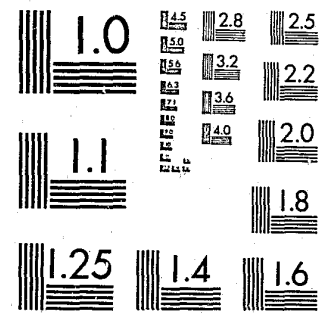

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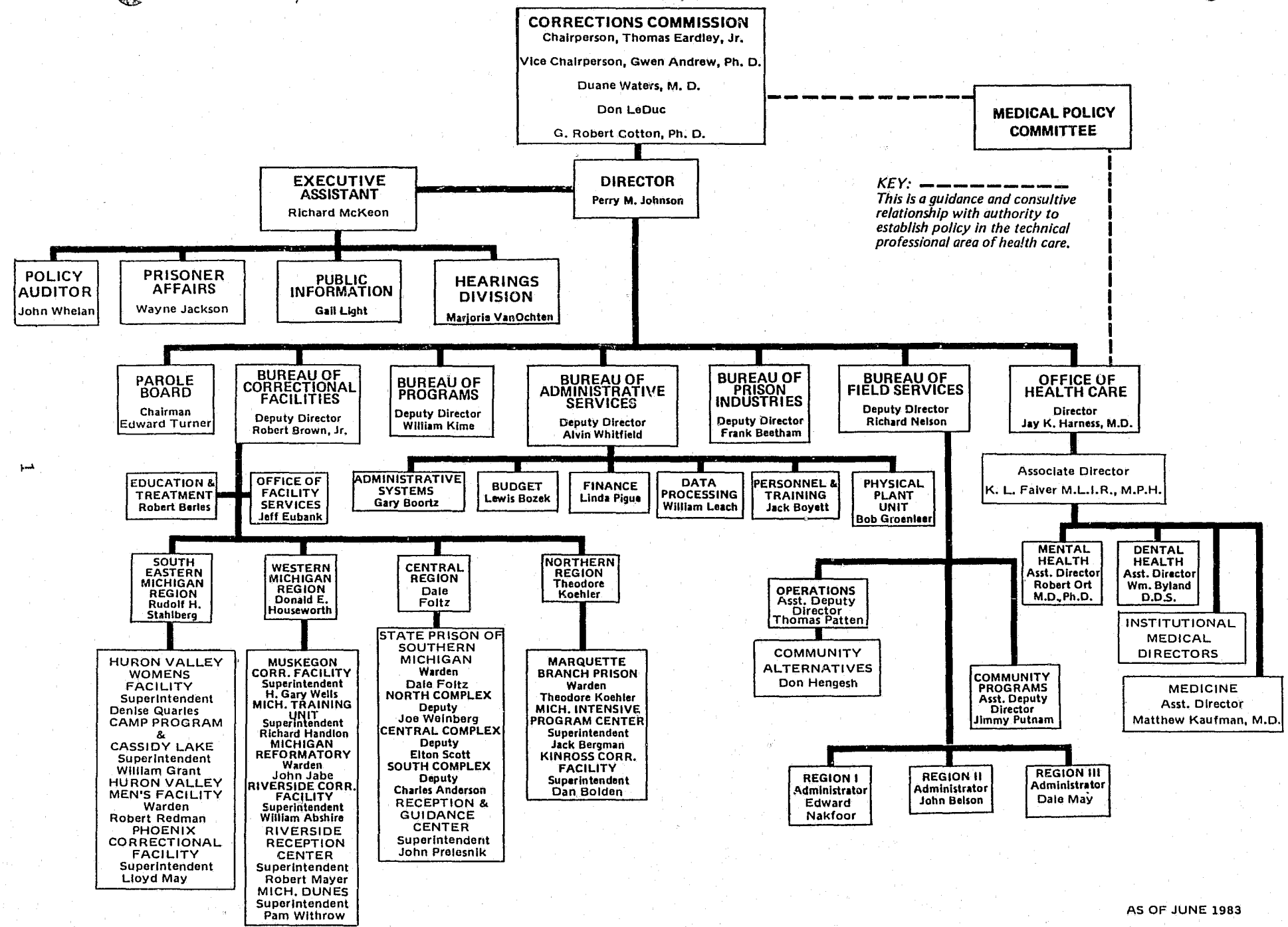

## Court Dispositions

The A tables, charts and graphs illustrate data supplied to the department by the circuit courts in Michigan and the Detroit Recorder's Court. They show dispositions for all felony convictions handled by the courts in 1982.

Table A-1 counts the number of people who received court sentences during the year. (Previously this table has counted cases, rather than people and the change accounts for the apparent reduction in the number of felony convictions). The table categorizes each person according to the most severe sentence s/he received even though a person may have been sentenced for several felony crimes. An individual will be counted more than once if s/he received court sentences on separate occasions that were three months or more apart.

This year the group designations are illustrated through pie charts rather than through graphs. More details on these groups by circuit court can be obtained through the Public Information Office.

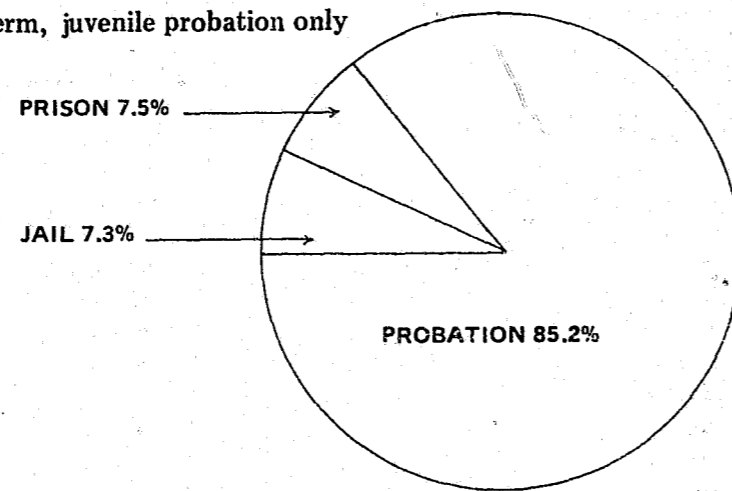
Table A-2 counts all court dispositions as in the past. One person may receive several sentences.

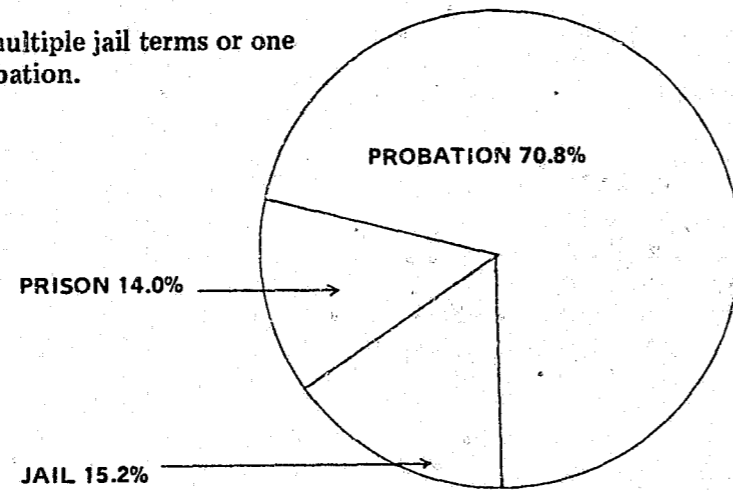

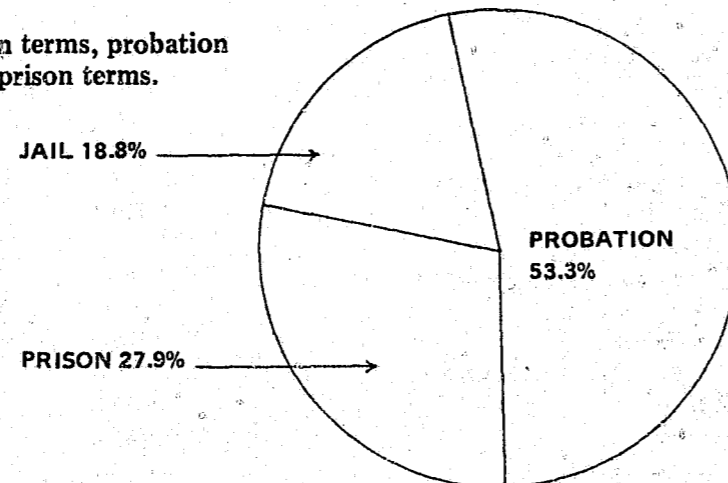
**A1a** Group A -- No prior prison term, juvenile probation only or one jail term.



**A1b** Group B -- Juvenile record, multiple jail terms or one term of adult probation.

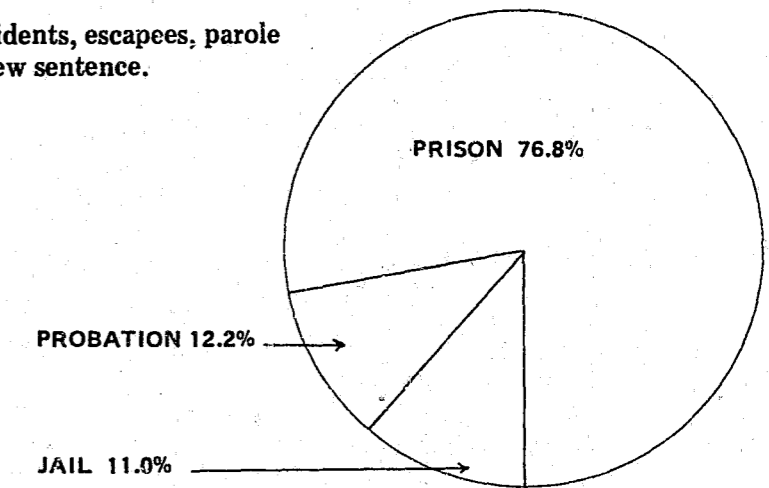


**A1c** Group C -- Multiple probation terms, probation violators or prior prison terms.

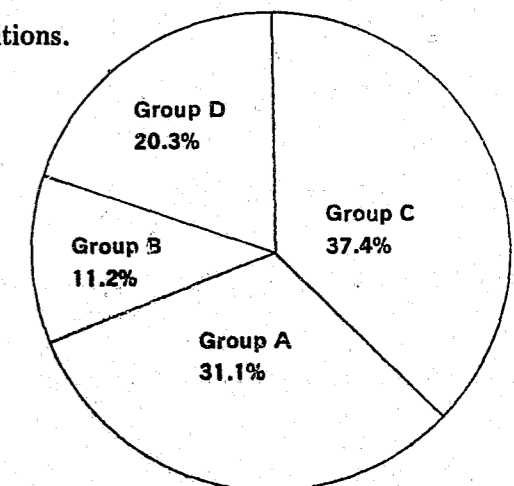

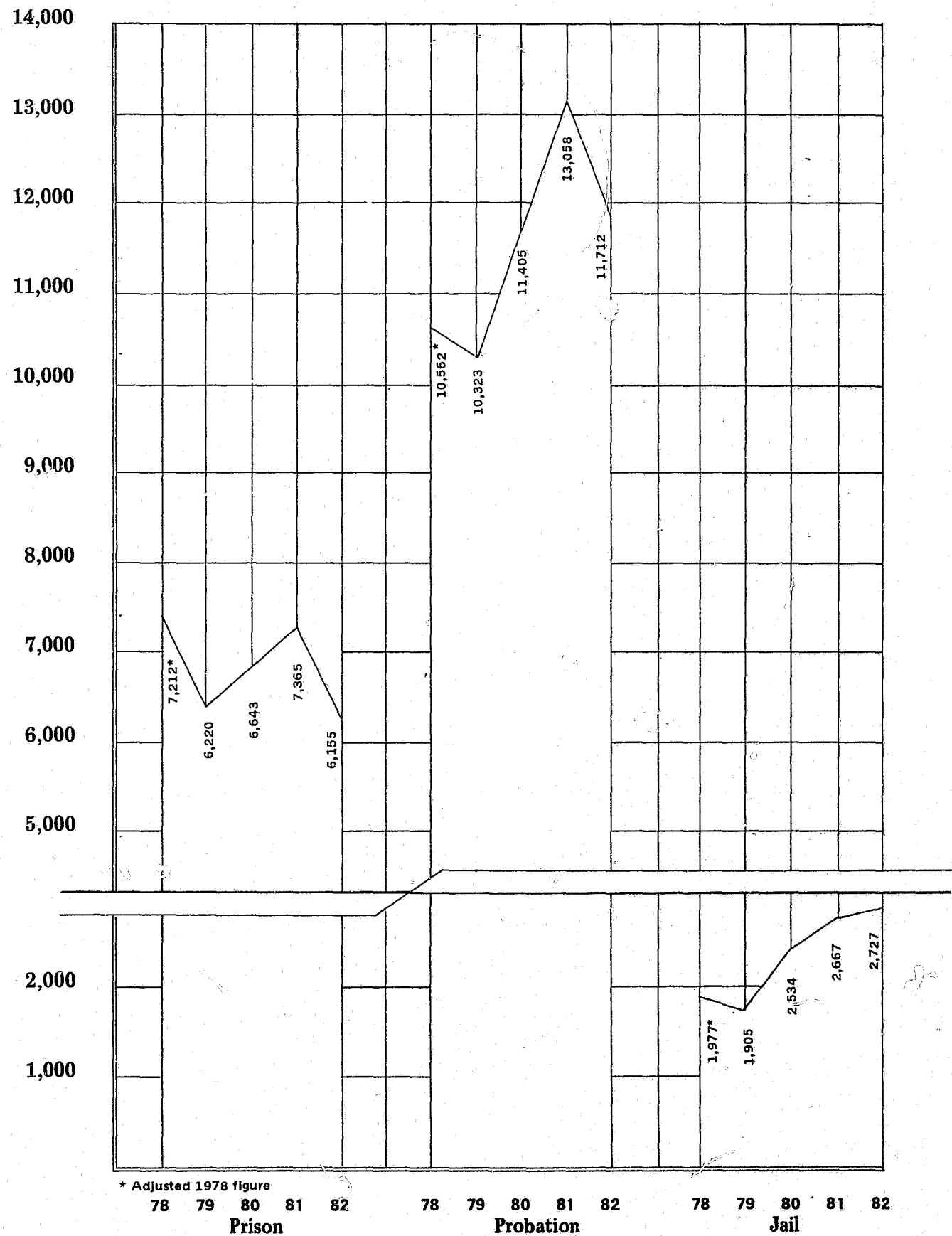

## Prison Commitments

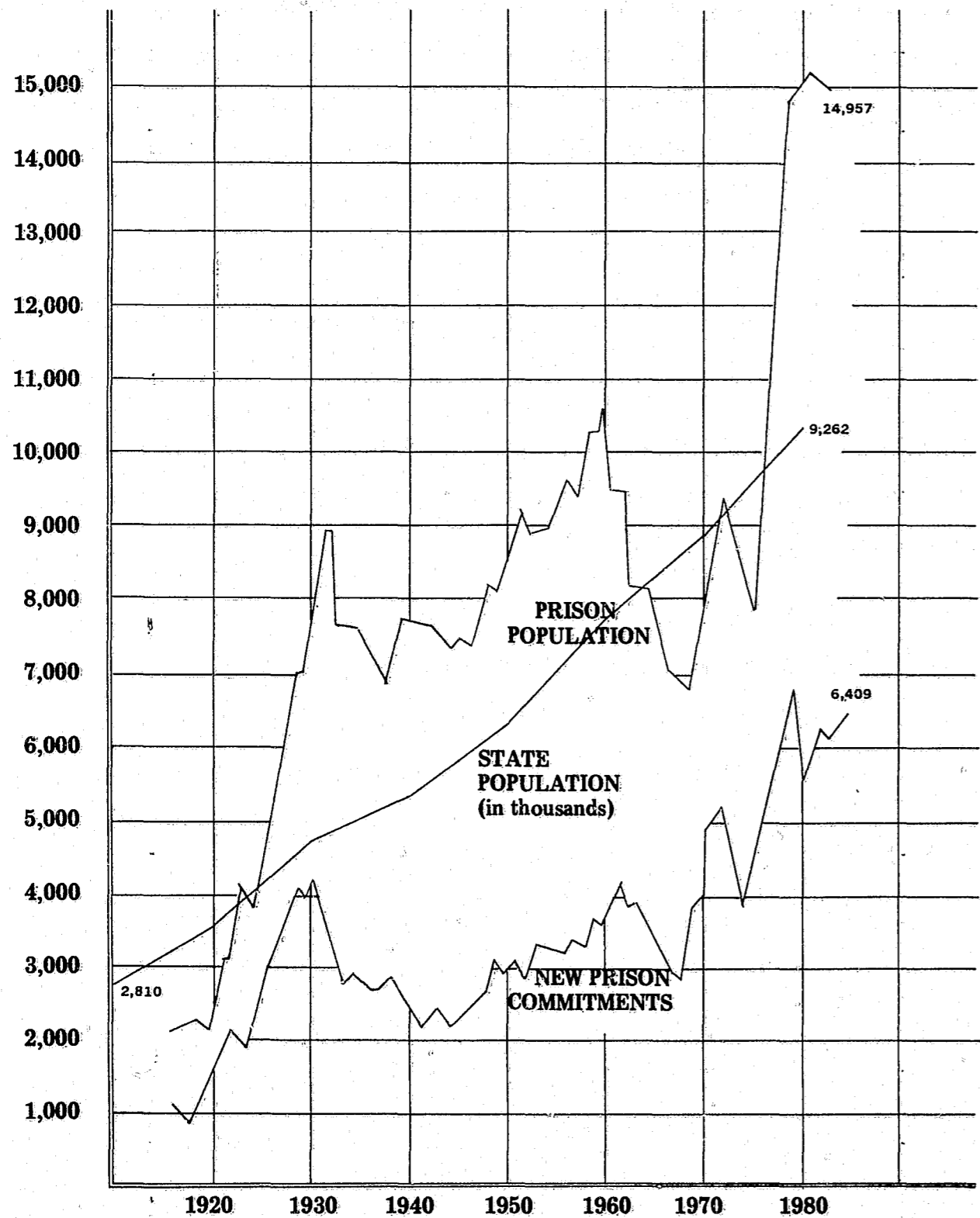
The B tables count the number of prison commitments for the year, reporting the longest sentence from each commitment. A person may be committed more than once in a year with multiple sentences per commitment. In 1982, total sentences represented by the commitments are 1,143 attempts and 6,665 non-attempts. Those sentences falling in between the various categories are grouped with the higher group.

The first two charts compare prisoner commitments with the state's population and the number of reported crimes.

The B-2 table contains male and female commitments but B-3 lists only female commitments. These charts now contain an average minimum sentence for the various crimes.

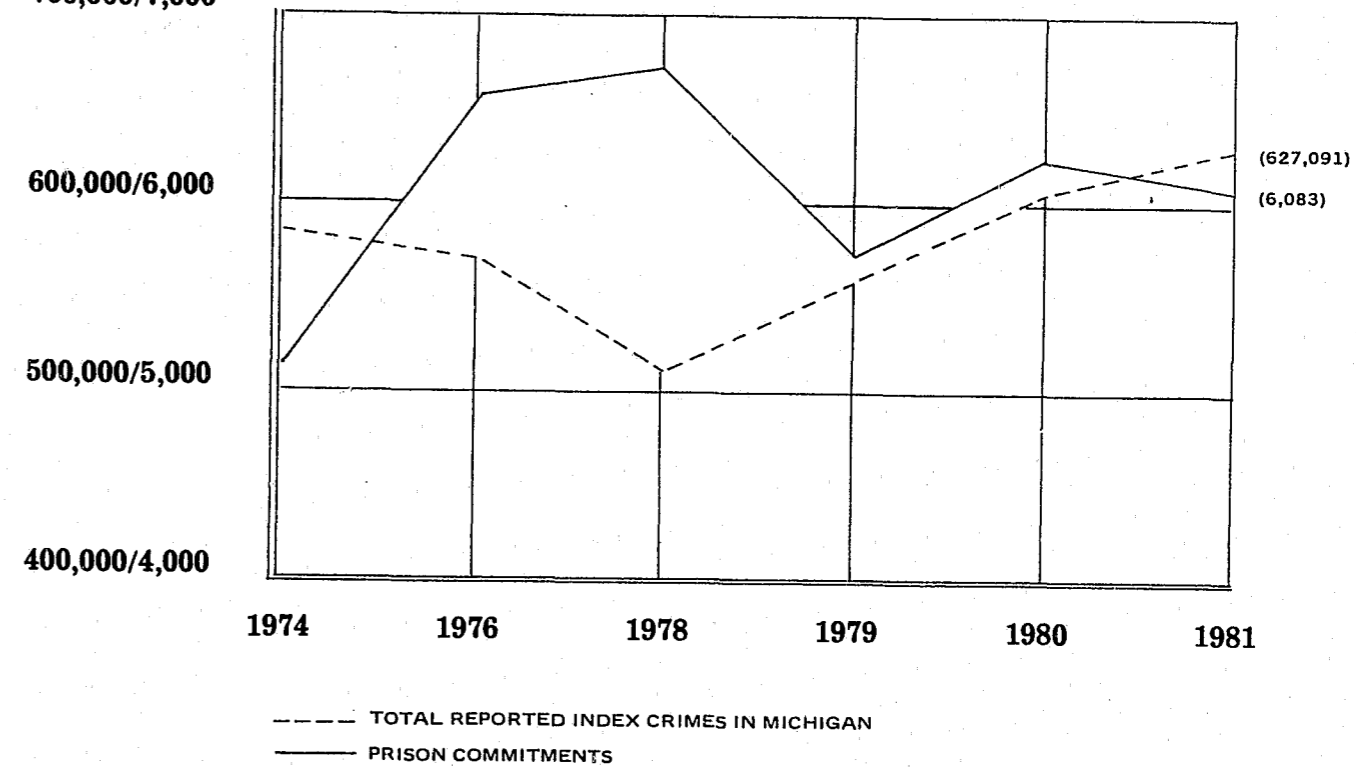

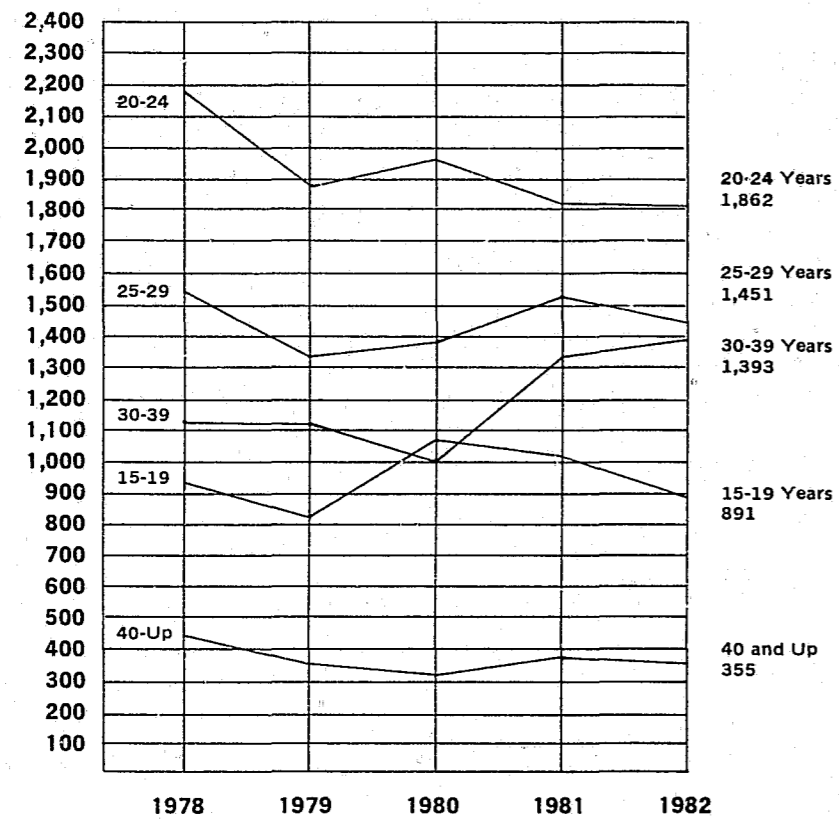

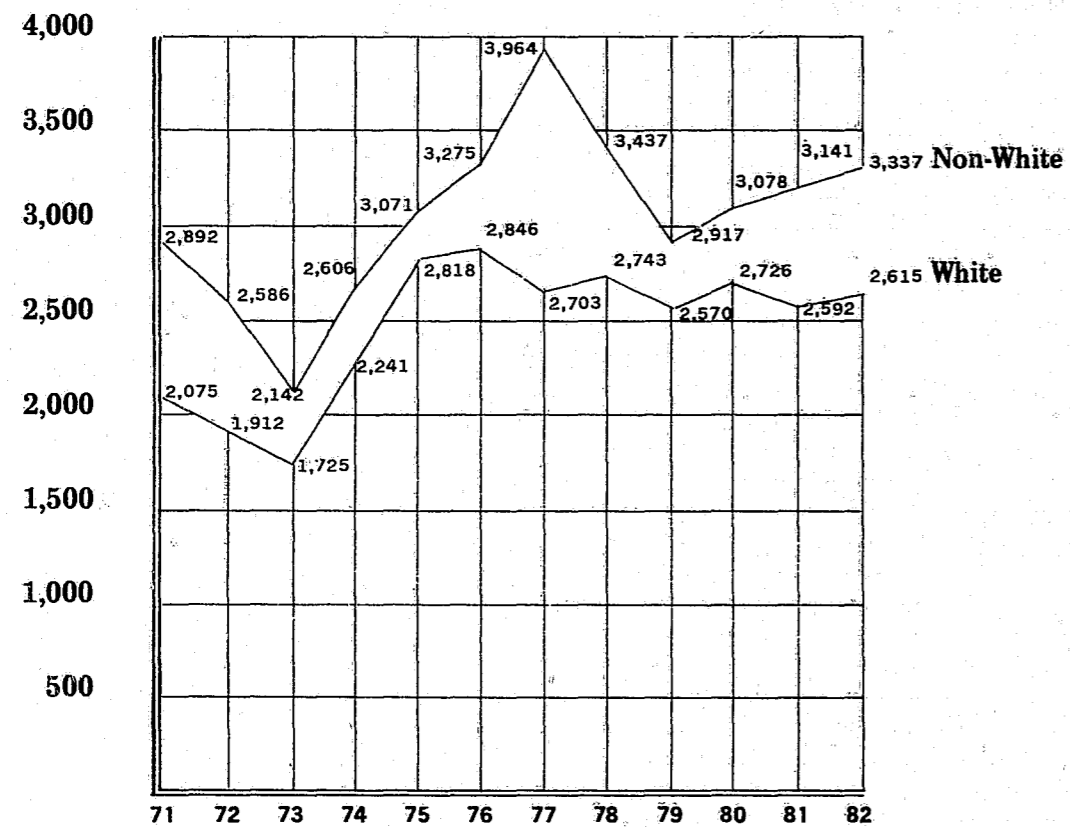

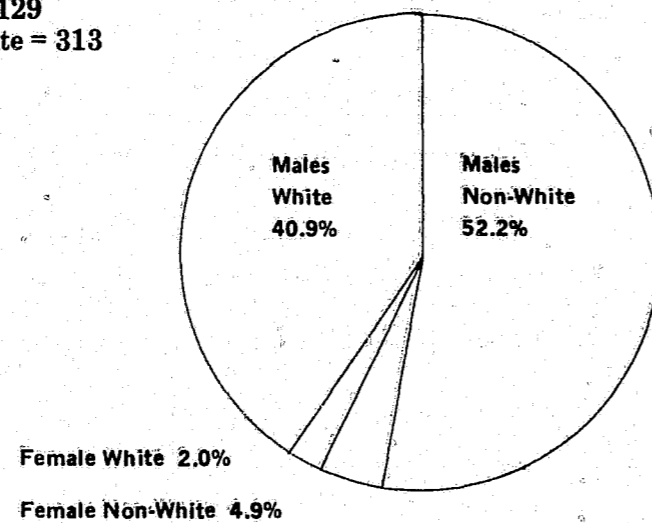
**B5a** Commitment by Race for Men



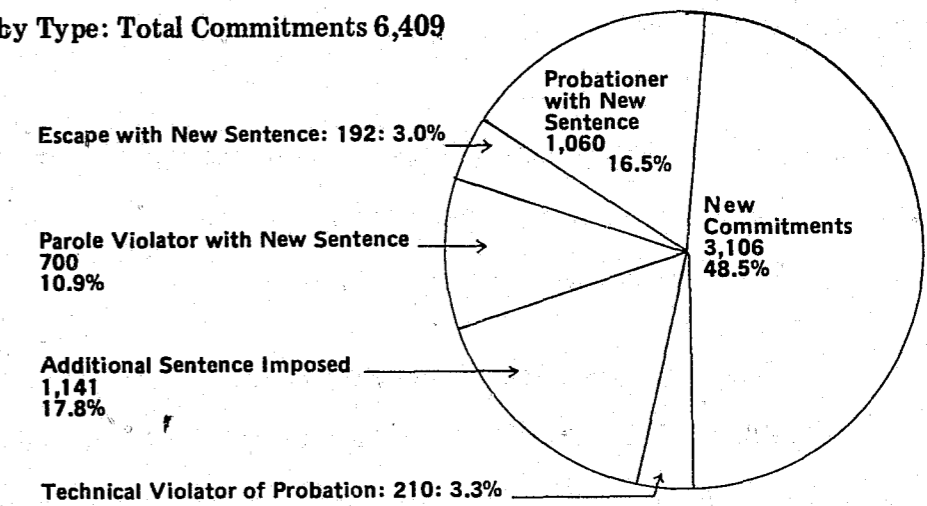
**B5b** Total Commitment by Race; Male and Female Percentages

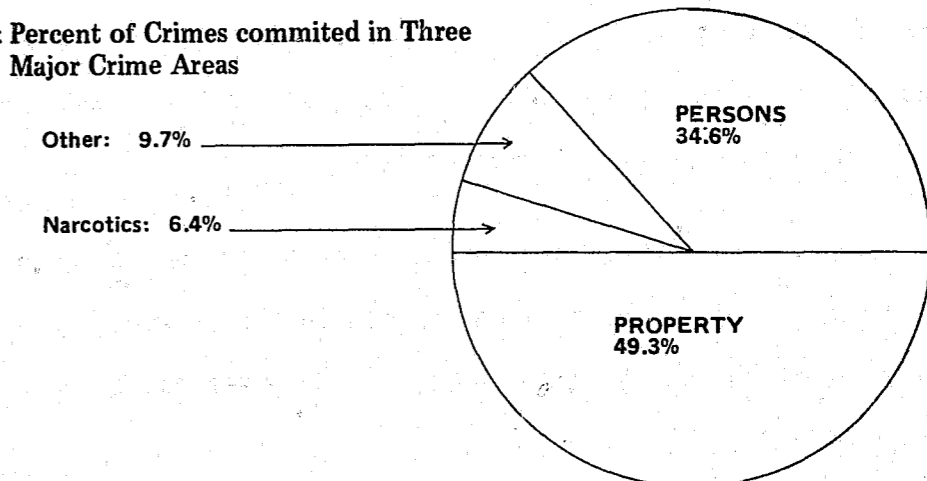

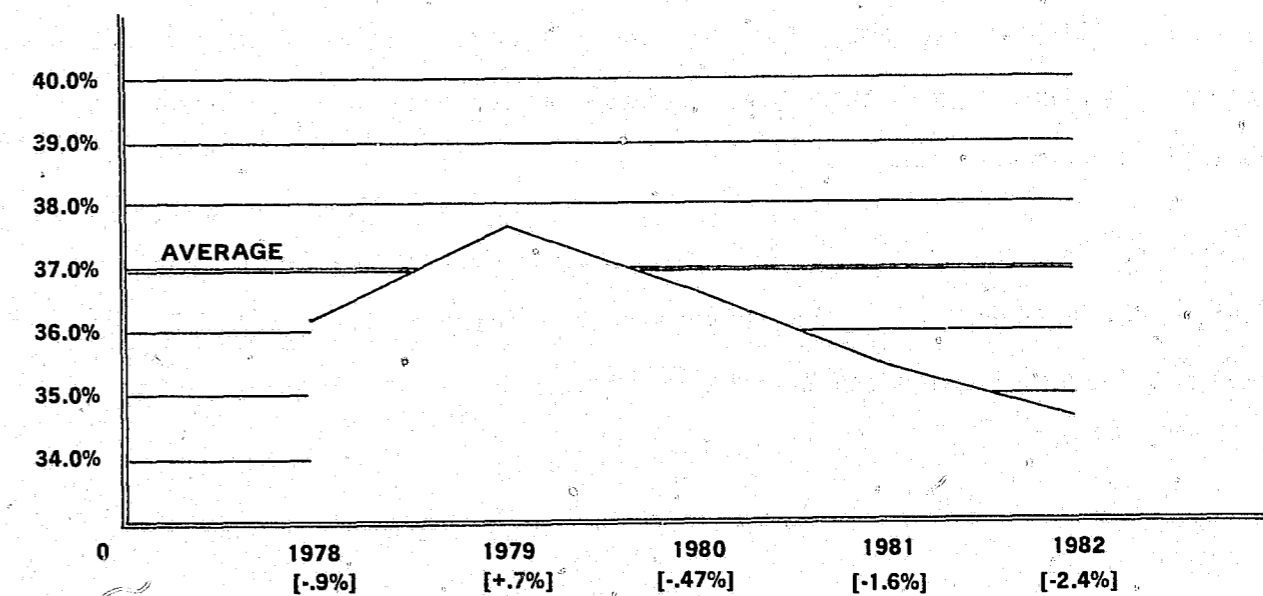
**B6** Commitments by Type: Total Commitments 6,409

## Prisons and Prisoners

The following tables and charts present information on the state's prisons and prisoners. A map shows the location of all prisons and camps. Another section describes each institution.

Illustrated in this section are the crimes for which prisoners have been incarcerated. The C tables count the controlling sentences for persons who were on count at an institution or in the halfway house program the last day of 1982. Temporary releases, furloughs, out-to-court and admissions to the Department of Mental Health are not counted nor are persons who are on a facility count but who do not have any active sentence record on the department's computer information system.

The C-1 chart contains sentences for both men and women but C-2 contains only women. Sentences falling in between the various categories are grouped into the higher categories. Attempted offenses are given directly below the named offense.

One chart lists the various treatment activities available in Michigan prisons and minimum security camps. Another describes critical incidents.

Charts illustrating activities of the Office of Health Care are not included in the report this year because a separate annual report is available from that office.

Charts also are available in this section showing the activities of Michigan State Industries. New this year is a chart on the disposition of major misconducts in Michigan prisons in 1982.

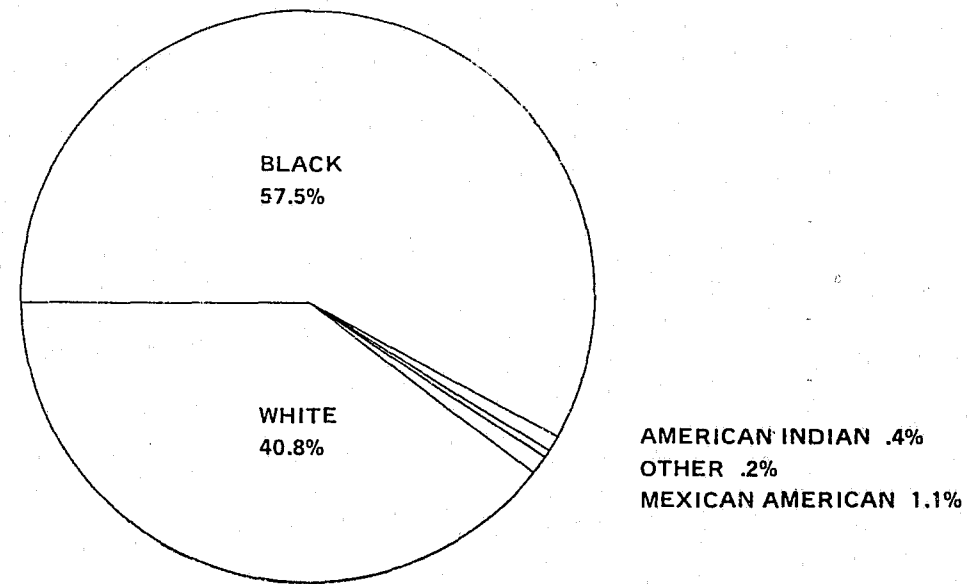

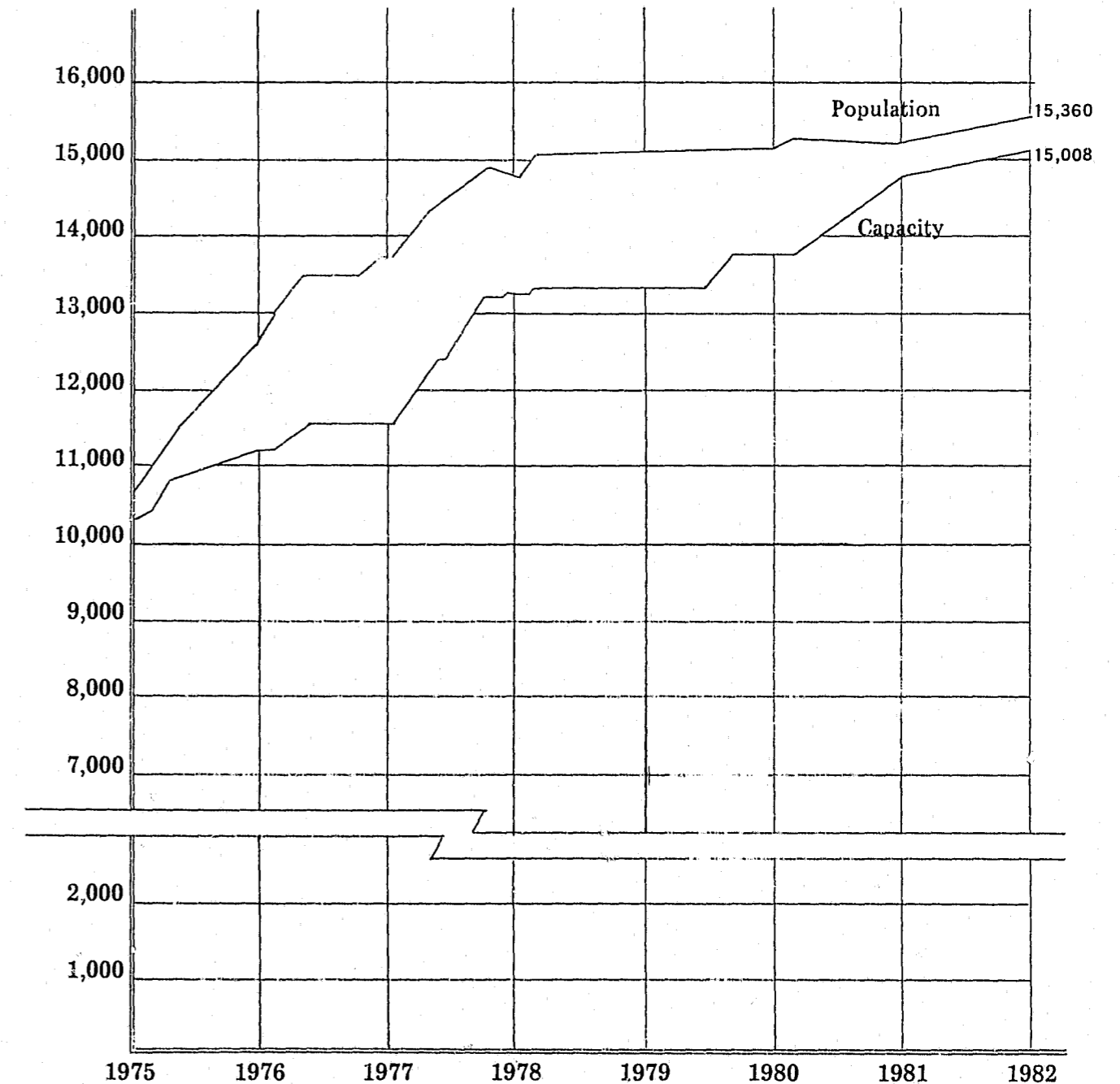

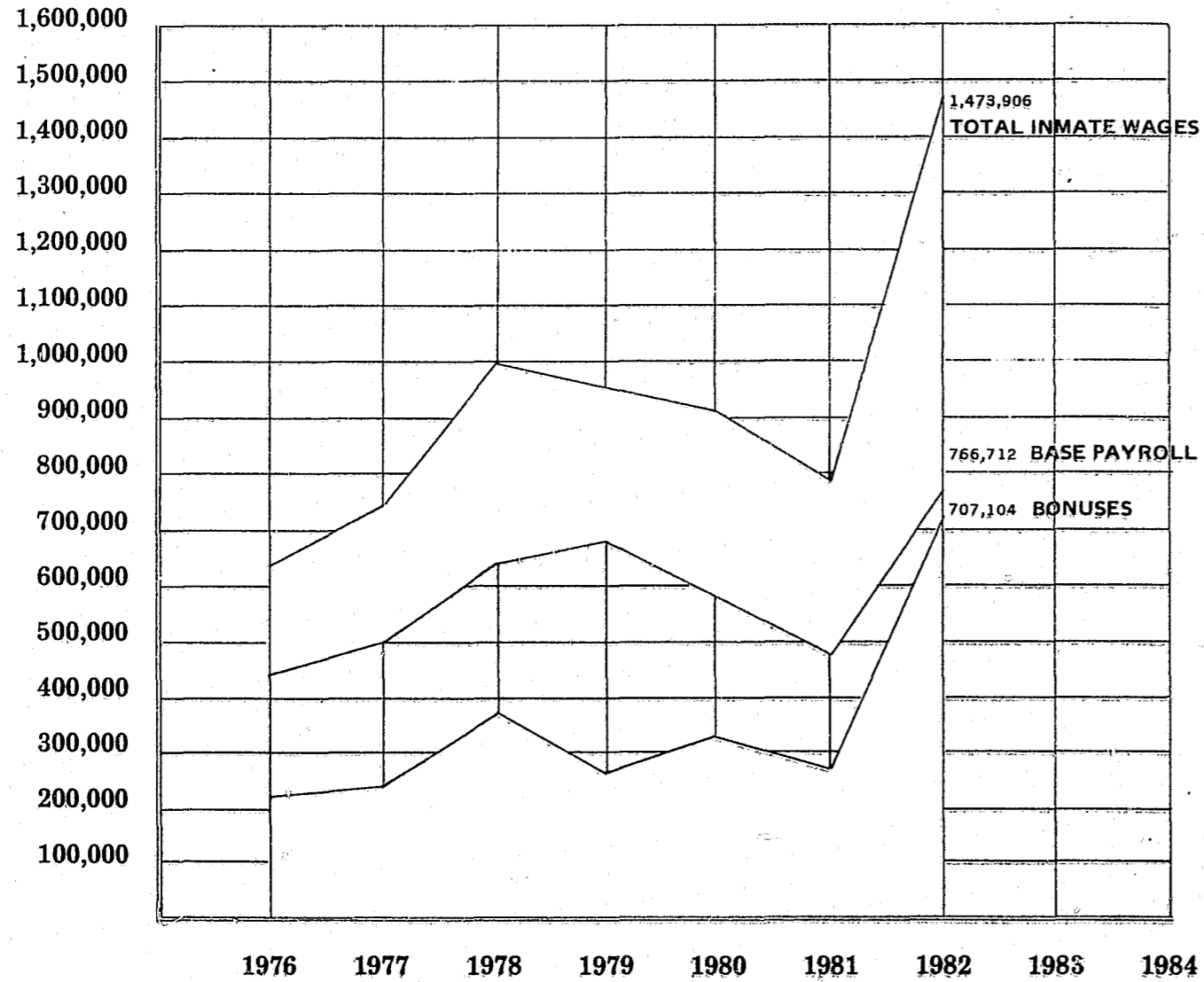

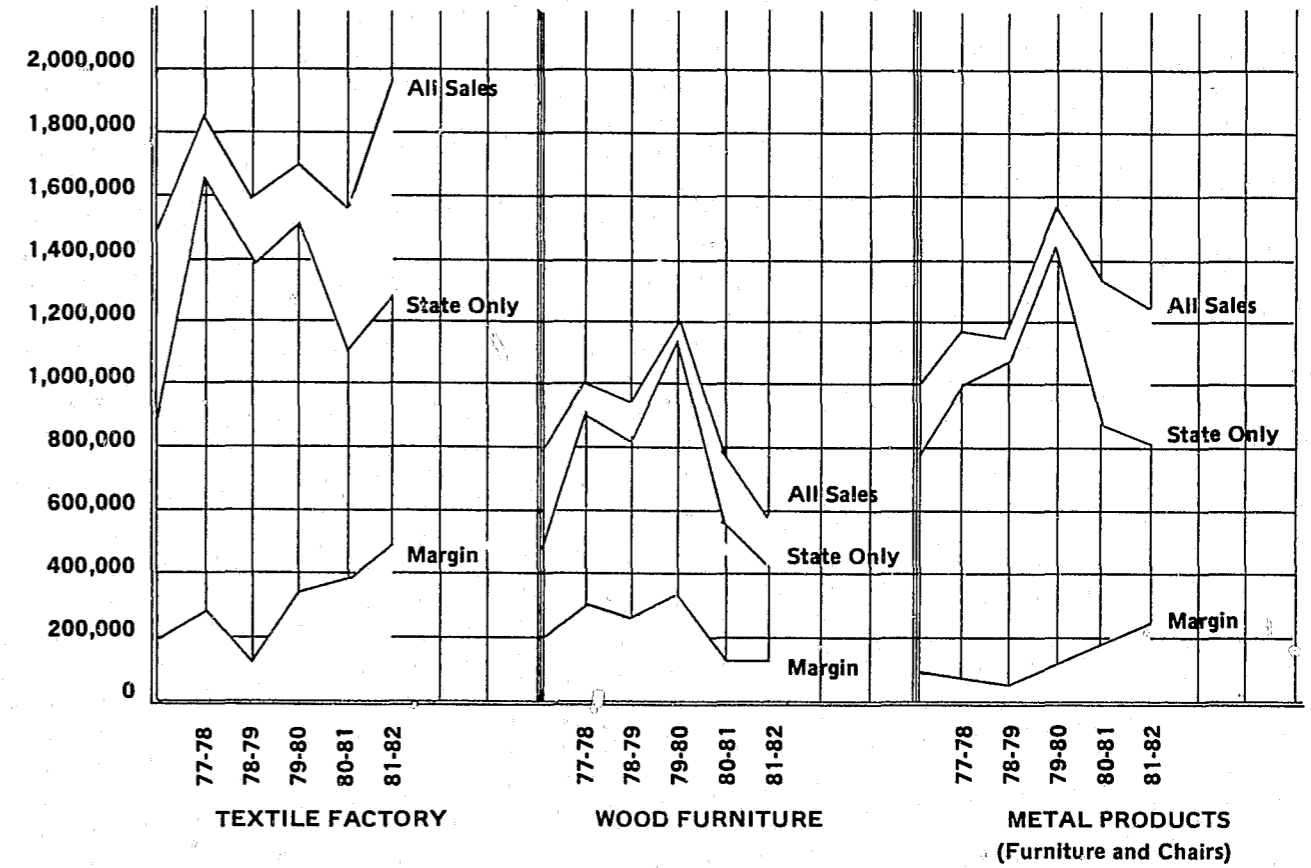

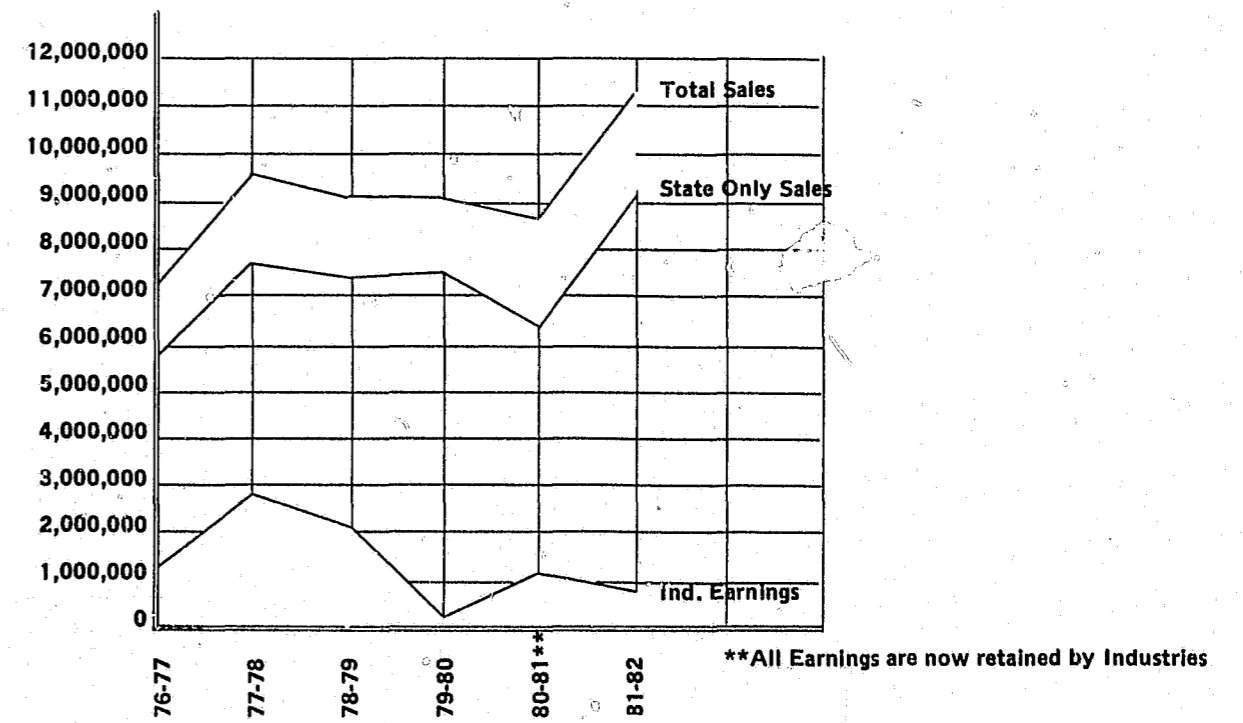
**C9** MICHIGAN STATE INDUSTRIES -- Total Inmate Wages

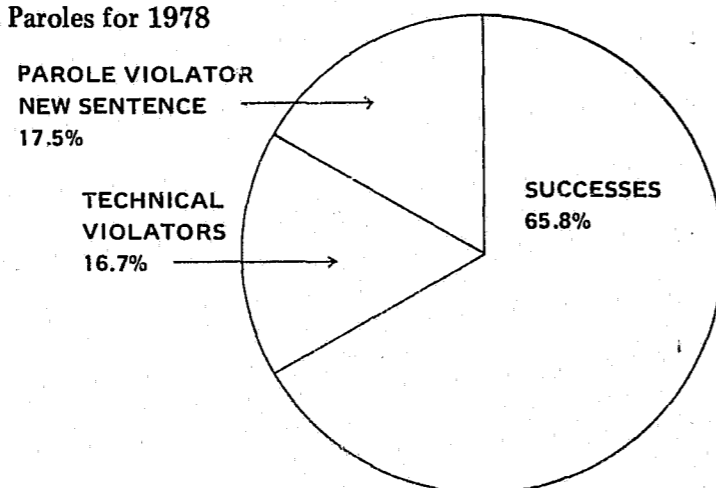

## Field Services

This section describes, through use of statistics, the activities of the Bureau of Field Services.

This bureau supervises all felons on probation, parole or living in the community in a halfway house or resident home.

The supervision is divided into three regions which are shown on the map in this section.

The central office prepares budgets, sets policies and handles matters that cannot be taken care of locally such as the Interstate Compact and communications concerning absconders picked up in other states.

Parole violations which result in return to prison are shown in this section.

Personnel and funds distribution illustrate the total staffing in field supervision, community corrections and central office administration. It also describes, through a pie chart, the dollars spent during the 1981-82 fiscal year on these same bureau sections. The work unit distribution charts show the efforts of the employees of this bureau are divided into supervision and investigation.

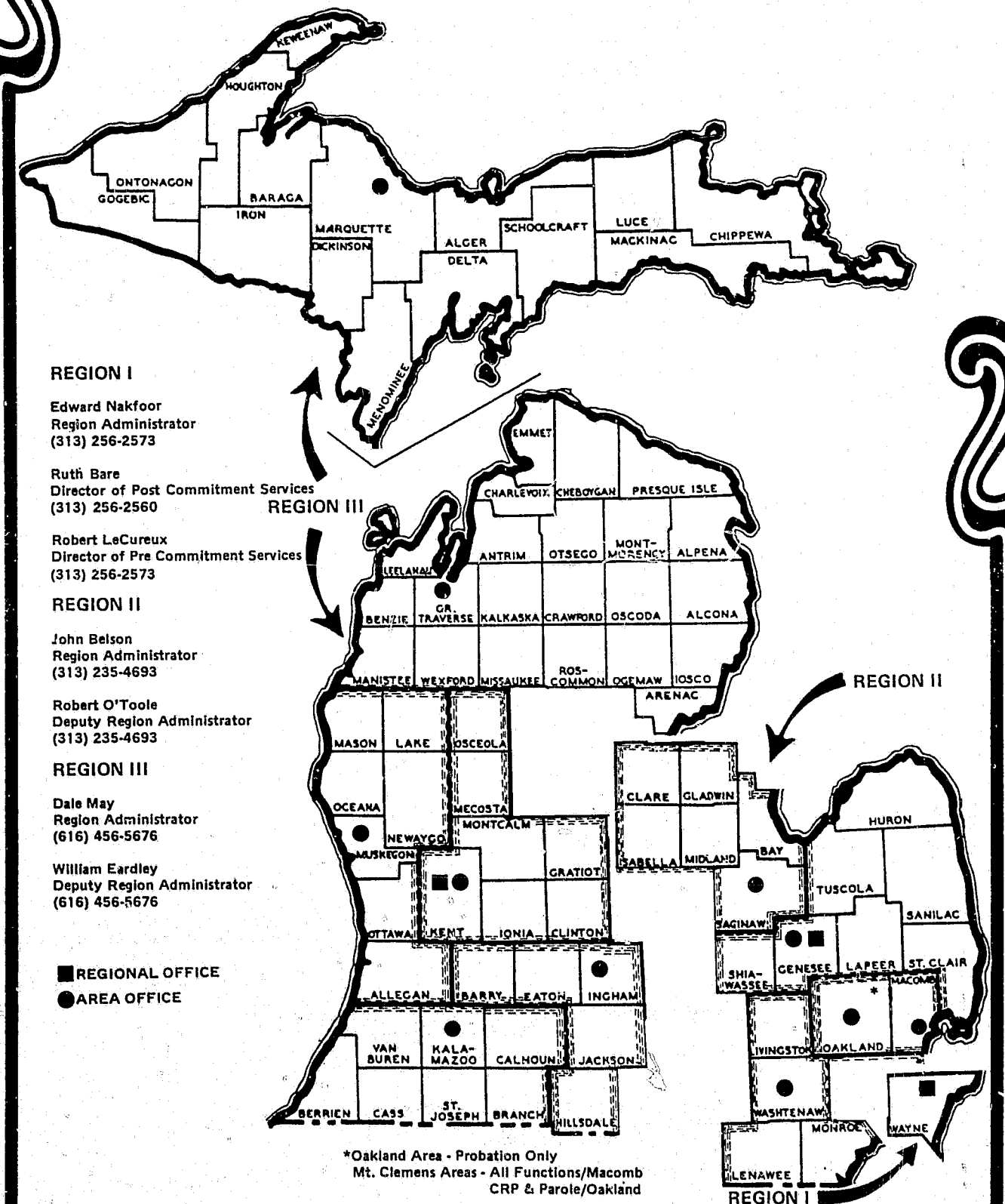
Supervision is further divided into type and shows that probation supervision accounts for 72.8 per cent of all supervision activities.

Investigations account for 139,118 of the work units. Of all investigations those done for the pre-sentence reports clearly predominate.

The bureau measures workloads by assigning unit values to the various tasks. A completed pre-sentence investigation equals five units and each client supervised is counted as one unit. In most Michigan counties parole and probation agents average 100 work units.

Dispositions of probation violations shows the sentences received by probation violators. Prison sentences have declined from 41 per cent in 1979 to 34 per cent in 1982. Probation terminations show how clients ended their term of probation either successfully or unsuccessfully. Successful terminations have declined slightly from 79 per cent in 1979 to 77 per cent in 1982.

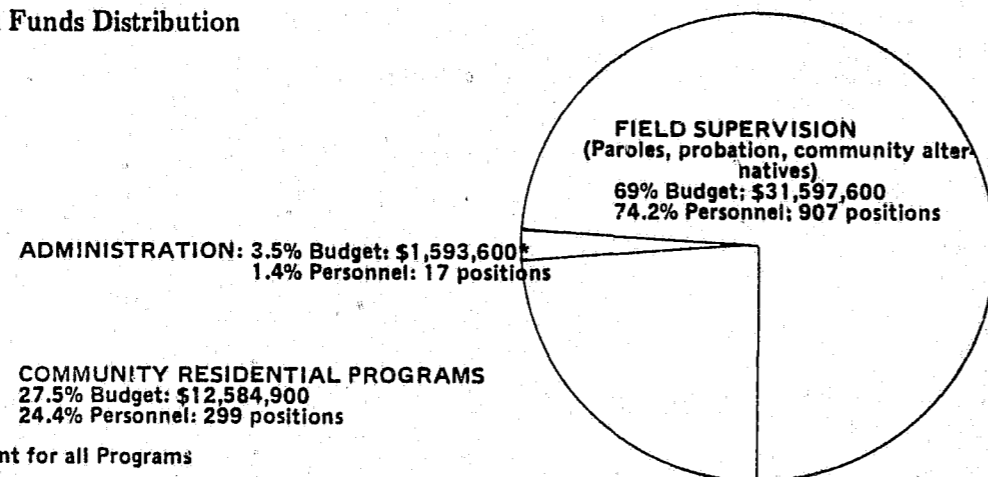

Personnel and Funds Distribution

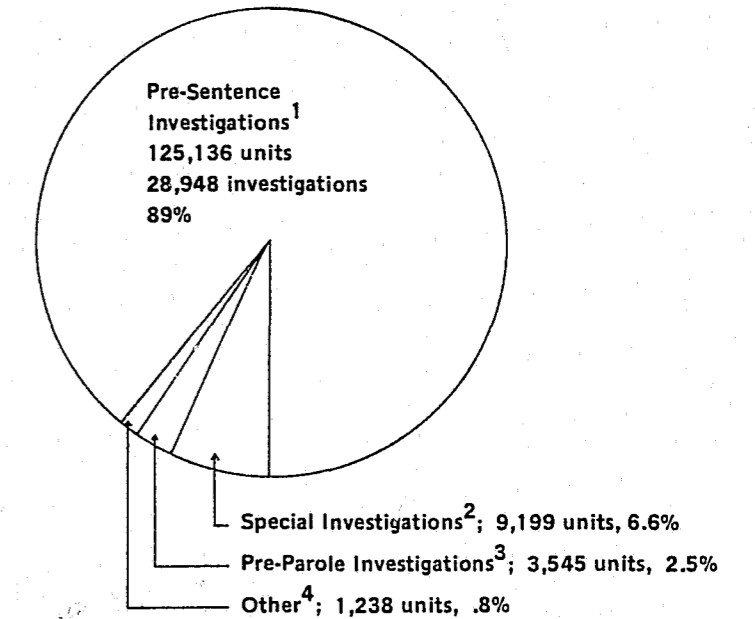

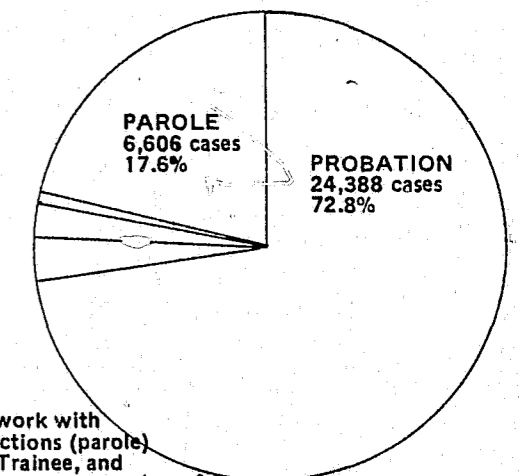

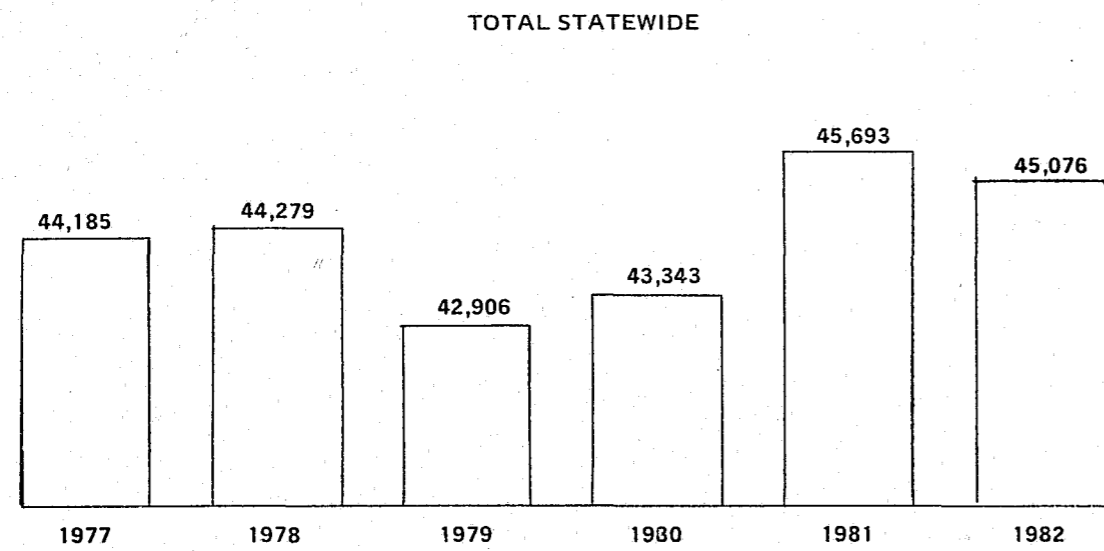

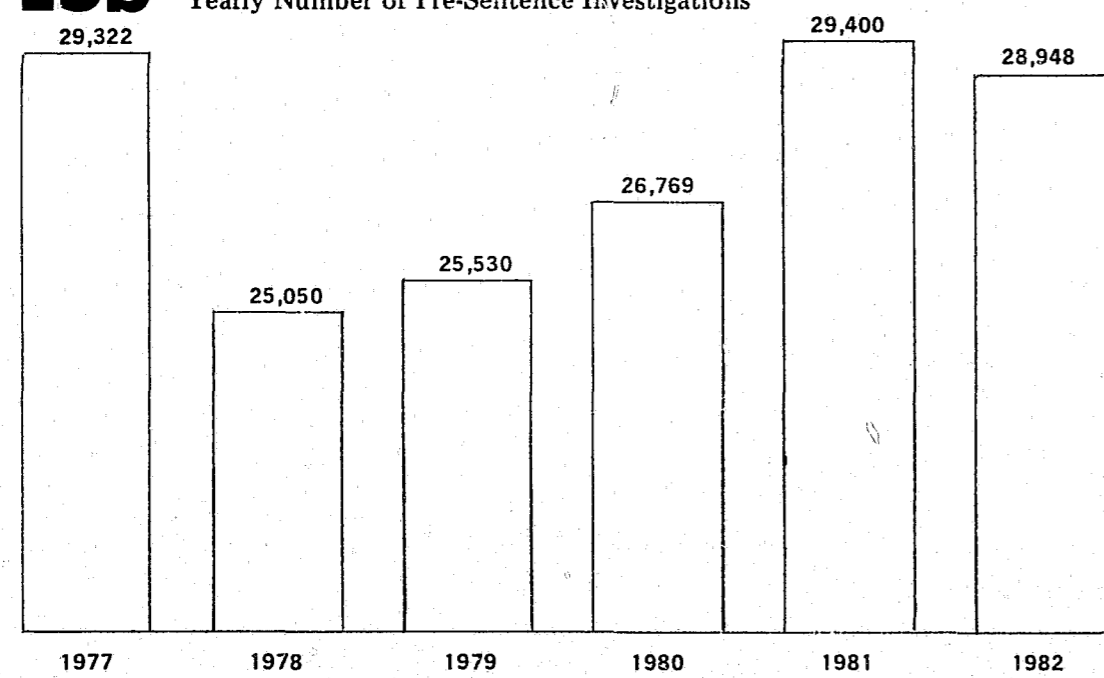

**E5a** Average Monthly Statewide Workunits\* Annually

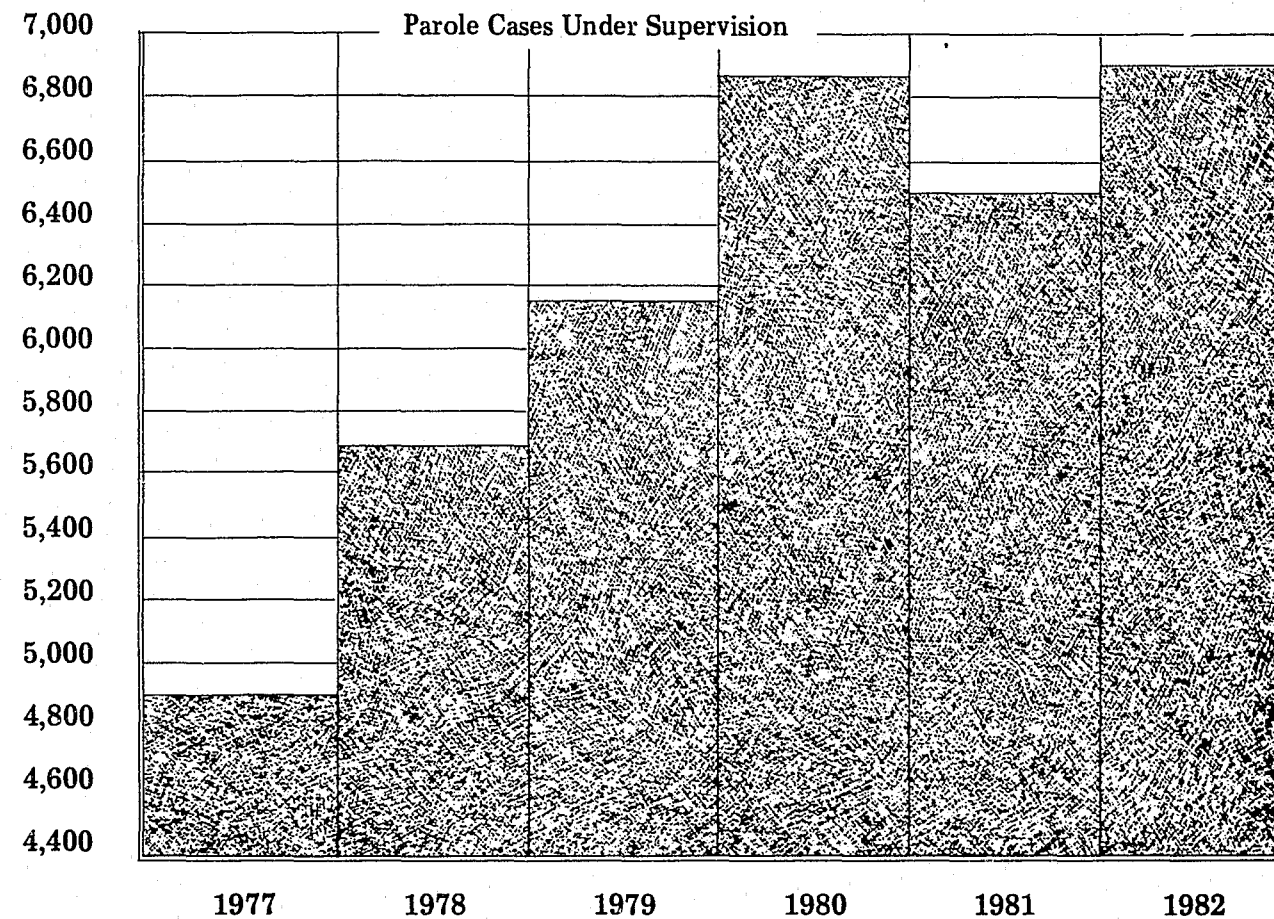

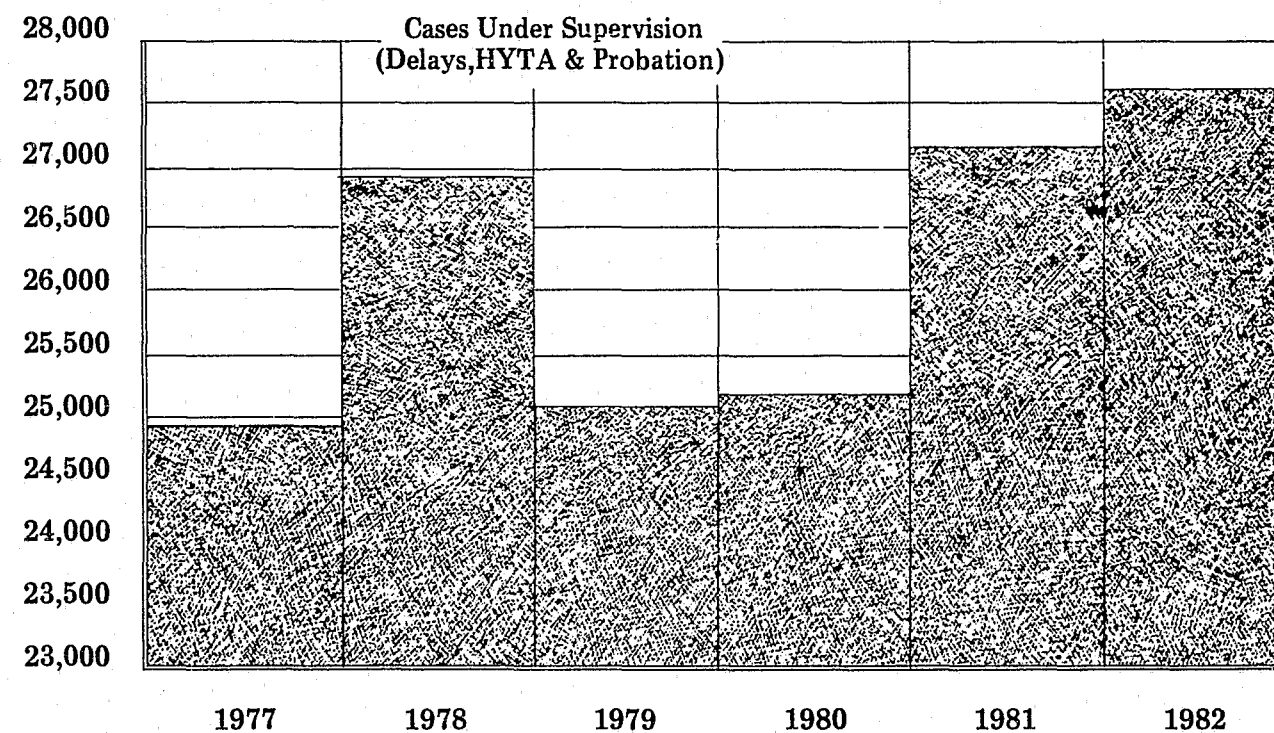
**E5b** Yearly Number of Pre-Sentence Investigations

Community Programs

This year the Community Programs division switched from a calendar year to a fiscal year for statistical reporting purposes. As a result, the following graphs and charts, with the exception of per diem costs which were always on a fiscal year basis, overlap those of calendar year 1981 by three months.

Chart F-1 displays all pertinent CRP statistics for the last five (one fiscal and four calendar) years.

Chart F-2 shows both the number and relative percentages of program terminations. While escapes and new felony charges declined, paroles and discharges increased and remained well above the 50 per cent mark for the second consecutive year.

Graph F-3 indicates growth in terms of the average daily count from 1974 when major growth began through fiscal 1981-82. The drop of over 200 during the last year has been attributed principally to the effects of multiple triggering of the Emergency Prison Overcrowding Act.

Chart F-4 displays the relative disbursement and amounts of fiscal year 1981-82 prisoner gross earnings. Prisoner earnings continue to mirror the general economy with the drop of \$1.42 million or 25.9 per cent from 1981. This is the second straight year prisoner earnings have declined.

F-5 shows the difference between the community program and average institutional per diem costs for the previous five fiscal years. The five-year savings difference amounts to a total of \$31.13 million. This is equal



to the combined 1981-82 FY expenditures of Marquette Branch Prison, Kinross Correctional Facility and the Muskegon Correctional Facility with a total average population of 2,214.

F-6 graphs the relative termination percentages for CRP from 1974 through fiscal 1981-82. For the last two years escapes and new felony charges have declined while paroles and discharges have increased for the last three years.

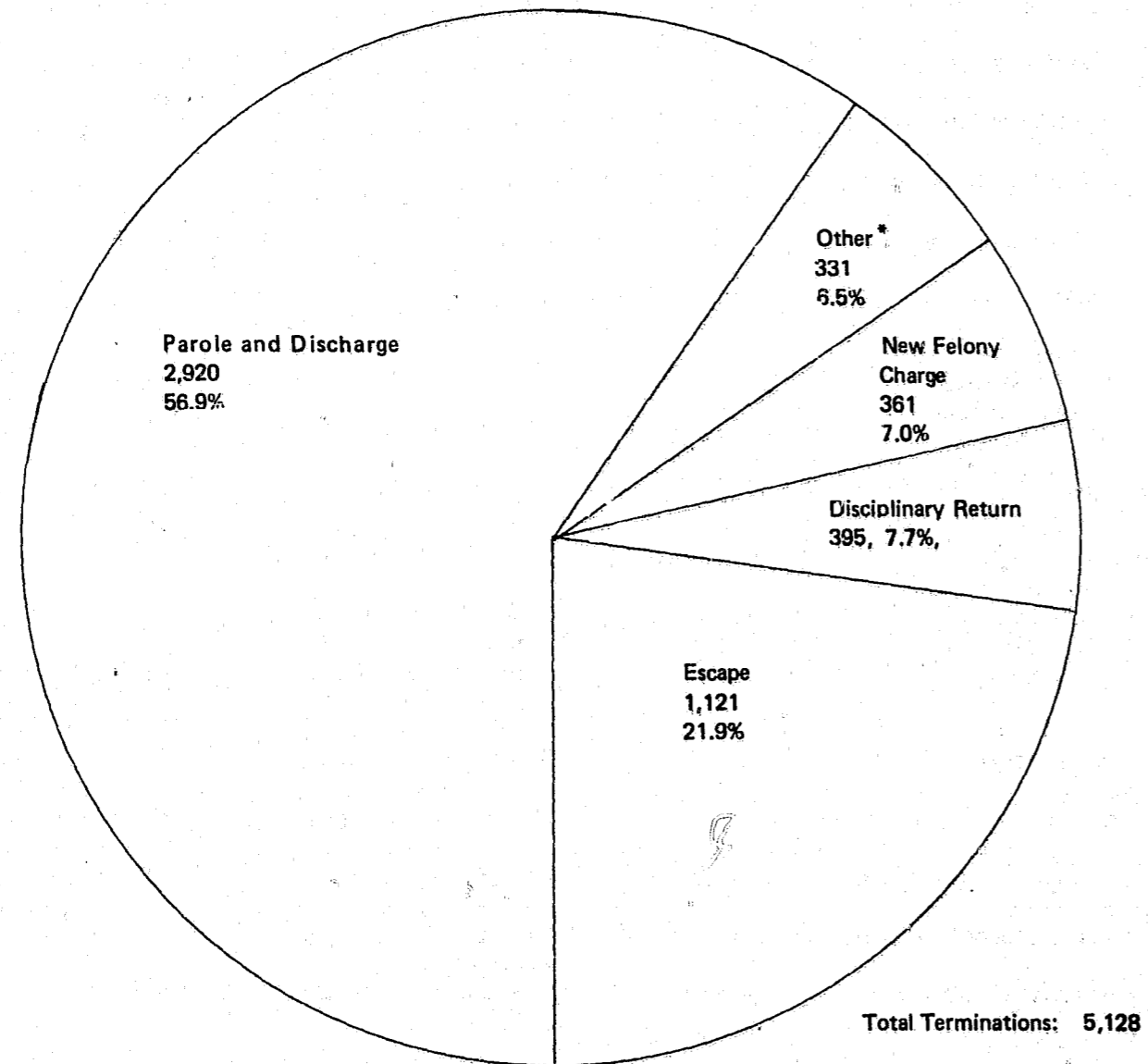

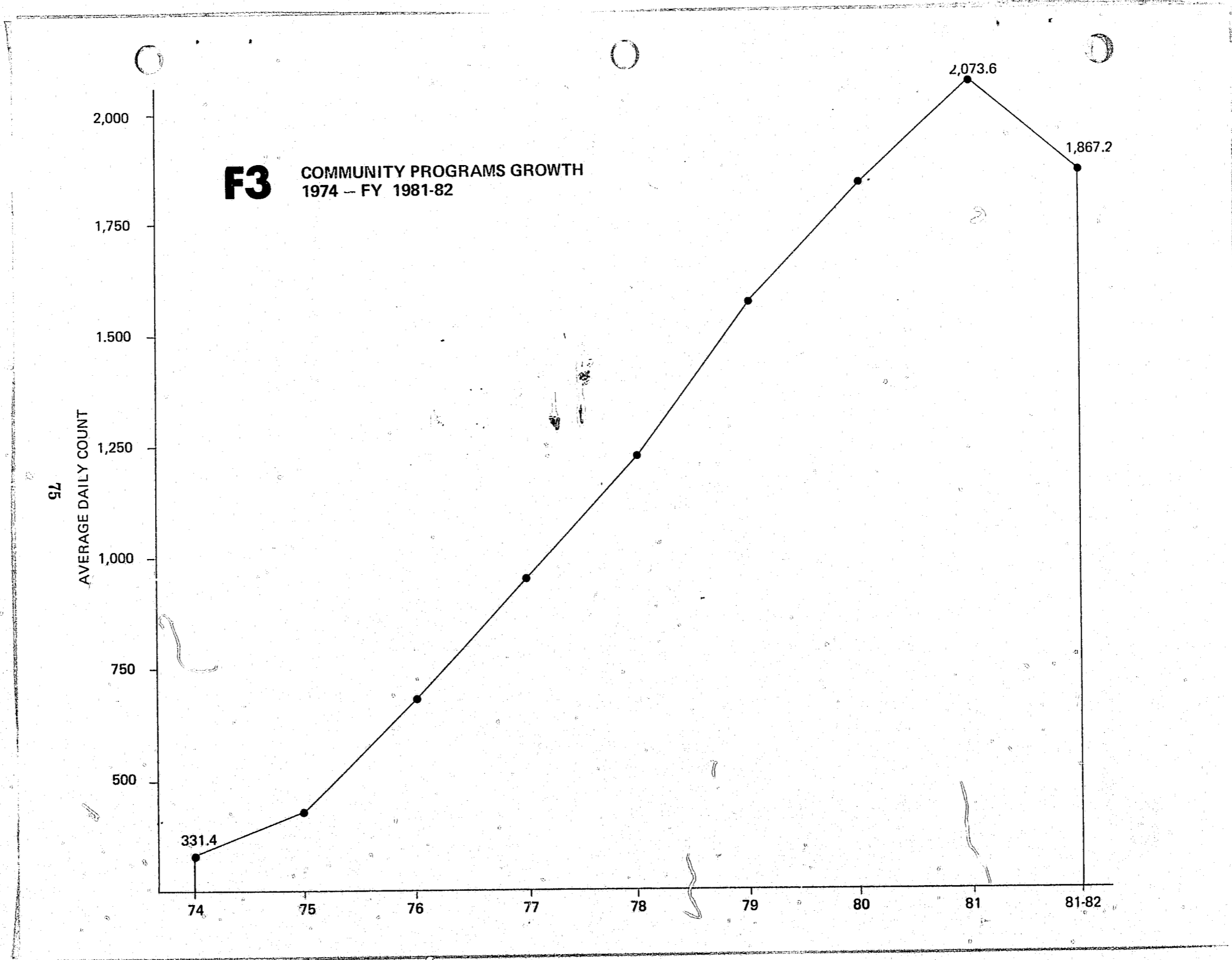

## CRP PROGRAM TERMINATIONS FY 1981-82

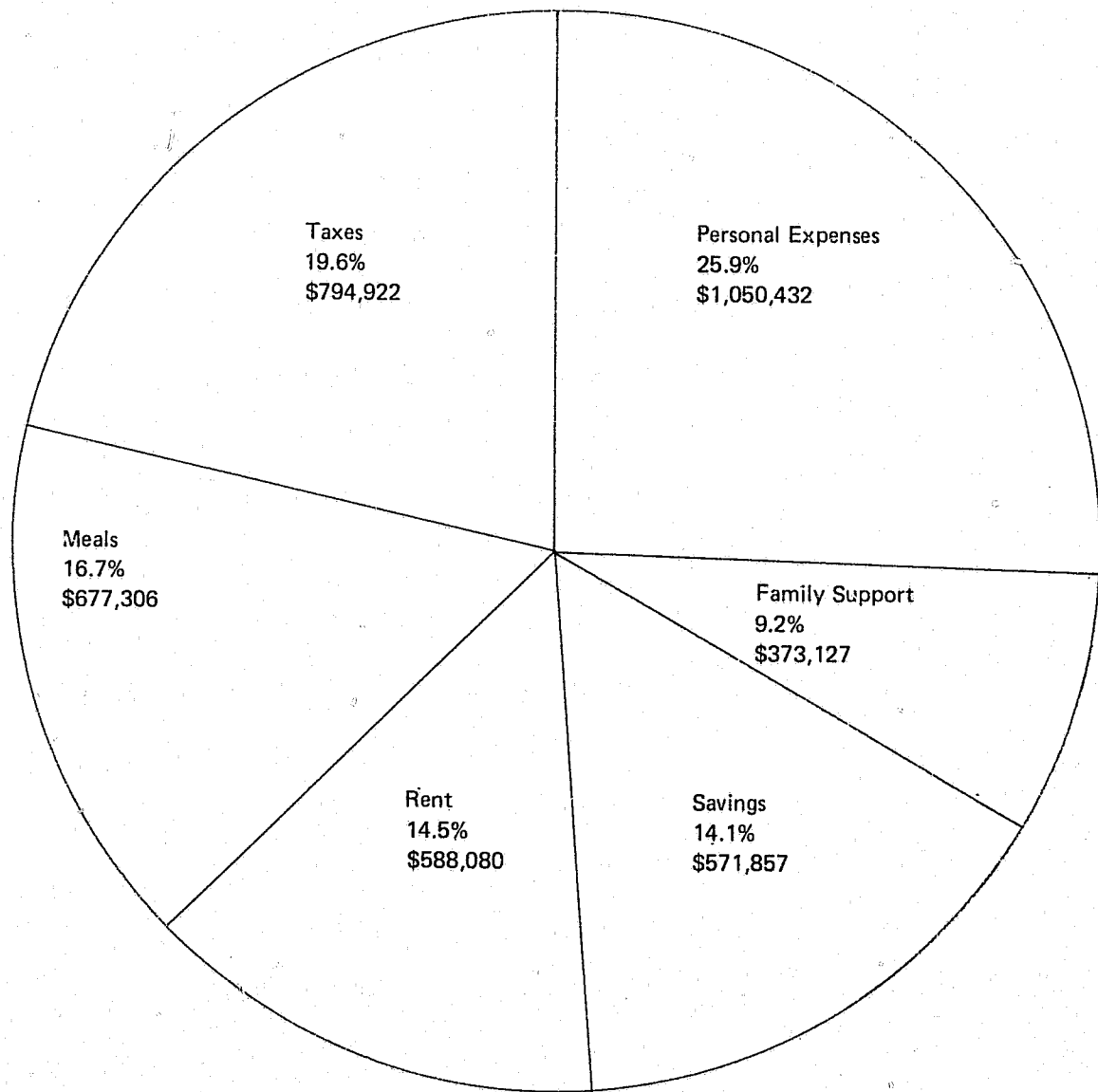

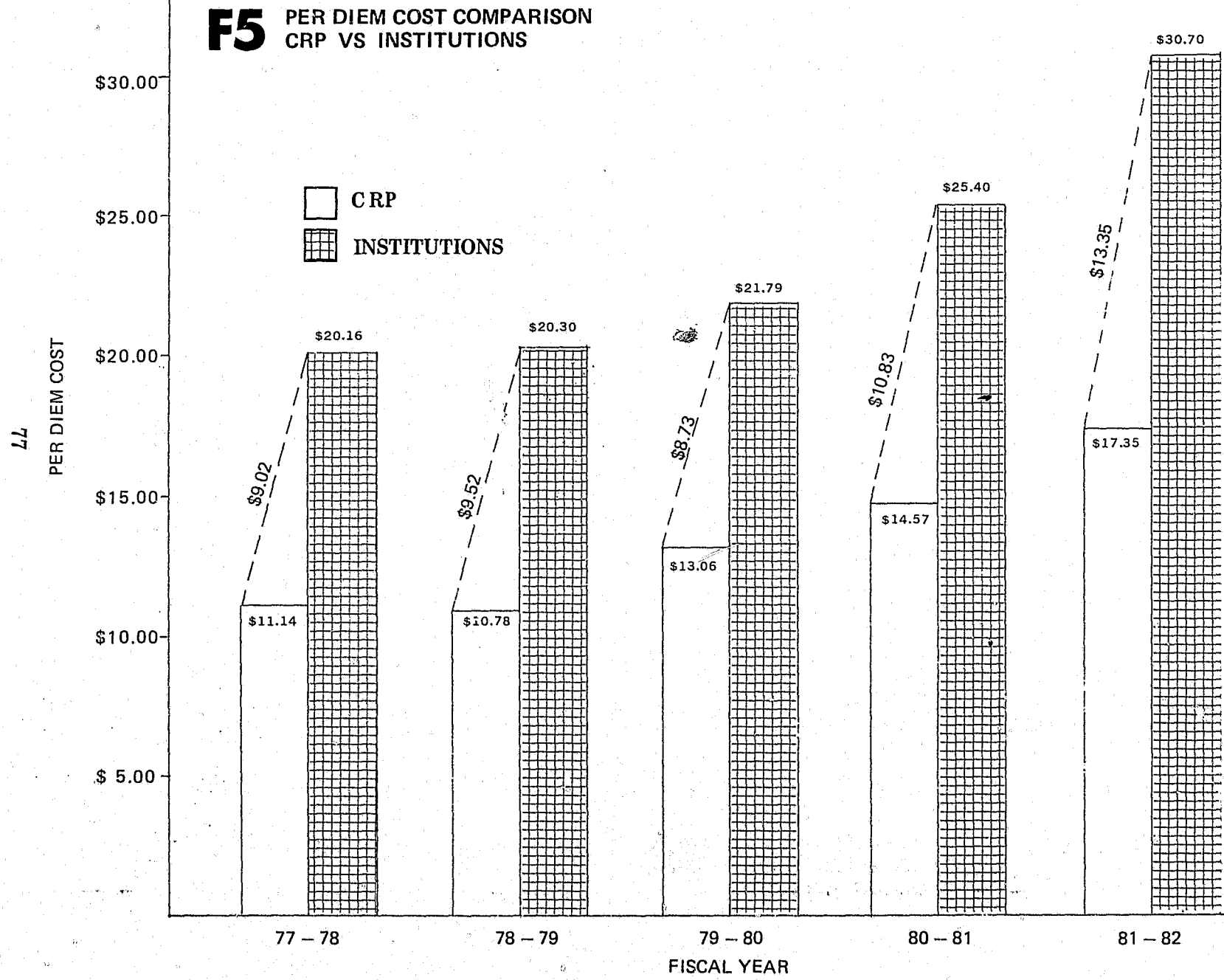

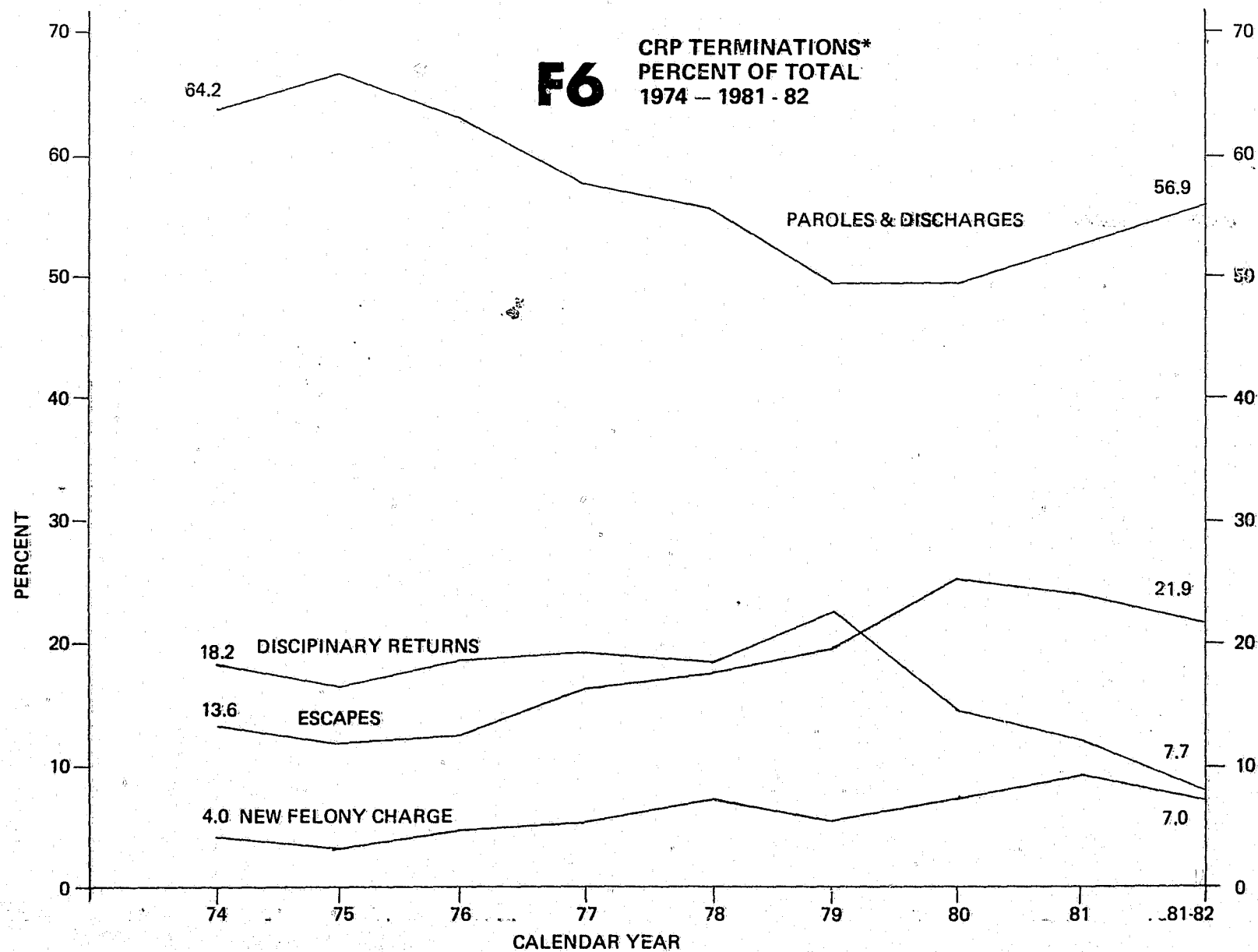
CRP PRISONER EARNINGS FY 1982-83

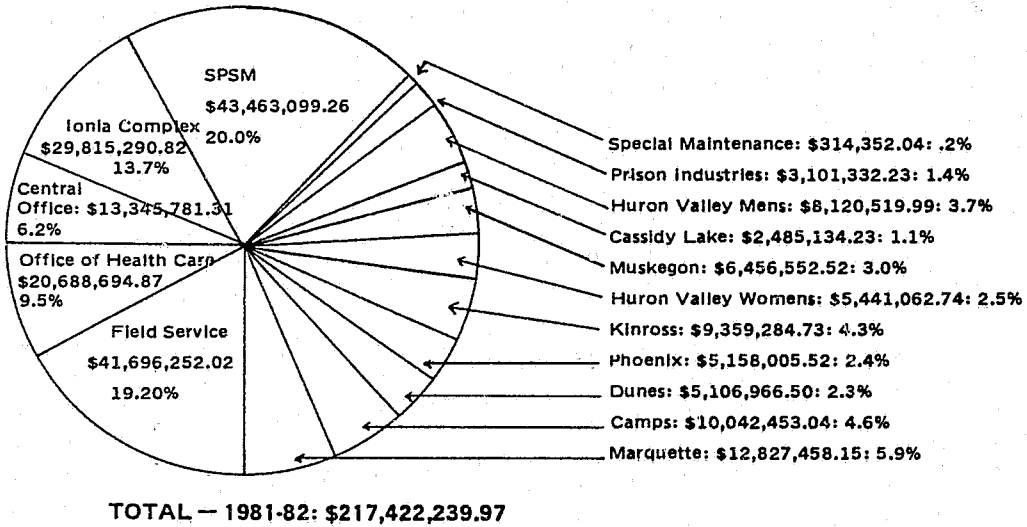
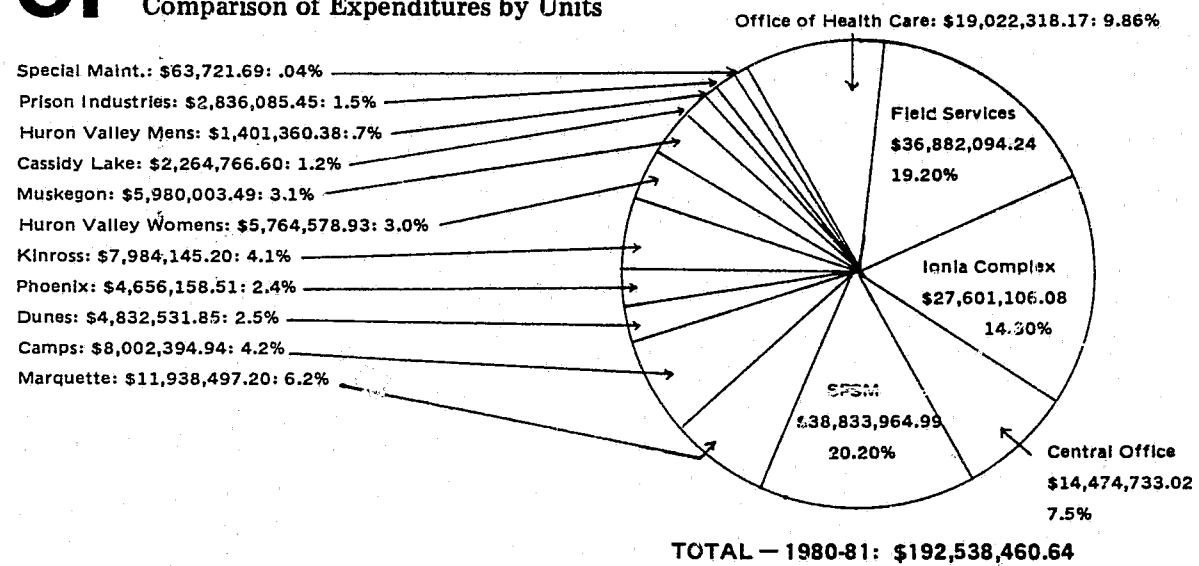

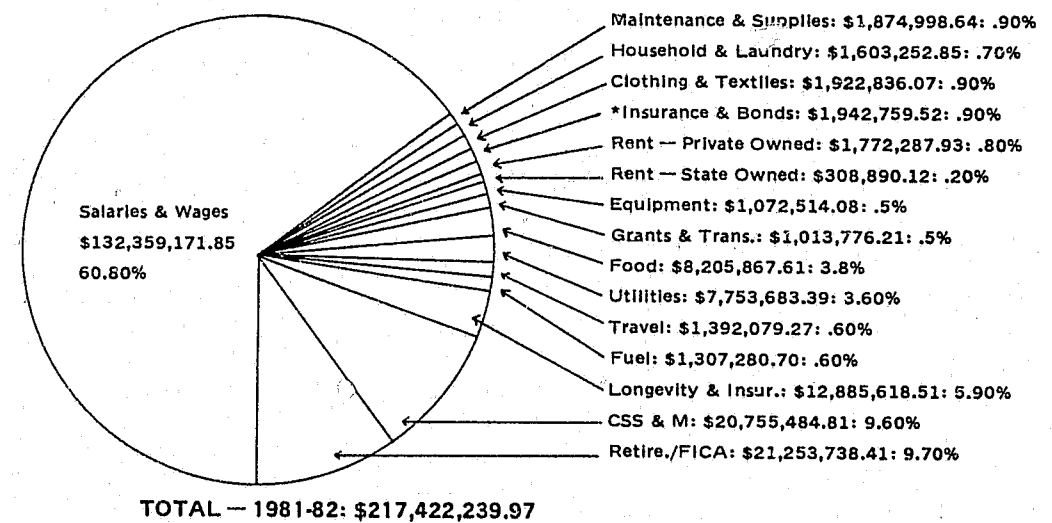
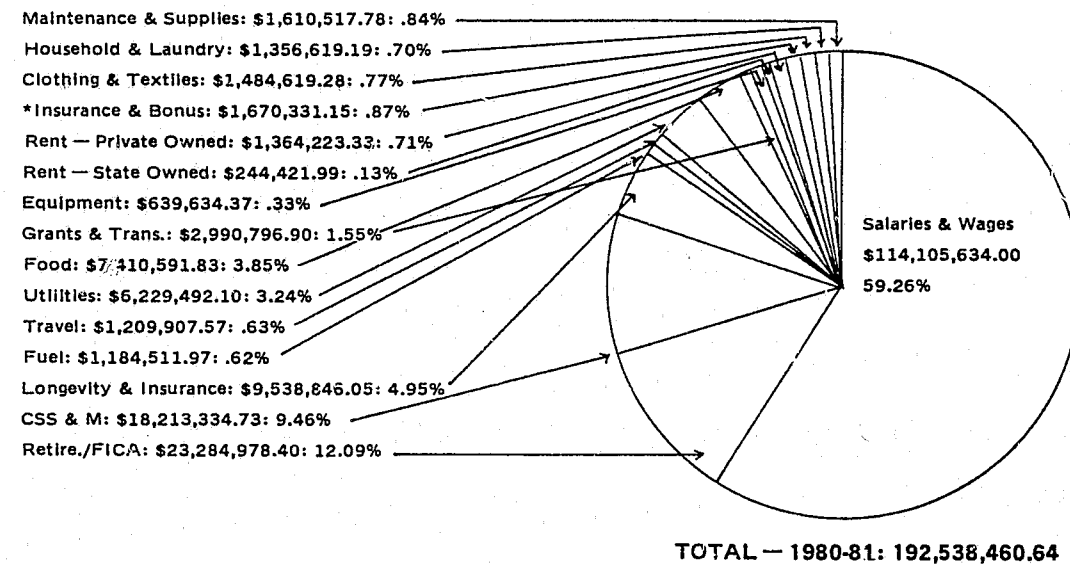

Chart H-3 lists male, female and minorities at administrative and professional levels as of December, 1982. It shows there are 501 minorities and females at these levels, most within central office and field services.

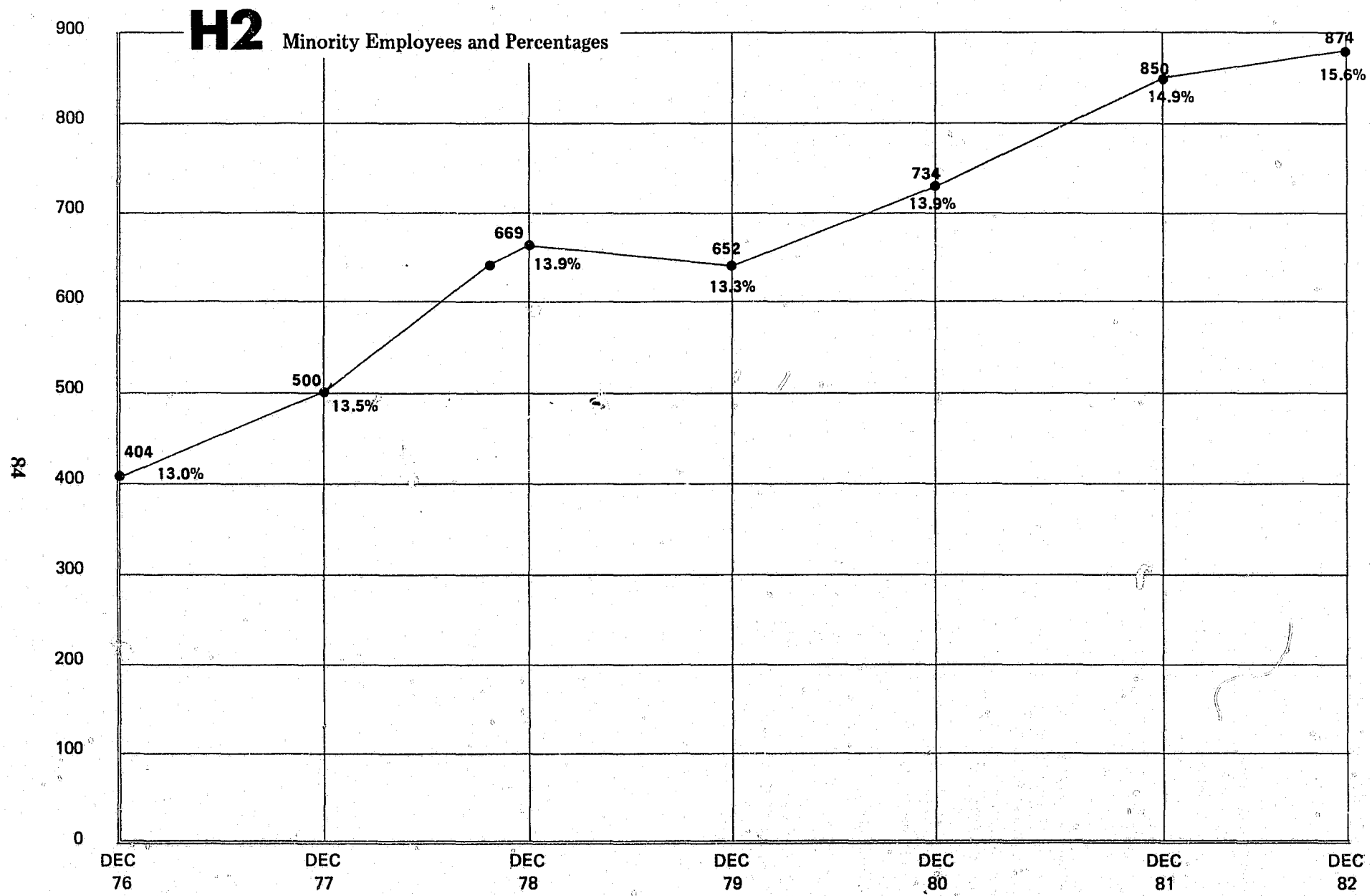

The slight decreases in 1982 reflect layoffs and hiring freezes imposed on the department because of state budget problems during the year.

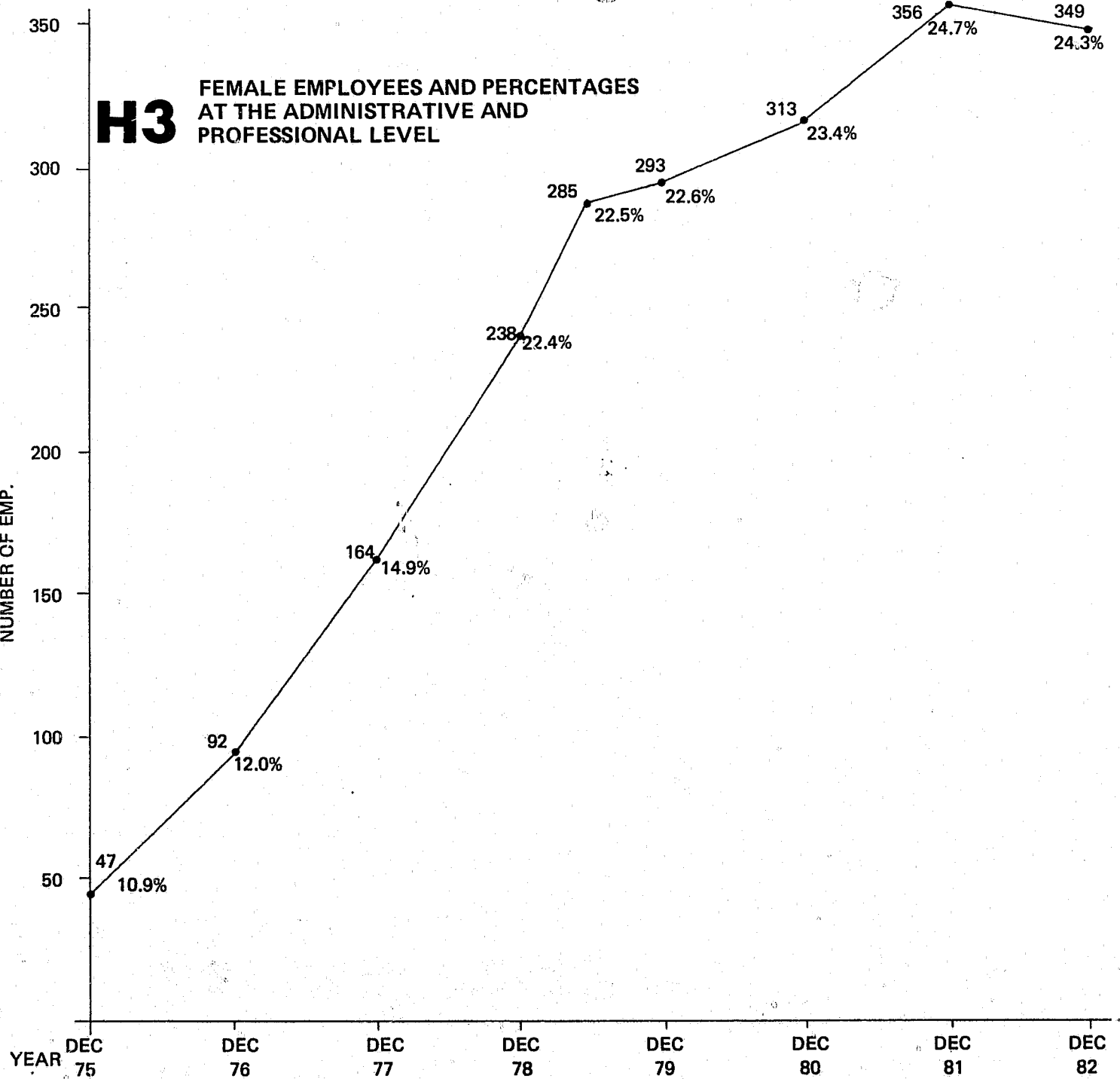

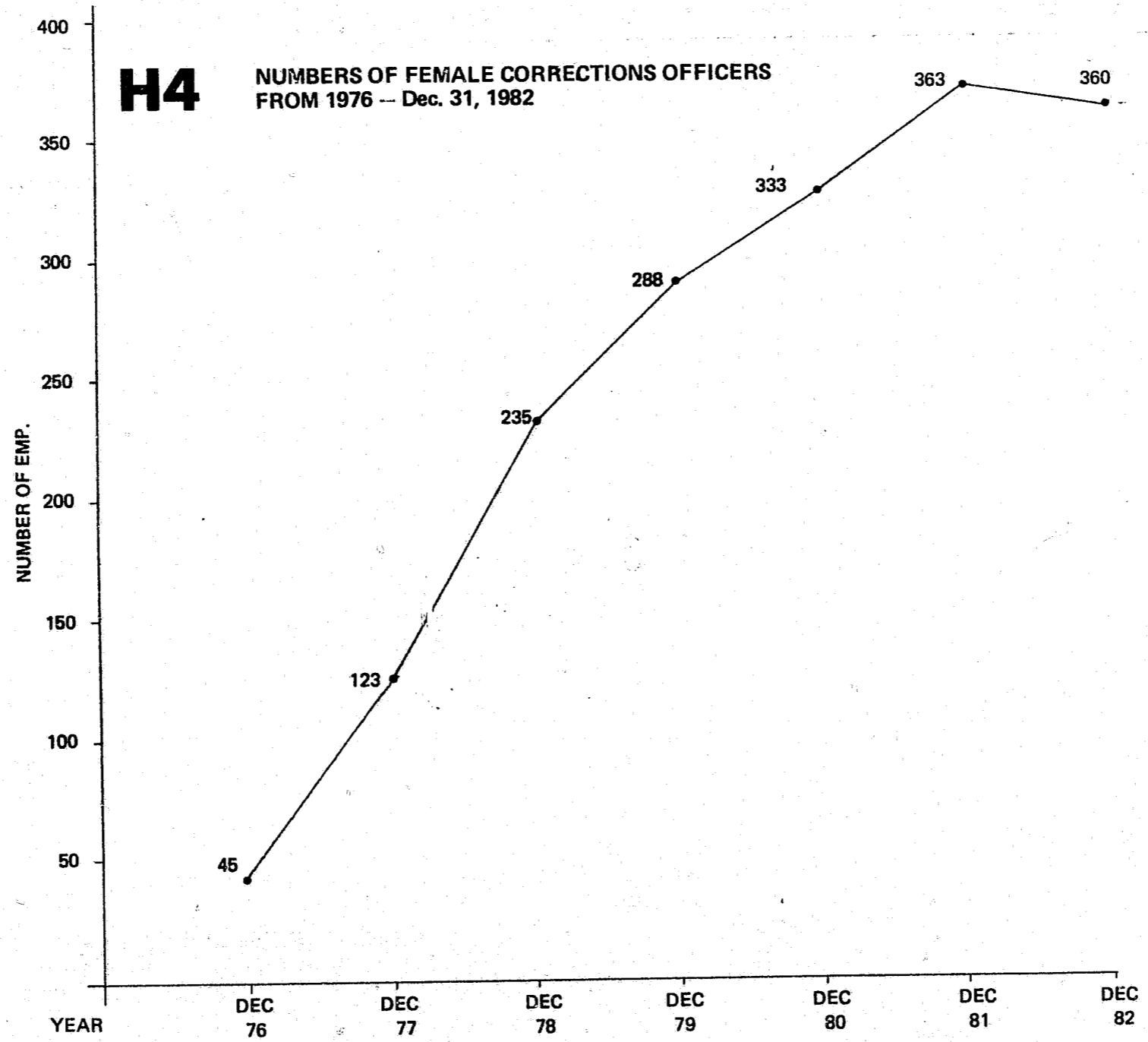
