (c) Knowingly starts a fire on property supported in whole or in part with State funds or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies without the consent of the State; or
- (d) Knowingly deposits on land or in a building supported in whole or in part with State funds, or Federal funds administered or granted through State agencies without the consent of the State, any stink bomb or any offensive smelling compound and thereby intends to interfere with the use by another of the land or building.
