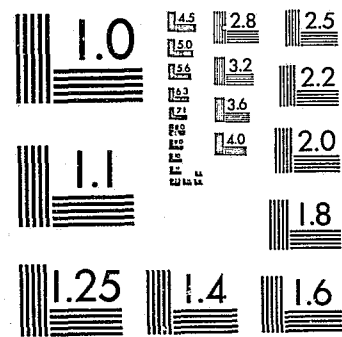

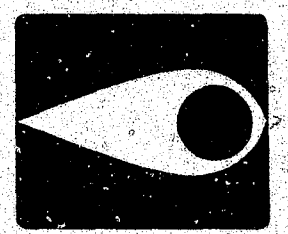

INTRODUCTION

This is the first attempt by the International Society of Crime Prevention Practitioners (ISCPP) to develop a directory of this type, and, no doubt, there is room for improvement. From this first attempt, I think ISCPP has laid the foundation for an informational resource they can build on annually or possibly biannually. Plans for the future of the Directory will be discussed during the ISCPP Annual Conference in Des Moines, Iowa, on October 4-8, 1982.

ISCPP's basic goal is to improve the quality of life by making our neighborhoods and communities safer places to live through the practice of effective crime prevention methods. Any professional organization such as ISCPP can be only as good as its membership wants it to be. This means that we must all work cooperatively and diligently to reach our goals. This Directory is but one tool among a cadre of many to help us reach our common ends: the restoration of public safety.

Background and Purpose

During the State Crime Prevention Directors' Meeting, held at the ISCPP Fourth Annual Conference in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on November 10, 1981, the idea to develop an international crime prevention directory was presented and overwhelmingly supported and approved. As Director of CALIFORNIA CRIME WATCH, I volunteered my office's resources to administer and coordinate the completion of this project.

The purpose of the Directory is to provide international crime prevention resource information in one document. The Directory can be particularly useful to any crime prevention practitioner interested in starting a crime prevention program, developing new programs, gleaning ideas for enhancing existing programs or who is just interested in what is taking place internationally in the crime prevention field.

The Directory should not by any means be considered a thorough crime prevention information resource. It will, however, provide the interested practitioner with basic information to conduct further research and, most important, to facilitate better communication among crime prevention practitioners internationally.

The Directory contains such information as the names, addresses and phone numbers of program contact persons, major programs conducted, publications and audio-visual programs developed by participating agencies, training programs available and other valuable information.

Process of Gathering Data and Response

To obtain the information contained in the Directory, it was decided the most cost-effective and efficient means would be to use a written survey questionnaire to be mailed to all state program directors, professional association presidents and international program contacts.

From contact lists provided by various sources, the questionnaire and instructions for its completion were mailed to contacts throughout the country. John Maybin, ISCPP Representative for International Region VII, graciously assisted us by mailing the questionnaire to international contacts.

It was soon learned that some programs no longer existed or were phasing out and others were in various stages of development. After literally hundreds of phone calls by dedicated staff and volunteers, we were able to identify 30 operational state administered programs in 28 states (California and Texas each have two) and 32 professional associations in 31 states (Missouri has two). John Maybin provided a list containing 16 contacts in 8 foreign countries.

Of the 30 state programs surveyed, all 30 or 100 percent responded; 22 or 69 percent of the 32 professional associations responded; and 1 country (Western Australia Police, Crime Prevention Bureau) of the 8 countries surveyed responded. Through the survey process and other means, 208 crime prevention contacts were identified (listed in the last section of the Directory) representing 46 states and 8 foreign countries.

Note: In some instances, there may be more than one contact listed for the same agency. These contacts were listed in the Directory because they were found to be particularly knowledgeable in the crime prevention field and helpful in its development.

Logos

Logos used by crime prevention programs have been a priority interest of ISCPP because of the need for crime prevention practitioners to join under one symbol that would be recognized internationally as representative of crime prevention. During the survey process, all state programs, professional associations and other countries were asked to provide copies of their logos. Where a logo was received, it is transposed on the program page in the upper right-hand corner. Where this space is blank, a logo was not received or, as explained by some program contacts, they are in the process of developing a logo.

How to Use the Directory

Because of the vastness of the information contained, it is almost impossible to index it, however the programs are divided into three sections: State Programs, Association Programs and International Programs. State Programs are crime prevention programs administered through a state governmental agency which provides crime prevention services to other governmental agencies and/or the public on a statewide basis. Association Programs are organized bodies of people consisting of professionals and/or concerned private citizens whose interest, activity or purpose is crime prevention.

One effective way to use the Directory would be for the practitioner who is researching a particular program, say, sexual assault prevention, to go through the Directory and make a note of those programs which list a sexual assault program and simply contact those program contacts by mail or phone for further information.

Note: The media programs listed for each program are those public service announcements (PSA's) or other media programs developed by the agency or association that can possibly be adapted for use by other programs.

Another purpose of the Directory is to facilitate communication among crime prevention practitioners worldwide. By adding the program contacts to your respective mailing lists and mailing newsletters and major program announcements to the new-found colleagues, we can take a giant step toward better communications and thus help to spread the crime prevention message worldwide.

Our special and grateful thanks are extended to those members of ISCPP who put forth the extra effort to make the completion of this Directory possible. By responding to the questionnaire and the many follow-up phone calls, you have provided a valuable public service and helped ISCPP take one step closer toward helping to restore public safety.
