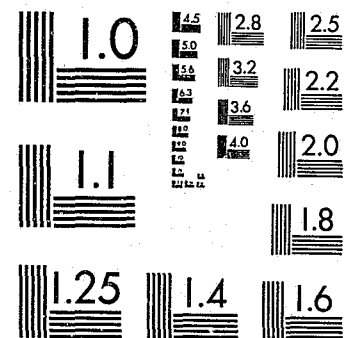

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CRIME IN KANSAS

SUMMARY 1981

- * Crime Index Offenses increased from 125,877 in 1980 to 128,370 in 1981, an increase of 2.0%.
- * Violent Crimes decreased by 3.2%, from 9,107 in 1980 to 8,814 in 1981.
 - Murder and non-negligent manslaughter decreased 6.9%, from 160 to 149.
 - Rape reflected a slight decrease of 1.6%, from 741 in 1980 to 729 in 1981.
 - Robbery decreased from 2,658 in 1980 to 2,605 in 1981, or 2.0%.
 - Aggravated assault went down from 5,548 in 1980 to 5,331 in 1981, a decrease of 3.9%.
- * Property Crimes increased by 2.4% in 1981, from 116,770 to 119,556.
 - Burglary increased from 35,649 to 36,656, an increment of 2.8%.
 - Larceny (theft) increased from 74,750 to 76,845, an increase of 2.8%.
 - Motor vehicle theft decreased from 6,371 to 6,055, or 5.0%.
 - Arsons reported to UCR decreased from 1,313 in 1980 to 985 in 1981, a decrease of 25.0%.
- * The value of property stolen in 1981 totaled \$57,074,478, an increase of 5.2% compared to \$54,265,504 in 1980.
- * The value of property recovered in 1981 amounted to \$16,352,137, a 4.7% decrease from 1980.
- * Arrests totaled 75,499 in 1981 compared to 75,567 in 1980.
 - There were 18,434 arrests for Crime Index Offenses.
 - There were 57,065 arrests for Class II Offenses.

On July 11, 1981, Kansas had the misfortune to lose a 22-year veteran officer of the Kansas Highway Patrol. Trooper Ferdinand F. "Bud" Pribbenow, age 47, was fatally wounded after stopping a suspect for speeding on the Kansas Turnpike near Wichita, Kansas. A suspect was apprehended later that day and was subsequently charged with first-degree murder in the slaying of the officer.

Trooper Pribbenow's many years of dedicated service to the citizens of the State of Kansas will long be remembered.

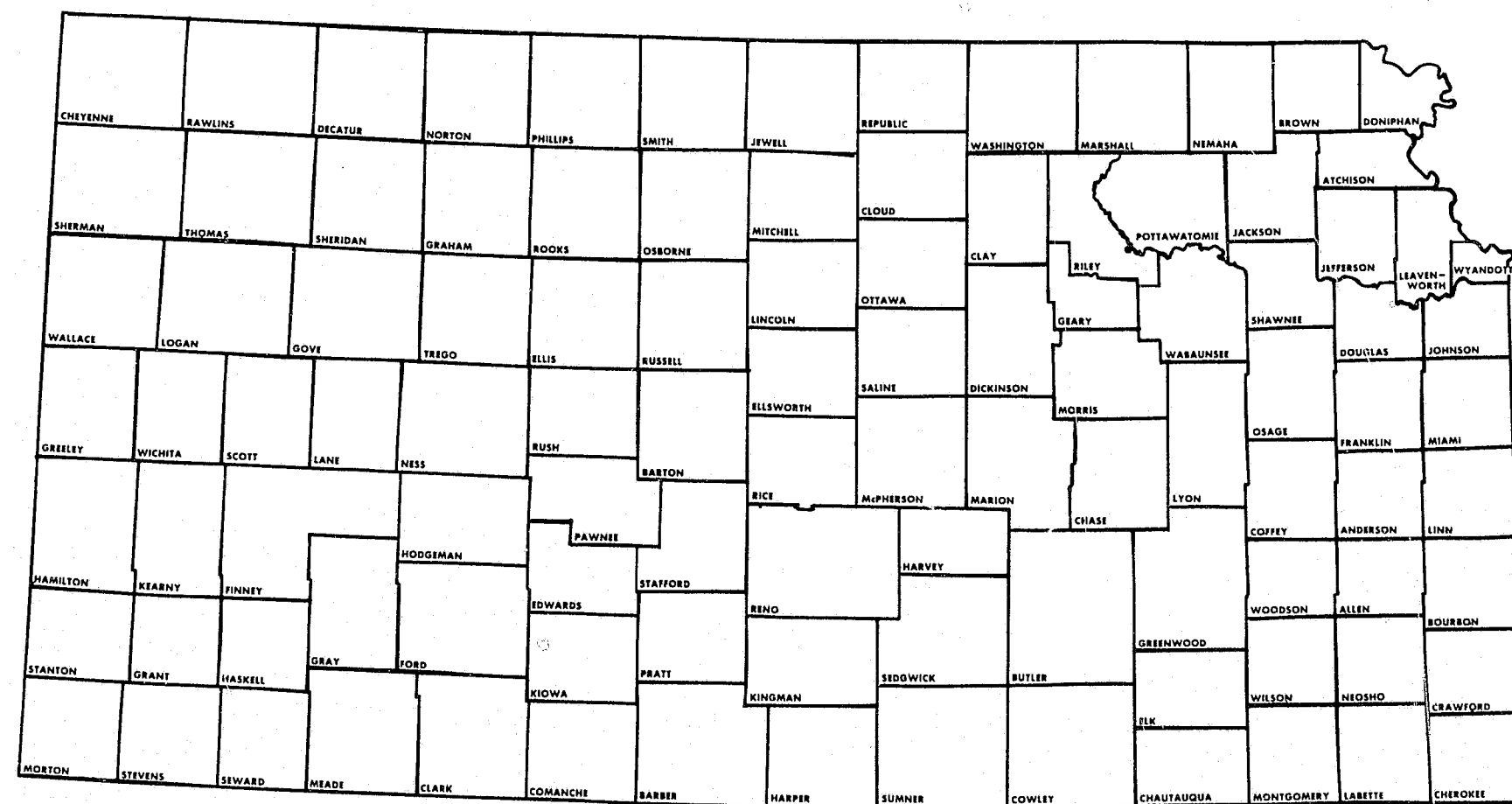
- * One law enforcement officer was killed in the line of duty in 1981.
- * Assaults on law enforcement officers totaled 1,342 in 1981, an increase of 7.9% over 1980.
- * Law enforcement agencies employed 5,089 full-time people in 1981.
 There were 3,942 full-time sworn officers.
 There were 1,147 full-time civilian employees.

The 1981 publication of the annual Uniform Crime Report, "Crime in Kansas," represents the first publication produced by the Statistical Analysis Center since being transferred to the Kansas Bureau of Investigation. SAC has been combined with the Uniform Crime Reporting section but will continue working with all functional areas of the justice community in Kansas.

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INTRODUCTION

CHAPTER 1
INTRODUCTION

The federally administered Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program came about due to the realization by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) of the need for standardized statistical data concerning crime. In 1930, congressional approval was given the FBI to serve as the national clearinghouse for statistical information on crime. In 1974, the State of Kansas established a program housed within the Kansas Bureau of Investigation which still remains an active contributor to the national UCR program.

Guidelines established by the IACP directed that seven crimes, selected for their severity, frequency and probability of being reported to law enforcement agencies, be included in the Crime Index. These seven offenses were murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft. In 1978, Congress mandated that arson become the eighth crime index offense; however, to date all arson data is collected in a supplemental manner. All other offenses are considered "Class II" or "Part II" crimes.

The Crime Index is broken into two categories, Violent Crimes and Property Crimes. Violent crimes (all committed within the presence of a victim) consist of murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery and aggravated assault. Property crimes include burglary, larceny (theft), motor vehicle theft and arson, again with arson being tabulated separately.

Many times multiple-offense situations will occur; however, for UCR purposes, only the most serious crime is tallied. This is done accord-

ing to the "hierarchy rule", established by the FBI, where priority goes to violent crimes, followed sequentially by the property crimes and then Class II offenses. The only exception is in the case of arson. When an arson occurs, both the arson and the most severe additional crime committed in conjunction with the arson are counted.

"Clearances occur when an offense is 'solved' for crime reporting purposes," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 40). An offense is cleared when at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court or when law enforcement officers have the basis for taking such action, but are prevented from doing so by extenuating circumstances. If the arrest of one person clears several offenses each cleared offense is tallied.

When one arrest results in charges for several offenses only one charge is recorded as an arrest for the Uniform Crime Report, that charge being determined by the hierarchy rule. If one person is arrested several times during a reporting period each separate arrest is tallied. If several persons are arrested for one crime the arrest of each person is tabulated.

Readers of this publication are asked to recognize the many variables involved when attempting to do agency-to-agency comparisons. Factors to take into consideration are:

- Strength and effectiveness of law enforcement agencies;
- Administrative and investigative emphases and law enforcement policies;
- Prosecutorial, judicial, correctional, and probational policies;
- Socioeconomic factors;
- Seasonality.

Only those offenses reported to law enforcement authorities are tallied; however, the rate of report of crime varies with the type of crime, sociological factors, and monetary concerns. Changes in record-keeping over time contribute to inaccuracies in trend data, even when the changes may represent overall improvements in the quality of the statistics.

Kansas currently has two statutes which require local law enforcement agencies to report statistical and offense data. K.S.A. 21-2501a mandates local agencies to submit Standard Offense Reports to the KBI on all felonies and all misdemeanors or other offenses pertaining to narcotics violations. K.S.A. 21-2504 empowers the Attorney General to collect statistical data from the clerks of district courts, sheriffs, police departments, and county attorneys in order to determine the true crime situation.

The data in this publication represent what is reported to the KBI by approximately 240 law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Kansas. Their efforts in providing this data in an accurate and timely manner have allowed the Kansas UCR program to be one of the more accomplished and efficient state programs.

CHAPTER 2

CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

The Crime Index, as referred to in this publication, consists of seven offense categories, murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft. Arson is considered the eighth crime index offense; however, arson offense data is collected and presented in a supplemental manner. The Committee on Uniform Crime Reports of the International Association of Chiefs of Police selected these offenses because of their severity, frequency of occurrence, and the likelihood of them being reported to law enforcement agencies.

In 1981 there were 128,370 Crime Index offenses resulting in a property loss of \$57,074,478. Recovered property by law enforcement agencies amounted to \$16,352,137, or 28.7% of the total property stolen. There were 25,064 reports of clearances of Crime index offenses in 1981; however, it should be noted that clearances may be shown for previously reported offenses and therefore will not reflect which particular offense is being cleared.

1975 - 1984

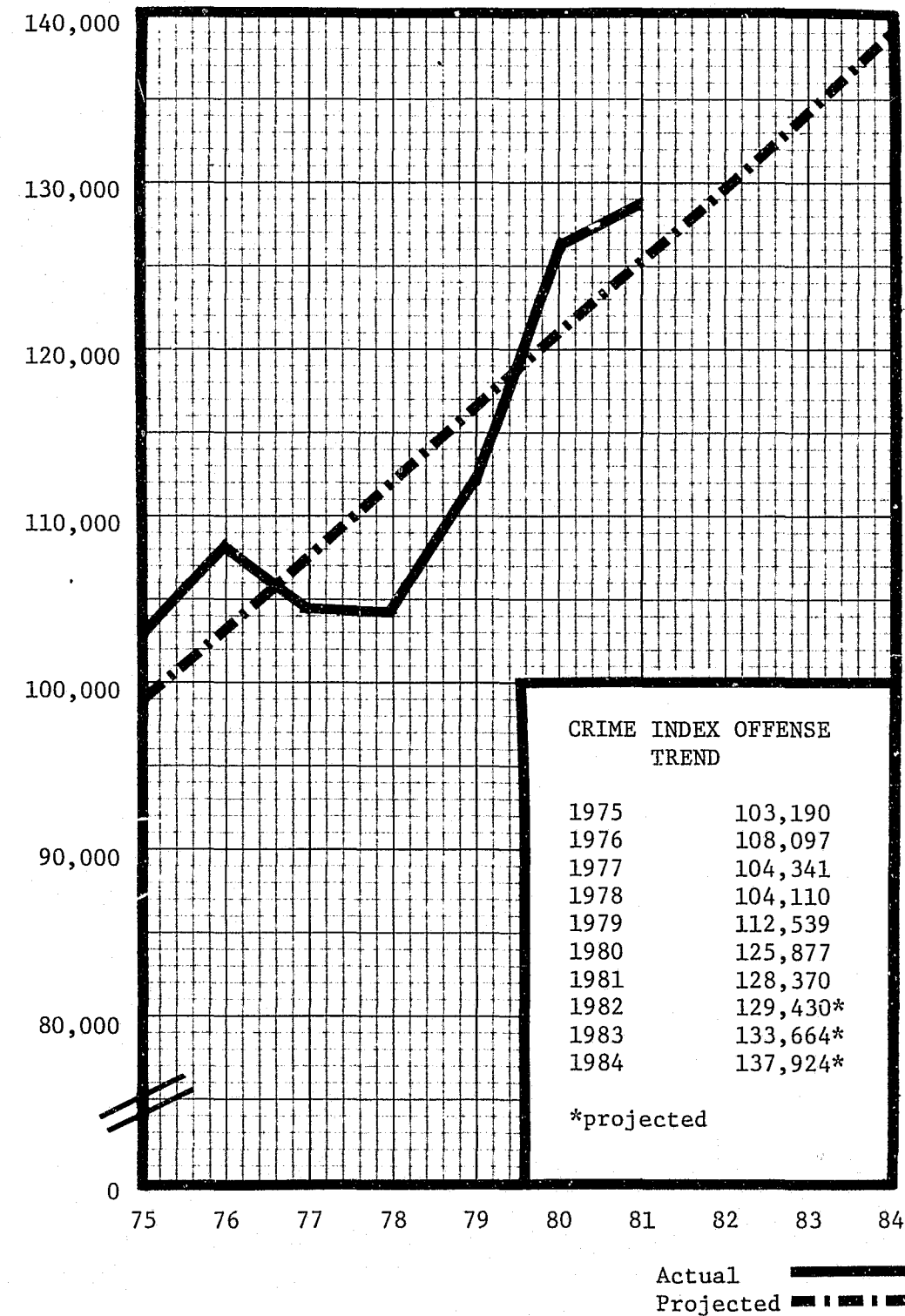

1981

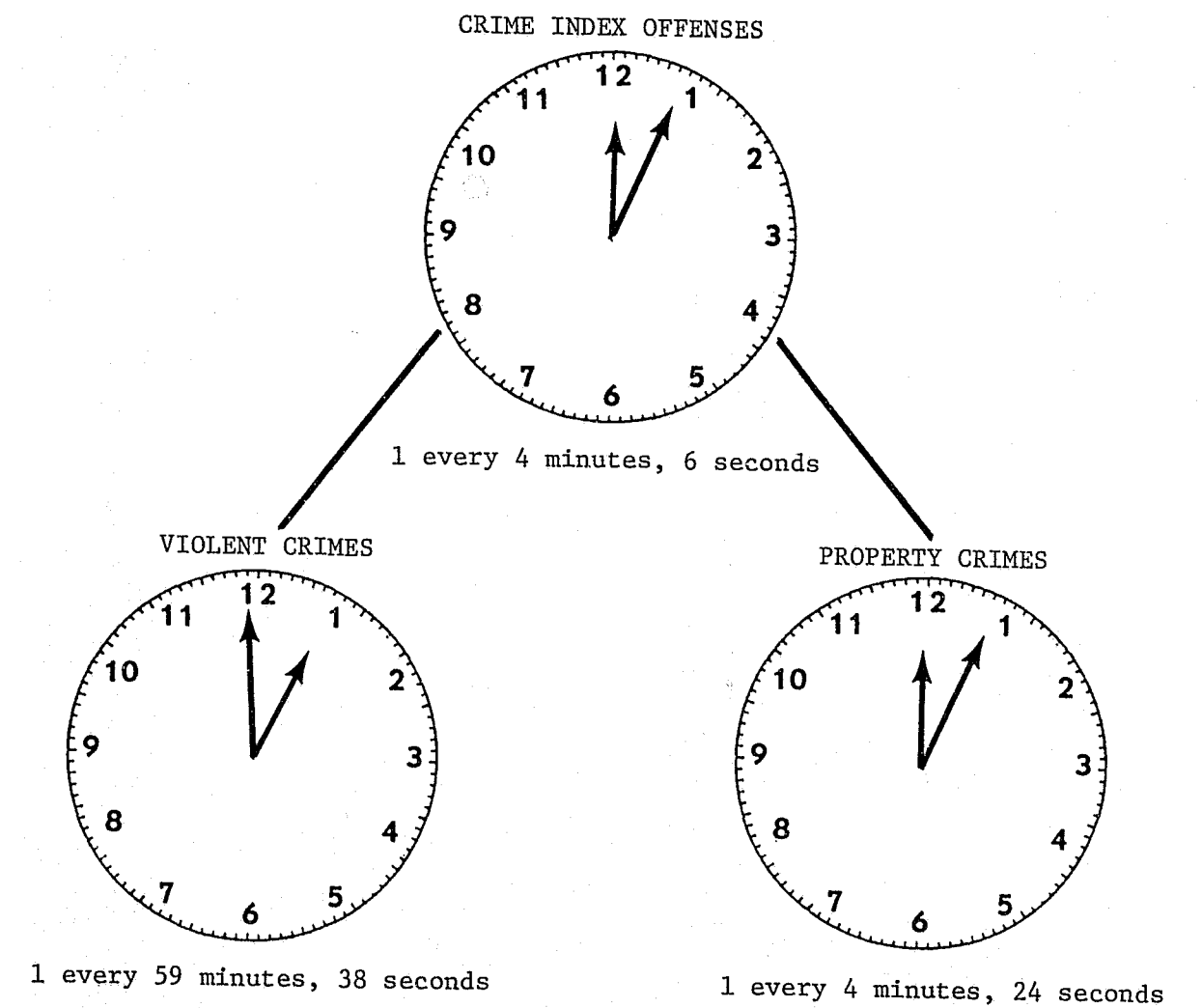


FIGURE 3

1981

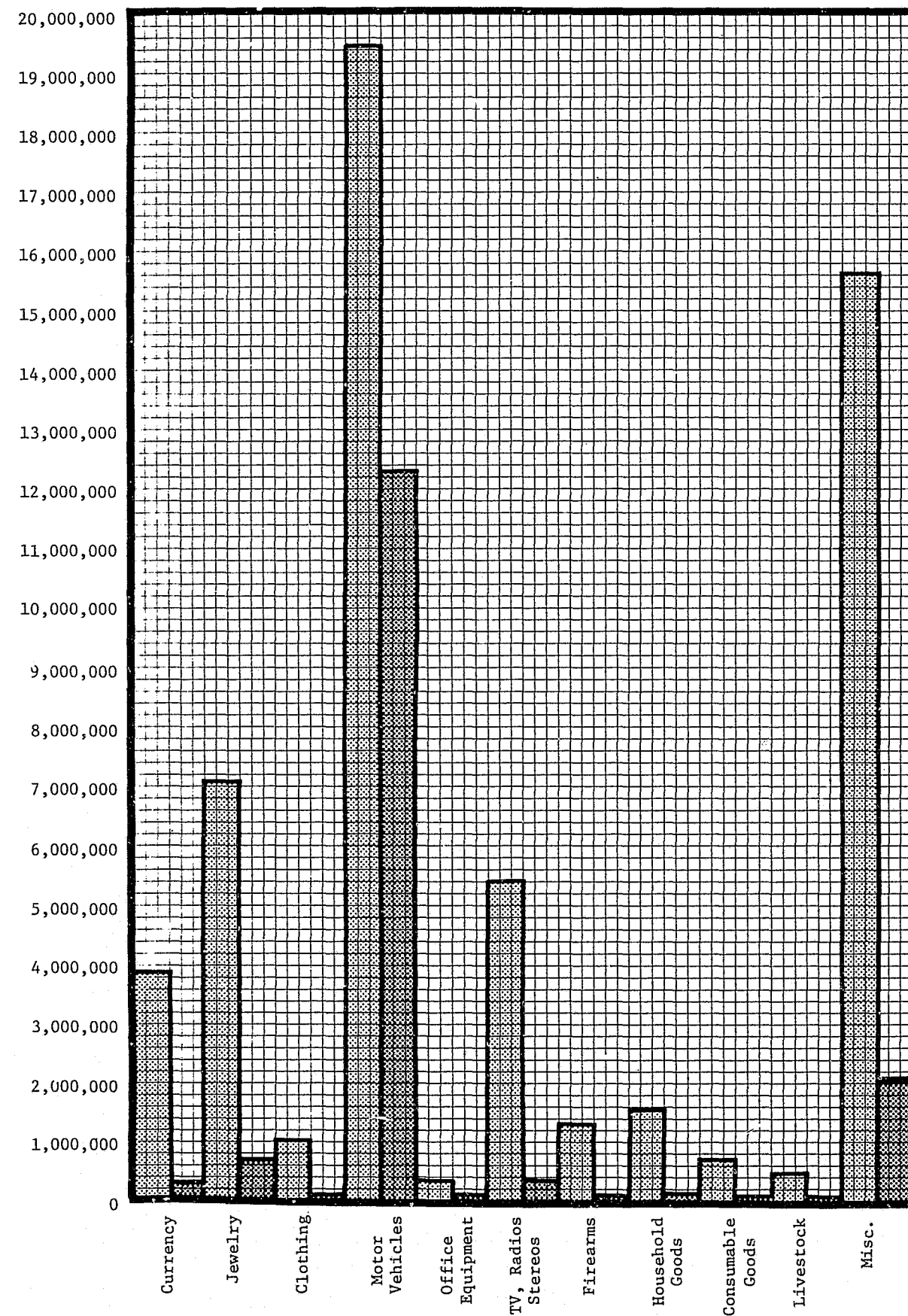

CHAPTER 3

VIOLENT CRIMES

Violent Crimes consist of four offenses: murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. These offenses are unique in that the victim is present as well as the threat of force by the perpetrator.

All violent crime categories experienced a decrease in 1981 over 1980. There were 8,814 Violent Crimes in 1981, 3.73 per 1,000 people, with a property loss amount of \$1,066,222. Violent Crime clearances totaled 4,664, a slight decrease from 4,681 in 1980.

The cities with populations greater than 10,000 experienced 80.3% of the state's violent crime total, as well as accounting for 86.4% of the total value of property stolen during violent crimes. By the same token, these cities were responsible for 74.1% of the violent crime clearances.

Figure 4 shows the trend of violent crime in Kansas from 1975 to 1981 with projections through 1984.

Figure 5 shows the frequency of occurrence of each violent crime category in 1981.

1975 - 1984

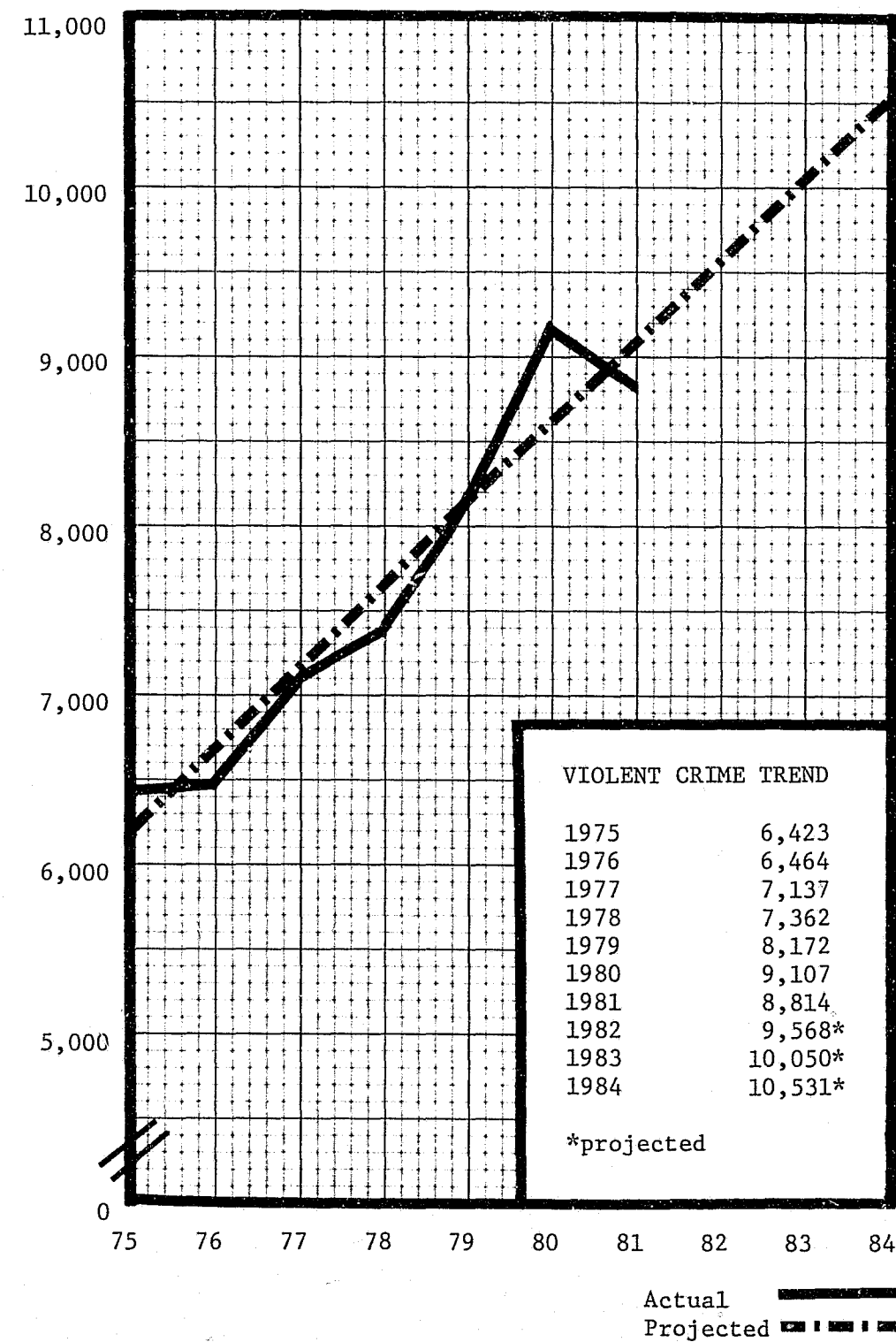
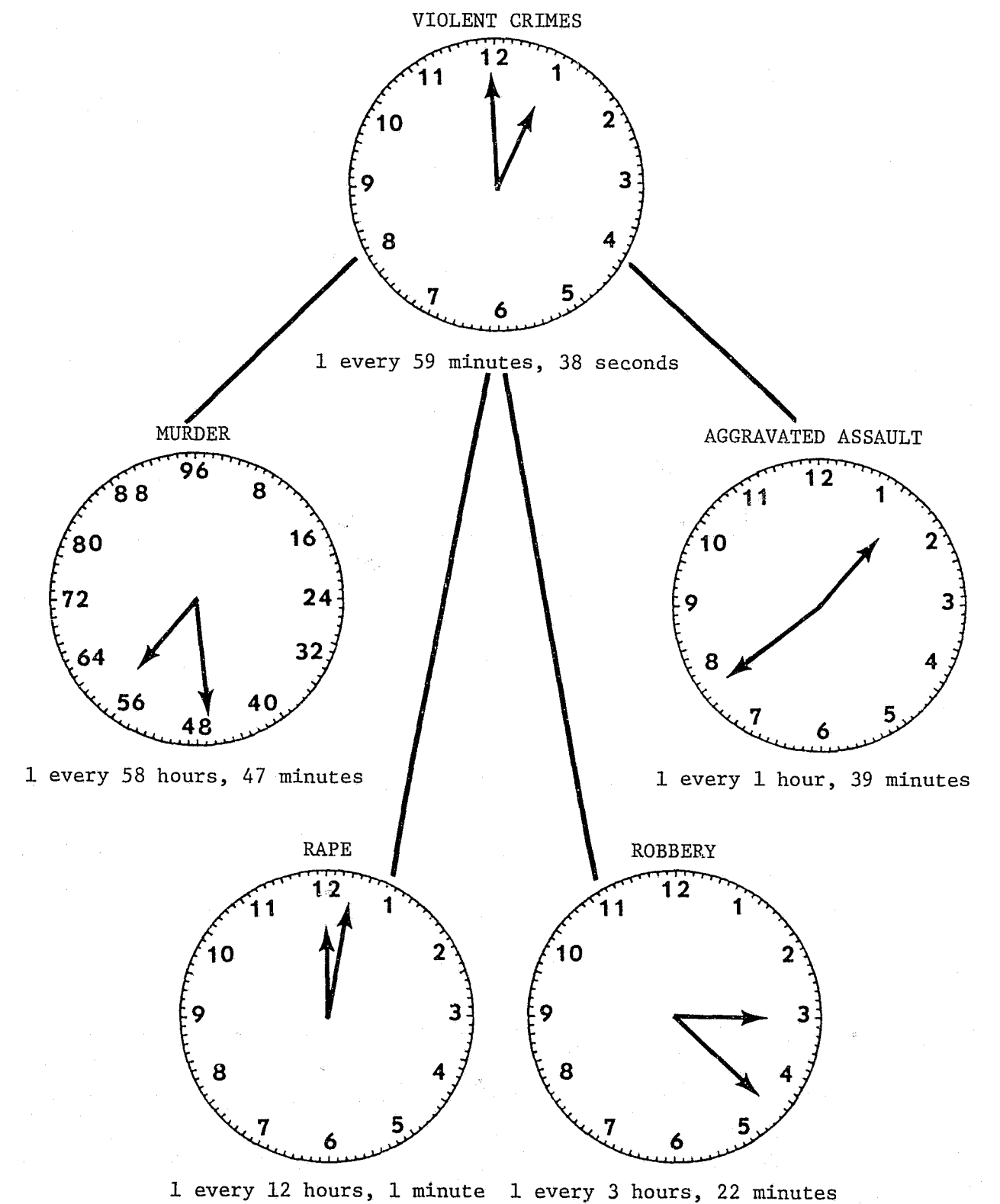

CHAPTER 4

MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER

Kansas Statutes define murder and non-negligent manslaughter as follows:

"Murder in the first degree is the killing of a human being committed maliciously, willfully, deliberately and with premeditation or committed in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate any felony," (K.S.A. 21-3401).

"Murder in the second degree is the malicious killing of a human being, committed without deliberation or premeditation and not in the perpetration or attempt to perpetrate a felony," (K.S.A. 21-3402).

"Voluntary manslaughter is the unlawful killing of a human being, without malice, which is done intentionally upon a sudden quarrel or in the heat of passion," (K.S.A. 21-3403).

In 1981, murders reflected the largest decrease (6.9%) of any other violent crime category, dropping from 160 in 1980 to 149 in 1981. Of the 149 murders 26.2% were family related and 19.5% of the total murders were committed during the act of another felony, such as rape, robbery, etc. Some type of firearm was used in 66.4% of the murders in 1981. Characteristics such as age, sex and race of victim and offender are collected if it is known at the time of reporting to the KBI. This data is reflected in the tables following.

NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER

Negligent manslaughter is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as "the killing of another person through gross negligence," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 9). There were six instances of negligent manslaughter in 1981, all involving one victim-one offender situations. The victims' ages ranged from 15 to 72; offenders' ages ranged from 9 to 60. In the six instances of negligent manslaughter four of the victims were males, two were females; likewise four offenders were males, two were females.

In one case the victim and offender were strangers, two were family-related and in three situations the victim and offender were acquaintances. Five victims were killed by individuals handling firearms and one by personal weapons.

JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE

Justifiable homicide is defined as:

1. The killing of a felon by a peace officer in the line of duty,
2. The killing (during the commission of a felony) of a felon by a private citizen." (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 6)

Eleven justifiable homicides occurred in 1981, all involving one victim-one offender situations. Victims' ages ranged from 18 to 43; all were male. Six victims were white, four were black and one was an American Indian. Perpetrators' ages ranged from 20-52 with nine males and two females. Eight of the perpetrators were white, three were black. Of the eleven justifiable homicides, six were committed by law enforcement officers in the line of duty and five were committed by private citizens. Seven of the victims were killed while in the commission of a felony, two were attacking police officers, one was killed while police were responding to a domestic disturbance and one was killed resisting arrest. Seven were strangers to their victims and four were acquaintances. Firearms were used in ten of the eleven instances, with a knife being used in the other situation.

1975 - 1984

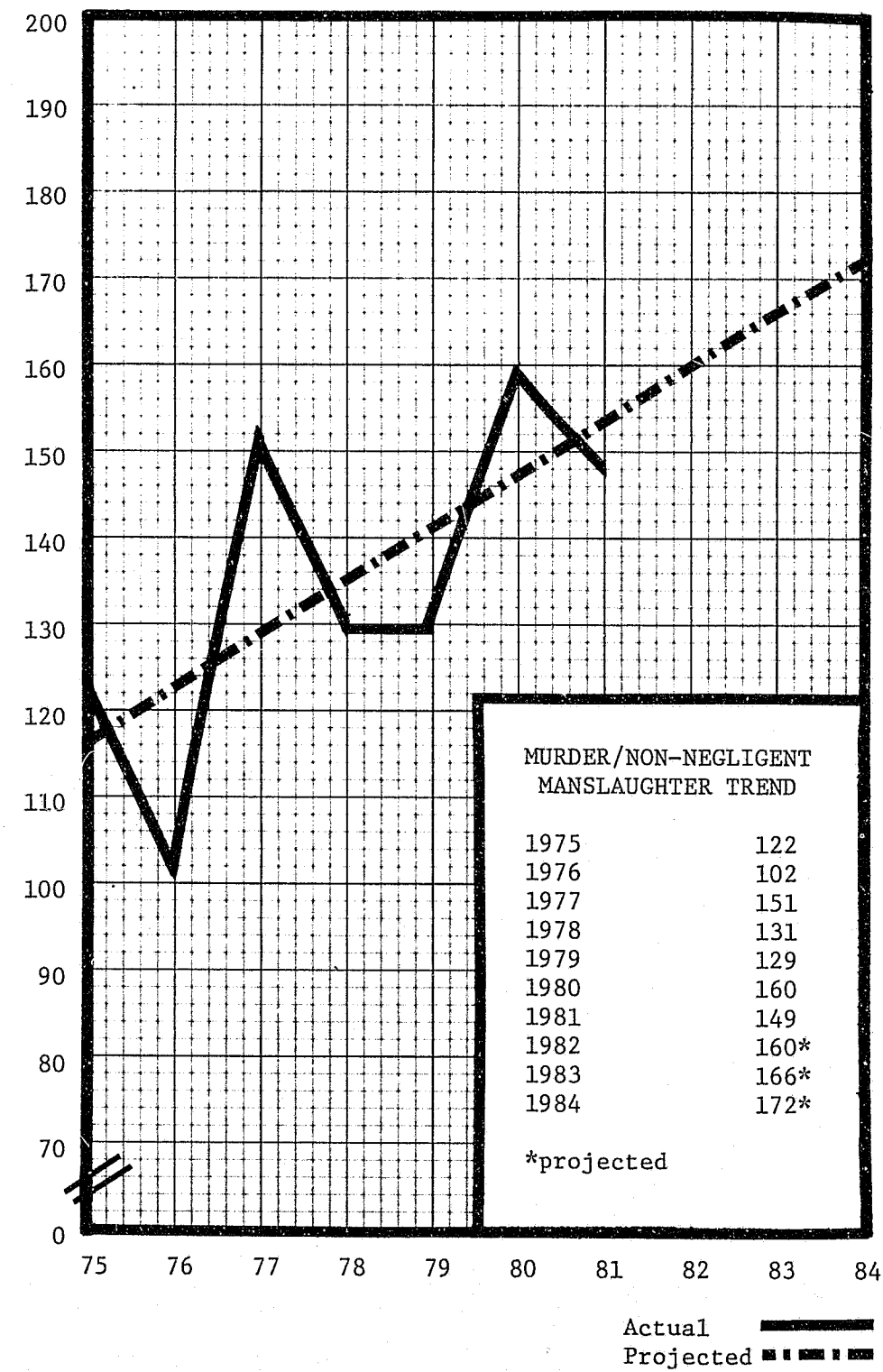

CHAPTER 5

RAPE

K.S.A. 21-3502 defines rape as:

"...the act of sexual intercourse committed by a man with a woman not his wife, and without her consent..."

The Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook defines rape as "the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will."

In 1981 the Kansas Uniform Crime Reporting program initiated a supplemental rape program whereby additional data is collected on each reported rape much like the data furnished in the instances of homicides. This additional data has provided a wealth of information in studying the circumstances of rapes occurring in the state.

Kansas experienced a slight decrease of 1.6% in reported rapes in 1981 from 1980. Of the 729 rapes reported to law enforcement agencies, 564 (77.4%) were actual rapes, while 165 were classified as attempted rapes.

Information was collected by the "type of location" of the assault (where the actual assault took place) and in this situation better than half (51.6%) of the total rapes occurred in a residence, 232 at the victim's residence while 58 occurred at the suspect's residence. The next most frequent location was that of a vehicle where 122 assaults took place, 12 in the victim's vehicle, 76 in the suspect's vehicle. Thirty-four reports did not specify which vehicle was involved.

According to Table 18 rapes occurring by month were fairly constant with most rapes occurring in June and the least number of rapes occurring in December. A little more than one-third (35.0%) of all rapes occurred

between the hours of midnight and 4:00 a.m. Of the 729 rapes, one-third involved the use of personal weapons (hands, feet, and fists) while in 38.0% of the rapes no weapon was involved. Medical attention was received by 469 victims of rape.

In 413 offenses the victim and offenders were strangers. In 237 situations victim and offenders were acquaintances and rapes involving family members accounted for 34 or 5.0% of the total rapes. Most instances of rape (80.7%) were a single victim-single offender situation; single victim multiple offenders situations totaled 95 or 13.0% of all rapes.

Of the total victims, 586 (80.4%) were white females and 129 (17.7%) were black females, 4 were Indian and 10 victims were Asian. Of the offenders 411 (57.9%) were white males, while 262 (35.9%) were black males. The average victim's age was twenty-four.

1975 - 1984

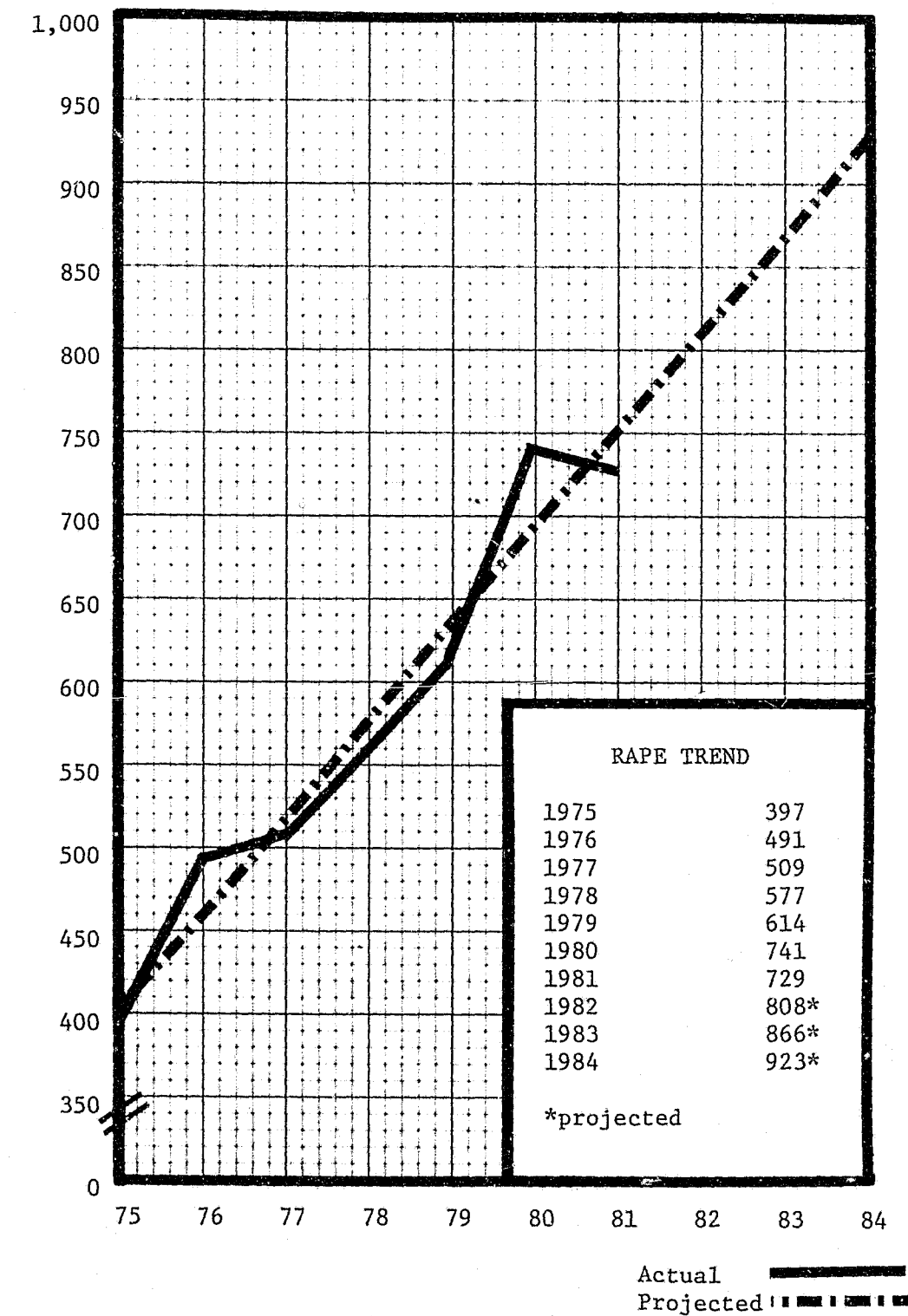

CHAPTER 6

ROBBERY

Kansas Statute 21-3426 defines robbery as:

"the taking of property from the person or presence of another by threat of bodily harm to his person or the person of another or by force."

This definition corresponds with UCR guidelines for robberies.

In 1981 there were 2,605 robberies, a decrease of 2.0% from 1980. The property loss to the above robberies totaled \$1,038,118. Table 1 reflects seven breakdowns of robbery and their total loss per category.

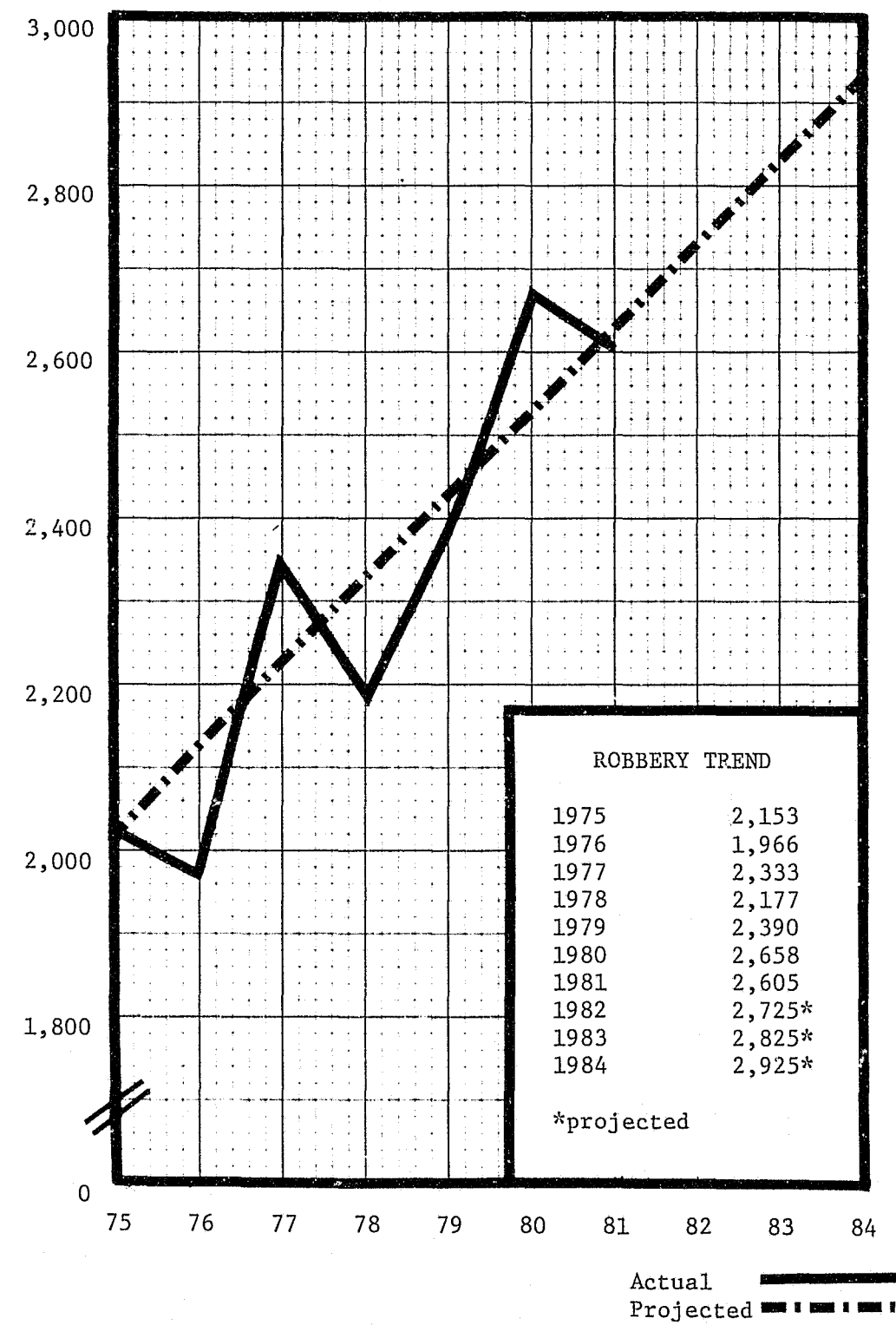
Highway robberies, those robberies committed outside of structures, constituted 38.9% of all robberies and were responsible for nearly one-fourth the value of property stolen in all robberies.

Ninety-two percent of all robberies occurred in cities with populations greater than 10,000 with a property loss of \$912,763.

CHAPTER 7

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated assault is defined in Kansas under K.S.A. 21-3410 as:

- "(a) Unlawfully assaulting or striking at another with a deadly weapon; or
- (b) Committing assault by threatening or menacing another while disguised in any manner designed to conceal identity; or
- (c) Willfully and intentionally assaulting another with intent to commit any felony."

Aggravated assault is defined for the Uniform Crime Report as:

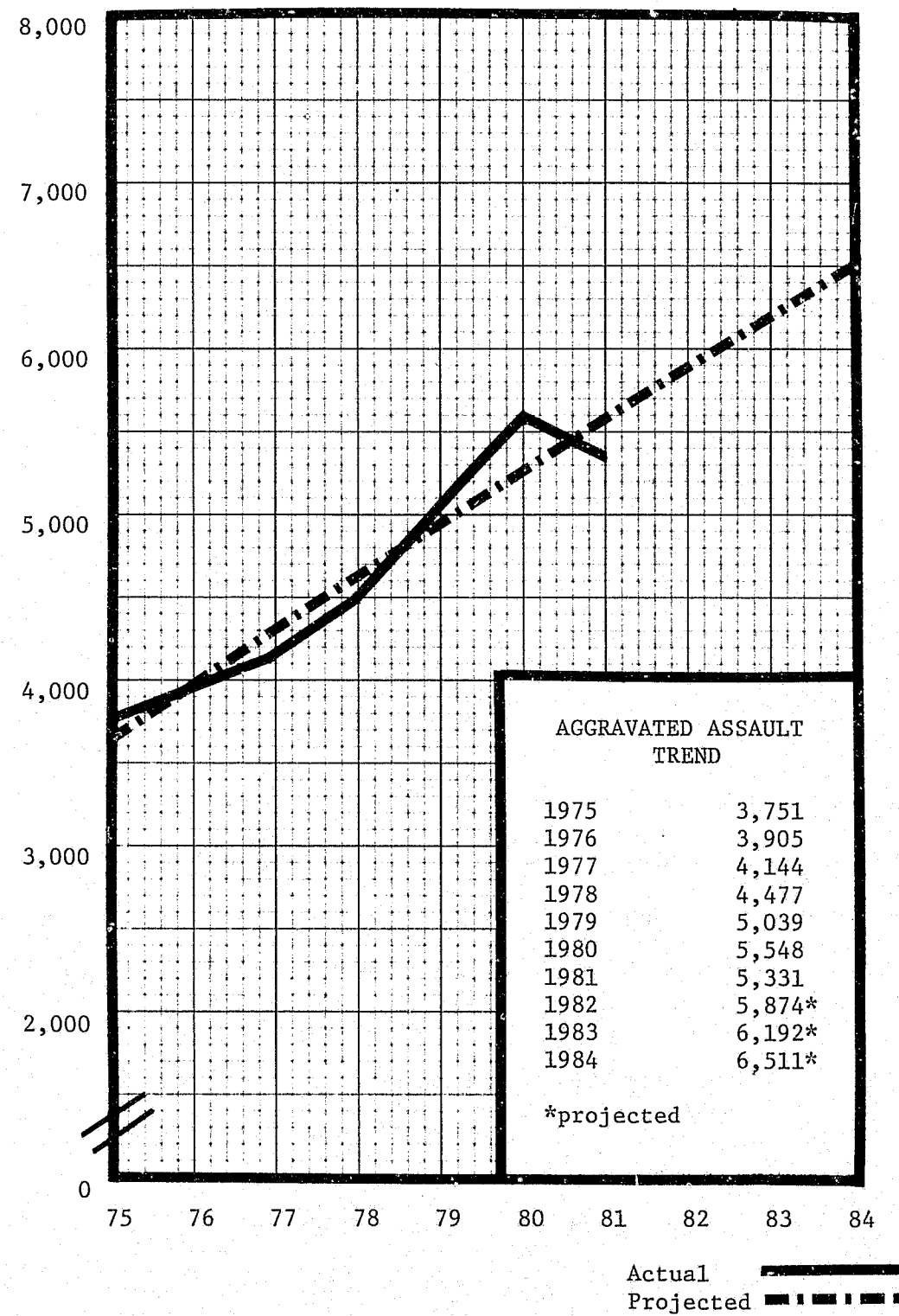
"An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 15).

Of the Violent Crimes, aggravated assault is consistently the most frequently occurring offense. Aggravated assaults decreased 3.9% from 5,548 in 1980 to 5,331 in 1981. Of the 5,331 aggravated assaults, 1,464 were committed with a firearm, 1,022 were with a knife or cutting instrument, 1,331 were by use of hands, fists, or feet and 1,514 were by means of another type of dangerous weapon. There is no property loss associated with aggravated assault; if property is involved, the offense is initially classified as a robbery. Statistics are also collected for simple assaults; however, simple assaults are considered a Part II crime and therefore, are not reflected in the Crime Index totals.

"Simple assaults do not involve the use of a firearm, knife, cutting instrument, or other dangerous weapon and are those assaults where there were no serious or aggravated injuries to the victims," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 16-17).

There were 13,647 incidents of simple assaults reported in 1981.

CHAPTER 8
PROPERTY CRIMES

Burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft comprise the Property Crime category offenses, where there is no victim at the scene of the crime.

In 1981 there were 119,556 property crimes, an increase of 2.4% over 1980, resulting in property loss of \$56,008,256. Three-fourths of all property crimes were committed in cities with populations greater than 10,000.

1975 - 1984

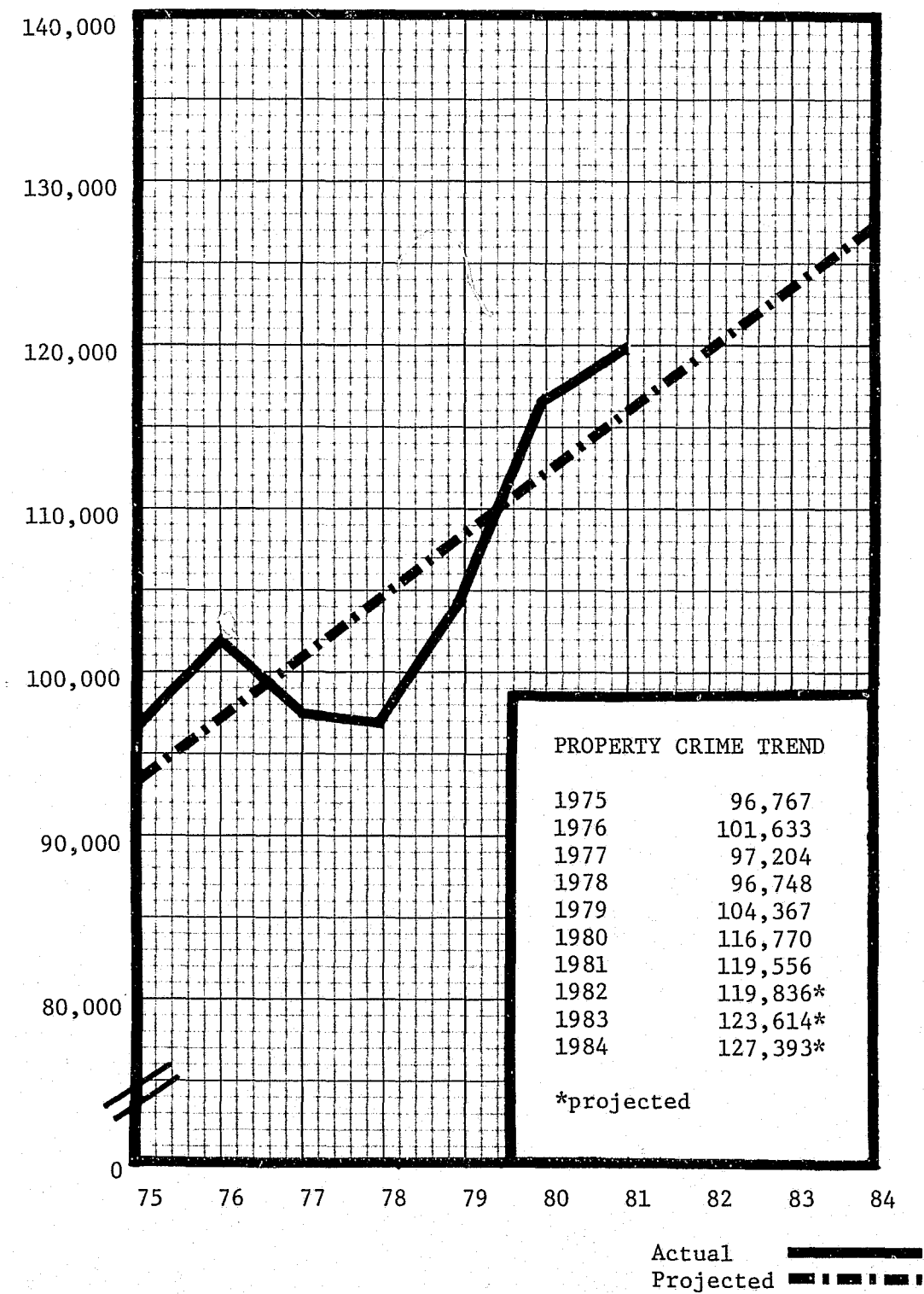
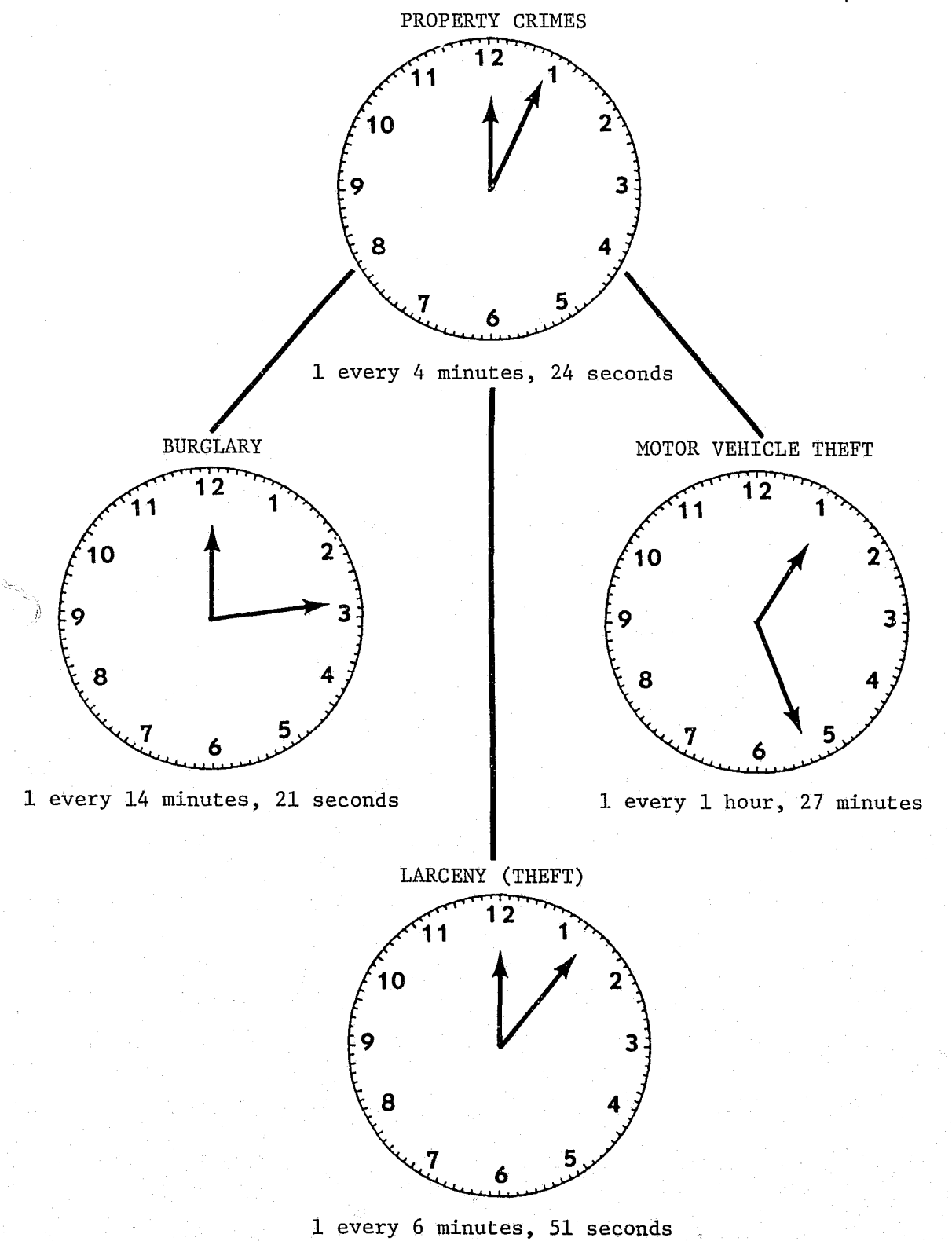

CHAPTER 9

BURGLARY

Burglary in Kansas is defined under K.S.A. 21-3715 as:

"...knowingly and without authority entering or remaining within any building, mobile home, tent or other structure, or any motor vehicle, aircraft, watercraft, railroad car or other means of conveyance of persons or property, with intent to commit a felony or theft therein."

For the Uniform Crime Report, burglary is defined as "the unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 20), and includes concealment within a building. UCR guidelines rule out illegal entry of a tent or vehicle used for recreational purposes. Burglary is tabulated according to the provisions of the "Hotel Rule." This "Rule" holds that multiple burglaries of transient dwellings or commercial spaces under a single manager, incidents most likely to be reported to a law enforcement agency by the manager rather than the lessees, are counted as one offense.

There were 36,656 burglaries in 1981, a 2.8% increase over 1980. Residence burglaries accounted for 64%, or 23,480, of those burglaries. Non-residence burglaries totaled 13,176. The property loss to all burglaries totaled \$20,226,181 with 67.2% of that figure coming from residence burglaries.

Almost three-fourths (74.2%) of all burglaries occurred in the cities with populations greater than 10,000 reflecting a property loss of \$12,747,407.

1975 - 1984

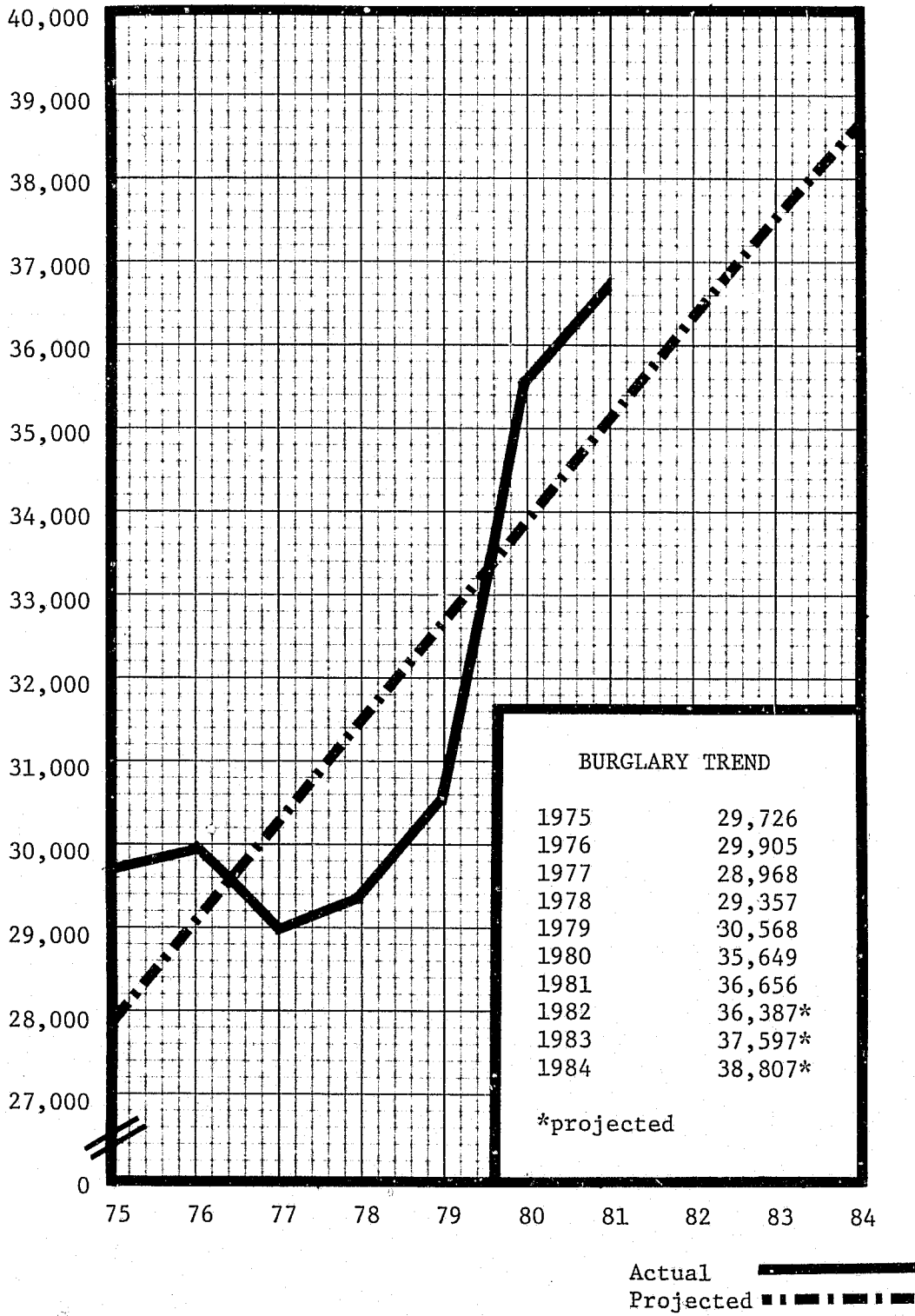

CHAPTER 10

LARCENY (THEFT)

Kansas Statute K.S.A. 21-3701 defines theft as:

"...any of the following acts done with intent to deprive the owner permanently of the possession, use, or benefit of the owner's property:

- (a) Obtaining or exerting unauthorized control over property; or
- (b) Obtaining by deception, control over property; or
- (c) Obtaining by threat, control over property; or
- (d) Obtaining control over stolen property knowing the property to have been stolen by another."

For the Uniform Crime Report larceny (theft) is "the unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 23). Attempts to commit larceny are included in the definition.

Larcenies reported in 1981 were up slightly over 1980, from 74,750 to 76,845, resulting in a total property loss of \$17,436,804. Larcenies are broken down by eight specific categories of occurrences as well as by three monetary categories in Table 1.

The cities with populations over 10,000 experienced 77.7% of all larcenies and 60% of the total property loss shown above for larcenies.

1975 - 1984

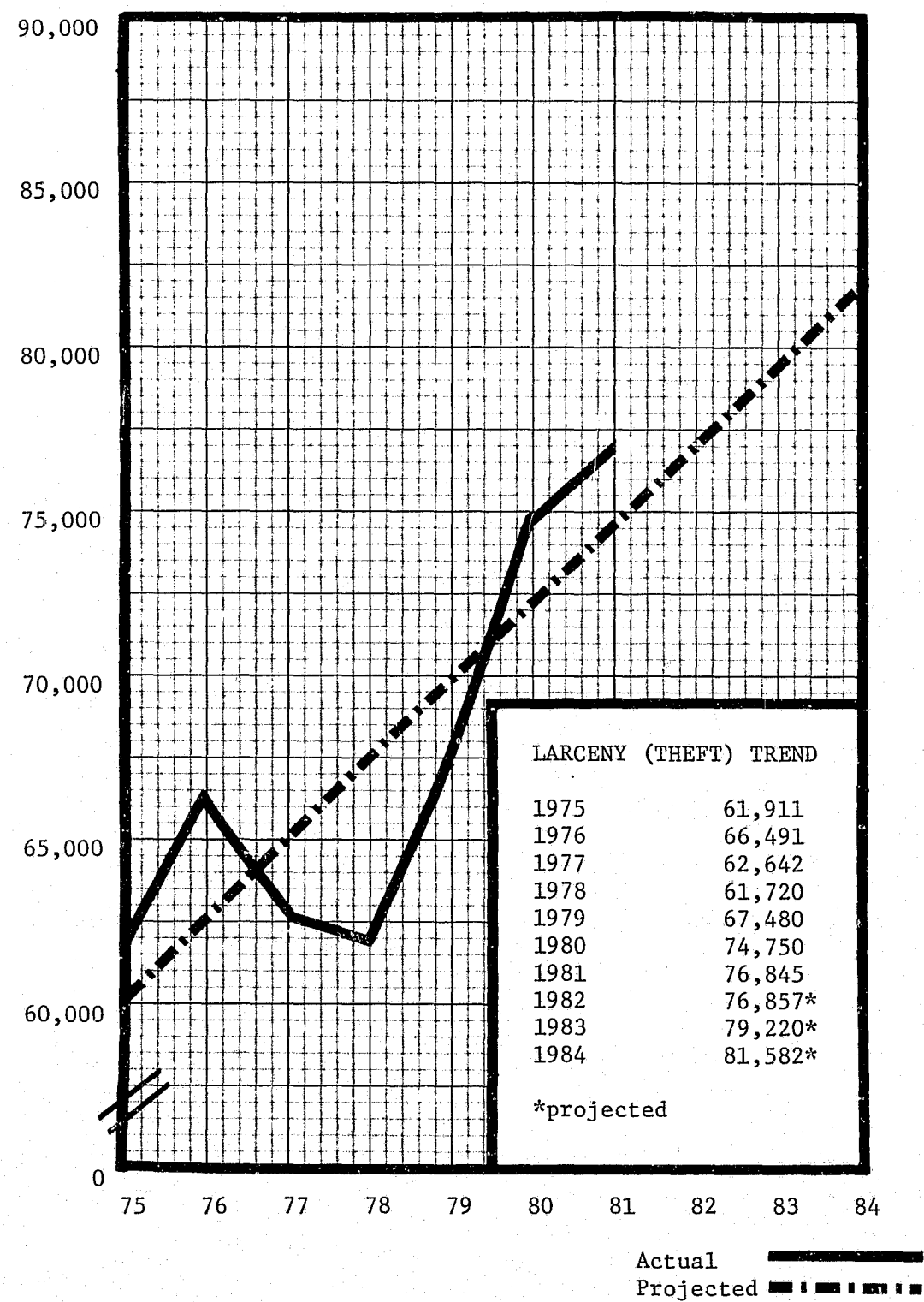

CHAPTER 11

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor vehicle theft in Kansas is included within the theft statute, K.S.A. 21-3701. Because of the large monetary loss due to motor vehicle theft, the offense is tabulated separately from larceny of other types of property for the Uniform Crime Report. Motor vehicle theft is "the theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle"; a motor vehicle is defined as "a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 27).

In 1981 there were 6,055 incidents of motor vehicle theft with property loss amounting to \$18,345,271. The total value of stolen motor vehicles, however, was \$19,500,685. This apparent discrepancy is explained by the hierarchy rule: when motor vehicles are stolen concurrently with commission of a higher offense, the value of the stolen vehicle is entered with the higher offense. A total of 3,929 motor vehicles was recovered.

Over three-fourths (78%) of all motor vehicle thefts, 4,724, occurred in the cities with populations greater than 10,000. The value of property loss to motor vehicle theft in the larger cities totaled \$13,402,456. Agencies in the larger cities recovered 2,952 stolen motor vehicles.

1975 - 1984

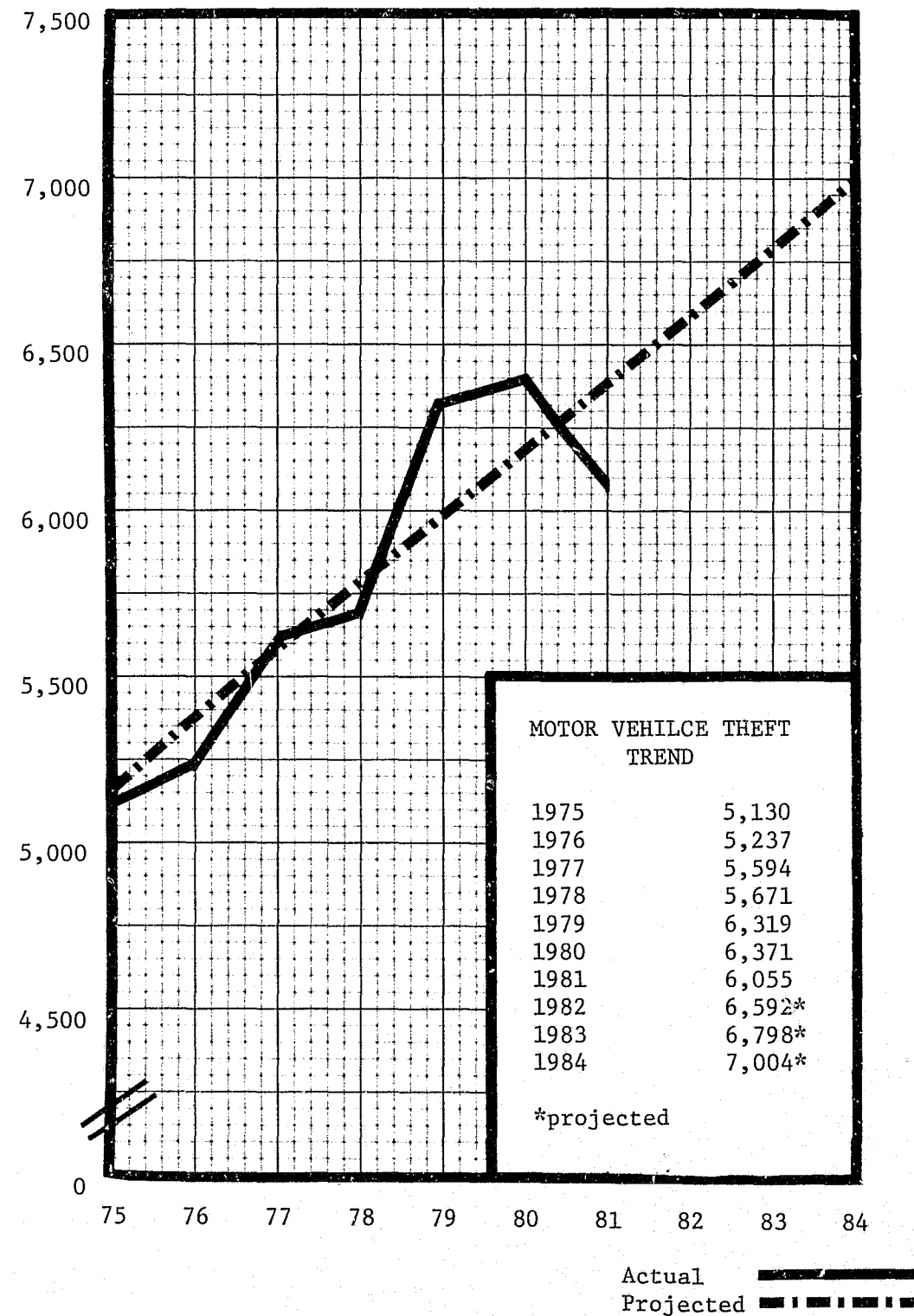

CHAPTER 12

ARSON

Arson is defined in K.S.A. 21-3718 as:

- "...knowingly, by means of fire or explosive:
- (a) Damaging any building or property in which another person has any interest without the consent of such person; or
 - (b) Damaging any building or property with intent to injure or defraud an insurer or lienholder."

Arson is defined under the Uniform Crime Reporting program as "any malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling, house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc." (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 58). The Hierarchy Rule does not apply to arson; therefore, an arson will be scored in addition to any other highest ranking Part I offense.

There were 985 arsons reported to the UCR program in 1981, a 25% decrease from 1980. Of the total number of arsons, 589 or 60% involved structural property, 249 or 25% involved mobile property, and 147 (15%) involved other property. "Other" property will include crops, timber, fences, signs and any property stored outside structures. Only 9.0% of the structural property which was burned was uninhabited, abandoned or not normally in use. Property damage due to arson totaled \$9,368,857, a 10.6% increase over 1980.

The cities with populations greater than 10,000 experienced 746 arsons, 75.7% of the total number reported. Property loss to arson in those cities totaled \$4,380,097.

Further data concerning fires and arsons reported to the State Fire Marshal's Office will be found in Appendix A of this publication.

ARRESTS

CHAPTER 13

ARRESTS

Arrest data is provided on the number of persons arrested, cited or summoned for criminal acts in both Crime Index and Class II Offenses. The age, sex, race, and ethnic origin of persons arrested each month are tabulated. Additionally, the disposition of juveniles taken into custody is noted.

In 1981 there were 75,499 total persons arrested for criminal offenses, compared to 75,567 in 1980. Crime Index arrests constituted 24.4% of the total arrests; juveniles arrested totaled 17,586, or 23.6% of all arrests.

Tables 36 through 41 reflect arrests by age, sex, and race; juvenile and adult arrests; arrests by type of offense and Crime Index arrests by agencies.

"Depending on the seriousness of the offense and the offender's prior criminal record, a juvenile may be warned by the police and released to parents, relatives, friends, or guardians," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 71); thus, an actual arrest is not always tallied. Table 42 shows actual arrests as well as those processed in one of five ways and will include juveniles taken into custody where an arrest was not actually counted.

1975 - 1984

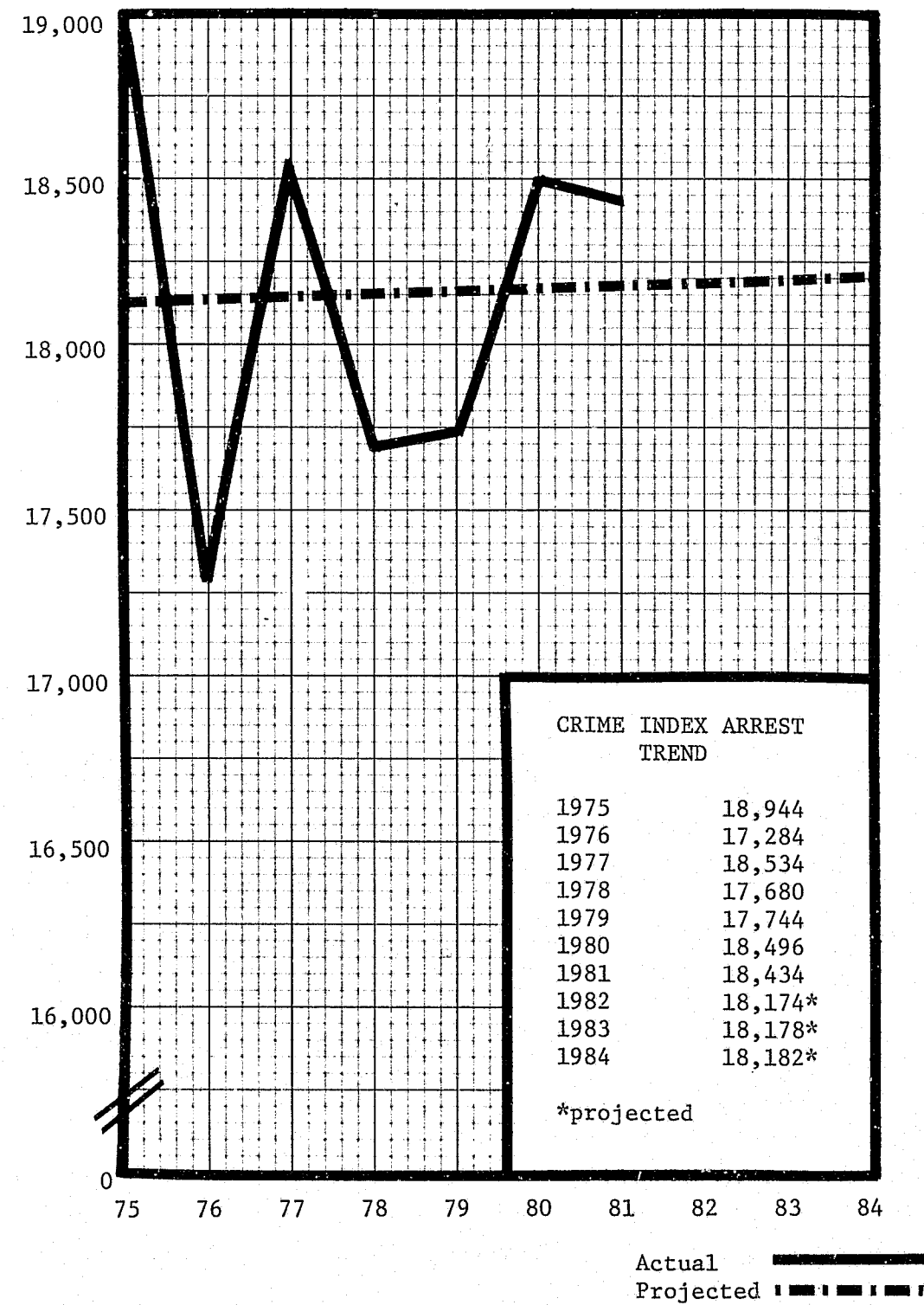

CHAPTER 14

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Law enforcement officers may become victims of assault as a consequence of their occupations. The Uniform Crime Report addresses all assaults on officers which involve "more than mere verbal abuse or minor resistance to an arrest," (Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook, 1980, page 62).

One sworn officer was killed in the line of duty in 1981. A Kansas Highway Patrol Trooper was shot to death after stopping a speeding car on the Kansas Turnpike. One individual was arrested and charged in the case.

There were 1,342 non-fatal assaults on law enforcement officers in 1981, a 7.92% increase from 1980. In 306 instances, officers sustained injury as a consequence of the attack. Tables 43, 44, 45, and 46 expound on the type of weapon used, the activity of the officer and the time of assaults.

1981

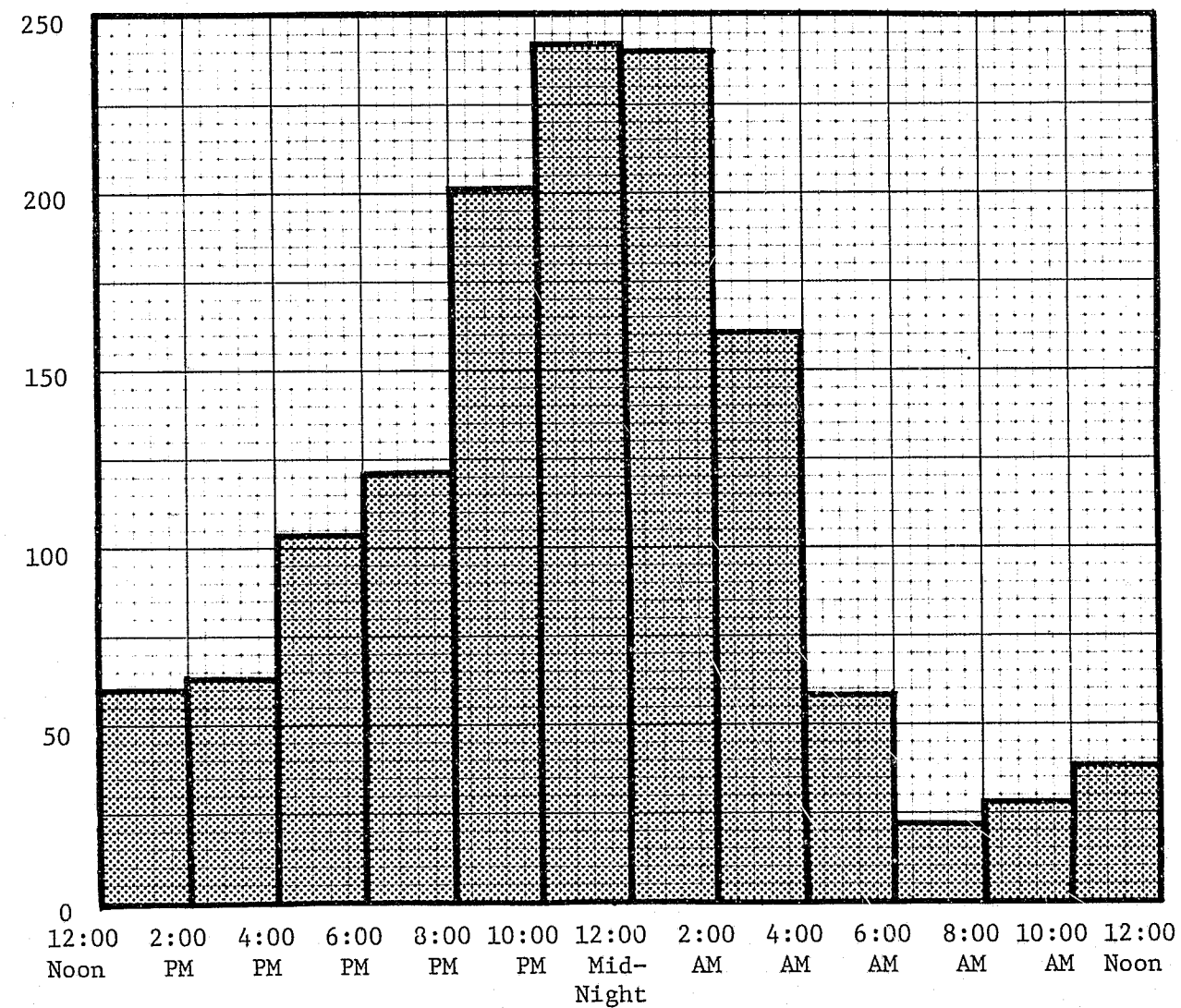

CHAPTER 15

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

Law enforcement employee data for 1981 was submitted by 234 agencies representing a total of 5,089 persons employed full-time by Kansas law enforcement agencies. Reserve officers, part-time employees or employees paid from other than law enforcement funds are NOT included in these figures.

Table 47 is a breakdown of law enforcement employees by age, sex, race, and ethnicity, as well as levels of education of those employed. Years of service with an employee's current agency and total years in law enforcement are also included.

Table 48 lists sworn and non-sworn male and female employees by reporting agency.

APPENDIX A

This Appendix contains data from the Kansas State Fire Marshal's Office concerning all fires, more particularly those fires of incendiary or suspicious origin. This data is collected under K.A.R. 22-5-1 which states:

"It shall be the duty of the chief of any organized (regular or volunteer) fire department, or the chief police officer or law enforcement officer where no fire department exists, to submit fire reports to the state fire marshal on every fire occurring in his or her municipality or fire district territory."

In May, 1980, the Kansas State Fire Marshal's Office implemented a statewide collection system of fire data under the Kansas Fire Incident Reporting System (KFIRS). At the time of this publication approximately 60% of the state's population is covered under this reporting program. The KFIRS system has not only allowed the state to have a more detailed and accurate picture of incendiary or suspicious fires, but all other fires as well.

Fire data collected under the KFIRS program and the UCR program have previously been published by the Statistical Analysis Center as Fire in Kansas; however, for simplicity and economic reasons statistical data concerning incendiary or suspicious fires collected under the two systems will be presented in this publication. UCR data on arsons in Kansas is found in Chapter 12. This appendix will present data obtained under the KFIRS reporting program; therefore, discrepancies might appear in numbers depending on whether the incident was reported and investigated by a fire service agency or a law enforcement agency.

In 1981 there were 14,882 fires reported to the Kansas State Fire Marshal, an increase of 36.1% over the number of reported fires in 1980. Property loss to those fires totaled \$45,066,476.

Incendiary or suspicious fires accounted for 1,759, or 11.8%, of all fires reported to the State Fire Marshal, resulting in property loss of \$8,402,153.

As a result of fires there were 558 injuries and 53 fatalities in 1981. There were 287 firefighters injured during fires; 57 of these injuries occurred fighting fires of incendiary or suspicious origin. Injuries to civilians amounted to 271 with 15 of those injuries occurring during incendiary or suspicious fires.

According to data collected through the KFIRS program, the highest number of incendiary or suspicious fires occurred during the month of March, that being 213 or 12.1%. Saturday and Sunday reflected the busiest days of the week for incendiary or suspicious fires with 32.8% occurring on those days. The most frequent hours of the day for these fires to occur were between 8:00 p.m. and midnight.

APPENDIX B
GLOSSARY

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GLOSSARY

ACTUAL OFFENSE: An offense which law enforcement personnel confirm to have happened.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES: State and local offenses not otherwise specified.

ARREST: The act of taking a person into custody by authority of law, to charge him or her with a criminal offense or to initiate juvenile proceedings.

ARSON: Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud.

ASSAULT, AGGRAVATED: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm.

ASSAULT, OTHER: An unlawful attack or attempted attack by one person upon another in which no weapon was used and which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

BURGLARY: The unlawful entry of or concealment within a structure to commit a felony or theft.

CLASS I: Classification of offenses including the Crime Index and negligent manslaughter.

CLASS II: Classification of offenses encompassing all crimes not included in Class I. However, for purposes of this publication negligent manslaughter is included with the Class II offenses.

CLEARANCE: An offense for which at least one person is arrested, charged, and turned over to the court for adjudication; or for which said procedure would be completed were it not for reasons preventing law enforcement officers from acting. Such reasons might include death of the offender, confession by an offender for another offense under different jurisdiction, denial of extradition, refusal of victim to cooperate, prosecution of offender for a lesser charge, and policy regarding handling of juveniles, etc.

CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, and aggravated assault.

CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses robbery, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

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CRIME INDEX: Classification of seven offenses selected for their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, and likelihood of being reported. Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft, all of which share the feature of criminal intent.

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS: Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; disorderly conduct in state institutions; prize fights; blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language; desecrating the flag; and refusing to assist an officer.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE: The driving or operating of any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATION: Transgression of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of narcotic drugs.

DRUNKENNESS: All offenses of drunkenness or intoxication except driving while intoxicated. Includes drunkenness, drunk and disorderly, common or habitual drunkard, and intoxication.

EMBEZZLEMENT: Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING: All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of that which is true.

FRAUD: Converting and obtaining money or property by false pretenses other than forgery or counterfeiting.

GAMBLING: Promoting, permitting, or engaging in games of chance.

INCENDIARY: Involving a deliberate burning of property.

JUVENILE: Person under the age of eighteen.

LARCENY (THEFT): The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another or the attempt to do so.

LIQUOR LAW VIOLATION: Transgression of any state or local liquor law except drunkenness and driving while intoxicated.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT: The theft or attempted theft of a self-propelled vehicle that runs on the surface and not on rails.

MURDER AND NON-NEGLIGENT MANSLAUGHTER: The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN: All charges of nonsupport and neglect or abuse of family or children.

PROPERTY CRIMES: Subclassification of the Crime Index which encompasses burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE: Committing or attempting to commit sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

RAPE: The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.

REPORTED OFFENSE: An act which comes to the attention of law enforcement authorities as a possible offense.

ROBBERY: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

RUNAWAY: Protective custody of juveniles under local statute.

SEX OFFENSES: Offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like, other than forcible rape or prostitution and commercialized vice.

STOLEN PROPERTY, BUYING, RECEIVING, AND POSSESSING: Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property or the attempt to commit any such offense.

SUSPICION: Arrests for examination by police, after which persons arrested are released.

UNFOUNDED OFFENSE: An act reported to law enforcement authorities which, upon investigation, proves to be not an offense.

VAGRANCY: Offenses of vagrancy, begging, loitering (adults), vagabondage, and being a "suspicious character or person, etc."

Includes murder and non-negligent manslaughter, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny (theft), and motor vehicle theft, all of which share the feature of criminal intent.

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS: Transgressions of curfew or loitering ordinances pertaining to juveniles.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Committing or attempting to commit a breach of the peace. WEAPONS OFFENSES: Offenses and attempted offenses against weapons regulations. Includes manufacture, sale, possession, or carrying open or concealed deadly weapons or silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to minors; possession of deadly weapons by aliens.

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
