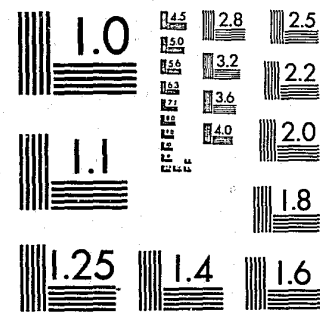

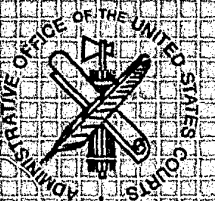

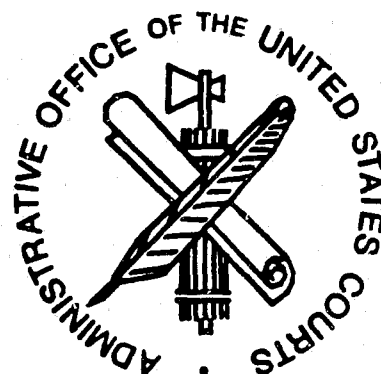

U.S. COURTS OF APPEALS

FEDERAL CIRCUIT

Summary of Workload

The Federal Courts Improvement Act of 1982 (Public Law 97-164) established a new appellate court called the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. This court, headquartered in Washington, DC, officially began its operations on October 1, 1982. The Federal Circuit was created by joining the appellate division of the U.S. Court of Claims with the U.S. Court of Customs and Patent Appeals. The court has retained the jurisdiction of both predecessor courts. Additionally, it has jurisdiction over final decisions of the U.S. district courts in patent infringement actions and final orders and decisions of the Merit Systems Protection Board and the various agency boards of contract appeals. A summary of the new court's workload during the six month period ended March 31, 1983 appears in Table 1 below.

The Act also created the U.S. Claims Court, a new Article I trial forum with basically the same trial jurisdiction as the former U.S. Court of Claims. Statistics for the U.S. Claims Court are published once a year in the **Annual Report of the Director**.

During the six month period ended March 31, 1983, a total of 392 new appeals were entered on the Federal Circuit's docket. The activity of the new court increased substantially during the second quarter of its existence, with 252 appeals filed during the period January through March 1983 compared to 140 appeals in the period October through December 1982. This increase can be attributed to the large influx of appeals from decisions of the Merit Systems Protection Board (up from 22 appeals in the first quarter to 108 appeals in the second). Appeals from the Merit Systems Protection Board (33.2 percent), U.S. district courts (23.7 percent), and the Patent and Trademark Office (21.9 percent) account for over three-fourths of the caseload of the Federal Circuit.

Total appellate terminations totaled 240 cases during the past six months. Of these dispositions, the greatest number (144) consists of appeals arising from the U.S. Claims Court. One-fourth of all the terminations recorded were withdrawn prior to decision. Of the 180 appeals decided by the court, 81.1 percent were affirmed, 12.2 percent were reversed, and 6.7 percent were modified.

With the large number of filings recorded during the latter part of the reporting period, the pending caseload in the Federal Circuit continued to grow. As of March 31, 1983, a total of 415 appeals were pending on the circuit's general docket, up 42.6 percent from the 291 appeals pending three months ago.

## TWELVE CIRCUIT COURTS OF APPEALS

### Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, the workload in the U.S. courts of appeals reached the highest level ever recorded. A total of 29,022 new appeals were entered on the dockets of the 12 circuit courts, a rise of 5.4 percent over the 27,540 appeals docketed in 1982. Total case dispositions grew 5.6 percent during the year to 28,599 appeals. Since the number of new filings exceeded the number of terminations by 423 appeals, the overall pending caseload increased by 1.9 percent during the year. As of March 31, 1983, a total of 22,545 cases were pending on the dockets of the appellate courts, up slightly from the 22,122 cases pending one year ago. Table 2 provides a comparison, by circuit, of the appellate workload during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1982 and 1983. Appendix Tables B-1 and B-3 provide more detailed data on the appellate workload in 1983.

### Filings Rise 5.4 Percent

Eight of the 12 circuit courts experienced increases in their docketing activity during the year. The largest rise occurred in the Eleventh Circuit, where new filings grew 21.7 percent to 2,978 appeals. Most of this growth can be attributed to a 31.0 percent increase in new prisoner petitions and other civil type appeals being docketed in this court. For the other circuit courts with increases, the growth rate ranged from a low of 5.6 percent in both the Second and Eighth Circuits to a high of 10.7 percent in the Third Circuit. Four circuit courts (First, Fourth, Seventh, and Ninth) registered declines in case filings during the past twelve months. Of these courts, the largest drop was experienced in the First Circuit. All categories of appeals except for non-prisoner U.S. civil type appeals decreased in this circuit during 1983, causing the overall number of case filings to decline 9.0 percent.

Among the various types of appeals filed nationwide, the largest growth was shown in bankruptcy appeals for the second consecutive year, up 17.0 percent from 505 cases in 1982 to 591 cases in 1983. Civil type appeals as a whole rose 6.9 percent in 1983, with the greatest increase occurring in state prisoner and other private civil appeals (up 7.5 percent). Criminal filings also grew during the past year, up 5.4 percent to 4,843 appeals.

Administrative agency appeals continued its downward trend, dropping 3.0 percent from 3,271 appeals in 1982 to 3,173 appeals in 1983. Original proceedings followed close behind with a 2.5 percent decrease in total cases docketed during the year.

#### Quarterly Comparison

Table 3 is a comparison of appeals commenced, by quarter, during each of the twelve month periods ended June 30, 1977 through 1982 and the first three quarters of statistical year 1983. A total of 7,625 appeals were filed in the 12 circuit courts during the period January through March 1983, up 12.8 percent from the 6,761 appeals filed during the same period last year. This 1983 total represents the highest number of appeals ever reported during a quarterly period.

#### Dispositions Up 5.6 Percent

During the past twelve months, 7 of the 12 circuit courts were able to increase their overall termination activity. The greatest increase and turnaround in activity occurred in the Third Circuit, where total case dispositions rose 53.2 percent. In 1982, this circuit was the only appellate court to record a decline in yearly terminations. Within twelve months, the Third Circuit increased their overall dispositions by 945 appeals, from 1,775 cases in 1982 to 2,720 cases in 1983. Much of the growth in termination activity in this circuit can be attributed to the new procedure implemented by the Chief Judge for processing stagnant appeals on their general docket. Other courts with significant increases in termination activity were the Eleventh Circuit (up 17.4 percent); the Tenth Circuit (up 15.9 percent); and the Sixth Circuit (up 15.7 percent).

In 1983, five circuit courts experienced declines in appellate terminations. The greatest drop was reflected in the District of Columbia Circuit, down 7.2 percent to 1,575 appeals. The decrease in this circuit is largely the result of declines in terminations of both private civil (exclusive of prisoner petitions) appeals and administrative agency type appeals. Among the remaining four circuit courts with decreases, the rate of decline varied from a low of 0.8 percent in the Fourth Circuit to a high of 6.1 percent in the Eighth Circuit.

#### Pending Caseload Up 1.9 Percent

Although the overall pending caseload increased during the year, 5 of the 12 circuit courts were able to reduce the number of appeals pending on their dockets. The largest drop was reflected in the Third Circuit, down 15.8 percent to 1,470 appeals. This circuit's decline was caused by the substantial increase in case terminations during the twelve months ended March 31, 1983. Reduced caseloads were also shown in the First Circuit (down 5.9 percent); the Ninth Circuit (down 3.5 percent); the Sixth Circuit (down 1.5 percent); and the District of Columbia Circuit (down 1.4 percent).

The largest increases in pending caseload during the past twelve months were reflected in the Eighth and Eleventh Circuits, up 21.4 percent and 19.2 percent, respectively. The remaining four circuit courts with increases had gains of 6.0 percent and below.

The Fourth Circuit recorded no change in its overall pending caseload in 1983. However, the number of cases pending within the various case types changed with reductions occurring in U.S. and state prisoner appeals, administrative agency appeals, and original proceedings.

#### Cases Disposed of After Hearing or Submission

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, the 12 circuit courts of appeals terminated 13,027 appeals after oral hearing or submission on briefs. This total represents a 5.0 percent increase over the 12,407 appeals reported in 1982. As a percent of the total case dispositions, 45.6 percent were terminated in this manner, a slight decrease from the 45.8 percent recorded last year.

### CASES UNDER SUBMISSION

The overall number of cases under submission for more than 90 days on March 31, 1983 was 10.8 percent above the 747 cases reported in March 1982. The U.S. courts of appeals, the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, and the Temporary Emergency Court of Appeals reported 828 cases held under submission for the quarter ended March 31, 1983 as provided in Table 4. A total of 512 cases (61.8 percent) were held more than three but less than six months; 159 cases (19.2 percent) were held more than six but less than nine months; 88 cases (10.6 percent) were held more than nine months but less than one year; and 69 cases (8.3 percent) were held more than one year. The Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals reported 225 cases, 27.2 percent of the total cases under submission. Cases awaiting the submission of additional memoranda or awaiting an opinion in another case are not included in the totals.

The Fifth Judicial Circuit was reorganized into two circuits, the Fifth and the Eleventh, on October 1, 1981. Cases taken under submission prior to that time are listed under the Former Fifth Circuit in Table 4. In some cases, the panels include judges who are now in either the reorganized Fifth Circuit or the new Eleventh Circuit. Several cases under submission were heard en banc in the Former Fifth Circuit.

### U.S. DISTRICT COURTS

#### CIVIL WORKLOAD

##### Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, the number of civil cases filed in the 94 U.S. district courts reached 233,065. This total reflects the continuous rise in the civil workload since 1960 and it represents a 17.8 percent increase over the 197,909 cases filed during the same period in 1982. The number of civil cases terminated in the U.S. district courts also rose, climbing 13.0 percent from 185,133 cases in 1982 to 209,207 in 1983. The civil pending caseload has continued to rise, reaching a high of 223,915 cases as of March 31, 1983. These pending cases represent an increase of 11.9 percent over the 200,057 cases pending during the same period last year. Despite the considerable increase in civil terminations over the past year, the current civil pending caseload is the highest ever recorded in the U.S. district courts. Table 5 is a comparison, by district, of the number of civil cases filed, terminated, and pending during each of the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1982 and 1983. Appendix Table C-1 provides more detailed data on civil cases filed, terminated, and pending, by district.

##### Civil Filings - Twelve Month Period

The total number of civil cases filed during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983 reflects the steady growth in filings over the past 20 years. The 233,065 cases filed in 1983 are more than three times the number of cases filed in 1963. The 17.8 percent rise in civil filings is highlighted by increases in 84 districts. The most outstanding increases were in Hawaii (up 69.7 percent); Ohio, Southern (up 68.3 percent); and California, Northern (up 53.4 percent). The rise in filings in Hawaii is largely the result of increases in the number of recovery of defaulted student loans and overpayments of veterans' benefits cases. The increases in Ohio, Southern and California, Northern are the result of an influx of recovery of overpayments of veterans' benefits cases. Although there is a national trend in filing growth, ten districts experienced declines in case filings. The most significant declines occurred in Guam (down 38.3 percent); Virginia, Eastern (down 9.4 percent); and Arkansas, Western (down 5.3 percent). These declines were mostly the result of reductions in the number of land condemnation cases in Guam and recovery of overpayments and enforcement of judgment cases in Virginia, Eastern and Arkansas, Western. More detailed data on civil filings, by district and type case, are provided in Appendix Table C-3.

##### Civil Filings by Jurisdiction and Nature of Suit

Approximately 38 percent of all civil cases filed during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983 involved the Federal government as either a plaintiff or a defendant. Of the 89,512 cases filed under U.S. jurisdiction, 57,458 cases were initiated by the U.S. while 32,054 cases were litigated against the U.S. The 89,512 cases involving the U.S. represents a 26.8 percent increase over the 70,585 cases filed last year. There were 143,553 private cases filed in 1983. Federal question cases rose 10.3 percent, from 78,009 cases in 1982 to 86,065 cases in 1983. Diversity of citizenship cases also rose, from 48,630 cases in 1982 to 56,818 cases in 1983, an increase of 16.8 percent. Civil cases filed under local jurisdiction declined slightly, decreasing 2.6 percent from 688 cases to 670 cases.

The 17.8 percent overall increase in civil cases filed during the year ended March 31, 1983 can be attributed to significant increases in several nature of suit categories. The largest increases in case types occurred in recovery of overpayments and enforcement of judgment cases and social security cases. The number of recovery of overpayments and enforcement of judgment cases climbed 45.1 percent, from 26,705 cases in 1982 to 38,752 cases in 1983. The volume of these cases has increased dramatically due to efforts by the U.S. to recover overpayments of veterans' benefits (up from 10,237 cases to 32,414 cases) and defaulted student loans (up from 1,738 cases to 4,918 cases). The number of social security cases filed rose 50.4 percent during 1983, from 11,329 cases to 17,034 cases. Substantial increases in social security litigation occurred in claims for disability insurance benefits and supplemental security income. Substantial increases in the number of civil filings were also experienced in several other categories: bankruptcy suits (up 43.9 percent); securities, commodities, and exchange cases (up 37.6 percent); and copyright cases (up 29.1 percent).

Although the number of civil filings has escalated over the past year, there have been significant declines in several case categories. The most notable declines in filing activity were in Occupational Safety and Health Act cases (down 61.1 percent); air traffic regulation cases (down 25.9 percent); Agricultural Act cases (down 16.0 percent); and Fair Labor Standards Act cases (down 13.1 percent).

Additional data on civil cases filed, by jurisdiction and type case, are provided in Appendix Table C-2.

#### Civil Filings by Quarter

Table 6 provides a summary of civil cases commenced in the U.S. district courts during each of the three month periods from July 1, 1976 through March 31, 1983. The 60,993 civil cases filed during the three month period January through March 1983 represents an increase of 18.4 percent over the 51,509 cases filed during the same period a year ago and is the largest number ever filed during a comparable three month period.

#### Civil Terminations

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, the number of civil cases terminated rose to 209,207. This is an increase of 13.0 percent over the 185,133 cases terminated during the same period last year. The overall increase in termination activity is the result of increases in 84 districts. Among those districts experiencing the most substantial increases were Wisconsin, Western; Arizona; and Florida, Northern, where terminations rose 88.1 percent, 58.7 percent, and 57.2 percent, respectively. The rise in disposition activity in Wisconsin, Western is the result of increases in the disposition of cases for recovery of overpayments of veterans' benefits and prisoner civil rights cases; the increase in disposition activity in Arizona is also attributed to recovery of overpayments of veterans' benefits cases; and the increase in disposition activity in Florida, Northern is primarily in prisoner civil rights cases. The largest reductions in civil cases terminated occurred in West Virginia, Southern (down 36.5 percent); Florida, Southern (down 36.5 percent); and Massachusetts (down 20.2 percent). The primary reasons for the declines in these districts are the reductions in social security cases terminated in West Virginia, Southern; land condemnation cases in Florida, Southern; and interstate commerce cases in Massachusetts.

#### Civil Pending Caseload

As of March 31, 1983, there were 223,915 civil cases pending in the U.S. district courts. This is the largest number of civil cases pending during any comparable period, and is 11.9 percent above the 200,057 cases pending last year. Although there has been constant growth in the total number of civil cases pending, 12 districts were able to reduce their pending caseload. Those districts with the most significant reductions include Wisconsin, Western (down 40.8 percent); South Dakota (down 18.6 percent); and Rhode Island (down 14.1 percent). The large decline in Wisconsin, Western is the result of the increased termination activity in recovery and prisoner civil rights cases. Eighty-two districts experienced increases in their civil pending caseloads. The largest increases in the pending caseload were in Oklahoma, Eastern; Ohio, Southern; and Hawaii, with increases of 52.6 percent, 48.9 percent, and 46.5 percent, respectively.

The civil pending caseload rose significantly in several case type categories. The most notable increases were in recovery of defaulted student loans cases (up 97.9 percent); recovery of overpayments of veterans' benefits cases (up 82.9 percent); Internal Revenue Service third party suits (up 59.6 percent); and social security disability insurance cases (up 52.8 percent). The largest declines were in land condemnation cases (down 17.5 percent) and Fair Labor Standards Act cases (down 13.1 percent). Additional data on civil cases pending, by nature of suit and district, is provided in Appendix Table C-3A.

#### Civil Cases Pending Three Years or More

The total number of civil cases pending three years or more rose significantly from June 30, 1982 to March 31, 1983. Although there have been increasing efforts by the courts to dispose of three-year-old cases, the number of pending cases has risen from 16,003 in 1982 to 17,359 in 1983, an increase of 8.5 percent. Much of the increase was caused by a rise in the number of pending personal injury product liability cases. Land condemnation has historically been the largest category of cases pending three years or more. This category experienced a 7.8 percent decrease in 1983, from 2,024 cases to 1,866 cases. Additional data on civil cases pending, by age and district, as of March 31, 1983 is provided in Appendix Tables C-6A and C-6B.

The number of civil cases pending three years or more, excluding land condemnation cases, rose from 13,979 cases as of June 30, 1982 to 15,493 cases as of March 31, 1983. Despite the overall increase, 26 districts experienced declines in their three-year-old pending caseloads. Among those districts experiencing significant declines were South Carolina (down



48.1 percent); Wisconsin, Western (down 42.0 percent); and Oklahoma, Western (down 29.0 percent). Notably, Kentucky, Eastern was able to reduce its three-year-old pending caseload from 1,200 cases as of June 30, 1982 (the highest number pending in any district during that period) to 867 cases as of March 31, 1983. The highest increases in cases pending three years or more occurred in Mississippi, Southern (from 117 cases to 361 cases); Georgia, Middle (from 21 cases to 52 cases); and New Mexico (from 22 cases to 48 cases). Table 7 provides a comparison of civil cases pending three years or more (excluding land condemnation cases), by district, as of June 30, 1982 and March 31, 1983.

## CRIMINAL WORKLOAD

### Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, the number of criminal cases filed in the U.S. district courts increased by 8.9 percent. There were 34,778 cases filed this year compared to 31,942 cases filed last year. Case terminations increased by 7.7 percent, from 30,305 cases terminated in 1982 to 32,632 cases terminated in 1983. Table 8 shows the criminal case activity during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1979 through 1983.

This year, case filings exceeded case terminations by 2,146 cases, which resulted in an increase of 12.7 percent in the caseload pending March 31, 1983. Appendix Table D-1 provides, by district, the number of cases and defendants filed, terminated, and pending during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983.

During the nine month period from July 1, 1982 through March 31, 1983, there were 26,002 criminal cases filed, an increase of 8.7 percent over the 23,918 criminal cases filed during the same period last year. Case terminations increased to 23,679 cases this year compared to 22,900 cases terminated during the nine month reporting period ended March 31, 1982.

### Filings and Terminations by Quarter

Case filings for the quarter ended March 31, 1983 increased 47.4 percent to 10,331 compared to 7,008 cases filed last quarter. Case terminations were up 24.3 percent from 7,127 cases terminated last quarter to 8,860 cases terminated this quarter. Table 9 provides the number of cases and defendants filed and terminated for each quarter during the past twelve months.

### Criminal Filings by Major Offense

The number of cases filed, excluding transfers, increased 8.3 percent from 31,076 cases filed in 1982 to 33,655 cases filed in 1983. Case filings increased in 10 of the 15 major offense categories with the largest increase (22.7 percent) reported in Drug Abuse Prevention and Control Act (DAPCA) cases. There were 4,824 DAPCA cases filed this year compared to 3,930 cases filed last year. Marihuana, narcotics, and controlled substances each contributed equally to the rise in this category.

An increase of 19.5 percent was recorded in the fraud category. The increase in "other" fraud offenses (92.6 percent), was a result of 645 food stamp violations reported this period as fraud violations instead of Agriculture Act violations. (Note the 53.5 percent decrease in filings for Agriculture Acts under Federal statutes.) Other offense categories with an increase in filings of more than 10 percent were forgery and counterfeiting (18.9 percent); burglary (16.6 percent); larceny and theft (11.6 percent); and sex offenses (11.2 percent). Overall, the increases were countered somewhat by decreases in violation of nationality laws and false personations. Appendix Table D-2 provides the number of case filings, excluding transfers, by offense categories for the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983.

### Criminal Case Filings by District

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, the number of case filings increased in 64 district courts and decreased in 30 district courts. The five districts reporting more than a 50 percent increase were: Nevada (95.5 percent); Louisiana, Eastern (90.9 percent); Maine (64.9 percent); North Carolina, Middle (54.2 percent); and Ohio, Northern (52.9 percent). The increase in filings in Louisiana, Eastern; Ohio, Northern; and Nevada resulted primarily from increases in the number of prosecutions for fraud violations. Increases in fraud filings for those districts were 53 cases, 46 cases, and 107 cases, respectively. Appendix Table D-3 provides the number of cases filed by district and by major offense categories during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983.

### Criminal Cases Pending

There were 19,061 cases pending March 31, 1983, which is 12.7 percent more than the 16,915 cases pending the same day last year. Districts with increases in their pending case-loads of more than 50 percent were: Georgia, Middle (154.9 percent or 79 cases); Ohio, Northern (86.4 percent or 95 cases); Oklahoma, Eastern (80.8 percent or 21 cases); North Carolina, Middle (63.6 percent or 28 cases); and Tennessee, Eastern (50.7 percent or 38 cases).

### CASES AND MOTIONS UNDER ADVISEMENT IN U.S. DISTRICT COURTS

For the first quarter of calendar year 1983, U.S. district judges reported 1,167 matters held under advisement over 60 days, a 23.2 percent decrease from the 1,520 matters reported last year. Part of this decrease is due to the fact that fewer judges reported this quarter than in 1982. There were 503 district judges, including 125 senior judges, who reported on the status of matters before the court, compared to 555 district judges for the same quarter last year (see Table 10). While 310 judges (61.6 percent) reported no matters held under advisement over 60 days, 193 judges (38.4 percent) reported matters held under advisement on March 31, 1983.

The 193 judges having matters held under advisement reported a total of 1,167 cases and motions. Of these, 792 cases and motions (67.9 percent) were held under advisement over 60 days but not more than six months; 254 cases and motions (21.8 percent) were held under advisement over six months but not more than one year; and 121 cases and motions (10.4 percent) were held over one year. The district judges of the Seventh Circuit reported the largest number of matters held under advisement with a total of 232 matters or 19.9 percent, while district judges in the District of Columbia Circuit reported only 5 cases or 0.4 percent of all matters reported.

Table 11 provides the distribution by circuit of cases and motions held under advisement over 60 days in the U.S. district courts on March 31, 1983.

## U.S. BANKRUPTCY COURTS

### Summary of Workload

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, a total of 543,917 bankruptcy estates were filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts. This is an increase of 20,052 estates, or 3.8 percent above the 1982 total of 523,865 estates. While filings increased at a modest pace, estate terminations rose more substantially, up 9.5 percent to 441,108 estates. Despite the increased termination activity, the pending caseload increased sharply to 800,623, up 14.7 percent from the 697,814 estates pending one year ago. Table 12 is a comparison of the bankruptcy caseloads during the twelve month periods ended March 31, 1982 and 1983. Additional data on the activity in the bankruptcy courts is provided in Appendix Tables F-1, F-2A, F-2B, F-3A, F-3B, F-3C, and F-3D.

### Bankruptcy Filings

In the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, there were 543,917 bankruptcy estates filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts. This figure represents 379,889 Bankruptcy Code cases (163,679 of which are joint petitions) and 349 Bankruptcy Act cases which were reopened during this period. The rate of increase in 1983 (3.8 percent) is up slightly from the 3.3 percent recorded in 1982.

While overall estate filings rose only slightly, a dramatic increase was experienced in one category of filings. Estates filed under Chapter 11 jumped 81.5 percent from 13,464 in 1982 to 24,434 in 1983. The majority of this increase was in Chapter 11 business reorganizations which rose from 11,401 to 20,675.

At the same time, Chapter 13 filings rose slightly to 151,384 estates or 8.2 percent over the 139,865 filed a year ago. The number of Chapter 7 filings decreased slightly, down 0.6 percent from 369,861 to 367,743 estates.

Table 13 provides a comparison, by district, of bankruptcy filing activity during 1982 and 1983. Fifty-one districts experienced increases in filing activity ranging from an increase of 0.5 percent (Missouri, Western) to 72.9 percent (Puerto Rico). The largest numerical increase by far was in California, Central, where filings rose from 38,128 in 1982 to 48,046 in 1983. Forty-two districts experienced decreases ranging from 0.2 percent (Indiana, Southern) to 51.9 percent (Virgin Islands).

## Filings by Quarter

During the three month period ended March 31, 1983, bankruptcy filings continued to decline, dropping to 128,910 estates, down 1.2 percent from the 130,441 filed in the comparable period in 1982. This total was down 6.6 percent from the 138,048 filed in the previous quarter. Table 14 provides a comparison of bankruptcy estates commenced, by quarter, for statistical years 1977 through 1982 and for the first three quarters of 1983.

## Terminations Up 9.5 Percent

A total of 441,108 estates were disposed of during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983. This is the largest number of bankruptcy estates closed during any comparable twelve month period. Estate terminations jumped from 403,003 in 1982 to 441,108 in 1983, an increase of 9.5 percent. The bankruptcy termination figure of 441,108 includes 291,650 Bankruptcy Code cases (125,485 of which are joint petitions) and 23,973 Bankruptcy Act cases originally filed prior to the Bankruptcy Reform Act of 1978.

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, a total of 60 districts experienced increases in termination activity. Of this number, nine districts more than doubled the number of estates terminated: Alaska; California, Eastern; Idaho; Maryland; Mississippi, Southern; North Carolina, Western; Pennsylvania, Eastern; Texas, Eastern; and Texas, Southern. Despite the overall increase, 33 districts registered decreases in termination activity.

#### **Pending Caseload Rises Sharply**

The pending estate caseload in the U.S. bankruptcy courts reached a record level of 800,623 as of March 31, 1983. This figure is 102,809 more than the 697,814 estates pending a year ago. The 1983 pending caseload is comprised of 525,443 Bankruptcy Code cases (232,542 of which are joint petitions) and 42,638 Act cases. The rate of increase in the pending caseload, however, dropped to 14.7 percent from 20.9 percent a year ago.

Despite an overall increase during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, a total of 17 districts were able to reduce their pending caseloads during the period. The most significant reduction was in Indiana, Southern, where pending estates dropped 33.2 percent from 11,537 in 1982 to 7,712 in 1983. Among the districts experiencing increases in pending caseloads, the largest increases were in California, Central (up from 37,003 to 55,032) and California, Northern (up from 26,922 to 34,326).

#### **Adversary Proceedings**

During the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983, a total of 168,059 adversary proceedings, arising out of Bankruptcy Code cases, were filed in the U.S. bankruptcy courts. This represents a significant increase of 32.2 percent from the 127,118 such proceedings filed a year ago. Similarly, adversary terminations jumped substantially, up 39.4 percent from 85,471 in 1982 to 119,146 in 1983. As a result of the large volume of proceedings filed, the number of pending adversary proceedings rose to 140,437 as of March 31, 1983, up 54.3 percent over the 91,007 pending a year ago. Additional data on adversary proceedings, by district, during the twelve month period ended March 31, 1983 is provided in Appendix Table F-1AP.
