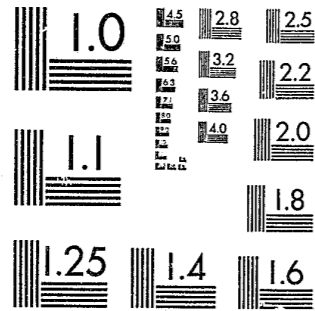

Wisconsin Crime and Arrests - 1981

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Care should be exercised in making comparisons of the data in this report with the data contained in previous annual reports. Adjustments may be required for the following reasons:

--Shifting of a law enforcement agency from one population category to another based on annual re-estimation of the jurisdiction's population.

--On occasion, the Federal Government designates an additional Wisconsin County as being included in a Standard Metropolitan Statistical Area. This could shift a Sheriff's Office from the Rural Areas Category to the suburban Sheriff's group and shift the cities within the county from Non-Suburban Cities to Suburban Cities.

--Populations are estimated for non-census years.

--1980 and 1981 figures include all Universities in the "Cities Under 5,000 Population" Category. Previously, Universities were assigned to population categories based on their enrollments.

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Crime and Arrests in Wisconsin - 1981Introduction

This report, prepared by the Wisconsin Statistical Analysis Center, presents data on crime and arrests in Wisconsin during 1981. The data were collected by Wisconsin law enforcement agencies and reported monthly to the state Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. From 1970 to 1980 the state UCR program, operated by the Crime Information Bureau of the State Department of Justice (DOJ), collected, compiled, and reported crime and arrest data for Wisconsin. Beginning in 1971 DOJ also provided data to the national UCR system, a program of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Effective December 31, 1981 the state program operated by DOJ was discontinued due to budget reductions. The 1981 data collected by DOJ were transmitted directly to the FBI. This report is based largely on the 1981 Wisconsin UCR data compiled by the FBI.

The National UCR Program

The national Uniform Crime Reporting program was initiated in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). After soliciting input from law enforcement agencies throughout the country, an IACP committee developed uniform offense and arrest classifications and reporting procedures which could be used by law enforcement agencies in every state. The FBI was designated as the national clearinghouse for UCR data. The Committee on Uniform Crime Reports of the IACP continues to serve the national program in an advisory capacity. In 1966 the National Sheriff's Association also established a Committee on Uniform Crime Reports to act as an advisory body to the program. The FBI regularly receives data on reported crime and arrests from law enforcement agencies throughout the country. The data are provided either by individual law enforcement agencies or by state UCR programs which collect and compile data for their states and convey the data to the FBI. From these data the FBI publishes its annual report: Crime in the United States.

The Wisconsin UCR Program

As indicated, the Wisconsin UCR program, which had been operated by DOJ, was discontinued in 1981. Wisconsin, therefore, does not currently have a state UCR program. The program operated by DOJ from 1970 to 1980 required that all law enforcement agencies submit UCR data either directly or through the county sheriff's office. It also required that DOJ submit the prescribed data to the FBI. DOJ expanded the national UCR program's classifications to collect more detailed and appropriate data on Wisconsin crime and arrests. From the statewide UCR data, DOJ published its annual report: Wisconsin Crime and Arrests, as well as quarterly, semi-annual, and other summary reports.

In November 1981 the Wisconsin Council on Criminal Justice received a grant from the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Statistics, to develop the Wisconsin Statistical Analysis Center (SAC). The SAC, under Executive Order No. 87 issued by Governor Lee Sherman Dreyfus on November 27, 1981, was mandated to collect and analyze criminal justice data, produce statistical reports on crime and the justice system, and promote the development of criminal justice information systems. SAC has assumed a substantial number of the state UCR program functions. SAC is collecting 1982 UCR data from most of Wisconsin's law enforcement agencies -- those which have responded to SAC's request for copies of the UCR forms sent to the FBI. The data are being compiled to provide detailed reports on Wisconsin's crime and arrests and to respond to requests for these statistics. SAC is currently recreating a comprehensive state UCR program which will meet the information needs of state and local criminal justice system professionals and decision-makers.

The 1981 Wisconsin Crime and Arrests Report

The data in this report are, for the most part, based on information provided to SAC by the national UCR program. The data provided were, for each Wisconsin reporting agency, yearly totals of index offenses by type of offense, the number of total and juvenile clearances for each index offense, and totals of adult and juvenile arrests by type of offense by age, sex, and race. Supplementary data on homicides, data on property stolen, law enforcement officers killed and assaulted, and law enforcement personnel were not available. The data supplied by the FBI were reviewed and edited by SAC staff.

Data for all 12 months of 1981 were not available for every reporting agency. As noted, the data provided by the FBI were compiled from data transmitted to the FBI by the Wisconsin DOJ. Data for the first six months of 1981 were transmitted to the FBI on magnetic tape; data for the second half of the year were transmitted on the original Wisconsin UCR forms. The months missing from the FBI records may never have been reported to DOJ or may not have been interpretable by the FBI. Some of the data missing from the FBI records have been restored from available DOJ records. Nonetheless, a significant amount of data is still missing. In general, the data presented for individual jurisdictions in this report are the reported data, with an indication of the number of months reported. The statewide totals presented are generally estimated state totals.

SUMMARY OF 1981 CRIME AND ARRESTS

Crime Index: The Crime Index is the sum of eight major offenses used to indicate the occurrence of crime in the United States. The eight offenses are murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. The first four of these make up the Violent Crime Index and the last four make up the Property Crime Index. The number of known index offenses in Wisconsin remained virtually unchanged between 1980 and 1981, increasing 0.2 percent. However, the number of index offenses has increased sporadically since 1971. The 1981 total of 227,066 reported offenses is 67 percent higher than the 1971 total.

Violent Offenses: There were an estimated 8,906 violent offenses reported in 1981, an increase of 4.2 percent over 1980 and an increase of 124 percent since 1971. While violent offenses have increased more rapidly than property offenses since 1971, their effect upon the Crime Index is minimal because they constitute only about 4 percent of the total Crime Index.

Property Offenses: There were an estimated 218,160 property offenses reported in 1981, an increase of 0.1 percent over 1980 and an increase of 66 percent since 1971. Property offenses constitute 96 percent of the total Crime Index.

Murder: There were an estimated 160 murders reported in 1981, a 17.6 percent increase over 1980 and a 29 percent increase since 1971. While murder is the most serious index offense, it represents less than 0.1 percent of the total Crime Index.

Forcible Rape:¹ There were an estimated 738 reported rapes in 1981, a 5.9 percent increase over 1980 and a 113 percent increase since 1971. The highest incidence of rape in 1981 was in jurisdictions of 50,000 population or more.

Robbery: There were an estimated 3,238 reported robberies in 1981, a 2.2 percent decrease over 1980 but a 129 percent increase since 1971. This increase is the largest percentage change in an index offense over the past decade.

The Uniform Crime Reporting definition of forcible rape is not the same as the Wisconsin Statute's definition of sexual assault. All data pertaining to forcible rape in this report are based on the Uniform Crime Reporting definition.

Aggravated Assault: There were an estimated 4,770 aggravated assaults in 1981, making this offense the most frequent of the four violent offenses. Reported aggravated assaults in 1981 increased 8.3 percent over 1980 and 128 percent over 1971.

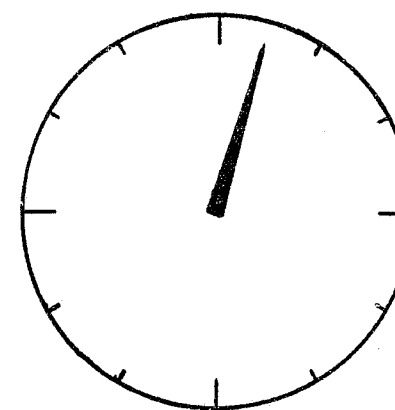
Burglary: There were an estimated 50,710 burglaries reported in 1981, an increase of less than one-half of one percent over 1980 but an 80 percent increase since 1971. Burglary is one of three index offenses for which a majority of those arrested are juveniles.

Theft: There were an estimated 155,576 reported thefts in 1981, an increase of 1.0 percent over 1980 but a 70 percent increase since 1971. Since theft constitutes over two-thirds of all index offenses, changes in patterns of theft usually result in similar changes in the total Crime Index.

Motor Vehicle Theft: There were an estimated 10,267 reported motor vehicle thefts in 1981, a decrease of 10.6 percent over 1980 and a 4.3 percent decrease since 1971. It is the only index offense which has declined over the past decade. Juveniles constitute nearly two-thirds of those arrested for motor vehicle theft.

Arson: There were an estimated 1,607 reported arsons in 1981, a decrease of 15.7 percent from 1980. Arson was not included in the Crime Index until 1979, hence a ten year trend cannot be examined. Juveniles make up a majority of those arrested for arson.

¹ The crime clock should be viewed with caution. Since it is the most aggregate representation of UCR data, it is designed to convey the annual reported crime experience by showing the relative frequency of index offense occurrence. This method of display does not imply a regularity in the commission of index offenses; rather it represents the annual ratio of crime to fixed periods of time.

Summary of Offense and Arrest Trends: 1971 - 1981

The following four tables present statewide data on 1) the number of index offenses, 2) offense rates for index offenses, 3) clearance rates for index offenses, and 4) the ratio of arrests to offenses for index offenses for each year from 1971 to 1981. Each table shows percent changes from 1971 to 1981 and eleven year averages of the data presented. Certain adjustments, noted in footnotes to each table, were made in the total Crime Index and Property Crime Index figures to make the data comparable from year to year.

The total number of known index offenses in Wisconsin has been increasing sporadically since 1971. The total of 1,227,066 index offenses represents a 67 percent increase over 1971. The offense rate for the total Crime Index increased from 3,016.9 to 4,827.1 crimes per 100,000 population from 1971 to 1981, an increase of 59 percent. The number of violent offenses increased from 3,973 to 8,906 from 1971 to 1981, an increase of 124 percent. The number of property crimes increased 66 percent over the same period, from 130,641 to 218,160. The violent offense rate increased 113 percent, from 89.0 to 189.3 from 1971 to 1981. The property offense rate increased 57 percent, from 2,927.9 to 4,637.8.

While the number of index offenses and the offense rate per 100,000 population increased between 1971 and 1981, the proportion of offenses cleared by arrest and the ratios of arrests to offenses decreased. The decrease in clearance rates has been more variable than the decrease in arrest ratios. The clearance rate for the total Crime Index decreased 13 percent, from 23.8 percent in 1971 to 20.8 percent in 1981. While the clearance rate for property crimes decreased 15.4 percent, the clearance rate for violent crimes was more constant, decreasing just 3.6 percent. The 8.3 percent decline in the robbery clearance rate is the largest decline among the clearance rates for violent offenses. The 25.6 percent decrease in the burglary clearance rate is the largest and most consistent clearance rate decrease of all the index offenses. The decline in the arrest ratios over the eleven year period roughly parallels the decline in clearance rates. However, the arrest ratios for some offenses have not declined as much as the corresponding clearance rates and the arrest ratios have generally declined more steadily. The trends for forcible rape, aggravated assault and the Violent Crime Index seem to be exceptions to the parallel between the two tables. For these offenses, the clearance rates have declined much less than the arrest ratios; apparently a fairly constant proportion of these offenses have been cleared by a decreasing number of arrests from 1971 to 1981.

The numbers used in this text are taken from the four tables that follow. As noted in the footnotes to the tables, the 1981 Total Index and Property Index figures include arson data but, since the 1971 data do not include arson, the 1971 to 1981 percent change figures do not reflect those additional 1981 offenses.

¹
Definition: Murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, as defined in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program, is the willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another. The classification of this offense, as for all other Crime Index offenses, is based solely on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide, or accident; justifiable homicides, which are the killings of felons by law enforcement officers in the line of duty or by private citizens; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are scored as aggravated assaults.

1981 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 160 murders reported during 1981, an 18 percent increase over 1980.
- Murder accounted for 0.07 percent of the total Crime Index and 1.8 percent of all violent index offenses.
- Approximately 1 murder was reported every 2 days.
- The murder rate was 3.4 victims per 100,000 population compared to 2.9 per 100,000 in 1980.
- The murder rate was highest in cities over 250,000 and lowest in jurisdictions between 5,000 and 10,000.
- Reported murders have increased, though inconsistently since 1971.
- An estimated total of 161 persons were arrested for murder in 1981, 88.8 percent of whom were adults.
- The murder clearance rate increased from 82 percent in 1980 to 85 percent in 1981.

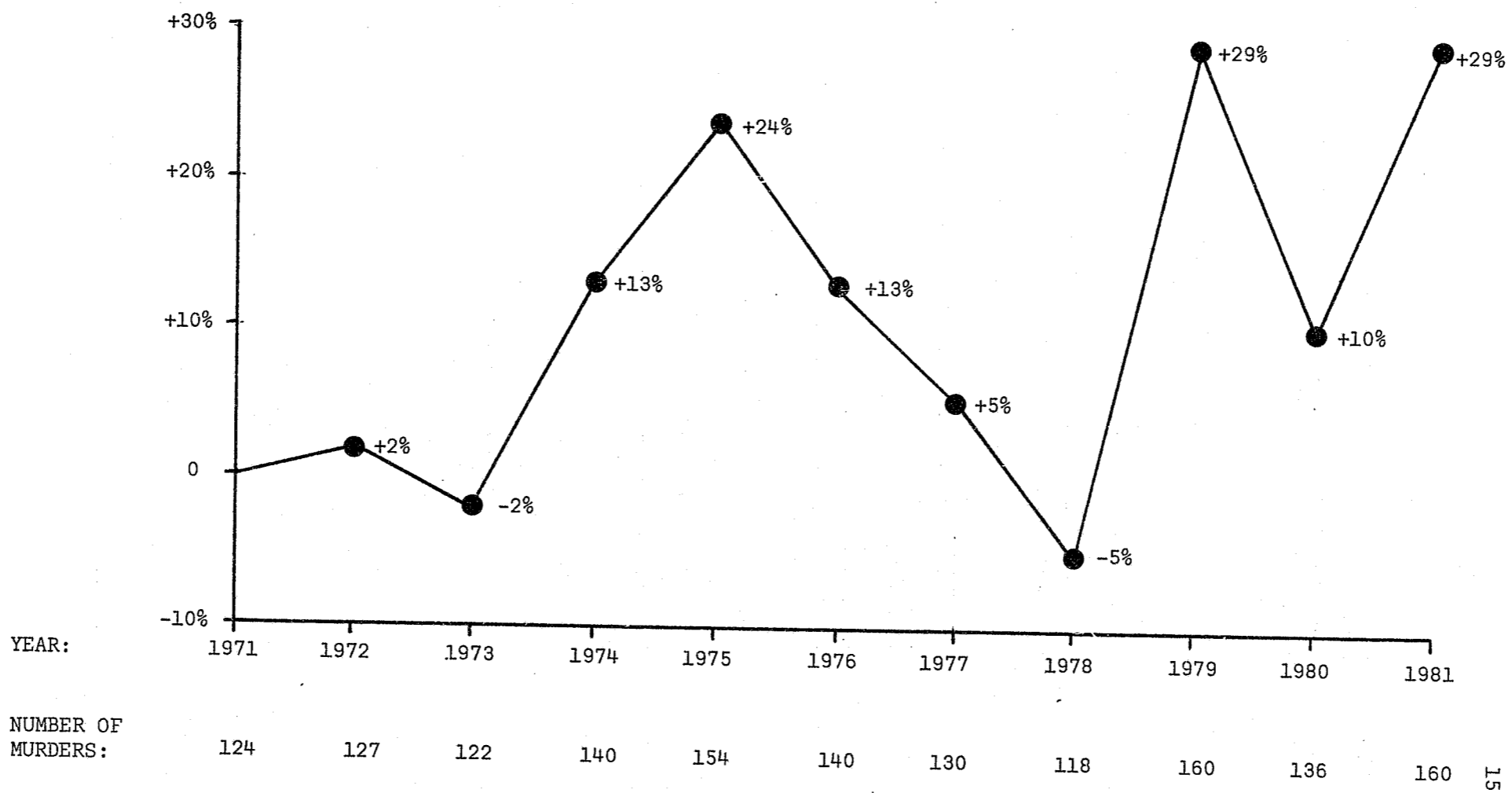

FORCIBLE RAPE

Definition: Forcible rape, as defined in the UCR program, is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included; however, statutory rape (without force) and other sex offenses are not included in this category.

1981 Summary Analysis

- . There were an estimated 738 rapes reported during 1981, an increase of 6 percent over the 1980 figure.
- . Reported rapes constituted 0.33 percent of all index offenses and 3 percent of violent index offenses.
- . Approximately 2 rapes per day were reported in 1981.
- . The rate of rape per 100,000 population was 15.7 in 1981. This represents a 6 percent increase from the 1980 rate.
- . The highest rape rates were in cities over 50,000 while the lowest rates were reported by rural sheriffs' departments.
- . Actual rape by force constituted over 78 percent of all reported rapes while attempted rape by force made up the remaining 22 percent.
- . The number of reported rapes has more than doubled since 1971.
- . There were an estimated 367 persons arrested for rape in 1981, approximately 84 percent of whom were adults.
- . The 1981 clearance rate for rape was 53 percent, a decrease from the 1980 figure of 59 percent.

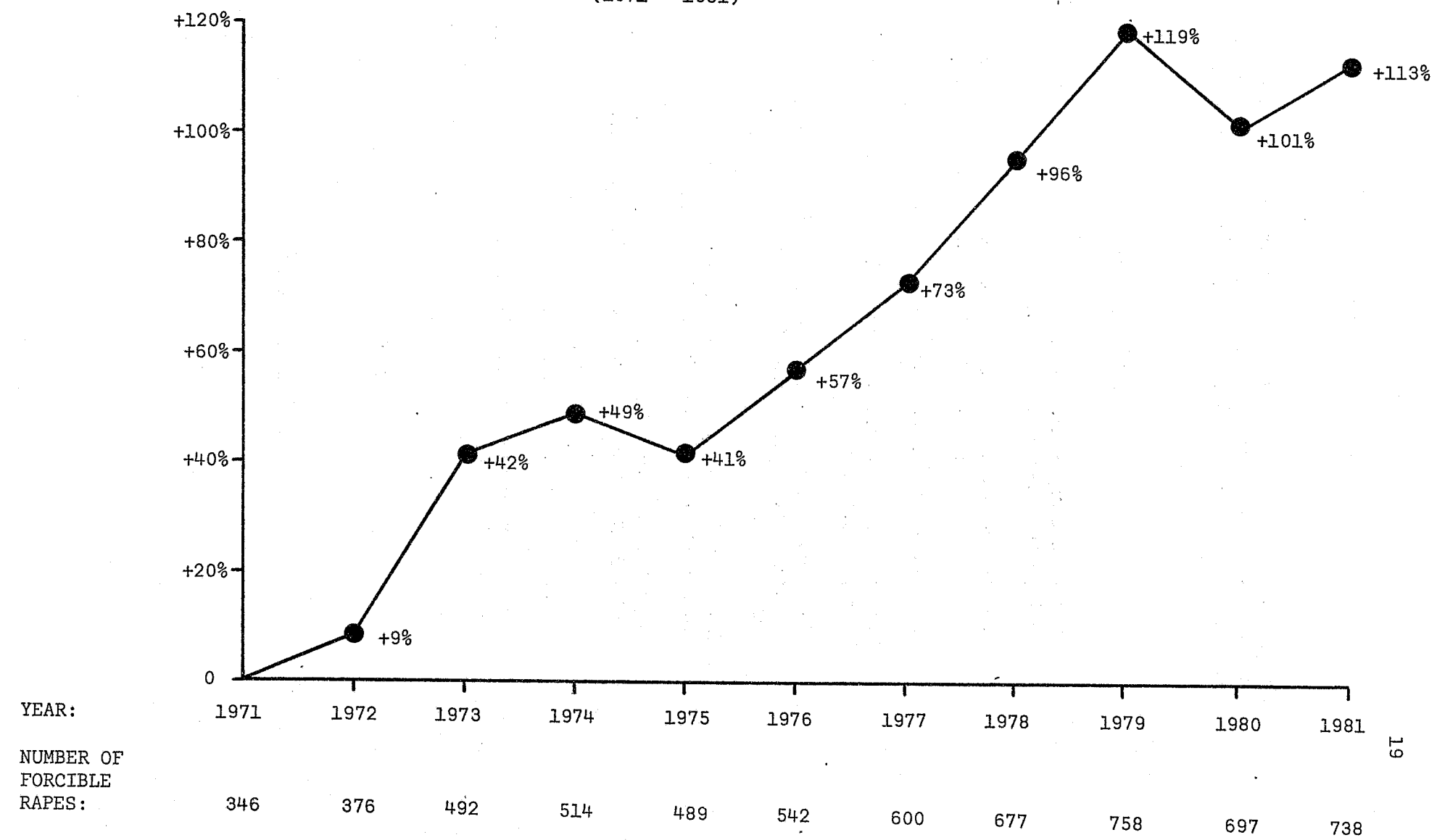

ROBBERY

Definition: Robbery is the taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

1981 Summary Analysis

- . There were an estimated 3,238 robberies reported in 1981, a 2 percent decrease from 1980.
- . Robbery accounted for 1.4 percent of the total Crime Index and 36.3 percent of all violent index offenses.
- . Approximately 9 robberies were reported each day.
- . The robbery rate was 68.8 per 100,000 population in 1981, compared to 70.3 per 100,000 in 1980.
- . The robbery rate per 100,000 increased in direct relationship to the size of the law enforcement jurisdiction.
- . Patterns in the type of weapon used in reported robberies were similar for 1980 and 1981.

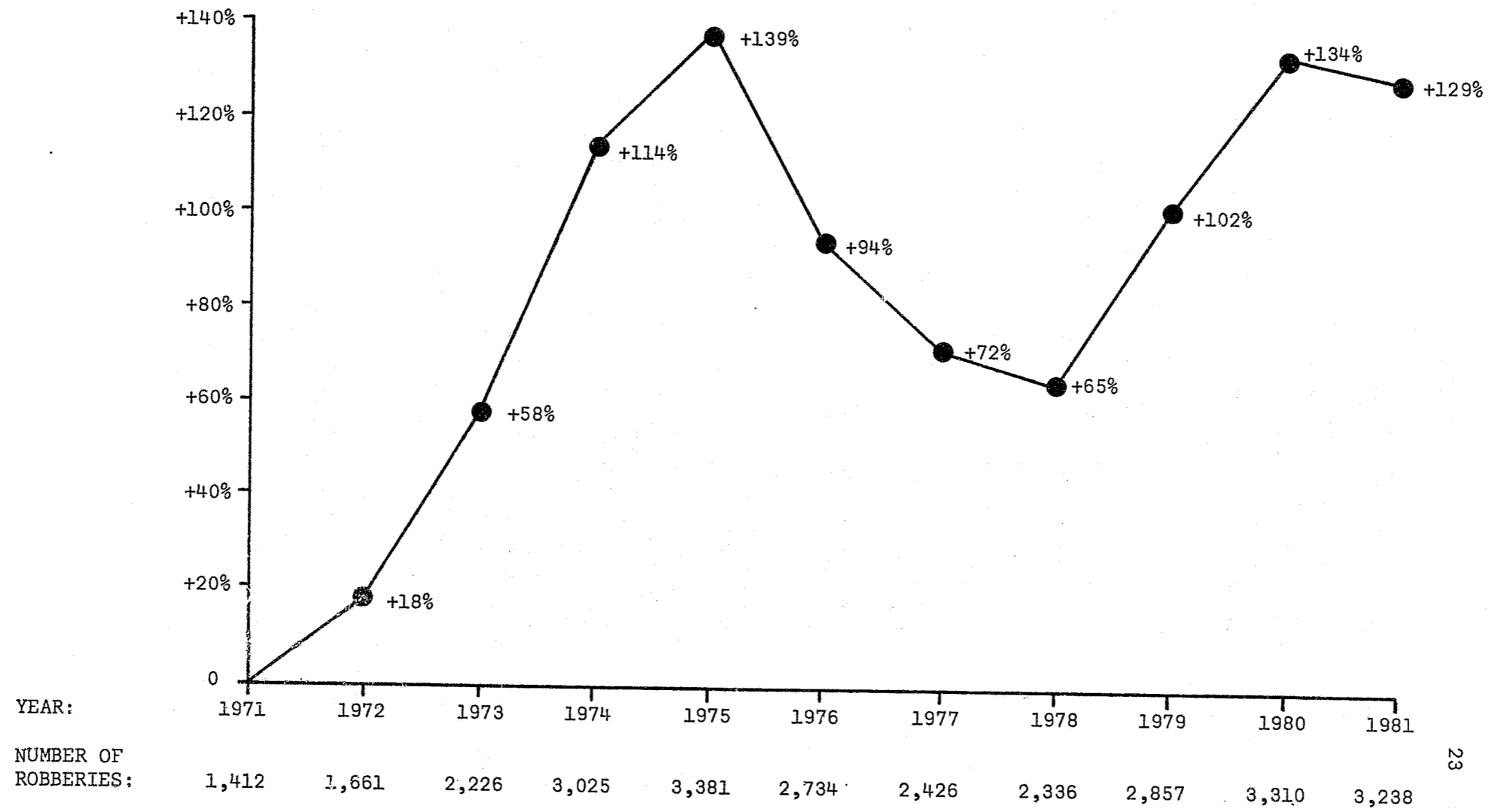

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Definition: Aggravated assault is an unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Attempts are included since it is not necessary that an injury result when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed.

1981 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 4,770 aggravated assaults reported in 1981, an 8 percent increase over 1980.
- Aggravated assault accounted for 2.1 percent of the total Crime Index and 53.6 percent of all violent index offenses.
- One aggravated assault was reported approximately every 2 hours.
- The aggravated assault rate was 101.4 per 100,000 population in 1981, compared to 93.6 per 100,000 in 1980.
- The aggravated assault rate per 100,000 was highest in jurisdictions over 250,000 and lowest in rural sheriffs' departments.
- Patterns in the type of weapon used in aggravated assaults were nearly identical in 1980 and 1981.
- Reported aggravated assaults have more than doubled since 1971 with greatest increases occurring after 1978.
- An estimated total of 2,459 persons were arrested for aggravated assault in 1981, 77.2 percent of whom were adults.
- The aggravated assault clearance rate declined from 67 percent in 1980 to 62 percent in 1981.

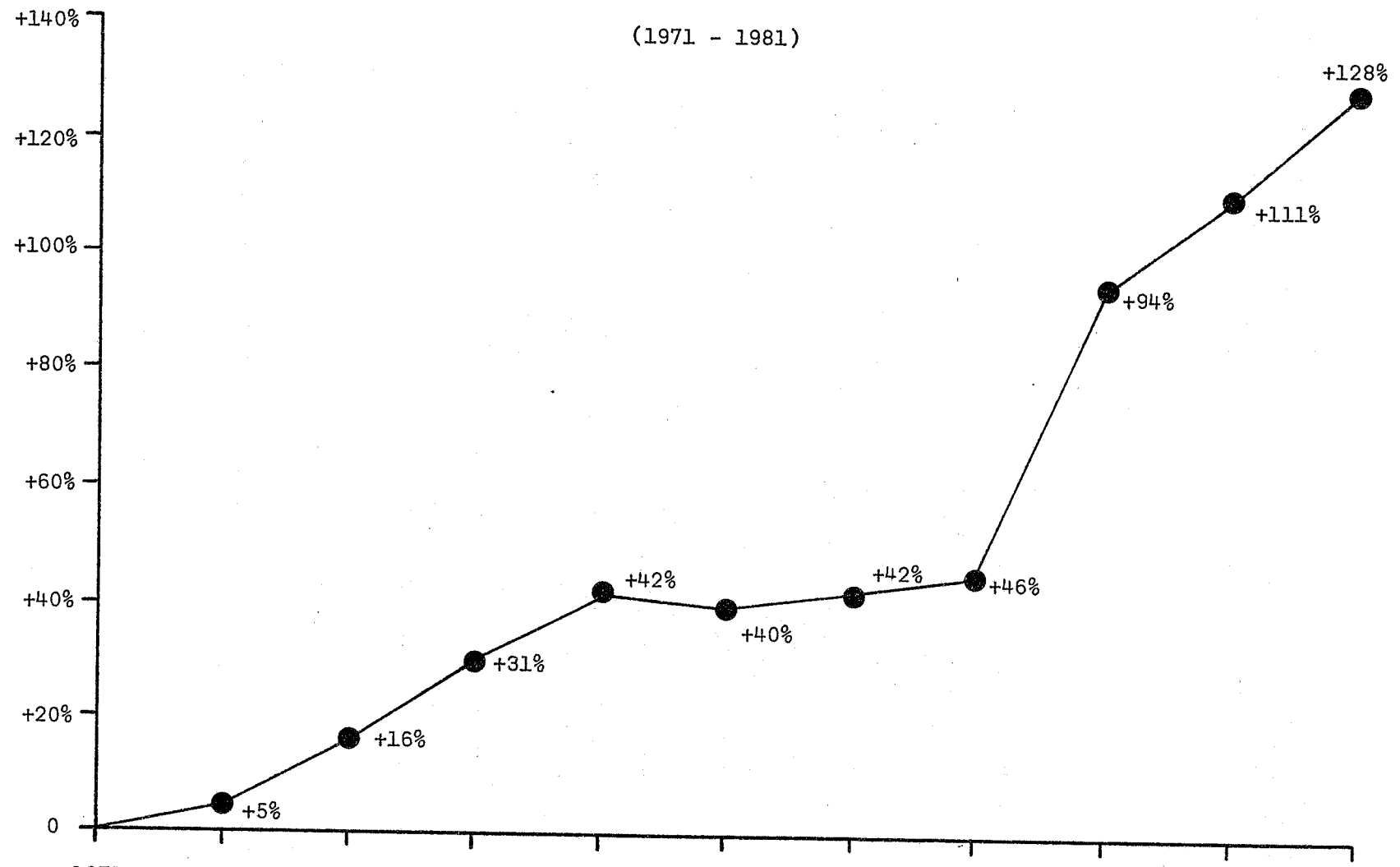

BURGLARY

Definition: The Uniform Crime Reporting Program defines burglary as the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. The use of force to gain entry is not required to classify an offense as burglary. Burglary in this program is categorized into three subclassifications: forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used, and attempted forcible entry.

1981 Summary Analysis

- . An estimated total of 50,710 burglaries were reported in 1981. This figure is nearly identical to that for 1980.
- . Burglaries accounted for 22.3 percent of the total Crime Index and 23.2 percent of all property Index offenses.
- . One burglary was reported approximately every 10 minutes.
- . The burglary rate was 1,077.6 per 100,000 population in 1981, compared to 1,073.7 per 100,000 in 1980.
- . The burglary rate per 100,000 was highest in cities over 50,000.
- . The proportions of types of burglary were very similar for 1980 and 1981.
- . Reported burglaries have increased 80 percent over 1971. The rate of increase has been stable during the decade.
- . An estimated total of 9,456 persons were arrested for burglary in 1981, 56.6% of whom were juveniles.

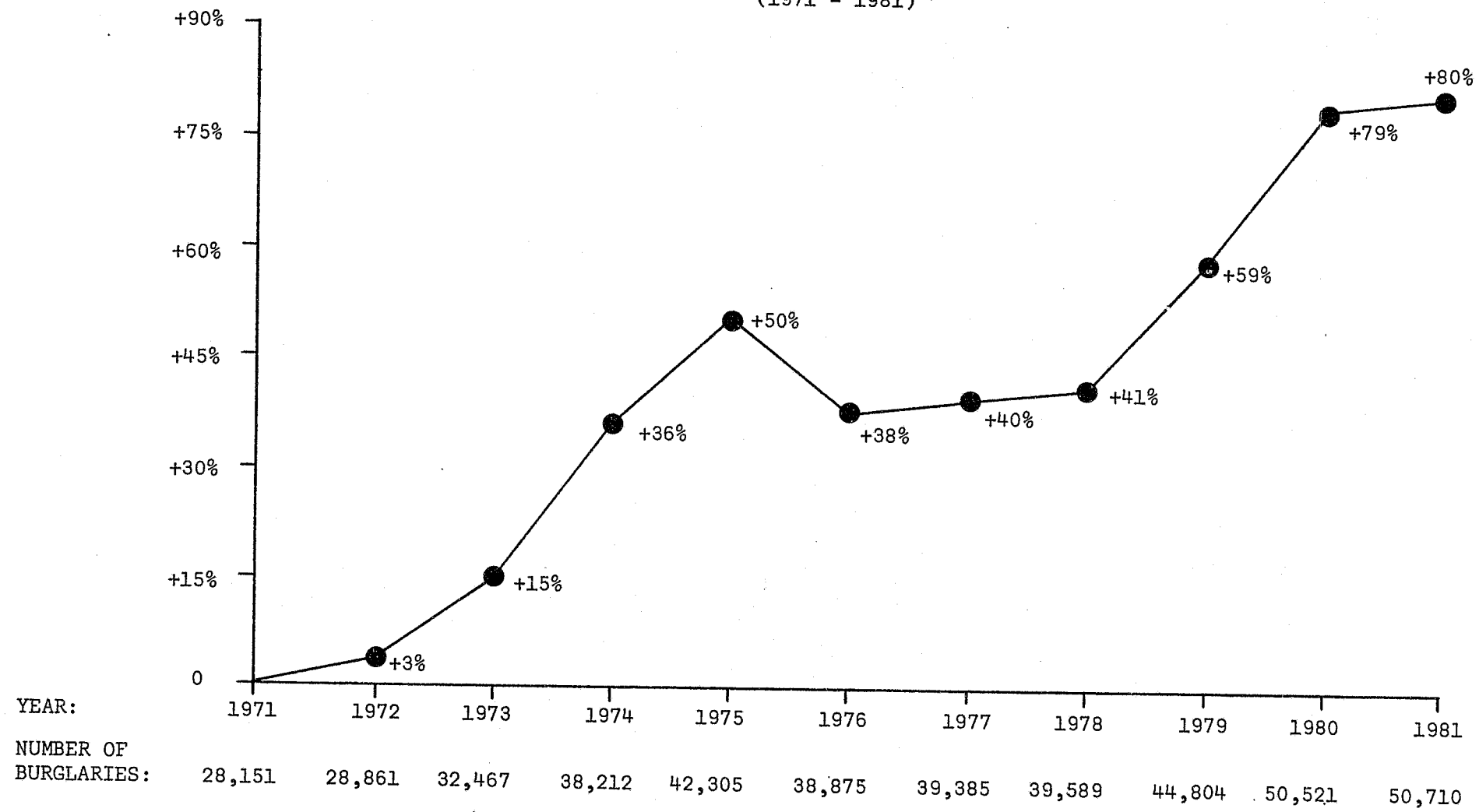

THEFT

Definition: Theft is the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. It includes crimes such as shoplifting, pocket-picking, purse-snatching, thefts from motor vehicles, thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories, bicycle thefts, etc., in which no use of force, violence or fraud occurs. In the Uniform Crime Reporting program, this crime category does not include embezzlement, "con" games, forgery and worthless checks. Motor vehicle theft is also excluded from this category for crime reporting purposes inasmuch as it is a separate Crime Index offense.

1981 Summary Analysis

- . An estimated total of 155,576 thefts were reported in 1981. This figure is 1 percent higher than in 1980.
- . Theft accounted for 68.5 percent of the total Crime Index and 71.3 percent of all property index offenses.
- . One theft was reported approximately every 3 minutes.
- . The theft rate was 3,306.1 per 100,000 in 1981, 1 percent higher than in 1980.
- . The theft rate was highest in cities between 25,000 and 250,000 and lowest in both rural and suburban sheriffs' departments.
- . Reported thefts have increased 70 percent since 1971.
- . An estimated total of 36,405 persons were arrested for theft in 1981, 51.4 percent of whom were adults.

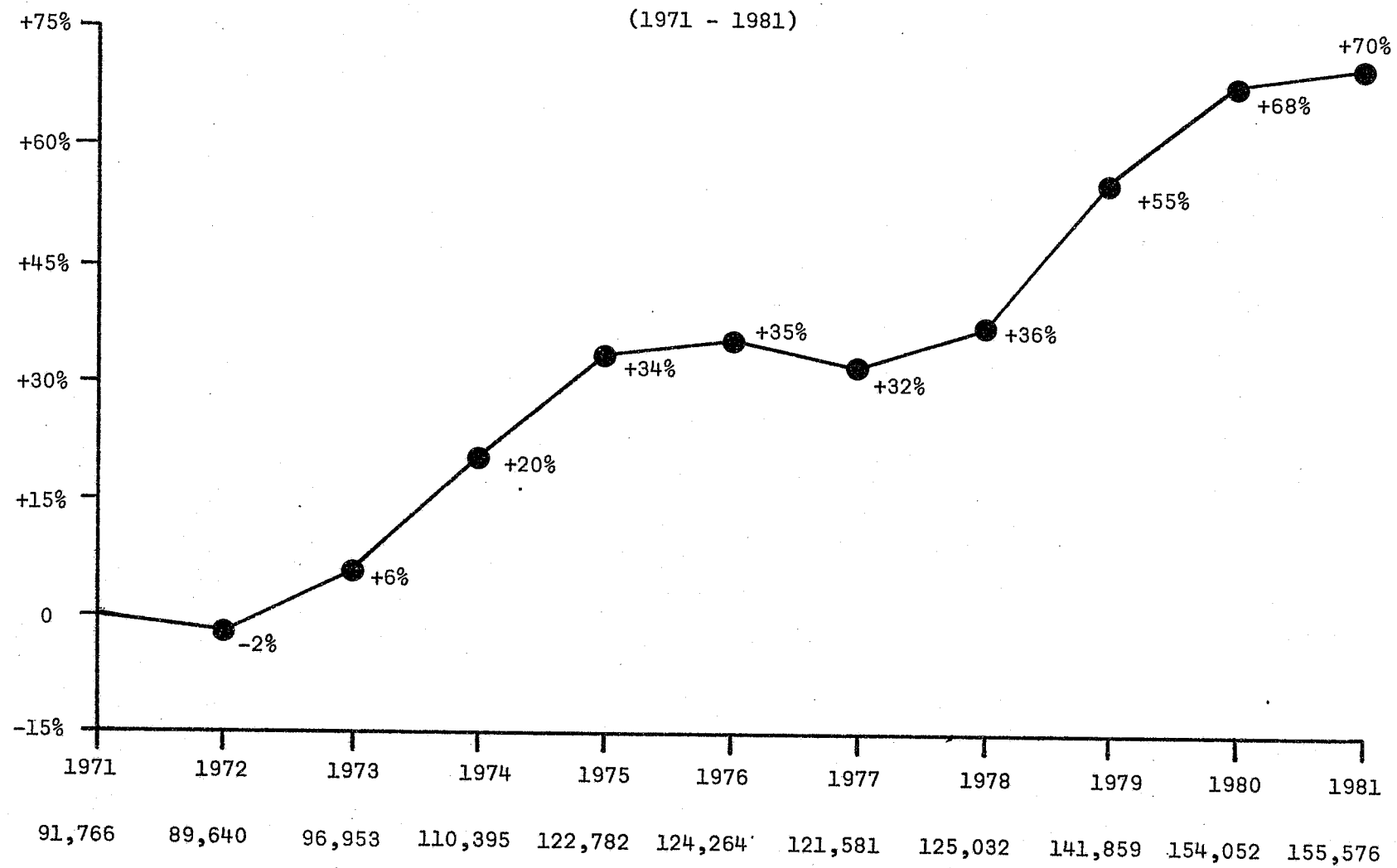

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Definition: In Uniform Crime Reporting, motor vehicle theft is defined as the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle. This definition excludes the taking of a motor vehicle for temporary use by those persons having lawful access.

1981 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 10,267 motor vehicle thefts reported in 1981, an 11 percent decrease over 1980.
- Motor vehicle theft accounted for 4.5 percent of the total Crime Index and 4.7 percent of all property index offenses.
- One motor vehicle theft was reported approximately every 50 minutes.
- The motor vehicle theft rate was 218.2 per 100,000 population in 1981, compared to 244.0 per 100,000 in 1980.
- The motor vehicle theft rate per 100,000 was highest in cities over 250,000 and lowest in rural sheriffs' departments.

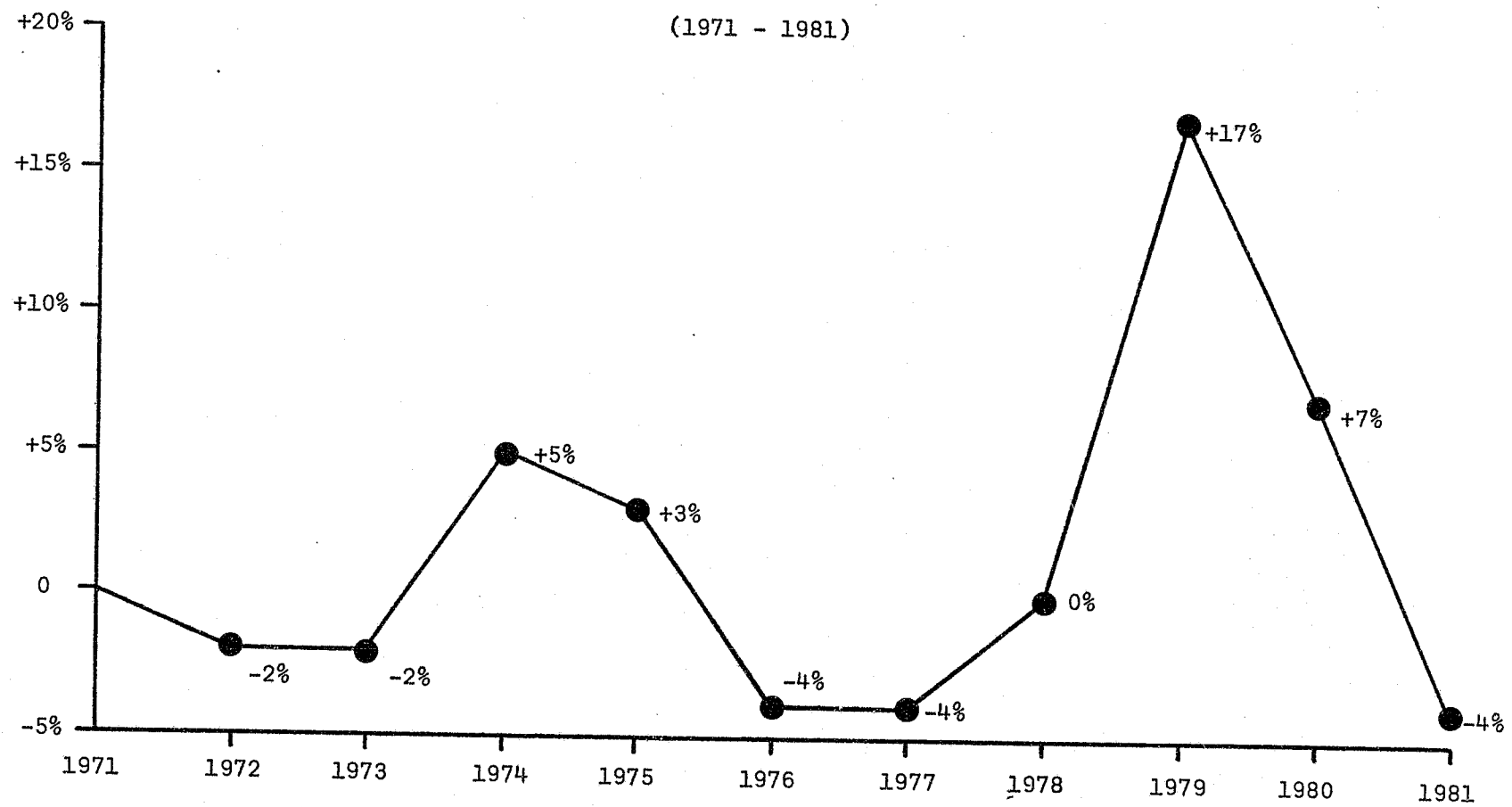

ARSON

Definition: Arson is defined by the Uniform Crime Reporting Program as any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc. Only fires determined through investigation to have been willfully or maliciously set are classified as arsons. Fires of suspicious or unknown origins are excluded.

1981 Summary Analysis

- There were an estimated 1,607 arsons reported in 1981, a 16 percent decrease over 1980.
- Arsons accounted for 0.7 percent of the total Crime Index and 0.7 percent of all property index offenses.
- One arson was reported approximately every 5 hours.
- The arson rate was 34.1 per 100,000 population in 1981, compared to 40.5 per 100,000 in 1980.
- The arson rate per 100,000 was highest in cities between 50,000 and 250,000. The rate was lowest in sheriffs' jurisdictions, both rural and suburban.
- Reported arsons have fluctuated substantially since 1978.
- An estimated total of 472 persons were arrested for arson in 1981, 59.3 percent of whom were juveniles.
- The arson clearance rate increased from 26 percent in 1980 to 31 percent in 1981.

Index Offenses by County and Municipality - 1981

Table 1 shows index offenses for 1980 and 1981 and percent changes from 1980 to 1981 for each jurisdiction. The four violent index offenses are totaled to provide the Violent Crime Index, and the four property index offenses are totaled to provide the Property Crime Index. The Crime Index is the sum of all eight offenses.

In Table 1 the number of months of data reported for each jurisdiction is listed. This information is vital to the interpretation of the table since the data presented are the reported data, even when fewer than 12 months of data were available. Twelve months of data were reported for 80% of the jurisdictions, eleven months or more were reported for 88% of the jurisdictions, and ten months or more were reported for 91% of the jurisdictions.

Data for a jurisdiction which reported less than 12 months of data cannot be directly compared with that jurisdiction's 1980 data or with data for other jurisdictions. Thus, no percent changes are shown for these jurisdictions. However, an approximate comparison can be made using an estimate of the 12 month total. This estimate can be calculated by multiplying the available data by a correction factor which is obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months reported. (For example, if 9 months of data are available for an agency, the data can be estimated for 12 months by multiplying the data by 12/9 or 1.33.) However, the accuracy of this approximation diminishes when only a few months of data are available. It should be applied with caution when less than 6 months of data are available. This method should also be applied with caution when the number of offenses involved is small. For example, if jurisdiction A had 72 thefts in 9 months and prorated them to 96 (12/9 X 72 = 96) thefts for the year, while jurisdiction B had 3 thefts in 9 months and prorated them to 4 thefts for the year, the estimate for jurisdiction A would be more reliable because it had a higher number of offenses.

The percent change in the number of index offenses from 1980 to 1981 is shown in Table 1 for each jurisdiction for which it was possible to calculate the change. The percent change is calculated using the formula:

$$\frac{(\text{offenses in 1981}) - (\text{offenses in 1980})}{\text{offenses in 1980}} \times 100\% = \text{percent change}$$

If the number of offenses for 1980 was zero, no percent change was calculated since percent change cannot be calculated from a zero base. In addition, as stated above, no percent change was calculated for a jurisdiction unless 12 months of data were available for 1981.

There were five new direct reporting agencies in the state UCR program in 1981. These agencies reported UCR data through their respective Sheriffs' Offices in 1980. The new direct reporters were Ashwaubenon (Brown County), Hallie (Chippewa County), State Fair Park (Milwaukee County), Durand (Pepin County), and Plover (Portage County). Percent changes for the Sheriffs' Offices in these counties would not be meaningful since the 1980 data for these Sheriffs' Offices include data from these agencies while the 1981 data do not. Thus, no percent changes are

shown for these Sheriffs' Offices. Estimated percent changes for each Sheriff's Office may be calculated if the 1981 data reported by the new reporter in each county are added to the Sheriff's Office totals for 1981. For example, this procedure yields the following estimated percent changes for the total number of index offenses: Brown County: -4.2%, Chippewa County: -26.2%, Milwaukee County: -13.7%, Pepin County: -0.8%, and Portage County: +12.2%.

Percent changes in the total number of index offenses, the number of violent offenses, and the number of property offenses were calculated for each county. For counties with any jurisdiction with less than 12 months of 1981 data, the percent changes are based on estimates of the 1981 county offense totals. The estimated county totals were obtained by summing the annual offense totals, either estimated or reported, of each jurisdiction in each county. Percent changes which are based on estimated 1981 county totals are presented in parentheses. Thus, percent changes shown in parentheses are based, in part, on estimated 1981 offense totals that are not shown in the table.

At the end of Table 1 there are statewide totals of the number of reported offenses in each category and estimates of the actual statewide totals. The estimated totals were obtained by calculating estimated annual totals, as described above, for each reporting agency with less than 12 months of data and totaling the estimates for these agencies and the reported figures for the other agencies.

Table 2 presents offense rates per 100,000 population for index offenses for each jurisdiction. The populations shown in this table are from the 1980 U.S. census.¹ The population shown for each county sheriff's office is the total population of the county minus the populations of any municipalities in the county for which UCR data were reported separately. The rates shown in Table 2 are derived by taking the number of reported offenses, shown in Table 1, dividing by the population of the jurisdiction, shown in Table 2, and multiplying by 100,000. These rates permit comparisons between and among jurisdictions of different sizes.

As discussed in connection with Table 1, twelve months of data were available for only 80% of the jurisdictions. Since offense rates based on less than 12 months of data would be misleading, Table 2 presents rates only for those jurisdictions which reported 12 months of data.

¹ 1980 U.S. census data (based on PHC80-3-51, Wis.) were used in this report, rather than 1981 estimated population figures, because the differences between the two sets of figures were small and because the 1980 census data provided an accurate adult/juvenile population breakdown (which is used in Tables 4 and 5). It should be clear though, that any difference in population will affect offense rates. For example, the statewide offense rate for the total Crime Index for 1981 is 4825.3 if the 1980 state population figure is used in its calculation and 4799.6 if the 1981 state population estimate is used. Thus, whether the rate has increased or decreased from its 1980 level of 4813.8 is determined by which population figure is used.

Table 3 presents the total clearance rate and the clearance rate for offenses involving only juveniles, by offense and jurisdiction. For a given offense, the total clearance rate is the number of offenses cleared, divided by the total number of offenses. That is, clearances are represented as a percentage of reported offenses. The juvenile clearance rate is the number of clearances involving only juveniles, divided by the total number of offenses. Note that this definition of a juvenile clearance rate is different from the definition used in previous UCR reports. In previous reports, a juvenile clearance rate was calculated by dividing the number of clearances involving only juveniles by the total number of clearances. The present definition is used to provide a more straightforward comparison between total and juvenile clearance rates. Note that no clearance rate can be calculated for an offense category if there are no 1981 offenses reported, even though there may be reported clearances of prior years' offenses.

Since the clearance rate is the ratio of clearances to reported offenses, it is not particularly sensitive to the problems of missing data described for Tables 1 and 2. It is reasonable to assume that this ratio would be fairly constant even though a few months of data were missing, as long as the number of months of data available was reasonably large. Thus, clearance rates have been presented in Table 3 for all jurisdictions for which six months or more of clearance data were present. Ten jurisdictions reported fewer than six months of clearance data and were excluded from the table. In many jurisdictions however, there were fewer months of clearance data available than offense data. When this was the case, the number of months of clearance data was adjusted to make the proportion of missing data equal for clearances and reported offenses. (For example, if a jurisdiction had 9 months of offense data available, but only 6 months of clearance data, the number of clearances for each offense was multiplied by 9/6 or 1.5 prior to calculation of the clearance rate.)

Arrests by County and Municipality - 1981

Tables 4 and 5 present data on adults and juveniles arrested by Wisconsin law enforcement agencies during 1981. The tables present the total number of arrests, the total number of Part I arrests, the total number of Part II arrests, and the number of arrests for each Part I offense for each reporting agency for adults and juveniles respectively. Table 5 also presents the total number of juvenile arrests for status offenses. Status offenses are those which are only offenses because the offender is a juvenile. The UCR offenses considered to be status offenses are liquor law, curfew, and runaway violations. Since status offenses are Part II offenses, they are also included in the total number of Part II arrests. The number of Part II arrests for offenses other than status offenses can be found by subtracting the number of status offense arrests from the number of Part II arrests.

As indicated in the introduction to this report, data are not available for all 12 months of 1981 for every reporting agency. In Tables 4 and 5 the number of months of arrest data available for each reporting agency is listed. Although it was determined that only the known data should be presented for each jurisdiction, an estimated yearly total can be calculated for any jurisdiction with less than 12 months of data reported. The estimated totals can be calculated by multiplying the numbers in the table by a correction factor which can be obtained by dividing 12 by the number of months of data reported. (Thus, if 11 months of data are presented for an agency, for example, the agency's figures should be multiplied by 12/11, or 1.09.) Naturally, the more months of data reported, the more accurate will be the yearly estimates. Estimates based on a small number of months of reported data should be interpreted cautiously.

At the end of each table there are statewide totals of the reported arrests in each category and estimates of the actual statewide totals. The estimated totals were obtained by calculating estimated yearly totals, as described above, for each reporting agency with less than 12 months of data and summing the estimates for these agencies and the reported figures for the other agencies.

These tables also contain population figures for each jurisdiction. Table 4 contains adult population figures. Table 5 contains juvenile population figures. The population figures presented for county sheriffs' offices are the county populations minus the populations of any municipalities in the county for which UCR data are reported separately. These figures, based on the 1980 U.S. census, can be used to calculate arrest rates for any of the jurisdictions or the State. Arrest rates are calculated by dividing the number of arrests by the relevant population and multiplying the quotient by 100,000. This rate per 100,000 is comparable across jurisdictions of varying size.

Statewide Arrest Summary Listings

The following two tables present the statewide data that are available on adult and juvenile arrests in Wisconsin during 1981. The tables are summary listings of the UCR adult and juvenile arrest forms that are submitted by law enforcement agencies each month. As such, they show the total number of adult and juvenile arrests for each offense, by sex, age, and race. Unlike most other statewide data presented in this report, these tables present totals of only the reported 1981 data. These data are the actual state totals because it was not possible to estimate these numbers in the same way estimates were calculated for the arrest categories in Tables 4 and 5. There were an average of 11 months of 1981 arrest data available for each jurisdiction. Rough estimates of the actual state totals could be obtained by multiplying the numbers in these tables by 1.09, which would compensate for one missing month. More accurate correction factors for specific offense categories, however, can be derived from the reported and estimated totals at the end of Tables 4 and 5. Correction factors for the data on persons arrested for the offenses included in Tables 4 and 5 can be obtained by dividing the estimated total for each offense or category by the reported total for each offense. This procedure yields the following correction factors:

Since these correction factors were derived from the estimated totals in Tables 4 and 5, which, in turn, were derived from the estimated totals of individual jurisdictions, these correction factors take into account the differences in data availability among the different jurisdictions. Estimated adult and juvenile arrest totals can be obtained from the following tables by multiplying the reported data for a given offense category by the correction factor for that category. Data on individual Part II or status offenses must be multiplied by the factors for the broader categories since correction factors for specific offenses within those categories could not be derived.

GLOSSARY

ADULT: A person 18 years of age or older.

ARREST: Taking into physical or other legal custody for committing an offense in the local reporting jurisdiction. Arrests for all criminal offenses are scored. Arrests for ordinance violations are included. Arrests for traffic offenses, with the exception of driving under the influence, are not scored. Included are those persons released without having been formally charged (See Juvenile Arrest).

ARREST RATE: The number of arrests for a particular offense, or group of offenses, per 100,000 population. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Arrests}}{\text{Population}} \times 100,000$$

CLEARANCE (BY ARREST): An offense is cleared, or solved for crime reporting purposes, when at least one person is arrested, charged with commission of the offense and turned over to the court for prosecution.

CLEARANCE RATE: The number of clearances divided by the total number of offenses, expressed as a percent. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of clearances}}{\text{Number of Offenses}} \times 100\%$$

Offenses are reported as they become known to law enforcement agencies. Clearances are scored as they are made. Therefore, it is possible for the clearance rate to exceed 100 percent for a time period. Both clearances by arrest and exceptional clearances are included.

CRIME INDEX: The total of eight serious offenses used as indicators of crime. Crime Index offenses are murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Definitions of each of these offenses are given in the section "Statewide Index Offenses and Arrests".

JUVENILE: A person under 18 years of age.

JUVENILE ARREST: Juveniles are scored as having been "arrested" for purposes of Uniform Crime Reporting procedures, although under Wisconsin Statutes law enforcement custody of a child is not legally considered an arrest. Arrests, in the case of juveniles, include those who have committed a crime and are taken into custody under circumstances such that were the juvenile an adult, an arrest would be scored. All violations by juveniles where some police or other official action is taken beyond a mere admonishment, including status offenses, are included. Law enforcement contacts with juveniles where no offense has been committed are not scored as arrests. Juveniles taken into custody for their own protection, such as in neglect cases, are not scored as being arrested if they have not committed a crime. (See Arrest)

JUVENILE INVOLVEMENT IN CLEARANCES: The number of clearances involving only juveniles divided by the total number of offenses. The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Number of Clearances Involving Only Juveniles}}{\text{Number of Offenses}} \times 100\%$$

PERCENT CHANGE: The formula is:

$$\frac{\text{Value in Current Period} - \text{Value in Base Period}}{\text{Value in Base Period}} \times 100\%$$

POPULATION: Totals as well as juvenile and adult sub-totals are based on the 1980 United States census.
