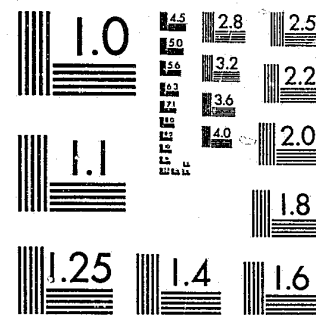

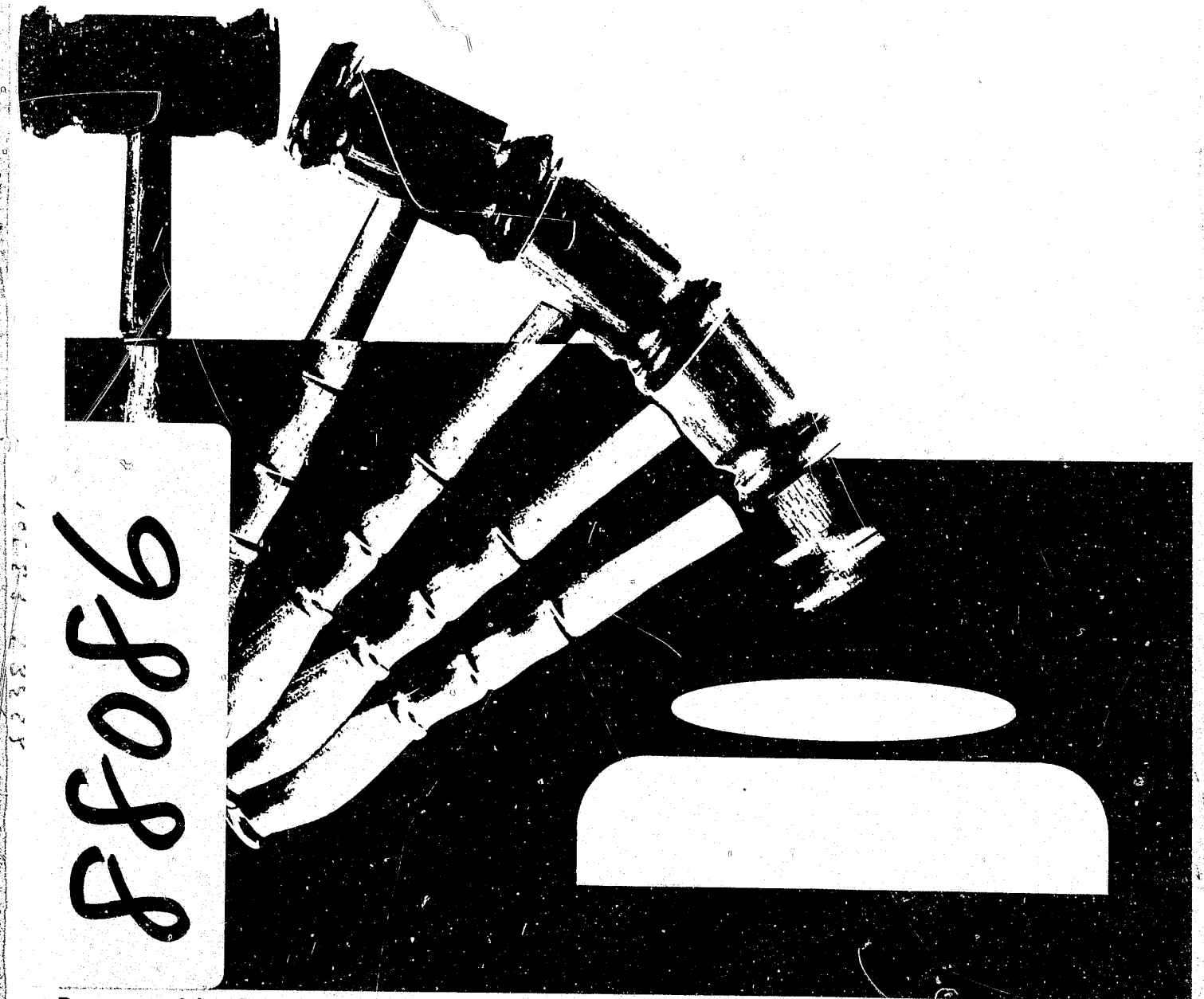

U.S. COURTS OF APPEALS

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, the number of appeals filed and terminated in the U.S. courts of appeals increased from the previous year. A total of 27,768 appeals were filed in the 12 circuit courts during 1982, a rise of 2.5 percent from the 27,101 appeals filed in 1981. Appellate terminations increased 8.3 percent during the past twelve months, up from 25,990 appeals in 1981 to 28,159 appeals in 1982. During the year, the number of terminations outnumbered filings by 391 appeals. This caused the pending appellate caseload to decline 1.8 percent, from 22,165 cases in 1981 to 21,774 cases in 1982. Table 1 is a comparison, by circuit, of the appellate workload during the twelve month periods ended September 30, 1981 and 1982. Appendix Table B-1 provides more detailed data on the appellate workload in 1982.

Filings

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, the total number of appeals filed in the U.S. courts of appeals rose 2.5 percent to 27,768 cases. In the past year, 9 of the 12 circuit courts registered increases in their filing activity. The largest increases in new filings were reported in the Eighth Circuit (up 15.5 percent); the First Circuit (up 13.6 percent); and the Tenth Circuit (up 10.7 percent). Three circuit courts (the Second, Fourth, and Ninth) experienced decreases in appellate filings during 1982. Of these courts, the greatest decline occurred in the Second Circuit, where new filings dropped 10.6 percent from the previous year. All categories of appeals decreased in the Second Circuit during this period with U.S. prisoner appeals showing the largest drop of 34.1 percent.

Among the various types of appeals nationwide, the most significant increase was in criminal appeals, up 12.4 percent, from 4,355 in 1981 to 4,897 in 1982. Four types of appeals reflected decreases in filing activity during the year. The greatest drop occurred in administrative agency appeals, down a sizable 18.1 percent to 3,060 cases. Modest declines in filing activity were recorded in U.S. prisoner appeals (down 3.1 percent); original proceedings (down 2.2 percent); and private prisoner appeals (down 1.1 percent).

Table 2 is a comparison of appeals commenced, by quarter, during each of the twelve month periods ended June 30, 1977 through 1982 and the first quarter of 1983. The 6,829 appeals filed during the period July through September 1982 were 2.5 percent lower than the 7,007 appeals filed during the same period last year. This quarterly decline represents the first decrease in a July through September period since 1977, when appellate filings dropped a slight 0.6 percent.

Terminations

During the past twelve months, 9 of the 12 courts of appeals reported increases in their termination activity. This growth resulted in an 8.3 percent rise in total appellate terminations for 1982. The largest growth was in the Tenth Circuit, where case dispositions increased 44.0 percent over last year. Part of this circuit's growth can be attributed to two large groups of criminal appeals which arose from the District Court of Colorado. Each group of appeals was consolidated in the Tenth Circuit for the purposes of oral argument and final disposition. Other courts with significant increases in their case dispositions were the Third Circuit (up 31.9 percent); the Sixth Circuit (up 22.9 percent); the First Circuit (up 22.2 percent); the Eighth Circuit (up 22.2 percent); and the Fourth Circuit (up 20.1 percent). In 1982, three courts experienced decreases in their total termination activity. These courts were the Second Circuit (down 13.6 percent); the Ninth Circuit (down 5.3 percent); and the District of Columbia Circuit (down 0.5 percent).

Pending Caseload

As noted above, more appeals were terminated than were docketed in the U.S. courts of appeals, causing the pending appellate caseload to drop 1.8 percent. Seven of the twelve courts of appeals were able to reduce the number of cases pending on their dockets during the year. The most substantial decreases in pending cases were reported in the Third Circuit (down 11.0 percent) and the Tenth Circuit (down 10.2 percent). Declines for the remaining five circuits with reduced caseloads ranged from 4.1 to 8.1 percent. Of the five courts with increased pending caseloads, the most significant growth was reported in the Eleventh and Second Circuits, up 20.1 percent and 15.8 percent, respectively.

CASES UNDER SUBMISSION

Compared to a year ago, the overall number of cases under submission has increased slightly. The U.S. courts of appeals, Court of Claims, and Court of Customs and Patent Appeals reported 765 cases held under submission more than three months on September 30, 1982, as provided in Table 3. This was a 0.5 percent increase compared to the 761 cases reported in September 1981. A total of 444 cases (58.0 percent) were held more than three but less than six months; 180 cases (23.5 percent) were held more than six but less than nine months; 83 cases (10.8 percent) were held more than nine months but less than one year; and 58 cases (7.6 percent) were held more than one year. The Ninth Circuit reported 217 cases, 28.4 percent of the total cases under submission. Cases awaiting the submission of additional memoranda or awaiting an opinion in another case are not included in the totals.

The Fifth Judicial Circuit was divided into two circuits, the Fifth and the Eleventh, on October 1, 1981. Cases taken under submission prior to that time are listed under the former Fifth Circuit in the accompanying table. In some cases, the panels were made up of judges who are now in either the reorganized Fifth or Eleventh Circuits. Several cases under submission were heard en banc in the former Fifth Circuit.

U.S. DISTRICT COURTS

CIVIL WORKLOAD

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, a total of 212,559 civil cases were commenced in the U.S. district courts. This figure represents an increase of 14.5 percent over the 185,626 cases filed during the same period one year ago. The number of cases terminated also rose during the 1982 period, up 8.5 percent, from 180,772 in 1981 to 196,120 cases in 1982. Although there was a significant rise in dispositions, the pending civil caseload continued to increase, jumping from 195,525 in 1981 to an all-time high of 211,964 in 1982. Table 4 provides a comparison, by district, of the civil caseload during each of the twelve month periods ended September 30, 1981 and 1982. Additional data on civil activity in the U.S. district courts is provided in Appendix Tables C-1, C-2, C-3, C-3A, C-6A, and C-6B.

Civil Filings - Twelve Month Period

The 212,559 civil cases filed during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, continued the trend of steady increases in the civil workload. The 14.5 percent rate of increase is significantly higher than the 8.3 percent rate of increase recorded last year. The most notable increase in any category of civil filings occurred in recovery of overpayments and enforcement of judgment cases, up 54.2 percent, from 20,673 in 1981 to 31,869 in 1982. The steady rise in the number of recovery cases can be attributed to the Federal Government's increasing efforts to recover defaulted student loans and overpayments of veteran's benefits.

There were 82 districts that experienced increases in filings over 1981. Substantial percentage increases occurred in Minnesota (up 90.3 percent); Guam (up 88.9 percent); and Oklahoma, Northern (up 88.5 percent). The increases in Minnesota and Oklahoma, Northern are largely the result of recovery of overpayments and enforcement of judgment cases, while the increase in Guam is the result of a rise in land condemnation cases. Although most districts experienced an increase in filings, 12 districts, other than the Canal Zone (the court was phased out in March 1982), experienced declines in filings during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982.

The largest reductions were reported in Virginia, Eastern (down 17.6 percent); Maine (down 17.4 percent); and the Virgin Islands (down 17.0 percent). Decreases in the number of recovery of overpayments and enforcement of judgment cases in Virginia, Eastern; personal injury product liability cases in Maine; and personal injury cases in the Virgin Islands are largely responsible for these declines.

Civil Filings - Three Month Period

A comparison, by quarter, of civil cases filed during each of the twelve month periods ended June 30, 1977 through 1982, and the first quarter of 1983, is provided in Table 5. The 56,793 civil cases filed during the three month period (July through September 1982) is 12.6 percent higher than the 50,427 cases filed during the same period last year, but is down slightly from the 57,220 cases filed during the previous quarter.

Civil Terminations

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, the U.S. district courts disposed of 196,120 civil cases, 15,348 more than the 180,772 disposed of a year ago. Among the 78 districts reporting increases in disposition activity, the most notable were Minnesota (up 84.7 percent); Wisconsin, Western (up 82.4 percent); and North Carolina, Middle (up 75.2 percent). The increases in the termination caseloads in these districts are the result of dispositions of recovery of overpayments and enforcement of judgment cases in Minnesota and North Carolina, Middle, and prisoner civil rights cases in Wisconsin, Western. Other districts experiencing large increases in disposition activity were South Dakota (up 55.7 percent); Oklahoma, Northern (up 51.6 percent); and New York, Northern (up 51.3 percent). Other than in the Canal Zone, the largest reductions in civil terminations were in Massachusetts (down 40.9 percent); West Virginia, Southern (down 25.0 percent); Alaska (down 17.1 percent); and New York, Western (down 17.0 percent).

Civil Pending Caseload

The civil pending caseload increased at a rate of 8.4 percent, from 195,525 cases in 1981 to 211,964 cases during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982. The current rate of increase in the pending caseload reverses a downward trend since 1979, when the rate of increase reached 8.1 percent. After 1979, the rate of increase dropped to 3.9 percent in 1980 and to 2.5 percent in 1981.

Despite the overall increase in the number of civil cases pending in the U.S. district courts during 1982, 15 districts were able to reduce their caseloads. Among those districts experiencing declines (other than the Canal Zone), the most significant were Florida, Southern (down 26.1 percent); South Dakota (down 19.2 percent); and Maine (down 17.3 percent). Other substantial declines occurred in Wisconsin, Western; Michigan, Western; and Kentucky, Eastern; down 16.7 percent, 16.4 percent, and 16.1 percent, respectively. The largest increases in pending caseloads were reported by Georgia, Middle (up 51.0 percent) and Utah (up 35.4 percent).

Civil Cases Pending Three Years or More

In March 1981, the Judicial Conference adopted a resolution requiring judges to annually review their dockets and report the status of all cases pending three years or more. This resolution, together with the adoption of other resolutions in September 1961 and March 1963, expresses the concern of the Judicial Conference regarding efforts to reduce the number of civil cases pending three years or more.

As of June 30, 1982, a total of 13,979 civil cases had been pending three years or more. As of September 30, 1982, this number increased to 14,455 cases. The 14,455 cases pending three years or more is expected to decline as judges continue to direct more attention to the disposition of these matters. The districts with the smallest number of three-year-old cases are Tennessee, Eastern and the Northern Mariana Islands with two each. A comparison, by district, of the number of civil cases pending three years or more (excluding land condemnation) as of June 30, 1982 and September 30, 1982 is provided in Table 6.

CRIMINAL WORKLOAD

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, the number of criminal cases filed in U.S. district courts increased by 5.8 percent from 31,280 last year to 33,097 this year. Case terminations rose by 7.3 percent, with 31,877 cases terminated this year compared to 29,705 in 1981. There were 1,220 more cases filed than terminated during the year, resulting in an increase in the pending caseload at the end of the year. The 17,671 cases pending on September 30, 1982 represented a 7.4 percent increase over the 16,451 cases pending on the same day a year ago. Table 7 compares the number of criminal cases and defendants for the twelve month periods ended September 31, 1981 and 1982. The number of cases filed, terminated, and pending during the year is provided by district in Appendix Table D-1.

During the three month period from July 1, 1982 through September 30, 1982, there were 8,695 criminal cases filed. This was a 6.0 percent increase over the 8,204 cases filed in the same three months last year. There were 7,680 cases terminated during the quarter, almost the same number as last year when there were 7,677 cases terminated for the quarter.

Criminal Cases by Offense Level and Type of Proceeding

There were 31,995 cases filed, excluding transfers, during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982. During the year there were 21,861 felony cases filed; 9,572 misdemeanors other than petty offenses; and 562 petty offense filings. The number of cases filed by type of proceeding is provided in Appendix Table D-2. Table 8 provides this information for felony cases only for the twelve month periods ended September 30, 1981 and 1982. The 21,861 felony cases, excluding transfers, filed in the courts during 1982 represented an increase of 6.1 percent over the 20,600 felony cases filed in 1981. The number of felony cases commenced by indictment increased by 4.8 percent from 17,240 cases last year to 18,071 this year. Indictment is the most common method by which cases are commenced in the district courts and this type of proceeding accounted for 82.7 percent of all felony cases and for 56.5 percent of all criminal cases filed during the year. Felony cases filed by an information when the indictment was waived by the defendant increased by 83.5 percent, from 479 case filings last year to 879 this year.

Criminal Filings by Major Offense

Case filings increased in most offense categories this year, contributing to the overall rise in filings. The largest increase occurred in forgery and counterfeiting cases which rose by 28.6 percent from 1,764 cases in 1981 to 2,269 in 1982. Prosecutions for auto theft increased by 20.8 percent from 308 cases to 372 cases.

Prosecutions under the Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act (DAPCA) increased by 14.8 percent, up to 4,329 cases in 1982 compared to 3,771 in 1981. Under DAPCA, case filings for marihuana violations rose by 39.2 percent from 1,257 cases to 1,750 cases. Appendix Table D-2 provides case filings by offense categories. Case filings by district and offense are provided in Appendix Table D-3.

Criminal Pending Caseload

There were 17,671 cases pending on September 30, 1982 compared to 16,451 cases pending last year, an increase of 7.4 percent. Table 9 provides the number of cases pending in each of the district courts as of September 30, 1981 and 1982. Sixty districts showed increases in the pending caseloads this year, while 35 districts had decreases in pending cases.

The largest percentage increases occurred in Louisiana, Western; West Virginia, Northern; Guam; and Illinois, Central. Each of these districts had more than a 100.0 percent increase in pending cases. Following these districts were Missouri, Eastern (87.7 percent); Nevada (84.9 percent); Louisiana, Eastern (69.2 percent); Washington, Eastern (67.6 percent); and New York, Western (58.8 percent).

CASES AND MOTIONS UNDER ADVISEMENT

For the third quarter of 1982, U.S. district judges reported 1,297 matters held under advisement over 60 days, a 10.0 percent increase over the 1,179 matters reported last year. Some of this increase is attributable to the number of judges who reported this quarter. There were 514 district judges, including 121 senior judges, who reported on the status of matters before the court, compared to 462 district judges for the same quarter last year (see Table 10). While 317 judges (61.7 percent) reported no matters under advisement over 60 days, 197 judges (38.3 percent) reported matters under advisement on September 30, 1982.

The 197 judges having matters held under advisement reported a total of 1,297 cases and motions held under advisement over 60 days on September 30, 1982. Of these, 869 cases and motions (67.0 percent) were held under advisement over 60 days but not more than six months; 289 cases and motions (22.3 percent) were held under advisement over six months but not more than one year; and 139 cases and motions (10.7 percent) were held over one year. The district judges of the Seventh Circuit reported the largest number of matters under advisement with a total of 295 matters or 22.7 percent, while district judges in the District of Columbia Circuit reported only 6 cases or 0.5 percent of all matters reported.

Table 11 provides the distribution by circuit of cases and motions held under advisement over 60 days in the U.S. district courts on September 30, 1982.

U.S. BANKRUPTCY COURTS

Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, bankruptcy estate filings rose slightly to 536,419 or 2.7 percent higher than the 522,486 filed last year. Bankruptcy estate terminations increased substantially, up 21.8 percent from 357,036 in 1981 to 434,932 in 1982. The pending bankruptcy caseload continued to increase, rising to 756,553 estates as of September 30, 1982, 15.5 percent above the 655,066 pending a year ago. A summary of the bankruptcy caseload during the twelve month periods ended September 30, 1981 and 1982 is provided in Table 12. Additional data on the bankruptcy caseload during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, is provided in Appendix Tables F-1, F-2A, F-2B, F-3A, F-3B, F-3C, and F-3D.

Bankruptcy Filings

The 536,419 estates filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts in 1982 are up slightly from the number filed during the same period in 1981, and 27.3 percent higher than in 1980. The 1982 estate figure includes 373,853 cases filed pursuant to the Bankruptcy Reform Act of 1978, Public Law 95-598 (referred to as Code cases). Of these 373,853 Code cases, 162,168 are joint petitions. The remaining 398 cases are estates originally filed prior to implementation of the Reform Act and reopened during this period and are referred to as Act cases. The Sixth, Seventh, and Ninth Circuits had the greatest concentration of bankruptcy filing activity. These three circuits accounted for 52.4 percent of all estates filed in 1982. Table 14 shows the filing activity in each district for bankruptcy cases and joint petitions during the twelve month periods ended September 30, 1981 and 1982.

Bankruptcy Filings - Three Month Period

During the three month period July through September 1982, a total of 139,144 estates were commenced, a 6.6 percent increase over the 130,536 filed during the same period a year ago. The 139,144 estates filed during this quarter is the highest number of bankruptcy estates ever filed during a comparable period. Table 13 provides a comparison of bankruptcy estates filed, by quarter, for statistical years 1975 through 1982 and for the first quarter of 1983.

Bankruptcy Terminations

Bankruptcy estate terminations continued to climb during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, reaching an all-time high of 434,932, up 77,896 from the 357,036 estates in 1981. The estate termination figure is comprised of 285,651 Bankruptcy Code cases (121,005 joint petitions) and 28,276 Act cases. Table 15 indicates the extent of the increase in termination activity in the six largest districts.

Bankruptcy Estates Pending

Despite the significant increase in termination activity, the pending caseload in the U.S. bankruptcy courts continued to rise, reaching a high of 756,553 estates as of September 30, 1982. The rate of increase, however, dropped significantly from 33.7 percent in 1981 to 15.5 percent in 1982. The current pending caseload is comprised of 481,970 Code cases (214,454 joint petitions) and 60,129 Act cases.

Adversary Proceedings

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, a total of 149,264 adversary proceedings were filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts, up a substantial 39.8 percent from the 106,764 filed in 1981. Adversary proceeding terminations also jumped significantly, rising 44.5 percent from 69,180 in 1981 to 99,933 in 1982. Despite the increased termination activity, the number of pending adversary proceedings rose to 117,146, an increase of 72.7 percent from the 67,815 proceedings pending a year ago. Table 14 provides a comparison of adversary proceedings filed, in 1981 and 1982, by district. Appendix Table F-1AP also provides a summary of adversary proceeding activity, by district, during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982.

FEDERAL PROBATION SYSTEM

As of September 30, 1982, the number of persons under supervision in the Federal Probation System had risen to 59,009 from 58,494 reported on the same date last year. This increase, although relatively small, was in sharp contrast to the decrease of 4,867 reported in 1981. The turnaround resulted from an increase of 2,856 in the number of persons received for supervision in 1982, with the total reaching 32,048 (excluding transfers). In addition, the number of removals from supervision declined nearly 1,000 this year to 31,775 (excluding transfers), down from 32,707 removed last year. Appendix Table E-1 displays the number of persons received for and removed from supervision during the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, by district.

Persons Received for Supervision Increases 9.8 Percent

The 32,048 persons received on new or reinstated periods of supervision in 1982 was 9.8 percent more than were received last year. This increase reversed a decline of 1,678 that was recorded last year (see technical note). As shown in Table 16, the number of persons received from district courts this year was 3,046 or 15.8 percent higher than last year, the second successive increase following several years of declines. The number of court probationers received was up 14.8 percent while the number received for probation supervision imposed by U.S. magistrates increased by 21.5 percent. A smaller rise of 114 or 5.8 percent was reported in the number of persons received this year under conditions of pretrial diversion.

TECHNICAL NOTE

In the past, records received during the year reporting supervision periods that actually commenced during a prior year have been added to the number of persons under supervision at the beginning of the year. This year, a change was made to add late-arriving records to the total of persons received. This change accounted for part of the increase in persons received.

In contrast, 190 (1.9 percent) fewer persons were received from institutions this year, but this decline was modest when compared to the drop of more than 2,400 persons reported in 1981. A decrease of 6.7 percent in the number of persons received on parole offset increases of 9.0 percent and 8.2 percent in the number of persons received on mandatory release and special parole terms, respectively.

A comparison of the total received for supervision for the three month periods July through September 1981 and 1982 is provided in Table 17. The total number of persons received during the three month period this year was 8.1 percent above the number recorded during the same period in 1981. The increase in special parolees noted over the full year does not appear in the three month comparison indicating that perhaps the increasing trend in this area has slowed somewhat. The increase in persons received on pretrial diversion was more pronounced during the three month period, as was the decrease in military parolees received. Changes shown in the three month comparison for the other types of supervision paralleled the changes shown in the twelve month analysis of persons received.

Persons Removed from Supervision

The number of persons removed to inactive status or terminated from supervision (excluding transfers) fell to 31,775 in 1982. This was 932 fewer removals than last year and 2,182 below the total removed two years ago.

The 12,880 court probationers removed from supervision this year was a decrease of 678 from last year's total. There were also 517 fewer parolees removed in 1982, down from 7,605 to 7,088, and 401 fewer special parolees removed.

The number of probationers removed from supervision imposed by U.S. magistrates rose to 5,723 this year from 5,082 last year. This increase, which was the only one of any significance in persons removed from supervision, resulted from the rising number of persons under supervision during the past 18 months on these relatively shorter terms.

Persons Under Supervision

As shown in Table 18, there were 59,009 persons under supervision on September 30, 1982. This was a slight increase of 0.9 percent above the total reported at the end of last year. Persons supervised by the courts increased by 1,965 (4.8 percent) to 42,689, while the number of institutional releasees under supervision declined by 1,450 (8.2 percent) to 16,320.

At the close of the year, there were 947 more probationers serving terms imposed by U.S. magistrates and 907 more probationers serving court-imposed terms. These increases were countered by a substantial decline of 1,241 in the number of parolees supervised at the close of the period. Small declines were also reported in persons serving special parole terms (down 89); mandatory release (down 74); and military parole (down 46).

Changes in District Caseloads

During the twelve month period ended September 30, 1982, 55 districts experienced increases in their caseloads. Maryland reported a gain of 304 persons under supervision; New York, Southern increased its caseload by 137 persons; and Georgia, Northern's caseload grew by 131 persons. North Carolina, Western had 133 more persons under supervision when the year ended, partly as a result of a re-alignment in which they gained four counties from the Middle District of North Carolina (P.L. 96-462, effective 10-1-81). California, Southern and Florida, Southern also reported increases in their caseloads during 1982 of 110 and 104 persons, respectively.

Although only 39 districts showed reductions in their caseloads this year compared to 71 last year, five districts reported declines of more than 100 persons. The District of Columbia had 167 fewer persons under supervision and Michigan, Eastern was down 161 persons when the period closed. New York, Eastern registered a decrease of 105 persons under supervision, while Pennsylvania, Western reported 101 fewer persons under supervision on September 30, 1982. Finally, the 138 persons shown under supervision in the Canal Zone last year are not shown this year because the probation office closed on March 31, 1982 in accordance with the Panama Canal Treaty.

Table 19 provides data on persons under supervision by district on September 30, 1981 and 1982. Appendix Table E-2 provides the number of persons under each type of supervision by district as of September 30, 1982.
